# **NEWS & NOTES**

- The Hawks are 1-2 on the season after a loss on the road at Monmouth this past Wednesday, 57-45.
- Junior **Kaliah Henderson** leads the Hawks in scoring with 14.0 ppg and is second in rebounding with 6.3 rpg. The Tampa, Fla. native posted a double-double in the lost at Monmouth with 16 points and 10 rebounds. She's tallied 16 or more points in her last two outings.
- Graduate student **Katie Jekot**, who missed Wednesday's game at Monmouth, is second on the team with 9.0 points per outing. Jekot also leads the team with 5.0 assists on average.
- Rookie Talya Brugler (8.7 ppg) and graduate student Alayna **Gribble** (7.7 ppg) round out the top four scorers. Gribble also adds a team best 6.7 rpg after tying her career high with six rebounds in each of the first two games, followed by a career high eight against Monmouth.
- Freshman **Julia Nyström** played her best game of the season against Monmouth in a season high 27 minutes. She scored seven points and handed out four assists.
- Saturday's game will air nationally on ESPN+ and internationally through the Atlantic 10 with Matt Martucci and Maren Walseth on the call.

# **COMMON CONNECTIONS**

Saturday's game will feature an abundance of common connections.

Graduate student **Mary Sheehan** and Nova's Kenzie Gardler played three years of high school basketball together at Cardinal O'Hara. The duo played against gradaute student Katie Jekot in the PIAA 6A State Championship in 2016. That trio also spent four years together with the Philadelphia Comets.

Sophomore **Emma Boslet** and Nova's **Christina Dalce** played together for a year in CYO at Saint Matthews and faced off in high school. Dalce later played two years of high school ball with the Hawks' sophomore Olivia Mullins at Rutgers Prep and a year together for the New Jersey Sparks EYBL.

Villanova assistant coach **Michelle Sword '12** (nee Baker) was a fouryear player for the Hawks. She ranked 14th all-time in scoring when she graduated.

**Katie Gardler '93** (nee Curry), an SJU alum and former assistant coach, is the mother of Nova's Kezie Gardler. Kenzie's father and grandfather also played hoops on Hawk Hill.

# **DOUBLE-DOUBLE PLEASE**

Junior **Kaliah Henderson** posted her first double-double of the season against Monmouth as she led all players in both points (16) and rebounds (10).

# **NOT MY YEAR - CRIMSON SHIRT**

Junior **Jaden Walker** and rookie **Kaylie Griffin** will be sitting out this season and taking a crimson shirt year - not to be confused with redshirt.

# **OUR HAWKS > YOURS**

St. Joe's jumped out to a 15-0 lead over UMES in the season opener and the rest was history. The Hawks tallied 84 points, the most in a game since defeating UMass 84-79 on Jan. 13, 2018, in the 84-49 blowout of the lesser Hawks. The 35-point margin is the largest for SJU since a New Year's Eve rout of VCU, 49-41, in 2017. Graduate student **Katie Jekot** (16), freshman **Talya Brugler** (14), and rookie **Mackenzie Smith** (12) led the Hawks in scoring.

# **NOT SO DIFFERENT**

The 2021-22 Hawks roster isn't so different from a season ago. In fact, 77% of the roster is the same, including 84% of the scoring from last go around. The losses for St. Joe's were **Alexis Santarelli, Lula Roig, and Olivia Ramil.**

Senior forward **Katie Mayock** played in all 60 games over the first two years of her collegiate career. Her mother, Alix (Burns), was a four-year standout at Saint Joseph's from 1985-89, helping the Hawks to four consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances and two Big 5 titles.

# LITTLE BIT OF LOVIN

Senior forward **Lovin Marsicano**'s given name is "Elizabeth," but she goes strictly by "Lovin." Why, you might ask? When Marsicano was two years old, she ate a Reese's Peanut Butter Cup... and ended up being allergic. Head coach **Cindy Griffin** is the eighth coach in NCAA Division I history to lead her alma mater to the NCAA Tournament as both a player and a coach.

# GRIFFIN

HEAD COACH | 21<sup>ST</sup> SEASON | SAINT JOSEPH'S '91 '93

The all-time leader in wins at Saint Joseph's, Cindy Griffin '91 enters her 21st season as head coach of the Hawks in 2021-22. A 1991 and 1993 graduate of SJU, Griffin (nee Anderson) has compiled an overall record of 385-310 in 23 seasons as a head coach, and a 337-277 record over 20 years at Hawk Hill that has included 11 postseason appearances.

