BILLIKENS BEGIN 18TH SEASON – Saint Louis opens its 18th season of intercollegiate women's soccer tonight when the Billikens host Western Michigan of the Mid-American Conference.

**THE SLU-WESTERN MICHIGAN SERIES** – Saint Louis defeated Western Michigan 1-0 on Oct. 11, 1996, at home in the only meeting between the teams. The Bills are 3-0-0 against MAC squads.

LAST TIME OUT — Six different players scored a goal in Saint Louis' 6-1 exhibition victory over Arkansas State Aug. 16 at Hermann Stadium. Jenny Hummert and Kirsten Clemens recorded a goal and an assist apiece, while Jamei Borges, Livi Logan-Wood, Kailey Pretzlaff and Julia Merlo each found the back of the net. Michelle Schwarz and Tori Belgeri tallied an assist apiece. Hanna Benben made three saves.

**SLU IN SEASON OPENERS** – Saint Louis owns a 10-6-1 mark in season-opening games. The Billikens fell 3-1 at Mississippi in last year's debut.

**BILLS IN HOME OPENERS** – SLU holds a 14-3 record in home openers, including a 1-0 loss to Denver last season. Marquette actually was the first opponent on the 2012 home ledger, but bad weather halted the match before 70 minutes could be played.

ABOUT THE BILLIKENS - Saint Louis returns eight starters and 10 additional players from last year's 5-9-4 team that finished 12th (3-4-2) in the Atlantic 10 Conference. Among the returning starters are senior forwards Maddie Gebauer (3G, 1A) and Jenny Hummert (2G, 3A), who tied for the team scoring lead in 2012. Junior forward Lindsay Elking tallied one goal and three assists last year after earning a starting spot. Senior defender Jessie Jarrett (1G, 1A) is back after helping the Bills post seven shutouts and a 1.11 GAA, as are junior defenders Maddy Bush (1G) and Mary Wright (1A). Additional returning starters are junior forward Abbey Stock and sophomore midfielder Katelyn Hammarlund. Sophomore midfielder Jamei Borges came off the bench and netted three goals in her rookie campaign. Also returning are senior forward Kailey Pretzlaff (1G, 1A), senior midfielder Tori Belgeri, junior defenders Andrea Strebler and Julia Merlo, junior midfielder Mallorie Owens, sophomore forward Livi Logan-Wood, sophomore defenders Colleen Cole and Michelle Schwarz, and sophomore goalkeeper Hanna Benben.

SEVEN FRESHMEN ON BOARD – The Billikens welcome seven freshmen to the 2013 team – defender Kacey Bright, forward Kirsten Clemens, midfielder Tori Marshall, defender Alyssa Mastroianni, forward Molly Piech, forward/midfielder Cristina Rodriguez and midfielder Shaney Sakamoto.

HEAD COACH KATIE SHIELDS – Katie Shields is in her first season as the Billikens' head coach after serving as an assistant to Kat Mertz last year. Prior to her arrival at SLU, Shields spent two seasons as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Northwestern. She served three years in the same capacities at her alma mater, Harvard. Shields began her coaching career with a one-year stint as an assistant at UC Irvine. She is joined on the sideline by four newcomers to the staff – assistant coaches Scott Gloden and Vince Gentile, volunteer assistant Anne Gloden and graduate assistant Maggie Baumann.

RODRIGUEZ COLLECTS PRESEASON HONOR – Freshman forward/midfielder Cristina Rodriguez was selected to the Atlantic 10 Conference preseason All-Rookie team by a vote of the league's head coaches. Rodriguez earned Missouri Class 2 Player of the Year accolades as a junior and senior while helping lead St. Dominic High School in O'Fallon, Mo., to consecutive state titles. She was an All-American in her senior season, earned first-team All-State plaudits three times, collected All-Metro accolades twice and was a four-time All-Conference performer.

BILLS TABBED EIGHTH IN A-10 – The Billikens were picked to finish eighth in the A-10 in the preseason coaches' poll. Dayton and defending champion La Salle tied for the most points in the balloting, with Dayton earning the nod as conference favorite based on an edge in first-place votes. VCU was third, followed by Richmond, Massachusetts, new member George Mason, Saint Joseph's, SLU, Fordham, Rhode Island, George Washington, Duquesne and St. Bonaventure.

RECORD NUMBER OF HOME GAMES ON THE SCHEDULE – After playing just seven games – the fewest in program history – on the home schedule a year ago, the Billikens welcome a record 11 opponents to Robert R. Hermann Stadium this season. The previous high was 10 home games in 1997.

BILLS IN NINTH SEASON IN A-10 — Saint Louis is in its ninth year as a member of the Atlantic 10 Conference. Now consisting of 13 member institutions, the league has a new look this year as Butler, Charlotte, Temple and Xavier have left and George Mason has been added.

