FRESH ICE

No. 12/13 St. Cloud State Women's Hockey (2-0-0, 0-0-0 WCHA) returns to the ice this weekend with a road nonconference series at Mercyhurst (2-2-0, 0-0-0 CHA) on Friday and Saturday at the Mercyhurst Ice Center in Erie, Pennsylvania. Puck drop is scheduled for 5:00 p.m. CT on Friday with a 1:00 p.m. start on Saturday.

LET'S GO POLLING

The Huskies enter week three ranked No. 12 in the country by the USCHO and landed No. 13 in the USA Hockey/The Rink Live poll. St. Cloud State is one of five WCHA programs featured in week three's rankings with one additional club receiving votes. The Huskies entered both the USCHO and USA Today National Polls in the first week of December last season, placing the team in the national rankings for the first time since 2009 and 2008 respectively. After debuting at No. 14 in both polls, SCSU proceeded to remain ranked in 10 of the next 11 weeks to close the year, closing the season ranked for the first time in program history at No. 12 by the USCHO and No. 13 by USA Today. Prior to 2022-23, SCSU had only appeared in the USA Today rankings five times while appearing in just six USCHO polls - last season, the Huskies were ranked 12 and 11 times respectively.

THIS WEEK IN THE WCHA

Week three features a busy stretch of competition across the WCHA as seven teams continue nonconference action. The No. 12/13 Huskies travel to Mercyhurst, No. 1 Wisconsin hosts (RV) Boston College, St. Thomas hosts Lindenwood, No. 4 Minnesota visits RIT, Bemidji State welcomes RPI, No. 6/7 Minnesota Duluth meets Long Island in Duluth and (RV) Minnesota State travels to Sacred Heart.

BLIZZARD'S BULLETS

LAST TIME OUT

Senior goaltender Sanni Ahola recorded her first shutout of the season as then-No. 13 St. Cloud State (2-0-0, 0-0-0 WCHA) swept Union (0-2-0, 0-0-0 ECAC) with a 4-0 win at the Herb Brooks National Hockey Center on September 24. The Huskies outshot Union 38 to 19, held the advantage on draws and won the special teams battle with four successful kills and a power play goal. Nine Huskies recorded a point in the win as junior defender Ella Anick and sophomore forward Avery Farrell provided multi-point efforts. Anick scored her first goal as a Husky and added one helper, skating to a plus-two with three shots on goal. Farrell tallied two assists while putting one shot on. Ahola was a steady presence in the crease, turning away each of the 19 shots she faced. The senior shut down a handful of odd-man rushes and added a pair of impressive covers in traffic, lunging into lanes and earning her defense a whistle. She played a key role in the 4-for-4 Huskies penalty kill, stopping all five Union shots on the advantage.

SCOUTING MERCYHURST

Mercyhurst is 2-2-0 to open the 2023-24 campaign, outscoring Post 7-0 in an opening-weekend sweep before being swept at the hands of (RV) St. Lawrence last weekend. Sophomore forward and Swedish National Team member Thea Johansson (4-3-7, +4) leads the club in goals and points while senior captain Sara Boucher (1-4-5, -1) leads in assists. Junior defender Sydney Pedersen (0-2-2, +1) has piled up 10 blocks as a leader on the blueline in front of graduate goaltender Ena Nyström (2-2-0, 2.69 GAA, .902 SV%). Nyström was named First Team All-CHA last season after going 15-11-2 with a 2.20 goals against average and a .924 save percentage.

SERIES HISTORY

The Huskies have played Mercyhurst 12 times since the all-time series began in 2001, owning a 1-9-2 record against the Lakers. St. Cloud State's lone win over Mercyhurst came in 2003 as a three point night from legendary defender Kobi Kawamoto and a 25-save effort by Ellen Brinkman led the Huskies to a 3-1 win on November 28, 2003 at the Herb Brooks National Hockey Center.

FAMILIAR FACES

Huskies fans will recognize two familiar names as SCSU meets Mercyhurst this weekend in Lakers graduate forward Olivia Cvar and assistant coach Emily Ach. Cvar skated four seasons with St. Cloud State before grad transferring to Mercyhurst for her final campaign while Ach spent two seasons as the Huskies' Hockey Operations and Video Coordinator graduate assistant.

