

#### **NOTEWORTHY**

- Juniors Roland Nyama and Tyrell Sturdivant had strong starts to the season against Columbia as Nyama led the team with 16 points and Sturdivant earned his second double-double with 11 and 10 in the game.
- Redshirt freshman Akwasi Yeboah made his collegiate debut against Columbia, adding 11 points and seven boards in his first start for the Seawolves.
- The Seawolves welcome five newcomers in 2016-17, as well as two redshirt freshmen that did not see the floor last season.
- Senior Lucas Woodhouse is the top returner for the Seawolves after logging 812 minutes of game time and scoring 208 points in his debut season at Stony Brook.
- Stony Brook unveiled its banners prior to the Columbia game, honoring the historical 2015-16 season that concluded with the program's first trip to the NCAA Tournament as a Division I team, after winning the America East Tournament for the first time and earning its fourth regular season conference title.
- The 26 victories in 2015-16 marked a Division I era, program best, making it five straight seasons with 20-plus wins.

#### THE OPPONENT

Boston College is coming off its first win of the season after topping Maryland Eastern Shore at home Tuesday night, 73-57. It fell to Nicholls State in its first game of the season, 79-73. Jerome Robinson leads the Eagles in scoring after scoring 16 points in the victory. Boston College is coming off of a 7-25 season in 2015-16. The Eagles lost their leading scorer Eli Carter (16.0 ppg) and rebounder Dennis Clifford (7.3 rpg) from a season ago.

#### THE SERIES

The Seawolves have never topped Boston College in four meetings. All four previous meetings were played in Chestnut Hill, Mass. Stony Brook is 0-7 against teams currently in the Atlantic Coast Conference and last faced an ACC opponent when it traveled to Notre Dame last season. The two teams most recently met on Dec. 11, 2011. Stony Brook fell to the Eagles 66-57.

#### **EARLY SIGNEES**

### ANTHONY OCHEFU — FORWARD | 6-8 | 225 | WEST CHESTER, PA.

Ochefu enters his senior season at Westtown School after helping his team to its first Pennsylvania Independent Schools Athletic Association (PAISAA) state championship last season. The power forward averaged 8.0 points and 6.0 rebounds per game as a junior as his squad made it three straight Friend's League championships.

#### JORDAN MCKENZIE - GUARD | 6-1 | 180 | CONCORD, N.C.

McKenzie was a four-year letterwinner at Jay M. Robinson High School before arriving at Hargrave Military Academy for a post graduate year. He averaged 16.5 points and 6.9 rebounds per game as a senior at Robinson, helping his team to a 3A state championship. McKenzie was a 1,000-point scorer and earned all-state as well as all-conference honors while at Robinson.

#### CORRY LONG - GUARD | 6-2 | 160 | CINCINNATI, OHIO

Long enters his final season at Cincinnati Hughes High School after averaging 19 points per game as a junior. Long was named First Team All-District 16, Enquirer First Team All-City and First Team All-CMAC following his junior season. As a sophomore, he averaged 16.0 points, 5.0 rebounds and 2.3 assists per game.

#### ELIJAH OLANIYI - FORWARD | 6-5 | 190 | NEWARK, N.J.

Olaniyi is coming off a strong junior season at Newark East Side that saw him average 10.8 points and 8.7 rebounds per game. He strung together seven straight games of double-figure scoring and notched a double-double on six occasions. Following the impressive year, Olaniyi was named to the All-Group 4 first team.

#### LAST TIME OUT

Stony Brook fell 73-66 in its season opener against Columbia before having over a week off from game play. Roland Nyama led the way with 16 points off the bench for the Seawolves, while Tyrell Sturdivant notched the second double-double of his career with 11 points and 10 rebounds.

Akwasi Yeboah, who finished with 11 points and seven boards, scored Stony Brook's first five points of the game. The Seawolves remained in control for much of the first half, but trailed by two at the break.

Columbia extended its lead in the second half, but a 10-2 run got Stony Brook back in it. Three straight buckets from the Seawolves tied the game at 65 with 2:22 left to play. A desperation three from Columbia's Mike Smith with 16 seconds remaining proved to be the difference-maker.

#### **AGAINST THE ACC**

The Seawolves have never topped an opponent from the Atlantic Coast Conference in seven attempts. They are 0-4 all-time against Boston College and last faced an ACC opponent a season ago, falling at Notre Dame.

#### COACHING CONNECTION

The Ohio connection between Boston College head coach Jim Christian and assistant coach Geno Ford is a strong one. Ford was a member of Christian's staff during his days as the head coach at Kent State. Ford spent four seasons working under Christian before replacing his as head coach in 2008. Prior to taking the Boston College job, Christian spent two seasons as the head coach at Ohio University, where Ford and Stony Brook head coach Jeff Boals were teammates in the mid 90's.

