NOTABLES

■ Saint Louis continues its five-game homestand Thursday by hosting Chicago State at Chaifetz Arena.

■ The Billikens are coming off a 92-67 season-opening win over Southeast Missouri State on Monday night.

■ **Robbie Avila** led the Billikens with 18 points and added 11 rebounds for a double-double. **Dion Brown** also recorded a double-double with 11 points and 11 boards.

■ **Amari McCottry** (16), **Kellen Thames** (12) and **Quentin Jones** (10) also scored in double figures for SLU.

■ The Bills corralled 54 rebounds, tied for the third-most ever for SLU at Chaifetz Arena and the second-most against a Division I foe on opening night in the NCAA.

■ The Billikens are in their 18th season playing inside the state-of-the-art Chaifetz Arena. SLU is 219-79 all-time on its home court.

■ Senior center **Robbie Avila** has been named to preseason Watch Lists for the Naismith Trophy, Oscar Robertson Trophy and Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Award. Last season he averaged 17.3 points and 6.9 rebounds. He led all centers in Division I in 3s made per game and assists per game.

■ Saint Louis went 19-15 overall and 11-7 in league play last season and was an at-large pick for the National Invitation Tournament (NIT).

■ Billiken head coach **Josh Schertz** is in his 18th season as a collegiate head coach. His .773 winning percentage ranks in the top 10 among active coaches in the NCAA.

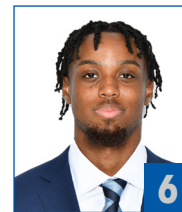

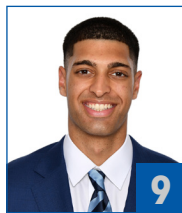

WHAT'S ON TAP?

► Saint Louis welcomes in the Chicago State Cougars to Chaifetz Arena on Thursday night.
► It's the second game of five-game homestand to start the season for the Billikens. SLU has Lindenwood (Monday, Nov. 10), Grand Canyon (Saturday, Nov. 15) and Purdue Fort Wayne (Friday, Nov. 21) still to come at home these first three weeks of the season.

FOLLOWING THE ACTION

► Thursday's game will be televised on FanDuel Sports Network Extra and simulcast on ESPN+. **Tom Ackerman, Troy Robertson, and Tamar Sher** will call the action.
► KMOX 1120 AM is the home for Billiken Basketball on the radio. Billiken Hall of Famers and longtime SLU men's basketball radio partners **Bob Ramsey** and **Earl Austin Jr.** will call the action for all SLU games, both at home and on the road. Billiken Basketball sends a special salute to Ramsey, who is in his 40th season as the radio voice of SLU hoops. Austin is in year No. 35.

LAST TIME OUT

► A 16-2 second-half run gave Saint Louis a commanding lead, and the Billikens went on to defeat Southeast Missouri State 92-67 in the season opener for both teams Monday night at Chaifetz Arena.
► Five Billikens scored in double figures, and **Robbie Avila** and **Dion Brown** posted their 11th and 10th career double-doubles, respectively. Avila had a game-high 18 points, Brown (5-of-7 FG) scored 11, and the teammates shared game-high rebounding honors with 11 boards apiece.
► **Amari McCottry** (7-of-8 FG) tossed in 16 points, **Kellen Thames** tallied 12 and **Quentin Jones** added 10 for Saint Louis, which shot 49.3 percent (33-of-67) from the floor and 81 percent (17-of-21) from the foul line.
► Jones (seven) and **Brady Dunlap** (six) also contributed significantly on the glass as the Billikens out-rebounded the Redhawks 54-29. The Bills also earned big advantages in points in the paint (48-28), fast-break points (20-8) and bench points (28-12).
► SLU held SEMO to 35.5 percent shooting overall and 25 percent from the arc.

