NOTEWORTHY

- Stony Brook has limited itself to single-digit turnovers in three of the last five games, committing 10 or fewer on six occasions.
- Junior Bryan Sekunda gave Stony Brook a big lift off the bench in his return to his home state of Pennsylvania. He helped lead the way in the win at St. Francis with a season-high 17 points, including five threes.
- Senior Lucas Woodhouse matched his Stony Brook career best in scoring and set new season highs in rebounds and assists, finishing the win at St. Francis with 17, 9 and 9, respectively.
- Junior Saintel returned to the starting lineup at St. Francis and earned the first double-figure scoring game of his Stony Brook career. The junior finished with 15 points and six rebounds.
- Freshman Michael Almonacy put up the best numbers of his debut season, scoring 15 points in the game at Hofstra, adding three rebounds and three assists.
- Redshirt freshman Akwasi Yeboah returned to double figures, scoring 16 points in the win over Lehigh, and followed it up with a season-best 18 points against Rutgers. He earned America East Rookie of the Week honors for his play.
- Tyrell Sturdivant has adjusted well to his new role this season. He hasn't missed a start this year, leading the team in rebounding and ranking second in scoring.
- The Seawolves have had the same or fewer turnovers than their opponent in nine of the ten games this season.

THE OPPONENT

The Highlanders recently snapped a four-game skid before the holiday break. They topped Dean College, a Division III opponent, 92-50 at home. Prior to the victory, NJIT nearly had Temple on the road, tied with the Owls in the final minute of play, but Temple was able to claim a 68-63 win in Philly.

NJIT is 6-8 on the season, but just 1-7 on the road so far. The Highlanders are led by senior Damon Lynn, who has scored in double figures in 28 straight games, and surpassed the 20-point mark on nine occasions this season.

THE SERIES

Stony Brook leads the series with the Highlanders, 5-0. The two teams first met in Newark, New Jersey, in 2006, as the Seawolves claimed a 65-61 road win. Stony Brook and NJIT met in each of the next three seasons, and most recently matched up last year, as the Seawolves topped the Highlanders 83-61 on the road. This marks the fifth meeting between the teams in the month of December. The lone November meeting was played in Stony Brook in 2009.

EARLY SIGNEES

ANTHONY OCHEFU - FORWARD | 6-8 | 225 | WEST CHESTER, PA.

Ochefu enters his senior season at Westtown School after helping his team to its first Pennsylvania Independent Schools Athletic Association (PAISAA) state championship last season. The power forward averaged 8.0 points and 6.0 rebounds per game as a junior as his squad made it three straight Friend's League championships.

JORDAN MCKENZIE - GUARD | 6-1 | 180 | CONCORD, N.C.

McKenzie was a four-year letterwinner at Jay M. Robinson High School before arriving at Hargrave Military Academy for a post graduate year. He averaged 16.5 points and 6.9 rebounds per game as a senior at Robinson, helping his team to a 3A state championship. McKenzie was a 1,000-point scorer and earned all-state as well as all-conference honors while at Robinson.

CORRY LONG - GUARD | 6-2 | 160 | CINCINNATI, OHIO

Long enters his final season at Cincinnati Hughes High School after averaging 19 points per game as a junior. Long was named First Team All-District 16, Enquirer First Team All-City and First Team All-CMAC following his junior season. As a sophomore, he averaged 16.0 points, 5.0 rebounds and 2.3 assists per game.

ELIJAH OLANIYI - FORWARD | 6-5 | 190 | NEWARK, N.J.

Olaniyi is coming off a strong junior season at Newark East Side that saw him average 10.8 points and 8.7 rebounds per game. He strung together seven straight games of double-figure scoring and notched a double-double on six occasions. Following the impressive year, Olaniyi was named to the All-Group 4 first team.

LAST TIME OUT

Stony Brook picked up a 75-63 win at St. Francis to head into the holiday break on a high note. The Seawolves didn't allow a bucket in the first three minutes of the game and used steady production to distance themselves early. They led by double figures for the majority of the first half, but the Red Flash closed it out on a 10-2 run to get back within six at the break.

