BILLIKENS TAKE ON INTRASTATE RIVAL – Saint Louis (3-6) and Southeast Missouri State (3-7) square off tonight in the 20th meeting of the intrastate rivals. Both teams are coming off a loss on Saturday; the Billikens were defeated 74-65 at Northern Iowa, while the Redhawks were toppled 79-58 at Western Illinois.

THE SOUTHEAST MISSOURI STATE SERIES – Saint Louis owns an 11-8 advantage against Southeast Missouri State in a series that began in the 1975-76 season. The Redhawks captured a 59-52 victory in Cape Girardeau, Mo., a year ago.

BILLIKEN LEADERS – Erin Nelson tops the Saint Louis scoring chart with 15.2 points per game, followed by Desirae Ball (13.6 ppg), Jamesia Price (10.3 ppg), Sadie Stipanovich (8.9 ppg) and Denisha Womack (7.3 ppg). Price (19-of-45, .422) and Nelson have 19 and 12 3-pointers, respectively, while Nelson (39-of-46, .848), Womack (23-of-27, .852) and Ball (20-of-22, .909) lead the way at the foul line. Stipanovich and Olivia Jakubicek average a team-high 6.7 rebounds apiece, with Stipanovich pulling down 3.7 offensive boards per game. Womack and Nelson average 5.3 and 5.0 rebounds, respectively. Price (3.8 apg) tops the assists chart.

HEAD COACH LISA STONE – Second-year head coach Lisa Stone owns a 518-262 record (15-25 at SLU) in her 28th year as a collegiate head coach. Before arriving at Saint Louis, Stone was 128-119 in eight seasons at Wisconsin, 64-27 in three years at Drake, 277-59 in 12 campaigns at Wisconsin-Eau Claire and 34-32 in three seasons at Cornell (Iowa). She is

joined on the sideline by three assistants in their first seasons at SLU – Mike Geary, Kristy Guffey and Linda Sayavongchanh.

STIPANOVICH SHINES AT NORTHERN IOWA – Sadie Stipanovich registered her first collegiate double-double in Saint Louis' 74-65 loss to Northern Iowa Dec. 7 in Cedar Falls, Iowa. Stipanovich tied for game-high honors with a career-high 17 points (6-of-11 FG, 5-of-6 FT), and she led all players with a career-high-tying 10 rebounds. Desirae Ball also scored 17 points for the Billikens, who also got nine rebounds and a career- and game-high five assists from Olivia Jakubicek.

SLU IN THE A-10 TEAM STATS – The Billikens rank among the top five in the Atlantic 10 Conference in free-throw percentage (third, .747), fewest turnovers (fourth, 15.2 tpg) and fewest offensive rebounds allowed (fourth, 11.6 orgp).

BILLS IN THE A-10 INDIVIDUAL STATS – Several Billikens are ranked among the Atlantic 10 statistical leaders:

• **Jamesia Price** is fifth in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.62:1), seventh in 3-point field goal percentage (.422), eighth in assists (3.8 apg) and eighth in 3-point field goals (2.1 pg);

• **Erin Nelson** is fifth in minutes (36.4 mpg), ninth in free-throw percentage (.848) and 11th in scoring (15.2 ppg);

• **Desirae Ball** is third in free-throw percentage (.909), fourth in minutes (36.7 mpg) and 12th in steals (1.8 spg);

• **Sadie Stipanovich** is second in offensive rebounding (3.7 orgp);

• **Denisha Womack** is seventh in free-throw percentage (.852).

STRONG AT THE STRIPE – Free-throw shooting has become one of Saint Louis' strengths; the Billikens are 33rd in the nation, converting at a .747 clip. The Bills, who had season highs of 24 made free throws and 29 attempts against Tulsa last week, have connected on at least 74 percent of their charity tosses in seven of nine games. SLU has shot 81 percent (88-of-108) from the line in its last five outings. Leading the way are Desirae Ball (.909), Denisha Womack (.852) and Erin Nelson (.848). Ball has made 14 straight free throws, while Nelson has converted 22-of-24 (.917) from the line in the last four contests.

