NABC Announces Rosters For Reese's® Division II College All-Star Game

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (March 25, 2013) – The National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) today announced rosters for the 2013 Reese's® Division II College All-Star game, which will be played as part of the 2013 NCAA® Division II Men's Basketball Championship. Reese's® Peanut Butter Cups are the official candy partner of the NCAA.

The Reese's Division II College All-Star game will be played on Friday, March 29, at 7:00 p.m. (EDT), in conjunction with the NCAA Division II Elite Eight® at Freedom Hall in Louisville, Ky. The teams are composed of two senior student-athletes from each of the eight regions in Division II nominated by coaches and four at-large selections.

The NCAA Division II quarterfinals are set for Thursday, March 28, with the semifinals on Saturday at Freedom Hall. This year's NCAA Division II championship game will be played at Philips Arena in Atlanta, Ga., at 4:00 p.m. on Sunday, April 7. The game is being played in Atlanta as the NCAA celebrates 75 years of March Madness®.

The Reese's All-Star game will feature a pair of outstanding former coaches in Division II. Former University of Central Oklahoma coach **Jim Seward** will lead the West team, while former Southern Connecticut State University coach **Art Leary** will coach the East team.

Reese's Division II All-Star Game Coaches

West Coach - Jim Seward, University of Central Oklahoma

Jim Seward has more than 30 years of successful collegiate coaching experience and close to 600 career victories. He enjoyed great success as the head coach at the University of Central Oklahoma from 1987-2002, guiding the Bronchos to six Lone Star Conference championships, including three straight from 1991-93, and his teams were ranked nationally among the top 20 for nine consecutive seasons. Seward is the all-time leader in career wins at Central Oklahoma with a 261-154 record and coached the national player of the year in 1993 and 1998. A former member of the NABC board of directors and former NABC congress member, Seward has also served as a consultant to the Australian Gold Coast Rollers.

East Coach – Art Leary, Southern Connecticut State University

In 28 seasons as the head coach at Southern Connecticut State University, Art Leary, led the Owls to the most significant moments in the program's history. His 1999-2000 team was ranked as high as fourth nationally in NCAA Division II with a 25-4 record. The Owls reached the Elite Eight in Louisville in 1996-97 with a program record 28-4 record, losing to eventual champion Cal State Bakersfield. Eight of Southern Connecticut's top 10 career scorers played for Leary, a three-time coach of the year in the New England Collegiate Conference. He served as chairman of the NABC Division II All-America Committee and is a long-time member of the NABC Research Committee.