CLEANING UP THE GLASS
► SLU's 54 rebounds against Southeast Missouri on Monday night represented the second-most on opening night of NCAA play for teams playing Division I foes. Illinois had 61 rebounds in its win over Jackson State on Monday.
► The 54 boards are tied for the third-most for the Billikens in a game at Chaifetz Arena.

SCOUTING CHICAGO STATE

► Chicago State enters Thursday game 0-1 on the young season. The Cougars fell 92-62 at DePaul in the season opener on Monday night.
► The Cougars were picked to finish sixth in the 10-team Northeast Conference (NEC). LIU was the unanimous choice to win the NEC.
► Against DePaul on Monday, forward **Marcus Tankersley** led the Cougars with 16 points and nine rebounds. Newcomer **Stephen Byard** came off the bench to score 16 points on 5-of-8 shooting. Guard **Braelon Bush** added six points, four assists and four rebounds, while **Doyel Cockrill III** chipped in 10 points and connected on two triples.
► Chicago State went 4-28 (4-12 NEC) last season.
► **Landon Bussie** is in his first season as head coach at Chicago State. He came to the Cougars from Alcorn State, where he led the Braves to back-to-back SWAC regular-season titles in 2022 and 2023. Bussie was a two-time SWAC Coach of the Year.

SERIES HISTORY

► The Billikens and Cougars are meeting for the 12th time. SLU is 11-0 against Chicago State. All but one game in the series has been played in St. Louis. The Billikens visited Chicago State during the 1988-89 season.
► Saint Louis defeated Chicago State last year 85-62 at Chaifetz Arena behind a team-high 19 points by **Robbie Avila**. SLU's 41-33 halftime lead almost completely evaporated in the early stages of the second half as Chicago State outscored the Billikens 16-9 to trail by one with 15:31 remaining. But 3-pointers by **Gibson Jimerson** on consecutive possessions extended the lead to 56-51 and sparked an offensive flurry that helped the Bills pull away.

AVILA DRAWING NATIONAL ACCLAIM ONCE AGAIN

- Senior **Robbie Avila** was the lone Billiken to snag preseason Atlantic 10 Conference honors as he was voted to the first-team by the league's head coaches and media.
- Avila figures to be in the mix for a variety of national awards this season. He has already been tabbed to the preseason Watch List for the Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Award, which is awarded by the Naismith Hall of Fame to the NCAA's top center, the Naismith Trophy and the Oscar Robertson Trophy.
- Last season, Avila averaged 17.3 ppg and 6.9 rpg. He led all centers in NCAA Division I in 3-pointers made per game (1.8) and assists per game (4.0), and was one of five players in Division I with at least 17.3 points, 6.9 rebounds and 4.0 assists.
- Avila ended up finishing fifth in the A-10 in scoring, fifth in field-goal percentage, and eighth in assists per game.
- Previously, Avila spent two seasons at Indiana State and helped the 2023-24 Sycamores to the MVC regular-season title and an appearance in the NIT championship game.

THAMES BACK FOR FOURTH YEAR

- **Kellen Thames** returns for year No. 4 at Saint Louis University.
- The redshirt junior missed the final 14 games of the season last year due to cramping.
- He began last season on a tear, averaging 14.8 ppg and 7.5 rpg through the first four games of the season.
- Thames leads all active Billikens with 57 appearances in a Billiken uniform.

MCCOTTRY, WARLIK RETURN AND WILL FIGURE INTO ROTATION

- Sophomores **Amari McCottry** and **Dylan Warlick** return with a year of the Schertz system under their belts and should contribute this year.
- McCottry made great strides as a freshman a year ago and played significant minutes in February and March. He posted a double-double of 20 points (8-of-10 shooting) and 10 rebounds, both career highs, in the NIT game at Arkansas State. McCottry averaged 4.6 points and 3.1 rebounds for the Billikens and shot 53 percent (53-100) from the field, the ninth-best mark by a SLU freshman in school history.
- Warlick initially had planned to redshirt last season, but injuries created a short roster so he elected to play. His first appearance came at Illinois State, 10 games into the season, and he ended up playing in 25 games.

