The Huskies will play Northern Michigan on Thursday, September 7, battle both Southern New Hampshire and Michigan Tech on Friday then close the tourney with Central Washington on Saturday. Thursday's tilt with NMU begins at 5:00 p.m. CT, Friday's matches are set for 9:30 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. with a noon start on Saturday against CWU.

BLIZZARD'S BULLETS

LAST TIME OUT

Then-No. 7 St. Cloud State Volleyball (4-0, 0-0 NSIC) received a vintage double-double performance from senior outside hitter Kenzie Foley as the Huskies downed Upper Iowa (2-2, 0-0 GLVC) in four sets at the Alaska Airlines Center in Anchorage, Alaska on Saturday afternoon, taking the match 25-20, 23-25, 25-20 and 25-18. Foley's 22 kill, 17 dig effort was backed by 13 kills and five blocks on .367 hitting from redshirt sophomore Sam Zimmerman and 11 kills courtesy of freshman outside hitter Abby Wachal. The Huskies close the Seawolf Invitational with a 4-0 record and a 12-1 mark in sets, earning three straight-set wins in addition to their four-setter over Upper Iowa. SCSU outhit the Peacocks .201 to .125 while outkilling them 63 to 39. Junior libero Keely Kurschner provided a match-high 21 digs as the Huskies piled up 74 total, averaging 18.5 a set. Sophomore setter Emma Berran matched Foley with her second double-double of the season, recording 47 assists and 10 digs to go with four blocks and an ace.

SCOUTING NORTHERN MICHIGAN

Northern Michigan enters the tournament with a 1-3 record on the season, taking a four-setter from Minnesota Crookston in their season opener before dropping matches to Hillsdale, No. 2 Concordia-St. Paul and Northwood. The Wildcats' offense has struggled to find efficiency out of the gate, hitting just .151 with 11.5 kills per set. Outside hitter Rayne Thompson and offensive-minded middle blocker Meghan Meyer each average 2.57 kills/set with the latter hitting a scintillating .351 while outside Jacqueline Smith sent down 20 kills against Crookston before missing the next three matches. Northern Michigan posts just 1.36 blocks a set and has allowed opponents to hit .232 with 30 aces - just over two allowed per set. St. Cloud State is 10-18 all-time against the Wildcats in a series that began back in 1979.

SCOUTING SOUTHERN NEW HAMPSHIRE

The Huskies meet the Penmen for the first time in program history this weekend, battling a 4-0 team yet to lose a set this fall. Southern New Hampshire took down Georgian Court, Edinboro, Southern Connecticut State and Saint Michael's in straight sets in Manchester last weekend as part of a terrific start to the Braden Zamore era. Outside hitter Ana Pimenta has been dominant at the left pin, recording 4.00 kills a set on .346 hitting, while fellow outside Dai Thawghmung and opposite Alessandra Peli each average more than 2.00 kills per set. The Penmen have posted a .145 hitting percentage defense through four matches this fall and have allowed just 10.33 kills/set.

SCOUTING MICHIGAN TECH

Michigan Tech owns a potentially deceiving 1-3 record entering the Up North Preseason Tournament, having dropped five-set battles to Winona State and Hillsdale along with a four-set loss to No. 2 Concordia-St. Paul. The "other" Huskies are led by longtime head coach Matt Jennings and feature a talented offensive weapon in outside Lindy Ujiri, a featured hitter who has produced 3.47 kills a set on .255 hitting through four matches. Senior libero Kate Walch leads the defense with 3.71 digs per set, but the Huskies net work has struggled out of the gate with just 1.24 blocks a set. St. Cloud State leads the all-time series against Michigan Tech 14-6, winning the last three meetings as well of four of their last five tilts.

