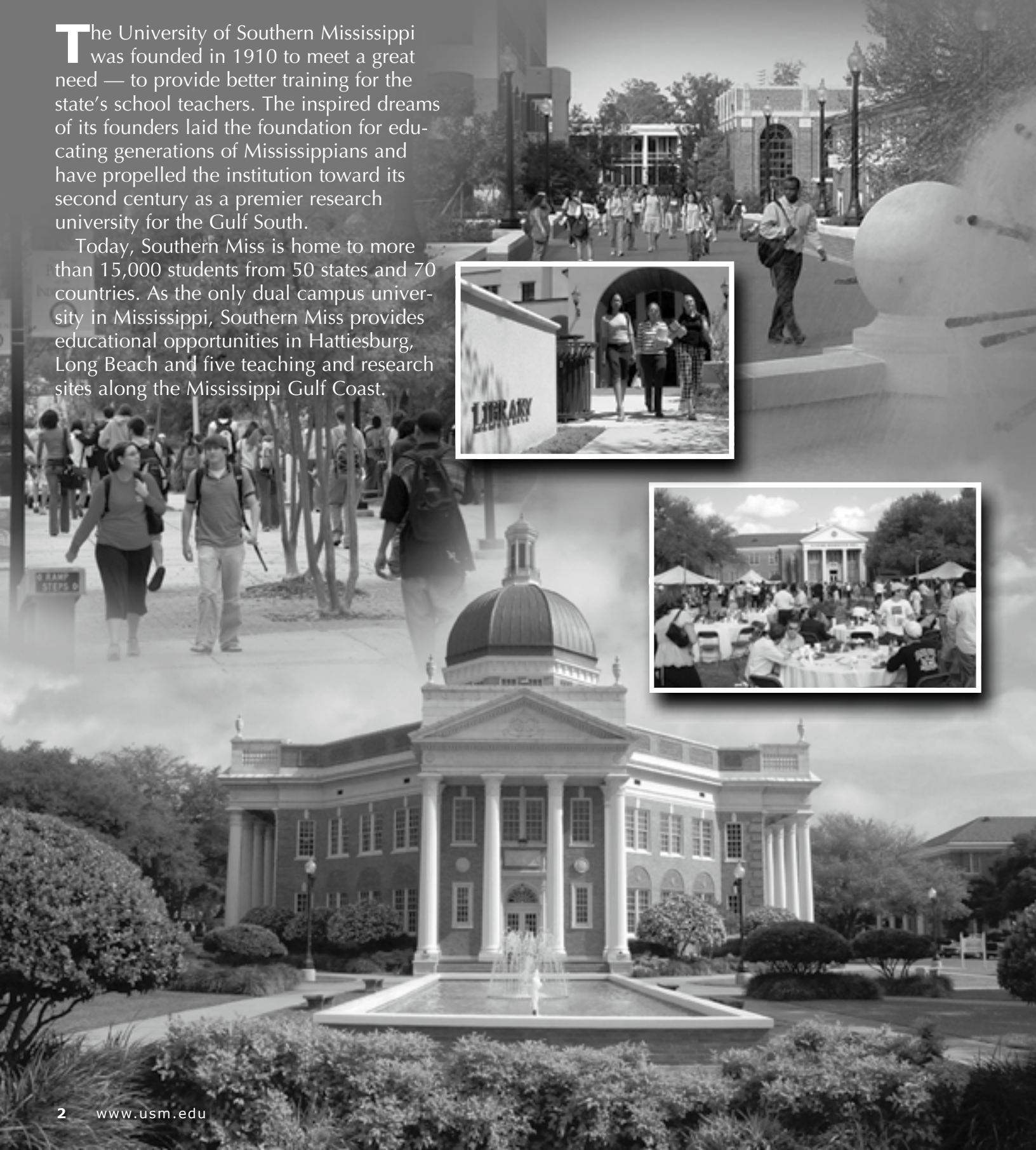

# Southern Miss – Creative. Bold. Determined.

The University of Southern Mississippi was founded in 1910 to meet a great need — to provide better training for the state’s school teachers. The inspired dreams of its founders laid the foundation for educating generations of Mississippians and have propelled the institution toward its second century as a premier research university for the Gulf South.

Today, Southern Miss is home to more than 15,000 students from 50 states and 70 countries. As the only dual campus university in Mississippi, Southern Miss provides educational opportunities in Hattiesburg, Long Beach and five teaching and research sites along the Mississippi Gulf Coast.



# Southern Miss – Creative. Bold. Determined.



- Southern Miss is one of 25 universities in the United States that is nationally accredited in all four arts disciplines: theater, dance, art and music. The university hosts over 300 arts events every year.

- The School of Nursing provides the profession with the largest number of nursing graduates in the state, more than 5,500 since the school was established in 1967.



- As a Carnegie I research extensive university, Southern Miss faculty and staff maintain a high level of research activity that has resulted in a two-year average of \$100 million in external research funding for projects that have widespread applications from homeland security to math and science education.

- For more than 30 years, the British Studies Program at Southern Miss has offered students the opportunity for study, research and travel. It is the largest summer program for Americans in London and attracts students from across the country.



## Southern Miss – Creative. Bold. Determined.

- Southern Miss is home to the nation's first Center for Spectator Sports Security Management, established in 2006. The center has received more than \$5.7 million in funding for research and development of institutional physical protection systems for college and university football stadiums, custom stadium emergency response simulation software and a pilot project to award certification for sports safety and security across the nation.



- The School of Polymers and High Performance Materials and the Center for Science and Mathematics Education both rank among the top 10 nationally in faculty productivity according to Academic Analytics.



- Research at the Marine Aquaculture Center at the Gulf Coast Research Laboratory in Ocean Springs, Miss., is focused on creating new technology to meet America's demand for seafood. As one of the university's innovation and commercialization clusters, marine aquaculture is supported by a \$10 million annual research base.

- The Trent Lott National Center for Entrepreneurship and Economic Development will be complete in 2009 and will be home to the Department of Economic and Workforce Development and its related programs.

- The University of Southern Mississippi Symphony Orchestra is the oldest orchestra in Mississippi and has performed in concert with many of the top classical artists in the world including Placido Domingo, Itzhak Perlman, Yo-Yo Ma and Sir James Galway.

- Ranked number one in Conference USA for football fans and game-day atmosphere by *Sporting News*, Southern Miss offers a fun-filled family weekend with food, friends and the exhilarating experience of watching the Golden Eagles take the field.

- The Honors College at Southern Miss is the sixth oldest honors college in the country and offers high-achieving students the opportunity to take on a challenging curriculum.

- The Thad Cochran Center, a 237,000-square-foot addition to the R.C. Cook Student Union, is home to on-campus dining at the Fresh Food Company, the Barnes & Noble Bookstore and meeting rooms for both campus and community use.

- Students and faculty members logged 40,000 hours of volunteer service in the community over the past two years. The Corporation for National and Community Service named Southern Miss to the 2008 President's Higher Education Community Service Honor Roll for exemplary efforts and service to disadvantaged youth.



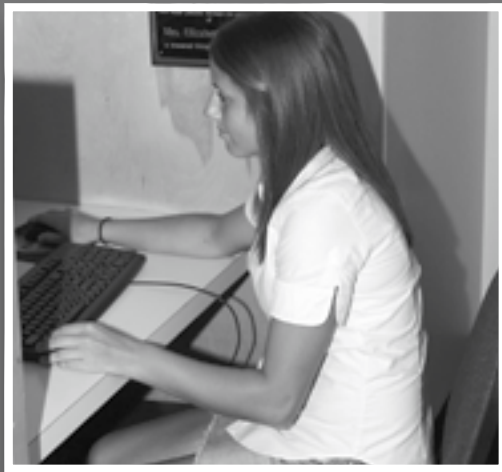

With a proud heritage and promising future, Southern Miss is poised for its next century of commitment to scholarship, teaching and service.

