SOONER QUICK HITTERS

- ▶ The No. 20 Oklahoma wrestling team (7-4, 3-4 Big 12) heads west for its regular season finale on Sunday, Feb. 16 when they take on Arizona State (4-7, 1-5 Big 12) in the programs' first meeting as Big 12 Conference foes. First bout is scheduled for 2:00 p.m. CT inside Mullett Arena. Sunday afternoon's matchup will be available for streaming on ESPN+ with live stats available via Trackwrestling.
- ▶ In their last outing, the Sooners wrapped up its home slate with a season-best performance on Feb. 1, knocking off No. 20 Missouri, 23-13, inside McCasland Field House. OU won their first four matches to take a 12-0 lead in the dual, a lead they would hold on to until the final whistle. Two of OU's six wins on the night came with bonus points. Before the match, the program honored six senior student-athletes in **Antonio Lorenzo, Cleveland Belton, Willie McDougald, Gaven Sax, Seth Seago** and **Ryder Wiese**.
- ▶ Oklahoma kicked off the new year with nine placers at the Southern Scuffle on Jan. 5, led by **Gaven Sax**, who finished runner-up in the 174-pound bracket. OU finished in a tie for second overall, finishing with 126.5 points along with Penn State. The Sooners finished behind only team champion Army (132.5). North Carolina (91) and North Dakota State (90.5) rounded out the top five.
- ▶ Oklahoma opened its season with a 32-3 win over Air Force inside Clune Arena on Nov. 8. It marked OU's largest margin of victory in a dual match since blanking Little Rock, 37-0, on Nov. 18, 2022.

YEAR 2 OF THE KISH ERA

- ▶ **Roger Kish** was named head coach of the Oklahoma Sooners on May 2, 2023 after spending 12 seasons as the head coach at North Dakota State.
- ▶ Kish made quite a splash in his first season as Oklahoma's head coach in 2023-24, helping the Sooners secure their highest NCAA finish (23rd) in eight seasons. Additionally, Kish helped elevate Stephen Buchanan to All-American status for the third time in his career. Buchanan put together a dominant 27-3 season, finishing third at the NCAA Championships in the 197-pound bracket to become OU's highest NCAA finisher in eight seasons.
- ▶ Kish had a 108-70 record in dual meets as the Bison head coach including a 50-30 record in conference duals, becoming the second winningest coach in program history, behind only the legendary Bucky Maughan who led the Bison to four NCAA Division II national championships.
- ▶ Turning the Bison into consistent winners as a Big 12 affiliate program, Kish's teams had 54 NCAA championship qualifiers in his 12 seasons as head coach including 21 over his last four seasons. He had six wrestlers advance to earn All-America honors. Kish directed the Bison to a pair of NCAA West Regional/Western Wrestling Conference championships (2014, 2015) and two WWC regular season titles (2013, 2015). He was a three-time WWC Coach of the Year.

WRESTLING NATIONAL TITLES

Oklahoma has the fifth-most team national titles (7) in the history of collegiate wrestling, winning titles in 1936, 1951, 1952, 1957, 1960, 1963 and 1974. The team's title in 1936 was the first from any team at the University of Oklahoma.

WELCOME TO NORMAN

- ▶ In the offseason, head coach Roger Kish added 17 newcomers to the roster, including three former NCAA qualifiers in seniors **Gaven Sax** (North Dakota State) and **Cleveland Belton** (Oregon State), as well as sophomore **Bradley Hill** (Iowa). Redshirt freshman **Carter Schubert** (Cal Baptist) rounded out the Sooners' incoming transfer additions. The group of transfers joined 13 incoming freshmen that made up Kish's first full recruiting class since being hired as Oklahoma's head coach. The 2024 class was rated No. 3 overall in the country, according to InterMat's final rankings big board.
- ▶ Oklahoma's 2024 recruiting class included the nation's No. 16 pound-for-pound wrestler **Beric Jordan** and one of the top 145-pounders in **Alex Braun** of Woodbury, Minnesota per FloWrestling. Jordan, a Stillwater High School product, was joined by five other in-state recruits that are all top-200 signees in Edmond North's **Hunter Hollingsworth** and **Jude Randall**, Bixby's **Clay Giddens-Buttram**, Stillwater's **Landyn Summer** and Piedmont's **Cash Donnell**.
- ▶ Braun was joined by **Owen Eck** of Andale, Kansas and **Koufax Christensen** of Waukee, Iowa as the out-of-state recruits for the 2024 cycle. Kish's first recruiting class boasted numerous all-area, all-state and All-America honors, as well as state championships.
- ▶ The Sooners' 2025 recruiting class is ranked No. 10 nationally by FloWrestling and includes four incoming freshmen ranked in MatScouts' Senior Big Board which charts the top 250 recruits in the country.

