TWO OF A-10'S TOP THREE TEAMS BATTLE TODAY

- •The second- and third-place teams in the Atlantic 10 Conference clash this afternoon as Saint Louis (11-3-1, 6-1) takes on Rhode Island (11-3-1, 5-1-1).
- •A-10 preseason favorite SLU, ranked 25th nationally by Top Drawer Soccer, seeks a return to the win column following Thursday's 2-0 loss to Dayton. Rhode Island, picked to finish sixth in the league, has won two straight and is 4-0-1 in its last five outings including Thursday's 5-0 victory over George Washington.
- •Saint Louis leads the series, which dates to 2005, 15-3 and has won the last three meetings. The teams did not play last year; most recently, the Billikens prevailed 5-0 at URI in 2023, improving to 4-3 vs. the Rams in Kingston.
- •Rhode Island's 11 wins are the most for the Rams since the 2014 team posted a 12-5-2 record.
- •Rhode Island was Saint Louis' opponent in the 2005 A-10 Championship final. The Billikens won 1-0 to claim the tournament title and an automatic NCAA Championship bid in their first season in the conference.

SAINT LOUIS IN THE NATIONAL PICTURE

- •Through games of Oct. 16, Saint Louis is No. 44 in the NCAA Division I women's soccer Ratings Percentage Index.
- •Four other A-10 teams are in the top 100 of the RPI Dayton (34), Loyola Chicago (77), Rhode Island (80) and Duquesne (81).
- •The Billikens are ranked No. 25 nationally by Top Drawer Soccer and No. 3 in the East Region by United Soccer Coaches.

HOCKETT ON TOP DRAWER SOCCER TOP 100 FRESHMEN LIST

- •Blakely Hockett is included on Top Drawer Soccer's Midseason Top 100 Freshmen List, landing at No. 52.
- •Hockett earned a starting spot at center back earlier this season and has been in SLU's first 11 in each of the past 10 games. In addition to helping the Billikens post an 8-1-1 record and register five shutouts during that stretch, she scored two goals including the game-winner vs. La Salle. Hockett's 968 minutes played are tops among SLU freshmen.

CHIER SELECTED A-10 ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

- Caroline Chier is the A-10 Rookie of the Week for Oct. 6-12.
- •Chier recorded the primary assist on **Nina Preusser's** gamewinning goal in SLU's 2-1 victory over Duquesne Oct. 12. The assist was Chier's sixth of the season, tying her for the A-10 lead.

BILLIKEN STATISTICAL LEADERS

- Adee Broesder and Audrey Smith have a team-high four goals apiece. Izzy Luebbert, Hope Kim, Julia Simon and Lucie Schwartz have three each.
- •Broesder and Luebbert top the points chart with 11 apiece, followed closely by Kim with nine points.
- Caroline Chier leads the team with six assists. Luebbert and Eva Schreiber have five apiece.
- •Hannah Larson has a team-high 30 total shots, followed closely by Kim (29). Smith (13), Kim (13) and Rylee Howard (12) are the leaders in shots on goal.

BILLIKENS IN THE A-10, NATIONAL TEAM STATISTICS

- •Saint Louis leads the A-10 in corner kicks per game (7.87, third nationally), winning percentage (.767, 20th) and assists per game (1.93, 51st).
- •The Billikens are second in the league in goals per game (1.93, 64th).
- •SLU is third in shots on goal per game (8.13, 14th), shots per game (17.20, 23rd), shutout percentage (.533, eight shutouts in 15 games, 34th) and goal differential (+16, 46th).

SAINT LOUIS GAME NOTES at RHODE ISLAND

BILLIKENS IN THE A-10, NATIONAL PLAYER STATISTICS

- •Caroline Chier is tied for first in the conference and tied for 53rd nationally with six assists.
- •Izzy Luebbert and Eva Schreiber are tied for fourth in the league with five assists.
- Emma Parker is fifth in the A-10 and 38th nationally with six shutouts.
- •Adee Broesder and Julia Simon are tied for eighth in the A-10 in game-winning goals (two).