CLEAN SWEEP

The Huskies swept the Western Collegiate Hockey Association Player of the Week Awards for the first time in program history on opening weekend as senior forward Emma Gentry, junior defender Ella Anick, senior goaltender Sanni Ahola and freshman forward Sofianna Sundelin were named WCHA Forward, Defender, Goaltender and Rookie of the Week respectively by the league office on September 25. This marked the first time in program history that St. Cloud State has swept the weekly awards and the eighth time that multiple Huskies were honored in the same week.

GENTS GOES BEAST MODE

Senior forward Emma Gentry led the WCHA with two goals and 15 shots on goal over Opening Weekend, dominating Union with her physical play in the offensive zone. Gentry skated to a plus-three and added an assist for three points on the weekend, scoring all three in the season opener. Following her terrific Opening Night performance, Gentry fired nine shots on goal during Saturday's contest as part of a 4-0 Huskies win. The honor is Gentry's first career Forward of the Week nod and her third weekly honor after twice being named Freshman of the Week in 2020-21.

ALL ABOUT ANICK

Junior defender Ella Anick enjoyed a terrific opening weekend, leading the WCHA with five points, four assists and a plus-five rating on the ice as the offensive-minded defender flourished in the Huskies' system. Anick scored a goal to go with her four helpers and shot 25.00% with four shots on goal and a pair of blocks. She was the lone conference player to post two multi-point games, tallying three assists on Saturday before a two-point afternoon in the finale. The honor is Anick's first of her career.

SANNNI TIME

Senior goaltender Sanni Ahola recorded her fourth career shutout as the Huskies blanked Union 4-0 on September 24 to earn the series sweep. Ahola was a steady presence in the crease, turning away each of the 19 shots she faced. The senior shut down a handful of odd-man rushes and added a pair of impressive covers in traffic, lunging into lanes and earning her defense a whistle. She played a key role in the 4-for-4 Huskies penalty kill, stopping all five Union shots on the advantage. The honor is Ahola's second Goaltender of the Week award and third career weekly honor including her Rookie of the Week honor in 2020-21.

BLIZZARD'S BULLETS**STUPENDOUS SUNDELIN**

Sofianna Sundelin led all WCHA rookies with two points, providing two assists with a point in both games of the series. Sundelin put three shots on goal and skated to a plus-one with two blocked shots while skating on both special teams units. The honor is the first of her collegiate career as Sundelin became the first Husky to earn a weekly honor in her debut weekend since Ahola did so on December 1, 2020.

OH CAPTAINS, OUR CAPTAINS

St. Cloud State has named six captains entering the 2023-24 season. Fifth-year forward Taylor Lind will wear the "C" for a second campaign as the Huskies' captain while fifth-year forward Klára Hymárová, senior forward Emma Gentry, junior defender Dayle Ross, fifth-year forward Addi Scribner and junior defender Grace Wolfe will wear the "A" as assistant captains. Lind becomes the program's fourth two-year captain, joining Kenzie Wylie (2020-22), Kobi Kawamoto (2001-03) and Tara McNamara (2000-02) as one of just three Huskies to wear the "C" for two seasons. Hymárová skates with the "A" for a second season while Gentry, Ross, Wolfe and Scribner each wear a letter for the first time in their careers. The Huskies' six captains in 2023-24 are the most in program history, surpassing their previous high of four acting captains carried in 2001-02, 2006-07, 2007-08, 2009-10, 2010-11, 2013-14, 2014-15, 2020-21, 2021-22 and 2022-23.

WCHA PRESEASON POLL

The Huskies were picked to finish fifth in the 2023-24 WCHA Preseason Coaches Poll as announced by the league office ahead of the season. Senior goaltender Jojo Chobak received votes to the Preseason All-WCHA team while the Huskies landed just six points behind Minnesota Duluth and eight behind Minnesota for fourth and third respectively. The Huskies' fifth-place projected finish is the program's highest since it was picked to finish fourth ahead of the 2009-10 season.

CAPTAIN LIND

Second-year captain Taylor Lind enters her fifth season with the program owning 67 points in 112 collegiate games on 23 goals and 44 assists, fresh off a terrific senior year in which she ranked second in assists and third in points despite missing 11 games midway through the season. Lind served as the Huskies' captain in 2022-23, providing eight goals and 14 assists for a 22-point season. Originally from Shaunavon, Saskatchewan, Lind has recorded back-to-back 20-plus point seasons for St. Cloud State. She is just the fourth Husky to wear the "C" in consecutive seasons, Kenzie Wylie (2020-22), Kobi Kawamoto (2001-03) and Tara McNamara (2000-02).

