Noting the Golden Eagles

- Southern Miss plays in its 106th football season in 2022, having first fielded a team in 1912. The Golden Eagles are 608-449-27, which is 41st best among FBS teams by winning percentage (.573).
- The Golden Eagles will begin play in their fourth different conference in their football history this season, after holding a spot in the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Association from 1931-41, the Gulf States Conference from 1948-1951 and Conference USA from 1996-2021. Southern Miss starts its first year as a member of the Sun Belt Conference.
- The program has collected 23 winning seasons over the last 29 and appeared in 18 bowl games during that time.
- Overall, Southern Miss has enjoyed 73 winning seasons and five years of .500 football over its history. Since 2000, the Golden Eagles have 17 of 22 winning seasons.

The Tulane Series

- Southern Miss and Tulane renewed their "Battle for the Bell" rivalry after a nine-year hiatus with the first-ever game played outside of either Hattiesburg or New Orleans when they met in the 2020 Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl. The two teams then played the next season in Hattiesburg and Tulane grabbed a 66-24 decision.
- The 2020 game was added after non-conference opponents for each team were dropped during the COVID pandemic.
- This is the first game of a current four-game series from 2022-2027. The Golden Eagles play the Green Wave in New Orleans during this weekend and in the 2026 campaign and in Hattiesburg in 2023 and 2027.
- The "Battle for the Bell" was added to the series prior to the 1999 game and the Golden Eagles have won nine of 12 between the schools since the addition of the bell to the game.
- The series dates back to 1979 in which the Golden Eagles hold a 23-9 overall advantage and won six of the last eight games between the two schools (for a breakdown of the series please go to page 3 of the notes).
- Both schools were charter members of Conference USA and played in the league together from 1996 until 2013. The two schools did not meet in the Green Wave's final three seasons within C-USA.
- Golden Eagle head coach Will Hall was the offensive coordinator for Tulane the last two meetings between the teams.
- Running backs coach Jordy Joseph was with the Green Wave for nine years, including five on their coaching staff, before joining Southern Miss prior to the 2021 campaign. Joseph was a quarterback for the Green Wave from 2011-15 and never played against the Golden Eagles in college.
- Southern Miss looks to snap a two-game losing streak to the Wave.
- Eleven current Green Wave players hail from the state of Mississippi, including Nick Anderson (LB/Vicksburg), Cameron Carroll (RB/Flowood), Joey Claybrook (OL/Starkville), Blake Gunter (TE/Madison), Kiland Harrison (DB/Raymond), Nik Hogan (OL/Brandon), Tylo Phillips (DL/Collinsville), Trey Tuggle (OL/Mize), Will Wallace (TE/Natchez), Duece Watts (WR/Richton) and Phat Watts (WR/Richton).
- Gunter is the younger brother of Grayson Gunter, who played for the Golden Eagles in 2020-21.
- Southern Miss has four players from the New Orleans metro area including Cole Cavallo (TE/Slidell), Zahn Diaz (RB/Mandeville), Trey Hebert (PK/Mandeville), Andrew Stein (PK/Slidell).
- This is the second of four games versus Louisiana school for Southern Miss this season.

Will Hall

Head Football Coach | Second Season - 4-11 (.267) / Overall - Eighth Season 60-31 (.659)

At his introductory press conference in December of 2020 as the 22nd head coach of Southern Miss football, Will Hall spoke about how 'attitude is everything' in his initial comments to those in attendance at Reed Green Coliseum.

That attitude has provided a relentlessly positive approach in how he has communicated and prepared his players, elevated the growth of every facet of this football program, while also energizing a fan base since first taking the stage as the Golden Eagles top football coach.

In his opening season for the Golden Eagles, adversity struck hard for the program as the Golden Eagles saw most of their quarterback corps go down due to injury during the early portion of the season. Despite that fact, the Golden Eagles remained upbeat each week and transitioned its offense that many fans dubbed the "Superback" featuring a running back overseeing the offense from a shotgun position toward the latter part of the campaign.