ANYA AMONG THREE PLAYERS WHO INTEND TO REDSHIRT THE 2025-26 SEASON

- Senior forward **Kalu Anya** intends to redshirt the 2025-26 season, giving him an extra year of eligibility for the 2026-27 campaign.
- Last season, Anya averaged 6.5 ppg and a team-best 7.5 rpg for the Billikens. He ranked third in the Atlantic 10 Conference in rebounds per game (7.5). Anya led the Billikens in steals (39) and blocked shots (33), and was third in assists (85).
- Anya shot .605 (98-162) from the field, the fifth-best mark in a single season in school history.
- Also planning to redshirt are freshmen **Badara Diakite** and **Luke Laczkowski**.

BILLIKENS FIND SUCCESS IN THE TRANSFER PORTAL

- Saint Louis benefited from six transfer portal signings in the offseason.
- **Dion Brown** (Boston College/UMBC) played the 2024-25 season at Boston College after beginning his career with two years at UMBC ... has scored 1,010 career points over his first three seasons of college ball ... first-team America East his sophomore year at UMBC and was an America East All-Rookie team selection as a freshman.
- **Brady Dunlap** (St. John's) played two seasons at St. John's ... appeared in 35 games (six starts) during his two years with the Red Storm ... averaged 3.9 points and was a 41 percent shooter from the field and shot 33.3 percent from 3-point range.
- **Trey Green** (Xavier) played two seasons at Xavier and was named to the BIG EAST All-Freshman team in 2023-24 ... appeared in 42 games overall for the Musketeers and averaged 5.5 points ... received an NCAA medical hardship waiver after appearing in just 10 games in 2024-25.
- **Quentin Jones** (Northern Illinois/Cal Poly) played his sophomore season at Northern Illinois after beginning his collegiate career at Cal Poly ... in his first two collegiate seasons combined, Jones has scored 825 points (13.1 ppg) while shooting 41.7 percent from the field, 37.3 percent from 3-point range and 72.5 percent from the line.
- **Paul Otieno** (Quinnipiac) played in and started 98 games over three seasons at Quinnipiac ... averaged 10.4 points and 7.4 rebounds over those 98 games while shooting 60.4 percent from the field and 74.8 percent from the free-throw line ... also averaged 1.3 blocks per game throughout his QU career ... has recorded 21 career double-doubles ... reached 1,000 career points in just three seasons with the Bobcats ...

played his first two seasons at Kilgore College in Texas ... is taking advantage of an NCAA waiver that allows former junior-college athletes who would have exhausted their eligibility in 2024-25 to have an extra year of NCAA eligibility.

- **Ishan Sharma** (Virginia) played the 2024-25 season at Virginia, where he appeared in 29 games (one start) for the Cavaliers.

BILLS WELCOME FOUR FRESHMEN

- ▶ The Billikens have four true freshmen on their roster.
 - Forward **Badara Diakite** intends to redshirt this season. He originally signed with Iowa but reopened his recruitment after a coaching change.
 - Guard/forward **Cam Hutson** helped his East Lansing High School squad to their first state title since 1958 his senior year. He has been slowed in the preseason by injury. Hutson's father, Andre, played at Michigan State and was a member of the Spartans' 2000 national championship team.
 - Forward **Jax Kerr** is a four-star recruit and was a top-25 four-star recruit out of Owasso High School in Oklahoma.
 - Guard **Luke Laczkowski** intends to redshirt this season. He scored more than 2,000 points during his prep career and is the all-time leading scorer at St. Mark's School (Dallas) with more than 2,000 career points.

