Blades, Berman Named To Conference USA's All-Decade Team

Former Lady Eagle softball players Courtney Blades and Amy Berman were named to Conference USA's softball All-Decade team, as Conference USA celebrated its 10th anniversary during the 2004-05 season. The league named a Team of the Decade for each of the conference's 19 sports.

Blades and Berman came to Southern Miss in 1999, the first year the Lady Eagle softball program was reinstated. That team gained instant recognition, winning an NCAA Regional and advancing to the Women's College World Series, ending the season with a No. 8 national ranking and 52-9 overall record. Both players were First-Team Louisville Slugger NFCA All-Americans that season and NFCA All-South First-Team selections.

In 2000, as softball began competition in Conference USA, the two players helped Southern Miss earn the inaugural league regular-season title and tournament title, as the 2000 squad again won an NCAA Regional and advanced to the Women's College World Series for the second-consecutive year, ending the season with a No. 4 national ranking. That team finished with a school record 62-13 record.

Blades earned First-Team All C-USA honors in 2000, named C-USA MVP and league Pitcher of the Year in 2000. She was also a First-Team Louisville Slugger/NFCA First-Team All-American selected to the NFCA All-South First-Team, as was also tabbed the 2000 Honda National Softball Player of the Year in 2000. Blades won a school, league and NCAA record 52 games in 2000, with a C-USA record 0.89 ERA. She set a C-USA/NCAA record with 663 strikeouts, 46 complete games and 28 shutouts. In addition, she was a three-time NFCA National Player of the Week and seven-time C-USA pitcher of the week, also earning WCWS All-Tournament Team honors and All-NCAA Regional Team (MVP).

Berman was a First-Team All C-USA selection in 2000, and a 3rd Team Louisville Slugger NFCA All-American. She hit .383 in 2000, with 92 hits, 60 runs, 18 doubles, 58 RBI, 14 home runs, 28 walks, in 240 at-bats. Berman finished her career with a .417 school record batting average, with 185 hits, 34 doubles, 121 runs, 29 home runs and 109 RBI. She earned C-USA Hitter of the Week honors, and was selected to the 2000 NCAA All-Regional Team and NFCA All-South First-Team.

Courtney Blades was a key participant in the rapid success of the Southern Miss softball program. In the first two years of the Lady Eagles resurgence to the diamond, she was a focal point on the mound, helping Southern Miss accomplish feats very few athletic programs have obtained, especially in such a short length of time.

The Lady Eagles put together a record of 115-22 in those two seasons, and Blades accounted for 95 of those wins in that incredible span. Among her many accolades, she earned both Conference USA Player and Pitcher of the Year honors. She was the

Region 7 Most Outstanding Player and received the Honda Award as the National Softball Player of the Year in 2000.

Blades was a 2000 First-Team Louisville Slugger/NFCA All-American and holds the NCAA Division I career strikeout record, fanning 1,773 batters over her illustrious college career. She is also the Division I career victory leader (151-34, .816), single-season strikeout leader (663 in 2000) and single-season victory leader (52-7, .881 in 2000).

1999 Lady Eagles Have Historical Year In First Year Back Since 1992, Win An NCAA Regional And Advance To Women's College World Series

It was a year like no other.

The Southern Miss Lady Eagle softball team entered the 1999 softball season as an unknown commodity on the national scene. For good reason, as the program was out of existence for six seasons, after being discontinued following the 1992 season.

But the decision was made to reinstate the program in 1997, and the search began for a head coach. That bill was filled by Lu Harris, who was hired on Dec. 18, 1997. Harris had a strong reputation for building programs, as she was named 1997 Women's Professional Fastpitch Coach of the Year, leading the Orlando Wahoos to a 60-13 record. Prior to that, she was the

head coach at Nicholls State, taking the team to back-to-back NCAA regional titles in 1996 and 1997. With her hiring, the Southern Miss softball program gained instant respectability.

Still, a nationally coach only goes so far, and with no players, Harris and her assistant coach Sharon Perkins began the task of recruiting and building a team, that was to begin its fall season in August, 1998. Recruiting went well, as three All-American candidates, junior pitcher Courtney Blades, junior shortstop Amy Berman and junior third baseman Jen Ford all joined the fold, along with Melanie McMains. The four players had one thing in common, they all played for Harris at Nicholls State.

So with a solid nucleus of players to build around, Harris and Perkins spent the remainder of the fall getting the players ready for the season, teaching fundamentals, while polishing the finishing touches on the team.

