WHAT TO KNOW

THE MEET: SMU is set to host its annual SMU Classic on Oct. 10-11 at 3 p.m. and 10 a.m., welcoming four teams, No. 20 Auburn, No. 12 Louisville, No. 14 LSU and Drury. Both the Cardinals and the Auburn Tigers competed at the SMU Classic last season, finishing second and fourth, respectively. Last SMU Classic, **Luke Sitz** walked away with wins and NCAA Zone Cuts on both 3-meter and 1-meter. Last time out, SMU claimed a commanding win over Oklahoma Christian (194-74) and Incarnate Word (186-83), earning victories in 15 events.

NCAA ZONE CUTS: In the season opener against Oklahoma Christian and Incarnate Word, the Mustang divers got to work, claiming four NCAA Zone Cuts. On 1-meter, sophomore Luke Sitz (370.25) and freshmen RJ Snyder (313.35) and Grant Cates (331.25) all scored well enough to qualify for the NCAA Zone Diving Championships. On 3-meter, the reigning ACC Diver of the Week RJ Snyder also nabbed an NCAA Zone Cut, scoring a 326.00. All three Mustangs have punched their ticket to compete at the NCAA Zone Diving Championships on March 9-11 in College Station, Texas.

FRESH INK IN THE RECORD BOOK: In the 2024-25 season, six records in the SMU record book were shattered. Individually, junior **Jack Berube** broke two records, recording a 45.74 in the 100 backstroke and a 1:40.37 in the 200 backstroke. Berube was also a member of the record-breaking 400 medley relay, also consisting of Lance Butler, Russell Exum and returner **Ward Lockhart**. Lockhart put himself in the SMU history books with two other relays, 200 freestyle (1:16.74) and the 800 freestyle (6:14.24). Other record-breaking relay returners are captains **Sage Sungail** and **Jack Forrest**. Also a captain, the last record breaker is sophomore **Luke Sitz**, who earned a spot in SMU history with a 436.65 on 3-meter.

THE NOTABLES

TOP OF THE CHARTS

Currently, the Mustangs have five times in this season's NCAA top-10 times list: Team of Brennan/Chateigner/Sungail/Likins (4th, 400 Free Relay, 2:54.86), Andy Baklanov (5th, 200 Back, 1:44.44), Jack Berube (6th, 200 Back, 1:44.51), Francis Brennan (8th, 200 Free, 1:35.74), Jack Forrest (9th, 1000 Free, 9:13.62).

RETURNING TO THE HILLTOP

 SMU returns seventeen athletes from the 2024-25 roster, consisting of six sophomores, six juniors and five seniors. Leading this year's team are SMU's three captains: Sage Sungail, Jack Forrest and Luke Sitz.

HIGH-LEVEL DIVING IN DALLAS

- Sophomore diver Luke Sitz made an immediate impact as a freshman at SMU. Finishing seventh at the NCAA finals on 1-meter, Sitz became the first SMU diver to earn First Team All-America honors on that event since Ali Al-Hasan in 1997.
- He earned six ACC Diver of the Week honors, breaking a conference record.
 The Texas native nabbed a silver medal on 3-meter and a bronze on 1-meter at his first-ever ACC Championships.

A LOOK BACK AT THE MUSTANGS' FIRST ACC SEASON

- The Mustangs were successful during the 2024-25 campaign, and the program looks to build off that success in 2025-26.
- At the ACC Championships, Luke Sitz made SMU history by becoming the first member of the program to medal at the ACC Championships on his first try. The freshman posted a score of 420.50 to earn silver, just 1.4 points shy of the gold.
- Also at the ACC Championships, the 800 free relay team of Jack Hoagland, Jack Forrest, Chris Mykkanen and Ward Lockhart threw down an NCAA 'A' cut of 6:15.42.
- The Mustangs registered a new 200 free relay school record on day two of the ACC Championships, with Lance Butler, Sage Sungail, Ward Lockhart and Joe Rusnock recording a 1:16.74 and finishing eighth.

