Working Press Credentials

Press and photograph credentials are issued to members of the working media only. These credentials can be obtained from Michael Kobylanski, associate director of athletics/communications. Passes should be requested no later than 24 hours prior to a contest to ensure space availability.

Media Parking

There is reserved parking available for members of the media located in close proximity to the entrance of The Ballpark at Southern Connecticut.

Post-Game Interviews

Interviews with SCSU student-athletes and coaches will take place following a 10-minute cooling-off period. Reporters can file from the athletic communications office following the conclusion of competition.

Interview Policies

Interview requests are coordinated through the athletic communications office. Requests must be made at least one day in advance to allow the player/coach to be properly notified. At no time will the player's dormitory telephone number be released to the media. However, if a telephone interview is necessary, arrangements can be made for the student-athlete to contact that member of the media.

Practice Coverage

The Southern Connecticut State University baseball program practices at set times during the fall and spring semesters. All student-athletes and coaches are available for interviews prior to, or following, practice with proper notification to the athletic communications office. Interviews are not granted on game days unless there are extenuating circumstances.

Affiliated with Southern Connecticut State University as a student-athlete, instructor and coach for more than two decades, Tim Shea's long-standing relationship with the university has been a tremendously successful one. He is in his 12th season at the helm of the Owls in 2013.

He took over as head baseball coach prior to the 2002 season after serving 11 years as an Owls assistant to Joe Bandiera.

During Shea's tenure, he has built the Owls into an annual contender for the Northeast-10 Championship and a berth in the NCAA Tournament.

In fact, Shea has piloted Southern Connecticut to five NCAA Tournament appearances (2005, 2006, 2008, 2010, 2011) and two NCAA World Series berths (2005, 2011).

Shea has amassed a record of 342-196-2 (.635) as the Owls' skipper. Southern Connecticut has won at least 30 games in eight of his first 11 seasons at the helm.

On the individual front, Shea has coached 70 All-Conference performers, 23 All-Region players and six All-Americans.

Southern Connecticut concluded the 2012 season with a 31-17 final overall mark and reached the Northeast-10 Conference Tournament. The Owls were ranked as high as No. 3 in the nation during the season. Eight student-athletes earned All-Conference honors, while Shea was selected as the Jack Butterfield Award winner by the New England Intercollegiate Baseball Association.

The 2011 season developed into the finest in the long and storied history of the Owls' program. He guided the squad to a berth in the national semifinals and posted a school-record 45 victories in the process. Southern Connecticut finished the year with a final No. 4 national ranking. Southern Connecticut won the Northeast-10 Conference regular season title and also set a new school mark with a 22-game winning streak to start the season.

Nine Owls collected All-Conference honors during the spring, with six earning All-Region accolades.

HEAD COACH TIM SHEA

The 2010 campaign featured a Northeast-10 Conference regular season championship and a No. 20 final national ranking as the Owls finished the year with a 38-13-1 mark. Shea was named ECAC, Regional and Northeast-10 Conference Coach of the Year for his efforts.

The Owls enjoyed another outstanding campaign in 2008, as they concluded the year with a 36-19 mark and reached the NCAA Tournament.

For his efforts, Shea was selected as the Northeast Region Coach of the Year by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association. He was also tabbed as the Northeast-10 Conference Coach of the Year.

Following the 2008 season, the Owls had two student-athletes sign professional contracts. Jim Fuller was selected in the Major League Baseball draft by the New York Mets, while Mike Diaz was picked by the Houston Astros. Both played in the New York-Penn League in their rookie seasons.

Shea enjoyed immediate success in his first year with the Owls, and that success has continued since. Southern Connecticut has won at least 15 games in Northeast-10 play each year.

The Owls were 31-16 in 2002 before posting another winning season in 2003 with a 20-17 mark. Southern Connecticut followed with a 30-22 mark in 2004.

In 2005, the Owls won the Northeast-10 Conference regular season championship (25-5) and earned the program's first appearance in the Division II World Series by winning the Northeast Regional championship. The club concluded the year with an overall mark of 31-14.

