## NOTABLES

- Saint Louis heads to Brooklyn, N.Y., and the Barclays Center for the 2023 Atlantic 10 Conference Men's Basketball Championship.
- The Billikens have cut down the nets twice at Barclays Center – in 2013 in the first year the A-10 held the Championship in Brooklyn, and again in 2019, the last time Barclays Center hosted the full A-10 Championship. SLU was the No. 4 seed in the 2020 A-10 Championship at Barclays Center, but the tourney was canceled on the Thursday of Championship Week due to COVID.
- In all, Saint Louis has won three conference tournament titles – the 2000 Conference USA Championship in addition to the 2013 and 2019 A-10 Championships. SLU owns a 17-14 all-time record in A-10 Championship tilts.
- SLU and Davidson are the only teams that have advanced to the semifinals of the last three A-10 Championships.
- **Yuri Collins**, a finalist for the Cousy Award as the nation's top PG, leads the NCAA in assists (304) and assists/game (10.1). He owns both the single-season and career A-10 assists records.
- In addition to Collins' gaudy assists numbers, he scores 11.3 ppg making him the only player in the NCAA averaging a points/assists double-double. Also, his 175 career steals rank fourth in school history, and Collins enters the A-10 Championship 18 points away from reaching 1,000 for his career.
- **Gibson Jimerson** leads the Billikens in scoring with 14.0 ppg. He ranks second in the A-10 in 3FG percentage (.397) and third in 3-pointers made per game (2.61).
- **Francis Okoro** is the A-10 leader in rebounds per game (8.8) and ranks fourth in blocks per game (1.4).
- Saint Louis leads the A-10 in rebounds per game (38.4), fastbreak points per game (12.9), assists per game (16.2) and assist/turnover ratio (1.34). The Billikens enter the Championship second in the A-10 in scoring offense with 75.3 ppg.

## BILLIKENS CAPTURE NO. 4 SEED IN A-10 CHAMPIONSHIP

► Saint Louis is the No. 4 seed for the 2023 Atlantic 10 Conference Men's Basketball Championship, which is being held this week at Barclays Center in Brooklyn, N.Y.

► The Billikens will open the Championship on Thursday, March 9, at 2 p.m. (ET) in a quarterfinal matchup against either #13 UMass, #12 Richmond or #5 George Mason. UMass and Richmond play Tuesday at 11:30 a.m. (ET), with the winner advancing to take on George Mason Wednesday at 2 p.m. (ET). The winner of that game advances to face SLU.

► If the Billikens advance to the semifinals, they would play Saturday at 1 p.m. (ET). The A-10 Championship game is set for Sunday at 1 p.m. (ET).

► Friday, March 10, is a designated off day. Teams will take part in a closed practice and press conference at Barclays Center.

## FOLLOWING THE ACTION

► All SLU games at the A-10 Men's Basketball Championship will air on KMOX 1120 AM. Billiken Hall of Famers and longtime SLU men's basketball radio partners **Bob Ramsey** and **Earl Austin Jr.** are on the call, as usual. Ramsey is in his 37th season calling Billiken hoops, while Austin is in his 32nd year.

► Tuesday's first-round games will be streamed live on ESPN+. The second round games on Wednesday and Thursday's quarterfinals will be televised nationally on USA Network. Saturday's semifinals air on CBS Sports Network, while Sunday's title game will be televised on CBS.

### SLU SEARCHING FOR THIRD A-10 TITLE; FOURTH OVERALL

► Saint Louis is one of seven active A-10 schools that has won multiple A-10 Championship crowns.

► The first came in 2013, when the No. 1-seed Billikens rolled through a stacked A-10 that featured five NCAA Tournament squads that year including SLU. The others were Butler, La Salle, Temple and VCU.

► The most recent Billikens' A-10 crown came in 2019, when sixth-seeded SLU reeled off four wins in four days to capture the A-10 title at Barclays Center.

► Prior to the 2013 title, the Billikens' only other conference championship came in 2000 when Saint Louis was in Conference USA. As the No. 9 seed, the Billikens won four games in four days at the Pyramid in Memphis, Tennessee. To this day, SLU fans refer to it simply as "The Miracle in Memphis."

## BACK TO BROOKLYN

► It's the 10-year anniversary of the Billikens' 2013 Atlantic 10 Conference title, which was the first year the tourney was held in the Barclays Center. SLU also cut down the nets in the 2019 A-10 Championship in this building.

► SLU is 8-5 all-time in games played at Barclays Center. In addition to the A-10 Championships played here (2013-16 and 2019), SLU had neutral-site games against Louisville in 2015 and Pitt in 2021 at Barclays Center.

## BILLIKENS ON THE BOARDS

► Saint Louis leads the Atlantic 10 and ranks 25th nationally in team rebounding with 38.4 rebounds per game. When breaking it down to defensive rebounds per game, the Billikens are ninth nationally with 28.2 drpg.

► SLU is led on the glass by **Francis Okoro's** 8.8 rpg, which leads the A-10. Okoro is 22nd in the NCAA with 3.3 offensive rebounds per game.

► The Billikens were the A-10 leader in rebounding in each of the last four seasons – 2018-19 through 2021-22 – and they are leading the league this season as well.

## THAT'S OFFENSIVE

► Saint Louis has been among the league leaders in scoring offense all year and enter the Championship second in the Atlantic 10 in scoring at 75.3 ppg. The Billikens are 17-2 this season when scoring 70 or more points.

► The Bills also lead the A-10 in assists (16.2 per game), assist/turnover ratio (1.34) and fastbreak points (12.9 per game). As a team, SLU ranks third in the league in both FG percentage and 3FG percentage, and fifth in FT percentage.

## 20 WINS

► Saint Louis has reached 20 or more victories in four straight seasons (not counting the shortened COVID season of 2020-21). That is the longest stretch of consecutive 20-win seasons in school history.

## ASSISTS KING

► Point guard **Yuri Collins** continues to lead the NCAA, overwhelmingly, in assists (304) and assists/game (10.1).

► His 858 career assists are the most in A-10 history and rank 23rd in NCAA history. Collins is in the top 20 in NCAA history in career assists average (7.52).

► Collins is the only player in the NCAA averaging a points/assists double-double as he scores 11.3 points to go along with his 10.1 assists. Only four players in NCAA history have finished a season averaging a points/assists double-double – **Avery Johnson** (Southern, 1987-88), **Anthony Manuel** (Bradley, 1987-88), **Jason Brickman** (LIU Brooklyn, 2013-14) and **Ja Morant** (Murray State, 2018-19).

► Collins will be the first player to lead the NCAA in assists average in back-to-back seasons since LIU Brooklyn's **Jason Brickman** did so in 2013 and 2014.

► Collins holds every assists record in school history – career (858), single-season (304, 2022-23) and single-game (20 vs. Tennessee State earlier this year).

► He became the A-10 single-season leader in assists in the Dayton game, surpassing Temple's **Howard Evans'** 294 assists in the 1987-88 season.

► Collins is the NCAA's active leader in career assists (858). His 7.50 career assists per game average is tops all-time in the A-10, leads all active players in DI, and ranks in the top 20 all-time in the NCAA.

► Collins had a school-record 20 assists against Tennessee State Nov. 30 with just one (!) turnover. Collins' 20 assists also equaled the A-10 record and are the most in the NCAA this season. His previous school record of 19 assists was set vs. Boston College last season.

► He has recorded 10+ assists in 17 games so far this year.

► Collins is one of five finalists for the 2023 **Bob Cousy Award** and is on the 2023 **Oscar Robertson Trophy** Midseason Watch List. The Cousy Award, which is sponsored by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame, recognizes the top point guard in men's NCAA Division I basketball. The Oscar Robertson Trophy is the US Basketball Writer's Association Player of the Year award. In December, he was presented the **Carl O. Bauer Award** at the Jack Buck Awards banquet at the Missouri Athletic Club. The Bauer Award recognizes the top amateur sports figure in St. Louis.

► In addition to his assists totals, Collins is among the top defenders in school history. He is fourth in school history with 175 career steals, five away from surpassing Josh Fisher for third. Also, Collins needs just 18 more points to reach 1,000 for his career.

## JIMERSON LEADS TEAM IN SCORING

► **Gibson Jimerson** leads the Billikens with 14.0 ppg. He led the team in scoring last year as well.

► Jimerson leads the team and is third in the A-10 with 2.61 3-pointers made per game. His 39.7 percent shooting mark from 3-point range is second in the conference.

► His 81 treys this season are fifth in a single season in SLU history. With seven more, he could get to No. 2 on the single-season list. Jimerson's 87 3-pointers last season were tied for the second in school history.

► Against Drake earlier this season, Jimerson became the 34th Billiken to reach 1,000 career points. That gameday against Drake was a unique experience for Jimerson, or any college basketball player for that matter. In the morning, he walked across the stage at Chaifetz Arena as he received his undergraduate degree in international business. Then, that night at Chaifetz Arena, he played against Drake and scored his 1,000th point.

► Jimerson continues to soar up the all-time scoring list and is now 18th with 1,276 career points.

► Jimerson is fourth all-time in school history with 229 3-pointers, two away from **Scott Highmark** in third.

► Jimerson ranks among the SLU program's top shooters of all-time. He is fifth in school history in 3-point FG percentage and fourth in FT percentage.

► While this is Jimerson's fourth season with the Billikens, he is technically a sophomore eligibility wise. He received a medical hardship waiver his first season (2019-20) after injuring his foot after playing in 10 games, the maximum amount of games allowed for him to play in and still receive the waiver. The 2020-21 season did not count against a players' eligibility due to the pandemic.

## OKORO LEADING THE BILLIKENS AND ATLANTIC 10 IN REBOUNDING

► Senior forward **Francis Okoro** leads the A-10 in rebounding with 8.8 per game.

► Against La Salle Feb. 21, he pulled down a career-high 20 rebounds, the most by a player in the A-10 this season and the most by a Billiken since **Hasahn French** recorded 24 rebounds against Belmont in the 2019-

20 season. Included in Okoro's total of 20 boards were 11 on the offensive glass, tied for the most offensive rebounds by a player in the NCAA this season.

► Okoro's 17 career double-doubles lead all active Billikens.

► He is an efficient shooter as well. His career FG percentage of .578 (231-400) is currently good for second in school history behind **Melvin Robinson** (1989-92, .636).

## PERKINS IS BACK

► Guard **Javonte Perkins** has started every game for the Billikens after missing all of last season with a torn ACL. He is third on the team with 11.1 ppg and second in A-10 games only, averaging 11.0 ppg.

► Perkins went for a season-high 28 points in the Bills' road game at Richmond, where he shot 10-of-16 from the field and 4-of-8 from 3-point range. Earlier this year, he scored 27 points at George Washington on Jan. 14, including his 1,000th career point.

► In 2020-21, Perkins earned second-team All-Conference honors after leading the Billikens in scoring with 17.1 ppg. As a junior in 2019-20, Perkins was voted the A-10 Sixth Man of the Year after leading the Billikens with 18.2 ppg in A-10 play.

► Perkins announced on March 28, 2022, that he would return for another season. That came after fans chanted "One More Year" while Perkins was being honored on Senior Day at Chaifetz Arena last year.

## FORD CLIMBING SLU COACHING LISTS

► **Travis Ford** is third in SLU history with 132 wins, having recently passed legendary head coach **Charlie Spoonhour**. Spoonhour went 122-90 in seven years with the Billikens from 1992-99.

► The Billikens reached 20 wins this season for the fourth time in Ford's tenure. He and Eddie Hickey are the only coaches in SLU history to lead the Bills to four or more 20-win seasons.

► Ford is one of five SLU head coaches who have a tenure lasting seven or more seasons.

► Ford has guided the Billikens to nine win in conference championships, the most in school history.



## REMEMBERING FORD STUEN

► The Billikens remember and honor assistant coach **Ford Stuen**, who passed away May 11, 2021, at the age of 29. Stuen, the nephew of head coach **Travis Ford**, played at Oklahoma State for his uncle and served on the SLU staff for five years.

► The Billikens wear a patch on their jersey with the "FS" script. That is how Ford would sign his name on the many hand-written notes and letters that he would send to family, friends, and coaching colleagues.

► The program has taken up one of Ford's favorite quotes: **"The Journey is the Reward"**

► On opening night last season, Nov. 9, 2021, a banner was unveiled honoring **Ford Stuen** that will forever hang in the Chaifetz Arena rafters.

## THATCH OUT FOR SEASON WITH TORN ACL

► **Fred Thatch Jr.** suffered a torn ACL against UMass on Jan. 4, ending his 2022-23 season.

► Thatch, who already has two degrees from SLU and is working on his third, announced that he will forgo his remaining year of eligibility, thus ending his college basketball career.

► Thatch played in 109 career games for the Billikens and scored 685 career points. He also averaged 4.0 rebounds. Thatch was a big part of the 2018-19 team that won the A-10 and played in the NCAA Tournament. In fact, he grabbed the final rebound in the 2019 A-10 Championship game at Barclays Center to start the SLU celebration.

► He had the best season of his career last year, finishing the season fourth on the team in scoring (9.3 ppg) and third in rebounding (5.5 rpg). He averaged 6.2 points for the Billikens this year.

## BASKETBALL BLOODLINES

► The Billikens' three local true freshmen are all sons of former NCAA Division I players.