NEW YEAR, NEW MUSTANGS

- The Mustangs added 10 freshmen swimmers to its roster for the 2025-26 roster.
- The newcomers hail from eight different states and two different countries.
- Eight of the freshmen will compete in swimming events while two will dive.

NEW EXPERIENCE COMING TO THE 214

- SMU welcomes two transfers this season, sophomore Ben Chateigner and junior Leo Pelaez, both boasting experience at power-conference institutions.
- Chateigner spent his freshman campaign at Auburn, where he earn an NCAA
 B cut in the 200 free (1:34.37). The French native nabbed three regular
 season podium finishes as well as scored two points for his team at the SEC
 Championships.
- Hailing from Indiana University, Pelaez competed at the 2025 US National Championships where he earned a C finals spot in the 400 free (3:55.99), placing fourth in the heat.

ACC ACTION

- The 2025-26 campaign will mark SMU's second season in the ACC.
- The regular season will culminate with the ACC Championships on Feb. 15-21 in Atlanta, Ga. On Feb. 15-17, the diving events will occur while Feb 17-21 will feature the swimming events.
- Nine ACC teams finished in the top 25 in the nation, making the ACC one of the strongest swimming and diving conferences in the country.

HEAD SWIMMING COACH SMU, 1984 SEVENTH SEASON

Former SMU head coach and All-American Greg Rhodenbaugh returned to the Hilltop to lead the men's swimming program, and enters his seventh season (2025-26) with the Mustangs.

In 2024-25, the Mustangs embarked on their first season as a member of the ACC. During the season, SMU worked on rewriting the record books, posting 33 new Top-10 times along with new school records in the 100 & 200 back and the 200 free relay, 800 free relay, 200 medley relay and 400 medley relay. The Mustangs also reached NCAA standards in four different relays, competing in three at the NCAA Championships.

The accomplishments weren't just limited to the pool, as 16 Mustangs landed on the All-ACC Academic Team following the season. In addition, four different SMU swimmers earned CSC Academic All-District honors, while Eric Stelmar picked up CSC Third Team Academic All-America accolades.

The 2023-24 season saw the Mustangs win their fourth straight conference championship, this time in the ASUN. SMU won in commanding style, winning 17 events while setting nine new championship record times. Jack Hoagland earned ASUN Most Outstanding Swimmer of the Championship, while Kristaps Mikelsons earned Most Outstanding Freshman Performer. Rhodenbaugh also earned ASUN Swimming Coach of the Year honors, his fourth consecutive season receiving conference coach of the year accolades.

At 2024 NCAA's, SMU earned its best finish since 2008, placing 18th at the Championships. Chris Mykkanen, Jack Forrest and Hoagland all picked up All-America accolades during the event. Following the season, five Mustangs were also named to CSCAA Academic All-American Teams.

In 2023, SMU won its third consecutive American Athletic Conference Championship, defeating Cincinnati 1267-1134. This was the Mustangs third overall AAC title and 44th conference championship in program history. They have won 19 titles since 1997. Rhodenbaugh was named the AAC Swimming Coach of the Year for the third consecutive season.

The Mustangs sent one swimmer and one diver to the 2023 NCAA Championships. Fourteen different Mustangs earned NCAA B Cuts during the season. In the classroom, SMU earned CSCAA Scholar All-America Team honors and four student-athletes earned CSC All-District honors.

For the second straight year, Rhodenbaugh led the Mustangs to an American Athletic Conference Championship in 2022. Eighteen SMU swimmers combined to make 41 individual NCAA B cuts throughout the season. Three swimmers were invited and competed in the NCAA Championships, and Rhodenbaugh was named American Athletic Conference Coach of the Year. SMU notched 34 new times in the all-time school top 10 lists, including two relays.

Rhodenbaugh returned SMU to the top of the conference for the first time since 2013, winning the 2021 American Athletic Conference Championships, and sent a swimmer to the NCAA Championships for the first time since 2017. Ten swimmers posted 19 total NCAA B cuts and a total of 16 times were added to SMU's all-time top 10 lists during the season. At the AAC Championships, four swimmers won seven total conference championships and four of five relays took home top honors.

