SMSU vs. Bemidji State Series Notes

Southwest Minnesota State and Bemidji State meet for the 42nd time on Saturday night with the series tied at 20-20-1 ... the teams first met on Oct. 17, 1970, in Marshall ... BSU leads 10-8-1 in games played in Bemidji ... this will be the team's first meeting in Bemidji since Oct. 28, 2006 ... BSU has won the last 11 games dating back to the 1998 season ... SMSU's last victory was on Sept. 27, 1997, in Bemidji ... SMSU hasn't scored more than 15 points in a game during the last eight match-ups ... SMSU had won nine of 10 games prior to BSU's current 11-game winning streak.

The Last Time - SMSU vs. BSU

Bemidji State outscored Southwest Minnesota State 18-0 in the second half to rally from a 14-12 halftime deficit to earn a 30-14 victory on Sept. 18, 2010, in Marshall. The BSU defense limited SMSU to just 268 yards of offense, including 31 yards rushing. Dustin Kroepin rushed for 96 yards and two touchdowns on 18 carries to pace the BSU offense, while Derek Edholm completed 14 of 25 passes for 183 yards and one score. Kroepin's 13-yard touchdown with 8:13 left in the third quarter gave the Beavers a 20-14 lead it would never relinquish. Gannon Moore rushed for a team-high 38 yards on 15 carries for SMSU and also caught five passes for 75 yards and one touchdown.

SMSU Looks to Snap an 11-Game Losing Streak to Bemidji State this Saturday Night

SETTING THE SCENE: Southwest Minnesota State University (1-1, 1-0 NSIC) continues Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference play on Saturday, Sept. 17, taking on Bemidji State University (2-0, 1-0 NSIC) at Chet Anderson Stadium in Bemidji, Minn., with kickoff slated for 6 p.m.

BSU has dominated the series in recent years, winning the last 11 games dating back to the 1998 season with SMSU's last victory in the series coming on Sept. 27, 1997, in Bemidji.

SMSU opened conference play last Saturday with a thrilling 48-45 victory over the University of Mary, while BSU picked up a huge road victory in overtime versus Augustana 30-27.

A VICTORY ON SATURDAY FOR SMSU WOULD...

- be its first over BSU since the 1997 season.
- snap an 11-game losing streak to BSU.
- be its first 2-0 start in NSIC play since 2002.
- lift the program's all-time record to 164-273-5.

ON THE ROAD: Southwest Minnesota State has six road games this season, its most since the 1994 season. SMSU, which is 0-1 on the road in 2011, finished 2-3 in road games last season and is 17-37 in road games since 2000.

ON THIS DATE: Southwest Minnesota State is 2-3 all-time when playing on Sept. 17. The following are the scores of the previous five games: 1977: L, 20-0 vs. Bemidji State; 1983: W, 17-10 vs. Bemidji State; 1988: L 31-20 vs. MSU Moorhead; 1994: L, 28-27 vs. Northern State; 2005: W, 30-14 vs. Upper Iowa.

THE COACHES: Southwest Minnesota State head coach **Cory Sauter** is in his second season and has an overall record of 5-8, including 4-7 in conference games. Sauter is 0-1 all-time versus Bemidji State. Sauter was named head coach on March 29, 2010, after serving two seasons as an assistant coach at SMSU. In 2009, Sauter served as the team's offensive coordinator, while in 2008 he served as quarterbacks coach. A complete bio on coach Sauter can be found on page 15.

Jeff Tesch is in his 16th season as the head coach at Bemidji State with an overall record of 100-64, including 75-47 in the NSIC games. A two-time NSIC Coach of the Year, he has been an assistant coach at North Dakota, Central Missouri and Montana State.

LAST WEEK IN REVIEW: Warren Matthews scored a 34-yard touchdown with 2:16 left in the game to lead SMSU to a thrilling 48-45 victory over the University of Mary in Marshall on Saturday night. The game featured 11 lead changes and featured 1,113 combined yards of total offense. SMSU scored on eight of its 10 possessions in the game. Tyler Peschong completed 29 of 35 passes for 334 yards and three touchdowns to lead the SMSU offense, while Warren Matthews rushed for 101 yards on 14 carries. Anthony Dean caught five passes for 102 yards and one touchdown. Tyler Erickson also had a solid game with seven receptions for 51 yards. Phil Breidall finished with a career-high nine tackles, while Da'Ronte Smith had