Shea was named Northeast-10 Coach of the Year, NEIBA Division II Coach of the Year and ABCA Regional Coach of the Year in 2005. The Owls were also named NEIBA Division II Northeast Team of the Year.

The Owls reached the NCAA Tournament for the second straight year in 2006. They finished with an overall mark of 36-19, which matched the second-highest single-season win total in program history.

Southern Connecticut won 19 games in 2007 before storming back in 2008 to secure a NCAA Tournament berth for the third time in four years.

Dating back to his days as an assistant coach, Shea has been a part of six squads that qualified for the NCAA Tournament.

Shea, who previously taught in the university's special education department, earned bachelor's and master's degrees in special education from Southern.

A two-year captain for the Owls, Shea led the nation in doubles per game his senior season of 1987. He was named team MVP in 1985 and Second-Team All-Conference in 1986.



A West Haven native, Shea played football and was an All-State selection in baseball at Notre Dame of West Haven High School. A former assistant coach in both sports at Notre Dame, Shea taught for 14 years in the Milford school system.

Shea also has additional coaching experience with the Connecticut Owls AAU program. His teams won back-to-back AAU National Championships in 2006 and 2007.

He resides in Hamden with his wife, Vicky, sons, T.J. and Tyler, and daughter, Briana.

Nate Cole, now in his sixth season as an assistant baseball coach at Southern Connecticut State University, has developed the Owls' pitching staff into one of the tops in the Division II ranks.

Cole has mentored 12 All-Conference selections and two All-Americans over the course of the last five seasons.

The 2011 Owls' staff led Division II in earned run average for the majority of the season and finished the year No. 3 in ERA and walks allowed per nine innings. Michael Johnston led the nation in saves, while Chris Zbin, Steve Simon and Kevin Pettine also ranked among the NCAA individual leaders in several categories. Four pitchers were named All-Conference, with three collecting All-Region accolades.

The Owls' 2010 pitching staff led all of Division II with a 2.53 earned run average. That figure was the third best in the NCAA, trailing only St. Thomas of Minnesota (2.41) and the University of Texas (2.45).

In 2009, Cole coached two All-Northeast-10 Conference selections and helped the Owls pitching rotation claim the fourth most wins in the conference (25) and second fewest losses (20).

During his first year with the Owls, he helped oversee a pitching staff that ranked first in the Northeast-10 Conference in shutouts (12) and was second in strikeouts, earned run average and saves.

Prior to SCSU, Cole was a three-year starter on the mound at Central Connecticut State University. Unfortunately, he was sidelined due to injury his senior year.

While with the Blue Devils, Cole was a part of two Northeast Conference championship squads and participated in NCAA Regional competition at Arizona State University and the University of Oklahoma.

Prior to college, Cole was a captain as a senior at King Philip Regional (Mass.) High School. He was a part of the first team in school history to advance to the state title game.

Originally from Wrentham, Mass., Cole currently resides in New Britain, Conn.

Former Owls' captain Kyle Rosadino is in his first year as an assistant coach on the staff. Rosadino joined the staff after a four-year playing career as an Owl (2008-11). He served as a team captain in 2011 and helped lead the team to the College World Series berth and a national semifinal appearance.

Rosadino received All-Conference honors in his junior and senior seasons and batted a team-high .348 during his senior campaign in 2011.

Rosadino holds a bachelor's degree in business management from SCSU.

2013 SEASON OUTLOOK

Now that it has been established as a powerhouse in the conference, region and nation, the Southern Connecticut State University baseball team is looking to once again return to the NCAA Tournament in 2013.

In 2012, the Owls finished a great year with 31 wins and made it to the Northeast-10 Conference Tournament.

The team returns 16 players from last year, including several top pitchers and the majority of its starting lineup.

Pitchers

The Owls will have a great veteran base on the mound this year. They return eight pitchers and added four newcomers to the staff.

The key returners are closer A.J. Turnier and starters Ryan Yerina and Steve Landell. Turnier was an All-Conference selection last year. He led the team in ERA (1.15) and recorded nine saves out of the pen. Yerina boasted a 4-1 record with a 2.76 ERA before suffering an injury in March. Landell posted a 3-2 record with a stout 3.04 ERA and fanned 54 batters on the season, good enough for third on the team.