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DIALING LONG DISTANCE – Jamesia Price has been a consistent threat from 3-point range all season. Price has registered at least one 3-pointer in all nine games and has made two or more treys seven times.

LOFTY HEIGHTS – Against Western Illinois, Saint Louis reached the 85-point mark for the first time since the 2008-09 Billikens scored 86 points at Morehead State.

OFFENSE IMPROVES EFFICIENCY – Last year, SLU had 102 assists and 170 turnovers in its first nine contests. Through nine games this year, the Billikens have 118 assists and 137 turnovers. The improvement in efficiency has allowed the Bills to average 68.6 points and score at least 61 points in eight of their first nine games. SLU tallied 61 or more points just eight times all season in 2012-13.

RULING THE BOARDS – Despite not having an abundance of height, Saint Louis has been an impressive rebounding team in recent years. The Billikens have earned the advantage on the glass in 51 of 71 games (71.8 percent) since the beginning of the 2011-12 season.

SLU SIGNS HERALDED RECRUITING CLASS – On Nov. 13, Saint Louis signed five high school players to National Letters of Intent. The quintet was rated by Blue Star Basketball as the No. 45 recruiting class in the nation. The signees are 5-11 guard **Aaliyah Covington** (Edwardsville, Ill./Edwardsville H.S.), 6-1 forward **Maddison Gits** (Fitchburg, Wis./Oregon H.S.), 5-7 guard **Jackie Kempf** (Arlington Heights, Ill./Rolling Meadows H.S.), 6-0 forward **Shea Shipman** (Olathe, Kan./Olathe Northwest H.S.) and 6-2 guard **Jenny Vliet** (Arlington Heights, Ill./Rolling Meadows H.S.).

NELSON HONORED – On Nov. 11, freshman forward **Erin Nelson** was selected the Atlantic 10 Conference women's basketball Rookie of the Week. Nelson, who turned in game-high scoring efforts against Missouri and Valparaiso, averaged 22 points and six rebounds in the two contests. She began her SLU career with a 25-point, five-rebound outing against Missouri. Her 10-of-18 shooting tally included a 4-of-7 performance from 3-point range. In the win over Valpo, Nelson scored 19 points, tied for game-high honors with seven boards and added four assists and a block.

YOUTH WILL BE SERVED – With six freshmen and two sophomores on its 12-player roster, Saint Louis figures to be one of the youngest teams in the Atlantic 10 Conference.

BILLIKENS RETURN FIVE PLAYERS – Saint Louis (12-19 overall, 5-9 Atlantic 10 in 2012-13) returned five players from last year's squad, although one of that quintet – redshirt sophomore guard **Jamesia Price** – missed all of last season due to injury. Price averaged 2.0 points, 2.0 assists and 1.3 steals in 2011-12. The Bills' lone returning starter is redshirt

junior guard **Desirae Ball**, SLU's top returning scorer (9.0 ppg). Ball also averaged 2.4 rebounds and 2.4 assists. Senior guard **Halee Castleman** (2.8 ppg, 3.9 rpg), sophomore forward **Denisha Womack** (2.9 ppg, 1.9 rpg) and junior guard **Erika Cook** also are back.

SEVEN NEWCOMERS ON THE SQUAD – SLU welcomed six freshmen and a transfer to the program this season.

- Guard **Regan Carmichael** was All-State honorable mention at Maine South (Ill.) H.S. last year, averaging 11.9 points and 3.6 assists.

- Forward **Briana Gray** from Nicolet (Wis.) H.S. collected first-team All-State plaudits as a senior with averages of 16.3 points and 8.8 rebounds.

- Olivia Jakubicek**, a forward out of Cary-Grove (Ill.) H.S., posted 16 points and nine rebounds per game last year en route to All-State special mention.

- Guard **Lexi Lopez** from Southview (Ohio) H.S. was All-State honorable mention as a junior (19.0 ppg, 8.0 rpg, 4.1 apg) before missing her senior campaign due to injury.