MUSTANG QUICK-HITTERS: SMSU's 45 points scored in the victory over the University of Mary was the team's highest output since scoring 49 vs. MSU Moorhead on Oct. 9, 2010 ... SMSU's 31 first downs vs. Mary was the team's highest total since earning 30 vs. Minnesota-Morris in 2002 ... **Tyler Peschong** passed for a career-high 334 yards and a career-high three touchdowns in the victory over Mary ... **Anthony Dean** had his first career 100-yard receiving game vs. Mary ... **Warren Matthews** recorded his third career 100-yard rushing game in the win over Mary ... Linebacker **Phil Bredidall** recorded a career-high nine tackles vs. Mary ... Senior defensive lineman **Randy Erickson** has started 19 consecutive games since week seven of the 2009 season ... Senior offensive tackle **Brian Rodas** has started 15 consecutive games since week 10 of the 2009 season ... Senior safety **Levi Reiff** has made 24 straight starts since the 2009 season ... Junior safety **Joe Stupka** has started all 24 games in his career.

PESCHONG NAMED NSIC PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Junior quarterback **Tyler Peschong** was named NSIC Offensive Player of the Week on Monday for his performance versus the University of Mary. Peschong accounted for five touchdowns, completing 29 of 35 passes for a career-high 334 yards and three touchdowns, while also rushing for 89 yards and two more touchdowns in SMSU's 48-45 victory over the University of Mary. It was his first career 300-yard passing game.

NCAA WEEKLY STATISTICS: In this week's NCAA national statistics, SMSU ranks second in net punting, 17th in total offense, 28th in rushing offense and 37th in passing offense. Individually, **Tyler Peschong** ranks 13th in total offense, while **Warren Matthews** ranks 17th in all-purpose yardage. A complete list of where SMSU ranks in the NCAA statistics can be found on page 18.

WELCOME TO THE 300-100-100 CLUB: SMSU's week two victory over the University of Mary featured something that hasn't happened 15 years. **Tyler Peschong** (334, pass), **Warren Matthews** (101, rush) and **Anthony Dean** (102, rec.) are the first SMSU players since Nov. 17, 1996, to record over 300 yards passing, 100 yards rushing and 100 yards receiving in a single-game. It was also the first time SMSU had both a 100-yard rusher and 100-yard receiver in a single-game since Sept. 4, 2004.

BACK-TO-BACK 400-YARD GAMES: SMSU has recorded over 400 yards of total offense in back-to-back games for the first the first time since Oct. 11 and Oct. 18, 2008. SMSU amassed 407 yards in week one versus Northern State and 550 yards last week versus Mary.

LET'S MAKE IT A TREND: SMSU rushed for 194 yards in the season opener versus Northern State and followed that with 216 yards versus the University of Mary in week two. SMSU is hoping that the positive yardage in the first two week are a sign of things to come. A season ago, finished last in the conference in rushing offense (NSIC games only) with a 96.0 yard per game average and rushed for over 100 yards in a game just three times.

BLOCK PARTY: Redshirt freshman **Tyler Tonderum** blocked a Northern State in week one setting up a Mustang touchdown. The blocked punt was SMSU's first since Nov. 7, 2009.

CONNECTING FOR 3: Sophomore **Mike Wenk's** 24-yard field in the opener versus Northern State not only was his first field goal made of his career in five attempts, but it was also SMSU's first made field goal since Nov. 7, 2009. Wenk connected on two more field goals in week two from 28 and 25 yards.

THE YOUNG AND RESTLESS: The season opening game featured 19 Mustang players appearing in their first career games in SMSU uniforms. Wide receivers **Jordan Cross** and **Adam Olson**, along with defensive lineman **Nathan Werner** are the only true freshman to see action in the first two weeks.

SPECIAL TEAMS TACKLE LEADERS: **Tate Bunkers**, **Will Kurka** and **Phil Bredidall** are all tied for the team lead with two special teams tackles.

MOORE IN THE RECORD BOOK: Junior running back **Gannon Moore** rushed for 13 touchdowns in 2009 tying **Robert Lipsey** (1990) for the school single-season record. After recording five rushing touchdowns in 2010, Moore ranks fifth in school history with 18 career rushing touchdowns.

HOLDING ONTO THE BALL: Winning the turnover margin each week is a major key to winning games at any level of football. Turnover margin has been a major issue for SMSU in the past seven-plus seasons. Since the start of the 2004 season (79 games), SMSU has been a "plus" in turnover margin in just 16 games (three in 2004, two in 2005, one in 2006, two in 2007, three in 2008, three in 2009 and twice in 2010).

