THIS WEEK'S GAME

On Homecoming Weekend in Latrobe, Saint Vincent welcomes Allegheny College to Chuck Noll Field. The Bearcats are searching for their first win of the young campaign, after falling 38-0 at two-time defending Presidents' Athletic Conference champion Carnegie Mellon, ranked No. 15 in the most recent D3football.com national poll. The Tartans jumped out to a 14-0 lead midway through the first quarter and the Bearcats were unable to recover. CMU's heralded defense held the SVC offense at bay, forcing four Bearcat turnovers and limiting its guests to just 164 yards of total offense and a 2-for-13 showing on third downs... After earning a 39-36 overtime win at Waynesburg in its season-opener, Allegheny was edged by Geneva last week, 27-21. Through the first two games of new head coach Braden Layer's tenure, the Gators boast the PAC's second most prolific offense, averaging 412 yards per game.

BEARCAT BRIEFS

IT'S BEEN A WHILE

Allegheny College and Saint Vincent College are two of the oldest institutions in the Presidents' Athletic Conference, with the former founded in 1815 and the latter 1846. Both institutions also have a long history of football, with Allegheny first fielding a team in 1893 and Saint Vincent in 1923. However, this week marks just the third time the two schools will meet on the gridiron, and just the second time the Gators will have traveled to Latrobe. The two teams first met in the 1929 season finale, with Allegheny winning 28-6 at Saint Vincent. Ninety-three years would pass before the two teams would meet again, as in week seven of last season, Saint Vincent won a 52-35 shootout in Meadville.

WILEY GOES WILD

In last week's defeat at Carnegie Mellon, junior middle linebacker Wiley Purry led both sides with 14 tackles, the most in a game for a Bearcat since Caleb Collins also recorded 14 stops on Nov. 3, 2018, vs. W&J. Through the first two weeks of the season, Purry has accumulated 25 tackles to lead the Presidents' Athletic Conference.

HOMECOMING HIJINKS

Saint Vincent celebrates Homecoming this week, and the Bearcats look to continue their recent success on the big day. Saint Vincent has won each of its past two Homecoming matchups, and three of its past four. On Sept. 17 of last season, the Bearcats defeated Thiel, 24-16, while on Oct. 2, 2021, SVC rallied for a dramatic 42-40 Homecoming win over Case Western Reserve. The Bearcats fell to Geneva on Homecoming 2019, but in 2018, they again defeated Thiel, 35-13.

HE DOES IT ALL

Saint Vincent's Kyle Murray has been a busy guy through the first two weeks of the 2023 season. The sophomore has been a full-time starter at safety for the Bearcat defense, and ranks second on the team, and 10th in the Presidents' Athletic Conference, with 15 tackles. Murray is also the team's primary punter and averages 37.4 yards on 12 boots, which ranks in the top-five in the PAC. A two-sport athlete at Saint Vincent, Murray earned All-Presidents' Athletic Conference accolades in men's tennis in the spring after tallying a 10-2 record in singles play.

CAPTAIN 'CATS

Per a vote of their teammates, the 2023 Saint Vincent College football team co-captains include senior defensive tackle Jake Beistel, senior receiver Molayo Irefin, senior quarterback Austin Slye, senior linebacker Nate Sullivan, senior receiver Kaelib McElroy, and junior linebacker Wiley Purry.

ON THE MAP

Nine different states are represented on the Bearcats' 2023 roster, with 59 players hailing from Pennsylvania, 16 from Florida, 14 from Maryland, six from Virginia, three from Ohio, two from South Carolina, and one apiece from California, New Jersey and New York.

UP NEXT

After today's game, Saint Vincent will head into its bye week, before traveling to Beaver Falls to take on longtime PAC rival Geneva College under the lights at 7 p.m. on Saturday, Sept. 30. The Bearcats won't be back at Chuck Noll Field until Oct. 7, when they welcome Case Western Reserve.

SAINT VINCENT VS. ALLEGHENY - LAST MEETING

MEADVILLE, Pa. (Oct. 22, 2022) — Senior quarterback Brady Walker tied a career high with five touchdown passes to lead Saint Vincent to a 52-35 victory in an offensive shootout at Allegheny College.

With their second straight victory, the Bearcats improved to 3-2 in the Presidents' Athletic Conference and 3-4 overall, while the Gators dropped to 1-4 in the PAC and 2-5 overall.

Behind Walker's 315 passing yards, the Bearcats recorded a season-high 439 yards of total offense and amassed 28 first downs.

Molayo Irefin was one of five Bearcats to record touchdown receptions in the win, while he led the squad with nine receptions for 103 yards. Wayne Corbin Jr., Ja'Tier Berkley, Ryan Whitman and Jeffrey Downs II also made touchdown grabs for SVC.

