THE SKINNY

Nevada goes for its second-straight bowl win when it takes on Southern Miss on Dec. 24 in the Sheraton Hawai'i Bowl ... The Wolf Pack went 7-5 this year and finished second in the WAC while USM won the Conference USA title ... The Wolf Pack is led by seven players who earned All-WAC honors, including WAC Freshman of the Year quarterback Cody Fajardo and All-American defensive tackle Brett Roy ... Nevada has 18 players on its roster who have already earned degrees including one, Tyler Lantrip, who has finished his Master's ... Nevada's Pistol offense has been more effective than 2010, to the tune of nearly 523 yards per game ... The Wolf Pack is 1-1 all-time in the Sheraton Hawai'i Bowl, having beat UCF in 2005 and losing to SMU in 2009 ... Nevada has had two players invited to both the Senior Bowl (James-Michael Johnson and Rishard Matthews) and the East-West Shrine Game (Brett Roy and Johnson).

BOWL HISTORY

Nevada is 3-6 all-time in its FBS/I-A bowl history and 2-4 in its current stretch of six consecutive bowl games. This year's appearance marks an ongoing school record of seven straight bowl appearances for the Wolf Pack. Overall, Nevada is 4-7 all-time in bowl games, including appearances in the Harbor Bowl and Salad Bowl in the 1940s.

Nevada is 1-1 in two appearances so far in the Sheraton Hawai'i Bowl. Nevada won its first appearance in the game in 2005 with a 49-48 overtime win over Central Florida. The Wolf Pack fell to SMU here in 2009.

IN THE SERIES

Southern Miss leads 2-0. Home: 0-1; Road: 0-1.

This will be the third meeting all-time between Nevada and Southern Miss. The Eagles have the edge in the series having won both games of a home-and-home with the Wolf Pack in the late 1990s. The Sheraton Hawai'i Bowl will be the first time a Chris Ault-coached Nevada team has played Southern Miss and the first time USM coach Larry Fedora has faced the Wolf Pack.

ACADEMICS FIRST

The Wolf Pack has 18 players on the roster who have already received undergraduate degrees from the University of Nevada. That's among the most in the nation among the 70 FBS teams who are competing in bowl games this season (see chart below). Every member of this year's senior class who came to Nevada as a freshman has graduated. Additionally, two juniors on the Wolf Pack have already earned their degrees in wide receiver Brandon Wimberly and defensive end Albert Rosette. In terms of starters, the Wolf Pack has seven defensive starters who already have earned degrees, including all four defensive linemen and two of the Pack's three linebackers.

DIPLOMAS

Three Wolf Pack players had already graduated prior to the season in senior quarterback Tyler Lantrip, senior defensive end Kaelin Burnett and tight end Zach Sudfeld. Lantrip received his MBA this month.

MORE ON DEGREES

Senior quarterback Tyler Lantrip is in small company when it comes to academic achievements. Lantrip is one of just three players who is playing in a bowl game who has earned a post-graduate degree. Lantrip received his MBA from Nevada earlier this month. The other two players who have Master's degrees are TCU's Kyle Dooley and Alabama's Brandon Gibson.

FINAL GAME FOR SENIORS

Nevada has 19 seniors who will be playing their final game for the Wolf Pack in the Sheraton Hawai'i Bowl. They are: Wide receiver Shane Anderson; safety Bubba Boudreaux; defensive end Kaelin Burnett; defensive tackle Willie Faataualofa; cornerback Isaiah Frey; tight end/long snapper Scott Frisbie; offensive lineman Steve Haley; punter/kicker Jake Hurst; linebacker James-Michael Johnson; quarterback Tyler Lantrip; wide receiver Corbin Louks; defensive tackle Zack Madonick; running back Lampford Mark; linebacker Brandon M. Marshall; wide receiver Rishard Matthews; center Jeff Meads; center Jordan Mudge; defensive tackle Brett Roy and wide receiver Tray Session.

Nevada has two other players listed on its roster as seniors in linebacker DeAndre Boughton and tight end Zach Sudfeld. Boughton is sitting out this year due to medical redshirt and

will return next season. Nevada will appeal to the NCAA for a sixth year of eligibility for Sudfeld, who was injured in the season opener at Oregon and who has missed a number of games in his career due to injury.

