MEDIA GUIDE



The SMU men's golf program got its start in 1927 in the Southwest Conference. The team has a national championship to its name in 1954, 23 NCAA Championship appearances and 10 conference titles. SMU golfers have won three US Amateur titles, one NCAA Individual national title, and 15 individual conference top showings.

SMU won its first conference title in 1931 with leadership of head coach Dr. J.S. McIntosh. O'Hora Watts (1931 and 1932) and Rufus King (1938 and 1939) would become the program's first two time individual conference champions. The Mustangs advanced to its first NCAA Championship in 1951 where they would finish in 11th.

In 1954 after coming in second in the Southwest Conference, the Mustangs advanced to the NCAA Championship for the second time behind head coach Graham Ross. With the championship taking place in Houston, the Mustangs got off to a strong start in the then three-round tournament. With names such as Floyd Addington, Stewart Carrell, Tom Towry and Bryan Honts, the Mustangs found themselves in front of North Texas State by one stroke at the end of three days securing a national championship for the program.

SMU men's golf would continue its strong stretch each of the next four seasons. They placed in the top 10 nationally each year with the best finish being a sixth place showing in 1957. They would add conference titles in 1955 and 1956. Jerry Pittman would be the program's first All-American in 1958.

After missing out on the championship for the next several years, the Mustangs would return to the NCAA Championship in 1972 with an eighth place finish. They added a 10th place finish the next season and 17th in 1975 and 17th again in 1977 with Payne Stewart on the team.

The program was cut from the SMU Athletics roster for three seasons only to be revived in in 1984. The Mustangs would return to the top of the Southwest Conference in 1988 and make their first trip back to the NCAA Championship. With the onset of the NCAA Regional period, the Mustangs would advance past the regional in 1991, 1994 and 1996 with the best finish coming with a 12th-place in 1996. The team would place second in the final Southwest Conference Championship.

The team joined the WAC in 1997 and returned to the NCAA Championship in 2001. The team made three straight trips to the NCAA Championship in 2003-05. They won back-to-back WAC titles in 2004 and 2005, the Mustangs final two years in the conference.

After winning the WAC Individual title in 2005, Will Dodson repeated in a new conference, Conference USA in 2005. The team also won a conference title that year. After eight seasons in the CUSA, the Mustangs joined the AAC in 2014 and had their best season in 60 years. They won a conference title in that first season, advanced past the NCAA Regional and made the final eight match play portion of the NCAA Championship for the first time since it was instituted. They returned in 2015 and finished in 14th with Bryson DeChambeau winning an individual National Championship. SMU made it back to the NCAA Championship in 2019 where they again reached the match play quarterfinals. The Mustangs made another showing in 2021 and won a conference title in 2022. They would return to the NCAA Championship in 2024. SMU set sail for a new conference, the ACC, in 2025.

Over the years, the program has produced 15 PGA Tour players including three with multiple wins. DeWitt Weaver won two PGA Tour titles in the early 70's. Payne Stewart joined the tour in 1979 and won 11 times. He reached the pinnacle with a PGA Championship in 1989 and a U.S. Open in 1991. He would win his second US Open in 1999 just a few months before his tragic passing. Bryson Dechambeau would continue Stewarts success on the tour with nine titles. He won US Opens in 2020 and 2024.

With five major championships by SMU golfers, countless NCAA Championship appearances, the Mustangs have built a legacy of golf excellence in Dallas. Now lead by head coach Chris Parra, the Mustangs embrace new challenges ahead in the ACC.

HEAD COACH SMU (1999) SEVENTH SEASON

Jerry Pittman Head Men's Golf Coach Chris Parra enters his seventh season (2024-25) at the helm of the SMU men's golf program and his 10th overall season on the coaching staff. Parra was named full-time head coach on April 16, 2020, after serving the 2019-20 season as interim head coach.