The Owls also have the good fortune to return two pitchers who made the Northeast-10 Conference All-Rookie team last year. Pat Egan finished the year with a 3-1 record and 2.16 a ERA in 22 appearances out of the bullpen. Additionally, Cole Bryant was impressive in a starting role, posting a team-high six wins in 60.1 innings of work his freshman year. Both sophomores should play a key role for the pitching staff this year.

Also returning for the Owls are juniors Rocco Cundari, Will Meade and Tyler Albrecht. Cundari, a transfer from Division I Bryant University, finished the season with the most strikeouts on the team with 55, while recording a 3.33 ERA in 16 appearances. Meade and Albrecht also saw time as relievers and will look to factor in again this year.

Additionally, the Owls will add four new arms to their pitching staff. Freshmen Austin Brochu, Gary Flowers, Mike Yerina and Sal Armao will all look to be key additions on the mound this season.



Catcher

Calling the games for the Owls this year will be junior T.J. Shea. Shea started all 43 games for SCSU last year, splitting time between catcher and designated hitter. Shea hit .238 on the season and drove in 21 runs.

Backing up Shea will be freshman Jake Lieberman (Commack, N.Y./Commack). The freshman will look to contribute in his first year either behind the plate or in the infield. Sophomore Brandon Docimo also may see sometime behind the plate if necessary.

Infield

The infield will also see its fair share of returners in 2013. Five players from last year's team will be back this year, and two newcomers have joined the Owls.

Vying for time at first base will be freshman Jake Paul (Kingston, N.Y./Kingston) and sophomore Joe Breen. The two will also most likely see some time as the designated hitter.

2013 SEASON OUTLOOK

Stepping in at second base will be Nick Baviello. He saw action in 25 games last year, finishing with a batting average of .290.

T.K. Kiernan will move from third base to shortstop in 2013. He started every game in 2012 and posted a .218 average.

A.J. Rouleau missed all of last season because of an injury. This year he returns to play third base for the Owls. In 2011, he was an All-Region and All-Conference selection. He will look to continue his solid play from two seasons ago as he makes his way back onto the field for Southern.

Freshman Jake DeRosa (North Haven, Conn./Notre Dame-West Haven) and sophomore Brandon Docimo will compete for time in the infield. Docimo appeared in 16 games last season. He hit .280 with a home run and drove in six runs for the Owls.

Outfield

The Owls outfield unit will see the most change of any group on the team. There are three returners, one of which is a returning freshman, and three newcomers.

Headlining the bunch is senior captain Michael Cleary, a Northeast-10 All-Conference selection from a year ago. Cleary will man center field for the Owls again this season, coming off a year where he was tops of the team in batting average, hitting .298.

Redshirt freshman Matt Burns will be the starting right fielder. Burns did not see any playing time last year, but will look to contribute this year in his new starting role.

Competing to start in left field are sophomore Will Hindinger, freshmen Joe Uccello (Glastonbury, Conn./Glastonbury) and Alex Wichmann (Granby, Conn./The Millbrook School), and senior transfer Collin Dickinson. All will also battle for time as the designated hitter as well.

NORTHEAST-10 CONFERENCE

The Northeast-10 Conference is an NCAA Division II conference that was established in 1979. The NE-10 consists of 16 member institutions that are located throughout the Northeast including Connecticut, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New York and Vermont.

The institutions that make up the Northeast-10 are Adelphi University (Garden City, N.Y.), American International College (Springfield, Mass.), Assumption College (Worcester, Mass.), Bentley University (Waltham, Mass.), Franklin Pierce University (Rindge, N.H.), Le Moyne College (Syracuse, N.Y.), University of Massachusetts Lowell (Lowell, Mass.), Merrimack College (North Andover, Mass.), University of New Haven (West Haven, Conn.), Pace University (Pleasantville, N.Y.), Saint Anselm College (Manchester, N.H.), Saint Michael's College (Colchester, Vt.), College of Saint Rose (Albany, N.Y.), Southern Connecticut State University (New Haven, Conn.), Southern New Hampshire University (Manchester, N.H.), and Stonehill College (Easton, Mass.).

