SMSU Administration

Founded in 1967, Southwest Minnesota State University offers both liberal arts and professional programs on a modern 215-acre campus in Marshall, Minnesota. Since its inception, the primary mission of Southwest Minnesota State University has been to offer undergraduate degree programs.

The largest undergraduate programs at SMSU are elementary and early childhood education and accounting. Wellness and human performance, computer science, literature, business administration, biology, and psychology are among other popular programs.

In 1996, the university began offering its first graduate degrees. Students can currently pursue over 46 baccalaureate majors, four associate degree majors, 40 minors, 16 preprofessional programs, and three master's degrees (business and education).

Southwest Minnesota State University strives to meet the needs of this region of Minnesota and the Upper Midwest. The university takes special pride in its regional and rural studies, global studies, honors programs, and facilities and services well-suited for physically disabled students.

The campus features a total of 24 buildings with all 11 academic buildings, student

center and food service interconnected. Approximately 1,000 students live on campus in 27 well-designed residence halls which are housed in nine buildings. Each residence hall accommodates about 40 students. The campus also features a child care facility and a religious center.

The campus landscape has been enhanced in recent years by the construction of the 71,000 square foot multi-purpose R/A (Recreation/ Athletic) Facility. A state-of-the-art \$18.2 million Student Center Complex opened in the summer of 2005 and includes food service and student service areas and a grand entrance onto the campus.

Also, the SMSU library had a \$9.2 million renovation that was completed in the fall of 2005 and includes a new entrance, a more user-friendly configuration and numerous technology infrastructure improvements.

SMSU will also be the home of a new \$16 million regional events center which is set to open in the fall of 2007.

Southwest Minnesota State University graduated its first four-year class in 1971.

Today the University's alumni body totals over 12,000, of which over 65 percent live in Minnesota. With an enrollment of 5,039 students and a teaching faculty of 130 full-time and 26 part-time, Southwest Minnesota State offers a friendly, cohesive learning environment with small-sized classes and close interaction between faculty and students.



Dr. David Danahar

- University President
• Seventh Year

Dr. David C. Danahar is now in his seventh year as the eighth president at Southwest Minnesota State University, having been appointed by Chancellor James McCormick in the summer of 2001.

President Danahar's tenure can be described in one word: rebirth. Shortly after coming to SMSU, a fire burned down the food service building and severely damaged the Student Center. From that tragedy came opportunity, and it was President Danahar's vision which resulted in the new Student Center and Conference Center on campus, two signature buildings which have reinvigorated the campus and serve both on- and off-campus groups.

President Danahar has also overseen a renovation of the SMSU Library and the construction of the Foundation Residence Apartments. His most recent construction project is the new Regional Event Center, which is scheduled to open in late 2008. The SMSU campus has an entirely new look, and feel, since his arrival.

Danahar came to SMSU from Loyola University in New Orleans, La., where he served as Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs.

Before his tenure at Loyola, he was at Fairfield University, where he was Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences, while prior to that, he was professor of history, director of general education and associate dean of arts and sciences during a 15-year period at the State University of New York at Oswego.

A historian by training, with special interests in Central European history and the Hapsburg Empire, Danahar received his undergraduate degree from Manhattan College and his Master of Arts from the University of Massachusetts. After studying at the University of Vienna in Austria and Oxford University in England, he was awarded his Ph.D. from the University of Massachusetts.

He is a recipient of numerous fellowships and honors, including awards from the National Endowment for the Humanities and the American Council of Learned Societies.

Dr. Danahar has three children, daughters Deirdre and Rebecca and son Michael. Danahar and his wife Cecilia live in Marshall with their son Michael.



Chris Hmielewski

- Director of Athletics
• Second Year

Chris Hmielewski is in his second year as the director of athletics at Southwest Minnesota State University. Hmielewski was named interim director of athletics on Aug. 17, 2006, before being named to the permanent position on Mar. 22, 2007.

Hmielewski, who was the associate director of enrollment at SMSU before being named to his current position, has made major strides for SMSU athletics in just one year. He has helped oversee the construction of the new Regional Event Center on campus as well as a new softball field and renovation of the current baseball field. He also has been instrumental in fundraising for the department which has added over 10 new scholarships for SMSU student-athletes.

Prior to being named to his current position, Hmielewski had served in the SMSU office of admission since 1998, where he began his career as an admission counselor for two years before being promoted to assistant director of enrollment in 2000. He served in that position until 2005 when he was named associate director of enrollment.