BILLIKENS SPREADING THE WEALTH OFFENSIVELY

- •SLU has displayed remarkable offensive balance this season.
- •Thirteen different Billikens have scored at least one goal, and 14 different Billikens have recorded at least one point.
- •Twenty-three of SLU's 29 goals this season have been assisted. There has been a different player combination on 21 of those 23 goals.

"CORNERING" THE OPPOSITION

- •After compiling a modest 29-17 edge in corner kicks through the first five games, Saint Louis has dramatically increased its advantage in that category.
- •Over the last 10 games, the Billikens have earned 89 corners while limiting their opponents to 29, giving them a 118-46 edge for the season.

BILLS MAKE HERMANN STADIUM A SOCCER FORTRESS

- •Saint Louis is 85-10-12 (.850) in its last 107 games on the home pitch of Robert R. Hermann Stadium, a stretch that dates to the final home game of the 2015 campaign.
- •In those 107 games, SLU outscored opponents 241-43, posted 68 shutouts, and allowed more than one goal just four times.
- •Against A-10 opponents during the 107-game stretch, Saint Louis is 58-2-4 (43-1-4 regular season, 15-1-0 A-10 tournament) at Hermann Stadium.

CHIER, STANCIAK NOTCH FIRST BILLIKEN GOALS AT SAINT JOE'S

- •Contributing to Saint Louis' 5-0 win at Saint Joseph's Oct. 5 were **Caroline Chier** and **Addison Stanciak**, each of whom scored a goal for the first time as a Billiken.
- •Four of SLU's six freshman field players have scored at least one goal.

HOCKETT NETS FIRST COLLEGIATE GOAL VS. LA SALLE

- •Blakely Hockett scored the first goal of her collegiate career in Saint Louis' 4-0 victory over La Salle Oct. 2.
- •The goal also was Hockett's first game-winner as it was the Billikens' first tally in the shutout.

A DAY OF "FIRSTS" AT SIUE

- •Three Billikens enjoyed career "firsts" in SLU's 3-0 victory at SIUE Sept. 7.
- •Izzy Luebbert (game-winner) and Adee Broesder tallied their first collegiate goals, while Eva Schreiber enjoyed the first two-assist game of her Saint Louis career.

KIM'S CAREER-POINTS HIGH LIFTS SLU PAST MISSOURI STATE

- •Hope Kim played a key role in Saint Louis' 2-1 win over Missouri State, producing a career-high three points.
- •Kim recorded the primary assist on **Julia Simon's** goal that gave the Billikens a 1-0 lead in the 53rd minute, then scored what proved to be the game-winning goal in the 62nd minute.
 - Four of Kim's seven career goals have been game-winners.

BACK-TO-BACK 1-0 SHUTOUTS FIRST FOR SLU IN SEVEN YEARS

- •Although Saint Louis has been among the nation's leaders in shutouts in recent seasons, the Billikens did something in their games vs. Missouri and Indiana that they hadn't done in seven years.
- •SLU's wins over the Tigers and Hoosiers were 1-0 decisions. It marked the first time the Billikens posted consecutive 1-0 victories since 2018 when they blanked Duquesne and Fordham on Oct. 7 and Oct. 11, respectively.

WIN OVER MISSOURI FEATURED PAIR OF FIRSTS

- •SLU's 1-0 win over Missouri Aug. 24 included two individual "firsts."
- Rylee Howard's goal in the fifth minute held up and became the first game-winning tally of her collegiate career.
- •Goalkeeper **Emma Parker** went the distance between the posts and notched the first solo shutout of her collegiate career.

