LEADING THE PACK

- Quarterback Reese Poffenbarger rolls into week nine leading the CAA in passing, completing 155-of-235 pass attempts for 2,052 yards. He has tossed 16 TDs over seven games. He averages 293.9 yards a game, completing six straight games with 250+ yards per game. Poffenbarger has been named CAA Rookie of the Week four times this season (9/19, 9/26, 10/3, and 10/17) and was once named the FedEx Ground FCS National Freshman Player of the Week.
- Todd Sibley ranks fifth in the conference in rushing. The graduate student is averaging 92.6 yards per game. He has rushed for eight TDs with one more coming through the air.
- Thomas Greaney ranks eighth in the league in receiving, averaging 5.3 receptions per game and 69.0 receiving yards per game. Against Villanova, he brought in two key TDs late in the game, recording six receptions for 42 yards.
- Dylan Kelly leads the team in tackles with 64.0 (36 solo, 28 asst) while Jackson Ambush follows closely behind with 61.0 (31 solo, 30 asst). For their efforts, both earned a ranking in the conference's top-10 in tackles.
- On special teams, Tyler Pastula is averaging 43.60 yards per punt (3rd in CAA). He recorded a season-high punt of 73 yards against Villanova. Kicker John Opalko is 6-9 on the season, hitting a long of 36 yards.

SCOUTING REPORT

In seven games this season, Stony Brook (1-6 overall, 1-4 conference) picked up its first win last week against Maine in a 28-27 nail biter. The Seawolves dropped their first two games against Rhode Island, losing 14-35, and UMass, 3-20. Against Richmond, Stony Brook took a 7-51 defeat, followed by a 10-27 loss to William & Mary. Before ending their losing streak, the Stony Brook football team had an additional two more losses to New Hampshire, falling 14-24, and Fordham, 14-45.

- Offensively, the Seawolves are falling to opponents averaging 12.86 points per game. In six games, the offense has totaled 1,959 yards or 279.9 per game. With 707 yards coming from the ground, most are coming from the air with 1,252 yards.
- On the defensive side of the ball, Stony Brook is allowing 32.71 points per game. Opponents are averaging over 2,800 yards of offense, with 953 coming from the ground and 1,902 coming through the air. The defense has recorded two interceptions and three fumble recoveries.

GOLDEN APPLE REFRESH

Dating back to 2015, the winner of Saturday's matchup will receive the 'Golden Apple' trophy. In that time, Stony Brook leads the series 4-3, taking the latest contest last season. UAlbany has picked up wins in 2016 (13-6 in Albany), 2018 (25-23 in Albany), and 2019 (31-26 at Stony Brook). During the Golden Apple era, the Great Danes have gone 2-1 at home and 1-3 on the road.

This year, the Golden Apple has a new look. Replacing the old trophy, the new design features a tall wooden base that holds the apple on top. Team logos cover the side, with the all-time series written across the front plate.

TEAM NOTES

New Look Offense

The UAlbany offense looks much different heading into the 2022 season. Jared Ambrose joins as the team's new Offensive Coordinator after most recently serving as the OC for CAA rival Delaware. While with the Blue Hens, Ambrose's offensive unit produced record-setting numbers on its way to a Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) Championship and FCS Semifinal appearance in 2020-21. Running back Dejoun Lee was selected as the CAA Offensive Player of the Year, the third that Ambrose has coached, and quarterback Nolan Henderson was one of the nation's most-efficient passers. Ambrose's offense that year ranked fifth in the nation and first in the CAA in time of possession.

Another new face joining Ambrose on the coaching staff is Wide Receivers Coach Kashif Moore. Moore was a four-year letter winner at the University of Connecticut where he was elected team captain as a senior and graduated while ranking in the top 10 in program history in receptions. He competed in three postseason games, including catching four passes for 62 yards against Oklahoma in the 2011 Tostitos Fiesta Bowl - the program's first-ever BCS Bowl game. He was invited to the 2011 NFL Combine and later signed contracts with Cincinnati, Indianapolis, Pittsburgh and Kansas City.

Moore and Ambrose will have plenty of new offensive weapons heading into the new year, including four potential starting quarterbacks, a new RB1 in Pitt transfer Todd Sibley, and a slew of new wide receivers to throw the ball to.

Putt Putt Quarterback Challenge

The Great Danes entered this year's training camp with a four-way battle for the starting quarterback job. Returning to the roster this year is sophomore signal caller Joey Carino and freshman Tyler Szalkowski. They are joined by transfers Reese Poffenbarger (Sophomore, Old Dominion) and Matt Valecce (Graduate, Boston College/Colorado State). All four took reps with the first team offense during camp. To decide the order in which they would get first team reps before the start of training camp, Head Coach Greg Gattuso took an unusual, but fair, approach – which included a golf putter. All four quarterbacks got a chance in the football coaches' office to sink a putt, with the two closest to the "pin" getting the first reps with the starting offense. The winners? Poffenbarger and Szalkowski.