No stranger to SMSU athletics, Hmielewski worked in the department for nine years, serving as the pitching coach for the SMSU baseball program for eight years (1997-2004), before taking over the position of hitting coach for the 2005 season. He also spent four years as the athletic department's director of advertising from 1997-2000.

A native of Franklin Park, Ill., Hmielewski played three years of college baseball at Kansas State University playing both first base and pitcher. Following his junior season in 1991, he signed a free agent professional contract with the Montreal Expos organization. He began his pro career as a first baseman, where he was an All-Star during his second season, before being moved to the pitching mound for the next three seasons and advancing as high as Class AA Harrisburg (Eastern League) in 1995.

Hmielewski signed with the Duluth-Superior Dukes of the Northern League in 1996 before an arm injury forced his retirement following the season.

Hmielewski, a graduate of Southwest Minnesota State University with a degree in English, earned his master's degree in education leadership from Minnesota State University, Mankato in 2003.

Chris and his wife Mary Jo have three children, Andrew (9), Ashtin (8) and Matthew (5).

2007-08 Outlook

The Southwest Minnesota State wrestling team finished last season fourth out of five teams in the NSIC and 3-13 overall. Last season's head coach, John Sterner, resigned in July after nine seasons at the helm of the Mustang wrestling program. Jesse Nelson was hired in August after five years at Ridgewater College in Willmar, Minn., where he led its wrestling team to five top-five national finishes at the junior college level, including a national championship in 2005.

The Mustangs must replace just three wrestlers, David Marshall who graduated and Chris Fast and Justin Crouch who decided not to return. Marshall posted a 6-17 record at heavyweight last winter and finished sixth at the NCAA North Regional. Fast posted a 2-21 record between 141 and 157 last year, while Crouch was 5-18 at 165 and 184.

125
Kurt Smith returns as one of the most experienced wrestlers for the Mustangs. The senior has a career record of 44-51, including a 21-22 dual meet record. Last winter, Smith posted an 18-13 record and placed fifth at the NCAA North Regional. Pat Cusack comes in as a freshman who will add depth to the program and will likely take over for Smith next year. He had a very successful prep career in Indiana.

133
Ryan Reed will likely return to 133, where he was very successful as a sophomore. Last season at 141, Reed went 7-21, including just 1-15 in duals. In 2005-06 at 133, Reed went 18-14, which included six wins by fall. He also won the

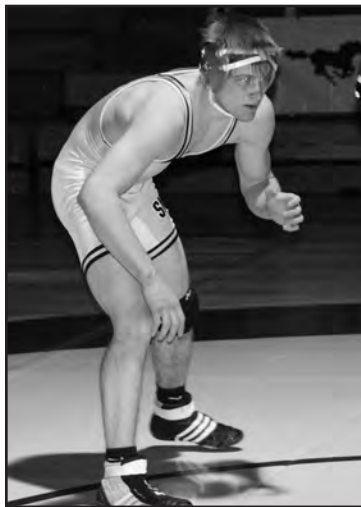
St. Cloud State Open at 141. Michal Barrie had a solid season at 133 last year, but will redshirt this year. Barrie posted a 15-14 record after transferring in from Ridgewater College for his junior season. Three freshmen add depth, including L.J. Franzoni, Ed Reno and Alex Streff. Jeremy Loch also returns after redshirting last season.

Freshman Tanner Skillings is the front-runner to replace Reed at 141 this season. Skillings was a three-time state qualifier at Minneota High School and posted a 38-1 record as a senior.

Luke Giese has high expectations after a 15-19 season as a redshirt freshman last winter. More impressive was Giese's 3-1 NSIC record and fifth-place finish at the NCAA North Regional. NSIC coaches have voted Giese as the second-best wrestler in the conference at 149 in the preseason polls.

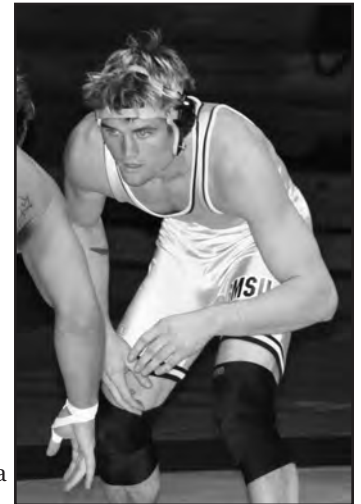

Freshman Logan McAlpin is the leader to fill the 157 spot. McAlpin finished in sixth place at the Minnesota state tournament last spring and will look to build on that success at SMSU. Abdul Tusa posted a 0-6 record in opens last winter, but could battle for time. Nick Wulf joins the team after qualifying for the South Dakota state tournament last spring.