ATTENDANCE FOR MISSOURI GAME IS NATION'S 11TH HIGHEST

- •Hermann Stadium was alive Aug. 24 as 4,097 fans attended Saint Louis' 1-0 victory over Missouri.
- •The attendance is the 11th highest this season in NCAA Division I women's soccer; the 29th highest this season in NCAA Division I soccer, women or men; and the third highest in history for a Billiken women's soccer game at Hermann Stadium.

OFFENSE AT KANSAS CITY ONE OF SLU'S BEST IN AN OPENER

- •Saint Louis' four-goal victory margin at Kansas City was its second largest in a season opener played on the road. The Billikens won 6-1 at Tennessee Tech in the 1997 season opener.
- •Also, the four-goal margin was SLU's largest in any season opener since 2015, when the Bills blanked SMU 5-0 in St. Louis.

BILLIKENS SET TEAM RECORD FOR FASTEST GOAL IN AN OPENER

- •When Lucie Schwartz found the back of the net just 39 seconds into SLU's match at Kansas City, it marked the fastest goal in a season opener in program history.
 - •The previous mark was 1:16 in 2011 and again in 2014.

SAINT LOUIS GAME NOTES at RHODE ISLAND

HOCKETT SELECTED A-10 ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

- •Blakely Hockett was the A-10 Rookie of the Week for Sept. 29-Oct. 5.
- •Hockett netted the first goal of her collegiate career, which turned out to be the game-winner, in the Billikens' 4-0 win over La Salle. Hockett's goal at Saint Joseph's gave SLU a 3-0 lead on its way to a 5-0 victory.
- •In addition, Hockett played all 180 minutes at center back and helped limit the Billikens' opponents to nine total shots and two shots on goal combined.

BROESDER NAMED A-10 ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

- •After scoring the game-winning goals in victories over VCU and George Washington, **Adee Broesder** was named A-10 Rookie of the Week for Sept. 22-28.
- •Broesder's goal gave the Billikens a 2-0 lead at VCU, and SLU went on to win 2-1. Her goal at George Washington snapped a 1-1 tie and completed the Bills' 2-1 comeback victory.

SCHREIBER EARNS A-10 WEEKLY HONOR

- •Eva Schreiber was selected the Atlantic 10 Conference Defensive Player of the Week for Sept. 1-7.
- •Schreiber played 80 minutes in a 2-1 win over Missouri State Sept. 4, helping the Billikens hold the Bears to nine total shots (two shots on goal) from her outside back position.
- •In 76 minutes of action in a 3-0 victory at SIUE Sept. 7, Schreiber tallied a career-high two assists and was part of a SLU defense that limited the opponent to one shot.

LUEBBERT GARNERS TOP DRAWER SOCCER RECOGNITION

- •Izzy Luebbert earned Top Drawer Soccer Team of the Week honorable mention for her performance in the Billikens' 4-0 season-opening victory at Kansas City Aug. 14.
- •Luebbert had three assists vs. the Roos, all on corners. The three helpers and three points are her career single-game highs.

SCHWARTZ DELIVERS CAREER-HIGH POINT TOTAL VS. KC

- •Lucie Schwartz tallied a career-high three points to help Saint Louis defeat Kansas City 4-0 in the season opener.
- •Schwartz scored the Billikens' first goal of the year off a corner kick just 39 seconds into the game and recorded an assist on SLU's third goal.

BILLIKENS SELECTED A-10 PRESEASON FAVORITE

- •In their preseason poll, Atlantic 10 Conference head coaches made Saint Louis the favorite to capture the 2025 league title.
- •The Billikens received 11 of 14 first-place votes and totaled 192 points. Dayton, which garnered two first-place nods and tallied 173 points, finished second in the balloting.
- •Fordham (149 points) was third, followed by Loyola Chicago (145), Saint Joseph's (140), Rhode Island (111), La Salle (106), VCU (97, one first-place vote), Davidson (91), Duquesne (79), George Mason (64), Richmond (59), George Washington (50) and St. Bonaventure (14).
- •The 11-member preseason All-Conference team included five Billikens Hope Kim, Hannah Larson, Izzy Luebbert, Eva Schreiber and Julia Simon.

