The Dallas Equestrian Center, home of the SMU equestrian team, resides on 5 acres in the heart of Dallas and is 3.5 miles from the SMU campus. The facility is conveniently located roughly 10 minutes away from campus, making it easily accessible for student-athletes, faculty and staff.

The DEC features three indoor arenas with new footing, a large outdoor arena, and 20 new state-of-the-art paddocks with cover. Other recent renovations include upgrades to a tack room and the addition of a club house with a locker room and coaches' offices. In addition, a 6 horse European horse walker was added to the facility.

All home competitions for SMU equestrian are held at the facility. DEC was purchased by Scott and Lisa Wilson in December of 2016. The facility is located at 8787 Park Ln, Dallas, TX 75231, across the parking lot from Top Golf Dallas.

# **EQUESTRIAN 101**

## **JUDGING AND KEY TERMS**

The National Collegiate Equestrian Association tests four to five riders from each team in head-to-head competitions. Five horses are selected for each event. Each rider is paired with one of the five horses in a random draw before the competition. The rider is able to watch the horse warm up and receives four minutes to practice on her assigned mount before competing. Riders from opposing teams compete on the same horse over the same pattern or course in the head-to-head competition. Each rider receives a score, and the rider with the highest score receives one point for her team. In NCEA competition, the level of difficulty is demonstrated by the accuracy of the pattern and how the competitor uses the horse that she draws to the best of her ability.

### **EVENTS AND DESCRIPTIONS**

**Equitation Over Fences (Hunt Seat)** - The judges evaluate the rider's position, consistency on course, smoothness, flow from jump to jump, the number of strides (steps taken by the horse) in a line and the rider's plan to complete the course. Scoring for the event is out of a perfect score of 100.

**Equitation On The Flat (Hunt Seat)** - The riders perform a flat test on their horses in a 40 x 20 metered arena. The test consists of nine movements to be judged on accuracy, smoothness and overall position of the rider. Each movement receives a score from 1-10. The 10th score judges the position and seat of the rider and the correctness and effectiveness of her aids. The score is out of a perfect score of 100.

**Horsemanship (Western) -** This event is designed to evaluate the rider's ability to execute a prescribed set of maneuvers with precision and smoothness while maintaining a balanced, functional and fundamentally correct body position. The ideal horsemanship pattern consists of seven to nine maneuvers and is extremely precise with the rider and horse working in complete unison, executing each maneuver with subtle aids and cues. Exhibitors are scored for each sequence of maneuvers with a -1.5 to +1.5 score for each maneuver with a base score beginning at 70.

**Reining (Western)** - This is a class based on set patterns and a precise scoring system. Within these patterns the horses' and riders' athletic abilities are tested in a series of maneuvers including spins, stops, flying lead changes and circles with changes in size and speed. In collegiate competition, the rider must perform one of the set National Reining Horse Association (NRHA) patterns. There are a total of eight parts to a reining test with each individual maneuver judged from -1.5 to +1.5 with a base score beginning at 70.

#### **KEV TERMS**

Hunt Seat: Hunt Seat riders compete over a series of jumps or in a general equitation pattern.

**Reining:** Western riders perform an assigned pattern from memory, demonstrating a variety of stops, turns and figures at various speeds. The emphasis is on precision and technical application of the rider's ability to handle unfamiliar horses.

**Horsemanship:** Western riders perform a set pattern that requires precision and correct aids with the horse's movements and efforts. Aids: A rider communications to her horse through aids.

**Combination:** A series of jumps set one or two strides apart from one another.

Course: A pre-determinded series of 8-12 jumps that must be completed in order without major penalty.

**Equitation:** In riding competitions, this indicates that riders are being judged on their ability to control the horse while maintaining the correct riding position.

**Gaits:** Starting from slowest to fastest, gaits include the walk, jog, trot, lope, cantor and gallop. Riders may be asked to vary each gait by shortening or lengthening the horse's stride.

**Roll Back:** A turn performed in equitation over fences to show control of the horse and rider's ability to maintain a position throughout a turn. In Western reining, a rollback is a 180-degree pivot with speed after a halt.



### **HISTORY OF THE NCEA**

In 1998, Equestrian was identified and adopted by the National Collegiate Athletic Association and the Committee on Women's Athletics (CWA) as an emerging sport for women at the Division I and III levels. Currently, there are 18 Division I and four Division II programs sponsoring equestrian.

The National Collegiate Equestrian Association (NCEA), a non-profit corporation, was created as a governing body to advance the sport of equestrian. The NCEA is responsible for the development and administration of equestrian rules and guidelines. Equestrian is subject to all NCAA policies and procedures in the same manner as other sports.

The NCEA developed sub-committees for areas critical to the advancement of equestrian. These sub-committees consist of coaches and administrators from member institutions. Coaches and administrators are invited to serve on any of the various NCEA Committees of their choice. The committees include but are not limited to: Emerging Sports, Competition, Promotions, Sponsorship, Selection, and Championship. Each committee is charged with helping to progress equestrian to championship sport status within the NCAA. Additionally, liaisons from the United States Equestrian Federation (USEF) and the American Quarter Horse Association (AQHA) interact with and provide input to these committees and the NCEA Executive Committee.

### **RECENT NCEA NEWS**

The Committee on Women's Athletics confirmed its support for Equestrian to remain on the NCAA Emerging Sports list during the April 2016 meeting in Indianapolis. The CWA voted on and approved a statement recommending that Equestrian remain on the Emerging Sports list due to new organizational efforts, membership feedback, and potential growth.

Over the past 12 months, support for the sport of Equestrian has surged with renewed enthusiasm from both NCAA membership as well as stakeholders in the equine industry. The NCEA in collaboration with the NCAA oversees the sport of Equestrian while under the Emerging Sports umbrella. With renewed focus on the expansion of the sport, the NCEA has provided the foundation for a stronger support base for the sport to remain viable within the collegiate setting.

Dr. Leah Fiorentino, Executive Director of the NCEA, responded to the CWA message, "Our initial efforts to reorganize our resources and implement a sound strategic plan for growth and expansion has been recognized by the NCAA. We are encouraged by the support we've received from the NCAA leadership as well as our colleagues involved with the other Olympic Sports. With the continued support of the NCAA we look forward to ensuring that Equestrian will be part of the effort to maintain meaningful educational opportunities for women through athletics".

In the fall of 2014, the CWA recommended that Equestrian be dropped from the Emerging Sports list due to the limited growth in the number of teams sponsoring Equestrian. Representatives from Division I and Division II rejected the CWA recommendation in support of maintaining participation opportunities for women. Multiple updates on the progress of the sport from the NCEA leadership offered a new perspective on Equestrian and convinced the CWA to reconsider its earlier action.

"Receiving the support of the CWA based on this latest action is crucial to the continued growth and development of the sport on the collegiate level", commented Nancy Post, Senior Woman Administrator at Baylor University, "Our work to expand the sport has been hampered by the uncertainty of future support from the NCAA. This public statement from the NCAA clears the way for several schools to move forward with the addition of Equestrian as a varsity sport on their campus".

Part of the NCEA's new structure includes a National Advisory Board (NAB) comprised of corporate leaders, philanthropists, and equine industry experts. The goal of the NAB is to develop the financial support to make Equestrian the first financially-independent non-revenue generating collegiate sport. NAB efforts have shown early success in the form of grants to help sustain current NCEA teams, as well as providing financial strategies for the development of new Equestrian teams across the nation.