Connor Dalbo, Colin Feehery, Caleb Rhodenbaugh and Brayden Rudd all posted U.S. Olympic Trials cuts, while Justin Baker posted a Canadian Trials cut.

During the 2019-20 season, the Mustangs produced 14 individual NCAA B cuts, and eight individuals posted 14 times on SMU's all-time top 10 performer lists. Two swimmers, Caleb Rhodenbaugh (100 breast, 200 breast) and Colin Feehery (400 IM), won conference championships, while three individual swimmers and four relays earned eight total all-conference honors.

In the classroom SMU earned CSCAA Scholar All-America Team honors and seven swimmers were named to the SMU honor roll.

Rhodenbaugh perviously served as head coach during the 1988-89 season after serving as an assistant and swam for the Mustangs from 1980-84. As a coach, he led the Mustangs to a runner-up finish at the 1989 Southwest Conference Championships, earning Co-Coach of the Year honors, and guided SMU to a 14th-place finish at the NCAA Championships.

Before coming to the Hilltop, Rhodenbaugh served as head coach at Missouri, a position he took over in May of 2010. During his time at Mizzou, Rhodenbaugh drastically increased the Tigers' presence on the National stage. Overall, Rhodenbaugh's tenure with the Tigers saw 23 women earn 124 All-America honors, while 23 men picked up 103. As a team, the men posted the top six NCAA finishes in school history, while the women made it seven.

In just his second season, he led the Mizzou men to a 19th-place finish at the 2012 NCAA Championships, its highest ever, an improved to 14th in 2013. That season, the Tigers produced their first NCAA individual All-American since 1979 and their first All-American relay in program history.

In 2014, the men posted a program-record 95 points at the National event, garnering four First-Team All-America honors, while the women picked up their first individual All-America honor for a freshman since 1978.

Success continued for both programs during the 2014-15 season, with record setting performances at the NCAA Championships. Both teams turned in top-15 finishes, with the men coming in 11th and the women 14th. The men posted five top-seven finishes, while earning six individual and four relay All-America nods. For the first time in school history, two of the women's relays earned All-America honors, including a program record in the 400 medley relay.

Rhodenbaugh guided Mizzou's first individual National Champion in program history, Fabian Schwingenschlogl, to victory in the 100-yard breaststroke at the 2016 Championships. In total, six men and women earned All-America accolades helping the men to an eighth-place finish and the women to 11th that year.

The teams held steady the next season as the men finished within the country's top 10 again at ninth, and the women were 13th. The 2018 Championships saw the Mizzou women finish 15th, earning five total individual All-America honors as well as three relay accolades.

Prior to his time at Mizzou, Rhodenbaugh served as an assistant at Arizona under Frank Busch, helping both the men and women to 2008 NCAA National Championships.

Rhodenbaugh has also served as a member of both the U.S. Swimming National Team and U.S. National Junior Team staffs. He mentored two-time Olympic Gold Medalist Amanda Beard, as well as Mustang medalists Ryan Berube, Ricardo Prado and Lars Frolander.

During his time at SMU as a student-athlete, Rhodenbaugh earned All-America honors in the 100-yard breaststroke (1983, 1984), 200-yard breaststroke (1983) and as part of the 800-yard freestyle relay (1983, 1984). SMU earned four top-10 NCAA finishes, including runner-up honors in 1983.

In addition to his collegiate swimming success, Rhodenbaugh won the 200-meter breaststroke at the 1982 U.S. National Sports Festival and was a member of the U.S. team at the 1983 World University Games in Canada.

Rhodenbaugh and wife Lisa, also a graduate of SMU, have eight children.



DARIAN SCHMIDT

HEAD DIVING COACH INDIANA, 2015 NINTH SEASON REPORTS CHMI

Former NCAA All-American and Big Ten Diver of the Year Darian Schmidt is in his ninth season (2025-26) as the Mustangs' head diving coach.

