SETTING THE SCENE

- Eleventh-seeded SMU is set to make its College Football Playoff debut when it faces six-seed Penn State at Beaver Stadium on Saturday at 11 a.m. on TNT.
- The Mustangs earned their first ever bid to the CFP by earning an at-large selection and the 11th seed during the playoff's first year with a 12-team format.
- SMU enters the contest at 11-2 and ranked No. 10 in the nation. The Mustangs have rose as high as seventh this season, the program's highest ranking since 1985.
- SMU has won its last 10 road games, second-longest active streak in all of the FBS behind only fifth-seeded Texas.
- The Mustangs have forced at least one turnover in nine of the past 12 games and in 19 of the past 23 contests.
- SMU orchestrated a furious fourth-quarter comeback during the ACC Championship versus Clemson to tie the game with under a minute remaining in the game. However, the Tigers nailed an ACC Championship Game-record 56-yard field goal as time expired to take the conference crown.
- SMU's 8-0 season in conference play is a first for a team jumping into a Power-4/5 conference from a Group of Five in their first season since 1978. Of those teams, only Louisville (2014) finished with a winning conference record, going 5-3 in ACC play.

QUICK HITS

- SMU's defense has continued to force turnovers this year, ranking 26th in the country with 21 turnovers gained, along with being fifth in defensive touchdowns with four.
- The Mustangs have had at least seven receivers catch a pass in 27 of the past 30 games.
- Brashard Smith has made an impact in 2024, ranking eighth in all-purpose yards per game with 139.54 and 11th in total touchdowns (18), resulting in being named a semifinalist for the Doak Walker Award. Smith has also scored 112 points this season, which ranks 15th in the nation. The senior is just 29 yards shy of breaking the SMU single-season all-purpose yards record.
- Collin Rogers has tallied 23 field goals this season, which is third in the nation. He leads the nation in made field goals over 50 yards with seven, one shy of the NCAA single season record of eight set by Tennessee's Fuad Reveiz in 1982, leading to being selected as a semifinalist for the Lou Groza Award, he also was named a First Team All-America by Sports Illustrated.
- Kevin Jennings sits 10th nationally in passing yards per attempt (8.87) and 13th in passing efficiency (156.9).
- Jennings has the highest passer efficiency rating in conference games only in the ACC at 171.5.
- SMU's 54 wins in the last six years are the most by any FBS Texas team. In addition, the Mustangs have won 24 of those on the road, tops for any team in the state since 2019.
- The Mustangs are 20-3 in their last 23 games, and 19-2 in their last 21 regular-season contests.
- Rhett Lashlee boasts a 21-3 conference record in his career. His 21-3 record in his first 24 league games on the Hilltop is the best in SMU history.
- SMU has posted a record of 26-2 during Lashlee's three seasons in charge when they score 30 or more points in a game.

THE SERIES

- This is the third meeting all time, with Penn State holding a 1-0-1 advantage in the series.
- Penn State took the matchup in 1978 at home, while the two programs tied 13-13 in the 1947 Cotton Bowl in Dallas.

ABOUT THE NITTANY LIONS

- Penn State enters the game at 11-2 overall and 8-1 in the Big 10.
- The Nittany Lions' comeback fell short during the Big 10 Championship against top-ranked Oregon, losing 45-37.
- PSU is 1-2 against ranked opponents this season, with the win coming over No. 19 Illinois in Happy Valley on Sept. 28.

THE COACHES

• Rhett Lashlee is in his third season as the head coach at SMU and has a 29-10 career record. Lashlee, who served as offensive coordinator for the Mustangs for two seasons (2018-19), also served as the offensive coordinator at Miami in 2020 and 2021. A one-time finalist (2013) and two-time semifinalist (2019, 2020) for the Broyles Award, Lashlee has the distinction of being the only coach ever nominated for the Broyles Award four different times at four different schools (Arkansas State, Auburn, SMU, Miami).

• Lashlee was named a finalist last season for the prestigious Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year Award, handed out the nation's top coach as voted on by the National Sports Media Association, the Bryant Awards' Executive Leadership Team, and the Bryant Family. The Arkansas native was also named Co-Coach of the Year by the Dave Campbell's Texas Football publication, a finalist of the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award, and a semi-finalist for Coach of the Year Award by the Maxwell Football Club for the job he did in 2023.

• Lashlee signed a contract extension with SMU on Nov. 22, 2024. Terms of the agreement were not disclosed.

• James Franklin, a 29-year football coaching veteran, was appointed Penn State's 16th head football coach on January 11, 2014, and enters his 14th season as a collegiate head coach. Franklin's career head coaching record is 123-56 and is one of five active FBS coaches with a 66-plus winning percentage and 13-plus years coaching experience.

MUSTANG CAPTAINS

• Kevin Jennings, Jonathan McGill, Justin Osborne, Elijah Roberts, Preston Stone and Kobe Wilson were voted captains for the 2024 season.

SOMETHING SPECIAL GOING ON HERE

- The Mustangs have been a force in conference play over the last three seasons.
- SMU has posted an 21-3 record against conference opponents since 2022, highlighted by the current 17-game winning streak.
- The 17 straight conference wins breaks the program record set back from 1981 to 1982.
- The winning streak is the longest active streak in the nation.

LET'S TAKE THIS SHOW ON THE ROAD

- SMU's 10-game current road winning streak is second-longest active streak in college football and longest in program history since a 13-game streak from Sept. 26, 1981 to Sept. 15, 1984.
- SMU has averaged 35 points per game during the streak.
- The Mustangs have scored at least 26 points in all 10 road wins dating back to 2023.

LEVELED UP

- The Mustangs continue to be a dominant force in conference games for a second straight season.
- SMU won conference games by a score of 37.62-18.25, an average of 19.37.
- The 19.37 average margin of victory is the third highest for any P4 team in the country, behind Indiana (23.11) and Oregon (20.0)
- Only the Ducks and the Mustangs went unbeaten in conference play amongst P4 teams in 2024.

SAME PONY, NEW EXPRESS

- The Mustangs have put together one of the best two-seasons run in the program's history in 2023 and 2024.
- For the first time ever, the Mustangs have put together back-to-back seasons with at least 11 wins.
- During the run, SMU went a perfect 16-0 in conference play in two different conferences (AAC in 2023 and ACC in 2024).

PLAYOFFS, WE'RE TALKING PLAYOFFS

- SMU made its debut in the first set of the 2024 CFP rankings on Nov. 6, coming in at No. 13.
- The Mustangs were ranked 10th in the final edition of the CFP rankings, good enough to earn an at-large bid to mark the program's first ever appearance in the CFP.

