





2007-08 OUTLOOK

The SMU men's swimming and diving team has enjoyed a long history of success, finishing in the top 25 nationally each of the last seven years. In the last 18 years, the Mustangs have managed 14 top-25 finishes. Such consistency is no accident. Head swimming coach Eddie Sinnott, entering his 19th season, is one key element of that success.

Sinnott has earned seven conference Coach of the Year awards and has coached 14 Olympians since 1991. Sinnott has seen his swimmers win over 100 individual conference titles and two of his swimmers have been named NCAA Swimmer of the Year.

Another piece of the puzzle is head diving coach Jim Stillson. Stillson is in his 24th year on the Hilltop and has coached six Olympians, including 1992 silver medalist Scott Donie. Three of Stillson's divers have been named NCAA Diver of the Year, and Stillson himself was named NCAA Men's Diving Coach of the Year in 1990.

Strength of schedule is another key element of the success of the SMU men's swimming and diving program. This season, the Mustangs will face six teams that have been ranked in the top 10 nationally.

SCHEDULE

The Mustangs will take on five opponents who finished in the top 20 last season. In the fall, SMU faces Texas A&M at the Art Adamson Invitational. The Aggies finished the 2007 season ranked 19th in the country. The Ponies then travel to Austin for the Texas Invitational. Texas finished ranked fifth last season, but start the 2007-08 preseason ranked No. 1 in the country.

"Instead of going to the Kerr-McGee meet this year, we're going back to the Texas Invitational," said Sinnott. "It's one of the best invitationals in the country. It perennially provides some of the fastest times of the year."

SMU kicks off the winter season by heading to the desert to face No. 4 Arizona. The Mustangs then host Arizona State, Southern California, Northwestern and the Texas All-Stars for the Classic @ SMU January 11-12. Southern California enters the season ranked No. 13 in the nation, but finished last season ranked ninth. Northwestern found itself ranked sixth in 2007, but has a preseason ranking of 18th.

In February, the Mustangs welcome both the Aggies and the Longhorns to Perkins Natatorium on consecutive weekends to wrap up the dual-meet season before heading to Houston for the Conference USA Championships, Feb. 27-March 1.

"We're looking to defend our conference title this season," said Sinnott. "It's not about our record in the dual-meet season. It's really about preparing ourselves for the conference championships and the NCAA meet."

The Mustangs will look to send some swimmers to the American Short Course Championships March 6-9 as a final stop before the NCAA Zone Diving Championships March 14-16 and the NCAA Championships March 27-29 in Seattle.

"The NCAA meet has historically been a good meet for us," said Sinnott. "We usually turn in some great performances there. I believe this team can finish top-15. We could actually close in on a top-10 finish if everything goes well."

FREESTYLE

The freestyle has long been a strong stroke for the Mustangs and this year should be no exception. The sprint corps is especially strong this season and the middle-distance group has more depth than in previous years. Currently, there is only one distance swimmer in the group, but Sinnott isn't concerned.

"With the unexpected departure of Michael Dmitriev, we had a hole to fill in distance free events," said Sinnott. "We will look to Chris Ginder to continue to improve and step in to that role for us."

Ginder, a junior, competed in the 1650 and 1000 free events last season, placing fourth at the C-USA Championships in the 1650.

Swimming middle-distance free events will be the trio of Maverick Smalley, Shane Milu and Nate Clark. Smalley, a sophomore, posted the team-best time in the 200 free last season and the second-best time in the 500. Milu enters his senior year as one of the most consistent freestyle middle-distance swimmers on

the team. The last two years, Milu has held the team's second-best time in the 200 free and consistently swims his best times at conference championships. Clark also has a proven track record in middle-distance events, as he took second at C-USA championships last year in the 500 free. The year before, Clark finished third in the same event.

The sprint corps is the strength of the team, according to Sinnott. Luka Vrtovec, Thomas Fadnes, Milu and freshman Greg Doughty make up the group. At C-USA championships last season, Vrtovec broke the pool record in the 50 free, en route to winning that event and swimming a team-best time. He also set the team-best time last season in the 100 free.

"Luka [Vrtovec] won the Slovenian national championships this past summer and was an individual qualifier for the NCAA meet last year," said Sinnott. "We will continue to count on Luka for success in the sprint free."

Fadnes clocked the team's second-best time in the 100 free last season as a freshman, Milu posted the team's second-best time in the 50 free.