Heading into the start of the season, Poffenbarger officially earned the title "QB1" after a strong showing at camp. Both Carino and Szalkowski are listed in the number two spot on the depth chart. However, Coach Gattuso clarified to the media that the starting quarterback position would be an open battle that could last a few weeks into the season.

Preseason Honors

UAlbany was picked to finish in 12th place in this year's CAA Preseason Coaches' Poll. The low mark comes as no surprise as the team comes off a year in which they went 2-9. The last time the Great Danes finished with a similar record was in 2018, when the team finished with a 3-8 mark. The next year though? The Great Danes went 9-5 overall and won their first ever postseason game, a 42-14 clobbering against CCSU.

Linebacker Jackson Ambush (Defense) and punter Tyler Pastula (Special Teams) both received preseason conference honors. In addition, defensive lineman Anthony Lang was named Honorable Mention. Ambush led the team in total tackles last season as a freshman. Pastula transferred from CAA foe Delaware, but not before being named All-CAA First Team and collecting two Special Teams Player of the Week awards in 2021.

Meet the Leadership Council

Every year, the UAlbany players and coaching staff elect a "Leadership Council" comprised of guys who show an extortionary level of leadership both on and off the field. This year's council is comprised of eight total student-athletes, five coming from the offensive side of the ball and three coming from the defensive side. Players on this year's council include offensive lineman Scott Houseman, quarterback Joey Carino, tight end Thomas Greaney, center Kobe Thomas, linebacker Jackson Ambush, linebacker AJ Mistler, running back Todd Sibley, and defensive back Larry Walker Jr.

Coach G Gets a New Deal

In late December, UAlbany Director of Athletics Mark Benson announced that Coach Gattuso had signed a contract extension through the 2024 season. Benson was quoted as saying "Greg has done a tremendous job guiding our football program to new heights during his tenure here. Although 2021 didn't produce the desired outcome we were hoping for, we have confidence in coach Gattuso leading the team moving forward." In 2019 under Gattuso, the Great Danes saw record-breaking performances en route to a 9-5 overall record and their first-ever FCS playoff game, a 42-14 win over Central Connecticut. Gattuso was named the 2019 CAA Coach of the Year and was also a finalist for the STATS Eddie Robinson Award, presented to the top head coach in FCS Football, for his efforts in making the Great Danes one of the nation's top contenders. When asked on the subject, Gattuso added "I'm very thankful to President Havidán Rodríguez and Mark Benson for this contract extension and the opportunity to continue to build this football program to be a top contender in the CAA. Mark and I talked about this after 2019, one of the best seasons in this program's history, and I'm glad we could get it done so now we can continue our focus on 2022."

Around the CAA

Monday, five CAA football teams were nationally ranked in the latest Stats Perform and AFCA Coaches FCS Top 25 polls. The CAA's five ranked teams were tied with the Big Sky for the most of any conference. William & Mary (6-1) edged up to No. 10 in the Stats Perform poll and No. 12 in the AFCA Coaches poll after picking up a 44-24 road win at Towson last Saturday. The Tribe, which is 4-0 on the road, returns home to face nationally ranked Rhode Island this week. Delaware (6-1) rose to No. 11 in the AFCA poll and No. 12 in the Stats poll after rolling past Morgan State, 34-7, last week. The Blue Hens face a tough road test at Elon this Saturday. Richmond (5-2) climbed to No. 17 in the Stats poll and No. 20 in the AFCA rankings following a 41-10 triumph at Hampton last week. The Spiders hit the road again on Saturday with a trip to Maine. Rhode Island (5-2) moved up No. 17 in the AFCA poll and No. 18 in the Stats Perform rankings after outlasting Monmouth, 48-46 in seven overtimes last Saturday. The Rams travel to nationally ranked William & Mary this week. New Hampshire (6-2) vaulted to No. 19 in the Stats poll and entered the AFCA poll at No. 25 following a 40-22 victory over nationally ranked Elon last Saturday. The Wildcats, who sit atop the CAA standings at 5-0, are off this week. Villanova (4-3) and Elon (5-3) were among others receiving votes in both polls.

GREG GATTUSO - NINTH SEASON AT UALBANY



Greg Gattuso enters his ninth season at the helm of the UAlbany football program in 2022.

A former standout defensive lineman at Penn State who's worked at Duquesne, Pittsburgh and Maryland, Gattuso has led the Great Danes through six seasons in the Colonial Athletic Association, one of the top Football Championship Subdivision conferences in the nation.

The 2019 season saw the Great Danes win nine games, including their first-ever FCS playoff game, at home against Central Connecticut State. The Danes went 9-5 overall, including 6-2 in the CAA to finish second after being picked 11th in the preseason coaches' poll. The 2019 team featured six All-CAA selections and two major awards, including Offensive Rookie of the Year Jeff Undercuffler, with Gattuso landing CAA Coach of the Year honors. Gattuso was also a finalist for the STATS Eddie Robinson Award, presented annually to the top head coach in FCS football.