SMITH ARMY KNIFE

- Running back Brashard Smith has been a weapon in multiple offensive facets so far this season, helping him being named a semifinalist for the Doak Walker Award.
- The Richmond Heights, Florida, native has racked up 1,270 yards on the ground along with 303 yards receiving, making him one of just two FBS players with 1,200+ rushing and 300+ receiving yards on the season.
- Smith also has 243 kickoff return yards, making him the only player in the FBS with 1,100+ rushing, 250+ receiving and 200+ kickoff return yards this year.
- Smith has posted a 90.4 offensive grade by PFF on the season, the 12th highest by any offensive player amongst all Power conference teams (70 teams) (Min 200 snaps).
- Smith has 1,814 all-purpose yards on the year, which rank second most in a single season in program history. He is just 29 yards shy of breaking the SMU single-season all-purpose yards record.
- Thanks to his success this season, Smith has been named an All-American for all purpose by the AP and AFCA, along with being named First Team All-ACC as a running back.
- Smith eclipsed 1,000 rushing yards on the season against Boston College, making him the 12th player in program history to rush for 1,000 in a single season.

BACK TO THE FUTURE

- SMU has posted back-to-back double-digit win seasons for the first time since the 1983 (10-2) and 1984 (10-2) seasons.
- The result has led to being getting up to eighth and seventh in the AP and Coaches Polls, the highest since 1985, which leads to some interesting tidbits.
- The last time the Mustangs were in the top 10 of the AP poll, the no. 1 song in America was the "Miami Vice" theme.

- SMU has enjoyed much success in the past six seasons.
- The Mustangs have recorded 54 wins since 2019, are the most by any of the 13 FBS teams in the state.
- Of those 54 wins, 24 have come on the road, tops for any team in the state since 2019.

START FAST

- SMU has led or been tied after the first quarter in 53 of the past 73 games, and have also led or been tied at halftime in 57 of the last 73.

- The seven made from at least 50 is one shy of the NCAA single season record of eight set by Tennessee's Fuad Reveiz in 1982.
- The junior set a new program record for made field goals in a game, going 5-for-5 in a loss to BYU on Sept. 6.
- Rogers set a career long with a 55-yard make in the win at Louisville on Oct. 5.
- Rogers was rewarded for his play, being named a Lou Groza Award semifinalist on Nov. 19.
- The junior now has 352 career points, breaking the previous program record of 288 held by Eric Dickerson, Doak Walker and Xavier Jones.
- His 126 points in 2023 is the second most scored in a season in program history for a Mustang.
- Rogers was named a First Team All-American by the FWAA thanks to his success this season.

CLOSING TIME

- SMU has been able to close in the month of November under head coach Rhett Lashlee.
- Lashlee has posted an 11-1 (.916) mark for November in his two seasons as leader of the Mustangs.

- So far this season, five Mustangs have garnered ACC Player of the Week accolades.
- Following the win over Nevada, RJ Maryland picked up ACC Receiver of the Week after hauling in eight receptions for 162 yards, both career highs, including the game-winning touchdown late in the fourth quarter.
- Ahmaad Moses was named ACC Defensive Back of the Week and Brashard Smith was tabbed ACC Running Back of the Week after the win over TCU. Moses tallied a career-high two interceptions, including one returned 60 yards to the house during the victory. Smith continued his breakout campaign with 127 yards on the ground and a career-best three touchdowns along with 24 yards receiving and a touchdown.

RUNS IN THE FAMILY

- RJ Maryland shined in his third year with the Mustangs being going down to a season-ending injury against Stanford.
- Maryland turned in the best performance of his Mustang career early in the year, finishing with career bests in catches (eight) and receiving yards (162) in the comeback win at Nevada on August 24.
- For his performance, he was named the ACC Receiver of the Week by the conference, the first weekly honor of his collegiate career.
- Maryland's 162 yards were the most by an SMU player since Rashee Rice's 180 yards at Tulsa on Oct. 29, 2022.
- Maryland has 14 touchdown receptions in his career at SMU, which is tied for most in program history for a tight end.
- The junior is coming off a breakout season in 2023 where he started in every game and recorded the team's second most receptions (34), reception yards (518) and reception yards per game (37).
- He was named to the Mackey Award List this preseason, only the second Mustang tight end in program history to be selected to the list, joining Grant Calcaterra in 2021.

MR. SMITH GOES TO THE HILLTOP

- Brashard Smith made an impressive debut in an SMU jersey, finishing with 141 all-purpose yards (67 rush, 26 receiving, 58 kick return) and a touchdown at Nevada.

- Junior kicker Collin Rogers continued to his run of good play in the season-opening victory at Nevada on August 24.
- Rogers made two clutch field goals in the win.
- The 52-yard kick tied for the seventh longest in program history.

- SMU showed its resiliency in the victory at Nevada on August 24.
- The victory was the biggest fourth quarter comeback since October 5, 2019 vs. Tulsa when the Mustangs trailed 30-9 in the fourth and won 43-37 in triple overtime.

- The Mustangs hit the road for three straight road matchups with games at Louisville (Oct. 5), Stanford (Oct. 19) and Duke (Oct. 26) to complete the October slate.
- The month of November features a match-up in Dallas against Pittsburgh (Nov. 2) on homecoming, then another home game against Boston College (Nov. 16).
- SMU closes out its regular season with match-ups against Virginia (Nov. 23) on the road before hosting Cal (Nov. 30) on Senior Day.

SOMETHING TO BUILD ON

- The Mustangs are coming off one of the best seasons in program history in 2023, posting an 11-3 record.
- The 11 wins were most since 1982 and tied for the second most in the program history.
- SMU's 43 wins in the last five years are tied for most by any FBS Texas team.
- The Mustangs were 10-0 last year when they scored at least 30 points in a game.
- The Mustangs' sack total of 47 last year ranked third in the NCAA and second most in program history for a single season.
- SMU's defense performed at a high level in 2023, ranking in the top 20 in the NCAA in third down pct defense (4th), defensive touchdowns (1st), scoring defense (11th), team sacks (3rd), tackles for loss (16th) and total defense (12th).
- The Mustangs took it to the conference opposition, posting an average margin of victory of 28.9 points (45.9-17.0) in conference games in 2023, the largest margin for any team in the NCAA in conference play last year.
- SMU outscored its opponents 174-58 in the first quarter last year.
- The Mustangs scored at least 55 points four times last season, the most in program history for a single season.

WELCOME TO THE LEAGUE ROOKIE

- Four Mustangs found their way onto NFL rosters for training camp this year after helping deliver a conference championship in 2023.
- Former Mustangs Elijah Chatman (New York Giants), Devere Levelston (Seattle Seahawks), Jordan Miller (Denver Broncos) and Charles Woods (Los Angeles Rams) all signed professional contracts this past April.
- SMU now has 17 former players currently on a roster in for the start of the 2024 NFL season.

