- •No. 15 seed Saint Louis makes its 2020 NCAA Championship debut Friday night against Washington in a second-round game.
- •The Billikens (15-1) will put a 10-game winning streak on the line in their first-ever meeting with the Huskies and their first game against a Pac-12 Conference opponent since battling Arizona State to a 1-1 draw in 2006.
- •Saint Louis is appearing in the NCAA Championship for a third straight year and fifth time overall. The Billikens have a 2-4 tournament record:

2005 - W, Stanford, 2-0; L, Santa Clara, 4-0

2006 - W, Drake, 2-0; L, Illinois, 4-1

2018 - L, Kansas, 2-1 (2 OT)

2019 – L, Notre Dame, 1-0

- •Saint Louis is 2-0-1 vs. Pac-12 opponents. In addition to the win over Stanford and the tie vs. Arizona State, the Billikens defeated Arizona 5-1 in 2002.
- •SLU captured the Atlantic 10 Conference regular-season and tournament championships, becoming the first team in A-10 women's soccer history to win both titles in three straight seasons.
- •The Billikens are ranked 20th in the United Soccer Coaches national poll. Their highest ranking this season was 17th.
- •With a 15-1 record, the Billikens have clinched the best winning percentage in program history.
- •Tonight's contest is the 499th game in Saint Louis women's soccer history.
- •The Billiken senior class has 65 victories, making it the winningest class in program history.

- •Hannah Friedrich has at least one point in eight of the last nine games. Friedrich has 16 points (3G, 10A) during that span and has taken over the team scoring lead with 22 points (4G, 14A). Her 14 assists are tied for the national lead.
- •A late-season surge has put **Abbie Miller** right behind Friedrich with 20 points (8G, 4A). Miller has 11 points (4G, 3A) over the last five games. She led the Billikens with 14 points (5G, 4A) in A-10 regular-season play.
- •Hannah Larson has a goal in five of the last six games, giving her eight to tie Miller for team-high honors. Larson is third on the team with 17 points (8G, 1A).
- Emily Groark is right behind Miller and Larson with seven goals. Groark has 16 points (7G, 2A).
- •Emily Puricelli has allowed more than one goal in a game just once this season. Puricelli carries a 0.55 GAA and an .833 save percentage.
- •In addition to outscoring its opponents 40-9 in the first 16 games, Saint Louis earned advantages of 260-117 in total shots, 117-58 in shots on goal and 106-34 in corner kicks.
- •Sixteen different Billikens have registered at least one point. Twelve different players have netted SLU's 40 goals.
- •After graduating a group of seniors who comprised what was then the winningest class in program history, Saint Louis has taken on a more youthful appearance. Sophomores and freshmen have logged 71 percent of the minutes this season.
- •Beginning in 2018 and including tournament play, the Billikens are 35-0-1 in their last 36 games against A-10 opponents.
- •Saint Louis has won 79 games from 2016 to the current season, the most of any A-10 women's soccer team.

Record Number of Billikens Earn All-Conference Honors

NEWPORT NEWS, Va. – Nine Saint Louis University women's soccer student-athletes, including three major award winners, earned 2020-21 Atlantic 10 Conference postseason honors, the league announced Wednesday.

Junior forward **Hannah Friedrich** was selected Offensive Player of the Year; freshman goalkeeper **Emily Puricelli** was chosen Defensive Player of the Year; and sophomore midfielder **Abbie Miller** was tabbed Midfielder of the Year.

Joining that trio on the All-Conference first team are senior defender **Brionna Halverson**, freshman defenders **Lyndsey Heckel** and **Sophia Stram**, and freshman forward **Hannah Larson**.

Junior forward **Emily Groark** was named to the All-Conference second team, while Puricelli, Heckel, Larson and Stram collected All-Rookie plaudits. The Billikens placed at least one player on the All-Rookie unit for a fifth straight year.

SLU set program records for first-team honorees (seven); number of honorees on the first and second teams combined (eight); and All-Rookie choices (four).

Puricelli's selection as Defensive Player of the Year extended the Billikens' streak of claiming the award to five consecutive seasons. Kacey Bright won in 2016, and Alli Klug was the recipient the past three years. Additionally, a Saint Louis goalkeeper made the All-Conference first team for a fifth straight year; Puricelli joined Mary Niehaus (2016, 2017, 2019) and Olivia Silverman (2018) in that group.