Last season, Parra guided the Mustangs to two tournament victories at the Vaqueros Intercollegiate and the Hal Williams Collegiate. The team advanced out of the stroke play portion of the ACC Championship in their first year in the conference. The Mustangs captured three individual crowns (Will Sides-Stephens Cup, Zach Kingsland-Trinity Forest Invitation & Hal Williams).

In 2023-24, Parra and the Mustangs returned to the NCAA Championship for the first time since 2022. They finsihed in 26th at the Championship. SMU recorded a tied for fourth place finish at the NCAA Regional and finished in second at the AAC Championship. The team had a scoring average of 283.90, good for -1.03 below par on average.

Parra led the Mustangs to a third place finish at the AAC Championship in the most recent season. During the 2022-23 campaign, the Mustangs won two individual titles. The previous season, Parra was named American Athletic Conference Head Coach of the Year for the 2021-22 season after leading the Mustangs to their second AAC title since joining the league in 2013, and 10th title in program history behind a 54-hole tournament-record performance at Southern Hills Golf Club (282-277-276, -29).

In his first two seasons as head coach, Parra led the Mustangs to their two best finishes (No. 12 in 2019-20, No. 18 in 2020-21) in the Golfstat rankings since the organization began ranking teams in 1993-94. The Mustangs have won three of 13 tournaments since he took over the reins of the program, and produced five individual tournament champions in that timespan.

Parra's time at SMU has been highlighted by success in NCAA postseason play, including leading the Mustangs to the 2021 NCAA Championships in his first opportunity as head coach. As an assistant in 2015, he saw Bryson DeChambeau win the program's first individual NCAA Championship, and helped the Mustangs reach the 2019 NCAA Quarterfinals after a memorable playoff win against Clemson for the eighth and final spot. In addition, the Mustangs won the 2015 Noblesville (Ind.) Regional and Noah Goodwin claimed medalist honors at the 2021 Stillwater (Okla.) Regional, Parra's first NCAA Regional as head coach.

Since arriving on campus in 2014, Parra has coached 11 All-American Athletic Conference selections (three as head coach), 10 all-region selections, three AAC Golfers of the Year (DeChambeau, 2015; Mac Meissner, 2019; Noah Goodwin, 2021), seven All-Americans, and been a part of 11 tournament wins. Eight of his players have gone on to play professionally, including three who won professional tournaments in 2021; DeChambeau (eight-time PGA Tour Winner), Austin Smotherman (Korn Ferry Tour tournament winner) and Meissner (Forme Tour tournament winner).

In addition to success on the course, the Mustangs have been successful in their courses during Parra's tenure. The Mustangs have earned an Outstanding Team Academic Award five times in Parra's eight school years, including both seasons that Parra has been in charge of the program. In addition, 19 Mustangs have been named All-America Scholars by the GCAA, with 13 of those selections coming since Parra was named head coach.

In 2019, the Mustangs won his first two events as acting head coach, making him just the 11th men's golf coach in NCAA history to win multiple events in his first season as head coach, and the first to win his first two tournaments as head coach since Mississippi State's Nick Goetze in 1998. The Mustangs would rise all the way to No. 2 in the Golfstat rankings and sat at No. 12 at the time of the season's cancellation due to COVID-19. The following season, Parra led the Mustangs to a NCAA Championships bid and a national finish of T-17th, after spending the entire season in Golfstat's top 25.

The Irving, Texas, native played for the Mustangs from 1996-98, earning a tournament win in 1997 at the UTSA Invitational. Parra had a 75.94 stroke average in six collegiate events, turning pro in 1999.

Parra competed professionally for 14 years (1999-2014), spending most of his career on what is now known as the Korn Ferry Tour. He played in 36 events on the PGA Tour's developmental circuit, earning one top-10 finish and four top-25 finishes. His best finish came in 2010, where he finished tied for seventh at the Fort Smith Classic. In 2006, Parra made his first PGA Tour appearance in the Byron Nelson Championship, where he made the cut and finished 72nd overall. Later in his professional career, he played in the LatinoAm and the PGA Canada Tour. At the 2013 U.S. Open Local Sectional Qualifying, Parra carded a 70 to tie for second.