MAKE IT 12

- The Mustangs captured their 12th conference championship with a 26-14 win at Tulane on Dec. 2, 2023 in Yulman Stadium.
- SMU has won 12 conference titles in the program's history - 1923, 1926, 1931, 1935, 1940 (shared), 1947, 1948, 1966, 1981, 1982, 1984 (shared) and 2023.

A GAME-CHANGING MOVE

- SMU played its first home game as a member of the ACC and the first home game with the new Garry Weber End Zone Complex at Gerald J. Ford Stadium.
- A \$50 million commitment from the Garry Weber Foundation, established by former Mustang football letterman Garry A. Weber '58, is the largest gift in the history of SMU Athletics and served as the lead gift for the new \$100M+ 192,500-square-foot Garry Weber End Zone Complex at Gerald J. Ford Stadium.
- Anchoring Ford Stadium's south bowl and connecting its existing east and west gate entries, the Weber End Zone Complex increases the functionality, efficiency and overall experience of Mustang football for student-athletes and fans.
- With over 192,000 square feet across three levels of public and private spaces, the new complex supports SMU's 484 student-athletes and houses team coaches, staff and recruiting services. Additionally, the new complex offers fans and visitors premium experiences, improved pedestrian accessibility and expanded guest facilities.

TRIBUTE 23

Since 2009, the SMU coaching staff has chosen a deserving student-athlete to wear the number 23 to honor Jerry LeVias. Isaiah Nwokobia earned the honor for a second straight season in 2024.

LeVias was the first African-American to receive an athletic scholarship in the Southwest Conference. While at SMU, LeVias made athletic and academic All-America teams and, in 1966, contributed to the Mustangs' first SWC title in 18 years. He was an All-American in 1968 and was chosen All-SWC in 1966, 1967 and 1968. He is in both the College Football and SMU Athletics Halls of Fame.

THE ALL-AMERICAN MAN

- Senior Elijah Roberts got rewarded for his breakout season in 2023 with the Mustangs.
- Roberts was named to Action Sport's All-America First Team on defense last season.
- Roberts has gotten his recognition this preseason, being named Best Defensive Lineman in Texas by Dave Campbell's Texas Football publication.

BUILT DIFFERENT

- SMU had the best defense in the AAC in 2023.
- The Mustangs ranked in the top three in the conference in several categories, including third down conversion defense (first), defensive touchdowns (first), first down defense (second), interceptions (third), passing yards allowed (first), rushing defense (second), scoring defense (first), team passing efficiency defense (first), team sacks (first), team tackles for loss (third) and total defense (first).
- SMU's defense allowed 16.47 fewer points per game in 2023 compared to 2022.
- The Mustangs held eight opponents to under 300 total yards in a game last year.

SAME PONY, NEW EXPRESS

- The Mustangs dialed it back to the days of the Pony Express with the elite level of play shown in 2023 on both sides of the ball.
- SMU held three straight opponents to 10 points or less (at ECU, at Temple, vs. Tulsa) on defense last year, the longest streak since doing so in four straight games in 1983.
- The Mustangs scored at least 55 four times last season, the most in program history.
- SMU has outscored conference opponents 140-41 in the first quarter of games last year.

SHUT'EM DOWN

- The Mustangs recorded two shutouts last season for the first time since 2012.
- SMU also posted the first shutout of a conference opponent since 2012 with a 55-0 victory at Temple (55-0) on Oct. 20, 2023.
- The 1935 National Champion team holds the record for shutouts in a single season with eight.

PRESEASON AWARDS RACKING UP

- SMU athletes have earned a high number of preseason accolades for 2024.
- 20 different players have picked up a preseason honor, with 12 having earned preseason All-ACC accolades by Athlon Sports or Phil Steele.
- Stone leads the way, picking up eight preseason honors already, and 13 Mustangs have earned multiple accolades.

PONY UP DALLAS

- In just seven days after announcing the move into the Atlantic Coast Conference on Sept. 1, 2023, SMU raised \$100 million to support the Mustangs' transition to the ACC for 2024.
- The generous early commitments from a group of thirty donors that includes trustees and key donors – alumni and non-alumni alike – enables SMU to align and compete with an elite group of national institutions with powerhouse athletic programs, benefiting both SMU Athletics and the entire University community.
- Notably, the move immediately raised SMU's profile, with media coverage of the move generating more than \$163 million in advertising value in the first three days.
- In that same small window, SMU also experienced a 103% increase in visitors to its undergraduate admissions homepage.

HISTOR-ACC DAY

- SMU celebrated one of the most important moments in the school's history on July. 1 when it joined the Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC).
- With the additions of SMU, Cal & Stanford, the ACC will have 17 members in football for 2024.

WEAR RED FRIDAY

Every Friday is a "Wear Red Friday" on the Hilltop – a vibrant display of Mustang pride and unity. Peruna leads the charge, reminding us to wear our favorite red apparel and to support our Mustang Nation.

Whether it's a T-shirt or a tie, wearing red every Friday throughout the year upholds this tradition, symbolizing our collective strength as a campus community.

BETTER IN BLUE

SMU added blue Dallas-themed jerseys to its rotation in 2021, which highlight some of the same features as the white jerseys, which debuted in 2019.

- The helmet decal features the famous Triple D interlocked with the timeless SMU Pony, symbolizing the unity between the city of Dallas and SMU.

- The stripe on the helmet and jersey sleeves pay homage to the Dallas Cowboys.

- The number and pant stripe pay tribute to the 1966 Dallas Cowboys, led by quarterback and SMU alum Don Meredith.

- The script 'Dallas' featured on the chest pays homage to SMU alum and AFL founder Lamar Hunt and the Dallas Texans.

YOUNG GUNS

SMU's coaching staff has some of the brightest young coaches in the game on its 2024 staff.

In the summer of 2024, Quarterbacks coach D'Eriq King was named to the 30under30 List by 247Sports while linebackers coach Maurice Crum Jr. was Dave Campbell's Texas Football 40 Under 40 List.

Prior to the 2023, Kyle Cooper was named to Dave Campbell's Texas Football 40 Under 40 List. He was also recognized by 247Sports in its 30 Under 30 list back in 2021.

Prior to the 2022 season, Symons was named to Dave Campbell's Texas Football 40 Under 40 List.

Offensive Coordinator and tight ends coach Casey Woods was announced as a nominee for the Broyles Award in 2022. Presented by the Frank & Barbara Broyles Foundation, the award honors college football's top assistant coaches.

