2024-25 DIRECTOR'S REPORT



To the Friends of St. Norbert College Athletics:

The 2024-25 season saw a display of excellence program-wide. We won nine more regular season and conference tournament titles, the most since 2016-17. Our men's and women's hockey teams advanced to the NCAA Division III quarterfinals. Individual athletes qualified for eight events in NCAA Division III national competitions, including two-time individual national champion Aiden Anderson '25, who won the pole vault at the Division III indoor and outdoor track and field championships.

Football won its first bowl game, women's hockey won its first regular-season conference championship, and swimming and diving sent a diver to NCAA regionals for the first time in program history.

We had three student-athletes named conference players of the year and nine earned All-America status. We also won the NACC Women's All-Sports Award for the 2024-25 school year, awarded for a school's performance in the regular season and conference tournament.

Academically, our athletes again earned a grade point average that outpaced the overall student body, and they made up nearly 30 percent of the Honors Program.

Strong support from the community enabled us to enhance our student-athletes' experiences through travel, equipment upgrades and coaching support. Additionally, the inaugural fundraising event for SNC women's sports, OctobHERfest, brought together alumni, fans and supporters in celebration of our female student-athletes. We're thrilled to announce that OctobHERfest will return on Oct. 17, 2025, and we hope to see you there.

This upcoming academic year marks the inaugural seasons for our STUNT and ACHA men's hockey teams. Our partners at Cornerstone Community Center continue to make progress on a new \$23 million community rink, which will become the home of our hockey programs.

I'm excited about these developments — and about what's sure to be another great season in 2025-26, with student-athletes distinguishing themselves as we strive toward our four pillars of success: academic excellence, athletic competitiveness, student-athlete experience and community building.

Thank you for your ongoing support of our program and our athletes. We couldn't do it without you.

Athletic Success

Team highlights

- Women's hockey captured both the NCHA regular-season and tournament titles for the first time in program history while also setting a season record for wins.
- Four athletes competed in the NCAA Division III Indoor Track & Field Championship. The women's team won its 10th straight conference championship, setting a new school record for most consecutive titles. The men's team also secured the conference championship.
- Women's track & field won its 10th consecutive NACC Outdoor Track & Field Championship title, while the men's team won its second straight.
 Three athletes competed in the NCAA Division III Outdoor Track & Field Championships.
- Dance earned the Wisconsin State Championship title as well as top honors at the DX AmeriCup.
- Women's basketball captured the NACC regular-season title and narrowly lost the tournament championship game.
- Men's basketball captured the NACC Tournament and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.
- Men's hockey won the NCHA Tournament and reached the NCAA Quarterfinals.
- Football won a bowl game for the first time.
- Women's tennis made its first NACC tournament final since joining the conference in 2021, falling just short against Edgewood.
- Men's and women's swimming & diving both finished second in conference competition.
- The Learfield Directors' Cup standings, published after each season, award comprehensive success in the NCAA Championships. St. Norbert sits at 71 out of nearly 450 NCAA Division III schools, our sixth best finish in school history and highest since 2017-18.

Individual recognition

- Aiden Anderson '25 became a national champion in the pole vault at the NCAA Division III Indoor Track & Field Championships in March. Anderson then claimed the outdoor title in May at the NCAA Division III Outdoor Championships, claiming his second-straight title in a jump-off. It is just the 17th time in division history that the pole vault event has been swept by the same athlete. Anderson is the 12th overall student-athlete to do so and the first since 2018.
- Courtnie Hogan '25 was named the women's hockey NCHA Player of the Year and a second-team All-American by the AHCA.
- Eden Maranell '27 and Jacob Klitzke '27 earned second-team
 All-America honors in the triple jump and shot put, respectively,
 at the NCAA Division III Indoor Track & Field Championships.

 Ezra Schermacher '26 was named a first-team All-American in the
 heptathlon. Maranell and Klitzke also went on to qualify for the outdoor
 championships in the same events, and both finished in 17th place.
- Logan Dombrowsky '27 was named the men's hockey NCHA Player
 of the Year and was named a first-team All-American by the AHCA.
 Teammates Liam Fraser '25, Dayton Deics '26 and Hunter Garvey '27
 were named second-team All-Americans.
- Owen Pittenger '27 qualified for the NCAA Diving Regionals, a first for the program.

 Nathan Thomson '25 became the first golfer in program history to be named an All-Region selection.