The eighth coach in NCAA Division I history to lead her alma mater to the NCAA Tournament as a player and a coach, Griffin's squads have posted six 20-win seasons and six victories over nationally-ranked teams, while her players have been honored as Atlantic 10 All-Conference performers 20 times and 16 have gone on to play professionally.

Despite numerous COVID-19 interruptions, the Hawks went 7-10 overall in 2020-21.

Guiding a veteran squad, Griffin brought SJU back to the postseason in 2017-18 as the Hawks advanced to Second Round of the WNIT and finished with a 19-15 overall record, marking the most games played (34) in a single-season in team history. Capturing the Hawk Classic title in November, the Hawks battled back from injures during conference play to five of their last six conference games and carried that momentum up to the title game of the A-10 Championship. Along the way, senior Chelsea Woods earned All-Big 5 First Team and A-10 All-Conference Third Team honors, with junior Sarah Veilleux being selected Big 5 Scholar-Athlete, named to the All-Big 5 Second Team and joined graduate student Amanda Fioravanti on the A-10 All-Academic Team.

Behind a resilient team, the 2016-17 Hawks battled back from a slow start to become one of the top teams in the Atlantic 10. Finishing third in the conference standings, the Hawks advanced to the semifinals of the A-10 Championship and earned the program's 10th Postseason WNIT berth. Individually, Chelsea Woods was named an A-10 All-Conference honoree and was selected to the All-Big 5 Second Team. Joining Woods on the All-Big 5 Second Team, Adashia

Franklyn also garnered Big 5 most Improved Player accolades, while Sarah Veilleux was recognized as the Big 5 Scholar Athlete.

Behind a pair of 1,000-point scorers in seniors Sarah Fairbanks and Ciara Andrews in 2015-16, Saint Joseph's finished tied for sixth in the A-10 behind a strong finish to the regular season. Finishing among the attendance leaders in the conference, the Hawks added to their mantle as they claimed the Hawk Classic title. Additionally, Fairbanks was named the Big 5's Scholar-Athlete, while sophomore Chelsea Woods was selected the Big 5's Most Improved Player.

Backed by First Team All-Big 5 selection Natasha Cloud, the Hawks earned a share of the Big 5 title in 2014-15. Cloud, who garnered A-10 All-Conference First Team and All-Defensive Team accolades, also became just the third SJU player to be selected in the WNBA Draft as she was picked by the Washington Mystics in the second round in 2015.

Following up their A-10 Championship the season prior, the 2013-14 Hawks continued to prove themselves as one of the top programs nationally as they earned an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament and advanced to the Second Round for just the seventh time in team history. Led by

Erin Shields and Cloud, Saint Joseph's earned its fifth straight postseason bid and claimed its first outright Philadelphia Big 5 title since 2000-01.

Under Griffin's leadership, Saint Joseph's posted one of its most memorable seasons in team history in 2012-13 as the Hawks claimed the Atlantic 10 Championship for just the third time and earned the automatic NCAA Tournament bid. Led by a senior class that had advanced to the postseason every year, the Hawks finished with a 23-9 record that included wins over #5 Maryland and #11 Dayton.

In addition to the team's success, a trio of Hawks were singled out for their performances, led by NCAA Woman of the Year nominee Chatilla van Grinsven. With Griffin's guidance, van Grinsven turned in one of the more dominant seasons in recent SJU history, becoming just the fifth player in SJU history to average a double-double for the year en route to being named to the A-10 All-Conference First Team and as the Big 5 Player of the Year. The duo of backcourt mates Shields and Cloud helped propel SJU to new heights, with Shields garnering A-10 and Big 5 Most Improved Player honors and I-AAA distinction, while Cloud was named the Most Outstanding Player of the 2013 A-10 Championship.

Backed by a veteran-laden team in 2011-12, the Hawks earned their third-straight WNIT berth and posted their most wins (22) since the 2003-04 season. Moving into second place in career victories at her alma mater, Griffin picked up her 200th win as the Hawks topped Boston University in the opening game of the WNIT on March 15, 2012. Leading the Hawks to a 15-4 mark at home, she helped Saint Joseph's become one of the more efficient teams in the nation, ranking fourth in fewest turnovers per game (12.5), 26th in three-point percentage (.348) and 39th in field goal percentage (.423).

