QUICK HITS

- St. Lawrence enters the weekend off a 2-0 loss to Clarkson last week in the fourth and final meeting of the regular season between the two rivals. It was the sixth shutout loss for the Saints this season and second 2-0 loss in the last three
- The Saints are looking to snap a 17-game winless streak, as they are 0-14-3 since their last win at Union on November 9.
- · St. Lawrence is also looking to get its leading scorer, Zach Risteau, back on the scoresheet as he's been held without a point since January 3 and has just two assists since the start of the second half after finishing the first half third in ECAC Hockey in scoring. He's currently tied for 11th.

ABOUT PRINCETON

- Princeton enters the weekend having lost the last four since beating St. Lawrence in overtime at SUNY Canton on January 11, and has been outscored 17-9 in those
- The Tigers sit just two points ahead of the Saints in the ECAC Hockey standings in 11th place. A win for St. Lawrence would move them into a tie with five regular season games left to play.
- Corey Andonovski leads the Tigers across the board in scoring with six goals, 12 assists and 18 points. He, Luke Keenan and Derek Topatigh are tied a team-best eight points in conference play.
- Topatigh has a team-high five PPG heading into the weekend.
 Princeton is tied for the ECAC Hockey lead with three shorthanded goals so far this season, including a league-best two from Jackson Cressey.
- Ryan Ferland and Jeremie Forget have each made 11 appearances in goal for Princeton this season and Forget enters the weekend with the team's top numbers with a 2.69 goals against average, .917 save percentage and two of the Tigers' three wins at 2-6-1.

- Princeton's Luke Keenan scored on a deflection with .6 seconds remaining in overtime en route to a 1-0 win over the Saints at SUNY Canton on January 11 for the Tigers' first league win of the season.
- Jeremy Forget finished with 22 saves in the win, while Daniel Mannella stopped 31 for St. Lawrence.

ABOUT QUINNIPIAC

- Quinnipiac is 5-2-1 since their last meeting with the Saints on January 10 at SUNY Canton, which the Bobcats won 3-2. They're coming off a pair of overtime games at Yale and Brown last weekend, edging Yale 3-2 on Friday and skating to a 2-2 tie with Brown on Saturday.
- Entering Friday's game with Clarkson, Quinnipiac is unbeaten at home in conference play at 7-0-0 and outscoring opponents 27-8 in those games.
- · Odeen Tufto leads Quinnipiac and is tied for the lead in ECAC Hockey with 31 points with four goals and a league-best 27 assists. He also leads Quinnipiac with 19 points in conference play.
- Wyatt Bongiovanni has a team-best 13 goals and is second in scoring with 21 points.

LAST TIME OUT

- All five goals scored in the game earlier this season came in the second period, as Quinnipiac opened the scoring with the first of two PPGs for Alex Whelan before St. Lawrence responded with rookie Ashton Fry's first collegiate goal and coast-to-coast PPG for junior Bo Hanson for a 2-1 St. Lawrence lead
- Whelan and Zach Metsa scored within two minutes of each other late in the frame to put the Bobcats in front 3-2 and conclude the scoring.
- Petruzzelli finished with 19 saves in the win, while Daniel Mannella made 29 saves for the Saints.

THE TRI-STATE SWING

• The Saints have not taken a point from the Princeton-Quinnipiac road series since the 2015-16 season

when they took three of the possible four, beating Princeton 5-1 at Hobev Baker Rink and earning a 0-0 tie at Quinnipiac.

• The Saints last win at Quinnipiac came on February 8, 2014. St. Lawrence scored two goals in a span of 1:12 late in the third period for a 3-2 win.

SERIES NOTES

- St. Lawrence is 4-5-1 through the last 10 against Princeton, with just one win in the last six games.
- Quinnipiac has won the last seven games with the Saints, dating back to an ECAC Hockey Quarterfinal series in the 2016-17 season. St. Lawrence shut out the Bobcats in the first of three, but it's been all Quinnipiac since, as they've

LEGS FEED THE WOOLF

• Junior defenseman Dylan Woolf leads ECAC Hockey in blocked shots (54) and is tied for 15th nationally heading into this weekend's games.