The university will pay tribute to both past and future during a year-long centennial — *A Treasured Past and A Golden Future* — that will culminate on March 30, 2010, the 100th anniversary of its legislative founding.



## Academic Success

**G**olden Eagle student-athletes understand that achieving a quality education is the most important thing in their collegiate life. However, with the demands of each athlete's athletic pursuits, balancing both is, at times, difficult



to achieve. Thankfully, the Southern Miss Student Academic Enhancement Program (SAEP) helps its student-athletes attain and maintain that balance by providing quality academic support services. The mission of the SAEP is designed to give Golden Eagle athletes needed support to assure that academic success is realistic, not only during the athlete's playing days, but also after his or her eligibility has expired.

- The SAEP emphasizes making the academic career at the university one of production, by counseling student-athletes in a variety of areas, including course selection and degree plans.

- The SAEP also focuses on preparing the student-

athlete for life beyond graduation.

- Aided with the help of tutors, the SAEP offers individualized tutoring in all courses and an academic center that includes a study hall and full access computer lab.

- In addition, the SAEP also monitors NCAA eligibility requirements for the

student-athletes, ensuring participation in their respective sports.

- Golden Eagle student-athletes also are involved in a variety of individual and group community service projects, along with life skills programs that further develop the overall person.

- The graduation rates of all

student-athletes at Southern Miss are higher than those of non-athletes.

- Golden Eagle athletes are consistent members on the President's and Dean's Lists, as well as among the leaders in Conference USA scholars.

- During the 2007-08 academic year, Southern Miss had four student-athletes win ESPN Academic All-American. There were 19 student-athletes to make the Conference USA Commissioner's Academic Medal for a grade point average of 3.75 or better, while 111 made the Commissioner's Honor Roll.

- Seven different Southern Miss student-athletes captured C-USA All-Academic Team honors for their respective sports.

## Athletics Facilities

The Southern Miss Department of Athletics unveiled a new vision a little more than five years ago. It's a vision unlike any other that Golden Eagle followers have seen in the history of the school. It's a vision that helps continue to move Southern Miss to the forefront of Conference USA and beyond. When the grand-scale expansion and improvements plan was laid out in April 2003 by Director of Athletics Richard Giannini, Southern Miss began to take its first steps in becoming one of the most competitive overall programs in the nation. The comprehensive facilities initiative seeks marked improvements in every sporting venue, further ensuring Southern Miss' place among the elite athletic programs in the nation.

- Reed Green Coliseum is the 8,095-seat on-campus venue for Southern Miss' men's and women's basketball programs. The facility, which was formally dedicated on Dec. 11, 1965, recently celebrated its 42nd anniversary during the 2007-08 basketball season. A number of improvements have been made to the Coliseum in recent years, including the installation of a new heating and cooling system in the summer of 2004 and the installation of a new floor in

the spring of 2006. Work on phase two of the renovation project - which will include changes and updates to the coaches' offices, player locker rooms and training areas - was completed in the summer of 2008.

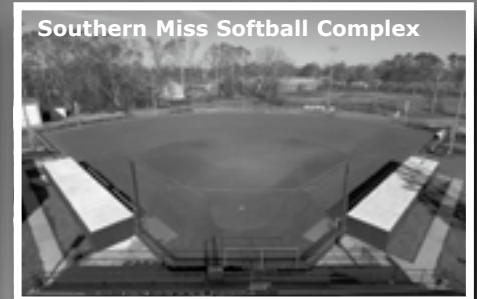
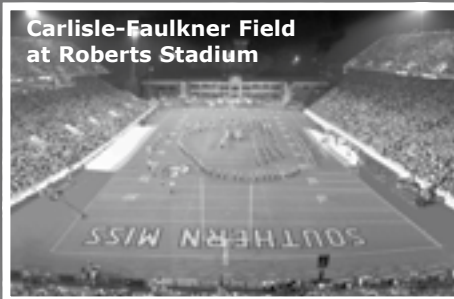
- Pete Taylor Park/Hill Denson Field has been the home of Southern Miss baseball since 1985, and "The Pete" as it is nicknamed, has seated more than a million fans who have entered its gates. The stadium features bleacher seating for 2,000 fans and chair back seating for 1,678. The stadium also has new media facilities and an increasingly popular right field lounge area known as the "Right Field Roost," which has reserved parking for 40 vehicles and is equipped with barbeque grills. The waiting list for a spot in this area continues to grow. The construction of 12 private luxury suites and a new press box debuted during the 2008 season. Preliminary plans are now in the works to put 500 additional chairback seats down the third-base line.

- The Southern Miss Softball Complex has been the home of Lady Eagle Softball since the spring of 2002. Bleacher seating for more than 500 is currently available, as well as concession and restroom facilities. An

indoor hitting facility was installed in January 2005 and additional batting cages are located behind the first base dugout. Future plans include a permanent grandstand with bench-back seating that will span from dugout to dugout. Other projected additions include a fully-equipped press box.

- The Southern Miss Track and Field and Soccer Complex is the home of the Golden Eagle track and field and soccer programs. The complex, which consists of a track, soccer field, press box and storage facilities, has bleacher seating for approximately 850. The complex also is equipped with a state-of-the-art Daktronics scoreboard.

- The Rogers, Thames and Welch Baseball Center at Pete Taylor Park, is a 6,000 square-foot facility, adjacent to the first-base side of the park, provides state-of-the-art facilities, including a team locker room, training room, players' lounge, an area for equipment storage and distribution, a laundry area, as well as coaches' offices and dressing areas for coaches and umpires. There also is a large lobby area at the entrance of the building, displaying the history and tradition of the baseball program.





## Athletic Training

**B**umps, bruises, aches and pains are all common when playing a varsity sport, especially with practices, games, weight training and conditioning drills, which are all parts of a student-athlete's collegiate life. But thanks to the hard work and devotion of Southern Miss' certified athletic trainers and student athletic trainers, Golden Eagle athletes receive proper treatment and care to keep their performance at the highest level in order to remain on the field of competition. Southern Miss also has a quality group of physicians who meet the medical needs of the 16 athletic teams at the University. The physicians are mostly specialists who are skilled in the various types of injuries that can occur in athletic competition.

- The program revolves around three major aspects – prevention of athletic injuries, treatment and rehabilitation of those injuries and recognition of injuries that require referral to appropriate medical personnel.
- The program is accredited nationally by the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs (CAAHEP) standards. In the program's

last review, the Southern Miss Athletic Training Program surpassed CAAHEP standards, allowing the program to continue with its certification.

- The direct involvement of the student athletic trainers helps make the program a success. The students are enrolled in an accredited five-semester curriculum in the athletic training program at the University and are the core foundation of the athletic training department.
- The athletic training program has seen a huge influx of students in recent years, and the program's numbers increase each year. Over the last 15 years, the athletic training programs' student staff has grown, from 25 students in 1989 to more than 40 in 2006.
- The athletic center also has resulted in more space for the athletic training program. The staff is now able to utilize a much larger athletic training room with state-of-the-art equipment able to handle the care for more than 300 athletes.
- The athletic training room is an open area where Todd McCall and his staff can view all the aspects of sports medicine.

There are 11 examination tables in the 4,000-square-foot room, 10 of which are housed in the main training room. The other table exists in a private examination room that team physicians utilize.