Miller became the second Billiken in as many years to garner Midfielder of the Year plaudits, joining 2019 recipient Courtney Reimer. Friedrich is Saint Louis' first conference Offensive Player of the Year.

Senior defender **Elli Brunts** was selected to the 11-member All-Academic team by the league's women's soccer sports information representatives.

Friedrich earned All-Conference honors for a third consecutive season after making the 2019 first team and the 2018 second team. She leads the Billikens with 18 points (2G, 14A), and her 14 assists lead the nation and are just one shy of matching the school record. Friedrich ranks third in the A-10 in points per game (1.29).

Puricelli tops the A-10 and ranks 16th nationally with six shutouts. She also leads the league in goals against average (0.56, 34th nationally), goalkeeper minutes played (1285:29, 34th nationally) and save percentage (.849, 44th nationally).

Miller is second on the team in all games with 16 points (6G, 4A). She led the Billikens in A-10 contests with 14 points (5G, 4A).

Halverson is a repeat selection on the All-Conference team; she collected second-team laurels in 2019. She has one goal this season. Heckel leads the team with 1,289 minutes and has two goals and an assist, while Stram has contributed three goals and an assist. The trio joined Puricelli on a backline that limited opponents to eight goals and averages of 7.6 shots, 4.1 shots on goal and 2.2 corner kicks in 14 games.

Larson is tied for the A-10 lead and is 27th in the nation in game-winning goals (three). She has a team-high-tying seven goals in all and is tied for sixth in the conference in goals per game (0.50).

Groark also has seven goals, two of which are game-winners. She is tied for sixth in the A-10 in goals per game (0.50).

Brunts has two assists on the season. She carries a 4.0 grade point average with a double major in accounting and entrepreneurship.

SAINT LOUIS RALLIES TO WIN A-10 TOURNAMENT CROWN

- •Hannah Friedrich scored in the 89th minute to push Saint Louis past Davidson 2-1 in the A-10 Championship final April 17.
- •Davidson led 1-0 at halftime the first time SLU has trailed in a conference tournament game during its current three-year title run but **Abbie Miller's** penalty-kick goal in the 57th minute tied it and set the stage for Friedrich's dramatic late strike.

BILLIKENS REACH TOP 10 IN RPI

- •Through April 18, Saint Louis is No. 7 in the NCAA Division I Ratings Percentage Index.
- •The Billikens trail only Florida State, Arkansas, North Carolina, Texas A&M, UCLA and Georgetown.

BILLIKENS PILED UP ATLANTIC 10 WEEKLY HONORS

- •Six different Billikens combined to earn a total of 11 Atlantic 10 Conference weekly awards this season.
- •Hannah Larson collected three Rookie of the Week nods (March 8-14, March 29-April 4, April 5-11).
- •Three players were recognized twice Emily Puricelli, Defensive Player of the Week (Feb. 22-28, March 29-April 4); Abbie Miller, Offensive Player of the Week (March 15-21, April 5-11); and Sophia Stram, Rookie of the Week (Feb. 22-28, March 22-28).
- •Anna Walsh (Feb. 15-21) and Emily Groark (Feb. 22-28) were named Offensive Player of the Week.

TOP DRAWER SOCCER RECOGNIZES BILLIKENS

- •Hannah Friedrich (April 12-18), Abbie Miller (March 15-21), Emily Puricelli (Feb. 8-14) and Hannah Larson (Feb. 1-7) were selected to the Top Drawer Soccer national Team of the Week.
- •Friedrich earned honorable mention for the weeks of Feb. 8-14 and Feb. 22-28. Puricelli garnered honorable mention for the week of March 1-7.

BILLIKENS PERFECT IN LEAGUE PLAY FOR THIRD TIME

- •Saint Louis' perfect (8-0-0) conference record this year is the third in program history and second in the past three seasons. The 2018 Billikens were 10-0-0, and the 2005 team was 8-0-0 in SLU's first year in the A-10.
- •The undefeated league ledger is the fifth for Billiken women's soccer. The 2019 (9-0-1, A-10) and 2000 (8-0-3, Conference USA) squads were unbeaten.