"Fadnes and Milu are both great contributors to the team," said Sinnott. "They bring a lot of strength to our sprint events."

Doughty joins the Mustangs this season from Southern Pines, N.C., where he holds the state records in the 50 and 100 free events.

BREASTSTROKE

The breaststroke may well be the deepest event for the Mustangs. Sinnott returns four experienced swimmers to this event in Alex Hetland, Mitchell Johnson, Grega Plevelj and Jerr Merritt.

The group is led by Hetland, a senior who earned All-American status in the 100 breast last season. Hetland swam a career-best time in the preliminary round of the 100 breast at NCAAs and went on to finish seventh overall in the event. Johnson and Plevelj both qualified for the national meet last year. Johnson swam second-best times in the 100 and 200 breast events last season and placed second in the 200 at C-USA championships. He also placed third at the American Short Course Championships in the 200. Plevelj clocked his career-best in the 200 breast at the C-USA championships, placing fourth in the event. Merritt also swam his career-best in the 200 breast at the C-USA meet, finishing just behind Plevelj in fifth-place.

"Jerr Merritt just missed qualifying last year," said Sinnott. "He will step up and be a real player in the breaststroke this season."

2007-08 OUTLOOK

BACKSTROKE

Losing All-American Ian Clark is a blow to the Mustangs, but Sinnott thinks his team will rebound strongly. Competing for the Ponies in the backstroke events will be Pontus Renholm and Colton Ingraham.

"Replacing Ian Clark will be difficult," said Sinnott. "But Pontus will look to do just that. I really think he is poised to follow Clark. He probably also has a real shot at making the Swedish Olympic team."

Renholm swam the team-best time in the 100 back last year and the second-best time in the 200 back. He was crowned C-USA champion in the 100 back and placed second in the 200. Renholm also holds the national record in the 200 back short course in his native Sweden. He also set junior national records in the 200 back short course and the 50 back short course.

Ingraham is another successful swimmer for the Ponies. He posted his season-best time in the 200 back at the C-USA meet last spring.

"Colton is expected to step up this year," said Sinnott. "He will perform well for us in the back events."

BUTTERFLY

Competing in the butterfly events will be returners Clark, Vrtovec and Brett Denham. Clark is positioned as a mid-distance flier, who placed second in the 200 fly at last year's C-USA meet. He also qualified for the 2008 Olympic trials in the 200 fly. Sinnott thinks Clark will be a key component to this year's squad.

"Nate is well-positioned to replace Justin Smith this season," said Sinnott. "I think he's going to be a real asset this season."

Vrtovec competes in the sprint events and holds the team-best time in the 100 fly. He also set a new pool record en route to taking the C-USA title in the 100 fly. Denham clocked the team's second-best time in the 100 fly in 2006 and will look to build on his strong past performances. Denham swam his career-best time in the 200 fly last season at the C-USA meet.

INDIVIDUAL MEDLEY

The Ponies have a strong tradition of excellent IM performers, due in part to Sinnott's experiences swimming the IM. This season should be no exception, as the Mustangs return three outstanding swimmers to the stroke. Hetland, Clark and Smalley all return to the water this season in the IM.

"We have a strong group of IMers, which is a tradition here at SMU," said Sinnott. "The IM was not our best event last season, but I think we will be much stronger this year."

Hetland qualified for the NCAAs last year in the 200 IM, after notching a team-best time. He also won bronze at the European Short Course championships in the 100 IM. Clark finished fourth at the C-USA meet last season in the 400 IM and qualified for the 2008 Olympic trials in that event. Smalley also qualified for the 2008 Olympic trials in the 200 and 400 IM. He finished third in both events at the C-USA championships last year and finished in the top ten in both events at the American Short Course Championships (7th and 6th, respectively).

RELAYS

One of the strengths of the team this season is in the relays. Every relay swimmer from last year returns this season and because of that experience, Sinnott intends to rely heavily on his relays to guide the Mustangs to national success.

"Our relays are the key to our NCAA success this year," said Sinnott. "One of our team goals is to score in all five relays at the NCAA championships. And I think that's a very realistic goal."

Last season, two of the SMU relay teams set new records. The 200 medley team broke the school record, notching a time of 1:26.31 in NCAA prelims. They went on to finish fourth at the NCAAs, earning All-American honors. The 400 free relay team broke both the meet and pool records at C-USA championships last season, checking in at 2:56.21. The 400 free team finished 13th at NCAAs, earning all four legs All-American honors.