That transition allowed the Golden Eagles to win two of their final three games of the campaign, while also almost knocking off the league champion, UTSA.

Hall also oversaw a Nasty Bunch defense that provided many highlights, including holding its opponents to the second fewest first downs in the country (197), while collecting the fourth most fumble recoveries (13). The defense gave up just 358.5 yards per game, which ranked No. 3 in Conference USA and No. 42 in the country. Southern Miss bettered their national ranking in total defense by 18 spots from the previous year.

With its core nucleus of players returning for 2022, to go along with a plethora of talent incoming for this season, Southern Miss looks poised to make a splash its initial Sun Belt Conference season as well as return to a bowl game for the first time since the 2019 campaign.

Hall, a native of Amory, Miss., came to Southern Miss after serving the previous two years as offensive coordinator at Tulane.

Hall made an immediate impact on the Tulane offense and helped the Green Wave rewrite their offensive record books. He helped Tulane post one of the most successful offensive seasons in program history in 2019. The Green Wave finished the season ranked 11th in the nation in rushing offense (243.2), 22nd in total offense (449.3) and 30th in scoring offense (33.1). Hall helped the Green Wave rush for over 200 yards in nine games in 2019 and over 300 times four times.

The Tulane offense set the program record in rushing yards at 3,162 yards in 2019. The offense ranked second in program history in rushing yards per game (243.2), rushing touchdowns (33) and rushing first downs (166).

Tulane's offense also eclipsed 500 yards five times, including a season-high 634 total yards against UConn. The Green Wave also set a season-high in passing yards against the Huskies with 323.

In 2020, the Green Wave enjoyed more success offensively as they finished No. 17 nationally in rushing offense (217.1), No. 19 in first downs (258) and No. 22 in scoring offense (34.7), while adding two more 500-yard total offensive games to his resume.

Hall joined the Green Wave coaching staff after he spent the 2018 campaign as the Associate Head Coach/Tight Ends Coach at the University of Memphis where he helped guide the Tigers to the American Athletic Conference Championship game for the second straight season and helped the Tigers to their fifth straight bowl appearance.

During his lone season at Memphis, Hall helped guide the Tigers to a school record with 42 rushing touchdowns during the regular season. In addition, Memphis finished the regular season with 3,311 rushing yards, setting a new school record.

Memphis' offense ranked in the nation's top 10 in rushing (No. 5, 275.9), scoring offense (No. 6, 43.8) and total offense (No. 6, 530.3) under Hall's assistance. In addition, Hall helped four Memphis offensive players earn All-AAC honors.

Hall joined the Memphis staff in January 2018 after spending the 2017 season as the offensive coordinator for the Louisiana-Lafayette Ragin' Cajuns, where six offensive players received all-conference honors. The Cajuns ranked among the best in the nation in red zone offense and turnovers lost with just 16.

In his one season as offensive coordinator at Louisiana-Lafayette, the Ragin' Cajuns compiled the Sun Belt Conference's third-best rushing offense with 2,204 yards and 27 rushing touchdowns. The Louisiana-Lafayette offense tied for the second-fewest turnovers in the Sun Belt during the 2017 season. The Cajuns were also efficient in the red zone, leading the Sun Belt by scoring

on 92.9-percent of their red zone chances.

In his three-year head coaching stint at West Georgia (UWG), Hall led the Wolves to a 31-9 record, the first Gulf South Conference (GSC) title since 2000 and a pair of NCAA Division II semifinal appearances. His first two seasons at UWG produced a pair of 12-win seasons before he finished 7-4 in 2016.

Success was immediate for Hall as the Wolves set multiple school records, won their first GSC title in 14 years and reached the NCAA Division II playoffs.

Under his direction, a program that had not made an impact in the conference, much less nationally, in over a decade transformed into the talk of the nation in NCAA Division II. Under Hall's direction, the Wolves were nationally ranked for 17 weeks consecutively and earned the program's first No. 1 national ranking on Oct. 26, 2015.

