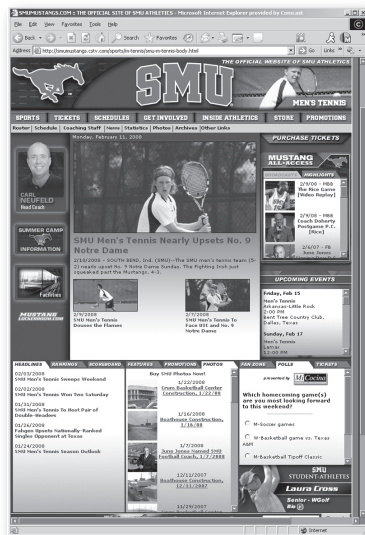

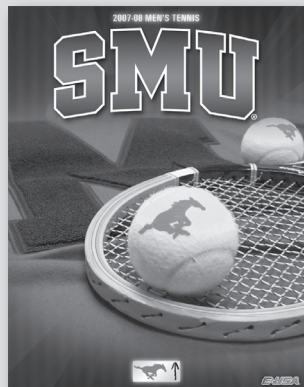

## 2007-08 OUTLOOK

Entering his 15th year as head coach of the men's tennis program, Carl Neufeld has brought SMU men's tennis the highest levels of stability and success since the program's inception in 1948. Under Neufeld's tutelage, the Mustangs have made NCAA appearances in 10 of the last 11 years. In addition, SMU has been nationally ranked every year since 1998, making an NCAA Final Four appearance in 2001.

To achieve the team goal of a top-25 finish, Neufeld will rely heavily on his veterans team to step up and play to their best tennis. SMU returns four seniors and two sophomores and adds four redshirt freshmen. Neufeld will look to Oivind Alver, David Kuczer, Alex Skrypko and Adolfo Solares to lead the team this season.

"Our goal every year is to be one of the best-conditioned teams in the country and peak at the end of the season," said Neufeld. "We want our seniors to play their best tennis during their final semester. I think our four seniors are poised to do just that. We're coming off a fall when we carried a team GPA of 3.3 and I feel like our seniors are playing at their personal bests. I'm really looking forward to seeing how they continue to improve as the season progresses."

Skrypko enters the spring unranked after not competing in the fall. He finished last season ranked 65th in the country and would have entered the fall ranked 39th. Last spring, Skrypko posted an 11-9 record at No. 1 singles and paired with Federico Murgier at No. 1 doubles, where the two amassed an 11-6 record. In singles, Skrypko rode a three-match winning-streak to end the season and defeated four nationally-ranked opponents. He was also a first-team All-Conference USA selection. No slouch in the classroom, Skrypko is a two-time member of the Conference USA Commissioner's Honor Roll and was named to the Conference USA All-Academic team last spring.

"Alex Skrypko is one of the top players in the country and he has been for the last three years," said Neufeld. "He suffered a severe knee injury his sophomore year here, but has battled back to be one of the top players in the U.S. He's going to continue to develop and help lead our team to a successful season."

Kuczer is one of the strongest players on the Mustangs' roster this season. Coming into the spring ranked No. 81 nationally, Kuczer will look to improve on his personal-best ranking this spring. He won the A Flight singles at

the Rice Invitational this fall to start the Mustangs off with a bang, defeating opponents from LSU and Tulsa to take the title. Kuczer then went on to the Polo Ralph Lauren All-American Tennis Championships, where he won four straight matches before being eliminated by Hawaii. In the ITA South Central Regionals, Kuczer continued his strong fall play, beating players from Texas Pan-Am and Texas Tech before falling to the four-seed out of Texas A&M.

"David had his best fall season this past fall," said Neufeld. "He emerged from the fall with a national ranking after beating some of the best players in the country. I'm excited to see what else he will do this spring."

Alver is coming off a successful spring 2007 season. He went 8-10 in singles play and paired with Robin Fahgen in doubles to mount a 12-7 record, mostly at No. 2. Alver's strong play at No. 3 singles helped the Mustangs blank both Southeastern Oklahoma State and Texas Pan-Am. With Fahgen, he managed a nine-match win-streak which was eventually broken by C-USA champion Rice on April 13. Solares has been an important member of the tennis team over the last three years. He posted one of the best records on the team last season, going 14-4, mostly at No. 6 singles. Solares won seven of his last ten matches last spring and continued his success into the fall. He advanced as far as the third round of the consolation finals at the ITA South Central Regionals and with David Kuczer, won the A Flight doubles title at the Rice Invitational.

