•SLU owns an 11-8-1 record vs. SEC teams. The Bills are 2-1 vs. Arkansas, 0-1 vs. Auburn, 3-2 vs. Ole Miss, 2-0 vs. Mississippi State, 2-0 vs. Missouri and 2-4-1 vs. Vanderbilt. (The 11-8-1 record does not include a 2-1 mark vs. Missouri and an 0-1-1 record vs. Oklahoma before those schools joined the SEC.)

BILLIKENS IN SEASON OPENERS

- Saint Louis is 17-11-2 in season-opening games, regardless of location.
- The Billikens' record in season debuts played at home is 13-3-1, including 7-1-1 on the last nine occasions.
- In all home openers, SLU carries a 24-4-2 mark.

SAINT LOUIS PICKED SECOND IN A-10 PRESEASON POLL

- Saint Louis was picked to finish second in the 2026 Atlantic 10 Conference women's soccer race in preseason balloting by A-10 head coaches. The Billikens received three of 14 first-place votes and totaled 182 of a possible 196 points.
- The 11-member preseason All-Conference team includes two Billikens – graduate defender **Camille Welker** and sophomore defender **Blakely Hockett**.
- Dayton, the 2025 regular-season and tournament champion, garnered nine first-place nods and tallied 188 points.
- Rhode Island (164 points, one first-place vote) was third, with Fordham (135), Loyola Chicago (133) and Duquesne (130) tightly bunched for places four through six. VCU (111, one first-place vote) and La Salle (92) rounded out the top eight.
- George Mason (90) was ninth, followed by Davidson (71), Saint Joseph's (64), Richmond (55), George Washington (41) and St. Bonaventure (14).

BILLIKENS WELCOME BACK 14 PLAYERS

- Saint Louis returned eight starters and six additional players from its 2025 team.
- Among the Billikens' returning players is sophomore midfielder/forward **Caroline Chier** (1G, 6A), the 2025 A-10 co-Rookie of the Year. Sophomore forward **Adee Broesder** (5G, 3A), SLU's leading returning point-scorer, and sophomore defender **Blakely Hockett** (2G) joined Chier on the All-Rookie team.
- Also back this season are key offensive threats in junior forwards **Hope Kim** (4G, 4A) and **Audrey Smith** (5G, 1A) and senior midfielder **Lucie Schwartz** (3G, 1A).
- Junior goalkeeper **Emma Parker** (0.92 GAA, .721 save percentage) returns after starting all 20 games a year ago, joining first XI mainstays in graduate defender **Camille Welker** (20 starts) and junior midfielder **Ashley Miller** (19 starts).
- Also returning are senior midfielder **Nina Preusser**, junior goalkeeper **Nimu Karani**, sophomore midfielder/defender **Ava Rademeyer**, sophomore forward **Addison Stanciak** and sophomore defender **Ava Scorfina**.

BILLIKENS HOST CRIMSON TIDE TO BEGIN 31st SEASON

- Playing the earliest opener in program history, Saint Louis women's soccer kicks off its 31st season of competition tonight by hosting Alabama of the Southeastern Conference.
- The Billikens and Crimson Tide are meeting for the first time.
- Saint Louis and Alabama finished 2025 separated by just one place in the NCAA Division I RPI. The Crimson Tide and the Billikens landed at No. 33 and No. 34, respectively. Ironically, it was the second time the teams have settled only one spot apart in a final RPI; Alabama and SLU were No. 44 and No. 45, respectively, in the 2019 end-of-season rankings.
- The Billikens are coming off a 14-4-2 season that saw them finish second (8-1-1) in the Atlantic 10 Conference regular-season standings and reach the A-10 Championship semifinals.
- Alabama advanced to the second round of the 2025 NCAA Championship as an at-large selection, ousting Northwestern in penalty kicks and falling to then-No. 1 Stanford. The Crimson Tide were 11-9-2 overall and 4-6 (tied for ninth) in the SEC and lost to eventual league champion Vanderbilt 2-1 in the SEC Championship quarterfinals.

SAINT LOUIS GAME NOTES vs. ALABAMA

FOUR TRANSFERS, SEVEN FRESHMEN ARRIVE IN MIDTOWN

- The 2026 Billikens will have a significant newcomer presence as four transfers and seven freshmen have joined the program.

- Senior midfielder **Jeanette Fieldsend** was a member of James Madison teams that played in two NCAA Tournaments and won the 2024 Sun Belt Conference regular-season and tournament crowns. Fieldsend earned All-Conference second-team honors a year ago, recording three goals and five assists.

- Senior defender **Caroline Fowlkes** played in 37 games at College of Charleston the past two seasons, including 14 starts in 2025, and contributed five goals and five assists.

- Fieldsend and Fowlkes are joined by sophomore goalkeeper **Pepper Escher** (Massachusetts) and sophomore defender **Avery Rasmussen** (Kansas) in the transfer group.

