THE SERIES

This will be the first meeting fifth meeting between the two school and the fourth conference game. UNH leads 3-1 in the overall series and 2-1 in CAA Football games. Stony Brook upended the 13th-ranked Wildcats 31-6 last season in LaValle Stadium.

LAST TIME OUT

Stony Brook's football team once again used a solid defensive effort and the running game to earn a victory, this time the 22nd-ranked Seawolves got past Delaware 28-3 on at Delaware Stadium to remain unbeaten in CAA Football play. The Seawolves gained 210 rushing yards and scored three times on the ground, including 120 yards and two touchdowns from RB **Stacey Bedell**. The defense forced five fumbles and recorded five sacks, including three sacks and three forced fumbles by DL **John Haggart** and a scoop and score touchdown by DB **Jaheem Woods**.

PRESS BOX SERVICES

The press box, located on the east side of LaValle Stadium, is accessible by elevator or stairs. The press box will open three hours prior to game time. Game notes, programs, a flip card and statistics will be provided prior to the game. Play-by-play and quick statistics, final team, individual and defensive statistics, drive charts and coaches' quotes also will be provided. Complete sets of information will be available approximately 20 minutes after the game.

Stony Brook follows guidelines set forth by the NCAA Public Relations Committee, the NCAA Football Rules Committee, the American Football Coaches Association and the National Press Photographers Association. Photographers are not permitted between the 25-yard lines and must have credentials visible at all times. Photographers are required to go behind the team benches to pass from one end of the field to the other. Uniformed security personnel will patrol the sidelines and anyone holding a media pass who is not actively involved in coverage of the game will be escorted from the sideline. Children under 12 will not be issued media or sideline credentials. Similar procedures will be in effect in the press box.

PAIR OF SEAWOLVES EARN PRESEASON HONORS

Stony Brook placed WR Ray Bolden, LT Timon Parris and DE Aaron Thompson on the preseason All-CAA team selected by the league's head coaches and SIDs. Thompson earned second team All-CAA performer in 2015 after posting 23 total tackles, including 8.5 sacks and 10.0 tackles for a loss. Parris was also a second team All-CAA selection in 2015 after starting all 10 games at left guard and anchoring a line that helped six Seawolves gain over 100 yards on the ground. Bolden was a first team All-CAA honoree in 2015 after he led the conference in receptions per game (6.80) and was second in yards per game (76.5). He pulled down 68 receptions for 765 yards and five touchdowns in Stony Brook's 10 games. He also posted three 100-plus yard games, including a career-best 112 this past week in the win over UAlbany.

SEASON OPENERS UNDER PRIORE

Head coach Chuck Priore is now 6-5 in openers at Stony Brook, including a 5-1 record when playing at home to open the season.

BIG WIN

Stony Brook upended No. 21/19 North Dakota to open the season. The victory marked the first win over a ranked opponent since the Seawolves defeated No. 13 New Hampshire 31-6 on Sept. 19, 2015.

BIG WIN, PART 2

The Seawolves remained 2-0 against FCS opponents in 2016 with a 42-14 victory at home against second-ranked and defending CAA Football champion Richmond. The win marked the highest ranked opponent the Seawolves have ever beaten.

CHOPPING WOODS

Senior DB **Jaheem Woods** has earned two CAA Football Defensive Player of the Week honors this season (Sept. 1 and Oct. 8). In the season opening victory over No. 19 North Dakot he recorded a career-high 11 tackles, four tackles for loss and a pair sacks. At Towson on Oct. 8 Woods had 10 stops with a forced fumble and a key interception.

TAKING IT TO THE HOUSE

Junior WR Sherman Alston Jr. earned CAA Special Teams Player of the Week in Stony Brook's victory over No. 2 Richmond when the Boston College transfer took the opening kickoff of the second half to the house. Alston Jr. field the kick at the four-yard line and zigged and zagged his way past the Spiders' defenders 96 yards for the touchdown. The return marked the first time a Seawolf took a kickoff back for a score since Miguel Maysonet did so against Gardner-Webb on Oct. 20, 2012.