- Erin Nelson**, a forward from St. Joseph's Academy in St. Louis, collected first-team All-State accolades and averaged 16.4 points and 7.7 rebounds a year ago.

- Another St. Louis-area All-State product, center **Sadie Stipanovich** out of Westminster Christian Academy, registered 14.8 points and 10.2 rebounds per game as a senior.

- Guard **Ilijana Todorovic**, a law student at SLU, has one year of eligibility remaining. Todorovic averaged 11.1 points and 6.5 rebounds at SUNY Canton in 2010-11.

CHALLENGING SCHEDULE FOR SLU – Saint Louis' 29-game schedule features 11 opponents who advanced to postseason play a year ago, seven teams that won 20 or more games and six squads that finished among the top 100 in the final NCAA RPI.

BILLS IN NINTH SEASON IN A-10 – Saint Louis is in its ninth year as a member of the Atlantic 10 Conference. With the departure of Butler, Charlotte, Temple and Xavier at the conclusion of 2012-13, and the addition of George Mason this year, league membership is at 13 institutions. Davidson will join the A-10 next year. Preseason favorite and defending regular-season champion Dayton was joined by A-10 Championship winner Saint Joseph's in last season's NCAA Tournament. The A-10 has been highly visible in postseason play in recent years, sending two teams to the NCAA Tournament and five to the WNIT in each of the past two seasons, and placing three in the NCAA and five in the WNIT in each of the three campaigns prior to that.

BILLS TASTE TOURNAMENT SUCCESS – With a victory over Butler in the 2013 A-10 Championship, the Billikens have won a conference tournament first-round game in consecutive seasons for the first time as a member of the A-10. SLU downed Charlotte in the first round in 2012.

CONQUERING THE ROAD – The Billikens won six road games last year, twice as many as the previous two seasons combined. SLU had six road wins for the first time in 27 years.

BUILDING A DEFENSIVE FOUNDATION – Saint Louis turned in several impressive defensive accomplishments during the 2012-13 season. Here are some highlights:

- The Billikens posted their best-ever scoring defense numbers as an A-10 member. In all games, SLU allowed an average of 57.9 points – 9.2 points fewer than the program's average of 67.1 points per game allowed in its first seven years in the A-10. The numbers were even better in conference games only, with the Billikens allowing an average of 58.6 points compared to 68.4 over the previous seven years – a difference of 9.8.

- SLU allowed an average of fewer than 60 points per game for the first time since the 1985-86 season.

- The Bills held 11 opponents to fewer than 50 points, a school record. Six of those 11 games were against A-10 opponents. In non-conference play, SLU allowed fewer than 50 points in five consecutive games, the first time in program history that has happened.

- SLU averaged just 13.9 fouls (34th in the nation) and allowed its opponents an average of only 12.1 free-throw attempts per game.

- In conference games only, Saint Louis opponents were just 51-of-194 (.263) from 3-point range.

OFFENSIVE EFFICIENCY IMPROVED – After averaging 21 turnovers in their first six games, the 2012-13 Billikens reduced that average to just 14.1 in the final 25 contests. SLU had more assists than turnovers in nine games last season, surpassing the previous year's total of six. The Billikens have accomplished the feat four times already this season – vs. Missouri (15 assists, 14 turnovers), vs. Valparaiso (17 assists, 15 turnovers), at Murray State (15 assists, 14 turnovers) and at Western Illinois (16 assists, 15 turnovers).

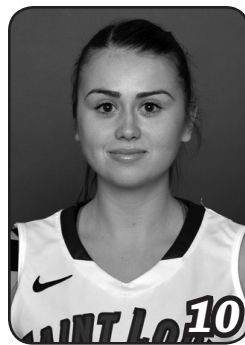

Head Coach Lisa Stone



Lisa Stone, who has amassed a 518-262 record in 28 years as a collegiate head coach, is in her second season as head women's basketball coach at Saint Louis University.