SERIES HISTORY

- ▶ Sunday's dual will be the 47th meeting between the Sooners and Sun Devils with the two sides first squaring off in 1966.
- ▶ The Sooners last traveled to Tempe in 2021 when they were defeated 22-12.
- ▶ Oklahoma leads the all-time series 29-16-1.

SOONERS IN THE RANKINGS

- ▶ The NCAA released its second set of coaches' rankings and the first Ratings Percentage Index (RPI) for the 2025 NCAA Wrestling Championships on Thursday. Eight Sooners were included in the coaches' rankings, with four slotted inside the top 20, while seven were featured in the RPI.
- ▶ **Antonio Lorenzo** (No. 26 - 18 RPI at 125), **Cleveland Belton** (No. 24 - 14 RPI at 133), **Mosha Schwartz** (No. 15 - NR at 141), **Willie McDougald** (No. 15 - 19 RPI at 149), **Tate Picklo** (No. 33 - 21 RPI at 165), **Gaven Sax** (No. 14 - NR at 174), **DJ Parker** (No. 20 - 10 RPI at 184), **Bradley Hill** (NR - 32 RPI at 197) and **Juan Mora** (No. 31 - 22 RPI at 285) represent Oklahoma in the latest release.
- ▶ The coaches' ranking and RPI are two of several criteria that will be evaluated by the NCAA Division I Wrestling Committee during the at-large selection and seeding process along with head-to-head competition, quality wins, conference tournament placement, results versus common opponents and win percentage.
- ▶ Oklahoma enters its 12th and final dual of the season as the No. 20-ranked team in the country, according to the National Wrestling Coaches Association.
- ▶ Projected starters **Antonio Lorenzo**, **Cleveland Belton**, **Mosha Schwartz**, **Willie McDougald**, **Tate Picklo**, **Gaven Sax**, **DJ Parker** and **Juan Mora** each made the latest Intermat rankings (Feb. 11) in their respective weight classes.

CHAMPIONSHIP PEDIGREE

- ▶ Since the inception of collegiate wrestling in 1928, Oklahoma has been one of the most dominant wrestling programs in the country. The Sooners have seven team national titles, 67 individual national champions and 278 All-Americans.
- ▶ In addition to the Sooners' seven national championships, Oklahoma has finished as runner-up at NCAAs 12 times, third most in the country. The Sooners' 40 finishes inside the top four are the fourth-most nationally and OU has grabbed a top-10 spot at NCAAs 64 times (third most) out of 96 championships held.
- ▶ The NCAA named Oklahoma the fourth-greatest wrestling dynasty in the country in the summer of 2020.
- ▶ Oklahoma has collected 24 overall conference championships and 186 individual conference champions in school history. The team's most recent conference championship came in 2021, their first in 19 years.
- ▶ OU assistant coach Teyon Ware was a four-time All American wrestler for the Sooners from 2003-2006.

HOME OF THE HODGE

- ▶ The Sooners honored legendary wrestler and Sooner, Danny Hodge, before their 189th Bedlam dual with Oklahoma State on Dec. 13.
- ▶ Hodge, who is a National Wrestling Hall of Famer, died on Dec. 24, 2020, at the age of 88 in his hometown of Perry, Okla. He came to Norman from Perry in 1955 to wrestle for hall-of-fame-coach Port Robertson.
- ▶ Hodge compiled a perfect 46-0 record as a Sooner, winning 36 of his matches via fall. He pinned 24 consecutive opponents and was never taken down during his college career.
- ▶ The legend won three consecutive national titles and his performance at the 1957 NCAA championship earned him Most Outstanding Wrestler honors and led the Sooners to their fourth national championship.
- ▶ The Hodge Trophy, which is wrestling's equivalent of the Heisman Trophy, is named after Hodge.
- ▶ To this day, Hodge is the only wrestler to appear on the cover of Sports Illustrated (April, 1957).