IN IDALSKI WE TRUST

In his first season as head coach of Huskies Women's Hockey, Brian Idalski was named the USCHO National Coach of the Year and Co-WCHA Coach of the Year following his program's historic turnaround and rise to national prominence. Under Idalski's guidance the Huskies tied a program record with 18 wins, going 18-18-1 with an 11-16-1 mark in WCHA play – establishing a new program record with 36 conference points to finish fifth, standing as the Huskies' best conference finish since 2015-16 and marking just the second time the program has earned a top-five conference finish in the last 13 years. The club's 18 wins were the most since SCSU won 18 games in 2007-08 while their 11 conference wins stand as the third-most in program history, one shy of their total from the past three seasons combined and most since 2009-10. St. Cloud State doubled their win total from a season ago and added a 42.9% points percentage, their best mark since 2009-10 – establishing a program record for the three-point era.

HIGH COMPETE HOCKEY

Huskies Hockey established a new culture of high-compete 200-foot hockey last season, beginning in the defensive zone. SCSU led the NCAA and set a new program record with 576 blocked shots while holding opponents to 2.59 goals – their second-best mark ever – and 32.24 shots per game – their best mark since 2015-16. St. Cloud State's goaltenders anchored the rejuvenated defense, recording the program's third-best team save percentage at .920 and second-best goals against average of 2.58. The Huskies posted a program-record six shutouts in 2022-23, punctuating their stingy defensive work.

GOAL GETTERS

In the offensive zone, St. Cloud State scored 87 goals last season – eclipsing 66 for the first time since 2009-10 and standing as the program's most since that same season. The Huskies netted 64 even-strength goals, good for second-most all-time, on a 10.43% shooting percentage that becomes the program's third best mark and highest since 2000-01. For the first time since 2009-10, four Huskies recorded 20-point seasons while two defenders provided double-digit scoring seasons for the first time since 2017-18.

CAREER CAMPAIGNS

Nine Huskies set or matched career-high point totals in 2022-23 while Dayle Ross set a program record with 104 blocks, Jenniina Nylund tied the program's record with five game-winning goals and Jojo Chobak broke the single-season mark with five shutouts. Klára Hymlárová scored 17 goals – eighth-most in Huskies history – and closed the regular season as the NCAA's power play goal leader with eight. Sophomore defenders Dayle Ross and Grace Wolfe took massive steps forward under Idalski's guidance, providing 15 and 18 points respectively while ranking No. 1 and No. 3 all-time in single-season blocks with 104 and 83 respectively. The SCSU goaltending duo of Sanni Ahola and Jojo Chobak thrived in a tandem, each recording save percentages of .923 with GAA marks of 2.50 and 2.46 to help anchor the turnaround.

GENTS AND JOJO TAKE ON LAKE PLACID

Senior goaltender Jojo Chobak and senior forward Emma Gentry helped lead the U.S. Collegiate Select Team to a three-game sweep of Canada in the 2023 Collegiate Select Series this past August at the Herb Brooks Arena in Lake Placid, New York. The duo became the fourth and fifth active Huskies to be named to the Collegiate Select Team – formerly known as the U22 Team – and first since goaltender Emma Polusny made the team in 2019. Defender Brittni Kuyper made back-to-back U22 squads in 2006 and 2007 while forward Holly Roberts joined her at the 2007 U22 Series.

SHUTDOWN STOPPERS

St. Cloud State can make a real case for owning the best goaltending room in the nation with senior backstops Sanni Ahola and Jojo Chobak returning as a tandem in 2023-24. Ahola continued her rise as one of the top goaltenders in the NCAA, making 20 starts in goal and going 9-11-0. She recorded a .923 save percentage and a 2.50 goals against average while posting one shutout. The Helsinki, Finland product ranked No. 19 in the NCAA in save percentage while landing sixth across the WCHA in goals against average. Chobak delivered a phenomenal first season with St. Cloud State in 2022-23, going 9-7-1 across 17 starts and posting a .923 save percentage alongside a 2.46 goals against average. The junior broke the Huskies' single-season shutout record with five clean sheets throughout the season while recording the fifth-lowest GAA in program history. Among her WCHA counterparts, Chobak ranked fourth in save percentage (tied with Ahola) and fifth in goals against average while landing No. 19 and No. 25 respectively nationally.

NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

St. Cloud State will have their hands full implementing an overhauled roster this winter as nine freshmen join six transfers to form a 15-player signing class. Freshmen forwards Grace Delmonico, Greta Henderson, Marie Moran, Alice Sauriol and Sofianna Sundelin; defenders Jaidyn Britt, Sydney Bryant and Kenzee Hope; and goaltender Paige Hoogendam will begin their collegiate careers at St. Cloud State this fall. The Huskies enjoyed terrific success in the transfer portal, bringing on graduate transfer forwards Katie Kaufman (Merrimack), CC Bowlby (Dartmouth) and Maddy Peterson (RPI) along with talented junior defenders Taylor Larson (Bemidji State) and Ella Anick (Bemidji State) and sophomore forward Avery Farrell (Franklin Pierce).

THE CONFERENCE OF CHAMPIONS CELEBRATES 25 YEARS

The Western Collegiate Hockey Association begins its 25th season of play in 2023-24, celebrating a quarter century of unmatched success and immense growth provided to the sport. Truly the "Conference of Champions," the WCHA has long held an undisputable reputation as the best conference in collegiate women's hockey - winning 20 NCAA Championships in its 24 years of competition including the first 13 in its existence. St. Cloud State was among the founding members of the league and has remained in the WCHA since its inception in 1999-00.

Head coach Brian Idalski enters his second season at the helm of St. Cloud State Women's Hockey in 2023-24. The reigning USCHO National Coach of the Year and WCHA Coach of the Year owns a career collegiate coaching record of 295-193-51 (.595) across 16 seasons as a head coach including a 18-18-1 (.500) mark during his first season leading the Huskies. A legendary figure in the history of women's collegiate hockey, Idalski has earned three conference Coach of the Year honors while guiding his teams to five NCAA Tournament appearances, an NCAA Tournament Final berth, four conference tournament championships, seven conference tournament finals and three regular-season conference championships.

Idalski has recruited and coached 10 Olympians, 35 National Team members from nine different countries, nine All-Americans, a Patty Kazmaier Finalist, four Patty Kazmaier Top 10 Finalists, two NCAA Great Eight Award winners, five WCHA Outstanding Student-Athletes of the Year, one Conference Player of the Year, one Conference Rookie of the Year and 42 All-Conference selections.

In addition to setting a standard for excellence on the ice, Idalski's programs have enjoyed incredible success in the classroom. Under his supervision 12 student-athletes have been named Academic All-Americans, 73 have earned WCHA Scholar Athlete recognition and a whopping 140 have been named to the WCHA All-Academic team.

Across his 16 seasons as a head coach, Idalski owns a conference record of 193-149-39 with a career points percentage of 55.9%. He earned three NCHA Regular Season Championships with UW-Stevens Point and has orchestrated top-half conference finishes in seven of his 11 seasons in the rugged WCHA.

Idalski-led programs have experienced incredible success in the postseason, going 25-18 at the conference tournament and 4-5 in NCAA Tournament play for a combined 29-23 (.558) playoff record. Leading UW-Stevens Point to the 2004 NCAA DIII Tournament Final in his first trip to the "Big Dance," Idalski has guided his teams to five NCAA Tournament appearances including a Third Place finish in 2006. He captured four NCHA Tournament Championships in five seasons prior to joining North Dakota, then won seven WCHA Quarterfinal series and made two WCHA Championship appearances during his 10 years in Grand Forks.

In his first season as head coach of Huskies Women's Hockey, Idalski was named the USCHO National Coach of the Year and Co-WCHA Coach of the Year following his program's historic turnaround and rise to national prominence.

Under Idalski's guidance the Huskies tied a program record with 18 wins, going 18-18-1 with an 11-16-1 mark in WCHA play – establishing a new program record with 36 conference points to finish fifth, standing as the Huskies' best conference finish since 2015-16 and marking just the second time the program has earned a top-five conference finish in the last 13 years. The club's 18 wins were the most since SCSU won 18 games in 2007-08 while their 11 conference wins stand as the third-most in program history, one shy of their total from the past three seasons combined and most since 2009-10. St. Cloud State doubled their win total from a season ago and added a 42.9% points percentage,

their best mark since 2009-10 – establishing a program record for the three-point era.