- The facility also houses a state-of-the-art hydrotherapeutic swimming pool, which provides athletes with water resistance to speed up the rehabilitation, while decreasing stress on the injured body parts.
- Along with the hydrotherapeutic pool, the facility also benefits student-athletes with an in-house X-ray unit, which helps reduce the time the athlete is off the field. Instead of waiting a few days to get an X-ray appointment, the athletes can have their injuries evaluated in a much shorter amount of time.
- On top of the benefits the student-athletes get from the facility, the athletic training staff and the athletic training students also benefit. The facility allows for a learning-lab environment that helps in the educational aspects of the program. The facility gives the athletic training staff more room for storage, which helps to maintain a better inventory of supplies used on a daily basis.

## Strength and Conditioning

**T**he Golden Eagle teams strive to play at its peak level each week during its season. To do that, much preparation, hard work and dedication is needed, to attain the high performance that is associated with Southern Miss teams each year. Physical preparation and conditioning is the foundation to that success. Each player understands that offseason work is the stepping stone to the next season, and without hard work, dedication and many hours of training, becoming a champion is impossible.

- The Southern Miss strength and conditioning program has two main goals – helping athletes to enhance their individual performance potential and aiding in the prevention of injuries through training.
- The athletes receive a specialized work-out that concentrates on improving their performance levels.
- Southern Miss athletes are committed to offseason workouts.
- The program has been enhanced with the recent addition of the strength and conditioning facility.

- Within the athletic center, student-athletes enjoy the benefits of a spacious, state-of-the-art workout area.
- Spacious floor area with 4,300 square feet of workable space, more than doubling the size of the previous weight room.
- A maximum of 48 athletes can be safely trained in the workout area.
- The workout area features equipment from some of the leading manufacturers of training equipment in the nation, including Power Lift, Hammer Strength and Life Fitness.
- There are 12 training platforms and 12 racks, as well as six "jammer" machines.
- There are also a number of workout machines that target each of the major muscle groups in the body, along with dumbbells and cardiovascular equipment.

## The President



**Dr. Martha D. Saunders**  
President

After completing her first year as president of The University of Southern Mississippi, Martha Dunagin Saunders is poised to lead the university toward its centennial with an even more determined sense of purpose and commitment to scholarship, teaching and service.

"I wake up every day with an overpowering sense of urgency to make a positive difference at Southern Miss," said Saunders, named the university's ninth and first woman president in 2007.

Under her leadership, the university launched a planning initiative last fall that engaged a cross-section of students, faculty, staff, alumni and community leaders in dialogues to identify the strengths of the university and the aspirations of its people. Participants identified four areas of strategic focus as keys to creating the university's desired future.

Saunders aims to focus on enhancing the national visibility of Southern Miss, strengthening relationships with the community, creating a healthy campus by embracing the tenets of sustainability and enhancing academic success through top-flight educational experiences.

"Success lies in the ability to translate vision into action," says Saunders, who intends to outline specifics in these areas and develop a planning document with help from a 23-member Strategic Planning Committee.

Other initiatives begun during the past year include

- An enrollment management planning process that goes beyond admissions and recruiting to strategically focus and manage the university's enrollment is underway.

- Planning for the new Cross Creek campus on the Mississippi Gulf Coast has begun. The IHL selected the location, and Saunders is leading the charge to thoughtfully plan and develop the campus to serve the higher educational needs of Gulf Coast residents;

- A Centennial committee is planning events for the university's 100th anniversary celebration that will be observed from 2010 to 2012.

Throughout her 30-year career in higher education, Dr. Saunders has taught thousands of students. Her philosophy of education follows three simple guiding principles: know your students, connect them to bigger things and set a good example.

A native of Hattiesburg, Miss., and a Southern Miss alum, Saunders tells students that much of what she remembers from being a student herself at the university is still true today – the family atmosphere, educational excellence and freedom to be yourself.

Saunders challenges the students to "ride all the rides" – do everything that's available to you as a student; and that "it doesn't count unless you finish, so plan to graduate!"

Dr. Saunders came to Southern Miss from Wisconsin-Whitewater, where she served as chancellor. During her tenure, she brought the campus together with a

widely inclusive strategic planning process; hosted a successful Higher Learning Commission re-accreditation review; and finalized plans for major building projects totaling \$110 million, including a new University Center and a new building for the College of Business and Economics.

Prior to her appointment at Wisconsin-Whitewater, she was vice president for academic affairs at Columbus State University in Columbus, Ga., where she was on the leadership team for a successful \$100 million capital campaign, and developed several initiatives to increase student enrollment and to recruit and retain outstanding faculty and staff.

She previously held the position of dean of the College of Arts and Sciences at the University of West Florida, where she was director of the University Honors Program.

Dr. Saunders' training and experience in the field of communication led to numerous publications on crisis communication and public relations; widely anthologized published speeches; and the Public Relations Society of America's highest national award for the "Just 2 It!" public safety communication campaign.

"Build trust, build a team and build a campus" is the mantra Dr. Saunders brings to her presidency. "Trust-building is very important, and team-building is right on its heels," she states.





## Director of Athletics



**Richard Giannini**

Director of Athletics/Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of the Southern Miss Athletic Foundation

Since Richard Giannini was named Director of Athletics in 1999, his vision, leadership and unwavering work ethic has transformed the face and landscape of Southern Miss athletics that will have lasting effects for years to come.

In fact, to see the impact he has made on Golden Eagle Athletics, one need only look at all the improvements that have been made during his tenure, especially in the areas of academics, facilities, athletic achievement and increased revenue.

A tireless and innovative administrator, Giannini brought outstanding intercollegiate athletic experience to Hattiesburg, including five years as director of athletics at one of Southern Miss' longtime interstate rivals, Louisiana-Monroe.

While working for the NCAA in the mid-1970s, Giannini's responsibilities included serving as executive producer of the ABC Football Highlight Shows, as well as NCAA Tournament basketball games not aired by NBC. He also arranged and produced the first national telecast of the College Baseball World Series for HBO, and produced numerous conference football highlight films. He was also director of licensing for the NCAA.

He served as assistant sports information director at Florida (his alma mater) from 1966 to 1970, was sports information director at Duke from 1970 to 1973, became assistant athletics director at Duke in 1974, and, after working for the NCAA in 1976 and 1977, returned to Florida as senior associate athletics director to oversee external affairs.

He left Florida in 1986 to enter the private sector, taking over as CEO and co-owner of Raycom Management Group in Charlotte, N.C., a subsidiary of Raycom Sports, where he developed numerous sporting events, including the Blockbuster Bowl, the most successful first-year bowl in NCAA history.

Giannini's successes have not gone unnoticed. He was inducted into the University of Florida's College of Health and Human Performance Hall of Fame in March of 2004 and the Saint Leo University Athletics Hall of Fame in February of 2005. The Golden Eagle athletics director was a track athlete, competing in the weight events, at Furman; and graduated from the University of Florida in 1966.

He serves on several Conference USA committees, was chairman of the C-USA football athletic director's committee in 2001-02 and currently serves as the chairman of the Football Committee and also is on the Scheduling, Finance and Strategic Planning Committees. Giannini recently completed a term on the NCAA Football Issues Committee and is in the fourth year of a four-year term as a member of the NCAA Championships Cabinet. He also is in the fourth year on the NCAA postseason football licensing committee, which governs all bowl games, and currently serves as its chairman. He also represents C-USA Athletics Directors at BCS meetings.

Giannini and his wife, Gayle, are parents of four daughters—Ansley Stone, Brittney Bobbush, Carlyn Linker, and DeLancey, and grandparents of Tori, Parker, Sara, Kelsey, Ryleigh, and Kyle.

### During Giannini's Tenure

- The Graduation Rates and Academic Progress Rates of USM student-athletes have been recognized as one of the best in the nation. Last year, the NCAA graduation success rate for all athletes was 83 percent, football was 81 percent and men's basketball 82 percent. The APR rate continues to improve with each of the University's 16 athletic programs and baseball was public recognized by the NCAA as having a Top 10 percent ranking in APR among Division I programs.