FUNDRAISING RECORDS

- SMU Athletics hit three major fundraising goals prior to its first season in the ACC.
- The department raised a record-setting \$159 million during the 2023-24 fiscal year, a number punctuated by an unprecedented \$100 million donated in just seven days following the announcement of the move to the ACC in September.
- SMU's Mustang Club reached its ambitious goal of 5,000 members, which far surpassed the previous high of 3,500 members.
- On the program's first day in the ACC, SMU announced that \$100 million had been donated to its ACC Competitiveness Campaign, an initiative launched to help ensure that the university's athletic programs remained competitive at the highest level of college sports during its transition to the ACC.
- In April, SMU announced that 2024 will feature the most season-ticket holders in Ford Stadium history, and season-ticket sales are up more than 50 percent compared to the end of the 2023, putting SMU on pace to more than double the amount of season tickets sold for the upcoming year.

REMEMBERING A MUSTANG LEGEND

SMU lost one of its biggest fans on Sept. 12, 2022, as SMU alum, former cheerleader and superfan Paul Layne died following a brief illness.

Layne set an unrivaled Mustang record, attending every SMU game for over 50 years, even going to Tokyo and Hawaii (EIGHT TIMES) to cheer on the Ponies. Starting when Layne attended SMU and was a team cheerleader, he attended 542 straight games.

More than once Layne had to go to extreme lengths to keep his streak alive – like the time his ex-wife remarried. He persuaded her to schedule her wedding on a Friday within driving distance of SMU's game at Nevada the following day. So the night before the Mustangs tangled with the Wolf Pack in Reno, Layne attended the wedding in California's Sonoma Valley, then drove 200 miles to catch the opening kickoff. In 1995, Layne attended a game dressed in a Halloween costume to disguise his case of adult-onset chicken pox, and in 2020, Layne received a special invitation from Tulane to attend SMU's 37-34 overtime win, since Yulman Stadium was closed to spectators.

SMU ATHLETICS STUDENT-ATHLETE SUCCESS DEPARTMENT

As part of its goal of Shaping Champions and preparing students for life, SMU Athletics proudly announced the creation of a new Student-Athlete Success Department in 2022. This new department encompasses all student-development-centered efforts such as Life After Ball, SAAC and community service initiatives. Additionally, it will house NIL Education and Diversity, Equity and Inclusion programming. Due to a generous donation from Suzanne and Glenn Youngkin, SMU Athletics will be able to grow staffing in these critical areas in our support of our student-athletes.

MUSTANG STUDENT-ATHLETES & NIL

SMU Football student-athletes benefit from Name, Image, Likeness (NIL) opportunities through SMU Athletics' conference-leading BOLD NIL program. SMU topped the AAC for NIL Deals among INFLCR partners, ranking No. 1 in Total Transactions, Total Transaction Value and Average Transaction Value. To date, football student-athletes have amassed over 160 total transactions, totaling more than \$434,800 with an average transaction value of nearly \$2,700. SMU student-athletes overall have over 280 transactions for over \$620,000 with an average transaction value of \$2,200.

PONY UP-GRADES!

Opened in 2000, Gerald J. Ford Stadium is adjacent to Mockingbird Lane. The architecture is consistent with the Collegiate-Georgian style of the entire SMU campus and features traditional, yet state-of-the-art design concepts. The stadium has a seating capacity of 32,000 with the possibility for future expansion to 45,000. The configuration includes nearly 600 club level seats and 240 seats in 24 spacious luxury suites housed in a three-level tower and press box. In addition to housing the club and suites, the press box provides excellent sightlines and comfortably accommodates more than 125 working print, digital, radio and television media. The playing surface is 25 feet below ground level, with half of the stadium's seats sunk below grade, ensuring a smooth transition into the surrounding neighborhood and the remainder of campus.

SMU has also invested in the creation of the Armstrong Fieldhouse includes features such as two scoreboards, a video board, glass rollup doors and translucent panels above the practice field to let natural light in. Housing the Weber Observation Deck and Loyd Field, Armstrong Fieldhouse incorporates tributes to SMU's most famous football alumni.

The stadium has undergone millions of dollars' worth of upgrades since opening, and in January 2022, SMU announced the \$100 million Garry Weber End Zone Complex project, which officially opened to the public for the home opener against HCU on August 31, 2024. Sparked by a \$50 million commitment from the Garry Weber Foundation – the largest gift in the history of SMU Athletics – the new three-level complex increased the functionality, efficiency and overall experience of Mustang Football and its fans. It also continues SMU's century-long commitment to competing at the highest levels. On Sept. 23, 2022 SMU announced a \$15 million gift from Bill and Liz Armstrong toward the end zone project.

THE RED CARPET

SMU may need to install a red carpet in the Mustang locker room as SMU has become "the place to be" in Dallas. Among the celebrities, legends, current and former pros that have attended practice or stopped by the stadium in recent years are: Micah Parsons, Dax Prescott, Trevon Diggs, Bo Nix, Bryce Young, Derrick Henry, Dez Bryant, Roger Staubach, Troy Aikman, Terrell Owens, Tim Brown, Michael Irvin and Deion Sanders, as well as SMU Hall of Famers Reggie Dupard, Eric Dickerson, Craig James, Jerry Ball, Russell Carter, Don Meredith, and Emmanuel Sanders.

Former President George W. Bush performed the ceremonial coin toss at games against Navy (2011), Memphis (2012), Texas Tech (2013), Cincinnati (2014), UNT (2015), Memphis (2016), Navy (2018) and Texas State (2019). Dallas Mayor Eric Johnson performed the coin toss in SMU's 2021 season opener against ACU, and Billy Gibbons of ZZ Top flipped the coin before the win over Tulane.

Eric Dickerson, Craig James and Lance McIlhenny were part of the coin toss against Lamar (2022), and former President Bush returned for the game vs. Navy.

THIS ONE GOES TO 11

Russell Carter is on the 2025 College Football Hall of Fame ballot with a chance to become the 11th Mustang enshrined in the Hall.

Carter was a football and track & field standout for SMU from 1980-83. Carter was a 1983 unanimous First-Team All-American who helped the Mustangs win NCAA-recognized National Championships in 1981 and 1982. Carter had seven interceptions in 1981 and 1983, both tied for second in a season at SMU. The three-time All-SWC performer led Mustangs to consecutive league titles in 1981-82 and is the Mustangs all-time career leader in interceptions with 18.

Carter was drafted in the first round (10th overall) of the 1984 NFL Draft by the New York Jets. Carter was inducted into the SMU Hall of Fame in 2013.