Idalski led St. Cloud State back into national prominence as the Huskies entered both the USCHO and USA Today National Polls in the first week of December, placing the team in the National rankings for the first time since 2009 and 2008 respectively. After debuting at No. 14 in both polls, SCSU proceeded to remain ranked in 10 of the next 11 weeks to close the year, closing the season





record with 576 blocked shots while holding opponents to 2.59 goals – their second-best mark ever – and 32.24 shots per game – their best mark since 2015-16. St. Cloud State's goaltenders anchored the rejuvenated defense, recording the program's third-best team save percentage at .920 and second-best goals against average of 2.58. The Huskies posted a program-record six shutouts in 2022-23, punctuating their stingy defensive work.

In the offensive zone, St. Cloud State scored 87 goals – eclipsing 66 for the first time since 2009-10 and standing as the program's most since that same season. The Huskies netted 64 even-strength goals, good for second-most all-time, on a 10.43% shooting percentage that becomes the program's third best mark and highest since 2000-01. For the first time since 2009-10, four Huskies recorded 20-point seasons while two defenders provided double-digit scoring seasons for the first time since 2017-18.

Special teams took a major step forward under Idalski as the Huskies power play delivered a 20.41% campaign while the penalty kill improved from a 77.27% mark a season ago to 85.50% in 2022-23. Both marks stand fourth-best in program history while the club's 20 power play goals were the most since 2009-10.

Nine Huskies set or matched career-high point totals in 2022-23 while Dayle Ross set a program record with 104 blocks, Jenniina Nylund tied the program's record with five game-winning goals and Jojo Chobak broke the single-season mark with five shutouts. Klára Hymářová scored 17 goals – eighth-most in Huskies history – and closed the regular season as the NCAA's power play goal leader with eight. Sophomore defenders Dayle Ross and Grace Wolfe took massive steps forward under Idalski's guidance, providing 15 and 18 points respectively while ranking No. 1 and No. 3 all-time in single-season blocks with 104 and 83 respectively. The SCSU goaltending duo of Sanni Ahola and Jojo Chobak thrived in a tandem, each recording save percentages of .923 with GAA marks of 2.50 and 2.46 to help anchor the turnaround.

Brian Idalski was named the sixth head coach in the history of St. Cloud State Women's Hockey on May 19, 2022.

Idalski was chosen to serve as the Head Women's Hockey Coach for China's National Team at the 2022 Beijing Winter Olympics. His team earned two wins in pool play and operated as the top penalty kill in the Olympics at 90.0% with nine kills on 10 chances. Under his guidance, goaltender Jiaying Zhou posted the tournament's best save percentage at .955 with 85 stops on 89 shots.

Prior to joining St. Cloud State, Idalski spent three seasons as the head coach of the Shenzhen KRS Vanke Rays in the Zhenskaya Hockey League. He guided the Rays to a 77-17 record, two regular season championships and the 2020 ZhHL Cup – becoming the first non-Russian team to win the league's championship. Idalski was named ZhHL Coach of the Year in 2020 and 2022 along with being selected to coach in the 2019-20 ZhHL All-Star Game.

Idalski spent the 2018-19 season as the Director of Hockey Activities at Culver Academy in Culver, Indiana, leading the program to its first USAH Tier-I Nationals appearance.

No stranger to the WCHA, Idalski spent 10 seasons as the head coach of North Dakota Women's Hockey – building the program into a perennial national power with a rich tradition of success. Idalski produced a 169-154-39 (.521) record in Grand Forks with a 124-124-32 mark in conference play, reaching 50 points four times in addition two NCAA Tournament appearances, two WCHA Tournament Finals and seven WCHA Quarterfinal Series wins. North Dakota finished .500 or better in each of their final seven seasons, going 144-89-25 (.607) overall with a 104-69-23 (59.0% points percentage) across that span.

Idalski recruited and coached six All-Americans, five WCHA Outstanding Student-Athletes of the Year, one WCHA Rookie of the Year and 25 All-WCHA selections during his tenure at North Dakota. Jocelyne and Monique Lamoureux, Michelle Karvinen and Shelby Amsley-Benzie earned All-American honors under Idalski's

ranked for the first time in program history at No. 12 by the USCHO and No. 13 by USA Today. Prior to 2022-23, SCSU had only appeared in the USA Today rankings five times while appearing in just six USCHO polls – last season, the Huskies were ranked 12 and 11 times respectively.