#### **GARCIA OUT FOR STONY BROOK**

Freshman Andrew Garcia will miss the remainder of the 2016-17 season after undergoing surgery on his left knee. The Harlem, New York, native attended the Master's School in Connecticut, missing most of senior year due to injury. He averaged 18 points and seven rebounds per game as a junior, earning honorable mention All-Class AA. Garcia ranked as the No. 15 prospect in Connecticut and No. 32 in New England by the New England Recruiting Report.

#### STRONG START

Stony Brook saw three players reach double figures in scoring in the season opener against Columbia as junior Roland Nyama led the way with 16 points off the bench and junior Tyrell Sturdivant notched the second double-double of his career with 11 and 10 in the game. Redshirt freshman Akwasi Yeboah made his collegiate debut and put up 11 points and seven boards in the game.

#### **DOUBLE UP**

Five of the six returners have logged a game scoring in double figures, while senior Lucas Woodhouse leads the way with 33 games in double digits. Woodhouse and junior Tyrell Sturdivant are the only returners that have notched double figures in rebounding, and Sturdivant is the only player on the roster with a double-double in his Stony Brook career, earning his second in the opener

against Columbia (11p, 10r).

#### A NEW ERA

The Columbia game marked the start of a new era for Stony Brook men's basketball as first-time head coach Jeff Boals coached his first game after being named to the position in April 2016. He spent the last seven seasons as an assistant at Ohio State. This season, Boals and his staff will direct a team with five newcomers and a pair of redshirt freshmen. Stony Brook has also added three junior college transfers in juniors UC Iroeqbu and Junior Saintel, and sophomore Blair Mendy.

#### **FAMILIAR FACES**

Stony Brook returns a number of familiar faces in 2016-17, including assistant coach Lamar Chapman, who enters his ninth season with the Seawolves. Just two starters return from last season as Lucas Woodhouse is in his final season and junior Bryan Sekunda is back from a late-season injury. Jakub Petras, Roland Nyama, Kameron Mitchell and Tyrell Sturdivant round out the returnees for the Seawolves and all saw time in at least 21 games last season.

#### **SEASON OPENERS**

Stony Brook is 9-9 in home openers since moving up to Division I and has started the season with a victory in four of the last five years.

#### AT THE ISLAND

In their third season playing in Island Federal Credit Union Arena, the Seawolves are 28-4 at home. They have dropped just one non-conference game in the new building, falling to Columbia in this season's opener.

#### RAISING THE BANNER

Prior to the Columbia game the Seawolves raised two banners honoring the 2015-16 season that saw the first Division I NCAA Tournament appearance in program history that came after the team won its first America East Conference Tournament. Stony Brook positioned itself for a successful conference tournament run after claiming its fourth America East regular season title.

#### A SEASON AGO

The 2015-16 season was one for the record books as the Seawolves tallied a program-best 26 wins en-route to their first Division I NCAA Tournament appearance. Then-senior Jameel Warney, who sits as the program's all-time leader in points, rebounds, blocks and games played, helped lead the team to the post season for the fifth straight season.

Stony Brook finished the year with a 26-7 overall record, going 14-2 in America East play and 15-1 at home. This marked the fifth straight season the team finished with 20-plus victories.

Jeff Boals was named head men's basketball coach at Stony Brook University by Director of Athletics Shawn Heilbron on April 9, 2016. He arrived at Stony Brook after spending seven seasons as an assistant coach at Ohio State.

A member of Thad Matta's staff since 2009-10, Boals [pronounced BOWLS] helped guide Ohio State to seven postseason appearances, including six NCAA Tournaments. The Buckeyes, who won or claimed a share of three Big 10 titles, advanced to the Final Four in 2012. Ohio State went 193-62 during Boals' time in Columbus.

Boals was instrumental in bringing some of the top players in the nation to Ohio State, including current NBA stars Jared Sullinger and D'Angelo Russell, along with Aaron Craft, the all-time steals and assist leader in Ohio State history. He also coached the 2010 National Player of the Year, Evan Turner, during his outstanding collegiate career with the Buckeyes.

Prior to Ohio State, Boals spent three seasons at Akron, serving as the team's recruiting coordinator and working with the post players. The Zips advanced to three Mid-American Conference championship games, winning the title in 2009. It was Akron's first NCAA Tournament berth since 1986. Boals also recruited Anthony "Humpty" Hitchens, a MAC All-Freshman Performer, and Zeke Marshall, a top-35 national recruit.

Boals spent two seasons (2004-06) at Robert Morris and four years (1999-2003) at Marshall. In his final season at Robert Morris, the Colonials posted their first winning record in 15 seasons. He also spent a total of four seasons at Division II University of Charleston in two different stints.

A 1995 graduate of Ohio University, Boals was a two-time captain and four-year letterwinner for the Bobcats, who advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 1994. The following year, Ohio University won the Preseason NIT Championship after wins over Ohio State and No. 14 Virginia, as well as George Washington and New Mexico State at Madison Square Garden.

Boals and his wife, Katie, have two children, Sydney and Chase.