Senior Lucas Woodhouse had a big first half, putting up 14 points, while junior Junior Saintel, who returned to the starting lineup against the Red Flash, scored nine points and grabbed six rebounds in the opening period.

The Seawolves allowed St. Francis to get back within five early in the second half, but 11 straight points from junior Bryan Sekunda, including three makes from beyond the arc, allowed Stony Brook to match its largest lead of the day.

St. Francis got the difference back to single digits with 5:09 to play, but another three from Sekunda with 1:01 on the clock got the Seawolves' lead back above 10, and the Red Flash were only able to connect two times in the final minute of play.

TRIO LIFTS SEAWOLVES PAST ST. FRANCIS

Top performances from Lucas Woodhouse, Junior Saintel and Bryan Sekunda helped the Seawolves pick up a win before the holiday break. Woodhouse neared a triple-double as he finished with 17 points, nine assists and nine boards. Sekunda went off in the second half to score a season-best 17 points, including five threes. Saintel returned to the starting lineup and notched the first double-figure scoring game of his career with 15 points, and added six rebounds in the road victory.

YEBOAH NAMED AE ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

Redshirt freshman Akwasi Yeboah earned the first America East Rookie of the Week honors of his young career for his play against Lehigh and Rutgers. He averaged 17.0 points and 4.5 rebounds through the 1-1 week for the Seawolves. After scoring a season-best 16 points, also adding six rebounds, in the win over Lehigh, Yeboah upped his number as he put up 18 in a nail-biter against Rutgers.

ALMONACY BREAKS OUT AT HOFSTRA

Freshman Michael Almonacy had a breakout game at Hofstra, going off for 15 points while also adding three assists and three rebounds. This was the first time this season the Long Island native has scored in double figures.

FROM THE CHARITY STRIPE

Senior Lucas Woodhouse leads the team and is second in the America East from the free throw line, shooting 91-percent from the line on the year. Woodhouse made 28 consecutive free throws through a seven-game span. He went 8-for-8 in the final 1:38 of the win over Northeastern, before setting a new career best the next game with 12 makes on 12 attempts against Lehigh.

CLEAN PLAY

The Seawolves have limited their turnovers all season, keeping the number in single digits in three of the last five games and on four total occasions this season. They

have committed more turnovers than their opponent just once this year.

SUCCESS IN A NEW ROLE

Upperclassmen Lucas Woodhouse and Tyrell Sturdivant have taken on new roles this season as full-time starters and leaders for the Seawolves. Woodhouse, who started just half of the games in his first season at Stony Brook, has doubled his production in his final year from 6.7 to 12.5 ppg. Sturdivant saw just 11.8 minutes per game last season, averaging just over three points and rebounds per game. This season Sturdivant leads the Seawolves in rebounding and is second in scoring.

HOT FROM BEYOND THE ARC

The Seawolves heated up from three-point range against Northeastern, sinking a season-high 13 attempts from beyond the arc. Junior Bryan Sekunda led the hot-shooting night going 4-for-5 from three, while juniors UC Iroegbu and Roland Nyama added three threes each. The victory over the Huskies marked the third straight game Iroegbu made at least three shots from downtown.

FIRST WINS FOR BOALS

Head coach Jeff Boals earned the first win of his head coaching and Stony Brook career as the Seawolves topped Hampton, 76-66, on Nov. 26, 2016. Boals added his first home win on Dec. 3, 2016 as Stony Brook held on to top Northeastern, 77-75.

WOODHOUSE SPARKS SEAWOLVES IN WINS

Senior Lucas Woodhouse matched his Stony Brook career best against Hampton, putting up all 17 of his points in the second half. He also added a career-high four steals, including a momentum-shifting take-away while pressing that helped extend the early end of Stony Brook's first lead of the game with under seven minutes remaining in the game.

Woodhouse had another clutch performance in the victory over Northeastern as he again finished with 17 points and went 8-for-8 from the free throw line in the final 1:38 of the game to secure the win.

STRONG AT HOME

In their third season playing in Island Federal Credit Union Arena, the Seawolves are 30-6 at home. They have dropped just three non-conference games in the home building.