In SMSU's last 57 conference games, which spans from late in the 2004 season through this season, SMSU is minus-41 in turnover margin. The Mustangs have been "even" or "minus" in turnover margin in 45 of their last 57 conference games.

BIG PLAY MUSTANGS: SMSU has recorded 17 offensive/defensive plays or kick/punt returns of 20 or more yards in 2011, including 11 by the Mustang offense (7 pass, 4 run). For a complete look at the "long" plays and SMSU's "money" plays for the season, go to pages 13-14.

2011 TEAM CAPTAINS: Five players, two on offense and three on defense, were team captains for the 2011 season. The team captains were selected by a vote of the Mustang players. The offensive team captains selected were junior quarterback **Tyler Peschong** from Marshalltown, Iowa, and junior running back **Warren Matthews** from Minneapolis. The defensive team captains named were senior safety **Levi Reiff** from Dell Rapids, S.D., senior linebacker **John Kersbergen** from Marshalltown, Iowa and senior linebacker **Derek Klinkner** from Artesian, S.D. It's the second straight season Reiff has been named team captain.

NSIC PRESEASON POLL: Southwest Minnesota State was picked to finish sixth in the NSIC South Division and 11th overall in the annual NSIC Preseason Coaches' Poll. SMSU received 58 points in the overall

poll and 11 points in the division poll. Augustana (33 points) was picked to win the South Division, while Minnesota Duluth (167 points) was picked to win the North Division and overall championship.

ALL-NSIC RETURNERS: SMSU returns four players this fall who earned All-NSIC South Division honors in 2010. Sophomore punter Mike Wenk was named second team All-NSIC South, while senior offensive lineman Brian Rodas, senior linebacker John Kersbergen and senior safety Levi Reif were all named to the honorable mention All-NSIC South.

THREE-YEAR STRETCH: SMSU amassed 15 combined victories in the past three seasons (2008-10), ranking as the best three-year stretch since the 1991-93 teams won 19 combined games.

WORKING OVERTIME: SMSU has played in eight overtime games in school history, including one last season, since the NCAA added the extra session in 1998. SMSU is 3-5 all-time in overtime games including 1-2 in multi-overtime games. SMSU's last overtime contest was an overtime win at Upper Iowa (40-34) on Oct. 23, 2010.

REGIONAL EVENT CENTER: The 2011 season marks the fourth season for SMSU football at the Regional Event Center. The \$16 million facility was opened in the fall of 2008 with the first college football game played on Aug. 30, 2008. SMSU is 8-10 all-time at the REC, including 2-4 last season.

SOME MUSTANG HISTORY: 2011 marks the 44th season of college football at Southwest Minnesota State dating back to 1968. SMSU owns an all-time record of 163-273-5, including 101-180-5 in conference play. SMSU has recorded eight winning seasons and has made two NIAA playoff appearances (1987 and 1991). The program earned its lone conference championship in 1990.

A SEASON AGO: Southwest Minnesota State finished the 2010 season with an overall record of 4-7 and finished in 10th place overall in the NSIC with a record of 3-7.

MUSTANGS IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY: SMSU has posted a 12-15 record in its last 27 non-conference games since the 2000 season.

FOR OPENERS: Southwest Minnesota State is now 20-24 all-time in season openers following this season's loss to Northern State, but has won eight of its last 10 lid-lifters. SMSU is also now 24-20 all-time in home openers after this season's victory over the University of Mary.

THE 2011 SMSU ROSTER: The Southwest Minnesota State football roster has a total of 109 players (as of Sept. 12) and features 11 seniors, 23 juniors, 18 sophomores, 16 redshirt freshmen and 41 true freshmen.

ABOUT BEMIDJI STATE: The Beavers are 2-0 overall, 1-0 NSIC, having beaten Minot State at home 27-0 on Aug. 25 and at Augustana 30-27 in overtime last Saturday. Quarterback Lance Rongstad is the team's leading rusher with 114 yards and two touchdowns on 31 carries and has completed 32 of 54 passes for 372 yards and two touchdowns. Tight end Brian Leonhardt has a team-high 12 receptions for 218 yards and one touchdown. The BSU defense, which has allowed just 27 points and 118 rushing yards in two games, is led by Jason Broom and Gary Young, who both have 12 tackles and 2.5 tackles for loss.