Saint Louis' 12-19 record in Stone's first campaign belied the team's competitiveness as nine of the Billikens' losses, including four in Atlantic 10 Conference play, were by seven or fewer points. Defense was the team's calling card, with SLU allowing an average of fewer than 60 points per game (57.9) for the first time since the 1985-86 season. The Billikens held 11 opponents to fewer than 50 points, a school record; six of those 11 opponents were A-10 foes.

Saint Louis qualified for the A-10 Championship as the No. 11 seed and upset No. 6 Butler in the first round. In addition, the Billikens won six road games, twice as many as the previous two seasons combined. It was the first time since the 1985-86 season that SLU recorded six road victories.

Prior to her arrival at Saint Louis, Stone served eight seasons (2003-11) in charge at Wisconsin. She began her head-coaching career with a three-year stint at Cornell (Iowa) College, spent 12 seasons at Wisconsin-Eau Claire and had a three-year tenure at Drake.

"We are thrilled to have Lisa and her family join the Saint Louis University community," Director of Athletics Chris May said upon Stone's hiring in May 2012. "Her successful career, which includes a commitment to academic success and winning at every level, speaks for itself.

"It is an exciting time for the Billikens as we welcome Lisa to SLU to lead the women's basketball program in educating student-athletes, competing for championships and building community," May said. "Lisa's arrival, combined with SLU's educational excellence, state-of-the-art facilities in Chaifetz Arena, the competitive Atlantic 10 Conference and a fertile recruiting base, makes SLU women's basketball poised for success."

"I am excited to join the Billiken family," Stone said. "Saint Louis University has an outstanding commitment to excellence, and

I am thrilled to be part of an institution that strongly encourages its student-athletes to lead, learn and serve. The University offers academic prestige, outstanding facilities and a beautiful campus, plus an opportunity to compete in the very strong Atlantic 10 Conference."

Stone guided Wisconsin to five postseason appearances, two 20-win campaigns and a 128-119 record that included a 95-68 mark in her final five seasons. In her fourth season (2006-07), the Badgers won a school-record 23 games (23-13) and finished second in the WNIT.

Following WNIT appearances the next two seasons, Wisconsin's 2009-10 squad posted a 21-11 record, tied for third in the Big Ten Conference and earned an NCAA Tournament bid. Stone was rewarded by being named Big Ten Coach of the Year. The Badgers again tied for third in the Big Ten in 2010-11 and participated in the WNIT.

Wisconsin also excelled academically with Stone at the helm. Twenty-one players combined to earn 42 Academic All-Big Ten nods during her tenure.

Stone's 64-27 record at Drake included a 42-12 Missouri Valley Conference ledger. She led the Bulldogs to a 23-7 record, an MVC regular-season co-championship and an NCAA Tournament berth in her first season (2000-01). Stone, whose 23 victories were the most by a first-year MVC women's basketball coach, was tabbed the league's Coach of the Year. The following season, Stone's team went 25-8, achieved a No. 20 national ranking and reached the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16.

The Drake program also flourished in the classroom under Stone's leadership. The 2000-01 Bulldogs were ranked sixth on the Women's Basketball Coaches Association's Academic Top 25 Honor Roll, and the 2001-02 team garnered a No. 15 ranking on the prestigious list.

At NCAA Division III Wisconsin-Eau Claire, Stone turned around a program that had registered just one winning record prior to her arrival. Her teams tallied a 277-59 mark (159-33 in conference play), turned in 11 20-win seasons, reached the NCAA Tournament 11 times and captured six league crowns.

Stone's 1996-97 squad was the national runner-up, and her 1993-94 team finished third in the nation. She was chosen the 1997 WBCA Division III National Coach of the Year, and in 2000 she was named D3 News/Molten Division III National Coach of the Year as the Bugolds posted a 28-1 record. A five-time Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference Coach of the Year, Stone was inducted into the UW-Eau Claire Bugold Hall of Fame in 2006.

Stone's accomplishments at UW-Eau Claire led to her selection to the inaugural class of the WIAC Hall of Fame. Additionally, she was named the WIAC Women's Basketball All-Time Co-Coach.