The 16 member institutions are spread geographically from Syracuse, New York to Boston, Massachusetts and from Burlington, Vermont to Long Island, New York. Many of the members are located in or around the metropolitan areas of Albany, Boston, New Haven, Worcester, and New York.

The Conference most recently welcomed the University of New Haven in 2008 and Adelphi University in 2009,

adding to the powerful union of strong academic and athletic colleges and universities.

The Northeast-10 has evolved into a membership committed to competitive athletics programs that emphasize the education on and off the field of its more than 5,500 student athletes.

Counted among the many accomplishments of our institutions are NCAA Division II National Championships in women's basketball, field hockey, men's lacrosse, women's lacrosse, men's soccer, women's track & field, and men's and women's swimming & diving.

From the field of play to the class room, the Northeast-10 honored a number of student-athletes for their academic accomplishments. The conference honored close to 200 student-athletes throughout the year that excelled at a high level on the field and in the classroom as members of the academic all conference teams. Additionally, 2,917 student-athletes representing each of the sixteen schools earned a 3.0 GPA or higher and were named to the Commissioner's Honor Roll last year.

Today's Northeast-10 Conference remains focused on complementing the academic integrity and missions of the member institutions with a commitment to a broad-based championship program, as evidenced by the 23 sports the Conference offers in championship play, the most of any Division II conference.

DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS PATRICIA NICOL

PATRICIA NICOL

Director of Athletics



The architect behind one of the top Division II athletic departments in the nation, Patricia Nicol is now in her ninth year as Director of Athletics and 14th overall as an athletic administrator at Southern Connecticut State University. A 2010 nominee for the Division II Athletic Director of the Year award and a 2011 selection to the National Register's

'Who's Who Among Business and Professional Achievers', she leads a department that is comprised of nearly 80 coaches, administrators and staff members.

Since her appointment in April, 2005, the Owls have excelled on the playing fields, in the classroom and in the community, maintaining a status for those around the nation to emulate.

Over the course of the past nine years, SCSU has won one team NCAA Division II championship (women's basketball in 2007) and eight individual NCAA Division II championships. Southern Connecticut's teams have made 77 NCAA Championships appearances and produced a total of 179 All-Americans during her tenure.

As a department, the Owls have ranked among the top-20 percent among all institutions in each of the past six years in the Learfield Sports Division II Directors' Cup, including four top-15 percent finishes and two top-10 percent finishes over that same stretch.

However, success has stretched far beyond the realm of athletic competition. The department has had nearly 1,200 selections to the Northeast-10 Commissioners Honor Roll over the past five years. Under Nicol's guidance, the department initiated its inaugural National Student-Athlete Day celebration in April, 2009 and has recognized more than 500 student-athletes since the event's inception.

In addition, the overall graduation rate of SCSU student-athletes continues to exceed that of the general student population.

Southern Connecticut's student-athletes, coaches and staff also continue to impact the campus and local communities under the guidance of Nicol. The creation of the Community Service Cup in 2008-09 enhanced the volunteer efforts all of athletic department representatives. Southern Connecticut student-athletes have volunteered more than 11,000 hours of their team to numerous outreach efforts over the last five years.

Success in all facets remained at the forefront during the 2011-12 academic year. The Owls posted a runner-up finish

for the Northeast-10 Conference Presidents' Cup – the highest mark since joining the league and third top-three finish in the last four years. In addition, the department finished No. 48 in the Learfield Sports Directors Cup, once again ranking in the top-20 percent of all Division II programs.

Seven programs were represented in NCAA Championships action, including a third-place finish – highest in program history – by the men's indoor track and field team and a run by the softball team to the College World Series. The women's basketball team also reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

Five programs won Northeast-10 Conference Championships during the year – men's indoor and outdoor track and field, men's and women's swimming and diving and softball (regular season).

On the individual front, the Owls produced three NCAA National Champions and two NCAA runner-up performances. A total of 20 student-athletes representing six different programs were named All-Americans.