That polish paid off early once the season began, as the team immediately made a national impact, serving notice of what was to come. The squad opened the year at the Texas-Arlington Invitational, and defeated two nationally ranked teams, No. 15 Oklahoma State, a semifinalist at the Women's College World Series in 1998 and No.

25 Oregon, a NCAA Regional team in 1998. But after opening the year 3-0, the team came back to earth, losing two consecutive games to end the tournament.



Then after falling to NAIA national power Oklahoma City in the Mardi Gras Invitational, the team rebounded and left the tournament with the tourney title and a 9-3 record, going on to win 10-straight games, and stood 23-4, entering the USA Today/NFCA national rankings on Mar. 17, 1999, becoming the first, first-year program to reach the top-25, when it entered the rankings at No. 22.

Following a strong performance at the Winthrop Invitational, which included a win over No. 15 Illinois-Chicago, the team earned a No. 19 national ranking, while Courtney Blades was named NFCA National Player of the Week. Following a strong performance in the Georgia Tech Buzz Classic, the team improved to 34-5, and following the 41-game road stretch, arrived for its home debut sporting a 35-5 record.

The home debut of 1,234 saw Southern Miss win the first three games of the Lady Eagle Invitational. Day two of the tournament drew 1,109 people, and they witnessed Blades become the second pitcher in NCAA History to surpass 1,000 strikeouts, ending the tournament with a 41-5 record.

Following the lone home appearance, the team traveled to Knoxville, Tenn., and claimed the Lady Vol Rocky Top Invitational

title, defeating No. 4 Louisiana-Lafayette to claim the title, with Blades the top pitcher and Berman tournament MVP.

Southern Miss then closed out the season with a two-game sweep of Saint Louis, in the inaugural Conference USA championship series, ending the regular-season with a 48-6 record and national ranking of No. 8.

Southern Miss then earned the No. 4 seed in the NCAA Regional hosted by LSU. The team opened the Regional with a 1-0 victory over Oregon State and then defeated Oklahoma, 5-0 in the winner's bracket. Then the team faced LSU for the right to advance to the championship game. LSU held a 3-1 lead in the sixth inning, but Lady Eagle freshman Kenya Peters, who broke her leg on the first day of fall practice, strolled to the plate and, with a runner on third, blasted a two-run home run over the left field wall, giving the team a 4-3 lead, to get to the championship game. Oregon State then awaited, and the Lady Beavers claimed game one, 9-1. But the team rebounded in game two, claiming a 4-0 victory to take the title, advancing to the Women's College World Series. Blades was the Tournament MVP and became the NCAA's all-time single season strikeout leader.

Less than 48 hours after winning the regional, the team traveled to Oklahoma City to compete in the Women's College World Series. Facing Fresno State in the opening game, the team dropped a heart-breaking 1-0 decision, to fall into the loser's bracket. After a day off, the team then faced DePaul, and again fell in a heartbreaking 1-0 game, as the team ended the year with a 52-9 record, and National Ranking of No. 8.

What a year 1999 was for the Lady Eagle softball team, as it had an incredible season. With the full roster returning in 2000, the 1999 edition got the ball rolling for a sign of big things that were to come.

2000 Lady Eagles Have Best Season In School History, Earn Second Straight NCAA Regional Title And Women's College World Series Berth

The 2000 Southern Miss softball team faced a daunting challenge; better, or at least match the unprecedented success of the 1999 team, the school's first after the program was discontinued following the 1992 season.

It would be a tough task, as the 1999 team finished with a school record 52-9 campaign, won an NCAA Regional, advanced to the Women's College World Series and finished the year with a No. 8 national ranking.

With every starter, including first team Louisville Slugger All-Americans Courtney Blades and Amy Berman returning, expectations were again high, especially with a No. 5 preseason national ranking.

But the season did not get off to the best of starts, as the team dropped its first four games of the year, including losses to the No. 1 and No. 2 ranked teams in the nation. But the team rebounded and used a 10-game winning streak to stabilize itself and then used a 16-game winning streak, including wins over No. 7 LSU and No. 4 Oklahoma, on its way to claiming the Ringor/Winthrop Invitational.

Standing with a 35-10 record as entering the final stretch of the season, Southern Miss rolled off 24-consecutive wins, as the team allowed only 10 runs during that span, claiming two tournament titles, the Florida State Invitational and inaugural Conference USA regular-season and tournament titles, which was held in Hattiesburg at Oak Grove Optimist Park. The Lady Eagles won three straight to

claim the title, defeating Louisville, USF and then DePaul in the championship game. Blades was named Conference USA Pitcher of the Year and MVP, earning first team All-Conference USA honors,



while Chrystal Stevens and Berman also earned first team all-league honors. In addition, Kenya Peters and Jen Ford earned second-team honors.