The 800 free relay team won the C-USA title, but didn't make it to the NCAA meet. The 200 free team also won the C-USA crown, but did not qualify for

NCAA consideration. The 400 medley relays did compete at NCAAs, finishing 13th and earning All-American status.

"Our 800 free relay team could qualify for the NCAA meet this year," said Sinnott. "For the first time in five years, they might very well make it. That's another of our team goals this season."

DIVING

Head coach Jim Stillson returns a sophomore to the roster this season and adds two freshmen. Preston Holcombe, who qualified for the NCAA meet last season as a freshman, will lead the two newcomers in what Stillson hopes will be a strong year for SMU diving.

"The similarities between this year's men's and women's teams are staggering," said Stillson. "The men's team can look forward to a very promising year. I think it will be a very exciting year, but we're still dealing with some unknowns with a sophomore and two freshmen. Anything can happen."

Holcombe posted career-best numbers in the one-meter and platform events at last season's NCAA Zone Diving "D" Championships, qualifying him for the meet. He also placed third in the platform event at C-USA championships last year.

"Preston accomplished his first goal last year, which was to qualify for the NCAAs," said Stillson. "This year, his expectations are even higher."


The Mustangs add two freshmen to the roster in Matthew Culbertson and Landon Owen. Both come to the Hilltop with strong high school experience.

"Matt and Landon should push each other this year," said Stillson. "I think they can both qualify for NCAAs."

Culbertson is a three-time NISCA All-American and a three-time Texas state silver medalist. Owen was named All-State three times and was a three-time Texas state meet qualifier.

"With three divers, we're better covered this year than we were last year," said Stillson. "I think we're in a situation to potentially win every meet. We're in the hunt this year, no question. I think at least two of the divers will be in the conference finals, but I hope all three will be. And as far as qualifying for the NCAA meet, I think all three of them are capable of doing just that."

Expectations are high as Eddie Sinnott enters his 19th year as head coach of the SMU men's swimming team. Under Sinnott, SMU recorded 10 NCAA top-15 finishes in the past 15 years.

Last season, Sinnott guided the Ponies to their second consecutive Conference USA Invitational crown and 18th at the NCAA Championships. He was named Coach of the Year at the C-USA Invitational meet for the second year. In previous years, he has guided the Mustangs to five consecutive NIC Championship and nine consecutive conference championships. SMU has notched 15 top-25 finishes at the NCAA level under the direction of Sinnott and his staff.


An accomplished coach on an international level, Sinnott has coached 14 student-athletes who have competed in four different Olympic games since 1992. In the summer of 2000, Sinnott watched as his protege Lars Frolander became the fourth Mustang to win a gold medal at the Olympic games, taking first in the 100 butterfly in Sydney, Australia. In 1996, former Mustang great Ryan Berube won a gold medal as a team member of the U.S.A. 800 free relay team and 2005 graduate Camilo Becerra competed in Athens in 2004 for Columbia.

On the national level, under Sinnott's guidance, both Frolander and Berube were named NCAA Swimmers of the Year within two years of each other (Frolander-1998, Berube-1996). In fact, since 1996 Sinnott has seen his Mustangs earn over 100 conference titles, 53 All-American honors, five conference Swimmer of the Year awards, two conference Freshman of the Year awards, and the afore-mentioned two NCAA Swimmer of the Year awards.

An eight-time conference Coach of the Year recipient, Sinnott guided the Ponies to eight straight NCAA top 10 finishes from 1991 to 1998. Sinnott has also served United States Swimming in various capacities. He was the head coach of the U.S. squad at the World University Games in 1993 and a head coach and assistant coach for the U.S. Olympic Festival team in 1987 and 1993, respectively. Sinnott also served as the head coach of the U.S. National Team on its European Tour in 1987. In the summer of 2007, Sinnott served as a team leader in the open water division and as the assistant manager for the U.S. National swim team at the 2007 Pan American Games in Rio de Janeiro.

In addition to coaching the United States team, Sinnott has also coached for Haiti and Denmark. In 2005, he coached his fourth different country, Columbia, in the World Short Course Championships.


