SERIES HISTORY

- The Hatters and Gyrenes have met just once before on the gridiron with Stetson taking a 60-21 victory late in the 2015 season.
- Stetson ran for a program record 353 yards in the game with quarterback Ryan Tentler leading the way with 93 on just six carries.
- That performance is one of just three games in the modern era in which the Hatters have rushed for 300 or more yards.

- Tentler also threw for 138 yards and a TD, completing 9-of-11 passes.
- Defensively, the Hatters piled up 11 tackles for loss in the game, including six sacks. Stetson also recorded three interceptions and blocked a kick.
- Stetson has played 18 opponents in football from the state of Florida. The Hatters have an overall record of 70-67-10 in those games against in-state foes.

HATTERS FOOTBALL NOTEBOOK

- The Brian Young era of Stetson football got off to exactly the kind of start you would expect from the former Hatters' defensive coordinator. Stetson set modern era records for fewest rush yards allowed in a game (-13), fewest rush yards per attempt in a game (-0.6), fewest total offensive yards allowed (106) and fewest total offensive yards per play (2.3).
- The Stetson defense allowed Warner to run just 47 offensive plays in the game, which is the second fewest in the Hatters' modern history. Nine of Warner's 11 possessions in the game last four or fewer plays. The Hatters finished the game with four sacks, nine tackles for loss, a forced fumble and an interception.
- The interception by Micah Adams came in the fourth quarter and was the first of his career. He is the 22nd player in the modern era to record at least one interception.
- Despite allowing an 82-yard kickoff return for a touchdown at the end of the first half, Stetson allowed Warner just 292 all-purpose yards in the game.
- The kickoff return for a score by Warner was the seventh allowed by Stetson special teams since restarting the program in 2013. The Royals are the only team during the modern era to return two kickoffs for touchdowns against the Hatters, with the first coming on August 30, 2014.
- Stetson is still looking for its first kickoff return for a touchdown.
- The 54 points scored by the Hatters in the opening game were the seventh most in a game for Stetson in the modern era. The seven total touchdowns in the game tied for the sixth most and the four TD passes, all by transfer John Seter, tied for fourth most, both for team and individual.
- The trio of quarterbacks to play in the game for Stetson combined to post a 197.2 QB rating for the game, which is the second highest in a game in the modern era.
- With his 112 rushing yards in the opener, redshirt sophomore Jalen Leary moved within 19 yards of surpassing Jareem Westcott for second on the Hatters' career rushing list with 1,239 yards. Cole Mazza owns the career rushing yardage record with 1,945 yards.
- The Hatters played the season opener without allowing a turnover, marking the 13th time in the modern era that has happened. Surprisingly, Stetson is just 5-8 in the modern era when not allowing a turnover, with four of those eight losses coming to San Diego.
- Redshirt sophomore kicker Cameron Gillis was named Pioneer Football League Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance against Warner. Gillis hit a pair of 35-yard field goals and was 5-of-6 on PAT kicks in the game. It is the 14th time a Stetson player has been named the league's special teams player of the week and he is the 11th different player to earn the award.
- In addition to Gillis, redshirt sophomore defensive back Davion Maxwell was named the College Sports Madness PFL Defensive Player of the Week for his performance in the opener. Maxwell had five tackles, including a sack, and recovered a fumble in the game.
- Since officially starting intercollegiate football in 1901 with a 6-0 victory over Florida Agricultural College, the Hatters have played 56 season-opening games, with 36 of those openers coming against in-state opponents. Stetson has a 30-23-3 record overall in season

openers and a 21-13-2 record in openers against in-state foes after the 54-14 season-opening victory over Warner.