50TH ANNIVERSARY: CELEBRATING THE 1974 CHAMPION SOONERS

- ▶ Oklahoma honored its 1974 national championship team during the intermission of their 189th Bedlam dual with Oklahoma State on Dec. 13.
- ▶ The 1974 NCAA Division I Wrestling Championships were the 44th NCAA Division I Wrestling Championships to be held. Iowa State University in Ames, Iowa hosted the tournament at Hilton Coliseum.
- ▶ Under legendary head coach Stan Abel, Oklahoma took home the team championship with 69.5 points and two individual champions (118 lbs: Gary Breece; 158 lbs: Rod Kilgore). The 1974 Championship remains OU's last team title win.
- ▶ The first Sooner wrestler to become a four-time All-American, Breece capped his career by winning the 1974 NCAA title at 118-pounds with a tense, low-scoring 3-2 victory over Jack Spates of Slippery Rock. Ironically, Spates would later become OU's head coach from 1994-2011. A two-time national finalist and two-time Big Eight Champion, Breece was a crafty, hardworking wrestler with solid offense and good defense. While in high school, Breece was a two-time Oklahoma state champion. He won his first title for Edmond Memorial in 1968 and his second for Tulsa Memorial in 1969.
- ▶ As a wrestler at OU, Kilgore was a four-time All-American, won two Big Eight conference titles and two NCAA championships. He was the first OU wrestler to win 100 matches.

125 POUNDS - ANTONIO LORENZO (13-6) (SENIOR)

- ▶ 8-2 dual record; Three-dual win streak entering Sunday; Defeated Missouri's Gage Walker (Dec. 4-1) in last outing; Earned a team-tying fourth ranked win against Northern Iowa's No. 30 Trever Anderson on Jan. 25 (Dec. 3-2); 4-2 record and fourth-place finish at the Southern Scuffle (Jan. 4/5); Topped Central Michigan's Kaden Chinavare (Dec. 9-6) on Dec. 6; Knocked off Wyoming's No. 2 Jore Volk (Dec. 3-2) on Nov. 23; Defeated Air Force's Robert Wright (Dec. 5-1) in season opener; Finished 2-2 at the Dakotronics Invite.
- ▶ 2023-24 - Did Not Compete.
- ▶ 2022-23 (At Cal Poly) - Second-time national qualifier after compiling an 8-10 overall record at 125 pounds ... 2-7 in dual meets ... Placed third in Pac-12 Championships at 125 pounds and was awarded an at-large berth in the nationals, where he was decisioned by third-seeded Liam Cronin of Nebraska 9-4 and was eliminated from the three-day championship with a 4-0 loss to Tanner Jordan of South Dakota State ... Was seeded second and earned a first place finish after going 3-0 at the Tiger Style Invite, picking up a fall and two decisions. In the finals, he earned an 8-6 sudden victory decision against top-seeded Noah Surtin of Missouri, an NCAA qualifier the season prior.
- ▶ 2021-22 (At Cal Poly) - First-time national qualifier after compiling a 20-11 overall record with two falls, one technical fall and five major decisions ... first win of season was a fall in just 1:22 against Dane Durlacher of Illinois in Michigan State Invitational ... technical fall was a 16-1 nod in 4:07 versus Kyle Randall of Sacred Heart in Las Vegas Invitational ... placed fifth in Pac-12 Championships at 125 pounds and was awarded an at-large berth in the nationals, where he faced pair of nationally ranked wrestlers and went 0-2, including a 2-1 loss to No. 18 Noah Surtin of Missouri ... placed fifth in Las Vegas Invitational with 6-2 mark and was third in Matmen Open with 4-1 record ... 7-2 mark in dual meets.
- ▶ 2020-21 (At Cal Poly) - Posted 4-5 mark in redshirt freshman season at Cal Poly ... 2-3 in dual meets and 2-2 in Pac-12 Championships for a fourth-place finish ... two of his four wins were by fall, both in the first period ... two of his wins were against Khyler Brewer of Little Rock, a 5-3 sudden-victory decision in a dual meet and a fall in 2:05 in the opening round of the Pac-12 finals ... named to Pac-12 Conference's Winter Academic Honor Roll.
- ▶ 2019-20 (At Cal Poly) - Compiled 17-5 record as a redshirt at 125 pounds ... competed in five open tournaments, placing first in both the Menlo Open and California Collegiate Open, both with 4-0 marks, and fifth in the Reno Tournament of Champions ... of his 17 wins, six were via fall and three by major decision ... five of his falls were in less than two minutes, including pins in 48 and 57 seconds, both in the Menlo Open ... won nine of his last 11 matches ... split four matches in the Midlands.
- ▶ HIGH SCHOOL - Placed in the California state high school championships all four years -- seventh at 106 pounds as a freshman in 2016, third at 106 as a sophomore in 2017, both at Del Oro High School, third at 113 pounds as a junior in 2018 and fourth at 120 pounds as a senior in 2019 at St. John Bosco ... helped Braves place fifth in 2019 team standings ... was ranked in the Top 100 by both Intermat and FloWrestling ... a Super 32 champion, a three-time Super 32 placer and also claimed first place at the 2018 Doc Buchanan Invitational.