- The football team was honored by the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) for having a graduation rate of 90 percent or better in 2006. The program also has been honored for four of the past six years for having a graduation rate of 70 percent or better.

- Southern Miss has had 14 *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-Americans, 17 Conference USA Scholar Athletes of the Year, 192 Conference USA Academic Medalists (3.75 GPA or higher) and 694 Commissioner's Honor Roll (3.0 or better), including 111 for the 2007-08 year.

- Established the Southern Miss Athletic Foundation and has spearheaded efforts to raise more than \$60 million in property, cash and endowments with the addition of pledges and suite leases totaling near \$100 million raised in the last nine years, including the development of the Circle of Champions program, which currently has over

120 members, who each committed \$100,000.

- Introduced and implemented a new athletic department logo in 2003, which has tripled the amount of licensing revenue for the department.

- Increased the amount of endowed scholarships to over 85, worth a total of \$3.8 million, and raised the athletic giving from \$750,000 to an excess of \$5 million annually through the Athletic Foundation.

- Orchestrated and renegotiated a multi-media rights agreement with ISP Sports, a national Sports Marketing Firm, which guarantees the University a sizeable rights fee and has reduced its expenses by almost \$250,000.

- Since 1999, he has overseen over \$60 million worth of new athletic facilities or renovations to current ones.

- He is currently overseeing a \$50 million facility upgrade, which includes renovation and expansion projects at M. M. Roberts Stadium and Reed Green Coliseum. A new state-of-the-art high definition scoreboard was added to Roberts Stadium for the 2007 season.

- A new baseball press box and 12 luxury suites were completed at Pete Taylor Park in 2008.

- The Athletic Center, an \$11 million edifice which replaced an aging Fairchild Fieldhouse, was erected and has been in use since 2002.

- The Rogers, Thames and Welch Baseball Center at Pete Taylor Park was completed in 2002.

- A new women's softball facility has been in use for the past seven seasons. Additions and improvements will begin on December of 2008.

- Construction on a new \$4.2 tennis complex began in June of 2008.

- A new artificial turf system, Momentum Turf by SportExe, was installed on Carlisle-Faulkner Field in Roberts Stadium in 2004.

- A new lighting system was installed at Roberts Stadium to meet the lighting requirements so the football games can be televised.

- The Golden Eagles have been the only Conference USA program to have won championships in the sports of football (1996, 1997, 1999 and 2003), men's basketball (2001) and baseball (2003).

- The football team won the Conference USA championship in 1999 and 2003 and has participated in a postseason bowl game in every year but one during his tenure at Southern Miss. Various players have earned 44 All-American honors.

- The baseball team has enjoyed the best six-year period in the program's history, making six-straight appearances in the NCAA Tournament and hosting the 2003 Hattiesburg Regional. Various players have earned 27 All-American honors.

- The softball team participated in three NCAA Tournaments and advanced to the 2000 Women's College World Series, finishing fourth in the nation.

to bring national attention to the University, and the Eagle Club is part of that effort at Southern Miss. All Eagle Club members know 100 percent of their donation is going to assist a deserving student-athlete. ## 2009 Women's Tennis Outlook

The Southern Miss women's tennis team will enter the 2009 season strong, following two back to back winning seasons. The Lady Eagles compiled an overall record of 8-6 in the 2008 season, including a 2-1 conference record.

This year's team will feature an equal mixture of veterans and promising newcomers. The newcomers on the team include: Sarah-Louise Ellis (Staffordshire, Great Britain), Alexandra Kaluza (Beaver, Pa.), Hollie Robinson (Norwich, Great Britain), and Elja van Berlo (Erp, The Netherlands).

However, the team lost four seniors, returning only four letterwinners, two juniors and two sophomores.

The veteran Lady Eagles include: captain Stephanie Dellocono (Baton Rouge, La.), co-captain Lauren Gutterman (Mandeville, La.), Zoe Lee (Hale, Great Britain) and Shannon Rogers (Virginia Beach, Va.).

Head coach Randy Rowley will enter his seventh season as the Lady Eagle's head coach, and he knows that this year will be challenging, yet promising.

"We lost four seniors, our number one, two, three, and seven. So this year is obviously going to be our rebuilding year," Rowley said. "I feel good about it, but I also feel that the kids we have brought in are very young and just trying to learn the system, and also to grow up and be here on their own. That just takes time, it's nothing new. But I am excited about it; we will see how everybody grows up."

Rowley will rely on his two co-captains, juniors Stephanie Dellocono and Lauren Gutterman, to lead the team.

"We have two veteran captains, with Stephanie and Lauren, if they step up and take control of the team as well; I think it can be a very good year because they have a lot to share and a lot to teach."

Dellocono finished her sophomore season with an overall record of 14-6, including a dual match record of 9-3. She was

very competitive in doubles, finishing with a season record of 15-7. Dellocono missed fall play because of a shoulder injury, but will be back for the spring season.

"I think missing the fall is going to take her a little while to get back into the game. She could be one of the winningest players in school history," commented Rowley. "Stephanie had a very good junior career, and is very experienced in singles and doubles. She is very explosive and will play at the top of the lineup for sure."

Co-captain Gutterman also had a competitive 2008 season, finishing 11-9 in singles and 11-11 in doubles play. Like Dellocono, Gutterman is also coming into the season off of two

back to back winning seasons.

"Lauren is the kind of kid that can do it all. I think when she continues to get a little stronger in the weight room she is going to be an even better player," said Rowley. "What I really like about Lauren is she is not afraid to talk to the girls, not afraid to step up. She brings a lot to the program not only on the court but off the court as well."

Zoe Lee is one of the two returning sophomores on the team this year. She finished last season with an overall singles record of 10-12, in addition to a doubles record of 5-10.

"Zoe is one of those players that does a lot of things right, in order for her to be successful, she doesn't need to get out of that box, she just needs to stay and do the things she does well," commented Rowley. "If she continues to do that, she is going to continue to stay in our lineup and

help out."

Shannon Rogers will also be entering her second season with the Lady Eagles. Last year she finished strong in doubles with an 11-9 record, as well as tallying a 6-7 record in singles.

"Shannon is a dynamic doubles player,

she is always in the lineup helping us in that area," said Rowley. "She is continuing to get better in singles, but the main reason she came here is because of her doubles strength and she is going to continue helping us in that area."

Elja van Berlo is one of four newcomers to join the Lady Eagles this year. She comes to the team from Holland, and looks to be a promising addition to the group.

"She is probably one of the steadiest players I have ever coached. She is very, very smart and really knows her way around the court," Rowley said of van Berlo. "She is very experienced at singles and doubles. The main thing for her is getting stronger, she is very tall and very thin, and so I think once she grows into her body, there will be a quick growth and level change for her just because of everything she can do. She can really do it all."

Alexandra Kaluza will also be joining the team this year. She is a sophomore transfer from West Virginia University.

"She has the type of game that could

really affect a lot of people's play, she is very steady and she doesn't do anything flashy, she just makes you hit a lot of balls," Rowley said of Kaluza. "If she is going to lose, it's going to be because someone has truly beaten her. With her doubles, we are just trying to fit her in with the right person. She brings in good experience, she was nationally ranked in juniors and highly recruited out of juniors, so I think she can bring a lot to the table if she stays organized and focused on what she is doing."

Another promising newcomer is Hollie Robinson, a junior transfer from Arkansas Little Rock, who hails from Norwich, Great Britain.

"She is very young, coming over when she was 16," Rowley said. "She is 18 now, so even though you look at her as a junior, she is still very young. Obviously being from England, it is still kind of a growing

process for her. Hollie is one of those kids who does not like to lose one single point. She is an absolute fighter, an absolute thrill to be around, a great kid, a real team person and is definitely going to be an asset to the program."

Sarah-Louise Ellis is the latest addition to Lady Eagles, joining the team in January.