When Stone was named head coach at Division III Cornell College at age 22 in 1985, she was the nation's youngest head basketball coach at a four-year institution. She collected a 34-32 record at Cornell and led the Rams to the Midwest Conference's Southern Division title in each of her three years. Stone also served as the Rams' head softball coach.

In addition to her collegiate coaching experience, Stone was a head coach in the 2001 WBCA All-Star Game as well as an assistant coach for gold-medal-winning Team USA at the 2002 World Championships for Young Women Qualifying Tournament in Brazil.

Stone holds a bachelor's degree in physical education (1984) and a master's degree in athletic administration (1986), both from the University of Iowa. A four-year standout at point guard under legendary head coach C. Vivian Stringer, she is 26th in points (1,129), tied for ninth in steals (177) and 12th in assists (322) on the Iowa career charts. Stone also owns a share of the Hawkeyes' record for steals in a game (nine).

Stone, a native of Oregon, Wis., was a three-time team captain and a two-time Hawkeye Most Valuable Player. As a senior, she won the Big Ten Medal of Honor as one of the top scholar-athletes in the conference and also captured the Iowa Student-Athlete of the Year award.

Stone and her husband, Ed, a certified public accountant, are the parents of a daughter, Allison, and a son, Tyler. Allie is a senior and a member of the soccer team at Wisconsin-Eau Claire, and Tyler is in his freshman year at SLU.

Assistant Coaches



Mike Geary

Mike Geary, who owns 417 wins as a collegiate women's basketball head coach, is in his first season as an assistant coach at Saint Louis University. Geary arrived at Saint Louis in June 2013 following four seasons as an assistant coach at the University of Detroit Mercy.

"I am so very pleased and excited to welcome Mike Geary to my staff," head coach Lisa Stone said. "Mike has a .758

winning percentage and more than 400 victories as a head coach, and he has been instrumental in turning programs around and leading teams to postseason play. His experience, energy and winning record will help us continue to build a championship program.

"Mike is highly accomplished at X's and O's, practice preparation and game strategy," Stone said. "He has developed numerous All-Conference players and implemented effective in-season and off-season player programs. Mike also is an outstanding recruiter and is very well-connected in the Midwest. He is respected throughout the coaching profession."

"I am excited to join the Saint Louis University women's basketball program," Geary said. "During my visits to St. Louis, I was impressed with the SLU campus and everyone I met. Lisa Stone is a tremendous coach and a proven winner, and I look forward to joining her, Kristy Guffey and Linda Sayavongchanh to build a program we believe will be special."

Geary helped Detroit Mercy post a 21-13 record and win the Women's Basketball Invitational in 2012-13. That followed a 2011-12 campaign that saw the Titans go 20-14 and earn a WNIT bid. During Geary's tenure, Detroit Mercy improved its NCAA Ratings Percentage Index (RPI) from 220 to 97.

Geary spent two seasons as an assistant coach at Ball State University. He helped guide the 2006-07 Cardinals to a 24-7 ledger, the Mid-American Conference West Division title and a WNIT berth.

Geary enjoyed considerable success as a head coach at the NCAA Division II level. He led Lake Superior State to the 1988 NCAA Tournament round of 16 in his second season, and the Lakers were 47-10 in his two campaigns at the helm. Geary then embarked on a stellar 17-year stint at Northern Michigan, where his teams compiled a 370-123 record and enjoyed 12 seasons, including eight in succession, with 20 or more victories.

Geary took over a Northern Michigan program that was 9-18 the year before and produced a 24-4 slate in 1988-89. The Wildcats became the first NMU women's basketball team to play in the NCAA Tournament, the first of 11 national tournament appearances under Geary's direction. He was named Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC) Coach of the Year.

Northern Michigan reached the NCAA Tournament Elite Eight (national quarterfinals) in 1996 and advanced to the national semifinals in 1998. The 1997-98 team won a school-record 28 games (28-4) and reached No. 3 in the national rankings. The 1996-97 Wildcats were undefeated in conference play and turned in the best winning percentage (.900, 27-3) in program history, accomplishments that led to Geary's selection as Coach of the Year by the GLIAC and the Basketball Coaches Association of Michigan.