A four-year letterwinner at SMU from 1973-76, Sinnott was the SWC champion in the 400 IM in 1973 and earned All-American honors in both 1973 and 1974. Born in Greenwich, Conn., Sinnott and his wife, Sioux, have two daughters K.C. and Silver Ann.

Jim Stillson begins his 25th year as head coach of the SMU men's and women's diving teams. In 2003-04, Stillson guided former men's diver Philip Griffin to NCAA All-American honors and NIC Diver of the Year Honors. Stillson's success in recent years adds to the national prominence the SMU diving program has enjoyed since his arrival on the Hilltop.

In his 24 years at SMU, Stillson has coached six Olympians including 1992 silver medalist Scott Donie. Since 1970, Stillson has guided 42 student-athlete divers to All-American honors, included three NCAA Diver of the Year award winners. Stillson has coached four NCAA champions in seven different events, and since 1974, 10 U.S. National Champions have been crowned champion under the tutelage of Stillson. The 1991 and 1995 NCAA Women's Diving Coach of the Year, Stillson served as the U.S. Diving National Team coach from 1987-91 and again in 1997.

In 1981, Stillson was named the NCAA Men's Diving Coach of the Year and in 1991 and 1995, the NCAA Women's Diving Coach of the Year. On the conference level, Stillson has earned 15 conference diving coach of the year honors while at SMU.

Stillson's successful coaching ability in 1999 earned him that year's United States Olympic Committee Diving Coach of the Year award.

Stillson's success with SMU student-athletes has been overly apparent in the individual success of his divers. Besides the 41 All-Americans under Stillson's direction, SMU divers have earned over 50 conference individual championships, eight conference Diver of the Year awards since 1997, 10 U.S. national champions and four NCAA champions.

In 1992, Stillson received the Mike Malone Memorial Award, given for outstanding contributions to diving by the national governing body of the sport, U.S. Diving. Stillson has coached the U.S. National Diving Team in competition in Europe, China and the Soviet Union. He was the 1984, 1988 and 1990 Texas Senior Coach of the Year.

Stillson was born in Aberdeen, Md. and attended Campbell (Calif.) High, where he was a high school All-American diver. A 1974 graduate of Ohio State, Stillson earned NCAA All-American honors his senior year in the three-meter competition. Stillson has several very important ladies in his life in daughters Katy, Chanelle and Mariah and wife, Elisabeth, whom he married in the summer of 2006.

Andy Kershaw begins his fifth year as assistant coach for the SMU men's swimming team. Kershaw came to the Hilltop after serving as the assistant swim coach for Ohio University from 1999-2003.

Kershaw's coaching career began as a student assistant at Ohio and continued in that role until 1998 when he became the graduate assistant for the 1998-1999 season. In 1999 he was hired as the head assistant coach, a role he served until 2003. As the assistant, he was primarily responsible for the distance group and oversaw the organization of the recruiting efforts. During his four years as the assistant, Kershaw helped lead the women's team to back-to-back Mid-American Team Championships, while guiding two Ohio swimmers to NCAA All-American performances.

At the national level, Kershaw has gained experience coaching 24 NCAA qualifiers in 55 events and eight U.S. Olympic Trial qualifiers over the past six years. He is also one of the team managers for USA Swimming.

In his first four years with the Mustangs, Kershaw has helped lead 22 swimmers to All-American status and helped the team win three conference championships and two Conference USA Invitational crowns.


Last season, the class of 2007 presented Kershaw with the Senior Award, traditionally presented to someone who has made a significant impact on the swimmers' careers. Last year's graduating seniors made up the first class of swimmers Kershaw has graduated, giving him a special connection to the class of 2007. The seniors noted that Kershaw's sense of humor and ability to relate to them made their team experience at SMU that much better. Kershaw also received the award in 2005, and counts the two awards as two of his proudest.

Kershaw has had an impact in the classroom as well. He has assisted in guiding two swimmers to GTE-CoSIDA Academic All-America honors and 23 NCAA Academic All-Americans. The focus on academics has continued on the Hilltop, as SMU earned an NCAA Academic All-American team award the last four years. In 2005, the Mustangs posted a 3.3 overall team GPA placing them sixth in the nation. Last season, the Ponies tallied a 3.1 overall team GPA, ranking them in the top 30 in the country.