SCHEDULE FEATURES FOUR "POWER 4" OPPONENTS

- •Saint Louis continued its recent trend of assembling a challenging non-conference schedule as the 2025 Billikens faced four teams in succession from "Power 4" conferences.
- •The first big test happened at Penn State, which defeated the Bills 4-1. Consecutive 1-0 shutouts of Missouri and Indiana at home followed, and a 3-0 loss at Iowa concluded the gauntlet.
- •Saint Louis' 10-game A-10 schedule includes six of the other seven teams that qualified for the 2024 A-10 Championship Dayton, Fordham, Saint Joseph's, Loyola Chicago, VCU and Davidson. Dayton claimed the No. 52 final RPI ranking in 2024.

SIXTH-YEAR PLAYER LARSON LEADS BILLIKENS

- •Granted a medical hardship after missing the 2021 season due to injury, plus utilizing the extra year of eligibility allowed by the NCAA due to the COVID-19 pandemic, **Hannah Larson** is in her sixth year as a Billiken.
- •Larson garnered second-team All-Region and first-team All-Conference honors in 2020 (played in spring 2021), and she was a 2023 second-team All-Conference pick. She is a four-time A-10 Championship All-Tournament selection.
- •In 17 career postseason games (A-10 and NCAA combined), Larson has six goals and eight assists for 20 points. She has been especially clutch the past two postseasons, recording four goals and seven assists for 15 points in 11 games.
- •Larson is tied for fourth in game-winning assists (eight), fifth in assists (26), sixth in games started (93), seventh in games played (93) and tied for eighth in points (72) in Billiken history, and she is closing in on the top 10 in two other SLU career categories. She needs one goal (currently has 23) and two game-winning goals (currently has seven).

LARSON HIGH AMONG ACTIVE NCAA PLAYERS

- •Hannah Larson ranks among the top 10 active NCAA women's soccer players (includes all three divisions) in two categories.
- •Larson's 93 games played rank third, and her 26 assists rank 20th.

17 RETURN FROM 2024 TEAM

- •Five starters and 12 additional players return from the 2024 Billikens.
- •Returning starters are midfielder/forward Hannah Larson, forward/midfielder Julia Simon, defender Izzy Luebbert, forward Hope Kim and forward/midfielder Lucie Schwartz. Simon was named to the All-Conference second team and Kim was an A-10 All-Rookie selection in 2024.
- •Also back are forwards Audrey Smith, Rylee Howard, Emily Fox and Sarah Sarnowski; midfielders Ashley Miller, Nina Preusser and Ellie Paloucek; defenders Eva Schreiber, Camille Welker and Jordan Gary; forward/defender Caigan Leonard; and goalkeeper Nimu Karani.

SAINT LOUIS GAME NOTES at RHODE ISLAND

BILLIKENS WELCOME 11 NEWCOMERS

- •One transfer and 10 freshmen joined the SLU program this season.
- •Goalkeeper **Emma Parker** transferred to Saint Louis following one season at Arkansas.
- •The freshmen are forward Addison Stanciak; midfielders Sydney Dulak, Summer Fishel and Ava Rademeyer; defenders Blakely Hockett and Ava Scorfina; goalkeeper Kate Lewis; midfielder/forward Caroline Chier; forward/defender Adee Broesder; and forward/midfielder Avery Fitzgerald.

QUINTET ACCOUNTS FOR BULK OF RETURNING OFFENSE

- •Returning players for the 2025 Billikens accounted for 22 goals and 24 assists a season ago, and five players combined to produce a large portion of that offensive output.
- •Julia Simon, Hope Kim and Audrey Smith scored four goals apiece, Lucie Schwartz had three and Hannah Larson added two.
- •Larson led the 2024 Bills with eight assists, while Simon and Kim contributed three helpers apiece.