The Owls also thrived in the classroom and in the community in 2011-12. SCSU student-athletes, coaches and staff members volunteered more than 3,000 hours of their time for numerous community service initiatives, including campus events such as Jail N Bail, Friends of Rudolph and The Big Event, as well as off-campus projects with numerous organizations.

Nicol also oversaw the continued facility improvements at Moore Field House and Pelz Gymnasium, and spearheaded the creation of a 'Fan Zone' store for SCSU athletics apparel and merchandise in the Michael J. Adanti Student Center.

The academic achievements of the Owls in 2011-12 continue to highlight the outstanding work through the combined efforts between student-athletes, coaches and administrators. SCSU student-athletes soared to new heights, as evidenced by nearly 325 selections to the Northeast-10 Conference Commissioner's Honor Roll and 36 Northeast-10 Conference All-Academic Team honorees. The department also had seven Academic All-Americans, 14 Academic All-District selections and one Northeast-10 Conference Scholar-Athlete Sport Excellence Award winner.

The department enjoyed one of the finest years in school history in 2010-11, including NCAA Championship participation from 10 programs for the second straight year. SCSU also finished No. 25 in the Learfield Sports Directors Cup, best among Northeast-10 Conference schools and the highest finish in school history. In addition, SCSU finished third out of 15 member institutions in the annual Northeast-10 Conference Presidents' Cup.

DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS PATRICIA NICOL

The baseball team reached the College World Series and advanced to the national semifinals for the first time in school history, while the men's outdoor track and field program finished ninth at the NCAA Championships and won its first-ever New England Championship. The men's soccer team reached the NCAA second round, while the softball squad made it to the NCAA regional finals.

Eight programs won Northeast-10 Conference Championships during the year – men's indoor and outdoor track and field, men's and women's swimming and diving, women's indoor and outdoor track and field, baseball (regular season) and softball (tournament).

On the individual front, the Owls produced one NCAA National Champion and three NCAA runner-up performances. In addition, a total of 24 student-athletes representing eight different programs were named All-Americans.

SCSU student-athletes, coaches and staff members also volunteered more than 3,000 hours of their time for community service in 2010-11. Academically, the department had more than 350 selections to the Northeast-10 Conference Commissioner's Honor Roll and 30 Northeast-10 Conference All-Academic Team honorees – both the highest totals in school history. A pair of senior student-athletes – Logan Lentz and Jennifer Peterson – were also awarded the prestigious Henry Barnhard Award, given to just four students at SCSU and only a dozen across the entire CSU system annually.

Nicol also spearheaded facility improvements to both Moore Field House and Jess Dow Field, including a complete replacement of the artificial surface, during the 2010-11 academic year. She also oversaw the creation of an individual Community Service accolade awarded to one exceptional student-athlete each academic year.

The 2009-10 academic year featured NCAA Championship participation from 10 programs, highlighted by appearances from the men's soccer, baseball and softball teams. Seven programs won Northeast-10 Conference Championships during the year – football, men's indoor and outdoor track and field, women's swimming and diving, women's outdoor track and field, baseball (regular season) and softball (tournament). On the individual front, 22 student-athletes were named All-Americans.

The Owls continued to excel in the classroom and in the community as well in 2009-10. SCSU student-athletes, coaches and staff members volunteered more than 2,500 hours of their time for numerous community service initiatives.

Furthermore, the Owls had 300 selections to the Northeast-10 Conference Commissioner's Honor Roll. From the conference level, 18 student-athletes were also named to the Northeast-10 Conference All-Academic Team,

while three student-athletes were selected as winners of the league's inaugural Scholar-Athlete Sport Excellence Award. The department also had six Academic All-District selections, while senior gymnast Sarah Darst was named a First-Team Academic All-American.

The 2008-09 academic year featured 11 programs participating in NCAA post-season action, including appearances by the football, field hockey and softball teams. SCSU finished third out of 15 member institutions in the annual Northeast-10 Conference Presidents' Cup, matching the highest department finish since joining the league. In addition, the Owls also won four Northeast-10 Conference championships and 18 student-athletes earned All-America honors during the year.