"Oivind has shown tremendous technical improvements," said Neufeld. "He and Adolfo are both peaking now. Both are ready to emerge as top players. I look forward to watching both of them continue to develop this spring."

The Mustangs also return two sophomores in Robin Fahgen and Chris Hooshyar. Both Fahgen and Hooshyar enter the spring with significant playing time last year and this past fall. Fahgen spent last spring predominately at No. 5 singles, tallying a 9-4 record there and a 16-5 record overall. In doubles, Fahgen paired with Alver for a team-best 12-7 record, mostly at No. 2. In the fall, Fahgen advanced to the quarterfinal round of the ITA South Central Regionals, defeating several regionally-ranked opponents along the way. Hooshyar posted an 8-6 singles record last spring and paired with former Mustang Federico Murgier and Solares to post a 4-1 doubles record.

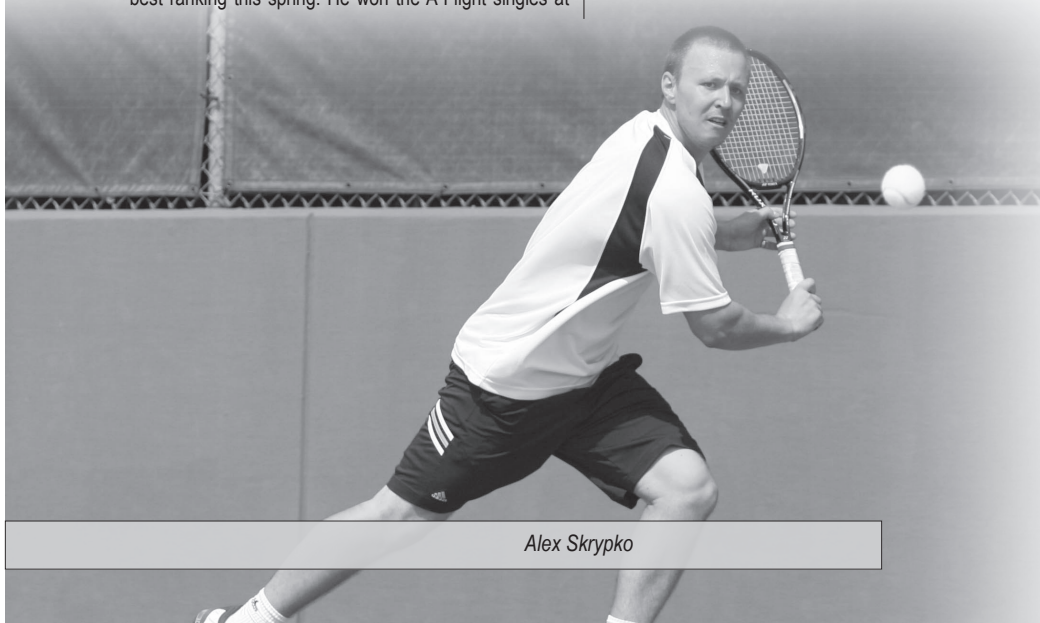
"Robin established himself with a tremendous fall season, beating many top regional players," said Neufeld. "He and Chris Hooshyar, along with the four seniors, help establish the core of a team I'm really excited about."

Adding to the excitement are the four redshirt freshmen active in 2007-08. Adham el-Effendi, Bryan Griffin, Taylor St. Eve and Darren Walsh add depth to the Mustang roster. All four saw playing time in the fall, with el-Effendi and St. Eve both making it as far as the semifinals of the consolation draw of the Midland Invitational. El-Effendi also won the B Flight singles at the Rice Invitational, while St. Eve won the C Flight singles at the same tournament. Walsh won the D Flight singles at Rice and then paired up with el-Effendi to win the B Flight doubles.

"The youth we have on this team is very exciting," said Neufeld. "We've got the best depth we've had since I got here. A number of the players are improving dramatically. The two sophomores and four redshirt freshmen are vying for positions in the lineup. They may serve as serious competition for those spots."