In each of his seven seasons at SMU, Schmidt has earned Men's Diving Coach of the Year honors in the American Athletic Conference and Atlantic Sun Conference, as well as the women's Coach of the Year in 2021. He has guided Luke Sitz (2024, 1-meter), Parker Hardigree (1 meter, 2022), Peter Smithson (Platform & 3 meter, 2020), Bryce Klein (3 meter, 2018) and Johanna Holloway (Platform, 2020) to All-America honors, and also led Smithson (2023, 2022, 2021, 2020), Hardigree (2019), Klein (2018), Nicole Stambo (2022) and Holloway (2021) to AAC Diver of the Year awards. Smithson and Hardigree were also named Freshman of the Year.

The 2024-25 season was highlighted by Schmidt's development of standout freshman Luke Sitz. During the regular season, Sitz earned podium finishes in every event he competed in. He also won six ACC Diver of the Week accolades, the most by a single diver in a single season in the history of the award.

Sitz's accomplishments would continue into the postseason, as he earned two medals during the ACC Championships. He opened it up on 3-meter, earning silver to become the first member of the program to earn an ACC medal. The success would continue on 1-meter, with Sitz earning Bronze to earn the second medal of his career.

The Prosper native would later punch his ticket to the NCAA Championships on 1-meter and 3-meter and placed seventh on 1-meter to earn First Team All-America honors. He became the first Mustang diver to earn First Team All-America accolades since Phillips Griffin did so on 3-meter in 2006 and the first on 1-meter since Ali Al-Hasan in 1997.

The seventh-year coach helped the duo of Tyler Coffey and John Dymond secure conference championships in both the 1-meter (Coffey) and 3-meter (Dymond) in 2024. Dymond went on the qualify for NCAA Zone Diving in Houston.

Schmidt help lead Hardigree to All-America honors in 2022, marking the first time a Mustang has achieved the honor through competition, 2020 accolades were based on qualification due to COVID-19 pandemics cancelation of the Championships, since Klein in 2018.

RORIC FINK

ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH WHITWORTH COLLEGE, 1986 SECOND SEASON

In his first season back on the Hilltop in 2024-25, the Mustangs embarked on their first season as a member of the ACC. During the season, SMU worked on rewriting the record books, posting 33 new Top-10 times along with new school records in the 100 & 200 back and the 200 free relay, 800 free relay, 200 medley relay and 400 medley relay. The Mustangs also reached NCAA standards in four different relays, competing in three at the NCAA Championships.

The accomplishments weren't just limited to the pool, as 16 Mustangs landed on the All-ACC Academic Team following the season. In addition, four different SMU swimmers earned CSC Academic All-District honors, while Eric Stelmar picked up CSC Third Team Academic All-America accolades.

Prior to rejoining the Mustangs, Fink spent two seasons at Arizona as an assistant and associate head coach. This was his second stint with the program, previously serving in the same role from 2003-10.

Fink has spent time on the Hilltop before, helping out as a volunteer assistant back in 2022.

The 1986 graduate of Whitworth College served as an associate head coach at Texas for eight years from 2012-20 and prior to that he held the same role at Missouri for two seasons.

He also boasts extensive and impressive club coaching experience, having built one of the nation's top aquatics clubs, Ford Aquatics, while in Tucson. While there, he steered the development of Lacey Nymeyer, Dave Rollins, Tyler DeBerry, and Marcus Titus, all of whom went on to win NCAA National Championships with Arizona.

In 2020, Smithson became the first Mustang to earn automatic bids to the NCAA Championships in multiple events since 2015, when Devin Burnett did so on 1 meter and platform. In 2023, Smithson also became the first Mustang diver to qualify for the NCAA Championships all four years since Bryce Dumais (2000-2003). On the women's side, Holloway became the first diver to qualify for the NCAA Championships since Audra Egenolf in 2010.

In 2021, Smithson automatically qualified in all three diving events and became the first men's diver to qualify for multiple NCAA Championships since Klein (2016 & 2018), and the first to earn back-to-back bids since Burnett (2012-13). It was also the first time a duo (Smithson, Hardigree) qualified for the Mustangs on the diving side since Philip Griffin and Brice Dumais did so in 2003.