In addition, Nicol has been instrumental in lending support and oversight to several key department projects.

The first phase of facility upgrades to Moore Field House was completed in late 2008. Improvements in phase one included several lobby upgrades – including new displays of the history of SCSU athletics, its 10 team National Championships, a new Athletic Hall of Fame display, as well as additional signage – as well as new team locker rooms and a new state-of-the-art Athletic Training room. The main gymnasium in Moore Field House now also houses banners for all athletic programs recognizing Northeast-10 Conference and NCAA Tournament success.

Additional initiatives spearheaded by Nicol include the launch of the Athletic Department Study Table and Tutorial programs, relaunch of the Faculty Athletic Advisory Board, creation of the annual Senior Athletic Awards banquet and implementation of the department's new website, www.southernctowls.com.

The Owls have also enjoyed an increased external affairs presence in the areas of marketing, promotions and corporate sponsorships with Nicol leading the department.

Nicol had been Southern's interim director since August, 2004, after serving as interim co-director since June, 2003. She is the fourth director of athletics in Southern history and the first female to be appointed to that position.

Prior to her interim appointment, Nicol served as associate director of athletics with the Owls' administration following three years as assistant director of athletics at the University of Maryland. Prior to that, Nicol spent six years as associate director of athletics at Providence College.

Nicol earned bachelor's (1980) and master's (1983) degrees from the University of Rhode Island, where she was an NCAA qualifier in track and field. Inducted into the URI Athletic Hall of Fame in 1990, she also served as head cross country/track coach at West Virginia University in 1983-84.

Nicol, a resident of Wallingford, Conn., has two children, Christine and Michael.

BOE PEARMAN

Associate Director of Athletics/
Senior Woman Administrator



Now in her eighth year as associate director of athletics and senior woman administrator at Southern Connecticut State University, Belinda “Boe” Pearman possesses a background of more than 20 years in collegiate athletics as a student-athlete, coach and administrator, in addition to experience in professional sports

and the private sector.

Pearman is responsible for the department’s compliance with NCAA and conference rules and regulations, encompassing more than 500 student-athletes and 60 coaches. She also coordinates all rules education programs for coaches and staff, as well as initial and continuing eligibility for all student-athletes.

She also serves as the sport administrator for the men’s and women’s basketball, men’s and women’s swimming and diving and gymnastics programs. In this role, she supervises all aspects of the daily operations of the five squads.

She also serves as the department liaison with campus constituents including the Offices of Admissions, Financial Aid, Residence Life, the Registrar, Bursar and Institutional Advancement.

During her time at SCSU, Pearman has developed and implemented several new policies and procedures, including the Athletic Department Study Table and Tutorial programs. Academic success for Owls’ student-athletes continues to soar to an all-time high thanks to these initiatives. The department has had nearly 1,200 selections Northeast-10 Commissioners Honor Roll over the course of the past five years. In addition, more than 100 student-athletes were recognized at the conference level or higher for academic excellence within a specific sport in each of the past five years.

Pearman also serves as a member of the Student Athlete Advisory Board and serves on the planning committee for the Annual Owl Golf Classic. She has also served on the University’s Drug and Alcohol Task Force Committee. On the internal front, Pearman has also chaired several committees at SCSU.

She has also been active on the conference and regional levels, having served as the department representative on the Northeast-10 Conference’s Committee for Sports Administration. Pearman also completed a term on the NCAA Division II East Regional Women’s Basketball Committee.

Also a respected member of the coaching community, Pearman was the head women’s basketball coach at Rhode Island from 1999-2004 and guided the Rams to the Atlantic 10 Conference Championship game for only the second time in the history of the program. She also helped to reenergize the local community through extensive outreach and fundraising efforts and resulted in new benchmarks in annual giving and attendance.

In addition, Pearman’s teams had three consecutive winning seasons for only the second time in URI history.

Equally as impressive was the fact that all players that completed their eligibility under Pearman graduated during her stint with the Rams.

Pearman took over at URI after serving as the associate head coach with the New England Blizzard of the American Basketball League. In this role, she provided leadership in the pioneering effort to organize and conduct the first professional basketball league for women.