SAINT LOUIS IN 30TH SEASON OF WOMEN'S SOCCER

- •The 2025 season is the 30th in SLU women's soccer history.
- •The Billikens are 360-180-66 for a .649 winning percentage.
- •In conference play (Conference USA 1996-2004, Atlantic 10 since 2005), SLU is 187-72-30 (.699).
- •Saint Louis has captured 18 conference championships (nine regular-season, nine tournament) and has made nine NCAA Championship appearances (2005, 2006, 2018-24).
- •The 2023 team became the first in program history to reach the round of 16. The 2005, 2006 and 2021 teams reached the second round with first-round wins; the 2020 (spring 2021) Billikens were seeded into the second round in a 48-team field.
- •The 2024 Billikens produced a 20th winning season (ninth straight) for the program and was the 11th team in program history to have a .750 or higher winning percentage (including three straight and eight of the past nine years). With 15 victories, the 2024 Bills became the 10th SLU women's soccer team (including three straight and seven of the past eight years) to win 15 or more games.

HEAD COACH KATIE SHIELDS

- •Now in her 13th season leading the Billikens, 2018, 2019 and 2022 Atlantic 10 Conference Coach of the Year **Katie Shields** owns a 179-64-23 career record (all at Saint Louis). Shields' .716 career winning percentage ranks ninth among active NCAA Division I women's soccer coaches with a minimum of five seasons.
- •In addition to the 2022 A-10 coaching honor, Shields and her staff were selected the United Soccer Coaches 2022 East Region Coaching Staff of the Year, the second such honor for SLU (2020).
- •Shields, who spent one year as a SLU assistant before becoming head coach, has guided the Bills to a league-best 157-35-18 mark since the start of the 2016 season. Her .790 winning percentage during that span ranks second among all active Division I women's soccer coaches (minimum five seasons) and is tops among active female Division I women's soccer coaches.
- •Shields' record since 2016 includes a 100-9-8 (.888) ledger vs. A-10 opponents (including conference tournament games).
- •Shields' Billikens played in a seventh straight NCAA Tournament last year after extending the A-10 women's soccer record for consecutive league tournament titles to seven.

- •The Billikens also made history five seasons ago when they became the first A-10 women's soccer team to capture both regular-season and tournament titles in three consecutive years (2018-20). They repeated the feat from 2022-24.
- •Shields' players have earned All-America honors seven times, All-Region plaudits 29 times and Atlantic 10 accolades (first team, second team, All-Rookie) 77 times. In addition, Billikens have been selected A-10 Defensive Player of the Year eight times (eight of the past nine seasons), Offensive Player of the Year four times (including each of the past three seasons), Midfielder of the Year three times, Rookie of the Year twice and Goalkeeper of the Year once (award was initiated in 2023).

BILLIKEN DEFENSE SHINES AGAIN IN 2024

- •Saint Louis continued its tradition of strong defense last year, ranking among the nation's top 25 in four categories.
- •The Billikens' 0.61 goals against average was 11th best among Division I teams. SLU allowed just 14 goals in 23 games.
- •Saint Louis registered 14 shutouts just one shy of the school record to tie for the third-highest total in the nation. The Bills' .609 shutout percentage ranked 11th.
- •The Billikens' .844 save percentage was good for 21st nationally.

FACING TOP TEAMS BECOMING ROUTINE FOR BILLIKENS

- •Since the 2020 season, Saint Louis has played, either during the regular season or in the NCAA Tournament, 14 opponents who were ranked among the top 50 in the final 2024 NCAA RPI.
- •The 14 opponents are Arkansas, BYU, Georgetown, Iowa, Kansas, Massachusetts, Notre Dame, Oklahoma State, Penn State, Rutgers, USC, Utah State, Washington and Xavier.
- •Penn State (Aug. 21) and Iowa (Aug. 31) are on SLU's 2025 schedule.