SCOUTING NO. 23 CENTRAL WASHINGTON

SCSU faces a big test on Saturday with the No. 23 Central Washington Wildcats, a program that enters its 28th season under legendary head coach Mario Andaya with a 2-2 mark. CWU fell in straight sets to No. 3 MSU-Denver then dropped in five to No. 19 Cal State-San Bernardino before taking down both No. 9 Cal State-Los Angeles and No. 18 Regis at the Yotes Classic Showcase last weekend. GNAC career triple-double leader and Wildcat setter Tia Andaya's offense revolves around outsides Kylie Thorne, Scottie Ellsworth and Ashley Kaufman - each of whom send down at least 2.40 kills per set. Thorne is hitting .300 through four matches with 3.60 kills a set, proving incredibly difficult to slow down at the pin. 6'0 middle blocker Emma Daoud-Hebert has already piled up 22 blocks - good for 1.47 a set - while her 6'2 counterpart Morgan Halady adds 14 and 0.93 respectively. St. Cloud State has faced Central Washington just once, falling in straight sets early in the 2021 season at Ellensburg.

FOLEY CONQUERS THE LAST FRONTIER

Senior outside hitter Kenzie Foley was named Most Outstanding Player and headlined the Seawolf Invitational All-Tournament Team after a terrific weekend, fueling St. Cloud State to a 4-0 start with a ranked win over No. 14 Alaska Anchorage. Leading the tournament and ranking No. 6 across the NCAA with 4.85 kills per set, Foley hit .307 with a pair of double-doubles while averaging 3.00 digs per set. She posted 5.04 points a set, No. 12 in the country, and shined in serve receive with a .964 on 84 chances. On the weekend, Foley produced 63 kills, 39 digs, three blocks, two assists and an ace.

BERRAN OF ANCHORAGE

Sophomore setter Emma Berran was named to the Seawolf Invitational All-Tournament Team after a terrific weekend in Anchorage. Quarterbacking a lethal offense to hit .251 with 15.15 kills a set, Berran posted 12.15 assists/set while hitting .400 on dumps and adding nine aces for a whopping 0.69 a set. She aced Florida Tech six times in a straight set win, a mark that lands her top-five in a single match in program history. Five of Berran's hitters averaged at least 2.33 kills a set as her distribution impressed throughout the weekend. She also added 2.62 digs a set with seven blocks and recorded a pair of double-doubles. Her 12.15 assists per set currently lands her second in the NCAA at the DII level entering the weekend.

Junior libero Keely Kurschner was named to the Seawolf Invitational All-Tournament Team after a terrific weekend in Alaska. The Huskies' defensive captain logged 4.92 digs per set with 64 in just 13 sets as SCSU recorded three sweeps and a four-set win, anchoring a defense that held opponents to hit just .102 with a meager 9.46 kills a set. Both marks land the Huskies top-three across the league. Kurschner added 15 assists and an ace over the weekend.

KILL COUNTING

Senior outside hitter Kenzie Foley enters the weekend just two kills shy of 1,000 in her collegiate career, on the verge of becoming the 13th Husky to join the prestigious club. Should she join the 1,000 Kill Club this weekend, Foley would become the fastest player in program history to reach 1,000 career kills and just the fourth to join the club in her third season of competition. The two-time AVCA All-American and 2021 AVCA National Freshman of the Year is also just 221 digs away from reaching 1,000 in that category.

ANCHORING THE MIDDLE

The Huskies' middle blocker pairing of redshirt sophomore Sam Zimmerman and freshman Hannah Bruskiwicz enjoyed a terrific opening weekend in Alaska, providing excellent sources of offense to a balanced attack. Zimmerman posted 3.46 points on 2.85 kills and 1.00 blocks per set, hitting .283 with a .402 kill percentage. Bruskiwicz led all Huskies with at least 60 swings in kill percentage, terminating her swings at a .467 clip, and closed her debut weekend with 2.42 kills a set on .273 hitting.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

Coupled with Bruskiwicz' strong debut weekend, each of the Huskies' three fellow freshmen enjoyed promising starts to their collegiate careers. Abby Wachal and Shelby Kimm averaged 2.40 and 2.33 kills per set respectively while splitting time at outside hitter, with the latter adding 2.22 digs per set and a .949 reception percentage. Wachal served a .970 as one of St. Cloud State's most consistent options at the line. Defensive specialist Annika Forbes found a home as the serving specialist, scoring a pair of aces.

SENIOR STEPS UP

Huskies senior defensive specialist Allena Shimon shined in her new role last weekend, providing strong service work and solid defense as the SCSU right back. The converted setter recorded four aces and was one of just two Huskies to not miss a serve - going 48-for-48. She added 1.42 digs per set while playing the back three rotations for the SCSU opposites.