Hall's first UWG squad in 2014 caught more than a few people by surprise. The Wolves finished the regular season strong with a 9-2 record and earned the program's first NCAA playoffs bid since 2000. Road wins at Tuskegee, Delta State, and Valdosta State were the first postseason victories in the school's Division II history and gave UWG the NCAA Super Region 2 title.

Though UWG caught no one by surprise in 2015, it didn't matter. Hall's juggernaut roared through the first nine games of the regular season, all wins, and none were closer than a 17-point margin. A three-touchdown, Week 8 win over nationally ranked North Alabama pushed the Wolves into the top spot in the nation in Division II for the first time in school history.

Hall was twice named GSC Coach of the Year and was the Super Region 2 Coach of the Year.

In his first season at West Georgia, more than 30 team and individual records fell. In addition to setting records, the Wolves hauled in individual accolades.

Sixteen players earned All-Gulf South Conference recognition and seven received All-American distinction, which included the program's first Academic All-American in Alex Macaulay.

From 2011-13 as the head coach at West Alabama, his teams won two league titles and twice earned spots in the NCAA Division II Playoffs.

Hall's players also have had success at the next level, and among that group of honored athletes is 2015 Super Bowl hero and current Tennessee Titan Malcolm Butler, who was a two-time All-GSC performer for Hall at West Alabama. In the spring of 2016, offensive tackle Dominique Robertson became the first UWG player in school history to receive an invitation to the NFL Draft Combine.

Prior to his six seasons at West Alabama, Hall enjoyed successful stints on the coaching staff at Arkansas-Monticello, Southwest Baptist, Henderson State, and Presbyterian. Hall's achievements in the coaching profession are a carryover from his illustrious career on the playing field at North Alabama.

Hall played for his father, Bobby Hall, at Amory High School leading the Panthers to the 1998 Mississippi High School Athletic Association (MHSAA) Class 3A state title. From 1999-2000, he attended Northwest Mississippi Community College, where he was a two-time National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) All-American.

In 2000, Hall set a NJCAA record for total offense in a season (4,075 yards) and added a NJCAA single-game record with nine touchdown passes.

Hall then moved to North Alabama, where he was a quarterback for the Lions from 2002-03. He won the Harlan Hill Trophy in 2003, emblematic of being America's top player in NCAA Division II. In 2003, Hall, who threw for 3,531 yards and 30 touchdowns, led the Lions to a 13-1 record and an NCAA Division II semifinals appearance.

In 2004, Hall signed a contract to play for the Tupelo FireAnts of the National Indoor Football League. Playing once again for his father, who was the head coach for the team, Hall passed for 2,046 yards and 44 touchdowns while rushing for 13 scores in the 14-game season. A 2003 graduate of North Alabama, Hall, and wife Rebecca, have two sons – Tripp and Pete.

Last Time versus Tulane

Tulane 66, Southern Miss 24 Sept. 26, 2020

HATTIESBURG, Miss. (AP) — Cameron Carroll scored a career-high three of Tulane's seven rushing touchdowns and added a 16-yard TD reception, and the Green Wave beat Southern Miss 66-24.

Carroll finished with a career-best 163 yards on 15 carries. Freshman Michael Pratt came off the bench and finished 8-of-18 passing for 142 yards and two touchdowns and added seven carries for 40 yards, including a 1-yard touchdown for Tulane.

Southern Miss jumped to a 14-0 lead fewer than five minutes into the game but Tyjae Spears scored on runs of 2 and 15 yards to tie it early in the second quarter. After Jack Abraham hit Naricuss Driver for a 61-yard touchdown to put the Golden Eagles back in front, Pratt hit Carroll to make it 21-all and then Merek Glover's 41-yard field goal with 1:41 left in the first half gave Tulane the lead for good.

