#### **NOTEWORTHY**

- The Seawolves picked up their first win of the Jeff Boals era with a 76-66 victory over Hampton.
- Senior Lucas Woodhouse matched his Stony Brook career best against Hampton, scoring 17 points in the victory, all of which came in the second half.
- Junior Roland Nyama returned to the starting lineup against Hampton and added 12 points and four rebounds. It was the 37th start of his career.
- Redshirt freshman Akwasi Yeboah has scored in double figures in all five games this season.
- Stony Brook has had the same or fewer turnovers than its opponent in every game this season, and has forced 33 turnovers in its last two outings.
- Junior Tyrell Sturdivant followed up a double-double in the season opener with a career-best 26 points at Boston College. He currently leads the team in scoring and rebounding.
- The Seawolves welcome five newcomers in 2016-17, as well as two redshirt freshmen that did not see the floor last season.
- Stony Brook unveiled its banners prior to the Columbia game, honoring the historical 2015-16 season that concluded with the program's first trip to the NCAA Tournament as a Division I team, after winning the America East Tournament for the first time and earning its fourth regular season conference title.

#### THE OPPONENT

Loyola will arrive at Stony Brook with a 2-4 record on the year, coming off of an 82-52 loss at No. 12 Creighton on Saturday. Prior to the holiday break, the Greyhounds topped Fairfield at home, 81-66. They have yet to win on the road this season, playing four games away from home. Senior Jarred Jones leads the way for Loyola, averaging over 14 points and six boards on the year, with two double-doubles. Loyola is the first of two teams from the Patriot League that Stony Brook will face this season, also hosting Lehigh less than a week later.

#### THE SERIES

The Seawolves have never fallen to Loyola, leading the series 5-0. This is the fourth consecutive meeting between the two teams after first meeting Jan. 5, 2000. Stony Brook took a 51-50 win on the road in the series opener. Most recently, the Seawolves claimed a 76-63 win in Baltimore a season ago. Junior Bryan Sekunda helped lead Stony Brook with 18 points in the game, including four three-pointers.

## **EARLY SIGNEES**

#### ANTHONY OCHEFU - FORWARD | 6-8 | 225 | WEST CHESTER, PA.

Ochefu enters his senior season at Westtown School after helping his team to its first Pennsylvania Independent Schools Athletic Association (PAISAA) state championship last season. The power forward averaged 8.0 points and 6.0 rebounds per game as a junior as his squad made it three straight Friend's League championships.

#### JORDAN MCKENZIE - GUARD | 6-1 | 180 | CONCORD, N.C.

McKenzie was a four-year letterwinner at Jay M. Robinson High School before arriving at Hargrave Military Academy for a post graduate year. He averaged 16.5 points and 6.9 rebounds per game as a senior at Robinson, helping his team to a 3A state championship. McKenzie was a 1,000-point scorer and earned all-state as well as all-conference honors while at Robinson.

#### CORRY LONG - GUARD | 6-2 | 160 | CINCINNATI, OHIO

Long enters his final season at Cincinnati Hughes High School after averaging 19 points per game as a junior. Long was named First Team All-District 16, Enquirer First Team All-City and First Team All-CMAC following his junior season. As a sophomore, he averaged 16.0 points, 5.0 rebounds and 2.3 assists per game.

#### ELIJAH OLANIYI - FORWARD | 6-5 | 190 | NEWARK, N.J.

Olaniyi is coming off a strong junior season at Newark East Side that saw him average 10.8 points and 8.7 rebounds per game. He strung together seven straight games of double-figure scoring and notched a double-double on six occasions. Following the impressive year, Olaniyi was named to the All-Group 4 first team.

#### **LAST TIME OUT**

The Seawolves picked up their first win of the season as it knocked off Hampton 77-66 Saturday evening. Stony Brook played catch-up for much of the first half, but kept it within two possessions until the midway point. Hampton put together a 10-0 run with just over 10 minutes until halftime and held a double-digit lead at the break.

A dunk from junior Roland Nyama and a three-pointer less than a minute later got the Seawolves back within four early in the second half. Stony Brook hovered around a one-possession differential until a pair of free throws from redshirt freshman Akwasi Yeboah with 6:38 remaining gave the Seawolves their first lead of the game.

Senior Lucas Woodhouse came up with a big steal as Stony Brook pressed following the foul shots, and he laid it in to extend the lead.

Woodhouse hit back-to-back threes the next two times down the court to help continue what would be a 12-2 run for Stony Brook, securing the momentum late.

#### **WOODHOUSE SPARKS SEAWOLVES IN WIN**

Senior Lucas Woodhouse matched his Stony Brook career best against Hampton, putting up all 17 of his points in the second half alone. He also added a career-high four steals, including a momentum-shifting take-away while pressing that helped extend the early end of Stony Brook's first lead of the game with under seven minutes remaining in the game.

#### YEBOAH KEEPING IT CONSISTENT

Redshirt freshman Akwasi Yeboah is one of four Stony Brook players averaging double figures in scoring, but the only player to have reached double-digits in all five games this year.