CORY DONNELL

ASSISTANT COACH **ABILENE CHRISTIAN (2019)** SECOND SEASON

SMU men's golf added Cory Donnell to its staff as assistant coach (2024-25). He enters his second season with the team in 2025-26.

In his lone year on the Hilltop, DOnnell helped the Mustangs to two tournament victories at the Vagueros Intercollegiate and the Hal Williams Collegiate. The team advanced out of the stroke play portion of the ACC Championship in their first year in the conference. The Mustangs captured three individual crowns (Will Sides-Stephens Cup, Zach Kingsland-Trinity Forest Invitation & Hal Williams).

Donnell spent the previous season at Baylor. With Donnell on staf at Baylorf, the Bears reached the NCAA Championship in 2024 advancing past the 54-hole cut. The 14th-place national showing was the Bears' third best all-time finish. They won a team title at the Aggie Invitational and finished in fourth at the Big 12 Championship, their best performance in 21 seasons.

Prior to Baylor, Donnell spent two seasons as assistant coach at Charleston Southern. In 2022-23, The Buccaneers won a team title at the VCU Shootout and finished one stroke shy of a conference championship. In 2021, after winning a conference title, the Bucs earned a bid to the 2021 Palm Beach NCAA Regional the program's first NCAA appearance since 2015.

Prior to joining the collegiate coaching rankings, Donnell spent two seasons as an assistant pro at Firewheel Golf Park in Garland, his hometown.

Donnell competed at Abilene Christian where he saw action in five tournaments over the course of two seasons. While at ACU, Donnell earned a Bachelor of Science in 2019.

Prior to ACU, Donnell spent two years at McLennan Community College from 2014-16. He was an All-American both seasons.

Donnell is married to Lydia Donnell who he met playing golf at McLennan

2015 Individual Champion - Bryson DeChambeau

BRADENTON, Fla (SMU) - Junior Bryson DeChambeau became the first NCAA Individual Champion in the history of the SMU men's golf program, winning by one stroke at 8-under after carding a 1-under 71 at the Concession Golf Club.

DeChambeau received both his national championship trophy and the Arnold Palmer Award for being the individual medalist at the NCAA Championship. The win is the third of his college career and second this season.

"It's been unbelievable; it's such an honor to win both of these awards." DeChambeau said. "I could have never imagined this in a million years growing up. It was my dream growing up to win a big event, and for amateur golf this is a major. I'm honored to win, and I'm looking forward to being back next year."

SMU started the final round on the back nine, and DeChambeau had an eventful first half of his day. He bogeyed holes 11 and 13, with an eagle on the par-4 12th hole in between. DeChambeau reached the 12th green in one shot, rolling his drive close to the cup on the 349-yard hole. DeChambeau then double-bogeyed the tricky 18th hole after hitting into the water on the right side of the fairway on his approach shot. The Clovis, California, native rebounded strongly on the front nine, shooting 3-under with no bogeys over the final stretch. DeChambeau moved to 8-under with a birdie on the par-4 eighth hole, sticking his approach shot to within four feet of the pin.

DeChambeau held off a number of challengers all day long, notably Washington's Cheng-Tsung Pan, who needed a birdie on his 18th hole to tie DeChambeau and force a playoff. Pan's approach shot landed in the bunker on the front-right of the green. Pan's birdie attempt from the bunker wound up going past the right lip of the cup.



October 25 marks the anniversary of the tragic passing of one of SMU's most prominent athletes and one of golf's most charismatic figures, Payne Stewart.

Stewart, an 11-time PGA Tour winner and three-time Major Champion, left an impact on the world of golf and the Mustangs' golf program.


After playing at Southern Methodist University (SMU) and earning his degree, the Missouri-native turned professional late in 1979, but failed to earn a PGA Tour card. So, instead, he competed on the Asian Tour, winning twice. In 1982, Stewart earned his PGA Tour card, where he went on to claim his first-of-11 PGA Tour titles, the 1982 Quad Cities Open.

