## First and 10:

- Missouri S&T continues its early season road stretch as it steps outside of NCAA Division II for a week to take on Drake in Des Moines, Iowa. The Miners have won both of their contests thus far in 2018, including a 27-16 win at Northwood last week, while Drake lost in its only completed game of the year, losing 48-16 at Montana over the weekend.
- The Miners are seeking their first 3-0 start to a season since 2012, a year that they opened with four straight victories, and are looking for just their 10th 3-0 start in the 125-year history of the program. Before the 3-0 start in 2012, S&T's last such start occurred in 2005 and prior to that, in 1984.
- Miner quarterback Tyler Swart, the school record holder in passing yards and total offense for a career, is on the cusp of another standard as he needs just two touchdown passes to tie Evan Gray's career record of 59 scoring throws. In the season opener, Swart became the first player in GLVC history last week to throw four touchdown passes in a game in four different seasons.
- Deshawn Jones is also moving up on the Miner career rushing list, as he currently has 2,052 yards and is 11 behind Randy Shed for third place. Jones' school record string of 10 straight 100-yard games came to an end last week, but he still ranks sixth in the GLVC in rushing after two games.
- Braxton Graham is currently tied with Quincy's Eric Poindexter for the GLVC record with 13 career games with at least 100 yards in receptions. Graham had his 13th 100-yard performance in the win over Eastern New Mexico and is also fifth in three other GLVC career categories.
- S&T's defense, which ranks sixth in NCAA Division II as it has allowed just 199.5 yards over its first two contests, held Northwood to 130 total yards in last week's win. The 130 yards allowed was the fewest given up by the Miners since South Dakota School of Mines had just 117 in the final game of the 2012 season.
- S&T linebacker Landon Compton entered the 2018 season as the leading active tackler in the GLVC, as he has recorded 271 stops in his first three-plus seasons in a Miner uniform. Compton currently ranks sixth on the GLVC's all-time tackle list.
- With 37 sacks last season, Missouri S&T's defense has now recorded at least 30 sacks in a year in seven consecutive seasons. The Miners have notched 267 sacks during the course of those seven years and their 229 since 2012 are the most among the five original GLVC football schools.
- The Miners have rolled up 810 yards of total offense in their first two games of the season, which is the second-most under head coach Tyler Fenwick behind last year's 820.
- MATCHUP TO WATCH: Drake passing game vs. S&T defense:** For the first two weeks of the season, S&T's defense has gone up against run-based offenses, but this week faces a Drake team that averaged nearly 260 yards per game through the air last year and threw for 287 in its opener.

## S&T Head Coach Tyler Fenwick:

Tyler Fenwick is in his sixth season at the helm of Missouri S&T's football program. Fenwick, the 19th head coach in the history of the S&T program, was the first to lead the Miners to a winning season in his first year as head coach since 1914.

Fenwick came to S&T after a successful six-season stint as offensive coordinator at Missouri Western; the Griffons played in the post-season in each of those six years, including an appearance in the NCAA Division II quarterfinals in 2012. MWSU was 53-18 during the six years Fenwick served on its staff. He is a native of Los Angeles, Calif. and also coached at Occidental College in California for four years and MSU Moorhead in Minnesota for a year before joining the staff at Missouri Western. He played collegiately as a wide receiver at Los Angeles Valley College and at the University of New Mexico.

## Scoring streaks:

Missouri S&T broke two scoring streak records during the course of the 2017 season. The Miners have scored in each of their last 76 games since Sept. 17, 2011, the longest such streak in school history. The Miners have also scored 17 or more points in 12 consecutive contests, the longest run since the 2005 and 2006 seasons when S&T did it in 20 straight.

In addition, the Miners have also scored in each of their last 50 road games which is the longest run on the all-time list for consecutive road games with points. The Miners last went scoreless in a road game on Sept. 26, 2009 at Wisconsin-LaCrosse.

## On top of the GLVC:

In the 2017 season, Missouri S&T led the GLVC in both total offense and total defense, as it averaged a school-record 459.7 yards per game of the offensive side and gave up just 294.3 on defense. It was only the second time in the six-year history of GLVC football that a team led the conference in both categories in a season, the other being Indianapolis in 2014.

The 294.3 yards allowed by the S&T defense last season also marked the fifth time in GLVC history that a team gave up fewer than 300 yards per game in a season. The Miners also hit that milestone in 2012, while UIndy gave up less than 300 in 2012, 2013 and 2014.

## Standing out on offense:

Last fall, Missouri S&T was one of only two teams in NCAA Division II to have a player that ranked among the top 20 in the nation in rushing yards and another player among the top 20 in passing yards. Deshawn Jones, with his 1,579 rushing yards, finished fourth in Division II in rushing and Tyler Swart, who threw for 3,165 yards, was 12th in the nation. Six of the 11 players who finished ahead of Swart in passing played in at least 12 games; as Swart was among the top 10 prior to the NCAA Division II playoffs.

The other team with players in the top 20 in those categories was Bowie State.