"We are still looking to see what she can do. She is a steady player, she just kind of came right in when the program had already started, she was here four days and then was off to Auburn with us," commented Rowley. "We are still learning more about her. Her game seems to be very explosive, we need to work on her consistency but she is a nice addition to the program."

Last season was a struggle

for the Lady Eagles. The team expected great things after returning from the best season in Lady Eagle history. However, injuries overcame the team as they tried to prevail.

"Last year we felt we would have a very good year, because of all the people we were bringing back, we only lost one person, and the year before was the best year we had in school history," commented Rowley. "Unfortunately, we struggled with injuries, and for the whole year we did not have our full lineup. Although it wasn't a bad season, we finished tied for fifth in the conference, out of 12 teams, but compared to the year we had before it was a disappointment."

Although this may be a rebuilding year, Rowley still has expectations for the 2009 season.

"I think it could be a learning year, but it could be even better. I think we have a good team and we could be close to getting into the national rankings, and if we don't then I think we will be very close," said Rowley. "Again, we just have to stay away from the injuries; if we can get through things like that then I think we can have a good team."

**R**andy Rowley enters his seventh season as the head coach of the Lady Eagles' tennis program. Rowley has brought a new attitude and high expectations to the Lady Eagle program. Since his arrival, he has turned a 3-21 program into a team that has become the winningest program in school history. Under Rowley, the program has achieved Southern Miss' first national team ranking, recorded the most wins in a single season and finished

third in the Conference USA tennis championships. His Lady Eagles have excelled in the classroom, twice winning the Forrest General Hospital GPA Award, winner of the Conference USA GPA Award in 2002 and NCAA-All Academic team.

In 2003, Rowley started the "Lady Eagle Tennis Classic" that is held each spring on the Mississippi Gulf Coast. Rowley has been selected five times as an NCAA Representative for the NCAA Tennis Championships.

While also coaching the Golden Eagles, Rowley has split his time traveling and coaching on the WTA tour, spending two months helping conduct a preseason training camp and coaching at the 2007 Australian Open Grand Slam, the 2007 Mondial Australian Women's Hardcourts, the 2007 Pacific Life Open and the 2007 United States Open Grand Slam.

Rowley comes to Southern Miss after spending three seasons as the assistant men's tennis coach at Texas Tech University. During that time, he was twice the NCAA Representative for the NCAA Tennis Championships. The Red Raiders were nationally ranked all three seasons during Rowley's tenure.

Prior to his three-year stint at Texas Tech,

Rowley was the head men's tennis coach at University of Louisiana-Monroe from 1995-2000. He changed titles in 1999, serving as director of tennis, coaching both men's and women's programs during the 1999 and 2000 seasons. He compiled a 52-36 record at ULM and a 14-2 Southland Conference record. He led the Indians to two Southland Conference titles, three years in the national rankings and a berth in the NCAA Tournament once, marking the first time in 25 years ULM reached the national tournament. Rowley has also served as an NCAA representative at the NCAA national tournament.

He spent three years as head women's coach and assistant men's coach at the University of Louisiana-Lafayette from 1993-95. The women's program reached a national ranking of No. 36 during his tenure at ULL. He also served as an assistant coach for the men's and women's tennis program at the University of Kansas during the 1996 and 1997 seasons. The Jayhawks reached as high as No. 21 in the national rankings, winning the Big Eight Conference Championship and earning an NCAA appearance.

After serving as a student assistant coach with the women's tennis program at Southwestern College in Winfield, Kan., from 1979-84, he was director of tennis at Seward County Community College in Liberal, Kan., from 1984-86. During his tenure at Southwestern, he helped lead the program to four KCAC team championships and three NAIA District 10 runner-up finishes.

During his coaching career, Rowley spent nine years as head coach of Tennis: Europe, five years as head coach for the national team of Tennis: Europe. He spent 14 years coaching ranked juniors on the ITF junior circuits in America and Europe. He has coached players on the ATP, WTA and ITF circuits. He served as the president of the junior program on the board of officers for the Dallas Tennis Association in 1992 and spent five years as the DTA representative at the USTA Area Training Center. Coach Rowley has his own NIKE / Southern Miss tennis camps as well as coaches at the NIKE / Lawrenceville, New Jersey, College Exposure Tennis Academy. He also directs a fundraising camp at his alma mater, Southwestern College, in Winfield, Kansas.

Rowley graduated with his bachelor's degree in physical education from Southwestern College in 1984.

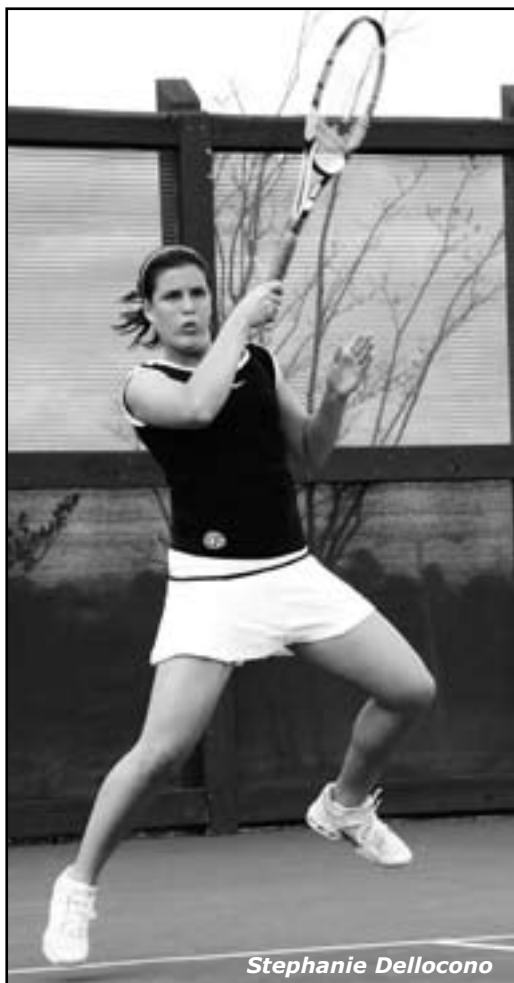

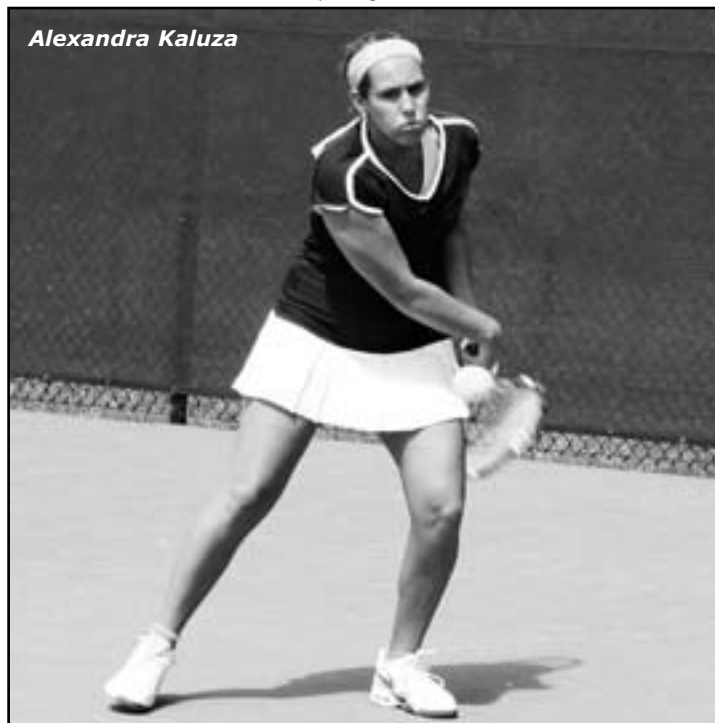

The spring season opened with a loss to Alabama. However, the Lady Eagles bounced back with back-to-back wins, defeating Sam Houston State 6-1, and then defeating Houston for their first Conference USA win of the season. Southern Miss then hosted UAB at home, contributing to their second loss of the season. The Lady Eagles returned with a three game winning streak, posting wins over Northwestern State, Memphis and Murray State.