► **Larry Hughes Jr.** is the son of Billiken great **Larry Hughes**. Larry Hughes played one season at SLU in 1997-98 before enjoying a long and successful career in the NBA. In his lone season with the Bills, Larry Hughes scored a school record 670 points and led the Bills to an NCAA Tournament appearance. Additionally, Larry Hughes Jr.'s sister, Laurnyn, graduated from SLU in 2021 and played for SLU's women's basketball team.

## HOME SWEET CHAIFETZ

► Saint Louis is in its 15th season playing inside the 10,600-seat Chaifetz Arena.

► SLU is 196-68 all-time at Chaifetz Arena, including 15-3 this year.

► Chaifetz Arena is named after SLU alumnus **Dr. Richard A. Chaifetz**. Dr. Chaifetz is a world-renowned entrepreneur and business leader, who in 1984 founded ComPsych Corporation, which today is the world's largest provider of employee assistance programs, behavioral health and wellness services.

## BILLIKENS IN THE A-10

► This is Saint Louis' 18th year playing in the Atlantic 10 Conference.

► The Billikens have an all-time record of 163-135 in A-10 tilts.

► Saint Louis has won two Atlantic 10 Conference regular-season crowns (2013 and 2014) and two A-10 tournament titles (2013 and 2019).

## JIMERSON UP FOR ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICAN

► **Gibson Jimerson**, who graduated with a degree in international business with a GPA above 3.9, was named Academic All-American last season and is up for the award against this year.

► He is vying to become the first Billiken since **Scott Highmark** to earn two Academic All-American honors.

► Other Academic All-Americans in school history are **John Kilo** (1967), **Rich Niemann** (1968), **Ted Mimitz** (1986), **Scott Highmark** (1994 & 1995), **Kevin Lisch** (2009) and **Brian Conklin** (2012).

## MASTER CLASS

► The Billikens are experienced this season both on the court and in the classroom.

► Six SLU players have already received undergraduate degrees **Francis Okoro** (B.A. Environmental Studies) and **Javonte Perkins** (B.A. Sociology) graduated last spring. **Jake Forrester** and **Javon Pickett** earned undergrad degrees from Temple and Missouri, respectively. **Gibson Jimerson** (B.S. International Business) received his undergraduate degree on Dec. 17 of this season.

► **Fred Thatch Jr.** has already earned two degrees from SLU and is working on another. Thatch graduated last spring with an MBA after earning a B.S. in Marketing in 2021. He is now working toward a Master's in Supply Chain Management.

## BILLIKENS SIGN THREE TO NLIS

► The Billikens signed three players to National Letters of Intent last November. All three will begin their four years of eligibility next season.

► **Cian Medley** (Sicklerville, N.J.) is the point guard for Camden High in New Jersey and played on the EYBL circuit for NJ Scholars Elite.

► **Brock Vice** (Germantown, Tenn.) is a 6-foot-10 power forward who starred in both football and basketball at Houston High School in the Memphis area.

► **Bruce Zhang** (Nanchang, China) is a 7-foot center who is currently playing at The Skill Factory in Atlanta.

## QUICK HISTORY LESSON

► The Billikens won the 1948 National Invitation Tournament. That team was led by **Ed Macauley**, who went on to an NBA Hall of Fame career. Easy Ed's No. 50 is retired by SLU.

► The AP poll was first released the next season, and SLU was the first-ever No. 1 in the inaugural poll on January 17, 1949.

► **Anthony Bonner** (1986-90) is the Billikens' school-record holder in points (1,972) and rebounds (1,424). In 2018-19, Bonner was in Brooklyn for the Billikens' run to the title and cut down a piece of the net.

► SLU owns two regular-season A-10 titles (2013 and 2014), and it won the A-10 Tournament in 2013 and 2019 at Barclays Center in Brooklyn, N.Y.

► The Billikens have made 10 NCAA Tournament appearances, the last coming in 2019. SLU made three straight NCAA Tournaments from 2012-14, winning its opening game in all three.

## TRAVIS FORD

### Head Coach

Kentucky, 1994

Record at SLU: 132-88 (7th year)

Overall Record: 468-354 (26th year)

In seven years as Saint Louis University's head men's basketball coach, Travis Ford has reinvigorated the program and reestablished its place on the national stage.

Hired in March 2016, Ford inherited a program that won 11 games in each of the two years prior. He proceeded to improve the Billikens' win total over the next four seasons.

Ford's tenure at SLU has been highlighted by three postseason appearances. Saint Louis captured the 2019 Atlantic 10 Conference Championship in dramatic fashion in Brooklyn and went to the NCAA Tournament. In a 2020-21 season that was derailed by COVID-19, the Billikens still managed to be in the conversation on Selection Sunday and ultimately was awarded a No. 1 seed in the NIT. The Billikens again went to the NIT in 2021-22. SLU was positioned for another postseason bid in 2019-20, but the season was canceled in March as SLU was preparing for the A-10 Championship.

The 2022-23 season is Ford's seventh year at SLU and his 26th season overall as a head coach. He has a 131-88 record at SLU and a 467-354 record overall.

Ford's 132 wins are third in program history. In 2022-23, Ford joined just five other SLU head coaches who have a tenure lasting seven or more seasons.

In addition to his six years at SLU, Ford has had head-coaching stints at Oklahoma State (eight years, 2008-16), Massachusetts (three years, 2005-08), Eastern Kentucky (five years, 2000-05) and Campbellsville (1997-2000). Ford has led his team to the NCAA Tournament seven times. He has coached seven players who have gone on to play in the NBA and eight who have been named a conference player of the year.

Ford came to SLU after eight seasons as head coach at Oklahoma State University, where he led the Cowboys to a 155-111 record and five NCAA Tournament appearances. He recruited three McDonald's All-Americans to Stillwater during his tenure.

Ford played the majority of his collegiate career at the University of Kentucky, helping the Wildcats to NCAA Tournament appearances in each of his three seasons (1992, 1993, 1994). He was a junior on the 1993 Wildcat team that advanced to the NCAA Final Four. Ford transferred to Kentucky after one season (1989-90) at the University of Missouri.

Ford is a native of Madisonville, Kentucky. He and his wife, Heather, have three children: Brooks, Kyleigh and Shane. Ford earned a bachelor's degree in communications at the University of Kentucky in 1994.

## SLU's veterans lead win over Dayton on senior night

The lengthy list of honorees on senior night at St. Louis University said a lot about the experience packed into the Billikens' roster that took the court at Chaifetz Arena for the last time Friday night.

As college basketball goes, this group is long in the tooth. Or to put it more succinctly, the Billikens are old.

In theory, that should be an advantage in pressure situations. It probably didn't hurt in a 65-61 win over Dayton in the final tuneup for the Atlantic 10 tournament next week in Brooklyn.

"You never stop learning, and I don't know if I've ever coached a team quite this old," SLU coach Travis Ford said. "But lately, I think experience has helped us a little bit. We've learned hopefully a lot that can help us be our best right now. It's different coaching a team this old. It's been a little bit different."

SLU and Dayton started the season as co-favorites in the A-10 but are now in a tie for second that the Flyers win via tiebreaker. The Billikens will wait for results of Saturday's games to find out if they are the third or fourth seed for the conference tournament.

The Billikens (20-11 overall, 12-6 in the A-10) might not have executed well enough to challenge for the title, but Ford said the mentality has been right recently.

Everyone in the program is looking for a reason for hope entering the tournament, where the Billikens would need three wins for an NCAA Tournament berth.

"In timeouts, instead of coach drawing something up, we talk among each other about what we need to do," senior Javonte Perkins said. "He says, 'You're the ones out there playing.' He gives us freedom to talk."

All of those years of cumulative experience showed on the court as everyone made a fairly significant contribution.

Perkins, who maxed out his eligibility, had 17 points and two clutch free throws. Javon Pickett had nine rebounds and Jake Forrester had six. Francis Okoro had 10 points and nine rebounds, and his defense helped limit Dayton's DaRon Holmes II.

"He's a great player and you've seen what he's done all season," Okoro said. "My mentality was to make him uncomfortable a little bit. My teammates helped and I didn't want to get in foul trouble."

After a six-game win streak, SLU was up and down the remainder of the season, splitting its final 10 games. That included a loss at Dayton by 14 points in the Billikens' second-lowest scoring game of the season.

Looking for glimmers of hope, Ford said he has not been upset by the team's approach to games, even if the execution hasn't been consistent.

"We're going to take two days off and move forward," he said. "I think we've been playing really good basketball the last two weeks. We've had the right mentality. Even in the games we didn't win the mentality was right."

A full house saw the Billikens open a 10-point lead in the second half and then hold on after the Flyers got within two points on several occasions. Although turnovers and bad shots by SLU helped Dayton make its run, the Billikens had enough answers.

After the Flyers scored six straight points to get within 57-54, Okoro scored on a putback. Dayton then pulled within two and Gibson Jimerson hit a jumper. At 61-59, Okoro scored again inside.

That was enough to hold on after Dayton rallied with the help of five 3-pointers.

"The biggest thing we wanted was to hold down their 3s," Ford said. "We did a great job in the first half."

## SLU basketball to honor 7 players on senior night but some can return

One year ago at St. Louis University's senior night ceremony, fans chanted for Javonte Perkins to play "one more year" and got their wish.

The same weekend, Javon Pickett was honored at Missouri and Jake Forrester at Temple.

Some senior nights are not necessarily the end of the road for a player's college career. After the Billikens play Dayton in the regular-season finale Friday night, those three will be among a group of seven players honored at Chaifetz Arena because they used an additional year of eligibility.

The next question will be whether guards Yuri Collins and Gibson Jimerson, who also will be recognized, will decide to move on despite having the option to play one and two more seasons respectively.

Perkins, Pickett and Forrester along with Francis Okoro have used all of their eligibility. Fred Thatch Jr. has announced that he will not use a remaining season after suffering a torn ACL.

Collins and Jimerson have decisions to make.

"They both need to pursue professional opportunities and go from there," SLU coach Travis Ford said. "They can make a decision from that point. But they both need to aggressively pursue where they are professionally, no doubt about it."

Collins could play one more year of college basketball due to the bonus season players received to compensate for COVID. Jimerson could play two years, having also received a medical redshirt. He is a sophomore for athletic purposes.

The seven have amassed some big statistical contributions in their careers. Jimerson, Pickett and Perkins have surpassed 1,000 points and the group has combined for 6,748 points. They have 2,996 rebounds.

And then there's Collins' SLU-record 848 assists and Jimerson's 227 3-pointers, which rank fourth in program history. Okoro is No. 2 on SLU's all-time field goal percentage chart at 57.9%.

"It's an interesting group," Ford said. "Some have been here a long time and made their mark and some came for one year and made a mark. Guys who have been here longer have been through a lot. All kids have, but it's interesting to see them stick together. The relationships they've built are as pleasing to me and important as anything."

All will have undergraduate degrees at the end of the academic year when Collins will graduate. Thatch has a master's degree and others are working toward one.

Perkins is in his sixth year of college, having decided to return after missing all of the 2021-22 season. The love he received from the crowd at last year's senior night didn't hurt in that choice and meant a lot to him.

"It showed I did something right playing basketball here," Perkins said. "I'm just happy I got back on the floor. That was the main thing – to show I could do it. I got to play in front of my mom one more time."

The world of name, image and likeness could ultimately play a role in the decision by players. The Billiken Victory Fund was recently unveiled as a collective that will be used to compensate players.

Ultimately, Friday night could be the final appearance for all of them at Chaifetz in a game that will help determine SLU's final standing in the Atlantic 10. The Billikens will finish either third or fourth.

Most important is generating some type of momentum before the conference tournament against a team that beat the Billikens in Dayton 70-56.

"There are always tough nights," Ford said. "You've got a lot that goes through your mind when you have as many (seniors) as we have. You have to stay focused on what's at hand. It hasn't usually been this tough a game at the end, so we have to stay focused."

## VCU claims A-10 regular-season crown with win over SLU

Any remaining hopes St. Louis University had of winning the Atlantic 10 regular season championship were doused Tuesday night by VCU, which used a sellout crowd at the Siegel Center to capture that crown for itself.

VCU trumped SLU's veteran lineup with athleticism that created a layup/dunk line on offense and forced 20 turnovers by the Billikens, who fell 79-67 in Richmond, Va.

"They forced us into a lot of turnovers and we took tough shots we didn't make. The stat sheet says it all," SLU coach Travis Ford said. "We got outrebounded and didn't shoot a high percentage. We hung in there a long time, even when I didn't think we were playing well."

There was no bouncing back when the Rams spent the final 10 minutes scoring on nothing but layups, dunks and free throws to wipe out SLU's final lead of the game.

The Billikens (19-11 overall, 11-6 A-10) fell into fourth place with one game remaining, against Dayton on Friday at Chaifetz Arena. They played without starter Francis Okoro, who was out with an illness.

Jake Forrester made up for his absence with 14 points, 10 rebounds and four blocked shots. But SLU had too many other problems it couldn't fix.

VCU (23-7, 14-3) scored 52 points in the paint, had six players score in double figures and did damage with 17 layups and seven dunks.

"VCU is a very athletic team," SLU forward Terrence Hargrove Jr. said. "We just gave them too many points in the paint. It's our fault. It was their athleticism and allowing them to get in the paint when we shouldn't."

Besides turnovers, SLU got into foul trouble in the second half, allowing the Rams to get to the free-throw line on top of the easy baskets they were getting.