D.J. Gray Jr. ran for a team-high 75 yards on 13 carries, while Berkley ran nine times for 43 yards and Max Pisula ran for a pair of touchdowns for the second time this season.

Saint Vincent out-gained Allegheny 439-366 in total offense, with the Bearcats averaging 6.8 yards per play and holding a decisive edge in time of possession, 32:24 – 27:26. The Bearcats went 6-for-11 on third down conversions.

Walker turned in just the fourth five-touchdown performance in program history and the second of his career, having previously done so on Apr 17, 2021, in a win over Waynesburg. The Allegheny contest also marked Walker's fifth career 300-yard passing performance, and Irefin's seventh career 100-yard receiving effort.

Derius May paced the SVC offense with 10 tackles, including 2.0 for loss and a sack. Joanes Polynice finished with eight tackles and 1.0 TFL, while Desonio Powell and Caleb Green teamed up for a sack and Ethan Facey picked up his second interception of the season. In all, seven different SVC players were credited with at least a half tackle for loss.

Tre Worship paced the Allegheny offense, rushing 32 times for 135 yards and two touchdowns. Jack Johnson completed 14 of 33 pass attempts for 170 yards and one touchdown, caught by Declan O'Brien, who finished with a team-high five catches for 67 yards. Hudson Alread led Allegheny with eight tackles.

SAINT VINCENT - LAST TIME OUT

PITTSBURGH, Pa. (Sept. 9) — The Saint Vincent football team dropped its first road bout of the 2023 season, falling 38-0 at Carnegie Mellon, ranked 17th in the most recent D3Football.com national poll.

The Tartans (2-0) jumped out to a 14-0 lead midway through the first quarter and the Bearcats (0-2) were unable to recover. Carnegie Mellon's heralded defense held the SVC offense at bay, forcing four Bearcat turnovers and limiting its guests to just 164 yards of total offense and a 2-for-13 showing on third downs.

Saint Vincent quarterback Austin Slye completed 14 of 28 passes for 130 yards, while he also led the SVC ground game with 28 yards on seven carries. The receiving corps was led by Wayne Corbin Jr., who caught four passes for 33 yards; Matt Esdelle, who made three grabs for 34 yards, and Keegan O'Brien's two catches for 34 yards.

Defensively, junior linebacker Wiley Purry led both sides with 14 tackles, while Evan Brozenich made 11 stops and broke up two passes. Max Pisula and Kyle Murray each had six tackles, while KeShawn Davis made five stops, including a 7-yard sack.

AARON SMETANKA HEAD COACH

Fifth Season Saint Vincent, 2012

A standout quarterback for the Bearcats during his playing days, Aaron Smetanka was hired as the third head coach in the Saint Vincent College football team's modern era on Dec. 5, 2018. He completed his fourth season as head coach in 2022, and holds a 15-20 career record.

In 2022, the Bearcats finished 5-5 overall and 5-3 in the Presidents' Athletic Conference, with the five conference wins the team's most since 2011. The Bearcats scored 37 touchdowns and averaged 28.6 points per game, both third best in the PAC. Eight Saint Vincent players earned All-PAC accolades, highlighted by junior receiver/return specialist Molayo Irefin. Irefin, who led the PAC in kick return (27.2) and punt return (15.9) average, recorded the longest punt return in the team's modern era with an 85-yard touchdown in the season-opener against Stevenson, before posting a 100-yard kick return touchdown in a week nine victory over Waynesburg. Irefin also ranked second in the PAC in receptions (62) and touchdown receptions (8) and third in receiving yards (732). Along with his All-PAC honor, Irefin was also named First Team All-Region and Third Team All-America by D3football.com, becoming the first SVC football All-American since 1960. Quarterback Brady Walker led the PAC with 21 touchdown passes and 165 completions, while ranking third with 2,015 passing yards. Defensively, cornerback Ahmad Shaw was named Second Team All-PAC after picking off a team-high four interceptions.

In 2021, Smetanka led the Bearcats to just their second postseason appearance since the team's 2007 rebirth, as they took part in the ECAC James Lynah Bowl. The Bearcats closed the season with five wins, tied for the second most in the team's modern era. The Bearcat offense scored 30 or more points in five different games and averaged 361.3 yards per game to rank fourth in the Presidents' Athletic Conference. The Bearcat defense also ranked in the top five in the PAC in yards allowed, while their 18 interceptions ranked second in the conference and 16th in NCAA Division III.

Walker threw for 2,721 yards and 22 touchdowns in 2021, finishing his junior season as the team's all-time record holder in career touchdown passes (37) and passing yards (4,200). Irefin set a program record with 919 receiving yards and ranked second in the PAC in receptions (68), while he led the PAC in kick return average (23.5 yards) and all-purpose yards (174.90/gm), which ranked fifth nationally.