STURDIVANT SHINES AGAINST EAGLES

Junior Tyrell Sturdivant took over late at Boston College to help get Stony Brook back within four points after trailing by as many as 23 in the game. With 5:15 left to play, Sturdivant scored 13 of the Seawolves' next 15 points to make it a two-possession game with under a minute to play. He finished with a career-best 26 points.

WE MEET AGAIN

Stony Brook traveled to Maryland in the early part of the year to take on the Terps for the third time in program history. The Seawolves will open the 2017-18 season against Maryland at

the new Nassau Coliseum. This will be the first meeting in the series that will not be played in College Park, Maryland.

GARCIA OUT FOR STONY BROOK

Freshman Andrew Garcia will miss the remainder of the 2016-17 season after undergoing surgery on his right knee. The Harlem, New York, native attended the Master's School in Connecticut, missing most of his senior year due to injury. He averaged 18 points and seven rebounds per game as a junior, earning honorable mention All-Class AA.

STRONG START

Stony Brook saw three players reach double figures in scoring in the season opener against Columbia as junior Roland Nyama led the way with 16 points off the bench and junior Tyrell Sturdivant notched the second double-double of his career with 11 and 10 in the game. Redshirt freshman Akwasi Yeboah made his collegiate debut and put up 11 points and seven boards in the game.

A NEW ERA

The Columbia game marked the start of a new era for Stony Brook men's basketball as first-time head coach Jeff Boals coached his first game after being named to the position in April 2016. He spent the last seven seasons as an assistant at Ohio State. This season, Boals and his staff direct a team with five newcomers and a pair of redshirt freshmen. Stony Brook also added three junior college transfers in juniors UC Iroegbu and Junior Saintel, and sophomore Blair Mendy.

RAISING THE BANNER

Prior to the Columbia game the Seawolves raised two banners honoring the 2015-16 season that saw the first Division I NCAA Tournament appearance in program history, which came after the team won its first America East Conference Tournament. Stony Brook positioned itself for a successful conference tournament run after claiming its fourth America East regular season title.

Jeff Boals was named head men's basketball coach at Stony Brook University by Director of Athletics Shawn Heilbron on April 9, 2016. He arrived at Stony Brook after spending seven seasons as an assistant coach at Ohio State.

A member of Thad Matta's staff since 2009-10, Boals [pronounced BOWLS] helped guide Ohio State to seven postseason appearances, including six NCAA Tournaments. The Buckeyes, who won or claimed a share of three Big 10 titles, advanced to the Final Four in 2012. Ohio State went 193-62 during Boals' time in Columbus.

Boals was instrumental in bringing some of the top players in the nation to Ohio State, including current NBA stars Jared Sullinger and D'Angelo Russell, along with Aaron Craft, the all-time steals and assist leader in Ohio State history. He also coached the 2010 National Player of the Year, Evan Turner, during his outstanding collegiate career with the Buckeyes.

Prior to Ohio State, Boals spent three seasons at Akron, serving as the team's recruiting coordinator and working with the post players. The Zips advanced to three Mid-American Conference championship games, winning the title in 2009. It was Akron's first NCAA Tournament berth since 1986. Boals also recruited Anthony "Humpty" Hitchens, a MAC All-Freshman Performer, and Zeke Marshall, a top-35 national recruit.

Boals spent two seasons (2004-06) at Robert Morris and four years (1999-2003) at Marshall. In his final season at Robert Morris, the Colonials posted their first winning record in 15 seasons. He also spent a total of four seasons at Division II University of Charleston in two different stints.

A 1995 graduate of Ohio University, Boals was a two-time captain and four-year letterwinner for the Bobcats, who advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 1994. The following year, Ohio University won the Preseason NIT Championship after wins over Ohio State and No. 14 Virginia, as well as George Washington and New Mexico State at Madison Square Garden.

Boals and his wife, Katie, have two children, Sydney and Chase.

- The final two minutes saw six of the game's nine lead changes. Senior Kameron Mitchell drove the lane with seconds seven on the clock and was fouled. He hit both free throws to put the Seawolves up 70-69, but Loyola's Andre Walker went straight to the basket off the inbound and was able to get one to fall as the clock ran out.