- Stetson is 22-5-1 all-time in season-opening games at home.
- The Hatters have now posted a 20-26 record at home since restarting the football program in 2013. That record included an 11-game home win streak in 2018-19.
- Brian Young is the 11th head football coach in Stetson history. He became the eighth head coach in program history to open his tenure at Stetson with a win with the 54-14 win over Warner.
- Since Stetson returned to the gridiron in 2013, the Hatters have posted a 6-3 record in season opening games. Stetson has averaged 50 points in the opening games while allowing an average of 20.3 points.
- While Coach Young is no stranger to Stetson, having spent eight seasons as defensive coordinator for the Hatters, his staff has a mixture of veterans and newcomers. Defensive coordinator Steve Davis, who is in his third season at Stetson, is in his 45th season overall as a collegiate coach. Defensive line coach Jeremy Perkovich and running backs coach Harry Richards are hold-overs from Roger Hughes' staff while linebackers coach Jeremy "JJ" Johnson is back for his second tenure at Stetson. All the other staff members are in their first season at Stetson.
- The 2021 Stetson roster has a solid mixture of veteran players along with a host of young players who are either new to the program or saw only limited action in the spring. The Hatters roster this fall includes:

Nine graduate students and three redshirt seniors
 Eight redshirt juniors
 One true junior – transfer Fernando Bryant from Oklahoma
 Panhandle State University
 There are 23 redshirt sophomores
 There are 42 redshirt freshmen
 There are 25 true freshmen

- The nine graduates on the Stetson roster for the 2021 season are: transfer quarterbacks Justin Agner (Florida Atlantic) and John Seter (Georgia) along with returning quarterback Alex Piccirilli, defensive end Bryson Richards, offensive linemen Thomas Connors, Alex Brown, Andrew Nadolski and Nick Plunkett along with defensive end Nolan DeFranco, who arrived as a graduate transfer from North Carolina last year.
- Agner, Seter and Bryant are three of the five transfers to Stetson this year from other colleges. Receiver Michael Martinez joined the Hatters from Western New Mexico and receiver Jalon Warthen-Carr came from Assumption College.
- As a result of the Covid pandemic and the shortened spring season that replaced the normal fall campaign, every player on the 2020 roster received an additional year of eligibility. Not every player who was eligible to return for an additional year did so. Those who did not return had all graduated (some with master's degrees) and either moved on to graduate school at another University or to law school or medical school.
- The Hatters do have some players returning this fall who missed the spring season because of injuries. That group includes running back Moise Satine and defensive end Bryson Richards, who both had knee injuries. The Hatters also welcomed back offensive

lineman Avery Samuels, who opted out of playing last year because of the pandemic.

- With so many players taking advantage of the extra year of eligibility, the Hatters enter the season with the most depth and experience on the offensive line of perhaps any team in the nation. Nine of the 10 players listed on the two-deep depth chart along the line have significant playing time, including from one to four seasons as starters.
- Even with many veteran players returning this fall, the Hatters expect some freshmen and redshirt freshmen to make immediate impacts on the field. The Stetson depth chart includes 16 redshirt freshmen and three true freshmen. The three first-year players are: tight end DJ Dell'Anno, running back Kederis Roberts and cornerback Rhyann Cheatham.
- The Stetson roster benefitted from the program at Jacksonville University being disbanded following the 2019 season. Five former Dolphins now suit up as members of the Stetson team: receiver Jalen Mason, running back Jordan Younge-Humphrey, kicker Anthony Einhorn, linebacker Ethan Hill and punter Matt Clements.
- Every season the National Football Foundation accepts nominations from colleges and universities from across the country for its post-graduate scholarship program. Each year the top college football graduating senior is presented with the Campbell Trophy along with a \$25,000 scholarship for post-graduate work. Several other scholarships are also awarded. Stetson's past nominees for the award have included Davion Belk, Austin Tyrrell and Gavin DeFilippo. This year, the Hatters nominee is senior captain Fermon Reid. The awards will be presented at the NFF's annual Hall of Fame induction and Awards dinner, which will take place this year in Las Vegas in early December.
- The Stetson kicking game will once again have an international flavor this year. Punter Matt Clements is a native of Melbourne, Australia, and kicker Cameron Gillis was born in Budapest, Hungary, and spent time growing up in Canada.
- While the Hatters kickers have an international slant, much of the rest of the team is home grown. Of the 111 players listed on the roster currently, 63 are from Florida, which accounts for 56.7 percent of the squad. The roster has another 19 players from Georgia while 18 other states are represented by anywhere from one to three players.
- Breaking down the roster further, by position group, there are 29 defensive backs, 20 offensive linemen, 18 receivers, 11 linebackers, 10 defensive linemen, eight tight ends, with seven running backs, seven quarterbacks and seven specialists.
- Turnovers were an issue for the the Hatters in the spring. There were eight turnovers on interceptions, including two by Presbyterian returned for touchdowns. The squad only lost one fumble, but lost possession on downs 10 times
- The total of 19 turnovers in the four games resulted in 24 points in the loss to Davidson, 17 points in the losses to Morehead State and Presbyterian and 14 points in the loss to San Diego. Combined, the Hatters allowed 72 points off turnovers.
- In the modern era, Stetson has played just 13 games without committing a turnover and just 17 games without forcing a turnover.
- Defensive end Fermon Reid had a career-