Abraham completed 23 of 38 passes for 299 yards and two touchdowns with one interception for Southern Miss. He connected with Jason Brownlee for an 88-yard touchdown that made it 14-0 with 10:31 left in the first quarter, the fourth-longest completion in program history.

Carroll scored on a 30-yard run with 41 seconds left in the first half before he raced untouched off left tackle for a 52-yard touchdown on the second play from scrimmage in the third quarter to make it 38-21.

The Green Wave finished with 556 total yards, including 414 rushing.

The Golden Eagles at Home

Since the start of the 1976 season, following the renovation of M.M. Roberts Stadium, the Golden Eagles have posted a 158-77 (.672) record at The Rock. The program has finished at .500 or better in home games for a season 39 times during that span.

Notes from Northwestern State Game

- The 41 points was the most scored in the opening half by the Golden Eagles since tallying that number against Jackson State on Sept. 1, 2018, and the 64 points scored in the contest is the most in the Will Hall era and most by Southern Miss since scoring 66 against Charlotte on Nov. 18, 2017.
- Southern Miss won for the 22nd-straight time against a team lower than the FBS.
- Freshman right tackle Kyron Barnes recorded his first career start.
- Reserve quarterback Ty Keyes threw for a career-best 192 yards on 6-of-9 throws and was responsible for four touchdowns (three throwing, one rush) as he added 29 yards on five carries. His touchdown throws were for 89 (Jalen May), 58 (Zay Franks) and 40 yards (Jakarius Caston). It was the first two TD receiving game for Caston and the 89-yard throw to May was the fourth longest TD pass in school history.
- Four quarterbacks combined to throw for over 300 yards, marking the first Southern Miss 300-yard performance since Oct. 2, 2021, when the Golden Eagles aired out 321 against Rice.
- Southern Miss added 587 offensive yards are the most since Dec. 10, 2020 against Florida Atlantic (514).
- Dominic Qewon registered his second sack of the year to start the second quarter and forcing a fumble that Swayze Bozeman returned 12 yards for a touchdown. The fumble return for a score was the first for the program since Everitt Cunningham returned a punt 47 yards against Troy (9/18/21). Southern Miss now has a defensive touchdown in five of the last seven games.
- Jay Stanley registered his first interception of the year and fifth of his career in the second quarter. The Golden Eagles have picked off at least one pass in all three games in 2022 and now have five on the year.
- Arian Gregory forced a sack early in the third quarter resulting in a safety for the Demons. It was the first safety forced by the Golden Eagles since at Rice (10/2/21) last season.
- Southern Miss limited NSU to 16 rushing yards. It was the first time to hold an opponent under 100 yards rushing for since Grambling State had 51 (9/1/21) and first time keeping a foe under 50 yards since allowing 31 at South Alabama (9/4/21).
- Briggs Bourgeois collected field goals of 34- and 26-yards and also converted all of his seven extra points. He also booted 10 kickoffs for 643 yards and posted eight touchbacks.
- Natrone Brooks tied a single-game school record with seven punt returns in the contest and his 145 return yards is the second most punt return yards (school record is Bobby Holmes with 177 at Alabama in 1949).
- The Golden Eagles finished with 178 punt returns to establish a school record for that category.