He was a crucial member of the 1983 NCAA Indoor and Outdoor National Championship teams and was an All-American on the indoor mile relay team and the outdoor 1600-meter relay team in 1983.

With 10 current Hall of Fame inductees hailing from the Hilltop, SMU is tied for 29th-most CFB HOF honorees with Texas A&M, Iowa, NC State and Syracuse.

LOYD FIELD

Outfitted with the same playing surface as Ford Stadium, Loyd Field will increase flexibility for many of SMU's sports programs to train, particularly during inclement weather. This space also allows use by other campus and student groups when not programmed by Athletics.



MUSTANG VISION STUDIOS

Located on the second floor, features the brand new \$23 million dollar Mustang Vision Studios, a state-of-the-art control center that handles all broadcasts for the ACC Network involving SMU teams.

WEBER OBSERVATION DECK

Located indoors on the second floor, the Weber Observation Deck overlooks the Armstrong Fieldhouse and offers prime views of practices or other activities on Loyd Field.

CRUM TERRACE

Located on the second floor and visible from Bishop Boulevard and Binkley Avenue, is a premier outdoor event space with two entrances from the recruiting lounge.

MILLER BOULEVARD BALLROOM

Located on the ground floor just inside the main entrance off Bishop Boulevard, serves as a multipurpose space that can accommodate banquets, presentations, meetings, hospitality and other social gatherings for athletics, as well as campus and community events.

WEIGHT ROOM

Located on the ground floor and has direct access to Loyd Field. It provides an additional strength and conditioning space for student-athletes.

LETTERWINNERS PLAZA

As a testament to over 100 years of SMU Football history, the Letterwinners Plaza features bricks with all of the men and women who earned a football varsity letter as a student-athlete, manager or trainer since the program's inception in 1915.

DALLAS (AP) -- Brashard Smith ran for 108 yards and two touchdowns, 348-pound nose tackle Anthony Booker Jr. returned a fumble for a score and SMU routed Houston Christian (HCU) 59-7 on Saturday night.

Preston Stone threw for two TDs and Kevin Jennings had one passing and one rushing as the quarterbacks split time in the first home game for SMU (2-0) since joining the Atlantic Coast Conference.

After starting with a three-and-out, the Mustangs scored touchdowns on four consecutive possessions of their own - and one of Houston Christian's.

Jahfari Harvey crunched CJ Rogers in the chest late in the first quarter, the ball squirted loose as the QB was being slammed to the turf and Booker scooped it up and rumbled 16 yards for a 28-0 SMU lead.

"It was a great start. The defense had a lot to do with that," coach Rhett Lashlee said after SMU's ninth consecutive home victory. "The second quarter we had a little bit of a lull. We told them at halftime we've got to be a finishing team. They did a nice job of finishing and not letting their guard down."

Jordan Hudson, Jake Bailey and Key'Shawn Smith had a touchdown catch apiece, starting with Hudson's 28-yarder a play after Brashard Smith's 47-yard run. Key'Shawn Smith's 35-yard score was his only catch.

The Mustangs finished with 595 yards total offense, including 369 rushing. It was their most on the ground since 2019. Freshman Derrick McFall was one of four with at least 50 yards rushing, getting 69 and a touchdown on 16 carries in the first game of his career.

DALLAS (AP) -- Will Ferrin kicked a 26-yard field goal with 1:58 left after BYU had two big fourth-down runs as the Cougars beat SMU 18-15 on Friday night, ending the Mustangs' nine-game home winning streak.

The game-winning kick came on the same drive when Miles Davis took a quick pitch on a fourth-and-1 near midfield and ran 37 yards to the Mustangs' 15.

The Mustangs (2-1) hadn't lost at home since Oct. 22, 2022, against Cincinnati. They averaged 53.9 points in their longest home winning streak since 1948, twice scoring 69 points and putting up 77 in another one. Their lowest-scoring game in that streak was 34.

Collin Rogers set a single-game school record with five field goals for all of the SMU scoring, including a 45-yarder with 6:17 left that tied the game. He also had kicks of 53, 52, 38 and 28 yards as he pushed his career total to 44, tying for the most in Mustangs history.

SMU starting quarterback Preston Stone played only three drives, all three-and-outs before halftime that lost a combined 24 yards with him sacked once on each of those possessions. Kevin Jennings was 15-of-32 passing for 140 yards and ran nine times for 38 yards as the Mustangs had only 261 total yards.

Early in the fourth quarter, Jennings was first picked off at the BYU 17 by Marque Collins, though the Mustangs got it back three plays later when Retzlaff made a sidearm throw right into the chest of 294-pound defensive tackle Jared Harrison-Hunte, who returned the interception to the 3.

For SMU, the more mobile Jennings certainly provided some sparks with his ability to avoid defenders and make some short completions, but didn't finish any drives in the end zone. SMU went 72 yards in 11 plays on its third series after he came in for the first time, but had an incomplection in the end zone on fourth-and-1 from the 6.

DALLAS (AP) -- Brashard Smith ran for 127 yards and three of his four scores while SMU also had three non-offensive touchdowns for the first time in 12 years on Saturday in a 66-42 win over TCU and former coach Sonny Dykes, who got ejected after two unsportsmanlike conduct penalties.

ACC newcomer SMU (3-1) had scored 17 points in the final 1:28 of the first half for a 41-21 lead, the most points the Mustangs ever scored in a half during the series that was played for the 104th time. That quick scoring spurt included Ahmaad Moses' 69-yard interception return for a touchdown.

The Mustangs jumped out to a 17-0 lead in the game's first nine minutes, including Brandon Crossley's 51-yard fumble return for a TD and Roderick Daniels Jr.'s 69-yard punt return only 58 seconds later. Their 66 points were the most scored by either team in a series that doesn't have another game scheduled after next year.

TCU's Josh Hoover threw for 396 yards and three touchdowns on 28-of-43 passing, but also had four turnovers — two interceptions and two fumbles. His first fumble was the one Crossley returned and the second was recovered at the Frogs' 1-yard line, setting up the first of Smith's two 1-yard TDs in the second half.

Hoover threw into double coverage when Daniels got his pick-6. Hoover's first interception of the season came on his 143rd attempt, the most in the nation before throwing one.

Smith also had a 25-yard TD run and caught a 24-yard scoring pass from Kevin Jennings, the more mobile quarterback who got his first start this season ahead of Preston Stone.

Jennings was 14-of-19 passing for 137 yards and two touchdowns. He ran 10 times for 41 yards.

Wilson made the interception between the hash marks, raced to the right sideline, and broke a tackle and hurdled a teammate while escorted to the end zone.