BSU ranks seventh in the country in turnover margin, 13th in rush defense and 14th in scoring defense.

CORY SAUTER
HEAD COACH
SECOND SEASON



Cory Sauter is in his second season as head coach at Southwest Minnesota State in 2011 and his fourth overall on the Mustang coaching staff.

Sauter was named the 10th head coach in program history on March 29, 2010, after serving a month as interim head coach. He brings six years of professional football playing experience in the National Football League and both collegiate and professional football coaching experience to the Mustang program.

During Sauter's first season as head coach, the Mustangs started the season 2-0 and were 4-4 after eight weeks, before suffering several injuries to key positions and finishing 4-7 overall. Seven Mustang players earned all-conference honors, including quarterback Ryan Ratekin, who became the first SMSU offensive player to earn first team All-NSIC honors since 2006.

Prior to becoming head coach, Sauter spent two seasons (2008-09) helping lead a high-powered Mustang offensive attack as quarterbacks coach and offensive coordinator.

During the 2009 season as offensive coordinator, quarterbacks coach and passing game coordinator, SMSU averaged 36 points per game, the third highest in school history, and also scored 30 or more points in eight games tying a school single-season record.

SMSU quarterback Ryan Ratekin was named NSIC Offensive Newcomer of the Year in 2009, setting a school record with a 63.9 percent completion percentage, while passing for 2,963 yards and 33 touchdowns, the third highest in school history.

SMSU senior quarterback Josh Shudlick had a record breaking season during Sauter's first season on the sideline in 2008 setting a conference record for passing yards and tying the league record for touchdown passes in one season. The Mustang offense lead the NSIC in passing yards, while Shudlick finished first in the conference in passing yards per game and total offense.

Prior to SMSU, Sauter, a native of Hutchinson, Minn., spent several years coaching at both the collegiate and professional levels. In 2006 he served as quarterbacks/receivers coach for the Hamburg Sea Devils in NFL Europe and was also a graduate assistant at the University of Minnesota. In 2007 he was quarterbacks coach for the Berlin Thunder.

A 1997 graduate of the University of Minnesota, Sauter had a record-setting career at quarterback for the Golden Gophers and spent six seasons in the NFL from 1998-2004. He played four seasons for the University of Minnesota (1994-97), including starting the final 34 games of his collegiate career and playing in the Blue-Gray All-Star Football Classic following his senior season. He finished his career as the school's all-time career record holder for pass completions, pass attempts and passing yards. Sauter earned his master's degree from the University of Minnesota in 2003.

Following his collegiate career Sauter spent six seasons in the NFL from 1998-2004. He signed as a free agent with the Arizona Cardinals in 1998 before spending time with the Detroit Lions, Chicago Bears and Indianapolis Colts. He appeared in one regular season game in his career completing 6 of 9 passes for 59 yards in a 2002 game with the Chicago Bears. He also played one season for the Barcelona Dragons in NFL Europe.

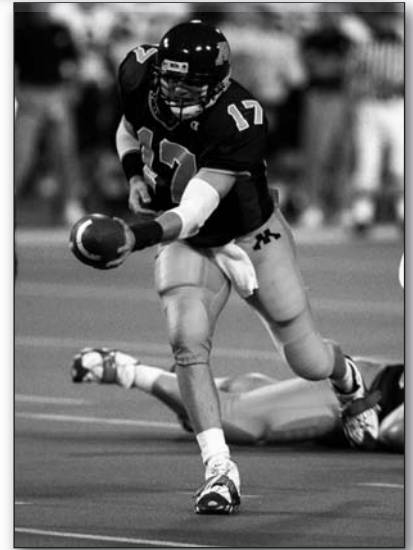

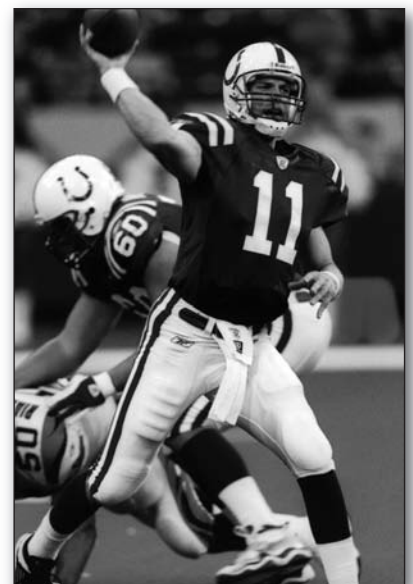