SERVING SLUMP

SCSU looks to find a bit more consistency overall at the service line this weekend after struggling with missed serves at the Seawolf Invitational. The Huskies committed 31 service errors to just 21 aces (1.69/set) over their four matches, serving an uncharacteristically low .902 at the line.

BLIZZARD'S BULLETS

PRESEASON COACH SPEAK

St. Cloud State Volleyball was picked to finish fourth in the 2023 Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference Preseason Coaches Poll. The defending NSIC Tournament Champion Huskies earned 154 points in the poll to land fourth, ranked top-four to open the season for the third straight campaign. Preseason favorite Concordia-St. Paul (190 pts) took eight first place votes to finish just ahead of Wayne State's (189 pts) seven, followed by Minnesota Duluth (165 pts) in third. Southwest Minnesota State (142 pts), Sioux Falls (130 pts), Augustana (109 pts) and Northern State (108 pts) round out the top eight. Winona State (99 pts) landed ninth with Minnesota State-Mankato (85 pts), MSU-Moorhead (64 pts) and Bemidji State (49 pts) filling out the top 12. The poll closed with Mary (47 pts), Minnesota Crookston (28 pts) and Minot State (16 pts).

LOOKING BACK...

2022 marked another chapter in St. Cloud State's rise to national prominence as the Huskies earned their first NCAA Sweet 16 appearance since 1995 while winning their second consecutive NSIC Tournament Championship. Opening their season with a program-best 12-0 start, the Huskies went 28-6 with a 15-5 record in NSIC play, producing the program's highest win total since 1986. St. Cloud State won the NSIC Tournament as the No. 5 seed and advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 at the Wayne Regional, taking down No. 2 Wayne State on their home court in the Round of 32. SCSU closed the 2022 season with their highest final AVCA ranking in program history at No. 5 to spend the entire season ranked in Top 10 nationally. St. Cloud State's offense found new heights in 2022, ranking sixth across the NCAA in hitting percentage (.278), eighth in kills (1717), 10th in kills/set (14.19) and 11th in assists (1563). The Huskies defense ranked No. 3 in the NSIC in opponent kills/set (11.11) and recorded the No. 5 hitting percentage defense (.180) in the league.

HUSKIES HOLD THEIR OWN

Since 2019, the Huskies are a combined 35-15 against AVCA Top-25 opponents and opponents receiving votes in the AVCA National poll. The 2022 Huskies went 9-6 against teams ranked or receiving votes including two signature road postseason wins – a five-set instant classic at No. 3 Concordia-St. Paul in the NSIC Tournament Final and a four-set upset of No. 2 Wayne State in the NCAA Round of 32 at the Wayne Regional. SCSU defeated the No. 2, 3, 7 and 12 teams in the country during their incredible postseason run.

LIVE STREAMING

Each of St. Cloud State's 27 matches this season are set to be live streamed with 23 of 27 found on the NSIC Network. KVSC 88.1 FM is the radio home of Huskies Volleyball in 2023, providing live coverage of select matches throughout the fall.

Under his guidance SCSU has earned two NSIC Tournament Championships, one NSIC Regular Season Championship, three NCAA Tournament appearances, an NCAA Sweet 16 appearance, three NSIC Tournament berths and multiple AVCA Top-25 rankings. He enters the 2023 season with a 414-254 (.620) collegiate head coaching record, 12 20-win seasons, six Conference Coach of the Year honors and has led his teams to six conference championships.

Since 2019, the Huskies are a combined 34-15 against AVCA Top-25 opponents and opponents receiving votes in the AVCA poll. In that same span, the Huskies have gone 33-6 at Halenbeck Hall and have won 36 of their last 42 home matches entering 2023.

Throughout his 22-year collegiate coaching career, Braegelmann has coached nine American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) All-Americans, 13 All-Region players, seven conference Freshmen of the Year, three conference Players of the Year, six Libero/Defensive Players of the Year and 61 All-Conference athletes.