Individually, senior Michelle Baker and Kelly Cavallo had breakout years, both garnering All-Big 5 honors. Behind Griffin's teaching, Baker went on to be named to the

A-10 All-Conference Second Team and capped her career as SJU's then all-time leader in games played (127) while ranking in the top 20 for scoring and field goals made. After seeing limited time as a freshman, Cavallo developed into one of the top post players in the A-10, leading SJU and finishing in the top five of the conference in rebounding, blocked shots and field goal percentage. With Griffin's aid, Cavallo finished her career second all-time in blocks and 11th in rebounding at SJU.

Returning just one starter for the 2010-11 season, the Hawks quickly jelled under Griffin's guidance as they went on to win 20 games, earned the program's 700th victory, and advanced to the second round of the WNIT. Led by All-Big 5 honorees Baker and Katie Kuester, Saint Joseph's had its most efficient offensive showing since 2002-03, as the Hawks finished 60th in the nation in field goal percentage (42.1).

Additionally, several Hawks were honored for outstanding seasons in 2010-11, headlined by sophomore Ashley Prim becoming the first SJU player to be named Atlantic 10 Sixth Player of the Year. Baker became just the second Hawk to be named to the A-10 All-Defensive Team, while freshman Erin Shields became the sixth player Griffin has coached to A-10 All-Rookie Team honors.

Earning a postseason berth for the first time in two years, the Hawks surpassed predictions in 2009-10 as they finished tied for fourth in the Atlantic 10 after being picked to finish ninth. After opening the season with a 3-7 mark, Griffin saw her team begin to click at the end of the non-conference schedule as SJU claimed the 19th Annual Hawk Classic title and worked its way to .500 by the second week of the Atlantic 10 slate. Posting a 9-5 mark against conference opponents, Griffin hit two milestones during A-10 play, earning her 150th win at Saint Joseph's in a victory against Dayton and earning her 200th coaching win against George Washington. The Hawks would go on to earn the program's seventh WNIT bid, and play the first postseason game at Hagan Arena.

In 2008-09, Griffin undertook arguably her toughest season to date as Saint Joseph's played every contest away from Hawk Hill for the first time in program history. And in typical SJU fashion, Griffin got her team to respond as Saint Joseph's went on to post an 8-5 record at home venues and earn its first Big 5 title since 2000-01. Individually five Hawks posted career bests in scoring, with Brittany Ford and Mariame Djouara both earning All-Big 5 Second Team honors.

Relying heavily on underclassmen in

2007-08, Griffin guided her Hawks to another winning season, including crowns at the Brown Basketball Classic and the Hilton Philadelphia Hawk Classic. Among the wins, Saint Joseph's posted its biggest win over a non-conference ranked opponent since the 1984-85, topping #15 Auburn for the Hawk Classic title.

Despite losing several experienced players prior to the 2006-07 season, Griffin had her team peaking at the right time. Playing Griffin's style of hard-nosed defense and persistent offense, the Hawks advanced to the Atlantic 10 Championship game, including the program's first win over a top 10 opponent (#8 George Washington) since 1992 along the way. Saint Joseph's capped the season with its fifth WNIT appearance in six years and tied the SJU record for games played in a season with 33.

Fueled by a collection of newcomers and a developed core of upperclassmen, Griffin led the Hawks back to national prominence in 2005-06. The Crimson and Gray engineered the nation's best turnaround (13 games) and received votes in the national polls for the first time since 2003-04. The Hawks advanced to the semifinals of the A-10 Championship and earned a berth in the WNIT.

With the loss of four 1,000-point scorers, the 2004-05 Hawks showed their true colors down the stretch, earning a hard-fought victory over La Salle in the opening round of the Atlantic 10 Championship and coming within 10 points of 16th-ranked, and eventual A-10 Champion, Temple.

Led by six seniors, the 2004 team went 22-11 and advanced to the WNIT Elite Eight. Saint Joseph's

finished second in the A-10 East and dropped a heartbreaker in the Atlantic 10 Championship to Temple. Four Hawk seniors reached the 1,000-point plateau, marking just the eighth time in NČAA?history that a quartet of players had reached the milestone in the same season. Erin Brady, Irina Krasnoshiok, Stephanie (Graff) McCaffrey and Amra Mehmedic went on to sign professional contracts.