Sun Belt Conference Inaugural Season

- After spending the last 26 seasons in Conference USA, the Golden Eagles announced its intention of joining the Sun Belt Conference last fall and became full members July 1.
- The Golden Eagles are part of the new 14-team Sun Belt Conference that are separated in the East (App State, Coastal Carolina, Georgia Southern, Georgia State, James Madison, Marshall and Old Dominion) and West (Arkansas State, Louisiana, South Alabama, Southern Miss, Texas State, Troy and ULM) division. JMU, ODU and Marshall joins the Golden Eagles as first-year members.
- Southern Miss won five Conference USA titles during its tenure, including one since divisional play started in 2005. They captured their only league title contest and the school's fifth overall C-USA league crown when they beat Houston, 49-28, in 2011.
- The school's other C-USA titles came in the inaugural season of 1996 as well as the 1997, 1999 and 2003 campaigns. The Golden Eagles also won two East Division crowns in C-USA (2006, 2011), and captured their first West title in 2015 after moving to that division during the 2014 campaign. Southern Miss won its third division title in 2015, but lost in the C-USA championship game at WKU, 45-28. Southern Miss was 1-2 in C-USA title games.
- Along with the five C-USA titles, the Golden Eagles also won three league titles - 1948, 1950, 1951 - when they were members of the Gulf States Conference.
- Against the current membership of the Sun Belt Conference, the Golden Eagles are 74-28-1 versus league foes, having never met Coastal Carolina, Georgia State and JMU.

The Offensive Line

The Golden Eagle offensive front line returned six players that made at least one start a year ago and five of those players started in two of the first three games of the season. Freshman Kyron Barnes made his first start against Northwestern State, replacing Paul Gainer at right tackle. The Golden Eagles had gone with the same starting lineup in each of the first two games in 2022. The longest streak of using the same lineup last year was three games and they did that twice during the year. Gerquan Scott, who is the only returning Southern Miss player to start every game on the line last year, ran his consecutive start streak to 19 last week for the Golden Eagles. Gainer, who has played the most on the offensive line at 27 contests, has 12 starts, while John Bolding started for the ninth straight time, getting the call at right guard.

Wilcke Gets the Call at Quarterback

Zach Wilcke became the ninth true freshman since 1987 to get the starting call at quarterback at No. 15 Miami. Wilcke is the sixth Golden Eagle true freshman to start since the start of the 2012 campaign. He is the first freshman quarterback for the program to start in his initial Southern Miss playing experience since Keon Howard, who started at Old Dominion, on Nov. 12, 2016.

Wilcke went 16-for-27 for 207 yards in his debut with a 32-yard touchdown pass to Jason Brownlee. He added a team-high 15 yards rushing. His passing yards were the most by a Golden Eagle freshman in his debut since Howard threw 230 on 12-of-24 attempts at ODU with a TD throw.

Wilcke made the start due to an injury with Ty Keyes, which he sustained in the opening half of the Liberty contest. The Golden Eagles used their SuperBack offense for the remainder of that contest.

Against Northwestern State, Wilcke opened the contest and threw for 102 yards on 9-of-18 with a touchdown in limited action.

Keyes Shines in Reserve Role versus Demons

Ty Keyes, who came off the bench for the Golden Eagles at quarterback, threw for a career-high 192 yards on 6-of-9 passes with three touchdowns throws and added a rushing score. He accounted for the first touchdown of the contest for the Golden Eagles with a 40-yard strike to Jakarius Caston with 4:06 left to go in the first period. He added a 89-yard scoring pass across the middle to Jalen May just before halftime, which ranks as the fourth longest TD passing play in school history. Keyes, who tallied 29 rushing yards on five carries, collected a seven-yard scoring run in the third quarter, before throwing a 58-yard TD pass to Zay Franks later in the period. Keyes helped the Golden Eagles throw for 400 yards - the first time that they had reached 400 yards in the air since throwing 421 versus North Texas in 2019. The Golden Eagles also finished with 587 total offensive yards.

Big Play Brownlee

Southern Miss senior Jason Brownlee led the team last season with 46 catches for 643 yards and eight touchdowns, despite having to mesh with all the different signal callers. He posted a solid performance against Rice with eight catches for a career-best 127 yards and against Middle Tennessee registered a career-high nine catches for 120 yards and his fifth career 100-yard receiving game.

After the Middle Tennessee contest, Brownlee recorded a touchdown catch for the second-straight game against North Texas with four catches for a team-high 53 yards. He caught Frank Gore, Jr.'s first career pass of 32 yards at UTSA and followed that with his first two-touchdown catch game - both coming from Gore, Jr. - at Louisiana Tech as he caught five passes for 67 yards. Brownlee finished the season with two more TD catches from Gore, Jr., in the finale - both from 34 yards out - as he finished with five catches for 98 yards against FIU to conclude the 2021 campaign.