ROOS HOUSE WOES

• The Saints struggled in their home-away-from-home this season, finishing 0-9-1 at SUNY Canton after last weekend's losses to Quinnipiac and Princeton.

OT NOTES

- With the tie with Yale earlier this month, the Saints are currently 1-5-4 in overtime games this season, with the lone win coming at Union (3-2) on November 9.
- The overtime loss at Mercyhurst in the season opener was the first since St. Lawrence fell to Princeton, 5-4, in the extra frame on February 2, 2018.
- St. Lawrence was a combined 2-4-11 in overtime games through the last three seasons, including a 0-0-7 record in overtime in 2016-17.
- The Saints were 2-0-2 in overtime last season, with wins over Minnesota and Dartmouth, with the latter coming in the first round of the ECAC Hockey playoffs.
- Zach Risteau is the only active player with an overtime game winner to his credit, now with two after this season's tally at Union.

RISTEAU FOR HOBEY

- Saints' leading scorer Zach Risteau was named a Hobey Baker Award Nominee on January 15 and is one of 75 student-athletes currently on the fan ballot.
- Prior to the bye week, Risteau's 17 road points were tied for the most in the nation.

GARVEY'S GOT CLASS

- Ryan Garvey was named one of 20 candidates for the men's hockey Senior CLASS Award on January 22.
- To be eligible for the award student-athletes must have notable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character and competition.

THE LEGENDS OF APPLETON

- Last Saturday, former men's hockey captain Peter McGeough '88 and women's hockey standout and Canadian Olympic gold medalist Gina Kingsbury '04 were inducted as the third class of Legends of Appleton.
- Peter and Gina join Brian McFarlane '55, Bill Torrey '57, Mike McShane, and Paul Flanagan '80, P'13 as Legends of Appleton Inductees.
- The Legends of Appleton program was launched by the University in the fall of 2017 to celebrate inductees for their play, commitment and impact on the St. Lawrence hockey programs and the hockey world.

SAINTS AT DEVELOPMENT CAMPS

- Keenan Suthers attended the Vegas Golden Knights development camp over the summer and scored three goals in three games to cap off an impressive week.
- Suthers had previously attended the Pittsburgh Penguins development camp in summer 2018.

THE LEADERSHIP GROUP

- Ryan Garvey, Carson Gicewicz, Michael Laidley and Dylan Woolf will all serve as captains for the 2019-20 season.
- Gicewicz and Woolf were also captains in 2018-19, while Laidley served as an alternate. This is Garvey's first season wearing a letter for St. Lawrence.
- Gicewicz, who played the first weekend of the season at Mercyhurst, will miss the remainder of the 2019-20 season due to injury.

NEW ERA

- Brent Brekke was hired to take over the men's hockey program as the Charles W. Appleton II Head Coach in May, and recorded his first career win as a head coach with the Saints on Saturday, October 12 at Mercyhurst.
- Brekke came over from Clarkson, where he was an assistant coach for the 2018-19 season. Prior to that he spent 10 years as an associate head at Miami University in Ohio, following a nine year stint as an assistant at Cornell.
- Tommy Hill and Ben Murphy were hired as assistant coaches in June. Hill spent the 2018-19 season as an assistant at Holy Cross, while Murphy was an assistant at Bentley for nine years prior to joining the Scarlet and Brown.

- Thanks to a generous lead gift from the Dolan Family Foundation, the home of St. Lawrence's Division I men's and women's hockey programs is going to be revitalized, yet preserve its rustic, historic nature.
- Renovations are set to include the arena's lobby, men's and women's locker rooms, training facility, media room, press box, event spaces and more.

• Appleton Arena will be officially dedicated on February 8, 2020.

TORREY RINK

- St. Lawrence announced earlier this season that the ice rink inside the newly renovated Appleton Arena will be named to honor the Torrey family.
- The building will remain named Appleton Arena to recognize the original contribution from the Appleton family in the tradition of Saints Hockey.
- The Torrey Rink will recognize 100 years of engagement with the University by members of the Torrey family, since their arrival on campus in 1920.