In keeping with tradition, the Mustangs will face a daunting schedule this spring, facing 11 nationally-ranked opponents. SMU kicks off its spring schedule by heading to Austin Jan. 26 to take on seventh-ranked Texas, who finished last season second in the Big 12. After a three-match homestand, the Ponies head north to take on No. 12 Notre Dame Feb. 10. The Fighting Irish captured the Big East title last season and ended 2007 ranked fifth. The Mustangs then return to Dallas to host four matches, concluding with No. 41 Minnesota on Feb. 24. SMU hits the road again to face No. 31 VCU and No. 35 Virginia Tech Feb. 29 and March 1 before swinging through Oklahoma to challenge No. 11 Oklahoma State. The Mustangs host No. 61 Indiana on March 10 before traveling to the Golden State to take on San Francisco and Cal, March 14-15. The Ponies briefly return home to face 2007 Ivy League champion Columbia on March 22 before heading to Waco to take on 2007 Big 12 champion No. 4 Baylor on March 27.

Conference play starts March 29 with the Mustangs playing host to Memphis and continues a week later when No. 32 Rice comes to Dallas on April 6, along with Grambling State. The Ponies travel to Tulsa April 12 to take on the Golden Hurricane before wrapping up the regular season by hosting crosstown rival No. 62 TCU in the new Turpin Center.

## CARL NEUFELD

Carl Neufeld enters his 15th year as head men's tennis coach at SMU. During his tenure on the Hilltop, he has compiled the most wins of any men's tennis coach (259) and a .676 winning percentage. On March 12, 2005, SMU defeated Illinois State to give Neufeld his 400th career victory. His career coaching record now stands at 440-228 and because of his success, Neufeld has been named WAC Coach of the Year three times, Dallas All-Sports Association SMU Coach of the Year twice and ITA Region VI Coach of the Year in 1998.

Neufeld's success continues, as he has led his squad to the NCAAs 10 of the last 11 years. His 10-year consecutive streak was broken last season. The 2005-06 campaign marked the 20th time in Mustang history that SMU earned a post-season berth. The decade-long streak ranks 17th overall in consecutive appearances by all teams in the NCAA.

Under Neufeld, SMU has won three conference titles and never finished outside of the top five in any final conference standings. He has coached 11 All-Americans in his 13 years, including Eric Cohn (2002), the only All-American from a Dallas high school since Michael Flanagan was an All-American at Stanford in 1994. Neufeld has also guided one individual to WAC Player of the Year honors and another to WAC Freshman of the Year. In addition, Neufeld has coached several players to top-five rankings in the region. Last season, Alex Skrypko won second in the South Central Regional tournament. In 2005-06, Peter Oredsson won the regional tournament title outright.

Neufeld annually produces some of the top student-athletes in the country. In 15 seasons, 20 individuals have finished ranked in the top 85 in the ITA rankings. Of those 20, two were in the top 50, four were in the top 25 and two individuals finished the season ranked in the top 10. His players also have national success in doubles play. Since 1998, Neufeld has guided nine pairings to ITA top-50 doubles rankings. Five of those duos finished among the top 25, with two tandems finishing in the top five, highlighted by an NCAA runner-up finish in 2001.

Neufeld led SMU to arguably its finest season ever in 2000-01, as two Mustangs won national titles while the team reached the Final Four at the NCAA Championships for the first time since 1986. The team reached the Final Four by defeating second-ranked UCLA. The accomplishment earned him his second WAC Coach of the Year honor.

After an 11-year absence from the NCAA Team Championships, Neufeld led SMU to the pinnacle of collegiate tennis in 1998 with its 11th appearance in the team championships. In only its second year in the WAC, SMU tore through opponents and registered a 21-5 record, the school's first 20-win campaign since 1987, not to mention an undefeated 9-0 mark against conference opponents and the school's first conference title since 1987.

In 1997, the Mustangs returned to NCAA postseason action for the first time in 10 years. Three players notched at least 20 singles wins, including current assistant coach Ignacio Hirigoyen, who became the first Mustang to win 30 singles matches in a season.

Neufeld was appointed to the NCAA Men's and Women's Tennis Committee for a three-year term starting in 2006. The committee is compiled of administrators and coaches from men's and women's tennis programs throughout the nation. The committee is in charge of all championships and selection of teams as well as general information, rules and regulations for tennis programs. They will also serve as NCAA representatives at various tennis events.