Brownlee has started the 2022 season with eight catches for 157 yards and is the top current receiver for the Golden Eagles who has 88 career catches for 1,410 yards with 14 touchdown grabs.

He tallied his sixth 100-yard receiving game at Miami with five catches for 102 yards.

Gore Leads the Running Backs

Frank Gore, Jr. led the Golden Eagles offense in a couple of roles last season. He was the team's top running back with 801 yards on the ground with three rushing scores and was also called to take snaps from the center late in the year and converted 10-of-16 passes for 189 yards with four touchdown passes, two coming at LA Tech and two versus FIU. He also led the team in all-purpose yards with 990, as he also had 155 receiving yards.

He started his third season with a career-best 178 yards on a career-best 32 carries as he also threw for 48 yards on 1-of-4 passing against Liberty. It was his sixth 100-yard rushing game of his career and the Golden Eagles are 4-2 when he achieves that feat.

Gore, Jr., led the team in rushing in 2020 with 708 yards on 121 carries for a 5.9 rush average. Gore was a second-team All-Conference USA selection in 2020 and was a member of the league's All-Freshman team. Gore is a member of the preseason watch list for the Doak Walker Award, given to the nation's top running back.

His six 100-yard rushing games tie him for 13th on Golden Eagle charts for that category with Tony Smith (1989-91) and Kendrick Hardy (2010-13).

Youngest Defensive Coordinator in the FBS

Southern Miss defensive coordinator Austin Armstrong has the distinction of being the youngest defensive coordinator in the Football Bowl Subdivision for the second-straight season. At 29, Armstrong came to Southern Miss last season from Louisiana-Lafayette where he was the inside linebackers coach. The next youngest defensive coordinator is Nate Dreiling at New Mexico State, who opens the season at 31 years old.

Nasty Bunch Opens Season with Solid Performance

Southern Miss finished 2021 at No. 42 nationally in total defense, allowing 358.5 yards per contest. The group finished No. 73 in the country in rushing defense (156.5 ypg), holding opponents to under 100 yards on the ground three times, and 24th in passing yards allowed at 202.0 per game.

The Golden Eagles surrendered 27.9 points per contest, ranking No. 80 in the country. But of the 335 points allowed by the team, the Golden Eagles gave up 63 points directly off turnovers, 34 points on short fields after turnovers, 14 points on two kick returns for scores, and one safety when the quarterback was sacked in the end zone, cutting the number to the defense allowing to 18.5 points per contest.

In 2022, the Golden Eagles have allowed an average of 377.0 yards per game, but limited the Flames to just 194 yards over the first three quarters and held Miami to 10 points in the opening half. They also have produced six turnovers this season, including three versus Liberty, and at least one in each of the three games this season.

Shorts Leading Team in Tackles in 2022

Defensive back Malik Shorts paced the Golden Eagles in 2021, as he was the school's nominee for the Conerly Trophy - the top collegiate player in the state of Mississippi.

In seven games last season, he either led or tied for the team high in tackles. Shorts ranked first in tackles with 89 including two tackles for loss, two interceptions and seven pass breakups.

Shorts ranked second in tackles in 2020 at 81, including 14 tackles versus Louisiana Tech as well as a team-high 11 stops at WKU. He had three 10 or more tackles contests three times in 2020. He tallied his lone interception of the season against UTSA.

This season, Shorts opened with a game-high 12 tackles and an interception against Liberty and

followed that with a game-high 13 stops with another interception at Miami. He got two tackles in limited action against Northwestern State.