C.D. Johnson returns after a rollercoaster

freshman season. Johnson began last year at 157 and ended up wrestling at 184 and 197 at the end of the season. Johnson posted a respectable 6-8 record between 157 and 165 last year, before finishing the year 1-12 between 184 and 197.

174
Greg Frank is the leading candidate to take over at 174 as Tyler Johnson moves up to 184. Frank redshirted last winter, but brings a 14-67 career record into this season.

184
Tyler Johnson hopes to bring his success from 174 to 184 this season. Johnson posted a 23-12 record at that weight as a sophomore last winter, including four wins by fall. As a team, SMSU was 0-21 at 184 last year.

Cody Chamblin will likely fill the 197 spot. The senior had a rough first year in the program, posting a 2-25 record between 174/84/97. However, Chamblin came from a successful junior college program and will look to bounce back this winter.

Head Coach Jesse Nelson



Jesse Nelson took over the head coaching duties for the Southwest Minnesota State wrestling team on Aug. 22, 2007, replacing John Sterner, who resigned in July. Nelson comes to SMSU after five years as the head wrestling coach at Ridgewater College in Willmar,

Minn.

A native of St. James, Minn., Nelson brings an impressive list of accomplishments to Southwest from his young career at the junior college level. He guided Ridgewater College to top-five finishes nationally in each of his five seasons there. Included was a national championship in 2004-05 and a second-place finish in 2003-04.

In addition to the team success, Nelson coached numerous student-athletes to individual success as well. During his five years at Ridgewater, he coached 13 All-Americans, four national finalists and one national champion.

Nelson racked up many awards in his five years at Ridgewater. He was named Minnesota Community College Conference Coach of the Year following each season and was named NJCAA Region XIII Coach of the Year in 2003 and 2004.

Nelson has also enjoyed success at the high school level as a coach, where he coached Greenbush-Middle River/Badger High School in Badger, Minn. In one year at GMRB, he coached five state tournament place winners and two state champions.

He has a well-rounded background in coaching. In addition to coaching wrestling at Ridgewater and GMRB, Nelson has coached freestyle wrestling and Minnesota Junior National Greco-Roman wrestling with Minnesota USA Wrestling. He was also an assistant football coach at Ridgewater for five years. At the high school level, he was a head fastpitch softball coach and a junior high and VFW baseball coach in the Montevideo (Minn.) School District.

Nelson is a 1999 graduate of St. Cloud State University, where he wrestled for one season and received his Bachelor of Science in physical education teaching with a minor in coaching. He anticipates completing his Master's degree from Minnesota State University, Mankato in sports

administration. Nelson also received an Associate of Arts degree from Willmar (now called Ridgewater) Community College in 1996 after wrestling for two seasons at WCC. As a wrestler, he was an NJCAA national qualifier both years and was named Male Athlete of the Year at Willmar in 1996. Nelson also played football for two years at WCC and was a team captain and earned all-conference honors.

Jesse and his wife, Julie, have an 8-year old son, Blake, and a six-year old daughter, Brooklyn.

The current NSIC was formed by a merger in the spring of 1992 of the Northern Intercollegiate Conference, which was the men's conference, and the Northern Sun Conference, which was the women's conference.

The NSIC entered the 1999-2000 academic year as an expanded ten-team league with the addition of Concordia University-St. Paul and the University of Minnesota-Crookston. Following the departure of University of Minnesota-Morris in the summer of 2003 and the University of Minnesota-Duluth in 2004, the conference once again become a ten-member conference with the addition of Upper Iowa University and the University of Mary in the fall of 2006.

The NSIC and its member institutions had an extremely rich tradition in the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA), including several National Champions and many national qualifiers. In 1992, the NSIC entered into another challenging episode in its rich athletic history when they entered the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA). In the fall of 1995, the NSIC and its member institutions became eligible for championship competition in the NCAA Division II ranks.

Since 1932, various institutions have competed in the NSIC. Bemidji State University, Moorhead State University and Winona State University are all charter members and have remained in the conference for its more than 60 years in existence. Southwest Minnesota State University joined in 1969 and Northern State University in 1978. Wayne State College became a member in 1998, with Concordia University and the University of Minnesota-Crookston joining the conference in 1999.