Brashard Smith and Roderick Daniels Jr. scored rushing touchdowns for the Mustangs (4-1, 1-0) from 13 and 2 yards, respectively. Daniels' score ended a drive that was continued when FSU's Omarion Cooper was called for a facemask penalty on the Mustangs' punt from their 26-yard line.

DJ Uiagalelei was 12-for-30 passing for 222 yards, three interceptions, and TD passes of 9 yards to Kentron Poitier and 20 yards to Landen Thomas for Florida State (1-4, 1-3). Uiagalelei was replaced by Brock Glenn in the final minutes.

Florida State continues to struggle on the ground. The Seminoles went into play averaging 67.75 rushing yards per game, the fourth fewest among FBS teams. They gained 75 on 26 attempts, averaging 2.9 yards per carry, and were led by Lawrence Toafili with 67 yards.

SMU leads FBS with five non-offensive touchdowns this season – two interception returns, two fumble returns and one punt return.

Up next for SMU is the first of three consecutive ACC road games against Louisville on Oct. 5.

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AP) -- Kevin Jennings passed and rushed for career highs, Isaiah Nwokobia intercepted an end-zone pass with 2:23 left to seal it, and SMU overcame blowing a double-digit lead to beat No. 22 Louisville 34-27 on Saturday.

The Mustangs (5-1, 2-0 Atlantic Coast Conference) rang up another significant win as an ACC newcomer, but only after its 24-13 halftime lead dissolved into a 27-all tie entering the fourth quarter. The Cardinals (3-2, 1-1) had clawed back behind Ja'Corey Brooks' 86-yard catch-and-run touchdown and a 1-yard TD run by Donald Chaney Jr. in the third.

After missing a third-quarter field goal and punt on its first fourth-quarter drive, SMU took over at its 11 and drove for the winning score with the help of several Louisville penalties and a video review that overturned Brashard Smith's fumble that Louisville had recovered at the 5. That gave the Mustangs possession at the 13, and Louisville penalties for pass interference and offsides put the ball at the 1.

LJ Johnson took it in for the TD with 6:39 remaining.

The Cardinals got into SMU territory, but Tyler Shough was sacked for a 9-yard loss before throwing a fourth-down pass into traffic that Nwokobia came down to seal the Mustangs' third consecutive victory.

Jennings completed 21 of 27 passes for 281 yards and rushed for 113 yards. He ran for a 59-yard touchdown, Roderick Daniels Jr. scored on a 5-yard run and Preston Stone hit Key'Shawn Smith for a 10-yard TD.

SMU took off from the start and appeared in control for more than two quarters, punting just once on its first six drives while the defense pressured Louisville throughout. The Mustangs' momentum stalled after Rogers' second field goal, but they recovered to get a late score.

STANFORD, Calif. (AP) — Kevin Jennings threw three long touchdown passes in the first quarter and No. 21 SMU rolled to a 40-10 victory over Stanford on Saturday night.

The Mustangs (6-1, 3-0 Atlantic Coast Conference) started fast on the way to winning their eighth straight road game.

Jennings set the tone with an 87-yard pass to Moochie Dixon on the first play from scrimmage. He added a 45-yarder to Key'Shawn Smith later in the opening quarter and then a 38-yarder to RJ Maryland to make it 21-0 before the end of the first quarter. He finished with 322 yards passing.

Jennings has accounted for nine touchdowns with only two turnovers, while averaging 294.5 yards per game of total offense in four starts since taking over as starter following a loss to BYU on Sept. 6.

That was more than enough to put away the Cardinal (2-5, 1-3), who remain winless at home against FBS opponents in coach Troy Taylor's two seasons at the helm. Stanford has lost 11 straight home games against FBS opponents and 16 straight against ranked teams since beating No. 3 Oregon 31-24 on Oct. 2, 2021.

Elijah Brown replaced Ashton Daniels at quarterback in the first half and threw for 153 yards with an 18-yard TD to Elic Ayomanor. Brown also had two interceptions.

The Takeaway
SMU: Despite the lopsided win, there were plenty of mistakes made by the Mustangs. Roderick Daniels fumbled away two punts, with the second setting up a Cardinal field goal, and Jennings threw an INT deep in his own territory to set up a TD for Stanford.

DURHAM, N.C. — No. 22 SMU forced an incompletion on a winning two-point conversion attempt to seal a 28-27 road victory in overtime against Duke late Saturday night.

It's the fifth consecutive win for the Mustangs (7-1, 4-0 ACC), who got 117 rushing yards and two touchdowns — including the winner in overtime — from Brashard Smith. Mustangs' quarterback Kevin Jennings had 299 yards of total offense, rushing for a score and throwing for another.

The Blue Devils (6-2, 2-2) lost despite winning the turnover battle 6-0. Maalik Murphy completed 27-of-48 passes for 295 yards and three touchdowns, while Star Thomas rushed for 65 yards and a score.

The game started anew with nine minutes left to play in the fourth quarter when Duke capped off a 10-play, 64-yard yard drive with Thomas muscling his way into the end-zone for a touchdown.

Late in the fourth quarter, Jennings fumbled on a second-and-6 scramble, which was scooped up by Duke linebacker Ozzie Nicholas and returned 21 yards, putting the Blue Devils in the red zone. But Duke failed to take advantage of a possession gifted to them by SMU, and a walkoff 30-yard field goal by Todd Pelino was blocked by SMU's Isaiah Nwokobia as time expired in regulation.

In overtime, the Mustangs scored quickly on a 24-yard run from Smith, and Duke countered with a passing touchdown to Eli Pancel. When Duke went for the win, SMU's defense stepped up.

The Mustangs entered this matchup with the 11th-best scoring offense in FBS, and gashed Duke's defense for 469 yards of total offense, the most the Blue Devils have allowed this season. Still, because of its turnovers, it needed some late-game magic to remain undefeated in conference play.

SMU hosts No. 19 Pittsburgh next Saturday, while Duke travels to No. 6 Miami next week.

CHARLOTTESVILLE, VA. (AP) -- Kevin Jennings threw for a career-high 323 yards and two touchdowns and ran for another, and No. 13 SMU clinched a spot in the Atlantic Coast Conference championship game by routing Virginia 33-7 on Saturday.

Isaiah Smith and Jared Harrison-Hunte each had two sacks to help the Mustangs (10-1, 7-0, No. 13 CFP) extend their winning streak to eight. They would earn an automatic bid into the expanded College Football Playoff by beating 11th-ranked Miami or 17th-ranked Clemson in the ACC title game on Dec. 7 in Charlotte, North Carolina.