Following a memorable

first year at the helm of her alma mater, Griffin upped the ante in her second season by capturing 2003 Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year honors after guiding the Hawks to a 19-11 record. The team sprinted to the conference's Eastern Division title and earned a berth in the WNIT for the second straight season, despite the departure of SJU's all-time leading scorer and a non-conference schedule that ranked fourth nationally.

Griffin helped to reinvigorate the SJU program in her first season, leading the squad to a 24-8 record and the second round of the WNIT. She capitalized on the team's tradition of scrappy play and rugged defense, while releasing the reins and allowing the team to play a more up-tempo style on the offensive end of the floor. The Hawks finished the year among the national leaders in nine different categories and paced the nation in free throw percentage for the second straight year.

Following her playing career, Griffin spent the 1992-93 season as a graduate assistant at her alma mater. She then accepted an assistant's spot at Vanderbilt University from 1993-95 under former Saint Joseph's head coach Jim Foster. Foster recruited Griffin to SJU and coached her during her playing career on Hawk Hill.

In her two years as an assistant at Vanderbilt, the Commodores finished 53-15 overall, won the 1995 SEC championship and reached the NCAA Sweet 16 both seasons. In addition to coaching responsibilities, she was the co-director of the Vanderbilt Basketball Camp and the director of the Black & Gold Club.

Griffin left Vanderbilt after the 1995 season to become an assistant coach at Loyola Maryland. She spent three seasons as an assistant under Patty Coyle before being promoted to associate head coach in 1998. Griffin was promoted to the position of head women's basketball coach at Loyola Maryland midway through the 1998-99 season. She was the seventh-youngest head coach in Division I at the time. Griffin – who was named head coach five games into the season as Coyle left for an assistant coach position with the WNBA's New York Liberty – kept the Greyhounds' momentum going as Loyola Maryland won a team-record 21 games that year. Overall she compiled a record of 48-33 during her tenure at the Baltimore school, guiding the squad to the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference semifinals all three years.

One of the top playmakers in Saint Joseph's history, Griffin starred for the Hawks from 1987-88 through 1991-92 (missing the 1988-89 season due to injury). A three-time team captain, Griffin finished her career with 662 points, 278 rebounds, 510 assists and 197 steals. She currently ranks fourth on SJU's all-time assist list. As a junior in 1990-91, she played in 1,178 out of a possible 1,200 minutes to set the school record for minutes played in a single season. The Hawks made three NCAA Tournament appearances. season. The Hawks made three NCAA Tournament appearances and posted three straight 20-win seasons during her playing career. # MOVE OVER 'MARE OF EASTTOWN:' THE REAL MARE SHEEHAN IS ALSO A DELCO NATIVE, A HAWKS BASKETBALL CAPTAIN, AND A WAWA FAN

In March, Mary "Mare" Sheehan woke up to a text from her parents with a link about a new show on HBO called Mare of Easttown. Not only was the show set in the Philly suburb where she grew up, but the lead character played by Kate Winslet was also named Mare Sheehan.

"My parents instantly were like 'We can't wait for it to start! You have to come home on Sundays to have dinner and watch the show,'" Sheehan said.

And so, Sheehan, 22, a graduate student at St. Joseph's University who's a captain and guard on the women's basketball team (known as the Hawks), did.

Then things started to get weird.

Not only was HBO's Mare Sheehan from Delco, but she was also a star basketball player, nicknamed "Miss Lady Hawk."

Kate Winslet's Mare Sheehan in HBO's "The Mare of Easttown" is a world-weary detective who was a star basketball player in high school known as "Miss Lady Hawk."

"It was crazy," Sheehan said.
"I was like wait, hold on, now we got my name, my town, my sport, and my mascot? This is too much! It's one too many coincidences."

Sheehan, 22, grew up in Drexel Hill, Delaware County (Delco!), and said people have been calling her Mare since she was a child.

She went to Cardinal O'Hara High School, where she led the girls basketball team to the Philadelphia Catholic League championship her senior year, then enrolled at St. Joe's, where 11 of her family members are alumni, including her mother and father. Her dad even played the mascot, the Hawk, for three years.