high 13 tackles, including a new Stetson modern era record six tackles for loss and three sacks in the game this past spring against Presbyterian.

- As a team, the Hatters registered 7.0 sacks in that game to set a new Stetson modern era record for most sacks in one game.
- In addition to points off turnovers, Presbyterian returned a kickoff for a touchdown. It was the sixth KO return for a TD against Stetson since restarting the program, but the first since Lawrence Dickens of Marist went 100 yards on Nov. 7, 2015. Stetson is still looking for its first KO return for a score in the modern era.
- There have been a total of nine players who have rushed for 100 yards or more in a game for Stetson since the program restarted. Cole Mazza did it six times in his career and Jalen Leary tied that mark with 112 yards in the 2021 season opener. Jareem Westcott had four 100-yard game, Ryan Tentler had three while Jerami Singleton, Gordon Stetson, Matt Taft and Gaven DeFilippo had one each. Sophomore Jordan Younge-Humphrey joined the list with his 115-yard effort against Davidson in the spring.
- Jaylon Johnson holds the modern era records at Stetson for both kickoff return and punt return yards. Johnson has 47 kickoff returns in his career for 1,141 yards and he has 26 punt returns for 191 yards. He has a long kickoff return of 60 yards and a long punt return of 37 yards.
- Jalen Leary became the first Stetson back in the modern era to rush for more than 1,000 yards in a season when he posted 1,013 during the 2019 campaign.
- Stetson has sent two players from the modern era - LB Donald Payne (multiple teams) and TE Donald Parham (LA Chargers) to the NFL, but did you know the Stetson football program had a player drafted by the NFL in 1951? Running back Bill Johnson was selected in the 27th round of the 1951 draft by the Washington Redskins.
- In games in which Stetson has rushed for more than 200 yards, the Hatters are 14-3.

- Stetson is 4-27 in its modern history when failing to rush for 100 yards in a game.
- Extremes in passing yards in a game does not provide an accurate measure of success for the Hatters. Stetson has failed to throw for at least 100 yards in a game eight times, and is 0-8 in those games. The Hatters have passed for more than 200 yards in a game 42 times, with a 21-21 record in those games.
- In 82 games since restarting the program,

the Hatters have been shutout three times and have been held to less than 10 points in a game 12 times.

- Over 82 games, the Hatters have scored defensive or special teams touchdowns 18 times.

Head Coach Brian Young

- After spending the 2020-21 year away from Stetson, Brian Young returned to DeLand on June 7, 2021 to become the 11th head football coach in program history.
- Young served as the Hatters' defensive coordinator from 2011 until departing for Georgia Southern following the 2019 season. He was the first on-field coaching hire of former head coach Roger Hughes when the program was restarted in 2011.
- Young helped build the program from the ground up, working with Hughes to recruit the first class of players to campus. Those recruiting efforts during the winter of 2011-12 resulted in more than 100 players signing on to launch the program
- As defensive coordinator, Young's units were known for their attacking style of play, especially in pass defense where the Hatters ranked first or second in the PFL six times. Stetson was also regularly among the top teams in the PFL in sacks and turnovers forced during his first tenure.
- Also during his previous time at Stetson, Young had a direct hand in the recruitment and development of the Hatters' four-time All-American Donald Payne, who has gone on to a successful career in the NFL. Payne was a three-time Pioneer Football League Defensive Player of the Year.
- Young is a native of Savannah, Ga., and a product of Georgia Southern University where he played defensive back and earned a B.S. in parks and recreation administration in 1997.
- He first arrived at Stetson from Cornell University in Ithaca, N.Y., where he served as defensive backs coach for two seasons. Young has enjoyed a long and distinguished career as a coach at multiple levels, including time in the NFL when he worked with the Buffalo Bills as a training camp assistant. He also had a successful tenure as a high school football and basketball coach.

