Princeton ended its first offensive drive in 665 days like it usually does with its high-powered offense.

A Collin Eaddy touchdown.

The Princeton Tigers showed a complete team effort with 454 yards of offense while only allowing 92 yards on defense in a 32-0 shutout of the Lehigh Mountain Hawks last Saturday.

Cole Smith threw for 412 yards and three touchdowns while Jacob Birmelin and Andrei Iosivas combined for 256 yards receiving to highlight the offense. Cole Aubrey (two) and Uche Ndukwe (one) totaled three sacks to pace the defense.

Smith's 412 yards passing was only the 14th time in program history that a quarterback threw for over 400 yards in a game.

Princeton's defense was excellent. The Mountain Hawks converted just one of their 13 third and fourth down attempts. The Tigers gave up -25 yards rushing, the third-fewest for an opponent in a single-game. Lehigh finished with 92 total yards.

The Tigers have not lost a season-opening contest since 2014.

The Ivy preseason poll in the league seems to suggest so, as Princeton was picked as the favorite. On the other hand, the league this year might be as wide-open and hard to predict as it's ever been. In that same poll that chose Princeton as No. 1,



Columbia was voted seventh of eight – and still received one first-place vote.

About The Stetson Hatters

The Stetson Hatters are 2-0 this season with victories over Warner and Ave Maria. The Hatters have outscored their opponents, 103-30.

Stetson's offense has been a high-power attack, averaging 537.5 yards per game. It's also been a well-balanced attack, securing 262.5 yards rushing and 275.0 yards passing.

Jalen Leary leads the team in rushing with 302 yards. John Seter is completing 65.5 percent of passes, adding 461 yards, seven touchdowns and no interceptions. Davion Maxwell leads the team in tackles with 12.

Brian Young

Stetson Head Coach

Young is in his first season as head coach of Stetson. During the 2020 season at Georgia Southern, he helped the Eagles to an 8-5 record that included victories over South Alabama, Troy, Florida Atlantic and, in the R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl, a 38-3 rout of Louisiana Tech. The Eagles had a player, Derrick Canteen, who led the nation in interceptions. Prior to Georgia Southern, Young was the defensive coordinator at Stetson from 2011-19. Young's defensive units were known for their attacking style of play, especially in pass defense where the Hatters ranked first or second in the PFL six times during his seven seasons as defensive coordinator from 2013-19. Stetson was also regularly among the top teams in the PFL in sacks and turnovers forced.

Series History

These two teams have never met.

Seeking Eight

Since the Ivy League went to a 10-game schedule in 1980, Princeton has reached nine or more wins eight times, including three of the last four.

Princeton is currently in a stretch of two straight seasons (2018, 2019) with at least eight victories. The most recent time Princeton has reached at least eight wins in consecutive seasons was in the three years from 1991-93.

The Tigers are 19-2 over the last two seasons. The last time Princeton won 18 games in a two-year stretch was 1950-51.

Captains

Princeton has named Collin Eaddy, Trevor Forbes, Nikola Ivanisevic, James Johnson, Cole Smith and Jeremiah Tyler captains for the 2021 season.

Eaddy is a two-time All-Ivy selection including earning second-team honors in 2019. He will very likely become just the seventh player in program history to reach 2,000 yards rushing and is the all-time leader in yards per rush (5.8).

Forbes is a three-time starter, highlighted by his junior season where he posted 34 tackles, three passes defended, two pass breakups and one interception. He has 69 career stops and seven passes defended.

Johnson collected Ivy Honorable Mention accolades in 2019 after leading the team with 68 tackles including eight and half for loss. He has gradually improved every year and has snagged 110 tackles in 61 career contests.

Ivanisevic, a starter on the offensive line, played in every game between 2018-19. He was a vital member of the line that helped the Tigers to the highest-scoring offense in Ivy history in 2018.

Smith is the least experienced of the selected captains, having only seen action in five games. His leadership blossomed during the time away as he got the quarterbacks together to help the team.