The Billikens held VCU guard Ace Baldwin to four points in the first half after he scored 37 in the first meeting in St. Louis. However, he started the second half by getting into the lane

for two early buckets and added another moments later as the Rams recaptured the lead.

SLU tried switching defenders on Baldwin throughout the game with Gibson Jimerson, Yuri Collins and Larry Hughes Jr. taking turns. He was held to 12 points, but the Rams had others who could attack and score.

St. Louis native Nick Kern did much of the damage for the Rams down the stretch and finished with 12 points on 6-for-7 shooting. His flurry of late scoring fueled VCU's momentum.

"They feed off that (crowd) energy, but you should never let a crowd dictate how you play," Forrester said. "But it was definitely loud in there, for sure."

Forrester played 30 minutes in Okoro's absence. He didn't commit a foul in the first half but was whistled for three in the first 10 minutes of the second half. The Billikens were called for 15 fouls in the final 20 minutes and ended up being outscored at the line 19-8.

"We were up four at half and then it's 8-1 in fouls (in the second)," Ford said. "I'm not saying whether we did or didn't foul, but it makes it hard and took some aggressiveness away."

SLU can still finish third, fourth or fifth in the A-10. It is possible that games played Wednesday night in the conference could result in the Billikens clinching at least fourth and a double bye in the conference tournament.

## Phil Forte is finding his voice, confidence in Year 2 as a SLU basketball assistant coach

In the progression of roles that Phil Forte has held alongside Travis Ford, assistant coach was the natural next step when he was offered a job before the 2021-22 season.

Forte had been recruited by Ford and played for him at Oklahoma State. He spent a season as a graduate assistant on Ford's staff at St. Louis University.

It's a relationship that goes back to Forte's sophomore year of high school and will last a lifetime, regardless of whether they are working together or not. The next step just came sooner than anyone wanted.

Now in his second year as a SLU men's basketball assistant coach, Forte, 29, is about to finish his fourth season in that role at a Division I program.

"I've been with coach Ford a long time, so I know how he operates like the back of my hand," Forte said. "For me, it was about finding my coaching voice and confidence. The transition coming here was easier with someone I'm very comfortable with, having known him and his family for 10-plus years."

Forte heard from Ford about the job after assistant Ford Stuen died in May 2021. Stuen was Ford's nephew and Forte's close friend from their college days.

After his one year as a GA at SLU, Forte was hired as an assistant at Sam Houston State. He spent two years in Huntsville, Texas, getting a thorough introduction to the job.

Because the staff was undermanned compared to others, Forte said he gained experience working with athletes on academics and learning aspects of videography and basketball operations.

"I learned there was a big difference in coaching and playing," he said. "It's definitely a different role from being a GA, and the two years at Sam Houston helped me develop and learn a lot. Getting thrown into the fire helped me learn a little of everything from the ground up."

Ford took some time to make a hire after Stuen's death. But he said he knew who he wanted if Forte was going to be comfortable with the move that would involve working out of his friend's old office.

"I wanted him to be comfortable with it, and he was," Ford said. "After I took some time, he was the guy I wanted. He's got a great work ethic, which as a young coach is where it has to start. He's got a good mind for the game and is good at developing relationships."

Forte has two reminders of Stuen in his office. One is the adage "The journey is the reward," a phrase that Stuen used at the end of letters he wrote to people, pinned to a bulletin board. The other is Stuen's remote clicker with his name taped to the bottom that Forte uses every day to watch game video on his computer.

He also encounters people in the community – at the gym, at Starbucks, at clothing stores – who still mention Stuen, knowing the two were close.

"I still think about him every day," Forte said. "It's not that I think about him and get sad. Sure, I 100% miss him, but I think about him, and it makes me want to be better at the job, be better as a person. I'm walking in the path he would be. Everything he stood for, I owe it to him to make sure it's done the right way."

Forte ended up playing four years under Ford at Oklahoma State and then stayed one more year to play for Brad Underwood. He scored 1,746 career points.

He said before deciding to stay at Oklahoma State for his final season, there was a brief conversation with Ford, who told him of SLU, "You're not going to come here."

Eventually he did, working his GA season reunited with Ford and Stuen before striking out on his own at Sam Houston State, which was 200 miles from his hometown of Flower Mound, Texas.

Forte continues to fulfill all the roles of an assistant, including recruiting, game scouting and planning. But he believes he has one particular strength that comes with being young. He's only five years older than the eldest Billiken.

"The main thing will always be playing experience at a high level and being able to relate to everything these guys are going through," Forte said. "That's still one of my strengths. There's so much related to mental health, and since COVID, everything is crazy. Being able to relate to them is more important than ever."

## Ford says 'Everybody in locker room is hurting' after loss at Dayton

DAYTON, Ohio – The time remaining to flip the script on the basketball season is shrinking quickly for St. Louis University after another loss to a top contender in the Atlantic 10 on Friday night.

A 70-56 loss at sold-out Dayton Arena continued a downward trend that has seen the Billikens drop three of the last four, all to their top competition in the conference standings.

SLU's offense went missing in the second half as the Billikens scored 10 points in the first 15 minutes. The Flyers beat them in almost every statistical category, including rebounding, free throws, 3-pointers, points in the paint and shooting percentage.

"We got stagnant in the second half because some shots didn't fall," coach Travis Ford said. "I thought we did a good job of cutting in the first half and didn't cut nearly as much in the second. The bottom line is you have to make shots. You can talk about offense all day long, but you have to put the ball in the hole."

SLU has lost its last nine games at Dayton, which moved into second place ahead of the Billikens (16-9 overall, 8-4 in the A-10).

The A-10 has been a perplexing conference this season with some teams such as Fordham and Duquesne rising unexpectedly and other such as SLU and Dayton not meeting the lofty expectations.

"It's not about expectations," Ford said. "We are frustrated and disappointed any time we're not playing our best. If there's anything competitive about you, you strive to be great and if something's not going your way you want it to be better."

With the league not expected to receive an at-large berth, there is a huge opportunity for some team to get hot down the stretch and carry that momentum into the conference tournament, where an NCAA Tournament qualifier will emerge.

The Billikens seemed headed in that direction when they put together a six-game win streak, but the latest stretch of play has generated more concerns.

"Things ebb and flow through the season and you have to figure out how to help the team play through things like this," guard Gibson Jimerson said. "We'll learn from it and bounce back. ... We always play our best basketball at the end of the season. There's not a doubt in my mind we can make a push."

Amid those ebbs and flows, Ford has pointed out some of the same general problems repeatedly. Asked what can be done to fix things with limited remaining time, he said "Win the next one. Then the next one."

A rough stretch arrives during every conference season. SLU lost four of six last season at one point and then got hot. The year the A-10 tournament was canceled, they won their last five after a rough patch.

But those teams didn't carry the weight of being projected as a tournament team with top-25 potential. Under the circumstances, do the team's struggles bother or weigh on Ford more than other years?

"I take pride in trying to push the right buttons and haven't got it kick-started with everyone on the same page night in and night out," Ford said. "To anybody that knows me, it's an easy question to answer. I've been competing at this game a long time, and I'm actually in the mix of it."

"When things aren't going your way, you don't sit around and twiddle your thumbs. Everybody in the locker room is hurting. They all want to play better. They just haven't been as consistent obviously as we'd like to put everybody on the same page being our best on a given night."

The inconsistency within games was apparent against Dayton. The Billikens were sharp offensively most of the first half. They made four early 3-pointers and were trading baskets with Dayton (17-9, 9-4) until the Flyers gained some separation late in the half.

The Flyers shot 62.5% in the first half to SLU's 50%. But the second half was disastrous offensively for the Billikens, who were 3-for-22 until making their last three shots of the game.

"I think some of it was that we weren't scoring and they were, so it made it worse," said Javonte Perkins, who led SLU with 17 points. "We stopped moving the ball and ourselves as much as we were in the first half. That led to us not making shots, and they went to the other end and made them and built a lead."

The second half started ominously for SLU. Francis Okoro picked up his third foul after 16 seconds and had to leave. Jake Forrester also picked up his third foul after subbing for Okoro.

Ford then decided to go with freshman Momo Cisse to eat up some minutes and some fouls. It could have left SLU more vulnerable than usual but Cisse put up a fight. However, there was nothing he could do about Dayton's perimeter shooting.

The Flyers entered the game as a mediocre 3-point shooting team at 33.5%. But they had multiple shooters get hot, and when Kobe Elvis and Koby Brea hit back-to-back 3s early in the second half, Dayton had its first double-digit lead, which continued to grow.

"We missed some early good looks in the second half," Ford said. "Our defense was good but we couldn't keep them off the foul line. You're not going to win at Dayton if they shoot 26 free throws and you shoot 13."

## Gibson Jimerson could be finding his shot for final stretch of SLU basketball season

The frequent motion and cutting that Gibson Jimerson brings to the St. Louis University men's basketball offense has made him a more versatile scorer around the basket than when he arrived in college.

The same can be said of his improved mid-range game. Even his jumping ability has increased, turning previously routine layups into occasional dunks.

But the SLU guard ultimately will be remembered as a 3-point shooter thanks to games like the last two that saw him score 24 points by making 11 of his 20 3s.

Jimerson subscribes to the shooter's philosophy that no matter how many you miss, just keep on firing. It's what he's prepared for since his middle school years practicing on a 9 ½-foot basket in his family's garage.

"The mental part is more than half of it," he said. "For guys who shoot well, when they're not, there's a little doubt. 'Can I even shoot? What's going on?' You deal with it, and it can be the hardest part. I just fall back on the work I put in and stay confident."

Jimerson had a longer-than-usual lull in his shooting this season that saw him make 23.6% of his 3s over an eight-game stretch. For a player who entered the season No. 3 in SLU history in 3-pointer percentage, it was disconcerting.

Did doubt seep in? "Maybe a little," he said.

Jimerson has made 47% of his 3-pointers since that time, covering nine games. His 3 with 30 seconds left against Rhode Island on Tuesday broke a tie and sent the Billikens to a win.

In four seasons – the first was limited to 10 games by an injury – Jimerson has reached 1,133 points and is fifth all-time at SLU with 210 3-pointers entering Friday night's key Atlantic 10 game at Dayton at 7 p.m. CT.

"Coming into college, it was an adjustment to face bigger, more athletic players," he said. "If you had told me I'd have the career I'm having, I wouldn't have believed you. But you always want to get better. Shooting is first and foremost, and I'm pleased with the way I've shot in college."

At 23, Jimerson is one of the oldest college sophomores you will find. He took an extra year before college to attend Montverde Academy in Florida, where he caught the eye of SLU coaches.

Montverde coach Kevin Boyle Jr. said he sees the difference in Jimerson four years later when he catches games on TV.

"He's continued to excel as a spot-up shooter, but he does a better job now off the dribble and at times on the move," Boyle said. "There's a lot more movement and teams are chasing you coming off screens. People are aware he's a shooter, and they

make him work for it."

Jimerson is a self-taught shooter, who worked on the skill alone in his garage. He got a copy of a video made by USC coach Andy Enfield and wore it out, trying to perfect Enfield's "all net" method.

"I watched that so many times. The dude didn't miss the entire video," Jimerson said. "I worked on my form every night. I was obsessed with making sure my form was the same every time and the video was the framework."

The family had a 10-foot basket outside the garage, but Jimerson remembers mostly working on his shot on the 9 ½-foot rim that provided cover during bad weather.

For a while, he said, his shot was much flatter than it is now. But he developed a high release point, which has allowed him to deliver 3-pointers with one of the quickest releases around if the situation calls for it. It's been part of adapting to college defenses.

Just as there are games when defenders shadow him as he moves and cuts, leaving bruises and gauges on his arms, there are some games when he is given little room to catch or shoot.

Jimerson leads SLU in scoring with a 13.2 average, a drop from his team-leading 16.3 points per game last season. His shooting percentages also are down a bit, but he tries not to pay much attention to that, figuring it will balance out in the end.

"Every season is different, and there are a couple of stretches you don't shoot well," he said. "I never really worry about missing shots. The end of the season is when I look at the numbers. I know at the end, it will be where it needs to be."

## SLU starts to find more energy on defense in win over Rhode Island

Attempting to rejuvenate a sometimes lackluster defense, St. Louis University coach Travis Ford reemphasized some points in the two days leading to Tuesday night's 76-71 win over Rhode Island.

A team that has failed to generate turnovers was charged with finding ways to disrupt the Rams and presumably the remaining Atlantic 10 opponents on the schedule.

Some of SLU's best moments in its loss last week came when the Billikens took VCU out of its offense. They were able to do the same on a small scale against Rhode Island at Chaifetz Arena, and it helped in a game where points were sometimes a struggle.

The Billikens had seven steals and seven blocked shots and were able to open a small lead early in the second half by creating offense from defense. That margin withstood Rhode Island's constant threats to capture the lead.

"We haven't been able to turn teams over, but it's been an emphasis the last couple of days to be more aggressive in some areas. We're not going to be a team that gets out and pressures the ball at all five spots. We have to be selective."

It was only the fourth game that SLU has had at least seven steals and they have won them all. Francis Okoro had three and Yuri Collins and Sincere Parker had two each.

Terrence Hargrove Jr. was frequently the offense on the other end. He scored eight points before the first media timeout of the second half, dunking twice in transition and scoring on a layup with steals by Collins helping set up two of the scores.