Geary's Northern Michigan teams captured seven GLIAC Tournament crowns, including four consecutive from 1995 to 1998, and played in seven NCAA regional championship games. His players earned five All-America awards and six GLIAC Most Valuable Player honors.

Geary is a 1979 graduate of Aquinas College (Grand Rapids, Mich.) with a bachelor's degree in physical education. He married the former Emily Samuelson in the summer of 2012. Geary has two sons, Sean and Tyler.



Kristy Guffey

Assistant coach Kristy Guffey was added to the Billiken women's basketball coaching staff in May 2013. Guffey, who arrived at Saint Louis following a head-coaching stint at Lee's Summit West High School, will serve as the Billikens' recruiting coordinator and will assist with daily practice planning, scouting and game preparation.

"It is my pleasure to announce the addition of Kristy Guffey to the Billiken

staff," head coach Lisa Stone said. "While Kristy is new to my staff, she is not new to women's college basketball. She is extremely well-connected throughout the country and is known as a relentless recruiter, one of the best in the business.

"In addition to her great recruiting connections, Kristy brings experience, knowledge of the game, energy, excitement and a desire to succeed," Stone said. "She shares my vision for building a championship program at SLU, and I am blessed to have her by my side."

"I am thrilled to be working with Lisa Stone," Guffey said. "She is highly respected across the country, and her energy and passion are delivered every single day to everyone around her. Coach Stone's desire to facilitate growth in the whole person is one of her greatest assets for young people today.

"I feel blessed to be a part of the SLU family," Guffey said. "The support from the administration and the community is outstanding, the facilities are among the best in the country, and the campus radiates beauty year round. I believe great things are in store for SLU women's basketball."

Prior to coaching at Lee's Summit West last season, Guffey spent four years as an assistant coach at Wichita State. Serving as the Shockers' recruiting coordinator, she signed a first-year class of four freshmen and four transfers that was ranked 42nd in the nation. On the court, Guffey was responsible for the development of the Shockers' post players.

Guffey signed players who earned Missouri Valley All-Conference, Defensive Player of the Year and All-Freshman accolades. She helped Wichita State make three consecutive postseason appearances (2010 WBI, 2011 and 2012 WNIT); the Shockers captured their first-ever postseason victory in the 2010 WBI.

Also during Guffey's tenure, Wichita State garnered the first Mid-Major Top 25 national ranking in program history, set a school record for home wins, registered the program's highest MVC victory total in more than a decade, and earned a place on the Women's Basketball Coaches Association's Academic Top 25 Team Honor Roll.

In one season as recruiting coordinator and assistant coach at Missouri State, Guffey signed players who would go on to collect MVC Player of the Year plaudits in 2010 and the league's Freshman of the Year recognition in 2008.

Guffey's experience also includes three years each as head coach at Fort Scott (Kan.) Community College and Notre Dame de Sion College Prep in Kansas City, Mo. Guffey's teams at both schools set program marks for winning percentage, and her Notre Dame de Sion squad won consecutive state championships. She was selected 2000-01 Missouri High School Basketball Coach of the Year.

Guffey is a 1997 graduate of Missouri Valley College, earning a bachelor's degree in education. She was a four-year basketball letter winner for the Vikings. Guffey also holds a master's degree in education from Mid-America Nazarene University (2000).

Assistant Coaches



Linda Sayavongchanh

Assistant coach Linda Sayavongchanh joined the Billiken staff in June 2013. Sayavongchanh, who arrived at Saint Louis following one season as assistant coach/co-recruiting coordinator at the University of North Dakota, is responsible for developing the Billikens' perimeter players, scouting and game preparation, recruiting, academic coordination and summer camps.

"It is my pleasure to welcome Linda Sayavongchanh to my staff and to our Billiken family," head coach Lisa Stone said. "I have known Linda for 11 years as a player, coach and recruiter. I recruited and coached her while serving as head coach at Drake University. She was one of the finest point guards in the Missouri Valley Conference and was instrumental in our success.