Tyler has not missed a game during his storied three-year career at Princeton. In 2019, he was unanimously first-team All-Ivy and was one of two finalists for the Bushnell Cup as the Ivy League Defensive Player of the Year. He contributed 62 tackles, 14.5 going for a loss including 3.5 sacks. In 30 career games, Tyler has posted 105 tackles, three interceptions and 10 passes defended.

Turning 100

Princeton head coach Bob Surace sits with a 57-44 record with three Ivy League championships already on his resume.

Surace was 1-9 in each of his first two seasons and then lost the first two games of Year 3, falling to 2-20. Since then, he has a record of 55-24, a winning percentage of .696.

He has placed 130 players on the All-Ivy League teams throughout his tenure, and he has coached a Bushnell Cup recipient in six of the last eight seasons, the most for any coach in the Ivy League. He has seen a quarterback win the Offensive Player of the Year honors four times — Quinn Epperly in 2013, Lovett in 2016/2018, and Chad Kanoff in 2017 – and had two Defensive Players of the Year – Mike Catapano in 2012 and Mike Zeuli in 2014.

Other notes

*Princeton has the most All-Ivy selections from 2019 returning with nine. Those include Jeremiah Tyler, Delan Stallworth, Henry Byrd, Collin Eaddy, Jacob Birmelin, Carson Bobo, Sam Wright, Will Powers, James Johnson. Birmelin earned All-Ivy honors at wide receiver and punt return.

*Jeremiah Tyler was named to the Buchanan Award watchlist and a Stats Perform third-team preseason All-American. The Buchanan Award is given to the top defensive player in the FCS, and Tyler is one of only 35 players to be named to the list.

*Jacob Birmelin finished with 60 receptions in 2019, good for third in the Ivy League. He earned second-team All-Ivy honors. His 60 catches are the 13th-highest in Princeton history for a single-season.

*Birmelin is the second player in Princeton football history to go from fewer than 10 career receptions to a season of at least 55 receptions. The other is Stephen Carlson, who had two career receptions before having 71 in the 2017 season.

*Collin Eaddy is one of only 14 Princeton players ever to rush for 10 or more touchdowns in a season (and one of five to do so this century). Eaddy led the Ivy League in rushing touchdowns with 12 and total scoring with 84 points in 2019. He placed third in the conference in rushing yards with 799.

*Princeton had three players ranked in the Ivy League’s top 10 in tackles per game in Delan Stallworth (7.5, T-3rd), James Johnson (6.7, T-6), and Jeremiah Tyler (6.2). Each of those players had at least 60 tackles. Tyler was one of three players to lead the squad with five sacks.

*James Johnson led the team with 68 tackles in 2019, securing Ivy League honorable mention. He is not the only Johnson to play linebacker at Princeton as his brother, Liam is also on the team. His older brother, Tom ‘19, was a two-time first-team All-Ivy while helping Princeton earn an undefeated regular season in 2018.

*Jacob Birmelin and Dylan Classi had at least one catch in every game in 2019. Classi has a streak of 15 consecutive games with a reception. Carson Bobo had at least one catch in all but one game during that campaign.

*Princeton has recorded a .500 record in eight consecutive years. The last time Princeton did that was 1960-67.

*Princeton had five alumni in NFL training camps this summer in Kevin Davidson, Stephen Carlson, Jesper Horsted, John Lovett and Caraun Reid. Horsted made the Chicago Bears’ roster following a three-touchdown performance in the preseason finale. He was inactive for the team’s first week contest vs. Los Angeles Rams.

Fun Facts ...

*John Volker’s brother, Charlie ‘19, was a two-time All-Ivy running back who rushed for 1,994 yards, good for seventh all-time. Charlie also ran track and was won an Ivy indoor 60-m dash and was part of the Ivy-League record 4x100 relay squad. Currently, Charlie is trying to qualify for the U.S. Bobsled team in the 2022 Winter Olympics.

*Andrei Iosivas, Austin Carbone and Christian Brown are member of the track and field team at Princeton. Iosivas was named the Ivy League Outstanding Field Performer at the 2020 Ivy Indoor Championship. Carbone is a two-time All-Ivy selection, NCAA Regional Qualifier and Ivy Champion in the 4x100 (Outdoor, 2018). Brown was an NCAA NCAA qualifier in the 110m hurdles and an Ivy League runner-up in the 60m hurdles in the 2019 indoor seasons.