IT'S RAINING 3s

- ▶ One of the staples of the **Josh Schertz** offense is capable shooters who can drain the trey.
- ▶ Last season, the Billikens set a school record with 333 made 3-pointers.
- ▶ However, more than half of those treys came from two players – **Gibson Jimerson** (school-record 110) and **Isaiah Swope** (104). They were two of just 34 players in NCAA Division I with 100+ 3s last year. SLU was the only school with two players who drained 100 or more treys a season ago.
- ▶ Schertz's Indiana State team in 2023-24 led the NCAA in 3-pointers made (427).

EFFICIENT FROM THE FIELD

- ▶ While the Billikens ranked among the league leaders in 3-pointers made and attempted, a sure sign that the Billikens' offense is clicking is when they are finishing their high percentage shots around the rim when they take them. Last season, the Billikens ranked third in the NCAA in 2-pt FG% (.601).
- ▶ In 2023-24, **Josh Schertz's** Indiana State team led the nation in 2-point field-goal percentage at .627. Schertz's Sycamores were third in 2022-23 (.592).

CARDIAC BILLIKENS

- ▶ Last year's Billikens were rarely ever out of games and can put up points in a hurry. Here is a sampling of some comebacks by the Bills this year.
 - At home March 8 against Duquesne, Saint Louis trailed by six with 41 seconds remaining. **Isaiah Swope** drilled two 3-pointers to send the game into OT, and the Billikens ended up winning it.
 - At Davidson Feb. 25, SLU was down by as many 13 with 6:31 left and by seven with under two minutes to play and rallied for the one-point win. **Robbie Avila** hit the game-winning basket with 4.3 seconds left.
 - Against George Mason Feb. 11, SLU trailed by six with 41 seconds left and rallied to send the game into overtime.
 - At UMass Feb. 4, the Billikens were down by five in the final minute and scored seven points in the final 37 seconds to steal the win.
 - At George Washington Jan. 25, SLU rallied from a 16-point second-half deficit and got it to within a possession in the final seconds.
 - At Richmond Jan. 18, the Bills were down seven with approximately five minutes left and won by four.
 - At Illinois State Dec. 15, SLU stormed back from a 22-point first-half deficit and had it to within a possession late in the game before falling by four.

BILLIKENS IN THE ATLANTIC 10 | LEAGUE CELEBRATING ITS 50TH YEAR OVERALL

► Saint Louis is in its 21st season playing in the Atlantic 10. The Billikens have a 179-155 mark in A-10 regular-season games.

► SLU has won two A-10 regular-season crowns (2013 and 2014) and two A-10 tournament titles (2013 and 2019).

► This season marks the 50th anniversary of the Atlantic 10 Conference. The year-long celebration will culminate at the 2026 A-10 Men's Basketball Championship at PPG Paints Arena in Pittsburgh, the city in which the league was founded.

HOME SWEET CHAIFETZ

► Saint Louis is in its 18th season playing inside the 10,600-seat Chaifetz Arena.

► SLU is 219-79 all-time at Chaifetz Arena.

► Chaifetz Arena is named after SLU alumnus **Dr. Richard A. Chaifetz**. Dr. Chaifetz is a world-renowned entrepreneur and business leader, who in 1984 founded ComPsych Corporation, which today is the world's largest provider of employee assistance programs, behavioral health and wellness services.

NBA BILLIKENS

► **Jordan Goodwin** (2017-21) is on the Suns active roster. He has made more than 150 appearances in the NBA with Washington, Phoenix, Memphis and Los Angeles Lakers.

► **Yuri Collins** (2019-23), who made his NBA debut last year with Golden State, is playing for the Brooklyn Nets' G-League team in Long Island.

► **Terrence Hargrove Jr.** (2019-23) is playing on the Denver Nuggets' G-League affiliate in Grand Rapids, Mich.

QUICK HISTORY LESSON

► The Billikens won the 1948 National Invitation Tournament. That team was led by **Ed Macauley**, who went on to an NBA Hall of Fame career. Easy Ed's No. 50 is retired by SLU.

