### **NOTEWORTHY**

- The Seawolves have had the same or fewer turnovers than their opponent in seven of the eight games this season, limiting themselves to eight mishaps in each of the last two games.
- Redshirt freshman Akwasi Yeboah set a new season best with 16 points in the win over Lehigh, scoring in double figures for the sixth time this season.
- Senior Lucas Woodhouse matched his Stony Brook career best for the second time in three games when he scored 17 points in the win over Northeastern. He set a new career best, going 12-for-12 from the free throw line in the win over Lehigh.
- Tyrell Sturdivant got out to a hot start to the season and has been one of the most consistent scorers for the Seawolves this season. He leads the team in scoring and rebounding, scoring in double figures six times so far this year after doing so just twice prior to his junior season.
- Junior Roland Nyama made his first start of the year against Hampton and has scored in double figures twice through four starts.
- Junior Bryan Sekunda gave Stony Brook a big lift off the bench against Northeastern as he went 4-for-5 from beyond the arc en-route to a 12-point night.
- The Seawolves shot 54-percent from beyond the arc against Northeastern, making a season-best 13 threes in the victory.

### THE OPPONENT

The Scarlet Knights enter the weekend at 8-1 on the year, with their only loss coming at Miami during the ACC/ Big Ten Challenge. Rutgers dropped the game against the Hurricanes, 73-61, after opening the season with six straight wins. Most recently, the Scarlet Knights knocked off Central Connecticut State at home Tuesday night, 79-37, as Nigel Johnson came off the bench to lead four players in double figures with 16 points.

Rutgers is outscoring its opponent by 14.3 points per game, and out-rebounding its opponent by 12.1 boards per outing. This game against the Seawolves marks just the third road game of the year for the Scarlet Knights, who are the second Big Ten opponent Stony Brook has faced this season (Maryland).

Rutgers head coach Steve Pikiell spent 11 season as the head coach of the Seawolves, helping them to 192 wins and six post season appearances.

### THE SERIES

The Seawolves have never defeated Rutgers through three meetings. This is the first meeting between the two schools at Stony Brook. The last clash took place at Madison Square Garden, while the other two were played in New Jersey. Stony Brook fell in the most recent match-up, 67-58, on Dec. 17, 2011.

## **EARLY SIGNEES**

### ANTHONY OCHEFU - FORWARD | 6-8 | 225 | WEST CHESTER, PA.

Ochefu enters his senior season at Westtown School after helping his team to its first Pennsylvania Independent Schools Athletic Association (PAISAA) state championship last season. The power forward averaged 8.0 points and 6.0 rebounds per game as a junior as his squad made it three straight Friend's League championships.

### JORDAN MCKENZIE - GUARD | 6-1 | 180 | CONCORD, N.C.

McKenzie was a four-year letterwinner at Jay M. Robinson High School before arriving at Hargrave Military Academy for a post graduate year. He averaged 16.5 points and 6.9 rebounds per game as a senior at Robinson, helping his team to a 3A state championship. McKenzie was a 1,000-point scorer and earned all-state as well as all-conference honors while at Robinson.

### CORRY LONG - GUARD | 6-2 | 160 | CINCINNATI, OHIO

Long enters his final season at Cincinnati Hughes High School after averaging 19 points per game as a junior. Long was named First Team All-District 16, Enquirer First Team All-City and First Team All-CMAC following his junior season. As a sophomore, he averaged 16.0 points, 5.0 rebounds and 2.3 assists per game.

### ELIJAH OLANIYI - FORWARD | 6-5 | 190 | NEWARK, N.J.

Olaniyi is coming off a strong junior season at Newark East Side that saw him average 10.8 points and 8.7 rebounds per game. He strung together seven straight games of double-figure scoring and notched a double-double on six occasions. Following the impressive year, Olaniyi was named to the All-Group 4 first team.

#### **LAST TIME OUT**

The Seawolves made it back-to-back wins at home as it knocked off Lehigh, 62-57, Tuesday night. Redshirt freshman Akwasi Yeboah led the way with a season-best 16 points, while Tim Kempton led Lehigh with 27 points.

