THIS WEEK'S GAME

Coming off of its bye week, Saint Vincent will take on Geneva College under the lights this Saturday. It will mark the Bearcats' first trip to Beaver Falls since week two of the 2018 season. The Bearcats most recently were in action on Sept. 16, when they claimed their first win of the season, 23–19, over Allegheny College at Chuck Noll Field. The Bearcat defense limited the Gators to just 194 yards of total offense, while Max Pisula ran for a pair of touchdowns... Geneva, 1-2 heading into this week's matchup, is coming off of a 42-7 loss at Case Western Reserve. The Golden Tornadoes trailed just 14-7 midway through the second quarter, before the Spartans scored 28 unanswered points. With their vaunted triple option offense, the GT's average 200.3 rushing yards per game, the second-best mark in the PAC... Geneva holds a 16-13-1 record in the all-time series, as Saint Vincent snapped a three-game losing skid against the GT's with last year's 41-25 win in week six.

BEARCAT BRIEFS

IT'S BEEN A WHILE

This week marks the 31st all-time meeting between the Bearcats and Golden Tornadoes, as Geneva is SVC's second-most frequent for on the gridiron behind only Waynesburg (41 previous meetings), though this will be Saint Vincent's first trip to Beaver Falls since Sept. 8, 2019, a 31-27 Geneva win. In 2019, Saint Vincent hosted Geneva on Homecoming at Chuck Noll Field, before the two teams did not play during the abbreviated spring 2021 COVID season. The Bearcats hosted the Golden Tornadoes in each of the past two seasons.

A SPECIAL PERFORMANCE

Saint Vincent sophomore punter Kyle Murray was named both the Presidents' Athletic Conference Special Teams Player of the Week and to the D3Football.com Team of the Week following his week three performance in the win over Allegheny. Murray averaged 35.5 yards on four punts, placing three inside the Allegheny 10-yard line. His biggest kick came with 53 seconds left in the fourth quarter with Saint Vincent clinging to a 4-point lead, as Murray sent a 44-yarder that was downed at the Allegheny 4-yard line, effectively sealing the win. Earlier in the game, he also had a 48-yard boot downed at the Allegheny one. Murray enters this week ranked fourth in the PAC with an average of 36.8 yards per punt, while the Bearcats top the conference in net punting with an average of 34.5 yards.

HELD IN CHECK

In the week three win over Allegheny, the Saint Vincent defense yielded only 194 total yards (60 rushing/134 passing) and 11 first downs to a Gators squad that was averaging 412.3 yards entering the contest. It marked just the second time since the beginning of the 2022 campaign that the Bearcats surrendered fewer than 200 yards of total offense, as Bethany totaled 190 in last year's season finale on Nov. 12, 2022. Allegheny's 60 rushing yards were the fewest amassed against an SVC defense since holding Bethany to a team-record -20 in a 52-7 win on Nov. 13, 2021.

MAGIC MARTIN

In the win over Allegheny, Saint Vincent freshman Ty Martin led both sides with a career-high 96 rushing yards on 15 carries, good for an average of 6.4 per pop. Through his first three career games, Martin leads the Bearcats with 155 rushing yards, and averages 5.5 yards per carry, the third-highest average in the PAC among players with at least 20 carries. Martin owns Saint Vincent's two longest rushes this season, with a 30-yard run in the season-opener against W&J and another 30-yarder in the win over Allegheny.

MAD MAX

Saint Vincent senior defensive lineman Max Pisula recorded a tackle for loss and forced fumble in the win over Allegheny, while he also ran for two touchdowns, the first two rushing scores of the season for the Bearcats. It marked Pisula's third two-touchdown performance of his career, after doing so last season against both Case Western Reserve (Oct. 8) and Allegheny (Oct. 22). On just 19 career carries, Pisula now has eight rushing touchdowns, tied with Mike Kale (2008-11) for the fourth-most in the Bearcats' modern era (2007-present).

ON THE CLOCK

Saint Vincent had a time of possession of 36:11 in the week three win over Allegheny, a season-high and just the third time in three seasons in which SVC held the ball for more than 35 minutes. The team is 3-0 in such instances, which include a 52-7 win over Bethany on Nov. 13, 2021, and a 34-14 victory at Bluffton on Sept. 11, 2021.

UP NEXT

Saint Vincent will return home for the first time in three weeks next week (Oct. 7) to welcome Case Western Reserve to Chuck Noll Field. The last time the Spartans visited Latrobe, the Bearcats pulled out a dramatic 42-40 Homecoming win on Oct. 2, 2021.