A TEMPORARY HOME

• While renovations were completed at Appleton Arena, the Saints utilized SUNY Canton's Roos House Ice Arena for both practices and games, but played their last games in the facility last weekend against Quinnipiac and Princeton.

SAINTS ON ESPN+

- Returning for the 2019-20 season, all St. Lawrence home games and road conference games will be available through ESPN+ and the ESPN App for just \$4.99 per month.
- Fans will have access to hundreds of ECAC Hockey games as well as other programming on the service, which includes a multitude of professional sports offerings, other college sports, the entire library of 30 for 30 documentaries, and more.
- For international fans, all St. Lawrence games and most ECAC Hockey away games will be available via Stretch Internet for the same \$4.99 monthly fee. The ECAC Hockey portal, which includes games for Clarkson, Colgate, Quinnipiac, St. Lawrence and Union is available on the men's hockey schedule page at saintsathletics.com
- All Ivy League institutions will also be available on Stretch as well, with links available the school's schedule pages.

- St. Lawrence is the eighth biggest team by average weight in Division I men's hockey at 190.77 lbs. Minnesota is the biggest overall at 193.89 lbs.
- Keenan Suthers is tied with Maine's Stephen Mundinger as the tallest player in college hockey a 6'8".

THE NEWCOMERS

• The class is comprised of five forwards, one defensemen and one goaltender and hails from three countries, including the first Finnish player in program history in Aleksi Peltonen. They represent five states and played in three different junior hockey leagues last season.

Brent Brekke was named the Charles W. Appleton II Men's Hockey Coach on May 25, 2019. He is the 15th head coach in program history. Prior to his arrival at St. Lawrence, Brekke has served as an associate head coach and assistant coach at the Division I level for the past 20 years.

Brekke spent the 2018-19 season as an assistant coach at Clarkson University where he helped the Golden Knights finish with a record of 26-11-2, win the ECAC Championship, and advance to the NCAA Tournament. Before that he had spent a decade as assistant and then associate head coah at Miami University in Ohio where he helped the RedHawks make back-to-back Frozen Four appearances, six NCAA Tournament appearances, win two regular season conference championships and two playoff conference championships.

Prior to his time at Miami, Brekke spent nine years as an assistant coach at Cornell University helping them to a Frozen Four appearance, four NCAA Tournament appearances and two ECAC Championships.

Hill spent the 2018-19 season as an assistant coach at Holy Cross after spending the previous five years as the Director of Hockey Operations at Miami University in Ohio where he worked alongside Coach Brekke as part of the RedHawks staff. Hill was also a volunteer assistant coach for Miami during the 2012-13 season prior to moving to Hockey Operations.

In 2018-19 with the Crusaders, Hill served as the co-recruiting coordinator and was also in charge of academic and compliance coordination, as well as team video and pre-scouts.

A 2012 graduate of Ferris State University, Hill captained the Bulldogs' NCAA runner-up team during the 2011-12 season. He was a two-time recipient of the team's Most Competitive Award, and was also the Most Improved Player in 2009-10. He obtained a Master's degree in Sports Studies from Miami University in 2015.



ASSISTANT COACH BEN MURPHY

Prior to joining the Saints, Murphy spent 10 seasons as an assistant coach at Bentley University in Waltham, Massachusetts. As the recruiting coordinator for the Falcons, Murphy recruited the program's first NHL Draft pick, seven of Bentley's 100-plus career points scorers, to the leader in all major goaltending statistical categories, and the all-time leading scorer for defensemen in Bentley history. Murphy also helped Bentley to back-to-back winning seasons for the first time in program history in 2013-14 and 2014-15.

Prior to his time at Bentley, Murphy was a graduate assistant coach at Division III Castleton and also served as an assistant coach with the Wichita Thunder.

He graduated from the University of Maine in 2005, where he helped the Black Bears to NCAA Tournament appearances all four seasons and played in two national championship games in 2002 and 2005. He went on to play professionally in Wichita for the 2005-06 season.