FRIEDRICH CLIMBING CAREER LISTS

- •Hannah Friedrich ranks among the top 10 on six Saint Louis career statistical lists.
- •Friedrich owns the school record of 13 game-winning goals. Five of those clinchers have come in the 84th minute or later, including two golden goals.
- •She is third in points (80; needs only two to take over second place) and game-winning assists (12), fourth in goals (26) and assists (28), and sixth in shots (179) on SLU's career lists.
- •In her freshman season (2018), Friedrich scored a school record 30 points (11G, 8A); her 11 goals were good for a third-place tie on SLU's all-time single-season chart.
- •She followed with another 11-goal output in 2019, and her 28 points (11G, 6A) tied for fourth on the Billikens' single-season list.
- •Friedrich scored a school-record seven game-winning goals last year, including a pair of golden goals.
- •Friedrich's game-winning goals (13) and game-winning assists (12) combined total of 25 is the highest in Billiken women's soccer history.

HEAD COACH KATIE SHIELDS

- •Now in her eighth season leading the Billikens, 2018 and 2019 Atlantic 10 Conference Coach of the Year **Katie Shields** owns a 101-45-12 career record (all at Saint Louis) for a .677 winning percentage.
- •Shields, who spent one season as a SLU assistant before taking the head-coaching reins, has guided the Billikens to a conference-best 79-16-7 (.809) mark since 2016. That record includes a 41-3-4 (.896) ledger in A-10 regular-season play.
- •Shields' Billikens are playing in the NCAA Championship for a third straight season after becoming the first team in A-10 women's soccer history to win both regular-season and tournament titles in three consecutive years.
- •During Shields' tenure, Saint Louis players have earned All-America honors twice, All-Region plaudits 14 times and Atlantic 10 accolades (first team, second team, All-Rookie) 45 times. In addition, Billikens have been selected A-10 Defensive Player of the Year five times (each of the last five seasons), Midfielder of the Year twice (each of the last two seasons), and Offensive Player of the Year and Rookie of the Year once each.
- •Shields began the 2020 campaign ranked 38th in winning percentage among active NCAA Division I head coaches.

SAINT LOUIS GAME NOTES VS. WASHINGTON • NCAA SECOND ROUND

FRESHMAN CLASS MAKING IMMEDIATE CONTRIBUTION

- •The Billiken freshman class has played a vital role this season.
- •Five rookies goalkeeper Emily Puricelli, midfielders Hannah Larson and Jess Preusser, and defenders Lyndsey Heckel and Sophia Stram have combined for 77 of the team's 176 starts. All but Preusser have started all 16 games.
- •Forward Caroline Kelly, midfielder Jenna Faybrick and forward/midfielder Gracie English also have seen action for SLU.

SAINT LOUIS IN 25TH SEASON OF WOMEN'S SOCCER

- •The 2020 season is the 25th in the history of Saint Louis University women's soccer.
- •The Billikens are 282-161-55 overall, a .621 winning percentage.
- •In conference play (Conference USA 1996-2004, Atlantic 10 since 2005), SLU is 148-68-26 (.665).
- •This year, the Billikens have secured a 16th winning season, a 10th season with a winning percentage of .700 or better, and the best winning percentage in program history.
- •Saint Louis has captured 11 conference championships (six regular-season, five tournament) and is making its fifth NCAA Championship appearance (2005, 2006, 2018, 2019, 2020). The 2005 and 2006 Billikens reached the second round.

SLU RECORDS A PROGRAM FIRST WITH DOUBLE-OT WINS

- •Saint Louis defeated St. Bonaventure 1-0 March 14 and topped Dayton 3-2 March 18, both in double overtime.
- •It marked the first time in Billiken women's soccer history that SLU played double overtime in consecutive games and won both.

18 RETURN FROM 2019

- •Saint Louis returned four starters and 14 additional players from its 2019 team that captured A-10 regular-season and tournament titles and earned an NCAA Championship bid for a second straight season. The Billikens were 17-4-2 overall and were undefeated (9-0-1) in league play for a second straight year.
- •Among the returning starters are three A-10 postseason honorees junior midfielder **Hannah Friedrich** (All-Conference first team), senior defender **Brionna Halverson** (All-Conference second team) and sophomore midfielder **Anna Lawler** (All-Rookie team). Junior forward/midfielder **Emily Groark** also is a returning starter.
- •Joining Halverson in the senior class are defender/midfielder Elli Brunts, forward Annabelle Copeland and forward/midfielder Megan Nixon
- •Friedrich and Groark are joined in the junior class by goalkeeper **Kasey Hartmann** and midfielder **Brianna Hatfield**.
- •In addition to Lawler, the sophomore class includes forward/midfielder Brianna Arthur, defender Sydney Beach, defender Emma Christanell, midfielder/forward Hadley Cytron (transferred to SLU in January 2020), midfielder/defender Jaime DeBerardinis, defender Sophia Denison, midfielder Karsen Kohl, defender Marissa Lesko, midfielder Abbie Miller and midfielder Anna Walsh.

