2017 AMERICAN ATHLETIC CONFERENCE RUNNER-UP

NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS: Junior Jonathan Gomez wrapped up his first NCAA Division I Swimming and Diving Championships with the Mustangs, earning a 17th-place finish, and first alternate status, in the 200-yard butterfly on Saturday.

Gomez finished 17th overall in the event's preliminary round, placing him outside the Consolation Final (16th place), in a time of 1:42.15. He also competed in heats of the 400-yard individual medley on Friday, posting his fastest preliminary time of the season at 3:48.78.

ALL-CONFERENCE: Six Mustang individuals and all five relays earned All-American Athletic Conference honors follow the 2017 Championships, league officials announced. As a team, SMU finished as the event runner-up.

AMERICAN CHAMPIONSHIPS: Jonathan Gomez was named the Most Outstanding Swimmer, and Bryce Klein was selected as the top diver at the 2017 American Athletic Conference Championships. Diving coach Jim Stillson was also named the Men's Diving Coach of the Meet, and the SMU men's swimming and diving team finished second in Houston.

East Carolina finished atop the field with 901 points, ahead of SMU with 764.5. The final relay sealed the runner-up spot by 4.5 points over Cincinnati (760), and Connecticut finished fourth with 634.5 points.

WEEKLY WINNERS: Junior Bryce Klein has won the American Athletic Conference Diver of the Week honor a league-leading four times this season (Jan. 17, Nov. 22, Nov. 8, Oct. 25). His most recent award came on the heels of the Mustangs' dual meet win over Incarnate Word where Klein won both the 1- and 3-meter events. Classmate Jonathan Gomez has the lone nod for the swimmers this season, winning the award on Oct. 25.

NCAA ZONES: Bryce Klein closed out competition at the 2017 NCAA Zone D Championships with an 11th place finish on 3 meter. The junior finished 10th in Monday's 1 meter competition.

Klein registered a two-round 731.05, which placed him two spots outside of automatic qualification, which was set at nine for this event. Juan Hernandez of LSU qualified in the top spot, with Mark Anderson (Texas) and Matt Barnard (Minnesota) finishing second and third, respectively.

Klein posted a 10th-place finish out of 32 competing divers on 1 meter, registering a 662.20 over two lists after carrying over a preliminary total of 340.25, which positioned him 10th heading into the final.

BREAKING GROUND: SMU broke ground on the Robson Lindley Aquatics Center and Barr-McMillion Natatorium in February. The 42,000-square-foot center will be home to SMU's internationally recognized men's and women's swimming and diving teams. Located at 5550 SMU Blvd. on the University's growing east campus, the center will provide facilities for practice, competition and community use. The Aquatics Center will feature an Olympic-sized, eight-lane indoor pool with a platform diving area, including four springboards and a 10-meter tower for training and competition. Coaches' offices, men's, women's and visitor locker rooms and a classroom and meeting area will be located adjacent to the pool. Spectator seating for 800 will be on the mezzanine level.

AMERICAN ACADEMICS: Bryce Klein was honored as SMU's Male Scholar-Athlete of the

Year by the American Athletic Conference, league officials announced Thursday. Klein holds a 3.775 grade-point-average and is majoring in accounting. The institutional award winners from each school are awarded with a \$2,000 scholarship.

The Southlake, Texas, native was a 2016 CSCAA Scholar All-America First-Team selection and was honored with the conference's Scholar-Athlete Sports Excellence Award. Each of his three seasons on the Hilltop, he has made the conference's academic honors list, and was named to SMU's Honor Roll with Distinction in the fall of 2014 and spring of 2013.

Faculty Athletic Representatives at each American Athletic Conference institution, in consultation with the Director of Athletics and appropriate athletic academic advisors, may annually nominate one male candidate for an Institutional Scholar-Athlete Scholarship. All nominees must have maintained both excellent academic credentials (minimum cumulative grade-point average of 3.00) and outstanding athletic performance; must have competed in an American Athletic Conference-sponsored sport; and must have attained a minimum of senior standing, as determined by the respective institution.

NCAA QUALIFIERS: Jonathan Gomez was selected to compete at the 2017 NCAA Division I Swimming and Diving Championships.

Gomez earned invites in the 200-yard butterfly and 400-yard individual medley, while having the option of adding the 500-yard freestyle to his list based on his qualification in the previous two events.

The Cali, Colombia, native ranks 15th of 29 invited swimmers in the 200 fly, posting a 1:41.98 to win the American Athletic Conference Championship and set the SMU program record. In the 400 IM, Gomez also topped the conference and the SMU all-time list covering the distance in 3:43.97. The time places him 22nd on the list of 29 invited swimmers.

A total of 30 swimmers were invited in the 500 free with a cutoff time of 4:16.67. Gomez sits just outside the group at 35th at 4:17.68.

RECORD BREAKERS: Gomez was named the American Athletic Conference's Most Outstanding Swimmer of the 2017 conference championships following his three meet and school record-breaking performances. Gomez's 500 free time of 4:17.68 narrowly came in under the previous record set in 2015, while his time in the 400 IM of 3:43.97

came in under the record of 3:46.01 set in 1992. In the 200 fly, he lowered a standard of 1:44.43 that has stood since 1984, covering the distance in 1:41.98.

Bryce Klein holds the SMU program records on both springboards (1m, 407.25 / 3m, 436.45) and swept the events at the conference championships last month. An eight-time all-league selection, Klein has back-to-back championships and holds the conference meet records on 1 and 3 meter.

DUAL WINNERS: The Mustangs went 3-1 in dual action during the 2016-17 season, picking up wins over American Athletic Conference opponent Connecticut, Metroplex rival TCU and Incarnate Word. The lone loss came against Texas A&M, a team that placed 16th at the NCAA Swimming and Diving Championships. It was the most dual wins in a season since the Mustangs went 5-2 during the 2008-09 season.

CHAMPIONSHIP SUCCESS: SMU has won 41 conference championships since the 1946-47 season, with 16 coming under current head coach Eddie Sinnott. In all, the program has produced 642 individual champions at the conference level, and 30 at the NCAA level. The Mustangs have earned runner-up honors at each of the four American Athletic Conference Championships.

GOMEZ GOES TO RIO: Jonathan Gomez represented Colombia at the 2016 Rio Olympic Games. The first-time Olympian made an appearance in the semifinals of the 200-meter butterfly finishing 15th overall. Following a fifth place qualifying performance in preliminary heats, Gomez touched in 1:57.47 in semifinals.

Mustang alum Julian Fletcher also made his Olympic debut for Bermuda participating in the 100-meter breaststroke as one of two swimmers representing the country in Rio. Fletcher placed third in his heat, ranking him 40th overall, with a time of 1:02.73.