She joined the Blizzard after a successful stint as an assistant coach at the University of Maryland (1985-97). During her time at Maryland as both a student-athlete and coach, the Terps won six ACC championships and appeared in 12 NCAA tournaments with three Elite Eight berths and two Final Four berths.

Numerous individuals who once played for Pearman have since moved on into the college coaching ranks at institutions in several notable Division I conferences, including the Atlantic Coast Conference, Big East Conference, West Coast Conference, Atlantic-10 Conference and Northeast Conference.

A four-year starter and Second Team All-Atlantic Coast Conference player at the University of Maryland from 1980-84, Pearman earned a bachelor’s degree from UM.

Pearman, who also has amassed experience in the private sector as a community consultant, currently resides in Cheshire, Conn.

MICHAEL KOBYLANSKI

Associate Director of Athletics/
Communications



Veteran athletic administrator Michael Kobylanski joined the Owls' staff in July, 2007 and is in his sixth year as Associate Director of Athletics/Communications.

He oversees all internal and external communications efforts for the SCSU Athletic Department and its 19 varsity sports, including media relations, publications, marketing, promotions, community relations and corporate sponsorship. He also serves as the sport administrator for the Owls' baseball, field hockey and women's lacrosse programs, as well as the department's NCAA CHAMPS/Life Skills Coordinator. In total, Kobylanski has amassed more than a decade's worth of experience within the field of collegiate athletic administration.

Kobylanski's first five years at SCSU have been highlighted by the formation of numerous key initiatives, including the relaunch of a renamed athletic department website - www.southernctowls.com, implementation of the Community Service Cup and National Student-Athlete Day event and the creation of comprehensive marketing and promotional schedules for all athletic programs.

In addition, Kobylanski has also played a pivotal role investigating and securing new corporate sponsors, implementing consistent brand imagery for external publications and promoting athletic department initiatives through an array of on- and off-campus measures.

He has also spearheaded new community outreach initiatives both on-campus and within Greater New Haven, including the creation of relationships with local groups such as the Boys and Girls Club and New Haven elementary schools.

Kobylanski also served as the search committee chair for the head men's basketball coach vacancy that resulted in the successful hire of Michael Donnelly.

Extremely active within the local community, Kobylanski is a member of the Knights of Columbus Council 9921 and a co-chair of the Greater New Haven Chamber of Commerce Sports Council Steering Committee. He is a past member of the New Haven YMCA Youth Center Board of Managers and a past co-chair of the March of Dimes' annual 'Elm City Legends' event.

Prior to joining the SCSU staff, he served as both Assistant Athletic Director and Sports Information Director during a six-year run at Quinnipiac University. In that role, Kobylanski was responsible for the publicity and media relations for 21 Division I programs and oversaw the daily operations of the Sports Information office.

Hines previously served as director of intramurals, where he oversaw a broad-based program comprised of 10 leagues and nearly 1,000 participants. Just the third director of intramurals in SCSU history, he replaced the legendary Bob Dikranian.

Southern Connecticut

State University maintains an outstanding intercollegiate athletic program for men and women, recognizing the needs of students in individual and team sports. The Owls are members of the Northeast-10 Conference, the Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) and the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division II. Southern's women's gymnastics program also participates in the USA Gymnastics collegiate championships.

Southern has had numerous individual NCAA champions in swimming, track and field and gymnastics and ranks among the top 10 of Division II colleges and universities for most individual championships. In addition, the Owls have won a NCAA Division II record six NCAA team titles in men's soccer, three in men's gymnastics and one in women's basketball.

Women's programs in cross country, field hockey, volleyball, soccer, swimming, gymnastics, basketball, track and field (indoor & outdoor), lacrosse and softball have produced many distinguished athletes and coaches. Southern has a rich tradition in women's basketball, having placed among the top four teams nationally four times. The Owls' Mary Anne O'Connor and Sue Rojcewicz were members of the 1976 U.S. Olympic women's basketball team, which won a silver medal at Montreal. The 2007 team won the Division II National Championship for the first time in program history while finishing the year 34-2 overall.