It was a slow start to the night for both teams as only two field goals were made in the first four minutes of play, but back-to-back threes from junior Bryan Sekunda got Stony Brook in it and began a seven-minute span of lead changes.

The Mountain Hawks were without Kempton for much of the first half due to foul trouble, but he was still able to put up 11 points in the first half. 7 of which came from the free throw line.

Stony Brook strung together seven quick points in the beginning of the second half, five of which came from Yeboah, but Kempton halted the run with Lehigh's second three of the half. The Seawolves never lost their lead again after the opening minutes of the new half, and used a 10-2 run around the midway point in the period to earn their largest lead of the night. Lehigh never went away and was able to get back within one with 37 seconds remaining in the game after making back-to-back threes, but four straight makes by Woodhouse from the free throw line decided the game.

### FROM THE CHARITY STRIPE

Senior Lucas Woodhouse leads the team and the America East from the free throw line, shooting 97-percent from the line on the year. Woodhouse has gone 28-for-28 from the charity stripe over the last four games. He went 8-for-8 in the final 1:38 of the win over Northeastern, before setting a new career best the next game with 12 makes on 12 attempts against Lehigh.

### **CLEAN PLAY & STRONG DEFENSE**

The Seawolves have limited their turnovers all season, keeping the number in single digits in each of the last two games and on three total occasions this season. They have committed more turnovers than their opponent just once this year. Stony Brook forces 14 turnovers per game and most recently drove Lehigh into committing a season-high 19 Tuesday night.

### **SUCCESS IN A NEW ROLE**

Upperclassmen Lucas Woodhouse and Tyrell Sturdivant have taken on new roles this season as full-time starters and leaders for the Seawolves. Woodhouse, who started just half of the games in his first season at Stony Brook, has doubled his production in his final year from 6.7 to 12.6 ppg. Sturdivant saw just 11.8 minutes per game last season, averaging just over three points and rebounds per game. This season Sturdivant leads the Seawolves in both categories.

### HOT FROM BEYOND THE ARC

The Seawolves heated up from three-point range against Northeastern, sinking a season-high 13 attempts from beyond the arc. Junior Bryan Sekunda led the hot-shooting night going 4-for-5 from three, while juniors UC Iroegbu and Roland Nyama added three threes each. The victory over the Huskies marked the third straight game Iroegbu made at least three shots from downtown.

#### FIRST WINS FOR BOALS

Head coach Jeff Boals earned the first win of his head coaching and Stony Brook career as the Seawolves topped Hampton, 76-66, on Nov. 26, 2016. Boals added his first home win on Dec. 3, 2016 as Stony Brook held on to top Northeastern, 77-75.

#### **WOODHOUSE SPARKS SEAWOLVES IN WINS**

Senior Lucas Woodhouse matched his Stony Brook career best against Hampton, putting up all 17 of his points in the second half. He also added a career-high four steals, including a momentum-shifting take-away while pressing that helped extend the early end of Stony Brook's first lead of the game with under seven minutes remaining in the game.

Woodhouse had another clutch performance in the victory over Northeastern as he again finished with 17 points and went 8-for-8 from the free throw line in the final 1:38 of the game to secure the win.

#### STRONG AT HOME

In their third season playing in Island Federal Credit Union Arena, the Seawolves are 30-5 at home. They have dropped just two non-conference games in the home building.

#### KEEPING IT CONSISTENT

Junior Tyrell Sturdivant has been one of the most consistent scorers for the Seawolves this season as he leads the team in the category, as well as rebounding. Sturdivant has scored in double figures in six of the seven games. Redshirt freshman Akwasi Yeboah started the season scoring in double figures in each of the first five games and most recently add his sixth with a season-best 16 points in the win over Lehigh.

### STURDIVANT SHINES AGAINST EAGLES

Junior Tyrell Sturdivant took over late at Boston College to help get Stony Brook back within four points after trailing by as many as 23 in the game. With 5:15 left to play, Sturdivant scored 13 of the Seawolves' next 15 points to make it a two-possession game with under a minute to play. He finished with a career-best 26 points.