"We needed that life coming out of halftime, and that's my job – to be a spark plug," Hargrove said. "That's all we talked about at halftime. We didn't have any life going into halftime. If we can keep that same energy, no one can mess with us."

But it was not sustainable, leaving the Billikens (16-8 overall, 8-3 in the A-10) to scrap and claw for a win that pulled them even in the loss column with VCU atop the standings.

Ford was surprised the Billikens were able to score 76 points in a game he felt they were "treading in mud." SLU rebounded from shooting 33% in the first half to shoot 57% in the second, a figure Ford didn't believe until he saw it.

Gibson Jimerson was the most consistent source of offense with six 3-pointers and 24 points. His 3 with 31 seconds left broke the only tie of the second half and was followed by two free throws by Sincere Parker to clinch the win.

"I just stay aggressive with my shot. It will be different every game, but I have to be ready to shoot at all time because it's what I do best," Jimerson said. "We knew coming in they were very aggressive under the 3-point line and do a great job breaking up the ball."

Collins had 15 points and eight assists and midway through the second half became the A-10's all-time assists leader when he passed Jacob Gilyard with No. 783. Hargrove had 12 points and nine rebounds.

His best stretch came over 40 seconds when he scored on a pair of dunks and a layup. His dunk with 17:30 left in the game gave SLU a 38-35 lead. Collins then came up with a steal and found Hargrove in transition for an alley-oop dunk. Another Collins steal led to a layup at the other end for Hargrove.

But Ford was left scratching his head about how SLU scored so many points.

"We took a great shot from a team that played really well on a night we weren't our best," Ford said. "It wasn't necessarily pretty. How we scored 76, I don't know. I was pleased we won because we weren't very good. And we had two of our best practices, I thought, the last two days."

Rhode Island entered the game without a road win in seven tries, the most recent being a 64-50 loss at St. Joseph's. The Rams did not appear to be outmatched at any time in the first 20 minutes as SLU clung to a 32-31 lead at halftime.

The biggest difference for SLU was the shooting of Jimerson, who had four 3-pointers and scored 14 points in the half. However, his shooting was a reflection of SLU's overall offense as the Billikens shot an abundance of jump shots with inside players Francis Okoro and Jake Forrester combining to take three shots.

The offense did become more balanced in the second half. But Ford was left repeating some lines that have been common all season.

"We've got to get everyone bringing their best game in terms of how hard they play, intensity and energy," he said. "We've got to get that real quick."

## SLU will focus on improvement, not changes, in search of strong finish

The best momentum St. Louis University generated this season has been snuffed out, the losses to Fordham and Virginia Commonwealth having increased questions about whether the Billikens can overcome concerns expressed by coach Travis Ford all season.

While it is true that SLU is in second place in the Atlantic 10 Conference, that position comes with acknowledgment that the team still is not playing well enough to meet the high expectations.

Eight games remain in the regular season to find a formula, and Ford says that formula does not have to involve significant changes but executing better, cleaning up mistakes and getting more out of each player.

"We're addressing what we believe needs to happen for us to hopefully gain consistency over the next eight games," Ford said. "We're addressing those on film and working on them in practice. I don't think there's anything drastic we're going to change.

"In 26 years, I've done that plenty of times. It could be lineup changes. But there are areas we have to get better. We've struggled the last few games not playing well down the stretch. But we did figure out how to run off six wins."

Ford suggested after the loss to VCU that he might need to adjust playing time because some players with extensive minutes have not produced as needed.

He backed off that a bit Monday ahead of a home game against Rhode Island on Tuesday night. Ford and his players remain committed to the system in search of a late-season surge.

"For sure we have to keep progressing in the things we're good at," point guard Yuri Collins said. "Some of the things coach says we need to fix are smaller things, and it's not too late to fix. So, that's what we're working on."

Ford was saying even in the opening month of the season that the Billikens lacked consistency. That they needed more players making contributions. That the team had too many highs and lows.

Those are some things that have contributed to SLU playing itself out of the NCAA Tournament at-large conversation. Forging ahead with the same message is seen as the path to a breakthrough.

"We all sat down as a team (Sunday) and coach gave us a lot of words of wisdom," forward Jake Forrester said. "We sat for an hour and a half, and it was a lot of stuff about what each individual could contribute to be the best we can be. We talked about how we're going to bring that every single day."

After losses to Iona, Boise State and Massachusetts had the

season looking bleak, the Billikens had a six-game winning streak with several road victories sprinkled in. There was hope that they had turned the corner.

But the losses to Fordham and VCU were reminders of issues that have not been rectified. The similarity was poor finishes in both games that allowed the opponent to pull away after otherwise tightly contested games.

Collins pointed to defense, rebounding and finishing games as the top things that SLU must improve. Those are significant projects at this point in the season. Whether playing time will change to pursue those goals remains to be seen.

"We kind of have our core group of nine, more or less," Ford said. "You see some guys play more than others based on foul trouble and different things. Some of the guys off the bench will play a lot some games and not as much in others. It's about getting more out of everybody. Even the guys we weren't so happy with the other night, it doesn't mean we're going to give their minutes to someone else."

SLU is a veteran team filled with fourth- and fifth-year players. Three Billikens are 24 years old and others are 23. That experience is something Forrester sees as a potential positive as the season winds down.

"Having veterans can be a good or bad thing," he said. "I think we're using it well this year. ... You can have people already checked out if it's their last year and giving up on the season. I feel we're all dialed in. No one is talking about anything like that. We're ready to finish as best we can."

## With bulk of road games behind, SLU basketball sets sights on first place

The quirks of the St. Louis University men's basketball team's schedule in the Atlantic 10 are not lost on coach Travis Ford, even if he says he doesn't pay close attention to the list of opponents as they unfold.

But the one word he does use when it comes to the balance of home and road games in the early going is "unprecedented."

The first half of the A-10 season concluded with the Billikens having played six road games. They survived with only a half game separating them and first-place VCU, which visits Chaifetz Arena on Friday night.

That's a pretty good position for SLU, which will finish with six of nine games at home as it pursues its first regular-season championship in Ford's tenure. A team that has not been especially strong away from home in recent years won four of six to remain in the hunt.

"We handled it pretty well," SLU senior Terrence Hargrove Jr. said. "We finally clicked, and when we click, it's hard to stop us. Fordham took us down, but there are going to be bumps. We've got a lot of games left and can still keep making a run. Everyone wants to be in first place, and it makes the game more interesting. You want to win even more."

SLU is the only team in the A-10 that played six of its first nine conference games on the road. That will be balanced in the second half of the season with a list of opponents that is stronger on paper than the Billikens have faced so far, including two against VCU and two against Dayton.

Like the schedule, Ford has said at times that he doesn't pay attention to SLU's placement in the standings. But he would have been hard-pressed to make that statement ahead of Friday's nationally televised game.

"We've mentioned it in passing, but these guys know," he said. "We spend more time talking about how to slow down (VCU's) Ace Baldwin and things like that are where we spend a lot of time. ... They're all big, but these are two teams in first place and two teams that have been pretty good for a couple of years. We shouldn't have to have a lot of rah-rah motivational speeches when we're playing a team like VCU."

The four closest teams in competition with SLU – VCU, Dayton, Fordham and St. Bonaventure – all played five of their first nine conference games at home. That could be an advantage for the Billikens if they can hold serve at Chaifetz.

SLU expects a near-packed house for the type of game the Billikens haven't played since the 2013-14 season. Before losing to Fordham on Tuesday, SLU held first place by itself later than any date since that season.

The Billikens have been good, not great, at home. They are 10-2, having lost to Boise State and Southern Illinois-Edwardsville.

Ford said Thursday the schedule was not something he thought about.

"I don't look at the conference schedule," he said. "I had no idea we had all the early road games until after Christmas."

But you can bet he grasped the significance as SLU made six trips in a month, mostly to the Eastern time zone. It weighed on everyone to a degree and was compounded by constant travel glitches.

There was a night SLU had to bus to another city to get its charter flight after a game. There were mechanical issues that caused long delays, and planes that were behind schedule. The Billikens returned home at 2, 3 or 4 a.m. on some trips.

The A-10 schedule makers did what they could to give the top teams the best conference schedules possible. At the time, that meant giving SLU two games against Dayton, VCU, Davidson and Loyola-Chicago. It couldn't have been foreseen at the time that Davidson and Loyola would be among the bottom teams in the league, but that's how it has unfolded.

The Billikens have not finished higher than fourth under Ford. They were picked second this season, their best preseason position other than 2018-19 when they were picked to win the conference.

## Vastly improved shooting is key to St. Louis University's six-game win streak

If there was one thing most insiders would have said would be a strength for St. Louis University's men's basketball team this season, shooting would have been at the top of the list.

As the nonconference schedule unfolded, that perception quickly faded as the Billikens struggled, whether it was at the rim or beyond the 3-point arc.

Their five nonconference losses had a similar look with SLU shooting below 40% in each defeat and 35% overall in those games.

The transformation since the start of Atlantic 10 Conference play has been startling and timely. SLU has been the best shooting team in the conference in its first eight games and that has translated to a six-game win streak and a spot alone atop the standings entering Tuesday night's game at Fordham.

Senior wing Javonte Perkins has a simple explanation.

"I guess we just found it at the right time," he said. "I think we might have found our rhythm."

Coach Travis Ford has a more elaborate analysis of why the Billikens are shooting 51% overall and 39% beyond the arc in conference play after finishing nonconference games at 44% and 32%.

"Without question it's sharing the ball," he said. "We're moving it better. When I called a play early in the year, they were shooting it no matter what. Now when someone double teams us, we're making the next play. ... When you're being double-teamed, you've got to make the next play to make it easier for you and better for the team. Everyone has done a better job of that."

As SLU approaches the halfway mark of the A-10 schedule, it has not shot below 40% in its eight games. It's been an across-the-board improvement.

Yuri Collins is shooting 59% in league games. Big men Francis Okoro and Jake Forrester have combined to shoot 64%. Sincere Parker and Terrence Hargrove Jr. are both a tick over 50%.

While Perkins is lagging a bit behind those numbers, he has looked more like himself recently while making a wider array of shots. He's even been effective with the ball in his hands and creating.

"I wasn't making a lot of shots earlier, but I'm getting used to things and making more," he said. "We all know what we can do. We give the ball to Yuri a lot, but we're showing we can play on the ball as well. We don't have to put all the pressure on him."

Gibson Jimerson has combined with Sincere Parker and Hargrove to boost the team's 3-point shooting. And as Perkins rounds into shape, it doesn't hurt that Collins has been more accurate beyond the arc, albeit in limited attempts.

Early in the season there was reason for concern because the offense was inconsistent. Especially baffling was SLU's poor conversation rate around the basket.

There were some games that the Billikens were below 50% on shots classified on the in-game statistics as layups, which can be wide-open breakaways, tip-in attempts, post shots or drives.

"We're better but there's still room for improvement," Ford said. "But Francis has been finishing better inside. Jake has been really good at times. And we've had guys driving and finishing better."

Decisions made by Collins often are the key factor in whether the Billikens get a good shot. He has been less prone to driving, getting stuck and taking a bad shot since the start of conference play.

Additionally, Perkins, Parker and Javon Pickett have shown the ability to create shots. When everything is combined in a game, SLU has displayed a more vast array of scoring options and methods.

"They hear me say it all the time, get in the paint, draw help and when you do, finish or find someone else," Ford said. "It's about decision making, and we've been making better decisions."

## The importance of Sincere Parker's merry attitude, smile and production for SLU basketball

Two things stood out to SLU men's basketball coach Travis Ford about Sincere Parker's performance last week in a game at Loyola-Chicago.

First was the guard's scoring in the first half that helped St. Louis University overcome an early deficit despite having four players in foul trouble.

Second was the guard's willingness to keep quiet when he was stuck to the bench in the second half.

Sure, the SLU coach contemplated using Parker more after he scored 13 points in the first 20 minutes. The question passed through the sophomore's thoughts. Even Ford's wife asked why Parker didn't get more time.

"Everyone has a role, and his was to come in the first half and get us 13 points and if I needed him in the second half," Ford said. "But we were fine. And he was great. If everyone has Sincere's attitude in life, forget about winning games, good things will probably happen."

Three days later against La Salle, Parker again produced offense in the first half and earned more time in the second, finishing with a career-high 20 points on 8-for-9 shooting.

As the SLU rotation has evolved, the 6-foot-3 guard from Rockford, Illinois, has gradually earned more minutes and increased his productivity. In the process, he has provided a different look for the offense with his shooting and shot creation.

The 3-pointers that were touted upon his signing have arrived. The mid-range game looks a lot like vintage Javonte Perkins. And his ability to drive to generate shots that defy the defense is especially intriguing.

Unorthodox at times, Parker manages to create and release shots that at first appear questionable but often result in points.

"It's more like a reaction type of thing," he said. "I really don't know what I'll do at the moment, but if I know where I want to get and then get there, I have a pretty high chance of making a shot. When I work out, I work on dribble moves and different shots – kind of crazy things people might think I'm working on for no reason. But you never know. It might come at any given moment."

Parker's efficiency has improved with his playing time. In the first 14 games, he shot 38.6% overall while making 2 of 22 3-pointers. In the last six games, he has shot 58.5% and made 11 of 21 3s.

His perimeter shooting might come and go, but the ability to get buckets in more ways than most could elevate Parker, especially as he tries to improve his defense, which cost him playing time early in the season.