The Huskies have starred in the classroom during Braegelmann's tenure as 51 student-athletes have earned Academic All-Conference honors – the most in any SCSU Volleyball coaching regime – while Maddy Torve became the program's first-ever Academic All-American in 2021. A program-record 11 student-athletes earned Academic All-Conference honors in 2019 with Braegelmann-led teams occupying each of the top four single-season high marks for All-Academic selections.

St. Cloud State has gone 8-1 with two Championships in three NSIC Tournament appearances under Braegelmann, making the Tournament Final in each of their three trips – once as the top seed, once as the No. 4 seed and once as the No. 5 seed.

2022 marked another chapter in St. Cloud State's rise to national prominence as Braegelmann guided the Huskies to their first NCAA Sweet 16 appearance since 1995 while winning their second consecutive NSIC Tournament Championship. Opening their season with a program-best 12-0 start, the Huskies went 28-6 with a 15-5 record in NSIC play, producing the program's highest win total since 1986. St. Cloud State won the NSIC Tournament as the No. 5 seed and advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 at the Wayne Regional, taking down No. 2 Wayne State on their home court in the Round of 32. SCSU closed the 2022 season with their highest final AVCA ranking in program history at No. 5 to spend the entire season ranked in Top 10 nationally.

St. Cloud State's offense found new heights in 2022, ranking sixth across the NCAA in hitting percentage (.278), eighth in kills (1717), 10th in kills/set (14.19) and 11th in assists (1563). The Huskies defense ranked No. 3 in the NSIC in opponent kills/set (11.11) and recorded the No. 5 hitting percentage defense (.180) in the league.

The 2022 Huskies went 9-6 against teams ranked or receiving votes in the AVCA National Poll including



two signature road postseason wins – a five-set instant classic at No. 3 Concordia-St. Paul in the NSIC Tournament Final and a four-set upset of No. 2 Wayne State in the NCAA Round of 32 at the Wayne Regional. SCSU defeated the No. 2, 3, 7 and 12 teams in the country during their incredible postseason run.

Three Huskies – Linsey Rachel, Phebie Rossi and Kenzie Foley – earned AVCA All-American honors in 2022 while the trio added All-





the Central Region Tournament in Warrensburg, Missouri, closed the season ranked No. 10 in the final AVCA top-25 poll and set new program standards for fewest losses and best single-season winning percentage. Braegelmann's offense was one of the most terminal units in the Nation, ranking seventh in hitting percentage (.270), 10th in assists (1576), 13th in kills (1682), 15th in assists per set (13.0) and 17th in kills per set (13.9). The Huskies' fearsome block ranked seventh in total blocks (305.0) and ninth in blocks per set (2.5) at the conclusion of the season.

Multiple AVCA Top-25 teams fell at the hands of St. Cloud State throughout 2021 as the Huskies were 8-3 against ranked opponents. SCSU dispatched the No. 5 (2x), 8, 9, 14, 15 (2x) and 16 teams in the country over the course of their historic season, including three ranked wins in their NSIC Tournament Championship run. The Huskies swept No. 16 SMSU in the Quarterfinal, took down No. 15 Wayne State in a five-set Semifinal thriller then defeated No. 8 Winona State in four sets to earn the conference crown.

Several student-athletes received recognition during 2021 headlined by Kenzie Foley, who was named the AVCA Division II National Freshman of the Year, AVCA Central Region Freshman of the Year and NSIC Freshman of the Year while earning First Team All-America, All-Region and All-Conference recognition after a breakout season with St. Cloud State. Maddy Torve graduated as one of the most successful setters in program history, earning First Team All-America (AVCA, D2CCA), All-Region (AVCA, D2CCA), All-NSIC, Academic All-District (CoSIDA) and Academic All-America (CoSIDA) honors while being named the NSIC Outstanding Senior of the Year. Linsey Rachel became the program's first two-time All-American, adding AVCA All-America Honorable Mention, First Team AVCA All-Region and First Team All-NSIC honors to an already-stacked trophy case. Phebie Rossi ranked sixth in the nation in blocks at the conclusion of the season and earned First Team All-NSIC, AVCA All-Region Honorable Mention and AVCA All-America Honorable Mention honors.