### **WE MEET AGAIN**

Stony Brook traveled to Maryland in the early part of the year to take on the Terps for the third time in program history. The Seawolves will open the 2017-18 season against Maryland at the new Nassau Coliseum. This will be the first meeting in the series that will not be played in College Park, Maryland.

### GARCIA OUT FOR STONY BROOK

Freshman Andrew Garcia will miss the remainder of the 2016-17 season after undergoing surgery on his right knee. The Harlem, New York, native attended the Master's School in Connecticut, missing most of his senior year due to injury. He averaged 18 points and seven rebounds per game as a junior, earning honorable mention All-Class AA.

### STRONG START

Stony Brook saw three players reach double figures in scoring in the season opener against Columbia as junior Roland Nyama led the way with 16 points off the bench and junior Tyrell Sturdivant notched the second double-double of his career with 11 and 10 in the game. Redshirt freshman Akwasi Yeboah made his collegiate debut and put up 11 points and seven boards in the game.

### A NEW ERA

The Columbia game marked the start of a new era for Stony Brook men's basketball as first-time head coach Jeff Boals coached his first game after being named to the position in April 2016. He spent the last seven seasons as an assistant at Ohio State. This season, Boals and his staff will direct a team with five newcomers and a pair of redshirt freshmen. Stony Brook has also added three junior college transfers in juniors UC Iroegbu and Junior Saintel, and sophomore Blair Mendy.

#### **RAISING THE BANNER**

Prior to the Columbia game the Seawolves raised two banners honoring the 2015-16 season that saw the first Division I NCAA Tournament appearance in program history that came after the team won its first America East Conference Tournament. Stony Brook positioned itself for a successful conference tournament run after claiming its fourth America East regular season title.

Jeff Boals was named head men's basketball coach at Stony Brook University by Director of Athletics Shawn Heilbron on April 9, 2016. He arrived at Stony Brook after spending seven seasons as an assistant coach at Ohio State.

A member of Thad Matta's staff since 2009-10, Boals [pronounced BOWLS] helped guide Ohio State to seven postseason appearances, including six NCAA Tournaments. The Buckeyes, who won or claimed a share of three Big 10 titles, advanced to the Final Four in 2012. Ohio State went 193-62 during Boals' time in Columbus.

Boals was instrumental in bringing some of the top players in the nation to Ohio State, including current NBA stars Jared Sullinger and D'Angelo Russell, along with Aaron Craft, the all-time steals and assist leader in Ohio State history. He also coached the 2010 National Player of the Year, Evan Turner, during his outstanding collegiate career with the Buckeyes.

Prior to Ohio State, Boals spent three seasons at Akron, serving as the team's recruiting coordinator and working with the post players. The Zips advanced to three Mid-American Conference championship games, winning the title in 2009. It was Akron's first NCAA Tournament berth since 1986. Boals also recruited Anthony "Humpty" Hitchens, a MAC All-Freshman Performer, and Zeke Marshall, a top-35 national recruit

Boals spent two seasons (2004-06) at Robert Morris and four years (1999-2003) at Marshall. In his final season at Robert Morris, the Colonials posted their first winning record in 15 seasons. He also spent a total of four seasons at Division II University of Charleston in two different stints.

A 1995 graduate of Ohio University, Boals was a two-time captain and four-year letterwinner for the Bobcats, who advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 1994. The following year, Ohio University won the Preseason NIT Championship after wins over Ohio State and No. 14 Virginia, as well as George Washington and New Mexico State at Madison Square Garden.

Boals and his wife, Katie, have two children, Sydney and Chase.

- The game saw five ties over a five-minute span late in the second half, but Stony Brook did not give up it's lead until Loyola's Chancellor Barnard hit a jumper to break the 62-all tie with 2:04 to play.
- The final two minutes saw six of the game's nine lead changes. Senior Kameron Mitchell drove the lane with seconds seven on the clock and was fouled. He hit both free throws to put the Seawolves up 70-69, but Loyola's Andre Walker went straight to the basket off the inbound and was able to get one to fall as the clock ran out.