A FAMILY AFFAIR

Stony Brook RBs **Stacey Bedell** and **Jordan Gowins** share more than just the carries out of the backfield, the two are first cousins. Bedell, a junior from Mastic Beach, N.Y., and Gowins, a sophomore transfer from Bellport, N.Y., have family blood running through their veins. So far in 2016, the duo has combined to carry the ball 206 times for 950 yards and 12 touchdowns.

DOUBLE TROUBLE

Stony Brook RBs **Stacey Bedell** (138) and **Jordan Gowins** (108) became the first pair of Seawolves to each rush for 100 yards in the same game since Bedell joined Isaiah White last year against Central Connecticut. Bedell and Gowins became the 20th duo to reach the milestone in the same game in Stony Brook history.

BEDELL BACK AT IT

Junior RB **Stacey Bedell**, who missed the final seven games of the 2015 season with a shoulder injury, returned to his old ways against No. 2 Richmond by gaining 100 yards on 17 carries, including a career-high four touchdowns. The 100 yard game was the ninth of his career. Bedell has collected a total of three 100-yard games this season (Towson-125, Rhode Island-138) to bring his career total to 11.

LAWLESS HAS CAREER NIGHT

Sophomore LB **Shayne Lawless** had a career night in the win over North Dakota. In his first career start, the Moorestown, N.J., native recorded nine total tackles, including 2.0 tackles for a loss. Six of his stops were solo, also a career-best.

RIGHT PLACE, RIGHT TIME

Senior DB **Kye Morgan** seems to have a knack to be in the right place at the right time. For the second time in his Stony Brook career, Morgan has scored a touchdown on a blocked punt. He scooped the blocked kick against North Dakota (Sept. 1, 2016) for a seven yard return and blocked the punt and fell on the ball in the endzone at Rhode Island (Nov. 14, 2015) for a touchdown.

BEVERETTE TAKES HONOR

Junior DB **Tyrice Beverette** was named the CAA Football Defensive Player of the Week for his effort in the win over Rhode Island on Oct. 15. Beverette registered a team-high 11 tackles, 4.0 tackles for loss (22 yards), a sack and a forced fumble to lead a Seawolves' defense that limited the Rams to just 134 total yards and a first-quarter field goal.

HAGGART'S CAREER DAY NABS HONORS

Junior DL **John Haggart** earned CAA Football Defensive Player of the Week, STATS FCS National Defensive Player of the Week and College Sports Madness National Defensive Player of the Week for his career marks set in the win at Delaware on Oct. 22. Haggart recorded a career-best 11 tackles, 5.5 tackles for a loss, three sacks and three forced fumbles in the victory over the Blue Hens.

FIRST TIMERS

Fourteen Seawolves have seen their first collegiate action this season: QB Pat Irwin, DB Syceir Malone, OL Joe Detorie, DB Gavin Heslop, RT Jackson Miller, RB Chris Parler, DL Odean Gilzene, OL Mason Zimmerman, LB Keegan Henderson, DL Sam Kamara, WR Kyle Vadis, DL Zach Brady, DL Jordan Scarbrough and OL Chris Infantino. Six other transfers saw their first action as Seawolves (WR Tim Keith, RG Jonathan Haynes, RB Jordan Gowins, WR Harrison Jackson and WR Sherman Alston Jr.).

CLIMBING THE CHARTS

RB **Stacey Bedell** enters the New Hampshire game ranked among the top 10 in several of Stony Brook's career rushing records. The junior sits second in career 100 yard games (12), third in career touchdowns (23), sixth in career carries (367) and eighth in career rushing yards (2026). See page 6 for the complete rankings.

LETS GO STREAKING

RB **Stacey Bedell** has rushed for at least 100 yards in each of the last three games (125 at Towson, 138 vs. Rhode Island, 120 at Delaware)...Bedell has also rushed for at least 100 yards in each of the Seawolves' CAA games this season (100 vs. Richmond).