Braegelmann led the Huskies to new heights in 2019, earning NSIC Coach of the Year after helping St. Cloud State record its best season in over 20 years. Under Braegelmann's guidance, the Huskies posted an overall record of 25-7 and a 15-5 mark in NSIC play, landing them fourth place in the NSIC rankings and earning their first-ever trip to the NSIC Tournament. St. Cloud State earned its first AVCA top-25 ranking since 1997, cracked the organization's top-10 for the first time since 1996, finished No. 10 in the final AVCA top-25 poll and earned an at-large berth to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2004. St. Cloud State defeated 14 nationally and regionally ranked opponents during the season, going 10-5 against AVCA Top-25 opponents and finishing runner-up in the NSIC Tournament.

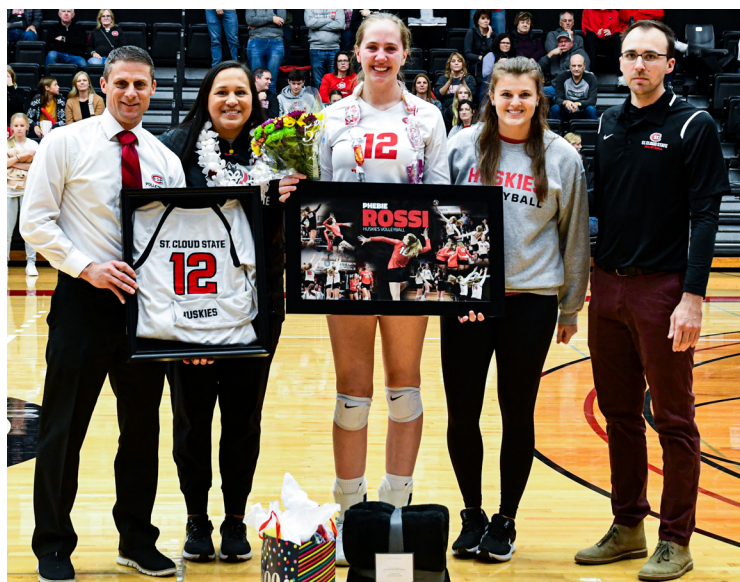
St. Cloud State's defense closed 2019 as one of the top units in the nation, leading the NSIC in digs and digs/set. The Huskies broke the program record for single-season digs, compiling 2213 over the course of 31 matches. Senior libero Clara Krenz became the program's all-time dig leader, concluding her impressive career with 2227. Braegelmann saw three student-athletes earn All-NSIC honors as Krenz was named the conference's Libero of the Year for the second consecutive season and earned First Team All-NSIC, AVCA First Team All-Central Region, D2CCA Second Team All-Region and AVCA All-America Honorable Mention nods. Sophomore outside Linsey Rachel earned First Team All-Conference, AVCA First Team All-Region and AVCA All-America Honorable Mention honors while junior setter Maddy Torve earned Second Team All-NSIC honors and ranked top-five nationally in assists and assists/set. A program-record 11 student-athletes earned Academic All-NSIC honors in 2019.

2018 saw the Huskies continue to build, posting a 15-11 overall record with an 11-9 mark in NSIC play and a seventh-place finish in the conference standings. St. Cloud State defeated two top-10 nationally-ranked opponents while several individuals find success during the 2018 season. Freshman outside Linsey Rachel and junior libero Clara Krenz received Second Team All-NSIC honors in 2018 and were named the conference Freshman and Libero of the Year. Both also earned NSIC Player of the Week honors at least once during the season while seven student-athletes earned Academic All-Conference honors in Braegelmann's fourth season with the program.

In 2017, Braegelmann led the Huskies to a 16-14 record and an 8-12 mark in NSIC play. The 16 wins were the most for the program since 2004, when St. Cloud State

Region and All-NSIC nods. Rachel concluded her legendary career as the program's career leader in kills, became the first member of the program's 1500x1500 club while graduating No. 2 in career points and No. 4 in career digs. Rossi graduated third in career hitting percentage and fourth in both blocks and block assists. SCSU made it back-to-back NSIC Outstanding Senior of the Year honors as Rachel claimed the illustrious honor. The star power of Kenzie Foley continued to shine as the phenom led the NSIC in kills/set and points/set, ranked second in the league in kills and was ninth in aces. Nationally, Foley ranked No. 10 in kills, No. 16 in points/set and No. 17 in kills/set. True freshman setter Emma Berran delivered a Huskies' first-year record 1286 assists while averaging 11.18 assists/set, landing her eighth and seventh respectively across the NCAA.