"He has a really good one-on-one game, maybe the best one-on-one player as far as scoring on our team," Ford said. "Off the dribble, he has a knack. For him, it's just been a defensive thing. Sometimes when you're making shots, you just need to outscore your man."

Parker credits much of his development as a player to workouts he had with his father. They practiced extensively on outdoor courts, starting around the age of 8. After a break of a couple of years, they resumed the summer before Parker's junior year of high school.

Parker didn't love any of it at first but came to realize the value, especially when he had a breakout season. The workouts in elementary school were under some rough conditions.

"I was a kid, and he's making me do hard workouts. I'm crying and giving up, saying I don't want to play basketball anymore," Parker said. "Sometimes there was bird poop all over the court. We played on double rims. It was the worst conditions possible."

When his father said they were going to resume the routine, Parker wasn't much more enthusiastic. But he was transferring to a new high school after not playing varsity as a freshman or sophomore.

"Some days, I hoped he would forget to ask, but looking back, I appreciate it," Parker said. "It changed me for the better."

Parker played for his third team as a high schooler when he went to Compass Prep in Arizona before spending two years at Moberly Area College, leading the country in points in his second season.

He finds himself back in a reserve role on a roster that has experienced starters and is beginning to find his niche in the system. It's the same situation that Perkins faced when he transferred from Southwestern Illinois College after leading all junior college players in scoring.

"I'm being patient, knowing my time will come eventually," Parker said. "I feel my personality with this group is big. We have older, mature guys, and it's my job to uplift, bring energy and make people happy and smile. I know when I see the older guys smiling and in a good mood that we're going to win."

## SLU's Javonte Perkins finding footing after knee surgery, ankle injury

Sometimes, Javonte Perkins still is Javonte Perkins.

"Yeah, I'm still me," Perkins said with a smile, in reference to his back-to-back games of 27 and 18 points. "It was good to show everybody that – hey, I can still do it."

Once a take-over-the-game guy, St. Louis U.'s Perkins missed last season because of knee surgery – and has sure missed a lot of shots this season. But he recently scored the jaw-dropping 27 at George Washington (with an eye-popping 11-for-16 performance from the field). The following game, again on the road, he totaled 18 against Loyola-Chicago.

I came for a fireworks show.

I got a front-driveway kid holding a sparkler.

It's a reminder of the cruel realities of returning from injury – plus the effects of an additional injury this season. Against La Salle, Perkins didn't make a field goal in the first half. He finished with two total field goals made and 11 points, quite close to his season average (11.2).

Eleven points in a victory still is important. Perkins and his teammates were smiling after the 84-71 win. But this was a guy who made two or fewer field goals just once in all of 2020-21. And made more than two in every conference game in 2019-20.

Perkins said Saturday that an ankle injury has bothered him this season. Trying to move out there on the court, he'll feel a strength-sapping weakness in his ankle, which affects his leg (and, really, his everything).

"Javonte is still not back to 100% – he's going to hopefully get there at some point," SLU coach Travis Ford said. "We've just kind of been rolling with him. Some days are better than others. But I think he's shown what he's capable of doing – we all know what he's capable of doing. But we've seen some bigger glimpses of it lately – and I don't see any reason he won't keep playing that way. But some games are better than others."

What a cool story he was – a St. Louis native (Miller Career Academy) came to his city's school and became a shooting star (17.1 points per game in 2020-21). Unfortunately, without Perkins always playing like Perkins this season (and other players underachieving, too), SLU lost a few winnable games in nonconference play. SLU should be 17-3; SLU instead is 14-6. Not that 17-3 would be a guarantee for the NCAA Tournament. The likely lone way from the Atlantic 10 Conference to the Big Dance is to win the conference tourney.

And so, what a cool story he still can be.

He won't score 27 points every game (or even 17), but the wise veteran still can contribute.

Maybe the best way to look at him is – the glass is still half-full (instead of half-empty). He'll still go on some scoring binges. He seldom turns the ball over. He's a reliable free throw shooter,

which means Ford can draw up plays for him late in close games. And in real time he's becoming a better and smarter player on defense, dedicating himself to a lower stance more often.

"Defense is what we hang our hat on over here," he said. "If the offense isn't going, playing defense gets you going a lot of different ways."

And he sure can be timely. While SLU beat La Salle, the game was closer than the final score.

Ford's Billikens only led by one point at halftime.

And La Salle led by six points with 16:54 left.

That's when Perkins (0 for five) finally made a shot.

Followed by another – a 3-pointer.

"I knew once I found one, I could get another one back, so I was just telling myself that," the senior said. "... Once I made the first one, I was shooting the second one regardless, because I felt the rhythm. I knew that will help the team out."

That sparked a 12-0 run. SLU took the lead and never relinquished that.

Going forward, the good news for SLU is other players are perking up like a Perkins. For instance, Sincere Parker scored 20 points in the La Salle game. This is a player who poured in points at the junior college level a year ago. Before this season, Ford was sincere about Parker's ability to make 3s – but the kid started the year two for 22.

Well, since then, Parker shot 10 for 21 from beyond the arc, including two for three against the Explorers.

And Francis Okoro, whose game is fueled by hustling hard on the boards, is sure hustling harder on the boards of late.

So, we'll keep an eye on SLU as the Billikens – and Perkins – find their footing. There still are plenty of steps to take before the crucial conference tournament.

## Basketball gives SLU's Francis Okoro an escape as his mother battles cancer in Nigeria

Concern for his family's well-being has provided a constant backdrop for Francis Okoro since he and his brother, Stephen, arrived in the U.S. from Imo, Nigeria.

Francis Okoro, in his final season at St. Louis University, is finding solace in being close to his brother, who plays at Principia School, amid ongoing worries for his mother back home.

He spoke Thursday to his mom, who is more than 6,000 miles away, after she spent some time in a hospital dealing with bone cancer in a foot. He will get to see Stephen this weekend. Those scenarios form the balancing act that has been necessary through a five-year college career that will end with this season.

"It's one of the things I have to control in my head and focus on what I can control here," Okoro said. "Basketball takes me away from those troubles, so I have to use it to my advantage in games. I'm thinking about a lot of stuff."

Okoro has spent his final season as an established starter for the Billikens while sharing time with Jake Forrester. Together they have developed a solid combination of offense, defense and rebounding with Okoro flourishing mostly among the latter two.

He hopes to match last season's strong finish after averaging 6.4 points and 8.3 rebounds through the first 19 games.

Francis Okoro: A look at the St. Louis Billikens basketball center Here is a look at Francis Okoro, the St. Louis Billikens men's basketball center and transfer from the Oregon Ducks. His hometown is Imo, Nigeria.

"I have thought about it and maybe that's how things work, and I need to be patient, and it takes some time," Okoro said of last season's big finish. "I've realized there are certain things I was doing last year that I need to start doing. I let some stuff get in my head, and I can't let it disturb my game."

Francis and Stephen Okoro went separate ways when the elder Okoro signed with Oregon out of Normal West High in Normal, Illinois, where he lived with an aunt and uncle.

His father died in December 2019 while he was at Oregon, and the funeral was the last time he saw his mother, who still hasn't seen him play a basketball game. Stephen moved further away when he played for two years at a school in Canada.

"I wanted him to be around me because he had some frustrating issues there," Okoro said.

Francis Okoro is fighting some frustrations himself on the court. But despite a decline in offensive production, the 6-foot-9 post player continues to be a force on the boards and defensively.

His scoring average has dropped four points per game over the 2021-22 season. He is shooting 54% from the field but has had games where he struggled to finish around the rim.

"Francis has proven he can score," coach Travis Ford said. "He was a force toward the end of last year with scoring. He was a big option for us, and I think he'll get back to that. We're confident he will."

Defense and rebounding remain his focus. One example of his impact without the ball came in the final 10 minutes against George Mason recently when he was instrumental in shutting down Josh Oduro, who had dominated earlier in the game.

Okoro's rebounding numbers have been solid. His average per 40 minutes has increased over last season, and his work on the offensive boards has been strong, placing him No. 42 in the country.

He said among the things he needs to emphasize moving forward are running the floor, being more aggressive when posting up, and finishing more frequently on offensive rebounds.

These are things that would be foreign to his mother, who remains disinterested in the game her sons play, while living near Lagos close to the Gulf of Guinea.

"We don't talk basketball, just about life," he said. "She was asking how I'm doing, and I told her things were going pretty well. Probably not the way I expected but going well. We talk about God and family and my brother that's here."

He saves the basketball chat for teammates, his brother and coaches, who he has many talks with as he tries to provide the production needed.

"I've got to be smart on the floor," he said. "I'm just worried about playing hard and getting in foul trouble. During this time last year, my mindset was to establish myself, and I think I have to get back to that."

## SLU basketball develops more options at point guard in absence of Yuri Collins

When your point guard averages 35 minutes per game and that number increases in conference play, worrying about a backup is low on the list of concerns.

It might even be at the bottom when that player is apt to re-enter a game at his own discretion as Yuri Collins has done for St. Louis men's basketball.

But recent injuries and illnesses have led to a series of moves at the position and some possible options for the remainder of the season. After missing the last game with an illness, Collins made the trip for Wednesday night's game at Loyola Chicago, but the choices if he can't play or needs more rest have expanded.

Fred Thatch Jr. served as the point guard backup until he was lost for the season with a torn ACL. With Collins out against George Washington last weekend, three players shared the role.

"I saw some things we might be able to do that we haven't been doing," coach Travis Ford said. "It might allow Yuri to get more rest now if we say we can hold down the fort a little bit."

The progression through point guards has gone from Collins to Thatch to Larry Hughes Jr., to Javonte Perkins to Javon Pickett. Thatch's absence forced more experimentation at GW, and for at least one game, it was a winning mix.

With the ball in their hands more, Perkins and Pickett combined for 51 points. Hughes started and was more involved in running the offense than looking for shots.

It was a completely different look than what the Billikens do with Collins. But they scored 81 points and shot 53%, so something went right.

"It was even interesting for me to watch it," Ford said. "It was fun to see how they did it. I really thought all three did a good job in their own way. Javon just made it simple and got the ball where it needed to be. Larry was more focused on running plays. When Javonte had it, we were more or less trying to get into something for him."

Ford said Collins participated in some elements of practice this week and is day-to-day. Pickett is also under close watch with a lower-body injury that has given him problems. Meanwhile, Kellen Thames remains out for "medical reasons."

The ongoing list of ailments, while not debilitating for the Billikens, has left Ford and his staff to adjust on the fly without many who fit the point guard characteristics.

"We never had an absolute true backup point guard," Ford said. "Fred was in that role and pretty established. Larry had done it a little, but we had moved him (off the ball) in the last month."

There were obvious benefits to having Perkins at the point. Coming off of his ACL recovery, the sixth-year player has had

trouble generating consistent offense. Notably, his ability to drive and score had been lacking.

But against George Washington, Perkins created numerous shots for himself and had his most productive offensive game of the season. Could that help him score more consistently for the remainder of the season?

"It's hard to say in one game," Ford said. "There are things we saw when he was in positions he hadn't been put in that we liked. So, from that standpoint, it's something we could continue to look at."

If Collins can play and Hughes and Perkins are available, Pickett probably wouldn't be needed in the point guard role. Ford said the Mizzou transfer has been battling an unidentified lower-body injury for most of the season and that he is "still not near 100%."

The preference, of course, is to have Collins return. But there have been games this season when Ford has had other players start the offense even with Collins on the court. That gave him some possessions that he could catch his breath momentarily without leaving.

Ford probably likes the confusion, because it has helped him create a minor mystery for SLU's first meeting with the Ramblers.

"It's up in the air at this point," he said about Collins. "It depends on how he feels."

## SLU assistant Corey Tate put the game in players' hands after Travis Ford's ejection

In the chaos of the moment, time did not allow Travis Ford to communicate with Corey Tate.

The realization that Ford had been ejected Wednesday night prompted the St. Louis University coach to momentarily react with shock, seek an explanation from the official and then have a quick word with his players.

There were 7 minutes, 16 seconds left against George Mason, and SLU led by one point after scoring the previous seven points. Tate, who is in his seventh season as a SLU assistant and third as associate head coach, did what Tate does and toned down the tension.

"I wasn't trying to be Travis," Tate said. "I just told the guys, 'Hey, listen, it's the same message, but we're going to deliver it a little different.' I told them to relax, take a deep breath, and I wanted to see smiles on their faces. We had to play for each other. That's how they went out and played."

Ford's departure left the 6-foot-4 Tate walking the sideline instead of sitting for the first time since his 11 seasons as coach at Mineral Area College.

"I did use to stand up before," he said.

After George Mason made the two technical foul free throws, it built an eight-point lead only to see SLU charge from behind for a 63-62 win.

It was the first time Tate had to take over for Ford, who was ejected for the first time as SLU's coach. But in his role as associate coach, he is always next in line.

Ford has been called for five technical fouls this season after getting one last season. A couple have come late in games the Billikens were trailing by a large margin. He has been insistent that both technicals Wednesday were unwarranted.

Ford never has been restrained when it comes to his sideline demeanor, whether it's addressing officials or his players. He has repeatedly commented that not everyone has his personality and that "maybe that's a good thing."

Point guard Yuri Collins, who intervened as Ford sought an explanation from an official, said that Tate called a few plays but that he didn't draw up anything on the whiteboard in team huddles.