Latham Finished No. 3 in Country in Fumble Recoveries

Santrell Latham recovered three fumbles last season - the last one he returned 72 yards at Louisiana Tech - and finished ranked No. 3 in the country in that category. He also forced four fumbles which ranked No. 8 in the country. He started this season with another forced fumble on a sack against Liberty to give him six forces in his career. Latham collected six solo tackles in the contest with two of those tackles for loss. He followed that with three assisted tackles last week at Miami.

Latham ended fifth on the team in tackles with 52, including five for loss, a season ago.

This year, after getting six tackles versus Northwestern State, Latham is tied for second on the team in stops with 16.

Ratcliff Returns as Top Tackler on D-Line

Sophomore Josh Ratcliff returned as the top defensive lineman in terms of tackles returning in 2022. Ratcliff tallied 34 tackles (13 solos) with 4.5 tackles for loss and a half sack to go along with one fumble recovery. After not registering a tackle in the opener, Ratcliff posted a career-high tying five stops against Miami, including his first sack of the year.

In the 2022 opener, defensive line teammates Kristin Booth and Jalen Williams paced the defensive line with four tackles each, while Armondous Cooley added three stops. Against Miami, Williams collected seven stops while Quentin Bivens tallied his first sack of the year. Ratcliff led all defensive lineman in tackles against Northwestern State with four stops, including a half sack and 1.5 tackles for loss and a quarterback hurry.

Briggs Bourgeois Back Booting Kicks

Redshirt senior Briggs Bourgeois opened 2022 by making all three extra-point attempts to go along with 2-of-3 field goals made, including a career-long 53 yard attempt in the second overtime. He added an extra point and two touchbacks in his contest at Miami. His best game of the year came last week in which he converted 34- and 26-yard field goals as well as making seven-of-seven extra point attempts. He also notched 10 kickoffs for a 64.3 yard average, including eight touchbacks.

In his career, Bourgeois has converted 26-of-37 field goals, while making 70-of-74 career extra-point attempts.

This is the third consecutive year and fifth overall that Bourgeois has handled most of the kicking duties, after missing 2019 with a leg injury.

Hunt Punts Down the Field

Redshirt senior Mason Hunt, who punted in the first game of 2020 and averaged 32.2 yards per punt over four tries against South Alabama in his only action of the year, had the duties all during the 2021 campaign. He is a Ray Guy Award Watchlist honoree prior to this season.

Hunt opened 2021 by blasting eight punts for an average of 47.9 yards. It was, at the time, the longest average by a Golden Eagle punter in a game since Zac Everett enjoyed a 48.7 punting average over three punts against ULM on Sept. 8, 2018.

Hunt enjoyed his best punting day of the season, averaging 51.7 yards per punt over six punts against UTEP. Of his punts, three were over 50 yards including a career-long 63 and 60-yard punts. He pinned the Miners back inside the 20-yardline four times including the 1, 4 and 6 yardlines. He also added a punt to the Miner 9 that was returned for six yards to the 15, but a facemask penalty forced the ball up to the 30.

Hunt finished the season by averaging 43.6 yards over 71 punts with 40 fair catches, 18 inside the opponents 20 and 15 or more for 50 yards. His per punt average was the furthest by a Golden Eagle since Tyler Sarrazin averaged 44.7 yards per punt in 2016.

Hunt started this year with 15 punts for a 43.3 average, including seven inside the opponent's 20 yardline and a long of 57 versus Miami.

Harrell Preseason All-Sun Belt at Kick Returner

Senior Camron Harrell was the only Golden Eagle to post a preseason All-Sun Belt Conference nod by the league's coaches at first-team kick returner.

Last season, Harrell returned 26 kicks for 662 yards and a 25.5 yard per return average. He contributed with a 95-yard touchdown return at Rice. It was his second kickoff return for a score during his Golden Eagle career as he also a 100-yard return in the 2020 season finale versus Florida Atlantic. He opened this year with two kickoff returns for 38 yards against Liberty.

His two career kickoff returns for touchdowns is tied for a school record, as Harrell holds it with seven other players.