ROY ALL-AMERICAN

Senior defensive tackle Brett Roy earned All-American honors earlier this month when he was named to the first team by Sports Illustrated. Roy is the first Nevada player since Nate Burleson (2002) to earn first-team All-America honors. Wideout Rishard Matthews and cornerback Isaiah Frey earned honorable mention from SI. More on Roy on page 4.

FAJARDO IS WAC FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR

For the third time in five years, Nevada has the WAC's Freshman of the Year. Quarterback Cody Fajardo won the award this year after completing 71.4 percent of his passes and throwing for 1,647 yards and six touchdowns while running for 680 yards and 11 touchdowns.

Fajardo was second in the WAC in passing efficiency (behind teammate Tyler Lantrip), third in the league in scoring at 7.3 ppg and fourth in both total offense and passing. He was seventh in the conference in rushing.

Quarterback Colin Kaepernick won the WAC Freshman of the Year honor in 2007 and wide receiver Brandon Wimberly earned the award in 2009.

SIX NAMED ALL-WAC

Brett Roy led six Nevada players on the All-WAC teams. He was named to the first team along with cornerback Isaiah Frey. On the offensive side, wideout Rishard Matthews was a first-team selection along with guard Chris Barker. Matthews, Frey and Barker were all second-team selections in 2010 while Roy was a glaring omission from the postseason teams last year. Safety Duke Williams earned second-team honors after a strong junior season. He was joined on the second team by fellow junior Jeff Nady, an offensive tackle.

BETTER THAN LAST YEAR?

For all of the records set and talented players who were part of the 2010 Wolf Pack football team, the 2011 Nevada offense has been better than it was last year. Or at least in terms of total offense.

Despite the loss of players like quarterback Colin Kaepernick, running back Vai Taua, tight end Virgil Green (all to the NFL) and others, this year's Nevada offense has gained more yards

MOVING UP: Rishard Matthews

In less than two full seasons, Rishard Matthews has put his name among some notable company in Nevada's record books with his stellar play. He was named first-team All-WAC this season and earned honorable mention All-America honors by SI.com after leading the WAC in both receptions and yards, the first time in Nevada's tenure in the conference that a Wolf Pack player has done so.

He has nine career 100-yard games, including seven this season. Against Utah State, the senior wide receiver caught a career-best 12 passes for 205 yards and a touchdown. For Matthews, it marked his second career 200-yard game as he posted a 220-yard effort earlier this season against UNLV. Matthews enters the bowl game ranked seventh in the nation in

receiving yards at 113.6 yards per game and 10th in the country in receptions per game at 7.6. He leads the WAC in both. Matthews is moving up in the record books at Nevada, despite being in just his second season with the Wolf Pack (charts below).

As a punt returner, Mathews is sixth in the nation with 13.35 yards per return and his 86-yard return for a touchdown earlier this season is the seventh-longest return in the country this season. He has 551 punt return yards in his career at Nevada, which ranks seventh on the Pack's career list. His 307 punt return yards this season is ninth-best in single-season history.

per game. Last year, the Wolf Pack averaged 519 yards per game while this year's version of the Pistol offense is at nearly 523 yards per game.

That production has come despite fluidity in the skill positions as Rishard Matthews is the only skill player on offense to start all 12 games. Nevada has started two quarterbacks and four different running backs this year.

PACK AMONG NATION'S LEADERS

As a team, the Wolf Pack is fifth in the nation in total offense at 522.83 and eighth in the country in rushing offense at 251.83 yards per game. Nevada is also 30th in passing and 31st in scoring.

Nevada has a number of players in the national rankings this year, both on offense and defense. A complete list can be found later in this notes package.

Senior receiver Rishard Matthews is seventh in the nation in receiving yards and 10th in receptions. Matthews is also sixth in the nation in punt returns.

Quarterback Cody Fajardo is 28th in passing efficiency and 33rd in total offense while Tyler Lantrip is 25th in passing efficiency. Fajardo is also 63rd in rushing.

Cornerback Isaiah Frey is third in the nation in pass breakups and he ranks 11th in the country in interceptions. Fellow corner Khalid Wooten is tied for 23rd in interceptions while linebacker Jeremiah Green is tied for 65th.

Defensive tackle Brett Roy ranks eighth in both sacks and tackles for loss.

GETTING DEFENSIVE

Much has been written, rightfully so, about the production of Brett Roy on the defensive front for Nevada. But the secondary has had some success this year, too. As noted, cornerbacks Isa-

iah Frey and Khalid Wooten are among the top 25 in the country in interceptions and Frey is third in pass breakups.