Meet The Coaching Staff

Steve Davis – Defensive Coordinator

- Entering his third season as a member of the Stetson coaching staff, Davis took on the defensive coordinator duties when Young left for Georgia Southern last year. Davis has spent more than 50 years in college football, starting during his playing career at the University of West Alabama where he had a Hall of Fame playing career, helping the Tigers to a 1971 NAIA National Championship. He jumped right into coaching at his alma mater after his playing career ended. His coaching career has included stops at East Mississippi Community College, the University of North Alabama, Southern Miss, LSU, Auburn, Troy, Tulane and Middle Tennessee State. Prior to joining the Stetson staff, he spent 14 seasons as defensive coordinator at Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College, helping that program to a junior college national championship in 2007. He and his wife, Brenda, have a daughter and four grandchildren.

Jonathan "JJ" Johnson – Linebackers

- JJ is in his second stint as a member of the Hatters' coaching staff, originally serving as the defensive line coach during the 2016 and 2017 seasons. A native Georgian, Johnson played college football at Belhaven College in Jackson, Miss., and started his coaching career there as a graduate assistant in 2013, coaching defensive ends, tight ends and the offensive line over two seasons. He moved on from there to work as an offensive assistant coach at Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College for two seasons before joining the Stetson staff. He returned to the Mississippi junior college ranks in 2018, coaching defensive line and serving as defensive coordinator at Pearl River Community College. He left to coach defensive line at UNC Pembroke before the pandemic started in 2020 but returned to Stetson this past spring to coach linebackers. He tied the knot with his now wife, the former MaddieBeth Robertson of Steamboat Springs, Colo., over the summer and the couple lives with their Australian Shepherd, Buck.

Jeremy Perkovich – Defensive Line

- Perk joined the Stetson coaching staff in 2018 after spending the previous season at Pioneer Football League rival San Diego. A native of Auburn, Wash., Perk played at the University of Puget Sound in Tacoma, which is also where he got his start as a coach. Despite being small for a defensive lineman, he was selected as the team defensive lineman of the year in 2015. Entering his fourth season at Stetson as the defensive line coach, he has helped groom the players at the point of attack on defense into a force on the field. He has also proven himself to be a tremendous asset in terms of recruiting players into the Stetson program.

Harry Richards – Running Backs

- Harry arrived at Stetson from Mississippi State where he worked with then MSU head coach (now Florida head coach) Dan Mullen as an offensive play signaler during the 2017 season. The Bulldogs posted a 9-4 record during that year, including a bowl victory over Louisville. A native of Virginia Beach, Va., he attended James Madison University and worked as an offensive intern during the 2015 season, working with both the running backs and quarterbacks for the Dukes. While still an undergrad, he worked as assistant running backs coach at Rutgers University in 2016. Since arriving at Stetson, he has helped both Jareem Westcott and Jalen Leary to PFL Offensive Freshman of the Year awards and mention on the Jerry Rice Award watch list for the best freshman offensive player in all of FCS football. Westcott rushed for 774 yards and a program record 13 touchdowns in 2018 and Leary followed up in 2019 by rushing for a program record 1,013 yards. This past spring it was sophomore transfer Jordan Younge-Humphrey who finished second in the PFL in rushing yards per game, averaging 89.8 yards per outing.