- The Saint Louis freshman class consists of defender **Hana Allen**, forward **Keira Bartholet**, forward **Gianna Harris**, defender **Lucy Marsh**, forward/midfielder **Emma Naftanel**, forward **Leah Simpson** and defender **Lauren Zangara**.

A LOOK AT THE 2026 SCHEDULE

- Saint Louis' 2026 schedule is an 18-game slate featuring contests against five "Power 4" opponents, four 2025 NCAA Championship qualifiers, four 2025 conference tournament runners-up, five Atlantic 10 Conference opponents at home and three intrastate rivals.

- Nine games are scheduled for the home pitch of Hermann Stadium. The Billikens begin and conclude their non-conference schedule with home matches against Alabama and Kansas, respectively. Rhode Island, the 2025 A-10 Championship runner-up, also visits Midtown.

- The Billikens' non-conference schedule features teams from five different leagues – Southeastern (Alabama, Missouri), Big Ten (Illinois, Indiana), Big 12 (Kansas), Ohio Valley (Lindenwood, Southeast Missouri State) and Missouri Valley (Illinois State). Alabama (second round), Illinois and Kansas (Sweet 16) competed in the NCAA Championship.

- A fourth qualifier for last season's NCAA field of 64, A-10 regular-season and tournament champion Dayton, is one of six 2025 A-10 Championship participants on the Saint Louis slate. The others are Duquesne, Rhode Island, VCU, Loyola Chicago and La Salle.

RETURNING OFFENSIVE PRODUCTION

- The Billikens returned players who accounted for 23 of the 42 goals and 18 of the 37 assists tallied by the 2025 team.

- Adee Broesder** and **Audrey Smith** are SLU's top returning goal-scorers after netting five goals apiece a year ago, which tied them for second on the team. **Hope Kim** and **Lucie Schwartz** scored four and three goals, respectively.

- Caroline Chier** registered six assists last season, tying for second on the team and tying for fifth in the A-10. Kim contributed four helpers and Broesder recorded three.

BILLS MAKE HERMANN STADIUM A SOCCER FORTRESS

- Saint Louis is 86-11-13 (.841) in its last 110 games on the home pitch of Robert R. Hermann Stadium, a stretch that dates to the final home game of the 2015 campaign.

- In those 110 games, SLU outscored opponents 249-47, posted 70 shutouts, and allowed more than one goal just five times.

- Against A-10 opponents during the 110-game stretch, Saint Louis is 59-3-5 (43-1-5 regular season, 16-2-0 A-10 tournament) at Hermann Stadium.

SAINT LOUIS IN 31ST SEASON OF WOMEN'S SOCCER

- The 2026 season is the 31st in SLU women's soccer history and marks the 30th anniversary of the program's beginning in 1996. The Billikens blanked Central Missouri 9-0 on Aug. 31, 1996, in their inaugural game.

- The Billikens are 363-181-67 for a .649 winning percentage.

- In conference play (Conference USA 1996-2004, Atlantic 10 since 2005), SLU is 189-72-31 (.700).

- Saint Louis has captured 18 conference championships (nine regular-season, nine tournament) and has made nine NCAA Championship appearances (2005, 2006, 2018-24).

- The 2023 team became the first in program history to reach the round of 16. The 2005, 2006 and 2021 teams reached the second round with first-round wins; the 2020 (spring 2021) Billikens were seeded into the second round in a 48-team field.

- The 2025 Billikens produced a 21st winning season (10th straight) for the program and were the 12th team in program history to have a .750 or higher winning percentage (including four straight and nine of the past 10 years).

FACING TOP TEAMS BECOMING ROUTINE FOR BILLIKENS

- Between 2019 and 2025, Saint Louis played, during the regular season and/or in the NCAA Tournament, 25 opponents who were among the top 50 in at least one final NCAA RPI ranking during those seven seasons.

- The 25 opponents are Arkansas, BYU, Brown, Dayton, Georgetown, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Louisville, Loyola Chicago, Massachusetts, Memphis, Mississippi, Nebraska, Notre Dame, Oklahoma State, Penn State, Purdue, Rhode Island, Rutgers, SIUE, USC, Utah State, Washington and Xavier.

HOME-GROWN TALENT PROMINENT ON BILLIKEN ROSTER

- Eight different states – Missouri, Colorado, Illinois, Kansas, Louisiana, Massachusetts, North Carolina and Texas – are represented on the 2026 Saint Louis roster, but the Billikens' team is composed largely of local talent.

- Of SLU's 25 players, 13 are from the greater St. Louis area (including one from just across the Mississippi River in Illinois).

SAINT LOUIS GAME NOTES vs. ALABAMA

HEAD COACH KATIE SHIELDS

- Now in her 14th season leading the Billikens, 2018, 2019 and 2022 Atlantic 10 Conference Coach of the Year **Katie Shields** owns a 182-65-24 career record (all at Saint Louis). Shields' .716 career winning percentage ranks sixth among all active NCAA Division I women's soccer coaches, and second among active Division I female coaches, who have coached a minimum of five seasons at the Division I level.