MORE STREAKS

As a team, Stony Brook has rushed for at least 200 yards in all four CAA Football games this year (221 vs. Richmond, 205 at Towson/242 vs. Rhode Island, 210 at Delaware) and a total of five straight conference games, including 236 vs. Albany to end the 2015 season.

AND ANOTHER STREAK

The Seawolves have won three straight road CAA Football games dating back to last year's win at Rhode Island.

AGAINST THE RANKS

Stony Brook is now 7-18 all-time against FCS ranked opponents, including the Seawolves' two wins this season. Stony Brook posted a 42-14 win over No. 2 Richmond and earned a 13-9 season-opening victory against No. 19 North Dakota. Richmond's No. 2 ranking equals the highest ranked opponent to come into Kenneth P. LaValle Stadium (No. 2 Towson on Sept. 28, 2013). The win over Richmond also marked the program's first victory over a top 10 team.

PRIORE REACHED MILESTONE IN 2015

Head coach **Chuck Priore** earned his 100th career win on Nov. 14, 2015 with a 19-7 victory at Rhode Island. Priore enters his 11th season as head coach at Stony Brook and owns 62 career wins with the Seawolves and had 39 wins in six seasons as head coach at Trinity. ards, 2 yards and 25 yards.



Since becoming Stony Brook's head football coach in the spring of 2006, Chuck Priore's tenure can be described as an usher. He's ushered the Seawolves through two conferences (Northeast and Big South), and for the past three seasons, CAA Football. During that time, Priore has ushered the program to the upper echelon of the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS), guiding SBU from 20 scholarships to a fully-funded program of 63 scholarship, the maximum allowed at the FCS level.

Under Priore's leadership, Stony Brook posted a number of firsts - a win over a Football Bowl Subdivision (Army), a 10-win season, an at-large berth to the Division I Football Championship and produced the Seawolves first NFL player when Will Tye joined the New York Giants as an undrafted free agent and enjoyed a very successful rookie campaign.

In Priore's previous 10 seasons at the helm of the Seawolves, SBU has collected at least five wins, including that 10-win season in 2012 and a nine-win season in 2011.

In 2015, the Seawolves posted a 5-5 record and went 3-5 in the CAA, including a 31-6 victory at home over No. 13 New Hampshire, the highest ranked opponent Stony Brook has even beaten. Priore's squad had to overcome numerous injuries to reach .500, but were highlighted by the CAA's Co-Defensive Player of the Year and All-America DE Victor Ochi. Ochi anchored the SBU defense that ranked first in the FBC is yards allowed with 250.1 and once again among the nation's best in scoring defense.

During the 2015 season, Priore reached the 100 career wins milestone as a head coach. Stony Brook defeated Rhode Island, 19-7, in Kingston on Nov. 14 to accomplish the feat.

The 2014 season once again featued five victories that included wins on the road at Towson and Elon. The Seawolves also claimed four wins in the CAA to finish the top half of the conference. Stony Brook was led by All-America selection Christian Richard that solidified a defensive unit the ranked among the FCS' best in yards and points allowed. RB Stacey Bedell, TE Will Tye and WR Adrian Coxson anchored the offense. Bedell rushed for over 1000 yards and nine scores, while Tye pulled down five touchdowns and Coxson had six TDs and over 600 receiving yards.

In 2013 Stony Brook, which won five games for an ninth straight season, went 3-5 in its first season in the CAA, including wins over No. 25 James Madison and in-state rival Albany.

Priore ushered Stony Brook to the upper echelon of Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). In 2012, the Seawolves hosted and won a playoff game and advanced to the second round of the Division I Football Championship.

The season featured a number of milestones - Stony Brook beat Army, 23-3, for its first win over an FBS program; Miguel Maysonet finished as the runner-up for the Walter Payton Award, given to the nation's most outstanding player, was named to a program-record seven All-America Teams and became the first SBU football player to be invited to the NFL Combine

Stony Brook, which won a program-best 10 wins, moved to the Colonial Athletic Association, considered the "SEC" of FCS football.

For his efforts, Priore was named AFCA Regional Co-Coach of the year, and earned a contract extension through the 2017 season.