SMU had to get there first, and Jennings led the way again, bouncing back from an interception and a fumble to complete 25 of 33 passes to six different receivers, including TD tosses to Jordan Hudson and Matthew Hibner. Brashard Smith provided a little balance on offense, running for 63 yards and his 13th touchdown of the season.

SMU's defense overwhelmed UVA's offensive line, sacking Anthony Colandrea nine times and allowing the Cavaliers (5-6, 3-4) just 173 yards. Special teams contributed, too, with Roderick Daniels Jr. returning a punt 48 yards and Collin Rogers making two field goals.

UVA's defeat made Notre Dame's opponents 2-7 in their next game after facing the Fighting Irish this season. SMU is responsible for three of those losses.

For SMU -given their schedule and the ACC's lack of strength, blowing out a mediocre opponent is not likely to strengthen the Mustangs' at-large case for the playoff. But they can only beat who they play, and this was a dominant performance that showed this team isn't collapsing under pressure.

SMU hosts California next Saturday to wrap up its first regular season of ACC play. Virginia visits rival Virginia Tech next Saturday night, needing to win to become bowl eligible.

DALLAS (AP) -- Kevin Jennings threw for 225 yards and two touchdowns as ninth-ranked SMU completed a sweep of its first Atlantic Coast Conference schedule with a penalty-plagued 38-6 win over California on Saturday.

Brashard Smith had 68 yards rushing on 16 carries, 66 yards on three receptions and scored twice while SMU overcame a season-high 17 penalties for 137 yards.

The Mustangs took control with touchdowns on three consecutive drives early. They were up 21-0 on Derrick McFall's 8-yard TD run with 13:02 left in the first half, when they had 234 total yards — and only 34 more from then until the start of the fourth quarter.

The Golden Bears' first five losses were by an average margin of 3.4 points. They started 0-4 in ACC play, losing those games by a combined nine points.

Jennings scrambled away from trouble, spun, rolled left and threw on the run to hit tight end Matthew Hibner in the front left corner of the end zone for an 11-yard TD. Smith, whose 32-yard catch helped set that first touchdown, then ran 5 yards for a score. Smith had a 23-yard TD catch in the fourth quarter.

The Mustangs enjoyed an incredible first season in the ACC, the ninth team since 2011 to make the move from a Group of Five to a power conference. None of the previous eight started better than 1-1 in its conference debut, and only Louisville had finished with a winning record, going 5-3 in the ACC in 2014 after moving from the AAC.

SMU plays in the ACC championship game Dec. 7 in Charlotte, North Carolina. The Mustangs will face Clemson.

CHARLOTTE, N.C. (AP) -- Cade Klubnik threw for 262 yards and four touchdowns, Nolan Hauser kicked 56-yard field goal as time expired and the No. 18 Clemson knocked off No. 8 SMU 34-31 Saturday night in the Atlantic Coast Conference championship to earn a spot in the College Football Playoff and position itself for a first-round bye.

Hauser's field goal was the longest in ACC championship game history.

Kevin Jennings threw for 310 yards and three touchdowns and ran a score for SMU (11-1, No. 8 CFP), which had gone 8-0 in the regular season in its first year since in the ACC after moving over from American Athletic Conference.

Clemson edge rusher T.J. Parker set the tone on the game's first series with a sack-fumble and Klubnik threw three first quarter touchdown passes as the Tigers, a 2 1/2-point underdog, bolted to a 21-7 lead. Klubnik finished the first quarter 8 of 10 for 120 yards with three TDs, including scoring tosses of 45 and 35 yards to Wesco.

Clemson tacked on a field goal late in the second quarter and SMU went into the locker down 24-7, its largest deficit this season.

SMU cut the lead to 31-24 with seven minutes left after Matthew Hibner hauled in a 20-yard touchdown reception from Jennings and Collin Rogers connected on a 46-yard field goal.

The Mustangs' defense forced a third straight punt on the ensuing possession, giving Jennings and the offense the ball back at their own 21 with four minutes to play. Jennings drove the Mustangs 79 yards in 16 plays, finding Roderick Daniels with a 4-yard touchdown pass with 16 seconds left to tie the game.

The game looked to be headed to overtime, but Adam Randall's 41-yard kickoff return gave Clemson the ball at their own 45. Klubnik found Antonio Williams for a 17-yard gain at the SMU 38 with three ticks left, setting up Hauser's winning kick.

Head Coach Rhett Lashlee enters his third season in charge in 2024.

Lashlee has a career head coaching record of 29-11.

The third-year coach has been the driving force in leading the Mustangs' return to prominence in his first two years as the leader of the program, highlighted by a championship season in his second year, going 11-3 and undefeated in AAC play (8-0).

SMU's 11 wins and nine-game winning streak in 2023 were the most since the 1982 National Championship team. The Mustangs also finished out the year ranked 22nd in the AP Top 25 Poll, the first time appearing in the final poll since 1984.

Lashlee made history on Dec. 2, 2023 with a 26-14 victory over No. 22 Tulane in the AAC Championship game, giving the Mustangs their first conference championship since 1984 and 12th overall as a program. It was the first outright conference title won by the school since 1982.

The historic campaign led to a fifth straight year of being bowl eligible, the longest stretch in program history.

The success of the season has resulted in various accolades for the team and coach himself, including a record-tying 18 AAC All-Conference selections. Lashlee was also named a finalist for the prestigious Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year Award, handed out the nation's top coach as voted on by the National Sports Media Association, the Bryant Awards' Executive Leadership Team, and the Bryant Family.

The Arkansas native was also named Co-Coach of the Year by the Dave Campbell's Texas Football publication, a finalist of the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award, and a semi-finalist for Coach of the Year Award by the Maxwell Football Club.

SMU was dominant all season long in 2023 on both sides of the ball, ranking in the top 25 in the FBS in numerous categories including: third down defense (4th), defensive touchdowns (1st), fewest penalties per game (18th), first down offense (6th), passing offense (22nd), passing yards allowed (13th), passing yards per completion (12th), red zone defense (25th), red zone offense (8th), sacks allowed (13th), scoring defense (11th), scoring offense (8th), tackles for loss allowed (9th), team passing efficiency defense (9th), team sacks (3rd), team tackles for loss (16th), total defense (12th) and total offense (16th).

On offense, the 542 points ranked second highest in program history. The 29 rushing touchdowns were third most in program history. The Mustangs scored at least 55 points four times in 2023, the most in program history for a single season. Lashlee's offense also finished top five in program history in first downs (1st), passing touchdowns (5th), passing yards (5th) and total yards (tied for 1st).

Quarterback Preston Stone led the attack for Lashlee's offense, posting career highs in passing yards (3,197) and passing touchdowns (28). Stone's 161.3 passing efficiency rating led all quarterbacks in the AAC. For his great play, Stone earned All-AAC Third Team honors in his first year starting under Lashlee.