ROGER KISH

Roger Kish was named Oklahoma's 15th head wrestling coach on May 2, 2023, and enters his second season in 2024-25.

Kish made quite a splash in his first season as Oklahoma's head coach in 2023-24, helping the Sooners secure their highest NCAA finish (23rd) in eight seasons. Additionally, Kish helped elevate Stephen Buchanan to All-American status for the third time in his career. Buchanan put together a dominant 27-3 season, finishing third at the NCAA Championships in the 197-pound bracket to become OU's highest NCAA finisher in eight seasons.

Kish took the OU reins after presiding over Big 12 Conference affiliate member North Dakota State for 12 seasons and guiding the Bison to a winning record each of the last five years (48-20 combined).

Kish coached North Dakota State to a 108-70 (.607) dual record since taking over prior to the 2011-12 campaign, including a 50-30 (.625) mark in conference duals (33-26 in the Big 12 and 17-4 in the Western Wrestling Conference). The Bison have been on the upswing under Kish the last five seasons, posting a .706 team winning percentage during the stretch and a 21-7 (.750) record the last two years.

Kish's 2022-23 NDSU squad went 11-3 in dual competition and finished fifth out of 13 teams at the Big 12 Championship after tying for fourth place in the regular season with a 6-2 record. The Bison, who broke into the top 20 and never left after a 20-16 season-opening road win over No. 8 Nebraska, reached No. 15 in the National Wrestling Coaches Association Poll for their highest official coaches ranking since they moved to Division I in 2006-07. They also reached No. 12 in the InterMat rankings this past season, their highest in any poll in their D-I history. NDSU beat Oklahoma 21-12 in February in Fargo, N.D., and went on to finish 24th at NCAAs after scoring a Division I program-record 25.5 points at the event.

Kish coached 21 Bison wrestlers to NCAA Championships qualification over the last four seasons: six in 2023, five in 2022, four in 2021 and six in 2020 (before the event was canceled due to COVID-19). Those wrestlers earned a total of nine All-America honors, including two in 2023 by 157-pound senior Jared Franek (fourth place; was also the 2023 Big 12 champion) and 165-pound redshirt freshman Michael Caliendo (seventh place).

Kish's NDSU wrestlers also flourished in the classroom. His Bison earned 35 NWCA Scholar All-America honors since he became head coach and combined for 100 academic all-conference accolades. Clay Ream was named the 2017 and 2018 Big 12 Wrestling Scholar-Athlete of the Year and earned three consecutive NCAA Elite 90 Awards (2016-18), while Franek won two straight NCAA Elite 90 Awards. The Elite 90 Award is presented to the student-athlete with the highest cumulative GPA participating to the finals site of each year's NCAA Championships.

Kish was named Western Wrestling Conference Coach of the Year three consecutive seasons (2013-15) and directed the Bison to a pair of NCAA West Regional/Western Wrestling Conference championships (2014, 2015), as well as two WWC regular season titles (2013, 2015). He produced 19 NCAA West Region/WWC/Big 12 individual champions.

Prior to being named head coach at NDSU, Kish spent two seasons as a Bison assistant coach under the legendary Bucky Maughan. Kish joined the Bison program after a

highly successful wrestling career at the University of Minnesota, where he also served as a graduate assistant for the 2008-09 season. He was a two-time All-American and NCAA runner-up with the Golden Gophers at 184 pounds.

Kish, who graduated from Minnesota in May 2008 with a bachelor's degree in business and marketing education, posted a 117-27 career collegiate record and went 35-7 as a sophomore en route to a Big Ten title and a second-place NCAA finish. As a team captain his junior season, he finished 37-3, was the Big Ten runner-up and finished third nationally.

A Lapeer, Mich., native, Kish was also a two-time cadet national champion and captured a USA Wrestling junior national title. He was a four-time state champion at Lapeer West High School.

Kish and his wife Jessalyn are parents to a son, Huxley, and a daughter, Emry.