For the first time in 13 years, the Huskies defeated or earned a point from all seven conference opponents – taking down then-No. 1 Minnesota, shutting out then-No. 8 and eventual NCAA Champion Wisconsin in front of a packed Kohl Center and taking both then-No. 1 Ohio State and then-No. 7 Minnesota Duluth to overtime. In defeating 2022-23 National Champion Wisconsin during the regular season, the Huskies recorded a win over the eventual NCAA champion for the first time since 2009-10 (Minnesota Duluth) and marked just the fifth occurrence (2005-06, Wisconsin; 2001-02, Minnesota Duluth & 2000-01, Minnesota Duluth) in the program's history.

Huskies Hockey established a new culture of high-compete 200-foot hockey under Idalski, beginning in the defensive zone. SCSU led the NCAA and set a new program



direction while Karvinen was named WCHA Rookie of the Year in 2011-12. Amsley-Benzie developed into one of the greatest goaltenders in collegiate hockey during her four years with Idalski, earning All-American honors in addition to being named a Patty Kazmaier Top 10 Finalist. Idalski and his staff's successful recruitment of the Lamoureux sisters was instrumental in the program's rapid turnaround as Jocelyne and Monique both earned two All-American nods while the former led the WCHA in scoring as a junior.

North Dakota enjoyed five 20-win seasons under Idalski, finishing below .500 just three times in his tenure with seven winning campaigns. His club earned a reputation for accountability on and off the ice, opportunistic offense and a rugged defense – recording 51 shutouts in his tenure while allowing less than 25 shots on goal per game in four of their final five seasons. All-WCHA forwards Michelle Karvinen, Josefine Jakobsen, Amy Menke and Becca Kohler flourished alongside the All-Americans Jocelyne and Monique Lamoureux. On the defensive end, Idalski helped develop Halli Krzyzaniak into a three-time All-WCHA selection and two-year captain before she became the program's first-ever NWHL draft pick – taken in the fifth round of the 2016 Draft, one spot ahead of Menke.

In addition to his time on the bench in Grand Forks, Idalski served as the Vice President of the American Women's Hockey Coaches Association and as the Governor of the American Hockey Coaches Association.

Idalski spent the 2006-07 season as an assistant coach on the St. Cloud State bench under first-year head coach Jeff Giesen – a season in which the Huskies went 12-18-7, one of only 11 campaigns with double-digit wins in the program's 25-year history. He led the defenders, coordinated advance scouting and oversaw the Huskies' recruiting efforts. His recruiting class was headlined by legendary SCSU goaltender Ashley Nixon, who graduated second all-time in saves, fourth in save percentage and fifth in goals against.



Earning his first head coaching role in 2001-02 with UW-Stevens Point Women's Hockey, Idalski quickly established himself as a rising star by going 108-21-11 (.881) in five seasons leading the Pointers. He was named NCHA Coach of the Year in 2002 and 2005 while being named a Finalist for the AHCA National Coach of the Year award four times, guiding UW-Stevens Point to four NCHA Tournament Championships and three NCHA Regular Season Championships. The Pointers made three NCAA Tournament appearances under Idalski, appearing in the 2004 NCAA DIII National Championship game and taking Third at the 2006 NCAA DIII Tournament. Idalski oversaw four 20-win seasons at Stevens Point and went 58-9-6 for a 83.6% points percentage in conference play, guiding his club to the NCHA's first-ever undefeated regular season in 2004-05. Three Pointers earned All-American honors under Idalski and 17 added All-NCHA accolades.

First joining the collegiate coaching ranks as an assistant with UW-Stevens Point Men's Hockey in 2000-01, Idalski broke into the coaching world in 1999-00 as an assistant on the Columbus Cottonmouths' bench in the Central Hockey League.

Idalski enjoyed a long playing career as a defenseman, spending two seasons with Columbus in the CHL and two with the Madison Monsters in the United Hockey League. The gritty blueliner helped Columbus earn the 1998 CHL Regular Season and Postseason Championships as a rookie. He played his collegiate hockey at UW-Stevens Point, appearing in 97 games and leading the Pointers to a pair of NCAA Tournament Finals including the program's 1993 NCAA DIII National Championship.

A native of Warren, Michigan, Brian and his wife Nicole have four sons – Beau, Jason, David and Mitchel.

all-time leader in goals, game-winning goals and power play goals. Across her four-year career the legendary forward produced 89 goals and 67 assists for 156 collegiate points, posting three 20-goal seasons and eclipsing 40 points twice with 50 in her junior season.