*Matthew Winston’s father, Kevin, who previously worked for the Atlanta Falcons, is now working in the NFL front office.

*AJ Barber is the son of former New York Giants’ running back Tiki Barber. Barber played 10 seasons in the NFL, rushing for 10,449 yards and 55 touchdowns.

*Blake Feigenspan, Andrei Iosivas and Christopher Paige all attended the same high school in Hawaii, the Punahou School.

Bob Surace '90, a four-time finalist for the Eddie Robinson Jr. National Head Coach of the Year award, has built Princeton football into a model FCS program in his first decade as head coach, complete with three Ivy League championships, multiple NFL draft picks and players, Bushnell Cup winners and finalists and the program's first national first-team Academic All-America in more than 20 years.

Surace has a record of 57-44, including a record of 55-24 after a 2-20 start. He has led the Tigers to four seasons of at least eight wins; Princeton had five eight-win seasons in the 44 years prior to when he became head coach.

He has placed 130 players on the All-Ivy League teams throughout his tenure, and he has coached a Bushnell Cup recipient in six of the last eight seasons, the most for any coach in the Ivy League. He has seen a quarterback win the Offensive Player of the Year honors four times — Quinn Epperly in 2013, Lovett in 2016/2018, and Chad Kanoff in 2017 – and had two Defensive Players of the Year – Mike Catapano in 2012 and Mike Zeuli in 2014.

In 2019, Surace coached Princeton to an 8-2 record, despite having graduated three players to the NFL the year before. Princeton had a Bushnell finalist (linebacker Jeremiah Tyler) and 14 All-Ivy selections, as well as a first-team CoSIDA national Academic All-America (Andrew Griffin), the program's first since 1998.

Surace has led Princeton football to three Ivy League championships in the last seven

years, including a perfect 10-0 season in 2018, the first perfect year for a Tiger football team since 1964. Princeton was ranked as high as No. 8 in the AFCA Coaches Poll in 2018, the highest it has been ranked since the Division I-AA/FCS level began in 1978. Princeton set an Ivy League record for total points (470) in a season and produced a defense that limited seven of 10 opponents to 10 points or fewer.

Previously, Surace led Princeton to both the 2013 and 2016 Ivy League championships. He was named a National Coach of the Year finalist after all three championship seasons, as well as a 2012 season that saw the Tigers break through from a 1-9 campaign to one where they were in the Ivy race until the final day of the season.

Surace was first named the Ivy League Head Coach of the Year in 2016 after leading Princeton to the Ivy League championship. His team led the Ivy League in scoring, total and rushing offense, as well as scoring, total and rushing defense. Princeton had two All-America honorees, the Ivy League Offensive Player of the Year, a finalist for Ivy League Defensive Player of the Year, and 18 All-Ivy League players. He won the award again after the perfect 2018 season, when 18 Tigers earned All-Ivy honors, and Princeton had both Offensive Player of the Year finalists in Jesper Horsted and eventual winner John Lovett.

That championship performance came three seasons after the memorable 2013 Ivy championship season, when Princeton set Ivy League records in both total offense and scoring offense. Princeton, which averaged 43.7 points per game, saw quarterback Quinn Epperly earn the Bushnell Cup as the league's Top Offensive Player.

A 1990 Princeton grad, Surace was a center for the Tigers, helping the team to the 1989 Ivy League title while winning first-team All-Ivy honors. He is one of two people to win an Ivy League championship as a player and a head coach.

Surace's wife, Lisa, was a four-time letterwinner in women's soccer at Princeton and is a member of the Class of 1992. She holds a Ph.D. in psychology and is now the Lower School Head at Princeton Day School. They have a daughter, Alison, and a son, A.J., both of whom are athletes themselves.

Surace is part of one of the richest traditions in all of college football. Princeton was involved in the first college football game ever played on Nov. 6, 1869, and has played a total of 778 all-time games with an all-time winning percentage of .675 and five former head coaches in the College Football Hall of Fame: William W. Roper, Fritz Crisler, Tad Wieman, Charles W. Caldwell, Jr. and Dick Colman.