"I told the guys we were going to win the game," Tate said. "I told them nothing was going to change about the game plan. It wasn't about Xs and Os or what plays you run. I called plays, yeah, but I wasn't playing. Yuri is our point guard, and we invest everything into him, so I trusted him. He was on the floor. We had a conversation about what they were comfortable running, and I saw how they were (defending) us."

The team's group of laid-back personalities might have helped in the moment.

"There was a bunch of smiles in the huddle, all laughing," Collins said. "Coach Tate told us 'Let's go. This is what we live for.' Big shout out to coach Tate for getting us through that one."

The rally started with a 3-pointer by Terrence Hargrove Jr. followed by another by Gibson Jimerson. Collins found Jimerson on a back-door cut for a layup to tie the game. He then put SLU over the top with a free throw with 1.7 seconds left.

"The best thing was how we played defense," Tate said. "The key to that was the guys sticking together. They played with a chip on their shoulders."

Ford watched the game on his phone from a hallway beneath the arena. He said after the game the first technical was because he made a traveling motion on a call he thought was missed. He received no explanation for the second, and the officials declined a request to comment.

Ford said all he did in the moment before the second technical was shout information at his players on the floor with the addition of an expletive.

He initially said, "It will be addressed." But the following day, Ford indicated he had put the matter behind him, saying, "I'm moving on. I don't have time for that."

Tate was happy to walk away without the win going on his record. Perhaps, it was suggested, he should be credited with the save.

"I was just glad I didn't mess nothing up," he said. "My grandma used to tell me, 'Whatever you do, leave a place as good as it was or better.' I'm glad it went our way and the guys had fun doing it. It was a fun way to play."

## SLU basketball's passing proficient Yuri Collins on pace for top 20 in NCAA career assists

The contributions made by Yuri Collins in St. Louis University's win over St. Bonaventure were many, but coach Travis Ford spoke only of his point guard's defense when the game ended.

Collins held Daryl Banks III to one point and that was worthy of his coach's admiration.

What Ford didn't mention, nor anyone else for that matter, was that Collins had 14 assists. It's a number that is almost taken for granted anymore with the senior leading the country and having reached that number six times this season.

After entering his fourth year at SLU with 554 career assists, Collins is at 727 and 66th on the NCAA's all-time list. He has 173 in 2022-23 and is averaging 10.8 in 16 games. With a minimum of 16 games remaining, Collins would land on 900 if he maintains that average.

Yet, he said he has no idea where he stands.

"There's too much to do. That's for you all to add up the numbers," he said Tuesday. "I'm not into all that. I know when something is posted (on social media) that says 'Yuri's at 700,' but I don't know the exact number. That's for you all. I play basketball."

The numbers have changed so quickly this season it's hard to keep up. He has surpassed 600 and 700, could soon reach 800 and, eventually, challenge 900. Get there and he would be No. 16 all time in NCAA Division I career assists with a season of eligibility remaining.

Collins is the NCAA active leader after playing his 100th career game. Ford admits he doesn't pay much attention to the numbers as long as SLU is winning. The Billikens are 7-2 when he has 10 or more.

"No question, I appreciate it, and it's amazing," Ford said. "But I don't pay much attention to it. We're trying to figure out how to be successful, and that's a big part of it. It's easy to not talk about when he does it so much. But let's not forget how difficult it is."

Collins has five double-doubles of assists and points this season and 11 for his career. One of the biggest came last season at George Mason, who plays Wednesday at Chaifetz Arena, when he had 35 points and 13 assists in a double overtime win.

That was part of a season in which he set the SLU single-game, season and career records for assists. He had 19 against Boston College to establish the game record.

Collins already has broken that, having recorded 20 against Tennessee State. He is averaging three more per game than last season.

"Coach put scorers around me who I can dish the ball to and who can make shots," Collins said. "But also I've been playing

four years, so I know the game a little more and how defenses rotate, plays I can't make and when to gamble. All that stuff playing into it."

Adding to his effectiveness, Collins has reduced his turnovers. He is 14th nationally in assist-to-turnover ratio at 3.15-to-1.

Collins was on the preseason watch list for the Bob Cousy Award, which goes to the nation's top point guard. He was last year as well but didn't make the cut as a finalist. This time around, he figures to be in the conversation.

Adding great defense will only help his case.

Collins played 39 minutes against St. Bonaventure and held Banks, who scored 58 points in the two previous games, to 0-for-5 shooting.

"I feel like I've always been a lock-down defender," he said. "It's just a matter of people recognizing it. I've been doing it since I got here. I feel I can guard anybody on the court. I want the challenge. I know smaller guards have to be productive at both ends."

## SLU basketball's Terrence Hargrove Jr. finds happiness after battling depression

The smiling, dancing and jabbering have always made Terrence Hargrove Jr. a conspicuous figure during practices and pregame warmups at Chaifetz Arena.

The St. Louis University senior is the big personality for the Billikens, with no one a close second.

But recently, Hargrove endured challenges in his life that led to depression and worse, he said, as school, family and other issues left him with little enthusiasm for basketball and sometimes not wanting to leave his apartment.

Hargrove went public Monday when he alluded to the problems in a Twitter post and declared that he had regained his happiness. But the dark side of his battle went much deeper, he revealed before practice.

"I was in a don't-care moment. That's when I wanted to throw in the towel but I couldn't do it – like suicidal, done," he said. "I really had a lot of suicidal thoughts during that time. I was in my room alone a lot. That's what scares me. That's why I hate to be alone sometimes. Those are things I didn't share with many people."

Hargrove did share his thoughts with his parents and now wants to talk openly to help others who might have similar issues.

He lost 15 pounds after returning from SLU's tour of Europe in late August, not to get in better shape but because he was eating poorly or little and not sleeping well. He lost physical and mental strength and spent practices looking forward to the end so he could go home.

The process of recovery for Hargrove included long talks with his parents and teammates Lamont Evans IV and Sincere Parker and reading his Bible.

"I made the Twitter post because I realized all the progress I've made in self-happiness," he said. "I looked in the mirror and realized how much I've gained. I see myself glowing."

Mental health is a much-discussed issue within college athletics and took on greater emphasis during the peak of COVID-19. The NCAA transformation committee last week issued a report with one of its top recommendations being improved support for athletes' mental, physical and academic well-being.

Hargrove didn't miss practices or games, but his head was not clear of the distractions, which he said included negativity expressed about him from the outside.

"It was keeping me up at night, and I wasn't getting the correct sleep, not the correct food," he said. "I would be up all night and thrown off in practice and games. Sometimes I didn't want to play games. I didn't really want to leave my room sometimes, but I had to. I wanted to get out of that because it wasn't me."

Hargrove said he has remained at the lower weight of 210 pounds but has added muscle. For a while it kept him from being able to compete at a high level.

"I couldn't match up against Javon (Pickett) in practice because he was stronger than me, and I didn't care," he said.

Hargrove said his situation is not uncommon among college athletes. After a recent game, Yuri Collins made a vague reference to the outside elements that impact players.

"Everyone's got their own issues they might have at the moment," Collins said. "You really don't know what it is."

Hargrove said he tried to camouflage his depression by maintaining a happy attitude on the floor. He is thankful for long talks and motivation given by Evans, who is his roommate, and Parker, who visits his room regularly to chat, as well as his mom and dad.

He said the slow process of "winning each day" led to a change that helped him reach this point. When he woke up Monday, it was another step in his recovery.

"I felt great," he said. "I went to weights and had a great session. I went to my room and cleaned up a little and listened to music. It's been a great day overall. I'm happy to be alive and that I made it through tough times."

## After repeated injuries, ACL tear ends Fred Thatch Jr.'s SLU basketball career

Resting on a trainer's table with his left leg encased in an ice therapy wrap Friday, Fred Thatch Jr. expressed amazement with how long he was able to play college basketball.

Not only his career of nearly five years, which ended with a torn anterior cruciate ligament this week, but this season.

A torn ACL ended his time playing for St. Louis men's basketball, but it could have been any number of things. This year alone he had problems with his back, a different knee injury, an Achilles tendon and a foot.

"Honestly, I haven't had a day of painless basketball in five or six weeks," Thatch said. "Every day, I wake up and get out of bed, I think 'Man, I've got to make it through the day.' A small part of me feels relieved. What I was putting my body through to compete was difficult. Now, it's time for the next journey."

Thatch was injured Wednesday night in SLU's game at Massachusetts. He left in the first half, was cleared by an attending doctor for UMass at halftime, and played without problem in the second half until his knee gave out.

Despite the pain of the initial injury, he said he felt ready to play after being examined at halftime. He described himself as "skipping, jumping, sprinting, running" during the break, and the decision was made that he would play.

"When it happened the first time, I knew it was bad because of the pain," he said. "The pain was crazy. But then the doctor looked at it and was moving it, and I couldn't feel anything. I guess my adrenaline was going so much. I don't know how it went from all that pain to nothing."

Asked if he was upset about being allowed to play or deciding to play, Thatch said, "Oh, no, no. That wasn't anybody's fault. I've built a tolerance for pain and don't blame anybody."

That became his final game for SLU, because he has decided not to use his final year of eligibility in 2023-24 due to the toll he has endured physically.

Thatch almost didn't get through his second year at SLU, when he missed most of the 2019-20 season after being diagnosed with a disorder that affected his muscles. At that point, he thought his basketball days were over.

The veteran of 109 college games has been connected to the SLU program since Ford's first season when he committed to the Billikens as a high school junior from Sikeston. Ford was emotional in discussing Thatch before practice Friday.

"There's no question what he has meant to the team," Ford said. "I don't know if people fully understand. His only carefree year was his freshman year. After that, he was battling illness and injury consistently. Sitting at home last night I hurt inside thinking of all the stuff he's been through. If anyone can handle

it, it's him. He's so mentally tough."

Thatch described the most recent stretch of this season as "four to five weeks of hell." He had a back injury and had to see a specialist. He suffered a knee injury during SLU's game against Maryland. Then came a sore and swollen Achilles tendon followed by the fear he had a foot stress fracture.

"His body hurt every day, and he was pushing through it," guard Yuri Collins said. "I sent him a text and told him I love him and appreciate him. He didn't have to do this, the way he was feeling. He said all the time, 'I feel like I'm 50 years old out here.'"

Ford said he had wanted to make Thatch a starter in recent weeks, but he resisted. Thatch said he didn't want to interrupt the routine he had developed, and Ford said Thatch repeatedly told him "It might mean more to (someone else) than it does to me."

The impact of his muscular condition has followed Thatch to this day. But while he was sidelined the one season, he accelerated his academic work and earned a bachelor's degree in marketing. He also has a first master's degree and is working on a second in supply chain management.

"I knew in my head I'd be done hooping in a couple of months," he said. "After what I went through a few years ago, I was grateful for all the time I had. I didn't expect to play after that. I truly don't have any regrets. I'm excited to see what comes next for me. I embrace this journey."

In his 109 games at SLU, Thatch started 28 times and finished averaging 6.3 points and 4.0 rebounds.

## SLU assistant coach Will Bailey holds the inside scoop for looming UMass basketball game

When handing out scouting assignments for the season, it was a no-brainer that St. Louis University men's basketball assistant coach Will Bailey was asked to provide the intel on Wednesday night's opponent.

He not only spent four months on the Massachusetts staff last year before returning to fill an opening at SLU, but he worked alongside UMass coach Frank Martin at South Carolina for two seasons.

When Martin got the job with the Minutemen, Bailey was asked to be one of his assistants. In his brief time in Amherst, Massachusetts, Bailey helped recruit some of this season's players and ran some workouts from April to July.

Thus, he was the assistant who was deeply involved this week in the Billikens' preparation for their second Atlantic 10 game.

"We were there during the spring and some of the summer, putting together a team," Bailey said. "We got quite a few transfers. We were trying to implement some individual workouts and get a feel for guys."

The Minutemen have two starters who made the move from South Carolina to UMass in Wildens Leveque and Brandon Martin, whose strengths and weaknesses Bailey presumably would know well.

A group of four other transfers and two freshmen were announced as additions to the roster in June before Bailey left.

With first-hand knowledge of how Martin operates, he could integrate a little of that background into his scouting report.

"I think it all factors in," Bailey said. "He's a great coach but has different personnel than at South Carolina, so he's trying to figure them out. Some things he's doing the same, but some things he's kind of tweaked to fit his players."

"Frank is tough and hangs his hat on defense, so he's going to be aggressive. That part's not changing. They'll pressure and deny and try to make entry passes hard to catch and try to create turnovers. That's who he is and he's done a great job from what we've seen."

Ford has experience coaching against Martin when they were at Oklahoma State and Kansas State respectively. He wasn't so sure that Bailey could offer anything extra, other than his usual insight into an opponent, on how to beat the Minutemen.

"I've competed against Frank's teams many times," Ford said. "We all know about everybody. You'd think it would be a big help, but we know what they're trying to do and they know what we're trying to do. But he has stressed the mentality that they play with."

Bailey's departure from UMass was on good terms. After all, he had left SLU after spending four seasons with Ford to join Martin. They have kept in touch, and Bailey said he texted Martin as recently as New Year's day.

After mentioning that he looked forward to seeing Martin, Bailey received a response that said, "I'd much rather see you in a restaurant."

Bailey decided to return to St. Louis in part because of his relationship with Ford and the proximity to home and family in Chicago. The opportunity came when Ray Giacoletti retired in the spring.

Bailey's connection with Martin goes back to his earliest days as an assistant and when Martin was head coach at Northeastern. After they met, Bailey said he followed Martin's career.