Taking an aggressive approach to SMU and the Dallas tennis community, Neufeld was the driving force behind bringing the ITA Indoor Collegiate Championships to Dallas in 1994. Neufeld was also the tournament director for the championships all 10 years that it was held in Dallas. Due in part to Neufeld's efforts, Texas is emerging as one of the best tennis-playing regions in the country.

Neufeld came to the Hilltop after serving four years as the assistant coach at Southern California, where he helped guide the Trojans to three consecutive Pac-10 titles and two NCAA Championships in 1991 and 1993. These were the most successful seasons in school history. The Trojans' national title in 1991 was their first in 15 years and they won three straight Pac-10 championships for the

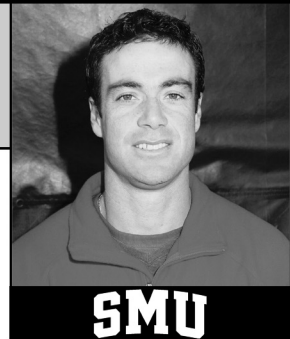
first time since 1966-68. While at USC, he coached nine NCAA All-Americans whose professional wins include Grand Slam titles at Wimbledon, the French Open, the U.S. Open and the Australian Open.

Prior to coming to SMU, Neufeld was active in the Los Angeles tennis community. He served a variety of positions, which focused on raising funds for tennis programs for underprivileged children.

Before starting at Southern Cal in 1990, Neufeld was the head tennis coach at Northern Illinois for nine seasons (1980-89). At age 22 in 1980, Neufeld was the youngest head tennis coach in the nation at the time. During his stint in Dekalb, he became the winningest coach in NIU history with a 181-104 record (.635). On his path to the wins record, Neufeld defeated schools from major conference such as the BIG E, Big Ten, Big 12 and Pac-10, highlighted by three wins over perennial national power Notre Dame. His last four teams at Northern all won 20 or more dual matches and combined for a 112-42 (.727) record.

## IGNACIO HIRIGOYEN

Assistant Coach  
5th Season  
SMU, '99



Ignacio Hirigoyen enters his fifth year as assistant coach of the SMU men's tennis team and is no stranger to the Hilltop as he was an All-American selection for the Mustangs as a player. In his four seasons with SMU, Hirigoyen has helped guide the teams to three NCAA Championship appearances and appearances in the championship matches of the WAC Tournament and Conference USA tournament.

In 2005-06, he helped lead the squad to SMU's 10th consecutive appearance at NAAs. In that decade of post-season play, Hirigoyen has been involved in six of them, three as a player (1997-99) and three as a coach (2004-06). The 2005-06 campaign marked the 20th time in Mustang history that SMU earned a post-season berth. The Mustangs' decade-long streak ranks 17th overall in consecutive appearances by all teams in the NCAA.

A four-year letterwinner for SMU from 1996-99, Hirigoyen was an All-America selection his senior year when he set the school's all-time mark for singles wins in a season with 34. After graduating from SMU in 1999, Hirigoyen embarked on a professional tennis tour that ran through 2003. In 2001, Hirigoyen enjoyed his best year on the professional circuit, gaining his highest career ranking of 221 in singles.

During his time in the professional ranks, Hirigoyen played in qualifications for Wimbledon, the Australian Open and the U.S. Open. In 2003, Hirigoyen defeated Germany Davis Cup member and two-time Olympic participant David Prinosil in Wimbledon qualifications. Hirigoyen was also a player representative on the Association of Tennis Professionals' (ATP) Player Council for the year 2002.

Hirigoyen graduated from SMU in 1999 with a degree in finance and economics and is currently working on his law degree at the SMU Law School.

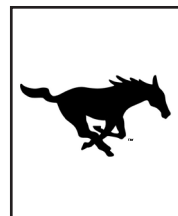

# ALTSHULER LEC ACADEMIC SUCCESS

Academic support for SMU's varsity athletes is coordinated through the Altshuler Learning Enhancement Center, which opened its doors to the student population in 1989 and has become one of the University's most widely-used student services.

The A-LEC contains the Blanton Academic Development Complex, including three state-of-the-art, fully-networked computer labs; six private rooms for both individual and small group study; an extensive library of audio, video and digital resources; and a large lounge area.

The A-LEC's content-specific services include tutoring, study groups, review sessions and the Writing Center. At the Writing Center, students receive help with the process of drafting and revising a specific project, as well as assistance with grammar, organization and style.