- In addition to the 2022 A-10 coaching honor, Shields and her staff were selected the United Soccer Coaches 2022 East Region Coaching Staff of the Year, the second such honor for SLU (2020).

- Shields, who spent one year as a SLU assistant before becoming head coach, has guided the Bills to a league-best 160-36-19 mark since the start of the 2016 season. Her .788 winning percentage during that span ranks second among all active Division I women's soccer coaches (minimum five seasons) and is the top mark among active female Division I women's soccer coaches. The 160 wins are the most of any 10-year period in SLU women's soccer history and the most in the A-10 from 2016-25.

- Shields' record since 2016 includes a 103-10-9 (.881) ledger vs. A-10 opponents (including conference tournament games).

- Shields' Billikens played in seven straight NCAA Tournaments from 2018-24, setting an A-10 women's soccer record of seven consecutive league tournament titles.

- The Billikens also made history six seasons ago when they became the first A-10 women's soccer team to capture both regular-season and tournament titles in three consecutive years (2018-20). They repeated the feat from 2022-24.

- Shields' players have earned All-America honors seven times, All-Region plaudits 34 times and Atlantic 10 accolades (first team, second team, All-Rookie) 83 times. In addition, Billikens have been selected A-10 Defensive Player of the Year eight times (eight of the past 10 seasons), Offensive Player of the Year four times (three of the past four seasons), Midfielder of the Year and Rookie of the Year three times, and Goalkeeper of the Year once (award was initiated in 2023).

THE 2025 SEASON IN REVIEW

- Saint Louis posted a 14-4-2 overall record and finished second in the Atlantic 10 Conference regular-season standings with an 8-1-1 league record.

- The Billikens produced the program's 21st winning season (10th consecutive) and 12th winning percentage of .750 or higher (fourth consecutive and nine of the past 10 years).

- SLU landed at No. 34 in the final Ratings Percentage Index.

- The Bills finished among the nation's top 20 teams in five categories, placing third in corner kicks per game (7.80), 10th in shots on goal per game (8.15), 17th in winning percentage (.750), 18th in shots per game (17.10) and 20th in shutout percentage (.550, 11 shutouts in 20 games).

WHAT'S A BILLIKEN?



The Billiken was born Oct. 8, 1908, when Kansas City art teacher and illustrator Florence Pretz patented a design for an elflike creature with pixie ears, a mischievous smile and a tuft of hair on his pointed head. Reportedly, the image came to her in a dream.

Although it didn't appear on the actual patent, some believe Pretz found the Billiken name in a fanciful work entitled, "Mr. Moon: A Song of the Little People," by Canadian poets Bliss Carman and Richard Hovey.

Within a short time, Pretz sold her patented image to

the Billiken Company of Chicago. Initially manufactured as a bank and statuette, and later as a doll, this good luck charm soon became a national craze. By 1911, the Billiken's likeness adorned everything from marshmallow candies to hood ornaments.

In his heyday, the Billiken enjoyed worldwide fame. Artisans in Alaska began carving his image into ivory, and in Japan, he appeared in shrines, amusement parks and even a movie.

Like many other fads, the Billiken might have faded into obscurity if it were not for Saint Louis University law student John Bender, who also happened to be the coach of SLU's football team during the height of Billikenmania.

One story claims that nearby drugstore owner Billy Gunn called Bender a Billiken when the coach walked into his establishment one day. Supposedly, legendary sportswriter William O'Connor was within earshot of the remark and took up the moniker not only for Bender but also for SLU's sports teams.

Another tale claims O'Connor himself dubbed the coach a Billiken after a particularly good practice left Bender beaming with a big smile. After practice, Bender's fellow law student Charles Z. McNamara, a local cartoonist, sketched Bender as a Billiken, posted it in Gunn's drugstore window and tabbed the football team "Bender's Billikens."

Yet another yarn reports that the druggist asked McNamara to decorate his store window the night before a homecoming game. Supposedly, McNamara drew a Billiken, a popular good luck charm, causing one of his fellow students to exclaim, "That looks like coach Bender!"

Whatever the case, O'Connor is generally credited for popularizing the name throughout the city, but one fact flies in the face of this legend and lore. O'Connor did not join the St. Louis Post-Dispatch until Nov. 26, 1911, one full month after the newspaper first mentioned "Bender's Billikens."

Regardless of how the story is told or whether his mysterious origins are ever finally resolved, the Billiken remains a good luck charm for Saint Louis University's sports teams and always brings smiles to the faces of SLU fans.

Legend has it that the Billiken has three kinds of luck – good, better and best. Buying a Billiken gives the buyer good luck. To have one given to you is better luck. The best luck comes if the Billiken is stolen.