The season also saw Blades make NCAA history, as she became the all-time leader in strikeouts, fanning USF's Renee Oursler for her 1,641st strikeout, passing University of California standout Michelle Granger. She was also a three-time national player of the week in 2000.

Ending the regular-season with a 59-10 record, the Lady Eagles then make their second-consecutive trip down to Baton Rouge, La., to compete in an NCAA Regional. The team opened with two wins over Oregon and Hofstra, before falling to LSU in a 1-0 decision. But the Lady Eagles then rebounded, eliminating Oregon to advance to

the championship game, in a rematch against LSU. Blades allowed only three hits, and as Jen Ford was hit by a pitch with the bases loaded, the team was headed back to the Women's College World Series. Blades was named MVP of the NCAA Regional.

The team would earn the No. 7 seed in the Women's College World Series, but faced a tough draw in No. 2 seed Arizona in the opening game. But Blades was outstanding, as she struck out 11 batters on her way to the fourth perfect game in Women's College World Series history. The team dropped its next game, falling 3-1 to eventual national champion Oklahoma, forcing the team to fight its way out of the

losers' bracket. The Lady Eagles took a step in that direction, eliminating Alabama to reach the semifinals, but then fell to national champion runner-up UCLA. Blades and designated player Erin Johnson were named to the Women's College World Series All-Tournament team.

Blades earned the Honda Award for Softball Player of the Year, also earning Louisville Slugger first-team All-American honors, while Berman earned third-team honors. The duo, along with Johnson, also earned first-team All-South Region honors.

The 2000 team ended the season with a school record 63-13 mark and No. 4 national ranking, surpassing the lofty expectations that followed the 1999 season, proving that the 1999 was no fluke, while staking its claim as one of the top programs in the country.

2001 Lady Eagles Make Third-Consecutive NCAA Regional Appearance, Win Conference USA Tournament Title

The 2001 season was one of change. A new coach, Gay McNutt took over the program, as Lu Harris, who guided the program to unprecedented heights with back-to-back NCAA Regional titles and berths in the Women's College World Series departed for Georgia.

New players also joined the program, as McNutt was faced with the daunting task of replacing seven starters, including the national player of the year and two All-Americans. With an opening day roster of 13 players, the team lacked depth, not to mention plenty of skeptics who wondered if the program, which had experienced so much success in the previous two seasons, would see that success come to a close.

It certainly looked that way, as the team, preseason ranked No. 21 nationally, opened its season 2-3. But the team silenced the doubters, winning nine of the next 11, including a 2-1 victory over defending national champion Oklahoma at the NCF A Leadoff Classic in Columbus, Ga., behind a three-hit performance from Melissa Cundiff, improving to 11-5 on the season.

But overconfidence from that victory probably played a role in the team losing five of its next nine, before rebounding by winning seven of the next eight, to stand 22-16.

The Lady Eagles then looked to defend their Conference USA regular-season and tournament titles, winning their first two opening series, taking two of three games against UAB and Houston.

Southern Miss continued its strong league play, sweeping both Charlotte and Saint Louis, before DePaul took two of three from the team.



The team then traveled to USF, where the Lady Eagles dropped a pair of one-run contests, before claiming a victory in the series finale. Southern Miss then concluded the regular season against Louisville, needing a sweep to earn the No. 2 seed in the Conference USA Tournament. The Lady Eagles did just that, and entered the league tournament as the second seed, looking to defend its title.

Before the tournament began, several Lady Eagles earned individual accolades, as Felicia Gonzales was named Conference USA Pitcher of the Year, while Tammy Edwards, Channika Gant and Gonzales all earned first-team all-league honors. Amanda Brown was named second-team All-Conference USA, while Cundiff and Heather Bell were named Conference USA All-Freshmen.

Southern Miss got off to a good start in the Conference USA Tournament, opening the tourney with a 9-0 victory over Saint Louis, before taking a 1-0 victory over USF. The Lady Eagles then suffered a

5-0 loss to DePaul, in a game that was postponed due to a rain delay, before the team rallied from a 1-0 deficit against Louisville in the fifth inning, scoring seven runs in the final two frames to advance to the championship game against DePaul. For the second-consecutive season, the Lady Eagles defeated the Lady Demons for the league title, claiming a 2-0 victory to earn an automatic bid into the NCAA Tournament, as Gonzales earned tournament MVP honors, while Brown, Edwards and Kenya Peters all made the all-tournament team.