BILLIKENS ENJOY RICH HISTORY – The Billikens carry an all-time record of 181-116-43 (.596). In conference play, SLU is 97-52-19 (.634) – 41-26-10 (.597) in the Atlantic 10 and 56-26-9 (.665) in Conference USA, its initial affiliation. Saint Louis played in the NCAA Tournament in 2005 and 2006, reaching the second round both years after claiming the A-10 tournament crown. The Bills have won three regular-season conference titles – 2005 (A-10), 2004 (C-USA) and 1999 (C-USA).

**SLU HISTORICALLY TOUGH AT HOME** – The Billikens are tough to beat at Robert R. Hermann Stadium. Since the facility re-opened in 1999, the Bills are 88-29-16 (.722) at home, including 52-11-8 (.789) in league play.

NATIONAL CHAMPS – Jenny Hummert, Jessie Jarrett, Maddy Bush, Lindsay Elking and Julia Merlo were members of the St. Louis Scott Gallagher team that captured the U.S. Adult Soccer Association U23 national championship this summer. SLSG posted a 2-1 double-overtime victory over FC Wisconsin Nationals in the title match.

# **Head Coach Katie Shields**



On January 15, 2013, Saint Louis University director of athletics Chris May announced Katie Shields as the third head coach in Billiken women's soccer history. Shields was selected to lead the program following one season as a SLU assistant coach.

Prior to her arrival at Saint Louis, Shields spent two seasons as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Northwestern University. She served three years in the same capacities at her alma mater, Harvard University, where she worked with head coach Ray Leone and assistant coach Tracey Leone, now the head coach at Northeastern University. Shields began her coaching career

with a one-year stint as an assistant at the University of California, Irvine under head coach April Heinrichs, who now is Technical Director for the U.S. Women's National Teams

"During our search, we engaged in exhaustive communication with National Team coaches, U.S. Soccer officials and NCAA College Cup coaches," May said. "They were unanimous in their support of Katie Shields as a leader who is ready to be a successful head coach.

"Katie is passionate about soccer and is committed to our department goals of educating student-athletes, competing at the highest level and building community," May said. "We are confident she will develop a championship program by building trust, demonstrating a commitment to excellence and showing she cares about her student-athletes."

"I am thrilled and honored to be the head women's soccer coach at Saint Louis University," Shields said. "I am grateful to (vice president for student development) Dr. Kent Porterfield, Chris May, and (associate director of athletics) Janet Oberle for believing in me and my vision to lead the SLU women's soccer program.

"Under the leadership of our President, Father Biondi, Saint Louis University offers a unique combination of academic prestige, top-notch athletic facilities and a wealth of local soccer tradition, providing a world-class experience for our student-athletes.

"Over the past year, we have made great progress in changing the competitive culture

of the program, and I look forward to continuing to build SLU women's soccer back into a championship-level program," Shields said. "The commitment of the current players and strong recruiting prospects promise a bright future for our program in the classroom, on the field, and in the community."

Shields helped guide Harvard to the Ivy League title and an NCAA Championship berth in 2008 and 2009. She coached two Ivy League Rookies of the Year, 16 All-Conference selections and six National Soccer Coaches Association of America All-Region choices.

In addition to her collegiate coaching experience, Shields served as assistant goalkeeping coach for the Boston Breakers of Women's Professional Soccer under head coach Tony DiCicco in 2009; head coach of the Boston Bolts F.C. girls' youth clubs for two years; and camp director/senior staff member of Soccerplus Goalkeeper School from 2006-11. Earlier this year, she served as an assistant coach for the U.S. Under-18 Women's National Team.

Agoalkeeper, Shields enjoyed a distinguished playing career (2002-05) at Harvard. She garnered All-Ivy accolades all four seasons and was an NSCAA All-Region honoree and team captain her senior campaign. Shields ranked fourth nationally in save percentage in 2005, set a school record for shutouts in a season and helped lead the 2004 Crimson to the NCAA Championship.

Shields is a 2006 graduate of Harvard with a bachelor of arts degree in government. She is pursuing a master's degree in sports administration at Northwestern.

## **Assistant Coach Scott Gloden**

Scott Gloden is in his first season as an assistant women's soccer coach at Saint Louis University.

"It is my pleasure to welcome Scott Gloden to the Billiken soccer family," head coach Katie Shields said. "He is an experienced assistant coach and is well respected in the soccer coaching community. Scott has a strong eye for talent and brings an excellent network of connections with club coaches throughout

the Midwest and the nation that will immediately benefit our recruiting efforts. Scott is a hard-working and detailed coach who is dedicated to our vision of returning SLU women's soccer to a championship-level program."

"I am excited to join coach Shields' staff and the Billiken family," Gloden said. "Women's soccer at SLU is nationally known, and I am humbled to be a part of such a great program. I cannot wait to help the players succeed in the classroom, in the community and on the field."