► The AP poll was first released the next season, and SLU was the first-ever No. 1 in the inaugural poll on January 17, 1949.

► **Gibson Jimerson** (2019-25) is the Billikens' all-time leader in career points (2,428), field goals (817), 3-point field goals (422) and games played (166).

► **Anthony Bonner** (1986-90) was the Billikens' school-record holder in points (1,972) prior to Jimerson breaking the record last year. Bonner also has a school-record 1,424 rebounds.

► SLU owns two regular-season A-10 titles (2013 and 2014), and it won the A-10 Tournament in 2013 and 2019 at Barclays Center in Brooklyn, N.Y.

► The Billikens have made 10 NCAA Tournament appearances, the last coming in 2019. SLU made three straight NCAA Tournaments from 2012-14, winning its opening game in all three.

Saint Louis University announced Josh Schertz as the head coach of the Billikens' men's basketball program on April 6, 2024.

One of the top offensive minds in college basketball, Schertz has had success at all three of his head-coaching stops. He went to 10 NCAA Division II Championships during an 13-year tenure at Lincoln Memorial. Schertz guided Indiana State to two postseason appearances in three years, including a magical run to the finals of the 2024 National Invitation Tournament.

Entering the season, Schertz ranked No. 8 among all active NCAA head men's basketball coaches with a career winning percentage of .773.

Schertz quickly put his exciting brand of basketball on display for Billiken fans. SLU finished 19-15 in 2024-25 and went to the NIT thanks in part to a record-breaking offensive campaign. The Billikens broke single-season school records for 3-pointers made (333), two-point field-goal percentage (.601), true shooting percentage (.585) and effective field-goal percentage (.565). Saint Louis was the only program in the country with two players (Gibson Jimerson, 110 and Isaiah Swope, 104) who poured in 100+ 3-pointers.

Schertz turned around the Indiana State program and led the Sycamores to their best season in several decades in 2023-24 as ISU captured its first Missouri Valley Conference regular-season title since 2000. Indiana State fell in the championship game of the 2024 Missouri Valley Conference Tournament and was selected as a No. 1 seed for the NIT after just missing out on an at-large bid to the NCAA Men's Basketball Championship.

Prior to his stint at Indiana State, Schertz guided one of the most successful NCAA Division II teams in the country, Lincoln Memorial University, for 13 seasons from 2008-21. The Railsplitters registered a remarkable 337-69 record during Schertz' tenure.

Schertz helped Lincoln Memorial (Harrogate, Tennessee) to 10 NCAA Tournaments. The Railsplitters went to the national semifinals three times (2016, 2017 and 2021) and were the national runner-up in 2016. Lincoln Memorial was 32-1 and poised for a national title run when the 2019-20 season was canceled due to the pandemic.

LMU earned 14 South Atlantic Conference championships during Schertz' tenure – nine regular-season crowns and five tournament titles.

Prior to becoming head coach at LMU, Schertz served as either an associate head coach or assistant coach at four different schools over a 10-year span – High Point University (2003-08), Queens University (2001-03), Lynn University (1999-2001) and Florida Atlantic University (GA, 1998-99).

Schertz is a 2000 graduate of Florida Atlantic. He also has a master's degree in education from Lynn. Schertz and his wife, Natalia, have two children, Jordan and Jaden.

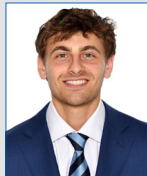

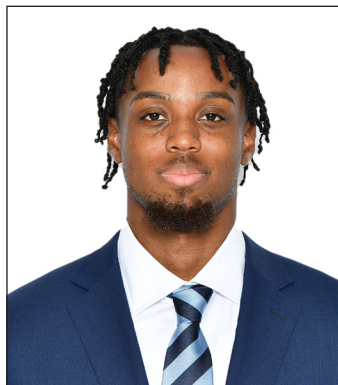