Sheehan joined the basketball team her freshman year and, because she took summer courses and had AP credits that transferred from high school, she got her undergrad degree in accounting by her junior year. During her fourth year, she returned to St. Joe's to get her MBA and, thanks to the NCAA's COVID-19 waiver granting students another year of eligibility, she's coming back to play her final season at St. Joe's this fall as a guard and co-captain of the women's basketball team.

Mary "Mare" Sheehan, a guard and co-captain for Saint Joseph's University Women's Basketball Team, is a standout on the basketball court, just like Kate Winslet's character, Mare Sheehan, on the HBO series "Mare of Easttown." "I decided to take the fifth year option because I love this place so much and I wanted to come back," she said.

Deloitte, an accounting firm which offered Sheehan a position in its Philly office, even agreed to defer her spot in its audit department until 2022 so she could play another year.

While there are similarities, their career aspirations are among the many stark differences between the Mares, including that the real Sheehan is not a grandmother or a mother and she does not vape excessively, or at all.

"I gotta keep these lungs working good," she said.

Sheehan also never puts Cheez Whiz on cheeseballs.

"I do like cheese, just not in those forms," she said. "We'd make jokes about her diet all the time, trying to draw a contrast between myself and her."

But both Mares do share a love of Wawa, though the real Mare's

order is a bit more complicated than coffee with two creamers, no sugar.

"I get an Italian hoagie — ya gotta have a hoagie from Wawa — with pepperoni, pickles, sweet peppers, and, this is the kicker, I put buffalo sauce as my condiment."

Sheehan said she loved all the Wawa and other local references on the show and thought the writing and acting were phenomenal, even if she could never get used to hearing her name on screen.

As her friends and family watched the show live — or even now, when they're catching up on streaming — she gets calls and texts asking if she's talked to anybody from the show about using her likeness.

"I'd love to meet Kate but I'm definitely not coming for any legal things," she said.

Sheehan, who said the most Delco thing about her is "probably how much I love Delco" and how "everybody who knows me knows I'm from Delco," felt the cast nailed the Delco accent.

But at times the show came down a bit hard on her beloved home county, she said.

"They definitely played into the stereotype that everybody is a little tougher here and rough around the edges," she said.

"And while I feel like Delco is known for drinking, on the show anytime anybody was eating they were drinking, and that's not exactly true."

Sheehan said she and her parents, who watched the show together, did guess who dun it before the finale aired ("I have a text receipt to a friend proving

it!"), but they're less certain how the title character came to share her name.

"The thing is I would have loved the show even if I didn't have all those connections," said the real Mare Sheehan, who like the character of the same name on "Mare of Easttown," also has a lot on her shoulders, including being co-captain of the Saint Joseph's University Women's Basketball Team.

As with all things in Delco there are theories, of course. Sheehan's dad and siblings attended Cardinal O'Hara High, where Tom Ingelsby, the father of the show's creator, Brad Ingelsby, also attended and played ball. And there's a theory that somebody may have dated someone else's cousin (which is a prevailing theory for many things in Delco, of course).

"Those are the only real stretches we have," Sheehan said.

On Wednesday, Sheehan — who has played the role of Mare Sheehan her whole life, for free — was not the least bit bitter to learn Winslet had been nominated for an Emmy for her role in the show this week.

"No way! That's incredible!" she said. "I thought she just did a phenomenal job."

In her final season with the Hawks, Sheehan is not only hoping to score a championship with the team, she's also hoping that Winslet, whose character showed up to a reunion for her basketball team at the local high school slugging back a beer, might make an appearance at a game.

"I have a ticket with her name on it for any and all games she wants to come to," Sheehan said. "They do sell beer at our games now, so I'll make sure we've got it stocked for her."

# **GRIFFINS' BASKETBALL BOND TAKES NEXT STEP AT ST. JOE'S**

When Kaylie Griffin was younger, she knew when – and how - to give her mother space after a tough loss.

Yes, the daughter understood how to read Cindy Griffin, the coach of the Saint Joseph's University women's basketball team, and when to tiptoe around the house.

"I knew growing up when mom came home and she lost, we would behave a little bit better, like clean up the house," Kaylie said with a laugh, of her strategy off the court as a kid with siblings Hannah and Curtis, Jr.

Well, flash forward – and for both mother and daughter the last decade or so has been a flash – and now Kaylie is a talented frosh guard with a high ceiling for the Hawks and her mother.