As a team, Nevada has 15 interceptions this season, which is the most by a Wolf Pack club since the 2006 team had 20.

Linebacker Jeremiah Green has been the surprise of the defense as he has started all 12 games and been a force on the strongside, which 12 interceptions to go along with 48 tackles this year.

COMEBACK WINS

Nevada head coach Chris Ault has well over 200 wins in his Hall of Fame career three dozen of those victories have been comeback victories in the last 30 minutes of games. Ault entered this year with 34 come-from-behind wins and he moved that number to 36 with back-to-back comeback wins to wrap up play in October.

On Oct. 22 against Fresno State, Nevada trailed 24-23 in the third quarter when Fresno State scored on its opening drive of the half. Nevada took the lead for good when Bubba Boudreaux recovered a fumbled punt return in the end zone and the Pack never looked back en route to the 45-38 win.

On Oct. 29 at New Mexico State, Nevada trailed going into the second half, 27-20. But the Wolf Pack scored the first three touchdowns of the second half to take control of the game as Nevada would go on to win 48-34.

Ault, of course, was the first to engineer the greatest comeback in the history of the NCAA when he guided the Pack back from a 35-point deficit against Weber State in 1991.

MASON MAGLEBY, JACK OF ALL TRADES

Third-string quarterback Mason Magleby has served in a variety of roles for the Wolf Pack this year. He has served as the team's holder on all extra-point and field goal attempts. He

ALL-AMERICAN: Brett Roy

The list of defensive linemen who are playing better football than Brett Roy right now is likely pretty short.

Roy was snubbed for All-WAC honors after a breakout season in 2010 in which he recorded 14.5 TFLs and 8.0 sacks from his tackle position. Now, even without standout ends Dontay Moch (third-round pick of the Bengals) and Ryan Coulson (Patriots signee) departed for the NFL, Roy has taken his game to another level this year.

Roy has already surpassed his sack and TFL totals from last season. He enters the bowl game with 10.0 sacks (leads WAC and eighth in the nation) and 18.5 tackles for loss (leads WAC and

eighth in the nation).

He was named to a pair of midseason All-America team this year – third team by Phil Steele Publications and second team by Sports Illustrated. A former walk-on safety, Roy has matured into one of the top tackles on the West Coast.

He was named first-team All-WAC and named first-team All-American by SI.com.

He is moving up the Nevada's single-season charts in both sacks and tackles for loss this year:

also served as team's long-snapper for a game when senior Scott Frisbie was out. That made Magleby just the second quarterback in the country this year to also serve as a long-snapper (Brandon Fricke at Central Michigan is the other). Magleby also successfully executed Nevada's first fake field goal attempt in at least a decade when he rolled out and found Kolby Arendse from 15 yards out for a touchdown. That TD added to an impressive (albeit short) statistical line for Magleby this season. He is 5-of-5 for 88 yards and two touchdowns with an efficiency of 379.84.

HELLO, MY NAME IS ... KENDALL BROCK

In game five of the season (against UNLV), Nevada pulled the redshirt of highly touted true freshman Kendall Brock, a running back/wide receiver/kick returner from Fresno, Calif.

Brock's debut came on the first play of the game as he lifted a struggling kick return unit with a 35-yard return on his first touch. But, thanks to a defense that pitched a shutout, it was the only time Brock and the kick-return unit saw the field against the Rebels, though Brock did play on other specials teams units in the game. Against New Mexico, Brock's role expanded a bit as the freshman had five carries for 70 yards, caught two passes for 17 yards and returned a kickoff for 31 yards. Brock returned six kicks for 123 yards against Fresno State and also had one carry for six yards.

Brock has not played in enough games to make the national or conference rankings. If he did, he would rank fifth in the WAC and 67th in the nation.

HURST EXCELLING

After three years of waiting in the wings behind Brad Langley, senior punter Jake Hurst has made the most of his opportunity this year. Hurst is fifth in the WAC and 41st nationally with an average of 41.9 yards per punt. He was rewarded for his efforts earlier this year with a WAC Special Teams Player of the Week award after the win over San Jose State and again after the win over Idaho.

He was also a boost in the kicking game when he took over the field goal and extra point duties after injuries to Anthony Martinez and Allen Hardison.