## Playing behind the line:

Last season, Missouri S&T recorded the eighth-most sacks on average in NCAA Division II, taking down the quarterback on a GLVC-high 37 occasions or 3.4 times per contest.

Defensive end Tereshawn Wharton led the GLVC and ranked third nationally with 13.5 sacks and also had a school record 21 tackles for a loss that put him seventh among all players in NCAA Division II. Of his 21 stops behind the line of scrimmage, 16 of them were of the solo variety.

## Return to glory:

Missouri S&T enters the 2018 campaign seeking to continue its longest run of consecutive seasons with at least one return for a touchdown, as it has at least one in each of the last 13 years. S&T had three returns last year for scores, two by Roderick Chapman on a kickoff return and interception runback, while Leshawn Lampkins also scored following a picked off pass in the season finale.

During this 13-year run, the Miners have had 43 returns that have resulted in touchdowns -- including 11 kickoff runbacks, 10 punts, 16 interception runbacks and six fumbles brought back for scores, as well as a defensive extra point during that span.

## Milestone Watches:

### Quarterback Tyler Swart:

Missouri S&T quarterback Tyler Swart enters this week's game ranked among the career leaders in several passing categories at S&T and in GLVC history. Coming into this week's play, Swart -- who has recorded the third-highest passing yardage total in a season last fall -- is the record holder for career passing yards and total offense at S&T and is second on the career lists for touchdown passes and pass completions. Swart is also closing in on two GLVC passing records that he could reach later this fall. In the opener against Eastern New Mexico, he became the first player in GLVC history with a four-touchdown game in four different seasons.

### Wide Receiver Braxton Graham:

Missouri S&T wide receiver Braxton Graham is also among the school and GLVC all-time leaders in all-purpose yards and into the top 10 on the receiving lists. At the end of last season, Graham had moved up to second place on the career all-purpose yardage list -- trailing only Ashton Gronewold -- and is also fourth in receiving yards as he became the Miner in history to reach 2,000 receiving yards in 2017. He also sits among the top 10 for career receptions and yardage in both school at GLVC history.

**Running Back Deshawn Jones:**

Deshawn Jones, the 2017 rushing champion in the GLVC, is the first Miner back in history with 10 straight 100-yard rushing games, including an S&T and GLVC record 275 in the win over Saint Francis. His 1,579 yards last season -- the second-most in a full season in GLVC history -- had him ranked fourth in NCAA Division II at the conclusion of the 2017 campaign. He became the fourth Miner player to reach the 1,000-yard mark for a season last year and moved over the 2,000-yard mark for his career in the season opener.

**Defensive End Tereshawn Wharton:**

Tereshawn Wharton, who led the GLVC in quarterback sacks and tackles for a loss in 2017, is among the top 10 in Miner history for sacks with 21 in his two-plus years in the program. Wharton also had an S&T single-season record of 21 tackles behind the line of scrimmage last year and has 33 for his career,

### Quick Hits on Drake:

- In what was their "season opener", the Bulldogs suffered a 48-16 loss at Montana to a team currently ranked 14th in the NCAA Division I FCS ranks. Drake trailed by just a 10-3 margin at halftime, but was outscored 38-13 in the second half as the Grizzlies finished with 401 yards of total offense. The Bulldogs' original season opener on Sept. 1 against William Jewell was cancelled on account of weather in the first quarter with Drake holding a 7-0 lead.
- Quarterback Grant Kraemer completed 23-of-42 passes in Saturday's contest for 281 yards and a touchdown, but he also threw two interceptions and was sacked seven times. Nine of the 23 completions went to Devin Cates, while Steven Doran had four receptions for 64 yards.
- The Bulldogs finished with 78 yards on the ground in the Montana game, getting 49 yards on one carry by Will Warner and 35 more from Cross Robinson. Drake gained 143 yards on the ground, but suffered 65 yards in losses with its running game.
- Warner, a strong safety whose run on a fake punt resulted in a touchdown, led the Bulldogs along with fellow safety Sean Lynch with seven tackles Saturday. The Bulldogs had one sack in the game, which was recorded by defensive end Jacob Hardy.

### Series history with Drake:

Drake has won all six previous meetings from the Miners, including five matchups played since 2002. The Bulldogs beat S&T in Rolla 28-25 in that 2002 meeting, then Drake took a 28-7 decision in Des Moines the following year. The two teams also met in 2009 (Drake won 19-0 in Des Moines), 2010 (a 28-14 Bulldog win in Rolla) and most recently in 2011 in Des Moines, where the Bulldogs won by a count of 27-23.

The first meeting between the teams took place in the 1923 season.

### A victory over Drake would:

- Give the Miners their first 3-0 start to a season since 2012 and 10th in school history.
- Give the Miners their first win over Drake in the series between the two institutions.
- Give the Miners their eighth win in their last nine road contests (S&T was 5-1 away from home last season).
- Give the Miners their fifth straight non-conference win and first over a team from the NCAA Division I ranks since a 2006 victory over Butler.