Buddy Blevins – Pass Game Coordinator

- A native of Wildwood, Mo., Blevins coaches the Hatters receivers as serves as the pass game coordinator. He played collegiately at Colorado-Mesa University as a receiver and started his coaching career at his alma

mater before moving to the University of Northern Colorado in 2012. He went on from there to play and coach in the Canadian Indoor Football League for the Oklahoma Defenders while, at the same time, coaching first at Midwestern State University, then at Texas A&M Kingsville and then, finally, at Oklahoma Panhandle State. In 2018 he coached at Trinity International University before moving on to Fort Valley State in 2019. He was hired as offensive coordinator for the 2020 season at Western New Mexico, but the Mustangs only got to play one game. He is a triplet and his brother, Woody Blevins, who is a defensive assistant coach at Assumption University, while his sister Cassie lives in Oklahoma. He is married to the former Morgan Scott, a native of Newcastle, Okla.

Darrell "DP" Eyman – Offensive Coordinator

- A former standout receiver at the University of Northern Iowa, Eyman came to Stetson from the University of Mississippi where he worked as an offensive analyst for Rebels head coach Lake Kiffin. As a player, Eyman led UNI with 42 receptions during his senior season, piling up a team-high 540 yards with four touchdowns. After receiving his degree in Political Science in 2010, Eyman embarked on his coaching career as an assistant at the Colorado School of Mines in 2011 and then at Concordia University in St. Paul, Minn., where he worked as an offensive graduate assistant while getting a Master's degree in Sport Management. Eyman spent time at San Jose State and Florida Atlantic before returning to Northern Iowa to work with the running backs in 2017.

John Jefferson – Cornerbacks

- A native of Wilmington, Del., Jefferson was an all-around player at Delaware State after earning honorable mention All-America honors as a high school quarterback. He played all over the field in college, spending time at quarterback, receiver and cornerback while also playing on special teams, earning comparisons to the likes of Antwann Randle El. After graduating in 2002, Jefferson played in the Arena Football League for six seasons. He began his coaching career at Woodrow Wilson HS in New Jersey in 2008 before spending a number of seasons coaching at post-graduate academies. He joined the coaching staff at Morehouse College in Atlanta in 2018 and spent two seasons coaching the Maroon Tigers' linebackers. Jefferson has a son, Jadon.

Jake Reed – Offensive Line

- A native of Columbus, Ind., Reed played in 40 games, starting 22 at center and guard, at Indiana University where he earned the program's Harold Mauro "Loyalty to IU Football" Award in addition to earning the Big Ten Sportsmanship Award. During his senior season, with him starting all 13 games, the Hoosiers led the Big Ten in total offense, passing offense and scoring offense. IU became the fourth college team in history to have a 3,500-yard passer, two 1,000-yard rushers and a 1,000-yard receiver in the same season. He was an All-State player in high school, earning Indiana's Mr. Football as a tight end as a senior. Following his playing days at Indiana, Reed was signed by the Atlanta Falcons as

an undrafted free agent, appearing in one preseason game before suffering an injury during the very next practice. He was given an injury settlement and released. After recovering from his injury, he became a graduate assistant in the weight room at the University of Kentucky, becoming certified as a strength coach. From there he spent the 2020 season as a graduate assistant coach at the University of Memphis, working with the Tigers' offensive line.

Brandon Tate – Safeties

- A former Mountaineer at the University of West Virginia, here he played for three seasons (2004-07) as a tight end, Tate comes to Stetson from West Liberty University, which is located in the northern panhandle of West Virginia. He spent two seasons with the Hilltoppers, coaching receivers and tight ends after starting his coaching career as a graduate assistant at his alma mater in 2009. He also spent a year as a GA at rival Marshall University in 2010. He spent six seasons as a high school coach and guidance counselor before returning to Marshall in 2017 to serve as an Academic Counselor in the Athletics Department. Tate received his undergraduate degree in Physical Education from West Virginia in 2007 and his master's degree in Secondary Education and Guidance Counseling from Alcorn State University, where he played his final year of college football, in 2009. He and his wife, Rebecca, have four children – Braylon (9), Braxton (7) and twins Kaden and Kenna (13).