Braegelmann repeated as the NSIC Coach of the Year in 2021, leading the Huskies to their first NSIC regular season title since 1982 and earning the program's first NSIC Tournament Championship. St. Cloud State went 27-5 with a 19-1 mark in NSIC play to finish alone atop the conference standings. The Huskies earned the No. 2 seed at



posted an overall record of 19-12, and marked just the third time in the last 20 years the Huskies won more than 15 matches in a season. Sophomore libero Clara Krenz led the Northern Sun with a whopping 5.92 digs per set and earned Second Team All-NSIC honors at the end of the season, becoming Braegelmann's second All-NSIC libero in three years with the program. The Huskies defense ascended to third in the NSIC with 17.26 digs a set, limiting opponents to the sixth-fewest kills per set in the league.

Year two at St. Cloud State served as a rebuilding year for the program as the Huskies were 8-21 overall, 3-17 in the NSIC. Four student-athletes earned Academic All-NSIC notice in 2016. The Huskies showed vast improvement at the service line, leaping to fifth in the NSIC with 1.52 aces per set. SCSU's serve receive was seventh in the conference, allowing just 123 aces. Nicole Miller led the Northern Sun with 76 aces - 24 more than the next-best serve specialist - and averaged just over half an ace per set. Freshman libero Clara Krenz opened her collegiate career with 4.30 digs per set, landing her seventh in the NSIC.

In his first season with the Huskies, Braegelmann posted a 9-19 overall record with a 5-15 NSIC mark in NSIC play. St. Cloud State's defense ranked fifth in the NSIC with 16.50 digs per set, led by All-NSIC libero Brienne Stamer's conference-leading 5.46 digs a set. Stamer was one of six Huskies on the Academic All-NSIC squad while Macy Weller ranked top-20 in the conference with 0.83 blocks per set.

Chad Braegelmann was named the fifth head coach in St. Cloud State Volleyball history on July 6, 2015.

Prior to his move to SCSU, Braegelmann was the head women's volleyball coach at the University of Minnesota-Morris where he also served as the Sports Studies and Athletics Discipline Coordinator and an Assistant Athletic Director. In seven seasons at Minnesota-Morris, Braegelmann posted a 130-91 record while earning UMAC Coach of the Year honors in 2010 and 2013. His team won a share of the Upper Midwest Athletic Conference title in 2013 before closing his Minnesota-Morris career with a 23-12 (12-2 UMAC) showing in 2014.

At Colby-Sawyer, Braegelmann departed as the all-time winningest coach in program history with a 156-80 record over seven seasons spanning from 2001-07. He guided the Chargers to Commonwealth Coast Conference Championships in 2003 and 2005 while twice advancing to the NCAA Division III National Tournament. Braegelmann led Colby-Sawyer to six conference championship match appearances with double-digit wins in all seven seasons, attaining the most single-season wins in school history in any sport. Volleyball athletes were successful off the court as well, earning the top team academic grade point average of Colby-Sawyer's athletic programs multiple times.

Earning his undergraduate degree at the University of Minnesota-Morris, Braegelmann received his master's in education from Northern State University.

A native of Richmond, Minn. and graduate of nearby ROCORI High School, Braegelmann and his wife Natalie have four sons.



ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH MARCI TAUMALOLO

St. Cloud State Volleyball associate head coach Marci Taumalolo enters her 14th season with Huskies Volleyball in 2023. At the conclusion of the 2019 season, Taumalolo (pronounced tah-mah-LOW-low) was promoted from top assistant to associate head coach. Honored as part of the American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) Thirty Under 30 in February of 2011, Taumalolo has helped shape St. Cloud State into a national power while establishing a well-deserved reputation as an elite mind in the field of player development.

In 13 years with the program, Marci has recruited and coached nine AVCA All-Americans, 11 AVCA All-Region honorees, 16 All-NSIC selections, two NSIC Libero and Freshmen of the Year recipients, two AVCA Central Region Freshmen of the Year honorees and an AVCA DII National Freshman of the Year. 73 student-athletes have earned Academic All-NSIC honors under Taumalolo's watch.