Five Mustangs have won 20 conference championships including a sweep of men's events in 2021 and 2022. In 2019, the Mustangs qualified multiple divers for the NCAA Zone Championships on the women's side for the first time since 2010. Overall, Schmidt has helped Mustang divers to 63 all-conference honors.

Schmidt came to the Hilltop after a season at AAC member East Carolina, where he coached four Pirates to the NCAA Zone B Championships, one school record, 11 AAC Finals appearances and 11 career-best performances. On the men's side, ECU won the AAC title.

During the 2014-15 season, Schmidt served as a student assistant coach at Indiana, and from 2009-16 he served on the staff at the TriSynerG Dive Camp with three-time Olympic coach Jeff Huber and 2012 U.S. Olympic head coach Drew Johansen.

As a student-athlete at Indiana, Schmidt was a four-time All-American and four-time Big Ten Champion. In 2013 and 2014, he was named the conference Diver of the Year, while earning Big Ten Diver of the Championships honors in 2012, 2013 and 2014. A member of the U.S. National Diving Team from 2013-16, Schmidt was selected for the Olympic Performance Squad from 2014-16, was a member of the 2015 World Championship team and was a five-time member of the Grand Prix team.

A native of Bloomington, Indiana, Schmidt earned his bachelor's degree in liberal studies from Indiana in 2015.



CALEB RHODENBAUGH

ASSISTANT COACH SMU, 2021 & 2023 FIRST SEASON

Former SMU standout swimmer Caleb Rhodenbaugh has joined the SMU staff as an assistant coach in July of 2024.

During Rhodenbaugh's first season as an assistant coach in 2024-25, the Mustangs embarked on their first season as a member of the ACC. During the season, SMU worked on rewriting the record books, posting 33 new Top-10 times along with new school records in the 100 & 200 back and the 200 free relay, 800 free relay, 200 medley relay and 400 medley relay. The Mustangs also reached NCAA standards in four different relays, competing in three at the NCAA Championships.

The accomplishments weren't just limited to the pool, as 16 Mustangs landed on the All-ACC Academic Team following the season. In addition, four different SMU swimmers earned CSC Academic All-District honors, while Eric Stelmar picked up CSC Third Team Academic All-America accolades.

Rhodenbaugh rejoined the Mustangs after spending two seasons as an assistant coach at Drury, helping the men's program to back-to-back NCAA-II runner-up finishes and a Great Lakes Conference Championship for both the men and the women in 2023. In addition, he assisted in the coaching multiple national champions on both the men's and women's side.

During his time as a swimmer with the Mustangs, he set program records in the 100 and 200 breast and won eight AAC Championships, Rhodenbaugh was a three-time NCAA Championships qualifier, named all-conference in 11 events and was the 2022 Most Outstanding Swimmer in the AAC. He also posted a US Olympic Trial cut in 2021.

His senior year he won Most Valuable Male Student Athlete for SMU Athletics at the Pony Awards.

Rhodenbaugh is the son of men's swimming & diving head coach, Greg Rhodenbaugh.

The Robson & Lindley Aquatics Center and Barr-McMillion Natatorium is the 42,000 square foot home to SMU's internationally-recognized men's and women's swimming and diving teams.

The Aquatics Center features an Olympic-sized, eight-lane indoor pool with a platform diving area, including four springboards and a 10-meter tower for training and competition. Coaches' offices, men's, women's and visitor locker rooms and a classroom and meeting area are located adjacent to the pool. Spectator seating for 800 is on the mezzanine level.





To further cement this facility as one of the finest in college athletics, SMU is building an adjacent outdoor pool to further enhance this space. Project design includes an eight-lane, 50-meter by 25-yard outdoor pool, 1- and 3-meter diving boards and a 20-foot by 40-foot instructional pool that will be used for lessons and rehab/therapy. With the addition of the outdoor pool to the Robson & Lindley Aquatic Center, SMU will be the only University in the country with both an indoor and outdoor, 8-lane, 50-meter pool in one facility.

SMU broke ground on the Holt Hickman Outdoor Pool April 7, 2022.