Trent Wessel – Tight Ends

- A Tampa native, Wessel played at Florida Atlantic University from 2016-19 before transferring to Louisiana Tech for his graduate season in 2020. At Florida Atlantic he was a backup quarterback under coaches Lane Kiffin, Kendal Briles and Travis Trickett. He served as a player-coach, signaling in plays, breaking down film and teaching the other players how to run the offense. He is the son of Joe Wessell, who played collegiately for Bobby Bowden at Florida State and then went on to a coaching career that included stops at LSU (1985-90), Notre Dame (1991-93) and in the NFL with the Philadelphia Eagles and Cincinnati Bengals.

Quality Control Assistants

- Jeffrey Eberhardt played football and lacrosse at Seminole High in Sanford before graduating from UCF in 2021. Was a volunteer coach at Seminole High and at Florida High in Tallahassee. Serves as a Quality Control assistant for the Hatters' defense.
- Jesse Marsh worked as a defensive quality control assistant for Stetson in the from 2014-19 after spending the previous 11 years as a high school coach. He returns as an administrative assistant working directly with Coach Young on fund raising, alumni relations and community relations.
- Jake Martinez comes to Stetson from Oklahoma where he played at Oklahoma Panhandle University. He has served as an intern at Texas Tech and as a high school receivers coach. He is certified in the Hal Mumme "Air Raid" offensive attack and is working as a Quality Control assistant for the offense.
- Alek Nikolich is a junior at Stetson and is transitioning from player to coaching staff. He is assisting Coach Reed with the offen-

sive line.

- Colin Ibison is also a junior at Stetson who came in as a kicker but transitioned to an off-field role, first as a video assistant and now as a student assistant working with the specialists.
- Darrien Steadwell is in his second season as a student assistant coach for the Hatters. He works with the equipment staff and trainers during practice and is responsible for organizing the filming and editing of practice and game film.

Hatters History

- The 2021 season marks 58th season of play for Stetson football. The Hatters have an all-time record of 185-177-27.
- Stetson began play in 1901, defeating the Florida Agricultural College, 6-0, on Nov. 22 (Thanksgiving Day) at the State fairgrounds in Jacksonville.
- The Hatters compiled a 155-127-27 (.543) mark in their history prior to discontinuing the program following the 1957 season.
- Stetson participated in the 1951 Tangerine Bowl, defeating Arkansas State, 35-20.
- The Hatters claimed the Florida state championship six times (1901, 03, 05, 06, 07 and 09).
- The program had been halted three times before, not competing in 1915, 1917-18 (World War I) and 1941-45 (World War II) in addition to 1957-2012.
- All four times that Stetson has missed a season of play, the Hatters won their first game upon the program's resumption, downing Rollins College in 1916, the Florida Military Academy in 1919, Troy in 1946 and Warner in 2013.
- Stetson football has produced 22 coaches and players who have been inducted into the Stetson Athletics Hall of Fame, in addition to the 1927, 1938 and 1951 teams.

Starter Notes

- A total of 155 players have made a start on offense or defense for Stetson since the program was re-started for the 2013 season.
- Only four players have made as many as 40 starts in their Stetson careers with linebacker David Lazear holding the career record with 45 starts.
- Others with 40 or more career starts are offensive lineman Patrick Fogarty (44), defensive tackle Davion Belk (43) and dawg safety Donald Payne (42).
- All four of those players were a part of the first signing class for the Hatters in 2012.
- Currently, there are 17 players on the list who have made just one career start. That group includes five players who made their first career starts in the 2021 opening game against Warner.
- Those five first-time starters in the opening game were tight end Kaleb Costner, linebacker CJ Davis, defensive tackle Josh Hughes, cornerback Jaytwon Peoples and receiver Mason Proch.
- The most experienced starters on the 2021 team are on the offensive line. Graduate Alex Brown leads the current roster in terms of both total starts and consecutive starts with 26.
- Others with double-figure starts on the offensive line are Billy Corte (16), Antonio Derry (15) and Nick Plunkett (14).
- The most experienced starter for Stetson not playing on the offensive line is senior defensive end Fermon Reid who has made 21 career starts.
- Combined, the active players on the 2021 roster for Stetson have been credited with 193 game starts.