"I was just getting into the business," Bailey said. "I met him and if you know Frank, he's so genuine and nice, and he came up and put his arm around me and talked to me. He made an impression."

Now, as happens with regularity in college basketball, two coaches who have had a working relationship will be competitors for one game.

Said Bailey, "He'd much rather go out to eat than to compete against someone he knows."

## SLU basketball approaching more degrees than a thermometer. Add Gibson Jimerson to the list.

The celebration on the floor of Chaifetz Arena will be like nothing Gibson Jimerson has experienced in his days playing basketball for St. Louis University.

It will be an emotional moment of pride and accomplishment capped by a shower of confetti. And SLU's graduation will be just the start of a busy Saturday for SLU's shooting guard.

After securing his bachelor of science degree in international business, Jimerson will follow with his usual game-day activities for the Billikens leading up to tipoff against Drake. When the game starts, he will be one of six SLU players who have at least one degree while some are working on a second or third.

The age of COVID and graduate transfers in the NCAA has created a new dynamic on rosters around the country, allowing athletes not only a fifth year of eligibility but in some cases a sixth year. Rosters are aging. Jimerson, 23, is graduating after three and a half years of classes.

SLU's roster is loaded with well-studied, veteran players unlike ever before. The Billikens rank 13th in the country and first in the Atlantic 10 in experience, according to KenPom analytics.

Where they rank in academic degrees is unknown. But now comes the unusual case of a player graduating and playing a game on the same day.

"We'll have the ceremony, walk across the stage and visit with my family, then we'll have shootaround after that and I've got to get into game mode," Jimerson said. "It will be a busy day, a fun day, and hopefully it ends with a win."

The oddity of Jimerson's graduation is that it will come at a time when he is classified as a sophomore for athletic purposes. If he wanted, he could play two more seasons after this.

That's what happens when your first two years don't count against your eligibility due to a medical redshirt and a COVID year. Despite his tenure, Jimerson is a youngster on this SLU team.

"I've had some older teams but not this old," coach Travis Ford said. "Not even close. There aren't going to be many like it. With transfers, you're bringing in guys that have already graduated. You can tell it's an older group."

Javonte Perkins is in his sixth year of college. Fred Thatch Jr., Francis Okoro, Javon Pickett and Jake Forrester are in their fifth years. Yuri Collins and Terrence Hargrove Jr. join Jimerson in playing their fourth.

The starting five used in the first 11 games has an average age of 23 led by Perkins and Pickett at 24. Thatch and Forrester, who come off the bench, are 23.

Along the way, Thatch has picked up a bachelor's degree in marketing and a Master of Business Administration degree; Perkins has a Bachelor of Arts in sociology; Okoro has a Bachelor of Arts in environmental studies; Forrester has a Bachelor of Science in criminal justice from Temple and Pickett has a Bachelor of Science in information technology from Missouri.

Ford said there are pros and cons to having an older group.

"Sometimes older guys think they have it all figured out," he said. "It was a concern early because I didn't think we practiced well. Experience is a positive if it's used right. I've had older teams where guys were worried about the next year and what they'd be doing. Sometimes they don't live in the present."

The SLU roster has players living out different scenarios than most college athletes. Forrester lives off campus with his girlfriend and newborn son. Thatch is working on yet another degree. Perkins is using a sixth year of eligibility after last season's ACL tear.

Thatch has been the most prolific, having earned his first degree in three years before adding a master's. Now, Jimerson is finishing early.

"We have to take summer classes, and I got a lot of credits done," Jimerson said. "When COVID happened, I took a few more because they were online and thought I might as well finish in the winter and go from there."

Different experiences and circumstances have brought them together before they enter the real world.

"I'm really proud of them," Ford said. "Off the court, they've taken care of their business at a very high level. That's impressive."

## Javon Pickett thriving for SLU as adjustments continue

In the process of choosing St. Louis University and preparing to integrate with a new team, Javon Pickett watched replays of games from last season when the Billikens played Auburn and St. Bonaventure.

That introduced some basic SLU concepts, but the 6-foot-5 senior knew that only time on the court would help him learn his new teammates and a new system.

That development is ongoing, from practice to practice, game to game, play to play, especially when it comes to his connection with guard Yuri Collins, who leads the country in assists.

"A couple of times last game, Yuri found me cutting to the basket and I was wide open, whereas a couple of weeks ago, I might have been standing in the corner waiting on a 3 or something," Pickett said. "Since the first game that's increased a lot. He doesn't have to really look at you to know. He's going to find you."

Pickett is averaging 11.4 points and has surpassed 1,000 for his career. He is shooting a career-best 52.7% after four seasons at Missouri and has seen his rebounding blossom to an average of 7.4 per game entering Saturday's game against Southern Illinois Carbondale at Chaifetz Arena.

The native of Belleville immediately established himself as a starter and at times has been a stat-sheet stuffer along the lines of Jordan Goodwin. Against Tennessee State he contributed 15 points, 7 rebounds, 3 assists and 3 steals.

"He's a high-impact guy when it comes to stats," coach Travis Ford said. "I saw it when we went to Europe. When we started practicing I thought I wouldn't be shocked if he led us in rebounding. He pursues the ball so well."

Pickett has been a presence that SLU needs. He is a significant threat around the basket, has displayed a floater or short jumper in the lane and has been good enough beyond the 3-point arc to require respect from defenses.

He took a different path to wearing a Billikens jersey, becoming a rare player to have connections with the trio of Illinois, Mizzou and SLU.

He originally signed with Illinois but asked to be released from his letter of intent because of a coaching change. In four years at Mizzou, he started 84 of 119 games and averaged 8 points.

Like any fifth-year transfer, he faced many adjustments after four seasons in another coach's system.

"It's a little different, but I like to slash and get to the rim so I don't have to have the ball in my hands so much," he said. "I'm still learning. I'm still getting accustomed to everyone, but I feel I'm doing a good job getting to know how they move and where they'll be."

Pickett was the second-leading scorer for Mizzou last season on a team that averaged 65 points. The Billikens average 80 and will rely on him less with a roster that has more scorers.

But Ford commented after the win over Tennessee State that Pickett appears to be adjusting to take advantage of Collins' playmaking abilities to get more scoring chances.

"It was kind of natural because Javon is smart," Collins said. "He's been in college four years in the SEC. In basketball you play off instincts. He sees stuff I see. We might talk about something in a timeout and execute it on the next possession."

Ford has emphasized rebounding as part of Pickett's game and believes it's within reason for him to average a double-double even though he had only one 10-rebound game at Mizzou. Pickett said he now thinks in those terms, pushing for the extra rebounds when he knows he's close.

"I wanted to come here and compete on the defensive end, run the floor, knock down shots and try to be a leader," he said. "I feel I'm having fun, and that's the main thing I wanted to do."

## Yuri Collins gets record 20 assists for SLU. He thinks he could have had 25.

Nothing was out of the ordinary as far as Yuri Collins was concerned while his assists were accumulating with passes for open shooters, fast breaks and one backdoor cut after another.

The St. Louis University point guard reached 15, but he had done that before. He hit 16 and then 17, and that still didn't register.

But finally he knew where he stood Wednesday night as SLU was completing an 80-63 win over Tennessee State at Chaifetz Arena. And Collins went for it.

"When I got to 18, I started hunting for them," he said. "At 17, we were still playing ball. There were a few minutes left and another media timeout. I figured it was going to come."

Collins tied his own school record of 19 on an inbound pass to Fred Thatch Jr. And he hit 20 to establish a new mark when he found Sincere Parker slicing to the basket for a layup with plenty of time to spare.

He played 36 minutes and had only one turnover, and there was no telling how many he could have had if all the layups he helped create had been converted.

"Like 25, 26," Collins said.

The 20 assists were the most by a Division I player this season and boosted his average to 11.6 per game.

He did much of his work by connecting with teammates on cuts that produced an abundance of layups along with a few misses.

"He made probably five to eight passes that were incredible," coach Travis Ford said. "I don't know if any player in the country can make them. He's had a lot of games he's made one or two crazy passes that led to incredible buckets, but he was putting points on a platter for these guys."

Collins had his big night in a game where SLU wasn't at its sharpest offensively throughout. In fact, the first 15 minutes were a bit of a struggle as Tennessee State's changing offenses caused some issues for the Billikens.

He had several assists in the final minutes of the first half as SLU opened a 10-point lead and reached nine at the break.

His assists were aided in the second half when Javonte Perkins warmed up from behind the 3-point arc. But he mostly created the plays by breaking down the defense.

Asked about the luxury of playing with Collins, Perkins scoffed, "It's all right. Nothing major."

Then he continued: "It's good for people like me. He finds the scorers and everyone on the court. It's a two-way street, you know. He passes the ball and we're scoring, so everyone's going to look good."

The game was Collins' fourth this season with 10 or more assists after he had eight in double digits last season.

On a night that Gibson Jimerson couldn't get open for 3-pointers, he moved and cut and scored on five layups, four of them assisted by Collins. The 6-foot senior also continued to fine tune his connection with Javon Pickett, who benefited from numerous feeds, including one of Collins' patented transition bounce passes.

"Gibson has figured out how to cut and move, and now Javon is figuring it out," Ford said. "He wants to get part of this, too. He's cutting and sprinting. Everyone wants to be a part of it. You have to love playing with him."

Ford still wasn't happy with SLU's conversion rate around the basket. The Billikens missed 18 shots within a couple of feet of the rim. However, Francis Okoro did go up with more authority than usual on a couple of plays to finish with dunks.

Pickett and Perkins scored 15 points to lead the Billikens, and Jimerson added 11. SLU had 26 assists as a team on 32 baskets.

Afterward, Ford was looking forward to reviewing the game. It's something he would do regardless but the chore was going to be different this time.

"I'm interested to see how many were 'wow' assists," Ford said. "Quite a few, I think."

## St. Louis U. reverses trend from last year by holding off Memphis in final minutes

Lost leads and squandered opportunities became a theme of St. Louis University's nonconference last season when double-digit advantages in the second half disappeared with regularity.

With Memphis having failed to make up ground in the second half Tuesday, a 14-point lead with under four minutes remaining seemed safe. It was, just barely.

"We experienced that a lot with big leads and letting them go," guard Yuri Collins said. "I'm sure that was running through our heads. We didn't say anything to each other, but we aren't letting a game like that go. We buckled down."

The Billikens held on for a 90-84 win at Chaifetz Arena after seeing Memphis pull within two points with 42 seconds left. SLU (3-0) scored its final 13 points at the free-throw line in a less-than-perfect finish.

But the Billikens were sharp for most of the first 36 minutes and that was enough for them to post a key win in a series of what will be tough challenges.

"It wasn't pretty but that's a really good offensive team," coach Travis Ford said. "We fed into it a little when their pressure picked up. Last year we talked extensively about how we didn't finish some games. History is good for that. Our guys haven't forgotten that. There's still work to be done to finish better. I'm glad we were able to finish at all."

While Memphis was on the attack to finish the game, the Billikens had to settle for free throws in the last six minutes when they weren't taking ill-advised shots or turning the ball over.

Collins had 22 points and nine assists and had a career-high 12 free throws on 14 attempts. He made eight in a row in the final six minutes.

The lead looked similar to those SLU held in the second half against Belmont, Alabama-Birmingham and Auburn last season only to lose. Even with the double-digit lead, Collins and the Billikens continued to push the tempo against the Tigers, something the veteran point guard insisted on doing.

"Give them credit for speeding us up a little," he said. "We were still going to play fast. Getting in transition is how we were scoring, so we weren't going to stop no matter what the lead was. When we got a rebound we were still going to push it. We missed some shots at the end we were making at the beginning. But we were playing our game. I'll take that any day."

Ford had a bit of a different take because of some decisions the Billikens made.

On a couple of occasions, players rushed as they attacked the basket and took difficult shots against taller defenders. SLU also had some turnovers against the pressure as Gibson Jimerson

was called for a backcourt violation and Collins and Javon Pickett miscommunicated on a pass that went out of bounds.

"We want to take what the defense gives us," Ford said. "We don't want to go against 6-10, 6-11 guys. We don't want to slow it down. We still want to play to win. But you've also got to make good decisions. Sometimes you play into the other team's hands. We did that."

In building the lead in the second half, SLU had some notable performances.

Francis Okoro overcame foul trouble to play a smart second half that included good defense and rebounding as he finished with 11 boards and was able to stay on the floor without fouling.

Sincere Parker saw his most notable minutes of the season and scored eight points, showing an ability to get to the basket and create shots around big defenders.

Jimerson had 18 points and contributed an impressive sequence when he grabbed a defensive rebound, flipped the ball to Collins and then ran the floor to get a return pass that resulted in a layup.

"They were face guarding me a little," Jimerson said. "I went through that a lot last year and got used to it. When they guard me like that, something else is going to open up. If they pay that attention, we make them pay in other ways."

Ford said he felt the Billikens were tired in the final two minutes as they were trying to hold on. Memphis had possession with a chance to tie the game or take the lead in the final minute.

"We gave them second shots and they scored," he said. "They got offensive rebounds kicked out for 3s. I think we were a little gassed. But I felt we were in pretty good shape and thought we'd be OK."

## Jake Forrester hopes to bring wisdom, calm to SLU men's basketball

With a degree in criminal justice in hand, Jake Forrester has refocused the academic portion of his college experience as he embarks on his final year of eligibility to play for St. Louis University.