The 2019 team saw record-breaking performances from redshirt-freshman quarterback Jeff Undercuffler, who led the FCS with 41 passing touchdowns. Undercuffler also set single-season program records for passing yards, attempts, and completions, and single-game program records for passing touchdowns, yards, attempts, and completions. Senior wide receiver Juwan Green set single-season records for receptions, receiving yards, and led the FCS with 17 touchdown receptions. Redshirt-senior defensive end Eli Mencer set a single-season program record with 14.5 sacks. All three players landed several postseason awards, including All-America honors.

The 2018 season included a win over No. 10 Stony Brook in the season finale. The Great Danes played one of the most difficult schedules in the nation, with four games against ranked teams and a season-opening game against Pitt, of the Atlantic Coast Conference.

In 2017, he led the Great Danes to their first win over a Top 10 program -- a 19-10 overtime victory over No. 7 Villanova at Tom & Mary Casey Stadium. UAlbany also shut out New Hampshire, an FCS playoff qualifier, 15-0 in the season finale. It was one of several superlative efforts from a defense that finished the season ranked No. 9 nationally. The Great Danes were 4-7 overall and 2-6 in the CAA against a rigorous schedule that featured games against an FBS opponent (Old Dominion) and five matchups with Top 25 teams.

Under Gattuso's leadership, UAlbany had its best season as a CAA member in 2016, finishing 7-4 overall and 4-4 in the league. The Great Danes were ranked for five weeks, including as high as No. 16. UAlbany also earned its first victory over an FBS opponent with a 22-16 road win over Buffalo.

Hallmarks of Gattuso's teams have included discipline and taking care of the football. In 2016, the Great Danes were second in the CAA with a plus-16 turnover margin.

In his first season, in 2014, Gattuso led the Great Danes to a six-win turnaround from the previous year. The Great Danes picked up votes in the national polls for 10 straight weeks and appeared in The Sports Network Top 25 four times on their way to a 7-5 overall record and 3-5 CAA mark.

A year later, the Danes earned CAA victories over Rhode Island and perennial power Delaware.

Gattuso was a defensive lineman at Penn State, where he helped lead the Nittany Lions to a national title in 1982. In his first collegiate head-coaching role, Gattuso piloted Duquesne to a 97-32 record during his 12-season tenure, and while making three bowl appearances at Pittsburgh, he turned the defensive line into one of the best in the nation as an assistant head coach.

Gattuso came to UAlbany after spending three seasons as a member Randy Edsall's staff at Maryland. There, he led the defensive line that ranked among the top in the ACC and was promoted to the position of assistant head coach in February 2012.

From 1989-1991, he served as head coach at his high school alma mater, Seton-LaSalle. Taking over a team that went 6-34 during the four seasons prior to his arrival, Gattuso led the Rebels to a 28-10-1 mark (.731), including three WPIAL playoff berths, a WPIAL championship and Parkway Conference title.

During his playing career, Gattuso was named the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette's Class AA Player of the Year his senior season at Seton-LaSalle.

Gattuso and his wife Colleen have two daughters, Jacqueline and Kaitlin.

- The Great Danes have seen 18 players sign NFL contracts. In 2019, WR Juwan Green, DL/LB Eli Mencer, and DB Jarren Williams signed undrafted free agent deals. Williams made his NFL debut for the New York Giants on December 13, 2020, recording one tackle on special teams.
- UAlbany also has several NFL connections on its coaching staff:
 - Associate Head Coach **Nate Byham** was a sixth-round pick in the 2010 Draft by the San Francisco 49ers. He played in 29 NFL games, playing 14 games, including three starts, with the 49ers before signing with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers for 2012 and 2013.
 - Wide Receivers Coach **Kashif Moore** has previously signed NFL contracts with signed contracts with Cincinnati, Indianapolis, Pittsburgh and Kansas City.
 - Cornerbacks Coach **Darrin Walls** was a 2011 undrafted free agent signed by the Atlanta Falcons. He also spent time with the New York Jets and Detroit Lions.

ABOUT UALBANY ATHLETICS

The University at Albany is a member of the America East Conference in 16 of 18 varsity sports, while women's golf is an associate member of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC), and football, a Division I Football Championship Subdivision program, is an associate member of the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA). UAlbany has earned the Stuart P. Haskell Jr. Commissioner's Cup, which honors the America East's top-performing athletics department, eight times overall, including six-straight years from 2013-2018.

UAlbany has won 124 conference championships and has made 57 NCAA Tournament appearances since moving to Division I in 1999. Proving to be a perennial power, the Great Danes won seven or more conference titles nine years in a row from 2010-2019. UAlbany claimed its 100th conference title on May 14, 2017, when softball won the America East Tournament. Entering the 2020-21 school year, UAlbany has 115 America East Tournament titles, six Northeast Conference (NEC) season titles in football, and three MAAC titles in women's golf.

Throughout its Division I history, UAlbany has had 20 players selected in the Major League Lacrosse Draft, nine players drafted by Major League Baseball, and 18 sign NFL contracts. The Division I era has also produced UAlbany's first female Olympian, Grace Claxton, a semifinalist in the 400m-hurdles at the Rio 2016 Games competing for Puerto Rico.

UAlbany's more than 400 student-athletes strive every day to be Great Leaders, Great Champions, and Great Danes.