Gloden most recently served as women's soccer program assistant at the University of Michigan, and he has worked in three other NCAA Division I women's soccer programs. He was an assistant coach in 2011-12 at the University of Cincinnati, where he was responsible for mentoring the Bearcats' goalkeepers, and was the top assistant at Bowling Green State University (2007-11) and Saint Francis (Pa.) University (2004-07). Gloden served as Bowling Green's recruiting coordinator.

Since 2007, Gloden has served as an ODP girls' staff coach with Ohio Youth Soccer Association North in Cleveland. He has spent time as Ohio North head coach and as a Region II staff coach. Additionally, Gloden was a girls' staff coach for the Pacesetter Soccer Club in Sylvania, Ohio, from 2009-12. He was head coach of the club's U-18 team that reached the State Cup semifinals two consecutive years.

Gloden is a 1998 graduate of Michigan, where he earned a bachelor's degree in general studies with a concentration in classical civilization. He holds a master's degree in sports administration from Wayne State (Mich.) University as well as a United States Soccer Federation National "A" coaching license.

Gloden is married to Billiken volunteer assistant coach Anne Gloden.



## Assistant Coach Vince Gentile

St. Louis native Vince Gentile joined the Billiken women's soccer staff as an assistant coach in the spring of 2013.

"Vince Gentile is an excellent addition to our staff," head coach Katie Shields said. "He has an infectious passion for the game, a tireless work ethic and a great soccer mind that our players will benefit from immediately.

"Vince is incredibly well connected within the St. Louis soccer community and

top clubs throughout the country," Shields said. "He is committed to reestablishing SLU women's soccer as a championship-level program, and he will be instrumental in our recruiting efforts to attract the top youth players to Saint Louis University."

"I am thrilled and honored to join coach Shields' staff," Gentile said. "Her vision is to return SLU women's soccer to the top 25 nationally. I share her vision and look forward to working with her to accomplish this."

Gentile has served as a girls' senior staff coach for St. Louis Scott Gallagher SC since 2008, and he also has filled administrative roles with the club. He has been SLSG's 96/97 Elite ECNL girls' head coach since 2007 and the 97/98 Elite ECNL girls' head coach since 2011.

Gentile's other coaching assignments with SLSG include stints as 94/95 Premier girls' head coach (2009-11), 89/90 Blue boys' head coach and trainer (2002-06), and 89/90 girls' assistant coach and trainer (2005-09). The 89/90 girls' team won a national title and was a three-time regional finalist.

From 2004-10, Gentile was the staff and program director for Total Soccer Training Academy in St. Louis. He was an assistant boys' varsity coach at Mary Institute and Saint Louis Country Day School (MICDS) from 2004-06.

In 2009, Gentile was commissioned by SLSG to establish the Premier League (formerly GSLS League), which he oversees. Under his guidance, the Premier League, which serves as a primary development tool for SLSG and the local soccer community, has expanded from 45 teams at its inception to more than 200 teams.

Gentile spent four years (2008-11) overseeing SLSG's player registration program, and he served a two-year term (2010-11) as state registrar for the Missouri Youth Soccer Association.

Prior to attending the University of Notre Dame, Gentile was a threeyear letterman at St. Louis' Christian Brothers College High School Prep. He served as co-captain and helped lead CBC to a state title in 1988.

Gentile was a member of the Region II Olympic Development Program team from 1986-88 and was in the Youth National Pool. He enjoyed success with the Busch Soccer Club, competing for the 1987 national runner-up and playing on teams that captured two regional titles and three state crowns.

Gentile is a 1994 graduate of Notre Dame, earning a bachelor's degree in finance and economics. He holds a U.S. Soccer Federation "A" coaching license and a National Soccer Coaches Association of America national diploma.

Gentile's father, Carl, played three seasons at Saint Louis and was a member of the Billikens' 1963 and 1965 national championship teams.



## **Volunteer Assistant Coach Anne Gloden**

Anne Gloden is in her first season as a volunteer assistant coach for the Saint Louis University women's soccer team.

Gloden served two seasons as an assistant coach at the University of Toledo. She helped guide the Rockets to Mid-American Conference regular-season and tournament titles and an NCAA Championship berth in 2011, as well as a MAC regular-season co-championship in 2010. Gloden was a graduate assistant at

Western Illinois University in 2008 and 2009.

Gloden spent three years as a staff coach with the Michigan Olympic Development Program. She was head coach of the '95 girls' state team

that captured the 2012 Region II championship. Gloden also served a three-year stint as a staff coach for the Pacesetter Soccer Club in Sylvania, Ohio, guiding the club's U-17 team to a berth in the State Cup final.

A 2008 cum laude graduate of Central Michigan University with a bachelor's degree in physical education, Gloden was a four-year starting goalkeeper for the Chippewas. She set school career records for wins, shutouts and saves as well as Mid-American Conference marks for career wins and shutouts. Gloden was a three-time All-Conference selection, earning first-team plaudits as a junior and senior and a second-team nod her sophomore year.

Gloden holds a master's degree in sports management from Western Illinois (2010). She is married to Billiken assistant coach Scott Gloden.