The team then traveled to Baton Rouge, La., for its third consecutive regional appearance. The Lady Eagles had happy memories in Baton Rouge, as they claimed the regional title there in both 1999 and 2000. But the team would not win a third-consecutive regional, falling to Louisiana-Lafayette 5-1 and 1-0 to Penn State, ending the season with a 46-21 mark, the third best performance in school history.

The 2001 team will be remembered as a team that despite its youth, inexperience, lack of depth, came together and proved that the success from the 1999 and 2000 seasons was not a fluke.

2004 Lady Eagles Win Conference USA Regular-Season, Make Fourth NCAA Regional Appearance In School History

The 2004 season certainly was a year to remember for the Southern Miss softball team, erasing the bad memories that followed back-to-back sub .500 seasons in 2002 and 2003. But there was a different feeling around the program entering 2004, as the team gained confidence and played well to close out 2003, winning seven out of their final 11 games.

That confidence was expected to carry over in 2004, but Southern Miss struggled to a 5-11 record in its first 16 games of the season. But the struggles wouldn't last the entire season, as the Lady Eagles caught fire and were virtually unstoppable over their final 23 games, winning 18 times, to close out the regular season.

The Lady Eagles closed out the regular season on an eight-game win streak, on their way to claiming the Conference USA regular-season title, their first since 2000, thanks to a 19-4 league mark. Southern Miss also earned the top seed in the Conference USA Tournament, but did not perform like it wanted, exiting the tourney in two games.

Though the Lady Eagles were disappointed with their performance in the Conference USA Tournament, that disappointment soon faded with news that the team would be playing in the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2001.

Southern Miss earned the fifth seed in the Region 7 Tournament in Palo Alto, Calif. The trip proved to be successful as the team won a game, the first NCAA Regional victory for the program since 2000, ending the year with a 33-26 overall mark.

Standing 5-11 on the season and off a road stretch that saw the team play 17 of 18 games away from the friendly confines of the Southern Miss Softball Complex, the Lady Eagles returned home for a badly needed 12-game homestand. It would be a good homestand,

as the team won nine of those 12 games, improving to 14-14 on the season, gaining momentum entering the second half of the season. In the homestand, Jessica Saunier pitched Southern Miss' first no-



hitter at the Lady Eagle Softball Complex. The team also opened Conference USA action at home, sweeping Saint Louis to open league play 3-0.

After falling below .500 again at USF, the team got a 6-0 victory over in-state rival Mississippi State and then swept Houston in league play. The Houston series was the one that Southern Miss Head Coach Gay McNutt said turned the season around. The team swept all three games, getting above .500 for the first time all season at 18-17, also improving to 6-3 in Conference USA.

The team then swept UAB in its next league series, took two of three at Charlotte, before returning home to face league foe DePaul, the defending Conference USA champions. The Lady Eagles took the first game, 2-1, and used a walk-off three run homer by Ashley

Brenan to beat the Blue Demons, 12-4, in five innings in game two. The series finale was canceled due to rain.

Entering its final six games of the season, Southern Miss needed two weekend sweeps to have a chance to win the Conference title.

Southern Miss got half-way there at East Carolina, sweeping the Lady Pirates, returning home to face league-leader Louisville.

The series against the Lady Cardinals had its fair share of dramatics, with the Lady Eagles taking the first game, 4-2, on a walk-off, two-run home run by Sarah Boyd in the eighth inning. The second game of the series saw Danielle Wymer limit Louisville to just one run on eight hits as Southern Miss won 6-1. In the series finale, a solo home run by Auriel Jenkins in the bottom of the sixth inning proved to be the deciding run, as the Lady Eagles claimed the Conference USA regular-season title, finishing league play with a mark of 19-4.

The sweep also netted the top seed in the Conference USA Tournament for Southern

Miss, but a disappointing performance in the tournament sent the Lady Eagles home early to ponder their postseason future.

For their season efforts, Southern Miss received several honors. McNutt was named Conference USA Coach of the Year, and Jenkins was named Conference USA MVP. In addition, Jessica Holaway, Ashley Davis, Jessica Huerta and Jenkins were named All-Conference USA, while Sue Logan was named to the Conference USA All-Freshman team. Jenkins also was named to the Easton Sports' All-American third-team.

The team then earned the No. 5 seed in the NCAA Region 7 Tournament hosted by Stanford in Palo, Alto, Calif., winning a game, before ending the season with a 33-26 overall record, the fourth-best total in school history.