The team headed into the second half of the season with a record of 5-2. The Lady Eagles traveled to Auburn, where they lost to the #29 ranked Tigers. They then headed on to the Alcorn State where they posted an upset of 4-3. The team headed back home for a 5-2 win over Louisiana-Monroe. The Lady Eagles then hosted back to back matches, losing to Troy but defeating New Mexico State. The team finished up the season with a loss against Southeastern Louisiana and a loss against SMU.

In singles play, senior Ali Blackett contributed a record of 11-8 while sophomore Stephanie Dellocono and Lauren Gutterman added records of 14-6 and 11-9, respectively. T. Southeastern Louisiana, 4-3 and Troy, 5-2.

In doubles, Dellocono tallied a record of 15-7 while Gutterman finished 11-11, including an 8-3 record for the pair. Freshman Shannon Rogers added a record of 11-9 in doubles action, including a 10-8 record with teammate Blackett.

"We felt like we would have a very good year because of all the people we were bringing back," said head coach Randy Rowley. "Unfortunately, we struggled with injuries, and we were never able to have our full lineup. However, it was not a bad season by any means. We finished tied for fifth out of twelve teams in the conference," said head coach Randy Rowley.

Southern Miss concluded the season with an overall winning record of 8-6, including a 2-1 conference record.

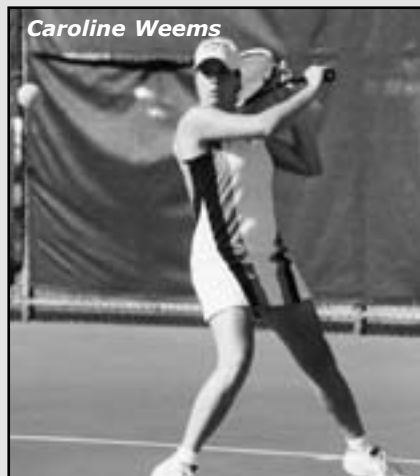

## 2009 Men's Tennis Outlook

*Southern Miss Golden Eagles*



The Southern Miss men's tennis team will enter the 2009 season with confidence, returning eight lettermen and looking to improve on last year's record. The Eagles finished last season 8-14 and tied for fifth place at the Conference USA Tournament.

The Eagles return eight veterans, losing only three players from last year and gaining one promising newcomer. The returning lettermen include: two seniors, team captain Domagoj Anic (Zagreb, Croatia) and Andrew Poole (Cape Town, South Africa); four juniors, Strate Krstevski (Skopje, Macedonia), Diego Machuca (Cuenca, Ecuador), Oscar Machuca (Cuenca, Ecuador) and Markus Wessinghage (Ingelheim, Germany); and two sophomores, Jan Burmeister (Bad Soden, Germany) and Felipe Sylva (Quito, Pichincha, Ecuador). The newcomer to the team is freshman Patricio Alvarado (Manta, Ecuador).

Head coach Teddy Viator is entering his 22nd year with Southern Miss and has high expectations for what this season may bring.

"The key to our upcoming season is that we have eight lettermen returning. We have also added one of the top juniors in the world, Patricio Alvarado. We are hoping he can play at the top. That is what we were missing last year, someone who could play at the top position and be competitive. Hopefully he can do that for us," said Viator. "We have also established some depth with the guys we have returning. We have a really good nucleus. In the fall the team really seemed like a team, they are together in everything that they do. I believe that goes a long way in determining whether you win or not."

Leading the team into the season will be senior team captain Domagoj Anic. Anic finished his junior season 9-15 in singles, recording a six-match winning streak. He finished 14-10 in doubles play, tallying an 8-4 record with teammate Jan Burmeister.

"Domagoj is a very experienced, all-around player," said Viator. "He is also a great team leader, serving as our team cap-

tain this year. His strengths lie in his forehand and serve."

Andrew Poole also enters his last season as a Southern Miss Golden Eagle. He concluded his junior season 9-16 in doubles play and 3-22 in singles action.

"Andrew is one of our better doubles players," said Viator. "He has a very good serve and a very good forehand. He has really improved his net play going into this season."

Strate Krstevski is one of the four returning juniors. Krstevski finished his second season 4-5 in singles action, also tallying a 5-3 record in doubles.

"Strate did not get a chance to play a lot last year but he was able to get some good experience in the fall," added Viator. "He is a good all-around player who will help us out throughout the season."

Diego Machuca also begins his third season with the team. Last year Machuca finished strong in doubles play with a record of 14-18 including a seven match

winning streak. He also tallied a 14-18 record in singles.

"Diego's strengths are his serve and his forehand," commented Viator. "He has been competitive in every match he has played in the last two years and he has now learned how to successfully win those matches."

Junior Oscar Machuca returns as well, after a competitive 2008 season, tallying a 14-16 record in singles. He finished 20-13 in doubles, including a 12-6 record with brother Diego.

"Oscar has a great competitive spirit. His all around game makes him a hard out. He has no weaknesses, good on both forehand and backhand," said Viator. "He was named Conference USA freshman two years ago, and hopefully he will continue to play like that."

Markus Wessinghage also comes back as a veteran junior. He recorded an impressive winning season last year, finishing 13-11 in singles, including an 11-5 record in dual play. Wessinghage finished 14-12 in doubles, including a 10-3 record with teammate Diego Machuca.

"Markus is one of our top doubles players and he will help us out in the lineup this year," said Viator. "He is also a good all-around player with strengths in his serve and backhand. He has great movement on the court."



Jan Burmeister is one of two returning sophomores this season. Burmeister finished strong in doubles last season with a 13-8 record, while compiling a record of 5-16 in singles action.

"Jan is the best doubles player on team and also has the best hands at the net," added Viator. "His strengths are his serve and volleys. We need him to continue to

improve throughout this season."

Felipe Sylva is also enters his second season with the Eagles. Sylva saw limited action his freshman year finishing 2-0 in singles, but gained valuable experience in the fall. He finished 8-4 in singles during fall play and also tallied a 5-2 record in doubles with teammate Patricio Alvarado.

"Felipe has very good movement on the court and also has a strong forehand," said Viator. "He is also a valuable doubles player."

Southern Miss added one newcomer this year, Patricio Alvarado, of Manta, Ecuador. Viator believes Alvarado will be a promising new member of the team.

"Patricio is a great new addition to the team," said Viator. "He is a great competitor and has one the best forehands in college tennis. He will hopefully fill the position at the top of the lineup that we have been missing."

Viator believes he has a complete and well experienced team this year and is fully ready to head into the 2009 season.

"I believe we have improved from last year. "I think our guys have learned what it takes to be a nationally ranked team. They saw what it takes in the off season and I believe they responded well, working hard and playing in a lot of tournaments," said Viator. "We are looking forward to the season, hopefully we will continue to improve and make the NCAA tournament."

**T**eddy Viator enters his 22nd season overseeing the Southern Miss men's tennis program. Last season, his Golden Eagles finished 8-14, against a competitive schedule that included five nationally ranked teams.

In 2007, Viator led the Golden Eagles to a 10-10 record and a tie for fifth place finish at the conference tournament.

Prior to his appointment at Southern Miss,



Viator spent four seasons as an assistant coach at LSU.