Taumalolo has helped lead St. Cloud State to back-to-back NSIC Tournament Championships in 2021 and 2022, three straight NCAA Tournament appearances (2019-22) and an NSIC Regular Season title in 2021.

The Huskies defense has developed into one of the top units in the NSIC during Taumalolo's time with SCSU, ranking top-six across the Northern Sun in digs per set in five of the past seven seasons. St. Cloud State led the NSIC in both digs and digs/set in 2019, holding opponents to the fifth-lowest hitting percentage across the league.

Throughout her career at St. Cloud State, liberos have flourished as Taumalolo has recruited and coached back-to-back record-setters. Of the top-10 single-season dig leaders in program history, seven performances have been overseen by Taumalolo. Four of the Huskies' top-six career dig leaders have played for Taumalolo: Clara Krenz (2016-19), Brianne Stamer (2012-15), Chelsea Nagle (2008-11) and Linsey Rachel (2018-22). Krenz established herself as one of the all-time St. Cloud State greats in her time with the program, racking up a Huskies-record 2227 digs and becoming the program's first-ever

2000 Dig Club member. She was named an All-American, a two-time NSIC Libero of the Year and garnered All-NSIC honors three times while leading the Northern Sun in digs per set during the 2017, 2018 and 2019 seasons. Stamer preceded Krenz as the program's all-time dig leader, posting 1929 digs in her illustrious career and earning All-NSIC honors during the 2015 campaign with a conference-leading 5.46 digs per set. Rachel paced all NSIC outside hitters in digs and digs per set during the 2021 campaign, developing into one of the best six-rotation players in the nation under Taumalolo's watch. Kenzie Foley followed Rachel by leading all NSIC outsides in digs during the 2022 season. Nagle provided the third-most single-season digs with 481 in Marci's first season with the Huskies, going on to finish third all-time in digs at the time of her graduation.

Marci's work with the Huskies setters has resulted in some of the best offensive seasons in program history, overseeing standouts including All-American Maddy Torve, Emma Berran, Erin Ohlemann, Marissa Kline and Jennifer Waterman. Maddy Torve became the first Huskies setter to earn All-American honors with a 2021 First Team AVCA nod after averaging 11.75 assists/set in and closed her career third all-time in program history with 4278 assists. Emma Berran delivered a Huskies' first-year record 1286 assists as a true freshman in 2022 while averaging 11.18 assists/set, landing her eighth and seventh respectively across the NCAA while becoming the first SCSU true freshman to start at setter since Waterman did so in 2007. Jennifer Waterman graduated third all-time in career assists while Erin Ohleman closed her career sixth all-time.

Each of the Huskies' seven best single-season team serve receive percentages have been recorded with Taumalolo guiding the defense while four of the top five hitting percentage defenses have been Taumalolo-coordinated. St. Cloud State has held opponents to hit below .200 in each of their last five seasons, the longest such stretch in program history.

Taumalolo moved back into her role as the top assistant in 2015 and has helped oversee an incredible turnaround, leading the Huskies to five straight 15-plus win seasons dating back to 2017 – marking the program's first such span since 1992-96.

Appointed as the interim head coach during a tumultuous 2014 campaign, Taumalolo helped navigate the Huskies through a difficult schedule while overseeing the continued development of a young roster. Libero Brianne Stamer finished third in the NSIC with 4.97 digs/set while senior setter Erin Ohlemann averaged 9.31 assists/set to land eighth in the league and graduate sixth all-time in career assists.

Joining St. Cloud State in July of 2010, Taumalolo spent her first four seasons with the program as an assistant coach. Marci developed standout setters Jennifer Waterman and Erin Ohlemann while truly shining in her work with the defensive specialists. Libero Chelsea Nagle improved her digs/set output by nearly a dig and a half in her first season with Taumalolo, closing her career third all-time in digs, while Brianne Stamer enjoyed an incredible true freshman campaign in 2012 by posting a .956 reception percentage and 4.62 digs per set.