Defensively, the Mustangs were one of the elite teams in the country. The 47 sacks rank second in program history for a single year. SMU took it to the conference opposition this past season, posting an average margin of victory of 28.9 points (45.9-17.0) in conference games on the year, the largest margin for any FBS team in conference play in 2023. SMU also finished first in all of FBS in defensive touchdowns with five. The Mustangs' two shutouts during the regular season were the most by the team since 2012.

Lashlee completed his first season (2022) as head coach on the Hilltop with a 7-5 regular season record, and an appearance in the New Mexico Bowl against BYU. Under his leadership, the Mustangs ranked 14th in the nation in total offense, 12th in scoring offense, and seventh in both red zone offense and passing offense. Furthermore, the Mustangs were among the best-disciplined teams in the nation, committing the 11th fewest penalties across FBS teams.

The appearance in the New Mexico Bowl made the Mustangs bowl eligible for the fourth straight season. The streak is the longest since SMU went to four bowls from 2009-12 and made the Mustangs bowl eligible in five of the past six seasons. The program has won at least seven games each season dating back to 2019, making it the longest stretch with at least seven wins since the 2009-12 seasons. It was also the first season the Mustangs have won five conference games since going 6-2 in league play in 2019.

Rashee Rice was named a second-team All-American by multiple organizations, Collin Rogers and RJ Maryland were among freshman All-America mentions and four Mustangs earned All-American Athletic Conference honors led by first-team selection Rice.

Lashlee, who served as offensive coordinator for the Mustangs for two seasons (2018-19), also served as the offensive coordinator at Miami in 2020 and 2021. A one-time finalist (2013) and two-time semifinalist (2019, 2020) for the Broyles Award, Lashlee has the distinction of being the only coach ever nominated for the Broyles Award four different times at four different schools (Arkansas State, Auburn, SMU, Miami).

During his time at Miami, Lashlee's first season saw the Hurricanes jump to No. 32 in the FBS in total offense (from No. 98), No. 29 in passing offense (from No. 52), No. 26 in scoring offense (from No. 90), No. 17 in red zone offense (from No. 122) and No. 20 in first downs gained (from No. 84). In 2021, Miami again ranked 26th in scoring average, improving to 34.1 PPG, and jumped up to 22nd in total offense at 448.8 yards per game.

Under his watch, QB D'Eriq King was a semifinalist for the Maxwell Award, Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award and Davey O'Brien Award. Several offensive players enjoyed career years under his tutelage, including Michael Harley, who became the school's all-time leading wide receiver, and TE Brevin Jordan, who was a Mackey Award semifinalist and an eventual 2021 NFL Draft pick of the Houston Texans. In 2021, freshman Tyler Van Dyke was named the ACC Rookie of the Year, and

Charleston Rambo broke the Miami single-season receiving yards and receptions record.

Prior to heading to Coral Gables, Lashlee helped lead the Mustangs to a 10-3 finish in 2019, guiding an offense that ranked No. 7 in FBS in scoring (41.8 points per game), No. 13 in passing offense (309 yards per game), No. 9 in total offense (489.8 yards per game) and No. 12 in first downs gained (322). SMU's 10 wins were the school's most since the 1984 season, and its 35 rushing touchdowns set a school record.

The Mustangs were ranked No. 3 nationally in plays per game, averaging 80.9 – a testament to Lashlee's up-tempo offensive style. SMU was one of only 34 teams in FBS to average more than six yards per play in 2019. Quarterback Shane Buechele threw for 3,929 yards with 34 touchdowns and just 10 interceptions, completing 63 percent of his passes. Running back Xavier Jones rushed for 1,276 yards and 23 touchdowns, averaging 5.2 yards per carry. His 23 TDs led the nation. James Proche led the nation with 111 catches. All three were first-team All-AAC selections.

In his first season at SMU, the Mustang offense ranked 27th nationally in passing offense at 271.7 yards per game. Quarterback Ben Hicks registered 2,582 yards and 19 touchdowns to finish his SMU career as the all-time leader in passing yards (9,081), total offense (8,977), TD passes (71), TDs responsible for (74), completions (718) and 300-yard games (12). His season passing yards ranked 11th at SMU, while his 19 touchdowns tied him for eighth. Wide receiver Proche was named a first-team All-AAC selection, and finished the season ranked fifth nationally in receptions per game (7.8), seventh in receiving touchdowns (12) and ninth in receiving yards (1,199).

Prior to joining SMU's staff, Lashlee served as an offensive coordinator for seven seasons, spending 2017 at UConn, 2013-16 at Auburn, 2012 at Arkansas State and 2011 at Samford.

In his only season in Storrs, Lashlee improved the Huskies' offense significantly, as UConn jumped from 122nd to 49th in the nation in total offense and from 94th to 34th in passing offense.

Prior to UConn, Lashlee helped Auburn to the 2013 SEC Championship, a BCS Championship berth and the 2016 Sugar Bowl, managing one of the more prolific offenses in college football during his tenure. The 2013-14 seasons were the best back-to-back offensively in Auburn history, and the 2014 squad set an Auburn record for total offense. Lashlee also served as the quarterbacks coach and demonstrated impressive ability to develop talent. In 2013, Auburn had the second biggest turnaround in college football history. Starting QB Nick Marshall did not practice until August, but Lashlee tutored the junior college transfer to 3,044 yards of total offense (1,976 passing, 1,068 rushing), 14 TD passes and 12 rushing TDs.

Lashlee was the offensive coordinator at Arkansas State (2012), helping the Red Wolves to a Sun Belt Championship and quarterback Ryan Aplin to Conference Player of the Year honors, and at Samford (2011), after having served as a graduate assistant at Auburn (2009-10) and Arkansas (2006). While at Auburn as an offensive graduate assistant during the 2009-10 seasons, Lashlee assisted Gus Malzahn with all aspects of the offense and coached the quarterbacks and slot receivers in 2010. In 2009, the Tigers finished 8-5 winning the Outback Bowl. During the 2010 season, he helped the Tigers finish 14-0, winning the SEC title and the BCS National Championship behind Heisman Trophy winning quarterback Cam Newton. Lashlee coached at Springdale (Ark.) High School in 2004-05, working with the quarterbacks and 2005 National Player of the Year Mitch Mustain.

Lashlee graduated from Arkansas in 2006 with a degree in marketing and business administration. He received his master's degree in higher education from Auburn in 2009.

He is married to the former Lauren Lee. They have twin sons, Thomas and Hudson, and twin daughters, Rowyn and Scarlet.