The owner of the Crazy Eights Hockey Camp since 2006, Siergiej has invested much of her career in the growth of the women's game at the youth level – directing Husky Pups at St. Cloud State while creating opportunities for girls across central Minnesota to get involved in hockey.

Jinelle and her husband Mike Siergiej have two sons – Colden and Rory.

Jinelle Siergiej enters her 10th season with St. Cloud State Women's Hockey in 2023-24, her fifth campaign as the program's associate head coach. Working primarily with the forwards, directing the power play and leading recruiting efforts, the 2010 Olympic Silver Medalist has guided eight Huskies to All-WCHA honors including five All-Rookie Team selections. 15 Huskies have delivered 20-point seasons under Siergiej's tutelage while 14 have posted double-digit goal campaigns.

Across her 11-year collegiate coaching career, Siergiej has recruited and coached five Olympians, 16 National Team members spanning eight countries, one Conference Goaltender of the Year, one Conference Rookie of the Year and 11 All-Conference selections. In addition to her work on the ice, Siergiej's academic supervision has helped 59 student-athletes earn WCHA Scholar Athlete recognition alongside 141 Academic All-Conference recipients.

Siergiej has recruited and coached four Olympic forwards in Jenniina Nylund (Finland, Beijing 2022), Klára Hymlárová (Czech Republic, Beijing 2022), Laura Zimmerman (Switzerland, Beijing 2022) and Sofianna Sundelin (Finland, Beijing 2022) during her Huskies tenure.

17 Huskies have signed professional contracts during Siergiej's tenure while Kayla Friesen (2020, Connecticut Whale) and Hannah Bates (2021, Connecticut Whale) were selected in the NWHL and PHF Drafts respectively.

Since joining the program as an assistant coach in 2014-15, Siergiej has been instrumental in the development of St. Cloud State's forwards. Molly Illikainen (17-15-32) gave the Huskies their first 30-point season since 2009-10 in Siergiej's second season with the program. Laura Kluge (7-17-24) and Klara Hymlarova (8-18-26) impressed as rookies in 2017-18 and 2019-20 respectively while Julia Tylke climbed to sixth all-time in goals at the conclusion of her SCSU career under Siergiej's watch.

Four of the program's top-eight single-season power play percentages have been recorded under Siergiej's direction including a pair of 20-plus percentage campaigns, 21.35% in 2015-16 and 20.41% in 2022-23. Klára Hymlárová closed the 2022-23 regular season as the NCAA's leader in power play goals while the Huskies reached 20 power play goals for the first time since the 2009-10 season.

Siergiej began her collegiate coaching career as an assistant coach at Robert Morris in 2013-14, helping RMU go 24-8-3 and finish second in the CHA with a 13-5-2 conference record. Freshman goaltender Jessica Dodds earned CHA Rookie of the Year honors while Rebecca Vint, Brittany Howard and Anneline Lauziere joined her on the All-College Hockey America team.

Entering the coaching ranks in 2010-11 as the head coach of Arrowhead High School in Hartland, Wisconsin, Siergiej spent three seasons with the program before moving to the collegiate level.

Siergiej represented the United States at the 2010 Winter Olympics in Vancouver and helped United States Women's Hockey earn Silver. She also won Silver at the IIHF World Championships with Team USA in 2007 and skated at the Four Nations tournament with Team USA in 2006, 2007, 2009 and 2010.

Her name synonymous with the success of Wisconsin Badgers Women's Hockey in the late 2000's, Jinelle (Zaugg) Siergiej played four years with the Badgers from 2004-05 to 2007-08. She gained All-WCHA honors in 2006, 2007 and 2008 and was selected to the WCHA All-Rookie team in 2005. At Wisconsin, Siergiej was part of two national title teams in 2006 and 2007 and left the campus as UW's

Billy Hengen enters his first season as an assistant coach with St. Cloud State Women's Hockey in 2023-24. Owning extensive experience in the coaching ranks with head coaching stints at Gentry Academy, the Minnesota Blades, Providence Academy and the Academy of Holy Angels, the 2006 St. Cloud State graduate provides a well-regarded offensive mind to the Huskies bench.