BILLS MAKE HERMANN STADIUM A SOCCER FORTRESS

- •Saint Louis is 45-2-5 in its last 52 games on the home pitch of Robert R. Hermann Stadium, a stretch that dates to the final home game of the 2015 campaign.
- •In those 52 games, the Billikens outscored their opponents 117-20, registered 32 shutouts, and never allowed more than one goal.
- •SLU was 8-1 at Hermann this season after going 11-0-1 at home a year ago.

KEEPING THEM AT HOME

- •Saint Louis traditionally has featured a large number of players from its back yard, and this season is no exception.
- •Seventeen of the 27 players on the Billikens' roster are from the St. Louis area. Of those 17 players, 13 hail from the Missouri side of the Mississippi River, four from the Illinois side.

SCHEDULE SHORTER, BUT CHALLENGES WERE THERE

- •The Billikens played just six non-conference games this spring, but they were tested.
- •SLU's season opener was a 4-1 win over a Kansas City team that registered a 13-4-4 record in 2019.
- •In a clash of defending conference champions and NCAA Championship qualifiers, the Billikens claimed a 2-0 victory over 2019 Big East winner Xavier.
- •Saint Louis posted a 3-1 win over Illinois State, which was the 2019 Missouri Valley Conference regular-season and tournament runner-up while turning in a 14-6 record.
- •The Billikens recorded a 3-1 road victory over an Arkansas team that went 9-2, won a second straight Southeastern Conference regular-season crown and earned a top-10 national ranking in the fall.
- •In a battle of nationally ranked teams, SLU took Oklahoma State to overtime before falling 1-0 on a penalty kick. The Cowgirls finished third in the Big 12 Conference last fall.

WHAT'S A BILLIKEN?

The Billiken was born Oct. 8, 1908, when Kansas City art teacher and illustrator Florence Pretz patented a design for an elflike creature with pixie ears, a mischievous smile and a tuft of hair on his pointed head. Reportedly, the image came to her in a dream.

Although it didn't appear on the actual patent, some believe Pretz found the Billiken name in a fanciful work entitled, "Mr. Moon:

A Song of the Little People," by Canadian poets Bliss Carman and Richard Hovey.

Within a short time, Pretz sold her patented image to the Billiken Company of Chicago. Initially manufactured as a bank and statuette, and later as a doll, this good luck charm soon became a national craze. By 1911, the Billiken's likeness adorned everything from marshmallow candies to hood ornaments.

In his heyday, the Billiken enjoyed worldwide fame. Artisans in Alaska began carving his image into ivory, and in Japan, he appeared in shrines, amusement parks and even a movie.

Like many other fads, the Billiken might have faded into obscurity if it were not for Saint Louis University law student John Bender, who also happened to be the coach of SLU's football team during the height of Billikenmania.

One story claims that nearby drugstore owner Billy Gunn called Bender a Billiken when the coach walked into his establishment one day. Supposedly, legendary sportswriter William O'Connor was within earth at of the remark and tool

was within earshot of the remark and took up the moniker not only for Bender but also for SLU's sports teams.

Another tale claims O'Connor himself dubbed the coach a Billiken after a particularly good practice left Bender beaming with a big smile. After practice, Bender's fellow law student Charles Z. McNamara, a local cartoonist, sketched Bender as a Billiken, posted it in Gunn's drugstore window and tabbed the football team "Bender's Billikens."

Yet another yarn reports that the druggist asked McNamara to decorate his store window the night before a homecoming game. Supposedly, McNamara drew a Billiken, a popular good luck charm, causing one of his fellow students to exclaim, "That looks like coach Bender!"

Whatever the case, O'Connor is generally credited for popularizing the name throughout the city, but one fact flies in the face of this legend and lore. O'Connor did not join the St. Louis Post-Dispatch until Nov. 26, 1911, one full month after the newspaper first mentioned "Bender's Billikens."

Regardless of how the story is told or whether his mysterious origins are ever finally resolved, the Billiken remains a good luck charm for Saint Louis University's sports teams and always brings smiles to the faces of SLU fans.

Legend has it that the Billiken has three kinds of luck – good, better and best. Buying a Billiken gives the buyer good luck. To have one given to you is better

luck. The best luck comes if the Billiken is stolen.