Stewart would total 11 PGA Tour wins in his career, and won his first major at the 1989 PGA Championship. In 1991, Stewart claimed his first U.S. Open, before going on to win his second in 1999, dramatically sinking a 15-foot putt to beat Phil Mickelson by one stroke.

Payne went on to become one of the most unforgettable figures in golf, striding the fairways in signature plus-fours and a tam-o'-shanter cap, while displaying a graceful, fluid golf swing and intensity.

He was posthumously inducted into the World Golf Hall of Fame in 2001, before being inducted into the 2015 PGA of America Hall of Fame.

In 2000, the PGA Tour established the Payne Stewart Award, which is given each year to a player who shows respect for the traditions of the game, commitment to uphold the game's heritage of charitable support and professional and meticoulous presentation of himself and the sport through his dress and conduct.







PAYNE STEWART SMU GOLF TRAINING CENTER AT TRINITY FOREST



SMU Athletics dedicated the new Payne Stewart SMU Golf Training Center at Trinity Forest Golf Club in 2017. The facility, among the finest in college golf, was made possible through the support of generous donors Ann Park Roberts Gibbs '66 and James R. Gibbs '66, '70, '72, Carolyn L. Miller and David B. Miller '72, '73 and the David B. Miller Family Foundation, The Dedman Foundation and family, and the Payne Stewart Family Foundation, Inc. Many additional donors also contributed generously to this initiative.

The center is named in honor of Payne Stewart '79, 1989 PGA Champion, two-time U.S. Open Champion and member of five U.S. Ryder Cup teams.

The 6,700-square foot facility features team locker rooms, coaches' offices, a conference room, a workout center and kitchen. The center also houses a hitting bay featuring premier equipment, including the Swing Catalyst, which tracks weight shift throughout the swing as well as four video motion-capture cameras and monitors to show swings. A TrackMan system uses dual radar technology to track both club movement and the ball at the moment of impact. This equipment provides the perfect foundation for analysis, enabling the Mustang golfers to use real-time data to improve their games.

The Payne Stewart SMU Golf Training Center also includes 70,000 square feet of teeing ground, a 45,000 square-foot putting and chipping green and a challenging nine-hole short course.


"Facilities like the Payne Stewart SMU Golf Training Center, the Robson & Lindley Aquatics Center, the new SMU Tennis Center, the renovated Moody Coliseum and the planned Indoor Performance Center are examples of the University's commitment to compete at the highest level of intercollegiate athletics," said SMU President R. Gerald Turner.

"Our commitment to competing for championships and enhancing the student experience requires continued investment in our infrastructure," said SMU Director of Athletics Rick Hart. "This great facility is just another sign of that commitment by our donors and our university. SMU, its donors and fans have made significant investments in athletics in recent years, and we thank them for their support."

Designed by Bill Coore and Ben Crenshaw, the championship course at Trinity Forest Golf Club adheres to their design philosophy that traditional, strategic golf is the most rewarding. Built in the Great Trinity Forest and surrounded on its edges by thousands of majestic hardwood trees, the classic links-style course artistically meanders through an open meadow of rolling, rumpled sand, recalling the windswept land of Great Britain or the Northeastern United States. The club is located less than 10 minutes from downtown Dallas on Great Trinity Forest Way, and the facilities include an 18-hole championship golf course, a world-class practice academy, and a short course, all designed by Coore and Crenshaw. A partnership with the City of Dallas, AT&T, SMU, Salesmanship Club of Dallas and First Tee of Dallas, Trinity Forest is the former home of the PGA TOUR's AT&T Byron Nelson and annually hosts NCAA invitational tournaments and additional high-profile professional and amateur events.