LONG STRANGE TRIP

On Oct. 18, 2008, Corbin Louks scored a pair of touchdowns -- both rushing TDs -- in a game against Colorado State. On Oct. 8 of this year, Louks saw the end zone again, this time on a 34-yard reception. The difference between the scores is the latter came as a Nevada wide receiver and the former was as a quarterback at the University of Utah. What happened in between is an unusual tale. Louks lost his starting job at Utah prior to the 2009 season and sought a transfer to Nevada, which had also recruited him out of high school. He came to Nevada and sat out the season as a transfer. He started the first game of the 2010 season as a starting safety, but suffered a knee injury in the game and lost his starting job. He returned to play on special teams during the year and was converted to a wide receiver prior to the Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl. He's been in the receiving corps in all of 2011 and then snagged that elusive touchdown grab in the Battle for the Fremont Cannon.

LINEBACKER TANDEM

Senior linebackers James-Michael Johnson and Brandon M. Marshall are two of the most experienced players on the team as the duo combines for 93 career games played and 79 starts. They are Nevada's active leaders in tackles (chart, page 7). You can also find each senior's name in the Nevada record books. Johnson is sixth all-time in career tackles for loss with 35.5 while Marshall is on his heels with 33.5. Both are among the active leaders in the NCAA in that category. This week, Johnson ranks 12th while Marshall is 20th.

FAJARDO SEIZES QUARTERBACK JOB

Nevada clearly had big shoes to fill this year in replacing quarterback Colin Kaepernick, perhaps the greatest player in school history.

Senior Tyler Lantrip started the first four games for Nevada and had some high moments, especially his 366-yard effort off the bench in a win against UNLV. But redshirt freshman Cody Fajardo has seized the starting job for Nevada with

his abilities in the Pistol offense. Fajardo had a breakout game against Texas Tech, running for 139 yards and two scores while throwing for another, but he missed the Boise State game due to injury. He got his first collegiate start against UNLV on Oct. 8 and had some ups and downs in the 37-0 win. Against New Mexico the following week, Fajardo settled in. He ran for 86 yards and two scores and complete 20-of-25 for 203 yards against the Lobos. Fajardo was tremendous in his first WAC start as he led Nevada to a 45-38 win over Fresno State. He threw for a career-high 313 yards and a touchdown on 19-of-27 passing and also rushed for 61 yards and two more scores. After that game, Fajardo (and Coach Ault) credited Lantrip for his performance on the sideline in helping Fajardo read the defense and function within the offense. Fajardo got his first road win, his fourth win as a starter (in four starts) and his first WAC Offensive Player of the Week award all in one fell swoop with his performance against New Mexico State. Fajardo accounted for 343 yards and four touchdowns (all rushing) in the win over the Aggies. He extended that streak to five wins in five starts with another WAC POW award following Nevada's win at Hawaii, in which he accounted for 371 yards of total offense and four touchdowns in the win.

LIGHTING THE LAMP

It was a long wait, but senior running back Lampford Mark finally saw some playing time during the Wolf Pack's win over UNLV. Mark suffered a torn anterior cruciate ligament in practice in November of 2010 and missed the final three games of the season and all of spring drills. He then missed the first four games of 2011 due to illness. But Mark came on down the stretch and enters the bowl game with five straight 100-yard games. He averages 104.0 yards per game. Against the Rebels, Mark carried the ball 15 times for 75 yards and a touchdown. The 4-yard TD run was the first score for Mark since Nov. 20 of last year against New Mexico State. With the 75 yards, Mark went over the 1,000-yard mark for his career at Nevada. Against New Mexico, Mark found even more success as he ran for 39 yards on nine carries with three touchdowns. The TDs marked his first multi-touchdown game of his career and were the most rushing scores in a game by a Nevada player since Colin Kaepernick had three at Louisiana Tech last season. Mark came through again at New Mexico State, entering the game in the second half and ran for 185 yards and a touchdown on just eight carries. He broke an 80-yard TD run – the longest run of his career. He later eclipsed that with an 85-yard run in which he was stopped just short of the end zone. He started against Hawaii and scored Nevada's first touchdown of the game on a 4-yard plunge. He topped the 100-yard mark for the fourth time in his career with 105 yards on 24 carries. Mark got another start against Louisiana Tech and responded with his third straight 100-yard game as he notched 109 yards on 28 carries. He put forth a similar effort against Utah State with his fourth straight 100-yard game with 111 yards on 22 carries. He closed the regular season with another 100-yard game against Idaho.