#### STURDIVANT SHINES AGAINST EAGLES

Junior Tyrell Sturdivant took over late at Boston College to help get Stony Brook back within four points after trailing by as many as 23 in the game. With 5:15 left to play, Sturdivant scored 13 of the Seawolves' next 15 points to make it a two-possession game with under a minute to play. He finished with a career-best 26 points.

#### **WE MEET AGAIN**

After facing the Terps earlier this week, Stony Brook will open the 2017-18 season against Maryland at the new Nassau Coliseum. This will be the first meeting in the series that will not be played in College Park, Maryland.

#### **GARCIA OUT FOR STONY BROOK**

Freshman Andrew Garcia will miss the remainder of the 2016-17 season after undergoing surgery on his left knee. The Harlem, New York, native attended the Master's School in Connecticut, missing most of his senior year due to injury. He averaged 18 points and seven rebounds per game as a junior, earning honorable mention All-Class AA.

#### STRONG START

Stony Brook saw three players reach double figures in scoring in the season opener against Columbia as junior

Roland Nyama led the way with 16 points off the bench and junior Tyrell Sturdivant notched the second double-double of his career with 11 and 10 in the game. Redshirt freshman Akwasi Yeboah made his collegiate debut and put up 11 points and seven boards in the game.

#### **DOUBLE UP**

Five of the six returners have logged a game in their career scoring in double figures, with senior Lucas Woodhouse leads the way with 33 games in double digits. Junior Tyrell Sturdivant and redshirt freshman Akwasi Yeboah have both scored in double figures twice this season. Woodhouse and Sturdivant are the only returners that have reached double figures in rebounding, and Sturdivant is the only player on the roster with a double-double in his career, earning his second in the opener against Columbia (11p, 10r).

#### A NEW ERA

The Columbia game marked the start of a new era for Stony Brook men's basketball as first-time head coach Jeff Boals coached his first game after being named to the position in April 2016. He spent the last seven seasons as an assistant at Ohio State. This season, Boals and his staff will direct a team with five newcomers and a pair of redshirt freshmen. Stony Brook has also added three junior college transfers in juniors UC Iroegbu and Junior Saintel, and sophomore Blair Mendy.

#### **FAMILIAR FACES**

Stony Brook returns a number of familiar faces in 2016-17, including assistant coach Lamar Chapman, who enters his ninth season with the Seawolves. Just two starters return from last season as Lucas Woodhouse is in his final season and junior Bryan Sekunda is back from a late-season injury. Jakub Petras, Roland Nyama, Kameron Mitchell and Tyrell Sturdivant round out the returnees for the Seawolves and all saw time in at least 21 games last season.

#### RAISING THE BANNER

Prior to the Columbia game the Seawolves raised two banners honoring the 2015-16 season that saw the first Division I NCAA Tournament appearance in program history that came after the team won its first America East Conference Tournament. Stony Brook positioned itself for a successful conference tournament run after claiming its fourth America East regular season title.

#### A SEASON AGO

The 2015-16 season was one for the record books as the Seawolves tallied a program-best 26 wins en-route to their first Division I NCAA Tournament appearance. Then-senior Jameel Warney, who sits as the program's all-time leader in points, rebounds, blocks and games played, helped lead the team to the post season for the fifth straight season.

Stony Brook finished the year with a 26-7 overall record, going 14-2 in America East play and 15-1 at home. This marked the fifth straight season the team finished with 20-plus victories.

Jeff Boals was named head men's basketball coach at Stony Brook University by Director of Athletics Shawn Heilbron on April 9, 2016. He arrived at Stony Brook after spending seven seasons as an assistant coach at Ohio State.

A member of Thad Matta's staff since 2009-10, Boals [pronounced BOWLS] helped guide Ohio State to seven postseason appearances, including six NCAA Tournaments. The Buckeyes, who won or claimed a share of three Big 10 titles, advanced to the Final Four in 2012. Ohio State went 193-62 during Boals' time in Columbus.

Boals was instrumental in bringing some of the top players in the nation to Ohio State, including current NBA stars Jared Sullinger and D'Angelo Russell, along with Aaron Craft, the all-time steals and assist leader in Ohio State history. He also coached the 2010 National Player of the Year, Evan Turner, during his outstanding collegiate career with the Buckeyes.

Prior to Ohio State, Boals spent three seasons at Akron, serving as the team's recruiting coordinator and working with the post players. The Zips advanced to three Mid-American Conference championship games, winning the title in 2009. It was Akron's first NCAA Tournament berth since 1986. Boals also recruited Anthony "Humpty" Hitchens, a MAC All-Freshman Performer, and Zeke Marshall, a top-35 national recruit

Boals spent two seasons (2004-06) at Robert Morris and four years (1999-2003) at Marshall. In his final season at Robert Morris, the Colonials posted their first winning record in 15 seasons. He also spent a total of four seasons at Division II University of Charleston in two different stints.

A 1995 graduate of Ohio University, Boals was a two-time captain and four-year letterwinner for the Bobcats, who advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 1994. The following year, Ohio University won the Preseason NIT Championship after wins over Ohio State and No. 14 Virginia, as well as George Washington and New Mexico State at Madison Square Garden.

Boals and his wife, Katie, have two children, Sydney and Chase.