Hengen joins St. Cloud State after an incredible career shaping Gentry Academy into a power, helping his teams close the season as league champions in each of his final four seasons on the bench. His 2022-23 Gentry Girl's Hockey program won the 2023 MSHSL Class AA State Championship while going 27-2, earning the state title in just their third season as a program. Hengen led the 2020-21 Gentry Boy's Hockey program to the 2021 MSHSL Class A State Championship with an undefeated 19-0 mark just a year after guiding the Gentry 16U Boy's program to a No. 1 national ranking in 2019-20 by going 52-5-1. His 2018-19 Gentry 15U's went 64-2-3 and closed the season ranked No. 1.

Leading Team Minnesota at the prestigious Brick Invitational in Edmonton, California, Hengen added tremendous experience as the head coach of the AAA Minnesota Blades from 2012 to 2017. He first began his prep coaching career with five years at Holy Angels under head coach Greg Trebil following his collegiate playing career, climbing the ranks from assistant to associate head coach before earning the lead job in 2012-13. Hengen later served as the head coach at Providence Academy before joining Gentry.

No stranger to St. Cloud State Hockey, Billy Hengen graduated in 2006 following a four-year playing career under longtime Huskies head coaches Craig Dahl and Bob Motzko. The playmaking wing delivered back-to-back 20-plus point seasons as a sophomore and junior before piling up 32 points and skating to a plus-16 as a senior, closing his career with 79 points on 24 goals and 55 assists across 119 collegiate games. Hengen led the Huskies in assists and points per game over his final three seasons while earning WCHA All-Academic honors in 2005-06.

Hengen starred in the USHL with the Lincoln Stars for two seasons, winning back-to-back Anderson Cup Championships while going a combined 86-22 under offensive guru Steve Johnson. As a prep, Hengen graduated as the all-time leading goal scorer at the Academy of Holy Angels with 112 goals and 220 points while leading the program to its first Class AA State Tournament berth in 1999.

Milica McMillen enters her first season as an assistant coach with St. Cloud State Women's Hockey in 2023-24. An All-American and four time All-WCHA selection at Minnesota with professional playing experience in the NWHL and three years of coaching experience in the WCHA, McMillen oversees the Huskies defensive corps.

McMillen spent three seasons at Ohio State from 2017-18 to 2019-20, helping the Buckeyes to three 20-win campaigns with a combined 68-32-12 record. OSU finished top-three in the WCHA each season as she assisted with a variety of roles including game planning, recruiting, player development and budget oversight. McMillen recruited and coached five All-Americans, one WCHA Defensive Player of the Year, one WCHA Rookie of the Year, six All-WCHA honorees and two WCHA All-Rookie Team members over her three years with the program.

Following her terrific college career with the Golden Gophers, McMillen was selected No. 10 overall by the Connecticut Whale in the inaugural 2015 Premier Hockey Federation Draft. She spent the 2016-17 season with the New York Riveters, skating to a +3 across 18 games while providing three goals and six assists for nine points.

McMillen spent her collegiate career with Minnesota, serving as a fixture on the blue line from 2012-13 through 2015-16 while leading the Gophers to three NCAA Championships, four NCAA Finals and four WCHA Championships. She earned All-American honors as a sophomore and added four All-WCHA selections with 120 career points on 44 goals and 76 assists across 149 games played. The legendary defender skated to a +129 and scored 28 of her 44 goals on the power play. She landed third among NCAA defenders with 39 points in 2013-14 and followed with the fifth-most defender points in 2014-15.

A native of St. Paul, Minnesota, McMillen enjoyed a stellar prep career at Breck School with 278 points in six seasons of hockey. She was invited to the 2011 USA Hockey National Festival and skated for Team USA at the Twelve Nations Cup in Finland as a member of the U18's and added Gold at the Junior World Championships.

Hofmann comes to St. Cloud following a three-year stint as an Assistant Coach at Alaska Fairbanks where he helped the Nanooks win 22 games in 2022-23, its most victories in a single season since 2001-02. Hofmann played four seasons on the ice for Saint Mary's, where he recorded 97 points (36 goals / 61 assists) in 98 games. He earned All-MIAC honors in his senior season, where he had 14 goals and 19 assists for 33 points in 2003-04.

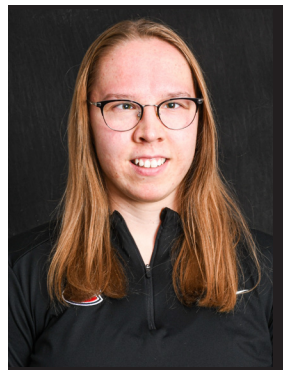
EQUIPMENT MANAGER COLIN JACOBSEN