The 6-foot-9 forward has one class in his graduate year – an online course that will provide him with a certificate in emergency management.

Beyond any ways he might apply the knowledge in a future career, Forrester says it could come in handy in the coming months as he sees it being applicable to sports.

"I've used that a lot in papers I write," he said. "Being an athlete, you learn how to communicate and direct people. I'm not saying playing is stressful, but there comes a time when you have to talk to each other, know where to put guys, when to do the right thing and not get flustered."

Forrester transferred at a time that the SLU program is teeming with players of similar experience. However, he hopes to provide attributes that are different from what is on hand. The type of things that make someone a proverbial X-factor.

At 23, he has played at Indiana and Temple, seeing time in 70 career games over four seasons. He has averaged 6.5 points and 3.9 rebounds with his best season being in 2020-21, when he averaged 9.3 and 6.4.

Forrester will be expected to provide minutes inside along with Francis Okoro, taking over the role filled last season by Marten Linssen.

"I feel I'll be an X-factor kind of guy," he said. "When I'm called, I'll bring the juice, the energy every time on the floor. I feel I bring wisdom to the team and calmness when I'm on the floor. I'm not flashy. I'm gritty and just simple, but you'll know when I'm out there."

The native of Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, is no longer leading a typical college life. He is living off campus with his girlfriend and newborn son. He commutes to campus and leads a non-student life away from basketball.

As a player, he was once described by Archie Miller, his coach at Indiana, as "a livewire" and "as energetic, as vocal, as high-strung

of a guy as I've had come into college in a while."

Time will tell if the years have mellowed Forrester, but he's intent on having his best college season with the Billikens, whom he chose because of his instant connection with the coaching staff.

"I was really drawn here just from speaking to coach (Travis Ford) and a lot of the assistants," he said. "My visit went really well. I came when a lot of the players weren't here, they were on break. So it was me and the coaches, and the system drew me."

Forrester had the advantage of playing with the team on its August trip to Europe, although he only played in two of three games after his travel was delayed due to a bout with COVID.

He has turned some heads in practice and twice last week was the team leader in practice points, which are awarded based on a variety of categories.

"Right now, I'm probably the best I've ever been on boxing out," he said. "Because everyone crashes the glass, you have to be. Plus, coach puts you on the treadmill if you don't box out."

Forrester sees himself still growing in basketball while also expanding in his life. As most young parents say, the arrival of a child has provided a new perspective and created new priorities.

Eventually, he'll give his career more serious thought. He already has laid a foundation with his degree and the work he's doing at SLU.

"It's been in the back of my mind possibly becoming a defense attorney or doing community reform in inner-city communities," he said. "I wrote my Capstone paper around doing inner-city and prison reform. I got a criminal justice degree to change the system and benefit people who are done wrong."

Forrester wants to be a force for change. That will start with his pursuit of getting SLU to the NCAA Tournament.

"I feel this will be my best year of college basketball, and the same for a lot of the older guys on the team," he said. "We're all hungry."

## Travis Ford showing increased intensity as SLU men's basketball faces high expectations

The core of a St. Louis University basketball team that has played together extensively in recent years is only two weeks deep into practice and still nearly a month from playing its first regular-season game.

The prolonged preseason can be a long and grueling stretch for a team that feels like it's ready for competition. The Billikens certainly are in a different place than they normally would be as mid-October approaches.

They can see it in each other, and they can see it in coach Travis Ford, who enters his seventh season at SLU with a roster that has created greater expectations than any of his previous teams in the program.

"Coach is always intense," center Francis Okoro said. "This year, he's not taking no nonsense. Everything has to be perfect. Everything has to be detailed. You come to practice and make a mistake, coach is going to stop the play. Coach understands how important it is for us not to think we're just going to be good naturally. He knows we have to work on it."

As an example, Okoro said Ford recently spent an hour reviewing and dissecting film of a stretch of play that lasted only a few minutes.

This week, SLU will find out how outsiders perceive the team's expectations when the Atlantic 10 releases its preseason poll and all-conference teams Thursday at media day in Brooklyn, New York.

No matter where the Billikens are picked – assuredly first or second – they will be looked upon as the group with the greatest potential since the program reached three consecutive NCAA Tournaments.

They were picked to win the league in 2018-19 and finished sixth before winning the A-10 tournament.

"We have some veteran guys who have been around for a while, whether it's here or somewhere else," Ford said. "Especially the guys who have been here, what I'm concerned about in the middle of the night is I don't want them to take anything for granted. ... They need to earn what they get."

Although games are not imminent, Ford tries to create competition in practice every day, stressing the motto "Win the day"

"Coach is big on that. Every day after practice, he says, 'If we had a game today, do you think we would have won?'" guard Fred Thatch Jr. said. "If the answer is 'yes,' we know we won that day. In college basketball, you have good days and bad days, but I'd say that 90% of practices have been good, and that shows maturity."

Outside of the SLU bubble, the offseason talk has been positive.

ESPN's Joe Lunardi has the Billikens as a No. 8 seed in his projected field for the 2023 NCAA Tournament. CBS Sports had them in its Top 25 and 1 until recently. National analyst Jon Rothstein ranks them No. 32.

"We try not to pay attention to the media because at the end of the day, if you're doing well, they're going to ride with you," Thatch said. "As a team, we have to stay together and make sure our emotions and everything are in place because this season is a big deal."

The maturity Thatch mentioned comes from the extended careers of many players. Perkins is a senior in his sixth year of college. Thatch, Okoro, Javon Pickett and Jake Forrester are in their fifth years. And Yuri Collins, Gibson Jimerson and Terrence Hargrove Jr. are in their fourth years.

There have been some bumps and bruises and twists in the early going. Javonte Perkins twisted an ankle and has missed a few days of practice but has been otherwise healthy. Daniel Rivera has missed a stretch of practice and has been wearing a boot.

Others, such as Okoro, have used the offseason and preseason to heal lingering injuries and get stronger for what, in some cases, will be a final college season.

"I think we didn't get to our potential last year," Okoro said. "This year, we have a chance to prove something to ourselves and the fans. We owe them a lot this year."

## SLU's Larry Hughes Jr. seeks his own identity while embracing his father's legacy

Whether it was an NBA locker room, a business meeting or a gym with his father's name attached, a model for life and basketball has been front and center for Larry Hughes Jr., since before memories were being formed.

He soaked in the culture and learned the skills. Resources were plentiful, even when it came to experiencing basketball as a work endeavor or for friendships and as an avenue for education.

One thing Hughes Jr. didn't get from growing up with Larry Hughes the NBA player was a lot of stories about dad's one season at St. Louis University and the massive crowds that attended games before an appearance in the NCAA Tournament.

"Surprisingly, it was everybody else who told me how impactful he was and how he was just that guy everybody wanted to see play," Hughes Jr. said. "He didn't tell me much about it. We're kind of the same person. I'm the same way, letting my game speak for me."

The younger Hughes was not raised to duplicate his dad on the court but to be the best version of himself. Ultimately, he decided the best path in college would be to also play for SLU, even if it meant joining the team as a walk-on.

When it came to committing to the Billikens last spring, he referenced the past without specifically naming the source: "The legacy continues" he wrote on social media.

"It's not like the legacy for matching what I did," Larry Hughes said. "It's about adding positives onto what's already there – just that he's a good student, and player and a good kid. To me, that's what we built before him."

Hughes Jr. is the third in his family to play for SLU, following dad, who averaged 20.9 points in his lone season of 1997-98, and sister Lauryn, who played from 2017 to 2021.

He bypassed chances to play on scholarship elsewhere to attend SLU, not because he felt pressured to do so but because the move felt right after being recruited by coach Travis Ford and his staff for several years.

The 6-foot-5 guard is likely to be learning as a spectator during games this season with a veteran roster expected to do big things and several other freshmen on board and on scholarship. "I'm proud of where I am right now," he said. "I'm fine with being (a walk-on). It adds a little chip on my shoulder. I want to prove not to myself but to people in the stands that it doesn't mean much to me. I'm as good as anyone out here."

Hughes Jr. also followed in dad's footsteps by winning a state championship at CBC as a senior. He averaged 13.4 points in his final high school season and had 20 in the state final.

The connection between father and son started when Hughes Jr. spent time in the Cleveland Cavaliers' locker room as a child. People looking for similarities soon found things that have continued to this day.

"We can't really run from it," Larry Hughes said. "How picky he is with food, mannerisms, being an introvert. There are mannerisms we see that are like a mirror like his walk. He's not really going anywhere too fast, just trying to get from A to B. (People say) That's your son."

Being around the Cavaliers, Hughes Jr. became friends with other NBA kids, including Bronny James, and the families once made a trip to Disney World together.

He was coached and trained by his dad to a certain point. And since an early age, he has had access to facilities at the Larry Hughes Basketball Academy, including during the height of the pandemic.

"As I got older, we branched off and found different trainers who could teach me stuff from a different person," Hughes Jr. said. "But he told me everything I needed to be successful and I tried to listen. When I was younger I wasn't trying to listen as much because he was my dad."

"But I realized he knows the formula and he's been really helpful. He mostly watched and then critiqued. He would wait until I was done with a workout and pull me aside and have a conversation. We'd watch film together. He taught me how important it is to act like a pro on the court and off."

Hughes Jr. is majoring in sports business. He recently released a line of apparel L2 Smooth, which he worked on most of the summer. He has listened during some of his father's business meetings. He was a straight-A high school student who knew that an NBA career was not likely to be his ticket.

But for now, school and basketball are the focus before worrying about whatever comes after college. Larry Hughes said he looks at his son's first year at SLU as a year of prep as he learns behind veteran players.

As for his father's legacy?

"I embrace it but want to make a name for myself," Hughes Jr. said. "It's hard having a dad in the league 13 years. But I can show people I'm my own person. I know what my dad did for the community. I want to continue the legacy while building my own."

## Travis Ford found SLU men's basketball's offense was too good on European trip

Personal photos and videos to last a lifetime kept St. Louis University basketball players busy for hours. The paella in Spain was a culinary highlight. And the sites in Italy were "mind blowing."

Those things were at the forefront of a 10-day trip for a group that just happened to be brought together by basketball.

How much the Billikens gained from practices and games during their European tour remains to be seen, but coach Travis Ford said it was clear that the Billikens benefited more defensively than offensively.

The cultural and bonding experiences will endure. Ford and his staff will do their best to apply some basketball lessons learned when the team reconvenes for individual workouts next week.

"They embraced the tours and sightseeing," Ford said. "Sometimes on these trips it gets old, but they were ready for every one of them we did. They participated and asked questions."

"Basketball wise it was more of a chance for me to see the new guys in the system and for them to get significant minutes. I don't know how much we got out of it yet (because) we won every game by 30 or 40 points. I know we got more out of it defensively than offensively."

Ford said the staff is breaking down tape of the games, but the competition was questionable in all three games, making it tough to analyze.

All of the opponents struggled to defend the Billikens, who averaged 97 points with Gibson Jimerson leading the team in scoring. Point guard Yuri Collins was able to pick apart defenses for quick scores, allowing SLU to play little of its offense.

Ford went into the trip with grand plans. He had developed a shooting lineup, a defensive lineup, a physical lineup. He wanted to play two big men together. Most of that wasn't employed because of the way games played out.

"We didn't get to run our offense because we created so quickly," he said. "Teams didn't know how to guard us. But we kind of know who we are, especially the top seven or eight guys. If we were a rebuilding team, we'd probably want better competition. No one got hurt and everyone got to play."

There were some things that stood out for Ford.

Javonte Perkins, who is coming off an ACL injury, looked good and played a lot of minutes without problems in the first two games before seeing only five minutes in the finale. Javon Pickett showed great rebounding potential despite missing the middle game with turf toe.

Sincere Parker has defensive work to do but his shot-blocking ability was a revelation. Kellen Thames showed signs of being a high-level defender. And Thames, Fred Thatch Jr. and Perkins will fill the minutes at point guard when Collins is resting.

Parker also was the team's second-leading scorer, although stat keeping was sketchy.

"We knew he could score, and he's not just a shooter but can score a lot of ways," Ford said. "The other thing we saw was his blocked shots. He blocked a ton at the rim and really rebounds. He has extremely long arms. He had three or four dunks. He's deceptively athletic. Now the other side of the ball, he's got to get better defensively."

Ford said he likes the idea of the big man combination of Francis Okoro and Jake Forrester. But Forrester missed the first game, and the two were not used simultaneously during the other two games.

So, not all of the combinations he wanted could be used. That went for defense as well as offense. The Billikens held the three opponents to an average of 55 points, but no one knows what, if anything, that means at this point. Ford said he believes SLU can be an elite defensive team.

"I think we can with the addition of Javon Pickett, who's a really good defender," he said. "Jake is a good defender. Kellen is elite and can be a game-changer. There are lineups we can play that will be very strong defensively."

The group spent more time sightseeing and eating than playing basketball on the trip, which is allowed once every four years.

The lone travel glitch was a delayed flight from Spain to Italy, forcing the team to go directly from the airport to a gym for a game. Better now than in January.

The paella in Spain was made by the team under the guidance of chefs. The Billikens toured the usual historic sites, including the Forum, the Colosseum and The Vatican.

Upon returning, Ford gave the team two weeks to rest before things get more serious. He's been away but isn't so sure they're taking much of a break.

"I'm letting them re-charge their batteries on their own," he said. "But they're in the gym every day from what I understand. That's just kind of this group."