HOME-GROWN TALENT PROMINENT ON BILLIKEN ROSTER

- •Seven different states Missouri, Illinois, Indiana, Kansas, New York, Tennessee and Wisconsin are represented on the 2025 Saint Louis roster, but the Billikens' team is composed largely of local and state-of-Missouri players.
- •Of SLU's 28 players, 14 are from the St. Louis area (including two from just across the Mississippi River in Illinois), and 15 are from Missouri.

THE BILLIKENS IN 2024 ...

- •Made a seventh consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance and defeated Kansas in the opening round. SLU narrowly missed making a second consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament "Sweet 16," falling to USC a No. 1 seed 4-3 in overtime in the second round;
- •Landed at No. 22 in the final RPI and the final United Soccer Coaches rankings;
- •Captured a seventh straight A-10 Championship title, extending the league record for consecutive women's soccer tournament championships won;
 - Won the A-10 regular season for a sixth time in seven seasons;
 - •Went 15-2-6 overall and 7-0-3 in conference play;
- •Finished among the nation's top 25 in nine categories eighth in goal differential (plus-38), eighth in corner kicks (7.09/game), 11th in goals against average (0.61), 11th in shutout percentage (.609), 13th in winning percentage (.783), 18th in shots on goal (8.35/game), 19th in total shots (18.04/game), 20th in goals (2.26/game) and 21st in save percentage (.844).



WHAT'S A BILLIKEN?



The Billiken was born Oct. 8, 1908, when Kansas City art teacher and illustrator Florence Pretz patented a design for an elflike creature with pixie ears, a mischievous smile and a tuft of hair on his pointed head. Reportedly, the image came to her in a dream.

Although it didn't appear on the actual patent, some believe Pretz found the Billiken name in a fanciful work entitled, "Mr. Moon: A Song of the Little People," by Canadian poets Bliss Carman and Richard Hovey.

Within a short time, Pretz sold her patented image to

the Billiken Company of Chicago. Initially manufactured as a bank and statuette, and later as a doll, this good luck charm soon became a national craze. By 1911, the Billiken's likeness adorned everything from marshmallow candies to hood ornaments.

In his heyday, the Billiken enjoyed worldwide fame. Artisans in Alaska began carving his image into ivory, and in Japan, he appeared in shrines, amusement parks and even a movie.

Like many other fads, the Billiken might have faded into obscurity if it were not for Saint Louis University law student John Bender, who also happened to be the coach of SLU's football team during the height of Billikenmania.

One story claims that nearby drugstore owner Billy Gunn called Bender a Billiken when the coach walked into his establishment one day. Supposedly, legendary sportswriter William O'Connor was within earshot of the remark and took up the moniker not only for Bender but also for SLU's sports teams.

Another tale claims O'Connor himself dubbed the coach a Billiken after a particularly good practice left Bender beaming with a big smile. After practice, Bender's fellow law student Charles Z. McNamara, a local cartoonist, sketched Bender as a Billiken, posted it in Gunn's drugstore window and tabbed the football team "Bender's Billikens."

Yet another yarn reports that the druggist asked McNamara to decorate his store window the night before a homecoming game. Supposedly, McNamara drew a Billiken, a popular good luck charm, causing one of his fellow students to exclaim, "That looks like coach Bender!"

Whatever the case, O'Connor is generally credited for popularizing the name throughout the city, but one fact flies in the face of this legend and lore. O'Connor did not join the St. Louis Post-Dispatch until Nov. 26, 1911, one full month after the newspaper first mentioned "Bender's Billikens."

Regardless of how the story is told or whether his mysterious origins are ever finally resolved, the Billiken remains a good luck charm for Saint Louis University's sports teams and always brings smiles to the faces of SLU fans.

Legend has it that the Billiken has three kinds of luck – good, better and best. Buying a Billiken gives the buyer good luck. To have one given to you is better luck. The best luck comes if the Billiken is stolen.