Defensively, graduate student Cam Norris recorded 7.0 quarterback sacks and 12.5 tackles for loss, while junior Ahmad Shaw and rookie Marvelle Cromerdie each intercepted three passes. Walker, Irefin and Norris were among a seven Bearcats who earned All-PAC honors, while safety Kyle Coombe, who recorded 51 tackles and three interceptions, was named First Team CoSIDA Academic All-DistrictTM.

In 2021, Smetanka guided the Bearcats to a 2-2 record during an abbreviated 2020-21 season that was played in the spring due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Over the four games, punctuated by a 35-6 victory over Bethany in week two and a 56-26 home win in the season finale against Waynesburg, the Bearcats ranked third in the Presidents' Athletic Conference in both scoring offense (29.8 points/gm) and total offense (382.5 yards/gm). Defensively, the Bearcats' allowed just a 44.4 percent conversion rate on third down, ranking second in the PAC, while they finished fourth in the league with six quarterback sacks.

Individually, 10 players earned All-PAC honors, highlighted by center Colton Belmont's First Team selection and Second Team picks Mike Stasko (RB), David Marshall (RB), Cam Norris (OLB) and Jared Gonzalez (P). Belmont was also recognized with All-Region honors by D3Football.com, while Stasko rolled up 370 rushing yards and four touchdowns to end his career as the Bearcats' modern era all-time leading rusher with 1,877 yards.

In 2019, Smetanka's first year at the helm, the Bearcats recovered from an 0-4 start to win three of their final six games. He recorded his first victory on Oct. 12 with a 41-18 decision at PAC rival Thiel, while the Bearcats ended the season on a high note with a 27-10 home win over Bethany College.

Seven SVC players were honored with All-PAC recognition following the conclusion of the 2019 team, including First Team selection Christian Witchey (punter) and Second-Teamers Belmont and Stasko. Stasko set new team records with 907 rushing yards and 10 touchdowns, while linebacker Izaak Gray recorded six quarterback sacks to graduate as the team's

all-time career leader with 16.5 OB takedowns.

Smetanka rewrote the record books during his career as the Bearcats' quarterback, before going on to play professionally for the Erie Explosion of the Continental Indoor Football League. Smetanka's coaching career began in 2012, and it includes a three-year stint as an assistant at Saint Vincent, while he served as head coach at Greensburg Central Catholic High School in 2017 and 2018.

A two-year starter under center for the Bearcats (2010-11), Smetanka ranks among the program's modernday career record-holders in passing yards (4,117), attempts (536), completions (331), and touchdown passes (31). Voted the team's offensive most valuable player in both 2010 and 2011, Smetanka was also a First Team All-Presidents' Athletic Conference selection in each season. As a senior and team co-captain in 2011, Smetanka led the Bearcats to their most successful season since the team's rebirth, as they went 6-4 in the regular season and qualified for the Eastern College Athletic Conference's Southwest Bowl. In 2014, Smetanka was named to the PAC's 60th Anniversary All-Time Team, which recognized the top football players in the conference's long history.

After graduating from SVC, Smetanka began his coaching career as the quarterback coach at Peters Township High School for the 2012 season. Following a one-year stint, he returned to his alma mater to join the Bearcat coaching staff as quarterback coach, a position he held for three seasons. Smetanka held a variety of responsibilities in this role, as in addition to coaching the team's quarterbacks, he was heavily involved in recruiting, scouting, and breakdown of game film, while also providing positive guidance and mentorship to the Bearcat players.

During his first stint on the Saint Vincent staff, Smetanka also starred under center for the Erie Explosion from 2013-14. As a rookie in 2013, he guided the team to a perfect 10-0 record and the CIFL title. A year later, Smetanka was named the Continental Indoor Football League's Offensive Player of the Year, leading the Explosion to a 9-2 record and their second consecutive league championship.

After spending the 2016 season on the staff at Chartiers Valley High School as passing game coordinator and quarterback coach, Smetanka was named the head coach of Greensburg Central Catholic in January 2017. He oversaw all aspects of the Centurion football program, as in addition to his head coaching role, he coordinated both the offense and special teams, while also serving as quarterback coach, strength and conditioning coach and equipment manager. During his time at GCC, a total of 21 Centurions were named all-conference.

In addition to his coaching experience, Smetanka has been a coach and speaker for the Coaching Boys into Men program for the past two years, an initiative aimed at promoting healthy relationships, building leadership skills and decreasing violence among high school boys. Smetanka was chosen as a featured speaker at the 2018 Coaching Boys into Men Summit, and was named the national MVP Coach of the Year, earning recognition from the United Way in its 2018 annual report.

A native of Allison Park, Pennsylvania, and graduate of North Catholic High School, Smetanka earned a bachelor's degree in business management from Saint Vincent's Alex G. McKenna School of Business, Economics and Government. He and wife Courtney are the proud parents of son Carter and daughter Kennedy.