"Linda has been in the coaching realm for seven years and is regarded as a rising star in the profession," Stone said. "She has great Midwest recruiting connections that will help us continue to build a successful program.

"Linda has energy, drive and a strong work ethic," Stone said. "She shares my vision of team unity, defense and fundamentals, and she is excited for an opportunity to contribute to the building of a championship program at SLU."

"I feel very blessed to have an opportunity to work with Lisa Stone and be a part of the Billiken family," Sayavongchanh said. "Lisa is a highly respected coach who has been in the business for a long time. I believe she can take the SLU women's basketball program to new heights."

Prior to her stint at North Dakota, Sayavongchanh served three years as an assistant coach at Drake. In her final season, the 2011-12 campaign, the Bulldogs were runners-up in the MVC Tournament and earned a WNIT bid.

Sayavongchanh spent two seasons as a graduate assistant coach at the University of Minnesota Duluth and one year as a student assistant coach at Drake. She has been Drake's summer basketball camp co-director since 2009 and also has assisted at the Minnesota Duluth camp.

Sayavongchanh was a four-year letter winner and two-year team captain at Drake. She was All-Conference honorable mention and an MVC All-Defensive selection in each of her four seasons, and she was named to the 2004 MVC All-Tournament team. Sayavongchanh helped lead the Bulldogs to WNIT appearances in 2004 and 2006.

Sayavongchanh holds a bachelor's degree in elementary education, with endorsements in mathematics and coaching, from Drake (2007). She earned a master's degree in education at Minnesota Duluth in 2009.

What's a Billiken?

The Billiken was born Oct. 8, 1908, when Kansas City art teacher and illustrator Florence Pretz patented a design for an elflike creature with pixie ears, a mischievous smile and a tuft of hair on his pointed head. Reportedly, the image came to her in a dream.

Although it didn't appear on the actual patent, some believe Pretz found the Billiken name in a fanciful work entitled, "Mr. Moon: A Song of the Little People," by Canadian poets Bliss Carman and Richard Hovey.

Within a short time, Pretz sold her patented image to the Billiken Company of Chicago. Initially manufactured as a bank and statuette, and later as a doll, this good luck charm soon became a national craze. By 1911, the Billiken's likeness adorned everything from marshmallow candies to hood ornaments.

In his heyday, the Billiken enjoyed worldwide fame. Artisans in Alaska began carving his image into ivory, and in Japan, he appeared in shrines, amusement parks and even a movie.

Like many other fads, the Billiken might have faded into obscurity if it were not for Saint Louis University law student John Bender, who also happened to be the coach of SLU's football team during the height of Billikenmania.

One story claims that nearby drugstore owner Billy Gunn called Bender a Billiken when the coach walked into his establishment one day. Supposedly, legendary sportswriter William O'Connor was within earshot of the remark and took up the moniker not only for Bender but also for SLU's sports teams.

Another tale claims O'Connor himself dubbed the coach a Billiken after a particularly good practice left Bender beaming with a big smile. After practice, Bender's fellow law student Charles Z. McNamara, a local cartoonist, sketched Bender as a Billiken, posted it in Gunn's drugstore window and tabbed the football team "Bender's Billikens."

Yet another yarn reports that the druggist asked McNamara to decorate his store window the night before a homecoming game. Supposedly, McNamara drew a Billiken, a popular good luck charm, causing one of his fellow students to exclaim, "That looks like coach Bender!"

Whatever the case, O'Connor is generally credited for popularizing the name throughout the city, but one fact flies in the face of this legend and lore. O'Connor did not join the *St. Louis Post-Dispatch* until Nov. 26, 1911, one full month after the newspaper first mentioned "Bender's Billikens."

Regardless of how the story is told or whether his mysterious origins are ever finally resolved, the Billiken remains a good luck charm for Saint Louis University's sports teams and always brings smiles to the faces of SLU fans. Legend has it that the Billiken has three kinds of luck – good, better and best. Buying a Billiken gives the buyer good luck. To have one given to you is better luck. The best luck comes if the Billiken is stolen.