Since coming to Southern Miss, Viator has consistently helped raise the level of play of the men's tennis program, having posted a 21-year career record of 216-221. He owns the third winningest season record in school history with an 18-6 finish in 1988. He has produced 31 all-conference selections, including seven first teamers. He coached three Conference USA Freshmen of the Year (two males and one female). The list also includes one Conference Player of the Year and an ITA All-American (female).

During his first 10 seasons at Southern Miss, Viator coached both men's and women's teams. His 1997 men's team advanced to the NCAA Tournament and, in 1996, Viator had a women's player (Kati Kocsis) and a doubles' team (Kati and Susie Kocsis) compete in the 1996 NCAA Tournament. Kocsis advanced to the round 16, while the doubles' team advanced to the 16. Kati Kocsis was tabbed an ITA All-American with a final ranking of 16. The doubles'

team finished with a final ranking of 26.

Viator, a four-year standout at LSU, was selected All-Southeastern Conference and a Nike All-American in 1984. He also was named the LSU Male Athlete of the Year in 1984. He still holds the distinction of being the only LSU tennis player to post at least 20 wins a season during his four-year career. He also still ranks among the all-time victory leaders in the school's history. He received his

bachelor's degree in accounting.

After his playing days ended, Viator spent two seasons (1984-85) as a student assistant coach and the next two years as a full-time assistant, responsible for recruiting, practice, and maintenance of the tennis strength and conditioning program.

Viator, a Jeanerette, La., native, attended St. Joseph High School, where he was a four-year letterwinner in basketball, track and tennis. He won three consecutive state high school championships in singles. Also a top performer in the classroom, he graduated as class salutatorian. Viator is also active in the local tennis circuit, giving private lessons and tutoring many of the up-and-coming local tennis stars.

Viator is married to the former Kay Smith. They are the proud parents of twins (Audrey Blair and Joseph Parker).

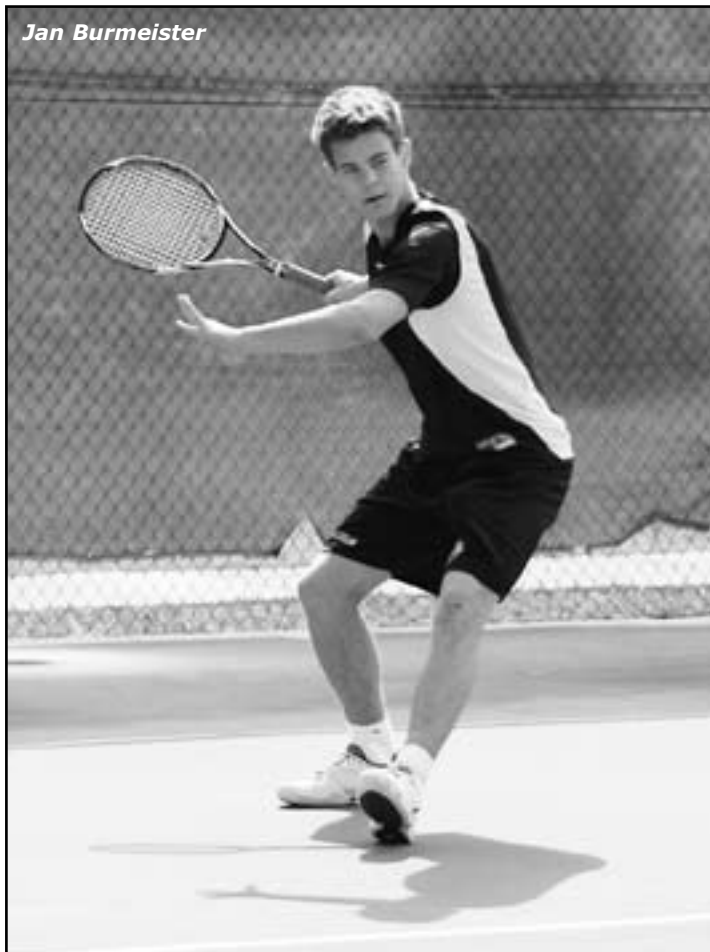

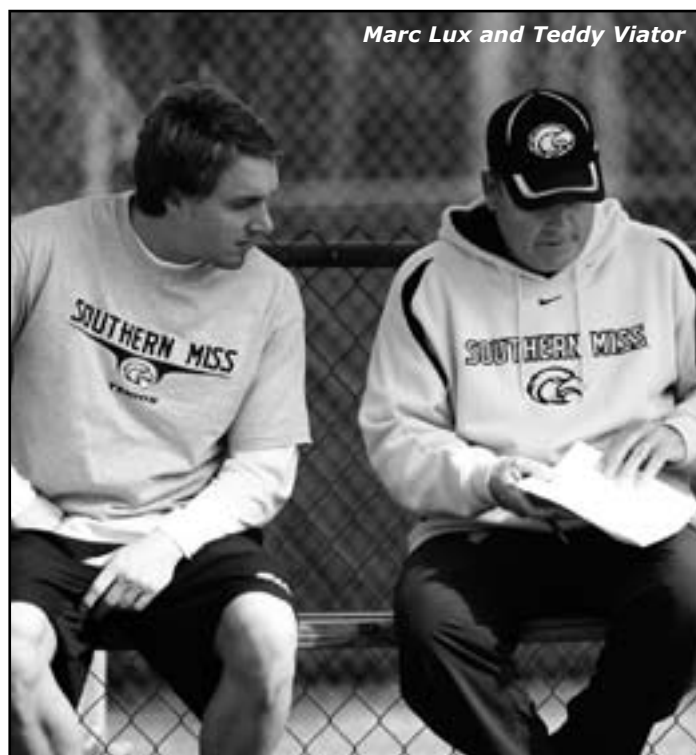

The Southern Miss men's tennis team headed into the 2008 season with a relatively young team, including only two juniors, six sophomores and three freshmen. The team competed in four fall tournaments to prepare for the upcoming season. The young team faced challenges early in the spring, as five of the first seven season matches were played against nationally ranked teams.

The Eagles opened up the season at home with a 7-0 upset over Alcorn State. The team then suffered a seven match losing streak against #13 Alabama, #70 UNLV, St. Mary's college, #31 Auburn, #44 Arizona State, #18 LSU and Central Florida. The team then bounced back for their first conference win of the sea-

son against East Carolina. The Eagles suffered one more loss against UAB before turning back to back wins against Charleston Southern and Citadel. The team then lost to SC State. However, they were back in the game with a win over Toledo before losing three close matches to Florida A&M, Nebraska and South Alabama.

The mood quickly lifted as the Eagles snapped the losing streak with a three game winning streak, defeating Southern, 6-1, Southeastern Louisiana, 4-3 and Troy, 5-2. The team then finished the season with two tough C-USA losses against Memphis and Tulsa.

In singles action, sophomore Strate Krstevski led the team with a 17-9 overall

record, followed by sophomore Markus Wessinghage who held a 13-11 record in singles action.

The dynamic duo of sophomores Diego Machuca and Markus Wessinghage led the team with a 10-3 record in doubles play.

Sophomore brothers Diego and Oscar Machuca also added a record of 12-6 to the doubles success.

"We didn't reach our goal of getting to the semifinals at the conference," said head coach Teddy Viator. "But we were really competitive against a very good schedule. I think our guys learned what it takes to be a ranked team."

Southern Miss concluded a tough season with a record of 8-14, and 1-4 in conference play.