Understanding the distinctive challenges and unique experiences facing student-athletes, the A-LEC's Academic Counselors are responsible for tracking and responding to student-athlete needs at each stage of the academic calendar. The Academic Counselors' work includes pre-advising student-athletes during summer orientation and registration sessions, meeting with all student-athletes to discuss each semester's academic support needs, and conferring with coaches to determine which student-athletes should be recommended for more closely monitored academic assistance.

- The internationally acclaimed Meadows Museum houses one of the finest collections of Spanish art outside of Spain.

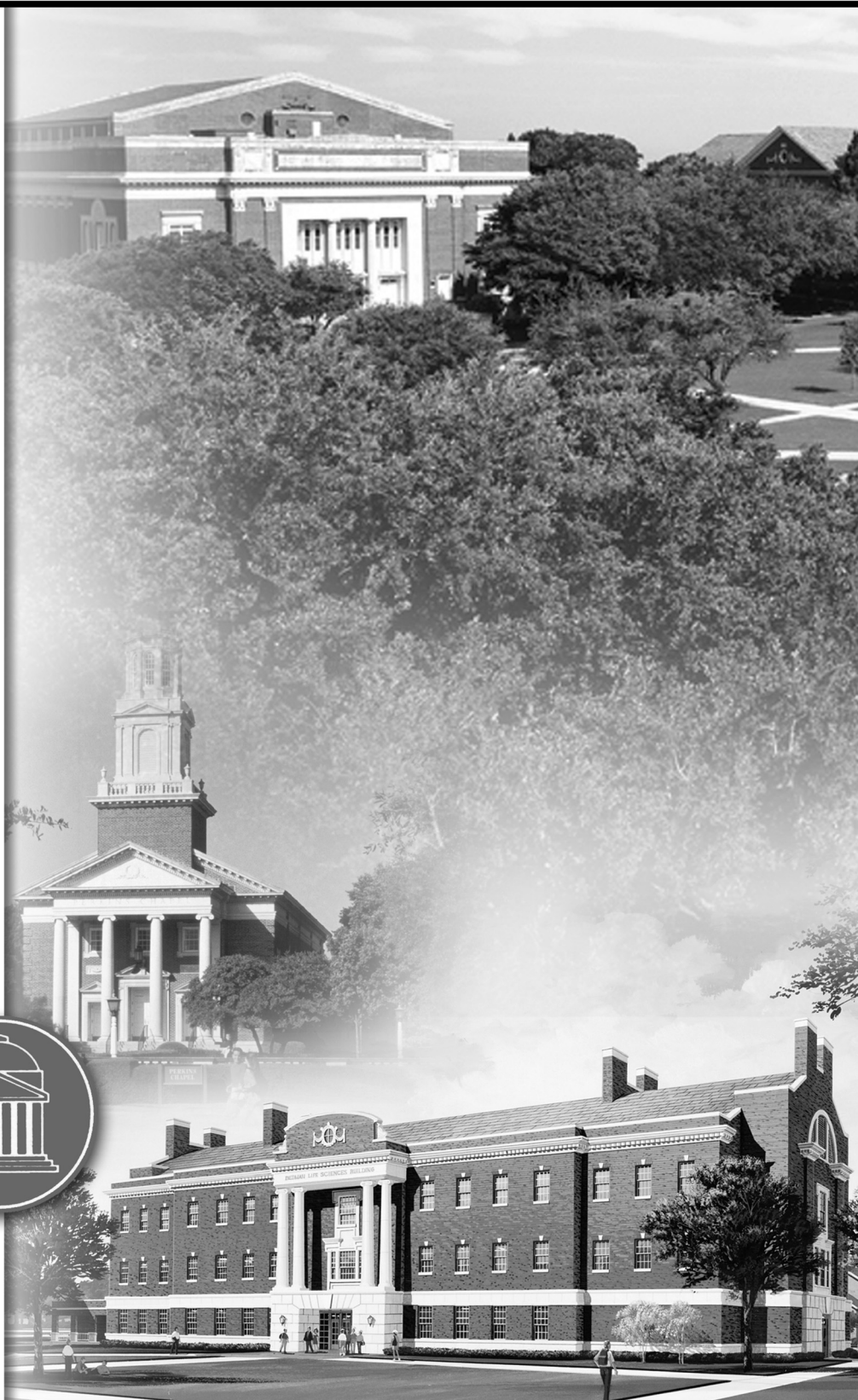

- SMU is one of the few universities to have a voting student member of its Board of Trustees. More than 200 campus organizations provide other opportunities for involvement.