In 2022, he has six returns for a 22.2 yard average with a long of 35 yards.

Eric Scott, Jr., also added a 22-yard interception return for a touchdown for the Golden Eagles, marking the fourth time that has happened over the last five games.

Game 2: at No. 15 Miami 30, Southern Miss 7 (Sept. 10, 2022)

MIAMI GARDENS, Fla. -- (AP) A pair of third-quarter touchdowns — barely two minutes apart — changed the game, Henry Parrish rushed for 97 yards and a score, and No. 15 Miami pulled away in the second half to beat Southern Miss 30-7 on Saturday at Hard Rock Stadium.

The Hurricanes (2-0) trailed for most of the second quarter, then shook off the slow start by scoring the game's final 27 points.

Thaddius Franklin Jr. rushed in from seven yards out for a 17-7 third-quarter lead, Tyler Van Dyke connected with KeyShawn Smith for a 35-yard flea-flicker touchdown on Miami's next offensive snap, and the outcome wasn't in doubt again.

Parrish had a 1-yard touchdown run late in the first half for only the seventh time in the past 18 seasons.

Jason Brownlee caught a 32-yard touchdown pass from Zach Wilcke for Southern Miss (0-2). That capped a six-play, 75-yard drive for the Golden Eagles — but they managed only 122 yards on their next seven drives, five of which ended in punts, one with an interception in the end zone and the other with a fumble.

Frank Gore Jr., the son of Miami Hall of Famer Frank Gore, was held largely in check by the Hurricanes' defense in his return to his hometown. Gore Jr. had seven carries for 10 yards, and two catches for 18 more yards. That's after he rushed for 178 yards last week in Southern Miss' opening-game loss to Liberty.

Wilcke completed 16 of 27 passes for 207 yards for the Golden Eagles. Brownlee had five of those catches for 102 yards. Malik Shorts recorded is second interception in as many weeks when he picked off Van Dyke in the second quarter.

Game 3: at Southern Miss 64, Northwestern State 10 (Sept. 17, 2022)

HATTIESBURG, Miss. – Southern Miss scored its most points since 2017 and garnered 587 offensive yards to post a 64-10 non-conference football victory over Northwestern State at The Rock.

The Golden Eagles (1-2) snapped a two-game losing streak as four quarterbacks combined to throw for 400 yards, including a career-high 192 yards and a career-best three touchdowns from Ty Keyes off the bench.

The point total was the most for the program since defeating Charlotte, 66-21, here, Nov. 18, 2017.

Southern Miss scored the first 50 point of the contest, include taking a 41-0 halftime advantage, as Jakarius Caston collected two touchdown catches of 40 and 7 yards in the first half. Caston finished with games highs of six catches and 94 yards.

The Golden Eagles started the scoring on field goals of 34 and 26 yards on their first two drives by Briggs Bourgeois and Caston added the 40-yard TD score on the third drive, giving Southern Miss a 13-0 advantage after a quarter.

Southern Miss pulled away in the second quarter after Swayze Bozeman returned a fumble 12 yards off a sack and forced fumble by Dominic Quewon and Gore, who rushed for a game-high 82 yards, tallied a 26-yard scoring run with 9:20 left in the second quarter, before Caston added his second TD some six minutes later.

Jalen May finished the scoring for the home team's first-half scoring with 1:24 left before the break on an 89-yard strike across the middle from Keyes, which turned into the fourth longest TD throw in school history.

In the second half, the Golden Eagles added a safety, a seven-yard run from Keyes, a 58-yard pass from Keyes to Zay Franks and a Kenyon Clay six-yard run late in the fourth quarter to finish the scoring.

NSU (0-3) scored all 10 of their points in the third quarter on a 15-yard pass from Zachary Clement to Ke'Nard King and an Eddie Godina 43-yard field goal.

Along with its 400 yards passing, the Golden Eagles added 187 rushing yards in the contest.

The defense limited the Demons to just 234 yards, including 16 on the ground.