Aside from serving as the Mustang assistant, Kershaw is also the recruiting coordinator for the program and is the co-director of the Mustang Swim Camp. A native of Mansfield, Ohio, Kershaw earned a bachelors degree in psychology and a masters degree in athletic administration from Ohio University. Kershaw resides in Dallas with his wife Elizabeth and daughter Emma.

EXPERIENCED STAFF PROUD TRADITION


SMU swimming & diving has a proud tradition of collegiate, national, and Olympic champions. In the past 17 years, SMU has finished in the top 12 at the NCAA Championships 10 times, and have won 10 consecutive conference team championships, including back-to-back C-USA crowns.

Since 1990, SMU has collected 150 conference champion titles plus two C-USA Invitational titles, two NCAA Swimmer of the Year awards and two Olympic gold medals. Since 1997, the Mustangs have five conference Swimmer of the Year awards, four conference Diver of the Year awards and two conference Freshman of the Year awards.

On the international level, SMU has had 27 members of its swimming & diving team compete in the Olympic games since 1968, including former NCAA Swimmer of the Year Lars Frolander. Frolander's gold medal at the 2000 Summer Olympics added to the world-class reputation the SMU men's swimming and diving team has set. In 1996, Ryan Berube captured gold as a member of the 800 free relay team for the United States. In 1992 both Frolander and Scott Donie won silver medals, while in 1984 the great Steve Lundquist won two gold medal. Ricardo Prado (Brazil) joined Lundquist in Los Angeles, winning a silver medal. Jerry Heindenrich (USA) won two gold medals, one silver, and one bronze at the 1972 Olympic Games in Munich, West Germany. All but five SMU swimming and diving records are now owned by Olympic medal winners.

SMU also owns one of the finest pedigrees in college coaching, beginning with the legend A.R. "Red" Barr, for whom SMU's outdoor pool is named. From 1946 through 1971, Barr lead SMU to 11 top 10 finishes in the nation, recording only three losing records in 25 years on the Hilltop. SMU swimming great George McMillion took over for Barr in 1972 and continued the Ponies' torrid pace on the national level of collegiate swimming, leading SMU to 14 NCAA top-10 finishes in 17 years as head coach, including a school best No. 2 finish in 1983. Eddie Sinnott has since led the Ponies to 10 top-12 finishes in the past 18 years.

SMU's proud tradition and unparalleled success keeps the Mustang program among the nation's best, both athletically in the pool and academically in the classroom.



HEAD COACH EDDIE SINNOTT

Entering his 19th year as head coach of SMU, Eddie Sinnott has led the SMU swimming program to an elite status among NCAA programs. Entering the 2007-08 season, Sinnott has a 92-52 record at SMU and a 96-55 record in 19 years of coaching experience that includes one year at Iowa State before coming to SMU. He has led the Mustangs to a top-12 finish nationally 10 of the past 18 years. Last season he was named Coach of the Year at the C-USA Invitational Meet for the second consecutive year.



SYDNEY, Australia — Dallas resident Lars Froelander, 20, won precious metal in the swimming at the 2000 Olympic Games.

They just never turn out to be losers, and Sweden's Lars Froelander, a former living in Dallas, shocked the International Aquatic Centre rooting on Friday by winning the men's 100-meter butterfly. His winning time was 52 seconds, 100th of a second faster than the previous record.

THE CLASSIC @ SMU

The competition allows a nine-man squad (eight swimmers and one diver per team) from each of the teams for the two evening sessions. There are no preliminary heats, only consolation and championship finals. The meet features two diving events, the one-meter competition on Friday night and the three-meter on Saturday night.

In the 2007 Classic, Northwestern claimed its first-ever title, amassing 359 points. Cal placed second, scoring 334 and the Mustangs took third with 305. Florida State also made the trip, finishing fourth with a total of 131 points, but was unable to compete in the second day's events.

The first Jerry Heidenreich Memorial 200 Freestyle event was held in 2003. Named after SMU's four-time Olympic medalist, the Heidenreich 200 freestyle honors the late SMU star who passed away in 2003.

Heidenreich won four medals, including two golds, at the 1972 Olympics in Munich for U.S.A. An All-American each of his four years at SMU (1969-72), Heidenreich set a new NCAA record in the 200 free on his way to being crowned national champion in the event during his dominant 1972 senior season.

In 1992, Heidenreich was inducted into the International Swimming Hall of Fame. To this day, Heidenreich remains SMU's most decorated Olympic medalist of all-time.