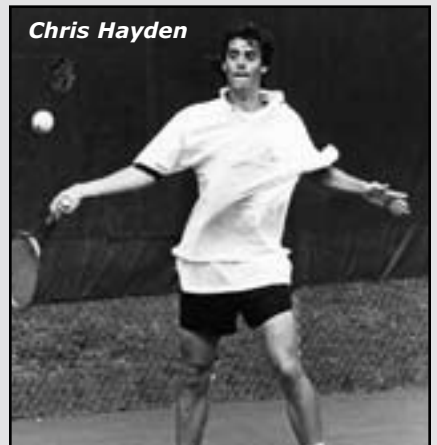

## Success Off the Field

C-USA institutions are among the nation's best in academic performance among student-athletes, bolstered by the fact that student-athletes at league schools have a higher graduation rate than the general student population. Among C-USA's 5,000 student-athletes, there are champions off the playing field as well. In 12 years, 105 student-athletes earned national ESPN The Magazine Academic All-America honors, while 338 were named All-District. In addition, more than 13,000 student-athletes have been named to the Commissioner's Honor Roll or received the Commissioner's Academic Medal, indicative of outstanding achievement in the classroom.

## C-USA on TV

C-USA institutions are among the nation's best in aC-USA enjoys significant television exposure through its partnerships with ESPN Inc. and CBS College Sports Television Networks (formerly CSTV). The league entered into long-term agreements with both ESPN and CBS College Sports, which, combined, provides C-USA with significant national and regional exposure for football, men's and women's basketball, and all other conference sports. Additionally, the CBS College Sports agreement includes video-on-demand, Internet, broadband, national over-the-air and satellite radio, and wireless distribution as well as corporate marketing rights, and website production through CSTV.com, part of CBS College Sports.

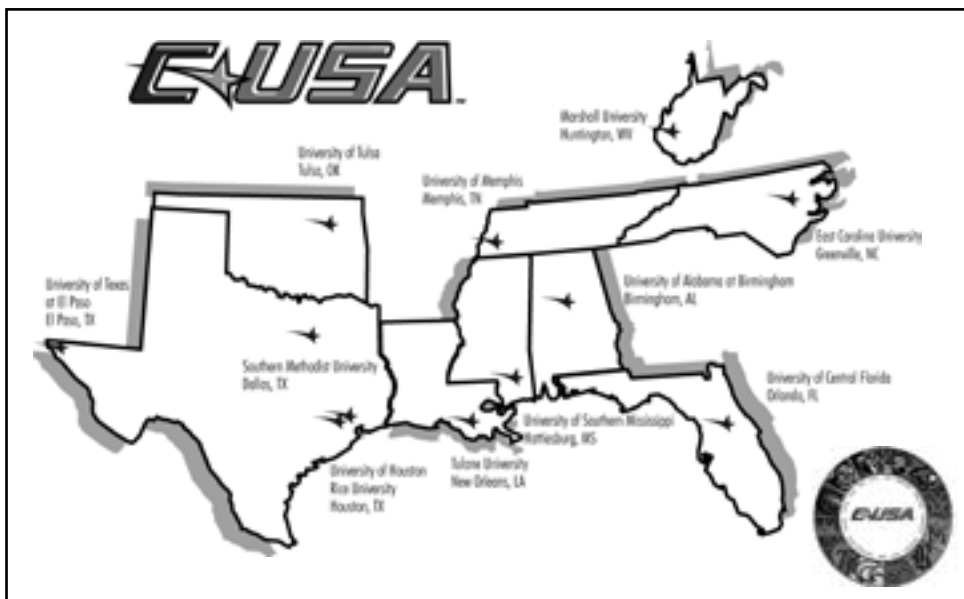

# Conference USA



The agreement with ESPN extends the conference's current regular season football package to include the broadcast of the conference's Football Championship Game. It also encompasses distribution of men's basketball and women's basketball on ESPN/ESPN2 and both tournament championship games.

### C-USA in the Community

The conference's footprint is concentrated with 12 members in nine states and a combined area population of nearly 17 million. More than 1.1 million living alumni represent C-USA schools across the nation. With a renewed commitment to community involvement, the conference has begun development of several initiatives to maintain strong ties in C-USA cities, as well as with fans and alumni across the country. C-USA schools also place a priority on giving back to their communities through volunteer service with local and national organizations.

### Governance

Along with the ACC, Big East, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-10 and SEC, Conference USA is one of the seven conferences having significant representation in the NCAA governance structure. The Presidents of the member institutions serve as the league's Board of Directors. R. Gerald Turner of SMU currently serves as chair of the Board.

### A Proud History; A Promising Future

Conference USA was formed in 1995 and

quickly emerged as one of the nation's top conferences. The conference unveiled its name, logo and commissioner on April 24, 1995 in Chicago. The league's charter members included Charlotte, Cincinnati, DePaul, Houston, Louisville, Marquette, Memphis, Saint Louis, Southern Miss, Tulane, UAB and USF. Eleven of the institutions began athletic participation in 1995, while Houston joined competition in the fall of 1996.

The league's headquarters were established in Chicago and after nine years, relocated to the current office in Irving, Texas. Britton Banowsky was named Commissioner in October 2002, succeeding Mike Slive, the league's first commissioner.

C-USA added East Carolina (September, 1996) and the United States Military Academy (March, 1997) as football members. ECU began league competition in 1997; Army in 1998 and UAB began football play in 1999. The league added TCU and ECU (1999) for all sports and they began competition in 2001. USF started C-USA football in 2003.

After celebrating its 10th Anniversary during the 2004-05 season, C-USA began a new chapter in 2005-06 when its current membership came together to form the new look of the league.

Since its formation, C-USA has established a strong foundation, an identity and a history that reflects the league's national presence. Twelve years of remarkable history has reinforced the league's position in collegiate athletics, setting the course for the next decade and beyond.

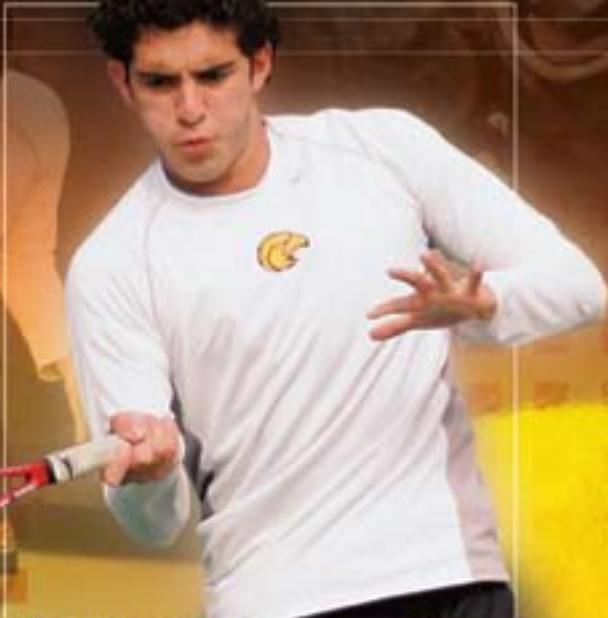

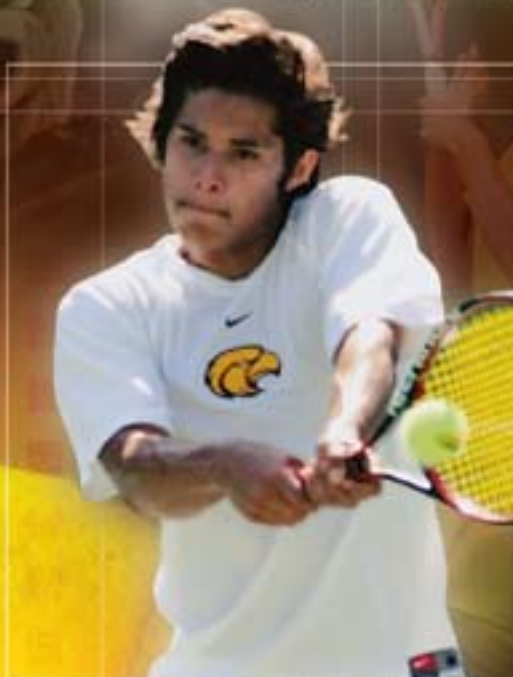