"And I think that kind of applies here," Kaylie continued on how she will approach now playing for her mom, "so, I think when we lose a game or we have a tough practice, we will just go our separate ways because you don't want to clash as mother-daughter, but as coach-player we have to have a relationship where we can talk about it, like what I personally did wrong."

Cindy, the all-time leader in wins at Saint Joseph's entering her 21st season, knows there are inherent challenges coaching a child on any level, but she also knows her daughter.

"I think you just have to separate the hats you wear," said the coach, who also was a scrappy, star player on Hawk Hill and inducted to the school's women's basketball Hall of Fame.

"She sees the game pretty much the way I see the game, which is a good thing.

"I think she knows what she's going to get from me is complete honesty, like with all of our players and I want what's best for her, but I want what is best for the team."

Kaylie, a multiple All-Conference selection at Gwynedd Mercy Academy, knew for a long time what was best for her.

"I just grew up around the program and seeing the players and the coaches and all the great people that my mom has been surrounded by and I've been surrounded by," Kaylie said. "I just always want to come here and I always want to be a part of that."

Cindy Griffin (nee Anderson), one of the top playmakers in Saint Joseph's history while running the point from 1987-88 through 1991-92 (she missed the 1988-89 season due to injury but came back in 1990-91 to play in a school-record 1,178 out of a possible 1,200 minutes), said she "never really thought about"

coaching her daughter in college, adding "I just can't believe I've been here for 21 years."

The coach fondly recalled a media day when her daughter was six months old.

"She was in my arms during the interviews and I can't believe she's playing for us now," Cindy said, "it's really surreal."

For Kaylie, sports and competition has always been as real as the walls of their Conshohocken home. Her father, Curtis, wrestled at Lock Haven. Kaylie's cousin, John Griffin II, served as the Saint Joseph's men's basketball head coach from 1990-95, while her cousin John Griffin III is the current associate head coach for the SJU men's basketball program.

"I think growing up I always wanted to play for my mom just because I always went recruiting with her," Kaylie said, "and I think my mom and I just really connect through basketball because we have a knowledge of the game, so we talk things out and talk things through with each other.

"And, when she would watch film preparing for games, we would watch together and I really just wanted to be part of that. And before I committed, I was just doing some reflecting and realized I just wanted to be here and wanted to play under her.

"I just think it's a wonderful opportunity for both of us."

"To be able to coach her and her being part of our team is really special," agreed the coach, who played her high school basketball for recently-closed Bishop McDevitt, winning two Philadelphia Catholic League titles.

"She is trying to find her way a little bit, which any kid as a freshman is trying to do, but she knows the game and she has a real high basketball IQ, but she probably needs a year or two for the physicality standpoint and understanding the level, but she is going to be a really nice player for us."





Cindy was a point guard for coach Jim Foster and played in the backcourt with Hawks Hall of Famer Ellen Shields.

"She is a point guard, but I think she can play combo," Cindy said about her daughter. "She can shoot the ball, but I think she has to work on her scoring, shooting and scoring are two different things.

"But just based on her basketball IQ and her ball-handling ability, she's going to be a point guard for us."

Griffin, who is the eighth coach in NCAA Division I history to lead her alma mater to the NCAA Tournament as a player and a coach, was a three-time team captain and still ranks fourth on SJU's all-time assist list. The Hawks made three NCAA tourney appearances while posting three straight 20-win seasons with her at the point.

Last year, during the COVID-19 shortened – and interrupted – season, the Hawks finished 7-10. The pandemic didn't just affect games, of course, but recruiting, too.

"Yeah with the COVID, people want to be close to home because we were home, but it could work the opposite way and people wanted to get away, so that was always a thought, you know people wanted more dif ferent experiences," Cindy said when asked if COVID played into her daughter's decision. "But, I think she just knew she wanted to be here and I tried to paint a not-so-good picture - like you have to do this, or you got to do that and are you sure you want to do this?"

Kaylie is one of five frosh - forwards Talya Brugler and Laila Fair, and guards Mackenzie Smith and Julia Nyström - on the veteran team, which includes eight juniors and seniors who averaged at least nine minutes in 14 of 17 games last season.

But, Kaylie is the only one who will play for her mother.

"My mom has never coached me so this will be the first time and I think it'll be great," said Kaylie. "I think we have a healthy relationship and we will be able to switch from daughter and mother to player and coach.

"Over the years, we've been very good at that."