THIS IS SMU



- SMU, a private university in Dallas, is a center for global research and teaching that serves approximately 7,000 undergraduates and 5,000 graduate students through eight degree-granting schools.
- SMU ranks in the top 20% of universities by U.S. News and World Report, with top 50 graduate programs in business [34], law [44] and education [48].
- SMU attracts high-achieving students from all 50 states and over 85 countries, with incoming first-year students averaging a 32 ACT score and a 3.7 GPA. Seven out of 10 first-year students receive scholarships or grants, and 75% graduate without debt.
- Within six months of graduation, 91% of graduate students and 86% of undergraduates are employed, enrolled in further education, pursuing military service, or volunteering. The median starting salary for undergraduates is \$70,000 and \$85,000 for graduates.
- Ninety-two percent of SMU student-athletes earn degrees, and 80% graduate with a GPA of 3.0 or higher. SMU's Life after Ball program supports their career readiness through networking, mentoring, and internships.
- Sophisticated high-performance computing and targeted goals are the hallmarks of SMU research which fosters interdisciplinary collaboration on earth hazards and national security; education and technology; data science and urban studies.
- SMU faculty members are elected to prestigious groups such as the National Academy of Sciences, National Academy of Education, and Arnold and Mabel Beckman Foundation Scholars. They are also fellows of organizations like the National Endowment for the Humanities,

 American Academy of Arts and Sciences, and John Simon Guggenheim Memorial Foundation, American Council of Learned Societies, National Humanities Center and Harvard Society of Fellows Junior Fellows.
- SMU graduate students receive prestigious awards like the National Science Foundation Graduate Research Fellowship, National Science Foundation Doctoral Dissertation Research Improvement Grant, Boren Fellowship, and the Federal Highway Administration Dwight D. Eisenhower Transportation Fellowship. They also earn competitive dissertation and career advancement awards, including the Newcombe Doctoral Dissertation Fellowship, Louisville Institute Dissertation Fellowship, PEO Scholar Award, ACLS Emerging Voices and Leading Edge Fellowships.
- SMU undergraduates are regularly selected for competitive national awards, including 31 Goldwater Scholars, four Marshall Scholars, 15 Truman Scholars and two Schwarzman Scholars. In the last five years, 28 students were awarded Fulbright scholarships.

- Entrepreneurship opportunities abound at SMU through academic majors and minors ranging from business and engineering to the arts as well as academic centers offering mentoring, funding, competitions and support to students across various disciplines.
- SMU is home to the George W. Bush Presidential Center, Library, Museum, Foundation and Institute, attracting over 1.9 million visitors since opening in 2013.
- SMU is Dallas' university, located in a city that hosts 24 Fortune 500 companies.
- Dallas was named the No. 1 best sports business city by the Sports Business Journal in 2024, boasting of six professional sports clubs, collegiate athletics, annual premiere events and world class athletics' facilities.
- SMU Athletics has invested over \$250 million in facilities since 2013. The Garry Weber End Zone Complex at Ford Stadium, opening in fall 2024, features premium fan spaces and dynamic student-athlete facilities.
- SMU is the only NCAA FBS program in Dallas, with a record of 10 national championships, over 200 team conference championships, 100 individual national championships, 150 NCAA top-10 finishes, nearly 2,000 All-American honors and more than 150 Olympic appearances.
- SMU won a school-record eight championships in 2023-24 and is riding a surge of momentum heading into 2024-25, with all 17 programs reaching the postseason and 16 programs winning conference championships since 2013.
- SMU football has more wins than any Division I team in the state of Texas since 2019 and appeared in the AP Top 25 in four of the last five years. In the fall of 2023, the Mustangs won their first conference championship since 1984.
- In 2023-24, SMU finished as the No. 1 American Athletic Conference program and ranked 54th nationally in the final LEARFIELD Directors' Cup Division I Standings, ahead of six programs from the Big 12, five schools from the ACC, four teams from the Big Ten and three programs from the SEC.
- In the week after the ACC offered membership to SMU, the University raised \$100 million to support its move to the conference, and a total of \$159 million over the 2023-24 fiscal year. In preparation for its inaugural year in the ACC, SMU set a new season ticket sales record for Ford Stadium and is on pace to more than double year over year.