ROAD WARRIORS

The schedule was not kind to the Nevada football team to open this year. The Wolf Pack opened with four games on the road and two were against teams who opened the season ranked in the Top 5 (Oregon and Boise State) while the other two are against a BCS foe (at Texas Tech) and a conference game (at San Jose State), respectively.

The Wolf Pack was the second-to-last FBS team in the nation to play a home game when the team finally opened at Mackay Stadium on Oct. 8 against in-state rival UNLV. But the flip side of the schedule is this: Nevada will only leave Reno once following Nov. 1 (Nov. 26 at Utah State).

SHUTOUT

The Nevada defense tossed a shutout at UNLV with the 37-0 victory. It was notable because it marked the first-ever shutout in the 37-game rivalry series. It was also Nevada's first shutout since 2006, when the Wolf Pack blanked Louisiana Tech 42-0 on Nov. 18 that year. It was Nevada's first shutout at Mackay Stadium since Nov. 11, 2006, when the Wolf Pack shutdown Utah State to the tune of 42-0.

Nevada's shutout against UNLV did not come easy, however. In fact it was more

impressive considering UNLV twice had the ball in the red zone and the Rebels' average starting field position was its own 40-yard line.

Senior cornerback Isaiah Frey stopped one Rebel drive in the red zone when he made a brilliant interception in the end zone that was intended for UNLV's top offensive player in wideout Philip Payne (who was held without a catch in the game). The other red zone drive ended on downs when Brett Roy (of course) made a tackle for a loss on a fourth-and-short play.

WAC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

So far in 2011, Nevada has won seven player of the week honors from the Western Athletic Conference. Since Nevada joined the WAC in 2000, Wolf Pack players have been honored by the league 62 times in the weekly awards. The list this year:

Dec. 5: Tyler Lantrip, Offense; Jake Hurst, Special Teams. Lantrip completed 24-of-31 passes for 340 yards and four touchdowns with no interceptions in Nevada's 56-3 win over Idaho. Hurst punted three times for a 43.3-yard average and was also perfect on all eight of his extra point attempts in the win over Idaho.

Nov. 14: Cody Fajardo, Offense. Fajardo accounted for 371 yards of total offense and four touchdowns in a win over Hawaii.

Oct. 31: Cody Fajardo, Offense. Fajardo passed for 283 yards while rushing for 60 yards and four touchdowns in a win over New Mexico State.

Oct. 24: Mike Ball, Offense. Ball had 216 all-purpose yards – including a career-high 198 rushing – and two touchdowns in a win over Fresno State.

Oct. 17: Khalid Wooten, Defense. Wooten recorded six tackles, forced two fumbles and picked off a pass in Nevada's 49-7 win over New Mexico.

Oct. 10: Brett Roy, Defense. Roy set a career-high with 11 tackles, including four for a loss (one sack) of 13 yards, in Nevada's 37-0 win over UNLV.

Sept. 19: Mike Ball, Offense; Jake Hurst, Special Teams. Ball rushed for 124 yards and two touchdowns in Nevada's 17-14 win at San Jose State. Hurst punted six times for 259 yards (43.2-yard average). He had a long of 49 yards and placed two inside the 20-yard line, including one at the Spartan 3-yard line for the Wolf Pack.

COACHING CONTINUITY

Nevada is one of 34 FBS schools that made only one change on its coaching staff this season but that new addition was a familiar face. Casey Moore, a former Stanford star who spent time in the NFL, is the new running backs coach for the Pack this season. But he was already on staff as he spent the 2010 season as the team's quality control assistant on the offensive side.

TEAM CAPTAINS

Four Wolf Pack standouts were selected by their teammates to serve as captains for the 2011 season. On the offensive side of the ball, senior wideout Rishard Matthews and junior lineman Chris Barker were selected. From the defense, senior tackle Brett Roy and linebacker James-Michael Johnson were chosen. The voting was done by the players.

This is the second season in a row that Johnson has been named a captain while Barker joins a rare group in Nevada history being elected captain as a junior.

THE DEAN OF COLLEGE FOOTBALL COACHES

With Ault in his 27th season, he is now the dean of college coaches in FBS and the only active FBS coach who is enshrined

in the College Football Hall of Fame.

- In the history of college football, no coach has ever had his team lead the nation in both passing offense and rushing offense during the course of his coaching tenure...until 2009. Ault's Wolf Pack led the nation in rushing in 2009, 14 years after his 1995 team led the nation in passing.