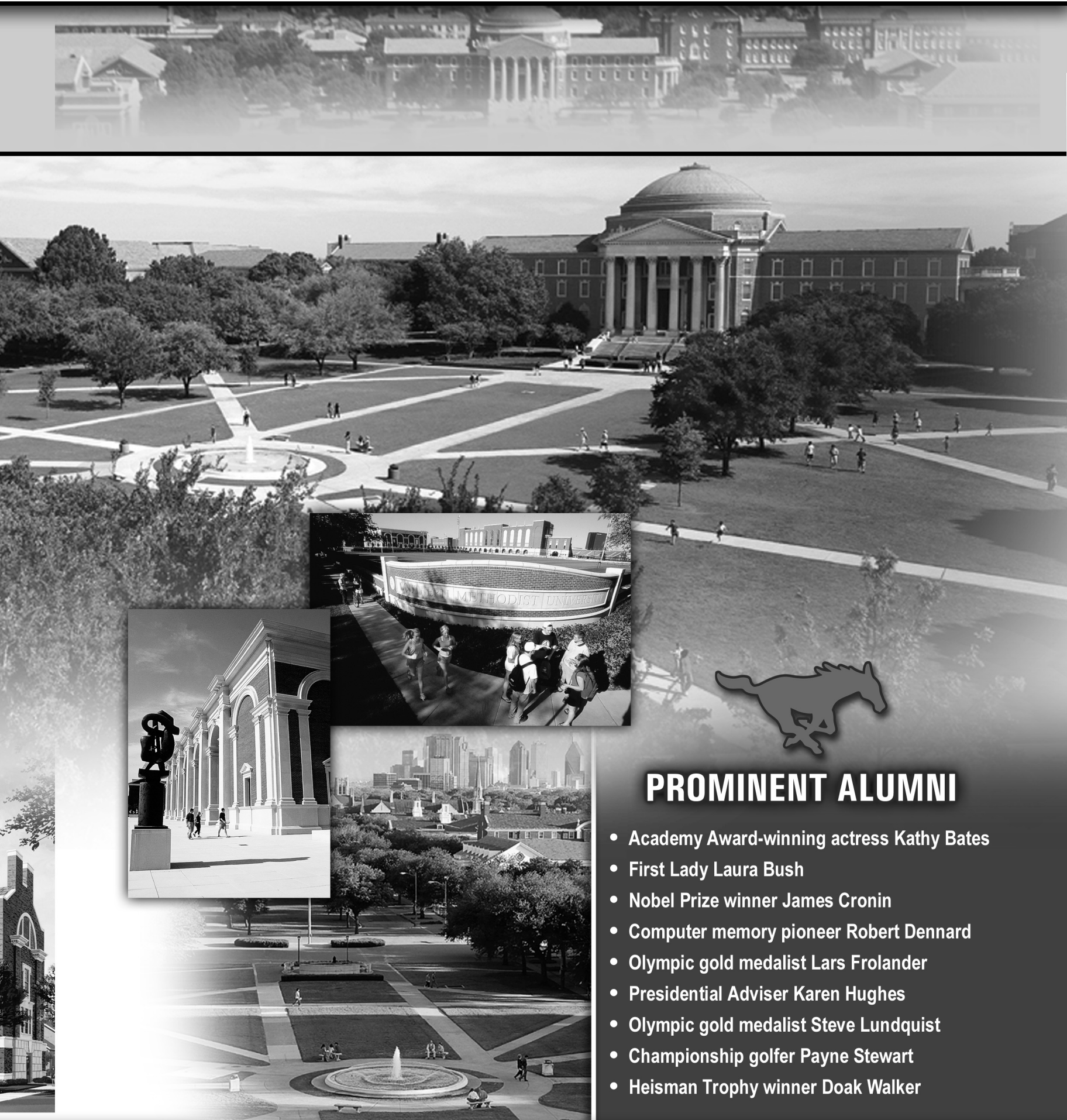
- SMU consistently ranks in the top one-third of national universities in the guide *America's Best Colleges*, published by *U.S. News & World Report*.