Following her graduation from Minnesota, Taumalolo began her collegiate coaching career as an assistant at Ball State from 2007-10. In her three seasons with the Cardinals, she helped lead the Ball State back court to top-five rankings in the final Mid-American Conference dig rankings each season. In 2007, the Cardinals finished fifth with 14.57 digs per set, while the back court improved two spots in 2008, ranking third with 15.43 digs per set.



A legendary four-year standout at Minnesota, Taumalolo finished her collegiate career with the Golden Gophers ranked second on the school's career digs list with 1,401. Leading the Big Ten with 5.22 digs per set as a senior, Taumalolo was named an AVCA Honorable Mention All-American, the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year and was a First Team All-Big Ten honoree. She was a four-time Scholar Athlete and picked up Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week nods three times.

Taumalolo was a two-time AAU All-American for the Kaepa Northern Lights Club while being named an All-American at the 2000 Junior National Championships (16-Open) and earning the Best Setter award at the 2002 National Junior Championships.

During her prep career at Armstrong High School in Plymouth, Minnesota, Taumalolo was an All-American and All-State player as a junior and senior. During her senior campaign, she led her team to an undefeated 29-0 record while collecting 31 kills and 28 digs in the team's state championship victory over Eagan. As a junior she recorded a school-record 53 kills in a single match.

Taumalolo earned her master's degree in Physical Education and Sports Administration at Ball State along with her undergraduate degree in Business & Marketing at Minnesota.

A native of Plymouth, Minn., Taumalolo is married with five children. She has nine siblings, including three older sisters and one younger sister who all played collegiate volleyball, along with five brothers.



ASSISTANT COACH JACOB VOSS



Jacob Voss enters his third season with St. Cloud State Volleyball in 2023. Primarily working with the setters and defensive specialists, Voss has helped St. Cloud State earn back-to-back NSIC Tournament Championships and two NCAA Tournament appearances in his two years on staff.

Voss played an instrumental role in the development of true freshman setter Emma Berran's incredible debut season in 2022 as she delivered a Huskies' first-year record 1286 assists while averaging 11.18 assists/set, landing her eighth and seventh respectively across the NCAA. St. Cloud State's offense found new heights in 2022, ranking sixth in the Nation in hitting percentage (.278), eighth in kills (1717), 10th in kills/set (14.19) and 11th in assists (1563).

In Voss' first season on the bench, Maddy Torve became the first Huskies setter to earn All-American honors with a First Team AVCA nod after averaging 11.75 assists/set. The 2021 Huskies offense was one of the most terminal units in the Nation, ranking seventh in hitting percentage (.270), 10th in assists (1576), 13th in kills (1682), 15th in assists per set (13.0) and 17th in kills per set (13.9).

St. Cloud State's defense has produced the program's No. 3 and 4 best seasons in hitting percentage defense, holding foes to a .184 mark in 2021 and .180 in 2022. Voss helped outside hitters Linsey Rachel and Kenzie Foley lead all Northern Sun outside hitters in digs during the 2021 and 2022 campaigns respectively while the Huskies' serve receive posted their second and third-best marks in program history with percentages of .937 and .933.

Prior to his time with the Huskies, Voss served as a student assistant at Gustavus Adolphus College, guiding the Gusties to their first Minnesota Intercollegiate Conference (MIAC) Tournament appearance since the late 2000s. He also served as head coach of Upsala High School from 2017 to 2020.

STUDENT ASSISTANT COACH AINSLEY APEL



Ainsley Apel enters her first season as the student assistant coach for St. Cloud State Volleyball in 2023. The former Huskies defensive specialist brings extensive playing experience to the SCSU coaching staff and will assist in all areas of operations and player development.

Joining the Huskies following one season as a club coach in Sauk Rapids, Apel has assisted with St. Cloud State preseason camps and Junior Olympic tournaments for the past three years.

Apel spent two seasons with St. Cloud State in 2020 and 2021 as a defensive specialist, helping the NSIC Regular Season and Tournament Champion Huskies go 27-5 in her sophomore campaign.

A native of Prairie du Sac, Wisconsin, Appel was a four-year starter at Sauk Prairie High School and earned All-State honors while establishing a program record with 1,863 career digs. She played six seasons of club volleyball with Capital Volleyball Academy from U13 through her senior year.

She is currently pursuing a degree in Exercise Science with a double-minor in Psychology and Biology.