Men's programs include soccer, cross country, football, track and field (indoor & outdoor), swimming, basketball and baseball. The Owls' Ben Michaelson, a 10-time NCAA champion in swimming, won two gold medals and set two records in 2003 for the United States at the Pan American Games. Peter Kormann, who coached U.S. Olympic teams at Atlanta in 1996 and in Sydney in 2000, became the first U.S. gymnast in 44 years to win an Olympic medal when he captured a bronze medal in floor exercise at the 1976 Montreal Olympic Games. Owls' gymnastics coach emeritus Abie Grossfeld coached the U.S. Olympic team in 1972, 1984 and 1988, leading his team to a team gold medal in 1984.

Among Southern alumni in professional sports, Joe Andruzzi recently retired after a 10-year career with the New England Patriots, Green Bay Packers and Cleveland Browns of the National Football League. Andruzzi was a part of three Super Bowl winning clubs with the Patriots. Currently, Jacques Cesaire is a defensive lineman with the San Diego Chargers.

The Owls also have a strong presence in the National Football League coaching ranks. Kevin Gilbride currently serves as offensive coordinator for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants. He was also the head coach for the San Diego Chargers during a NFL coaching career that has spanned more than 20 years. Chris Palmer is the current offensive coordinator for the Tennessee Titans. He was the quarterbacks coach for the Giants during their Super Bowl XLII victory and has also been the head coach of the Cleveland Browns during a NFL coaching career of more than two decades. Tim Holt is in his first year as offensive line coach for the Chicago Bears after three years on the staff of the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

Bo Oshoniyi, currently an assistant men's soccer coach at Penn State University, retired from Major League Soccer after suiting up with the Columbus Crew and Kansas City Wizards. Fellow men's soccer alum Brian Bliss played for three teams in MLS and also served as head coach of Kansas City. He is currently the Technical Director with Columbus. Two-time Major League Soccer All-Star Mike Petke retired from the MLS with the New York Red Bulls in 2010. Former Owl Juan Carlos Osorio is a past head coach of Red Bull New York.

The Owls have enjoyed a strong alumni presence in the college basketball coaching community. Joan Bonvicini is the head coach at Seattle University and has also served as head coach at the University of Arizona and Long Beach State University in a distinguished career with more than 600 victories. Cathy Inglese is the head coach at the University of Rhode Island after previous stops at Boston College and the University of Vermont. She has totaled more than 400 victories in her coaching career. Don Perrelli, a former SCSU men's basketball standout, won more than 400 games as a college women's basketball coach with stops at SCSU, St. John's and Northwestern University.

Dedicated in November of 1988, Jess Dow Field is a multi-million dollar stadium facility which can accommodate football, soccer, field hockey, lacrosse and track and field. The AstroPlay artificially-surfaced playing field is surrounded by an eight-lane, state-of-the-art 400-meter track surface, both of which were replaced in 2000. Directly adjacent to Southern's Moore Field House, Dow Field is lighted and has seating for some 6,000. The facility was completely resurfaced in the summer, 2011.

James W. Moore Field House is Southern's primary indoor athletic complex. The main arena, with a permanent seating capacity of 2,800, has a six-lane, artificially-surfaced track (200 meters), which was completely renovated in the summer of 1997. The fieldhouse is utilized for all major indoor events and can accommodate multiple practice sessions simultaneously. Drop curtains and netting allow the main arena to accommodate a complete baseball or softball infield for practice as well as the traditional indoor programs.

Moore Field House also has complete weight-training facilities, locker rooms and equipment rooms. Located in Moore Fieldhouse, Hutchinson Natatorium has an eight-lane swimming pool with both one- and three-meter diving boards and a Colorado timing system.

The recently renovated Pelz Gymnasium is the oldest of the Southern athletic facilities and is utilized primarily for physical education classes, recreation & intramurals, women's gymnastics, and volleyball. The facility has a six-lane pool and an independent, auxiliary gymnasium for gymnastics.

The Owls also recently refurbished their softball facility behind Pelz Gym and opened a new baseball complex in the fall of 2001.

All of the Southern facilities have played host to collegiate and scholastic championship events.