SAINT VINCENT - LAST TIME OUT

LATROBE, Pa. (Sept. 16) - The Saint Vincent football team received big plays in all three phases of the game in its 23-19 victory over Allegheny College on Homecoming at Chuck Noll Field.

The Saint Vincent defense limited Allegheny to just 194 yards of total offense, while the Bearcat offense possessed the ball for more than 38 minutes and amassed a season-high 324 yards.

The special teams unit also came up big on a number of occasions. In the first quarter, after an SVC field goal was blocked and returned for an Allegheny touchdown, the Bearcats' Ahmad Shaw blocked the ensuing extra point attempt, which was raced 98 yards into the end zone for SVC's first two points of the day. In the fourth quarter, with under a minute left and clinging to the 4-point lead, punter Kyle Murray pinned the Gators inside their own 5-yard line to effectively seal the win. It was one of two punts by Murray on the day that landed inside the 10.

Rookie Ty Martin paced the Saint Vincent offense, rushing 15 times for a career-high 96 yards, while classmate Gino Caesar gained 43 yards on nine tries and Max Pisula ran for two touchdowns out of the Wildcat. Quarterback Austin Slye turned in an efficient performance under center, completing 16 of 26 passes for 164 yards and a touchdown to Kaelib McElroy, who made five grabs for 74 yards.

Defensively, Dwight Collins Jr. led the Barcats with 10 tackles and Wiley Purry nine, while Collins, Josiah Weyandt, Payton Hrehovchak and Andrew Gelin all recording quarterback sacks.

SAINT VINCENT VS. GENEVA - LAST MEETING

LATROBE, Pa. (Oct. 15, 2022) - Saint Vincent used a balanced offense and opportunistic defense to earn a 41-25 victory over Presidents' Athletic Conference foe Geneva College at Chuck Noll Field.

The Bearcats (2-4, 2-2 PAC) amassed a season-high 410 yards of total offense, while the SVC defense forced four Geneva (1-5, 1-3 PAC) turnovers, as Saint Vincent earned its first victory over Geneva since 2017.

Through the air, Brady Walker completed 16 passes for 221 yards and a touchdown. Seven different receivers made at least one catch, with Molayo Irefin, Nick Domico and Ryan Whitman each securing touchdown grabs. On the ground, D.J. Gray Jr. ran for 93 yards and Ja'Tier Berkley 92 yards and a score, while Walker recorded his first rushing touchdown of the campaign.

While the Bearcat offense turned in an impressive showing in producing its highest scoring output of the season, the SVC defense was just as impressive. The Bearcats recovered three Geneva fumbles, including a fourth quarter fumble return touchdown by Joanes Polynice. Ahmad Shaw recorded his second interception of the season, while the Bearcat held the vaunted Golden Tornadoes rushing attack to 67 yards below its season average.

May led the SVC defense with eight tackles, with Polynice and Caleb Green finishing with seven apiece.

For Geneva, Brutus Ogilvie completed 10 of 13 passes for 235 yards, with Hilton McClain recording 161 receiving yards on three grabs. Josh Syster ran for a game-high 139 yards on 27 carries. Gabe Trexler totaled a game-high 11 tackles, while Ray Richard made five tackles, including three for loss.

AARON SMETANKA HEAD COACH

Fifth Season Saint Vincent, 2012

A standout quarterback for the Bearcats during his playing days, Aaron Smetanka was hired as the third head coach in the Saint Vincent College football team's modern era on Dec. 5, 2018. He completed his fourth season as head coach in 2022, and holds a 15-20 career record.

In 2022, the Bearcats finished 5-5 overall and 5-3 in the Presidents' Athletic Conference, with the five conference wins the team's most since 2011. The Bearcats scored 37 touchdowns and averaged 28.6 points per game, both third best in the PAC. Eight Saint Vincent players earned All-PAC accolades, highlighted by junior receiver/return specialist Molayo Irefin. Irefin, who led the PAC in kick return (27.2) and punt return (15.9) average, recorded the longest punt return in the team's modern era with an 85-yard touchdown in the season-opener against Stevenson, before posting a 100-yard kick return touchdown in a week nine victory over Waynesburg. Irefin also ranked second in the PAC in receptions (62) and touchdown receptions (8) and third in receiving yards (732). Along with his All-PAC honor, Irefin was also named First Team All-Region and Third Team All-America by D3football.com, becoming the first SVC football All-American since 1960. Quarterback Brady Walker led the PAC with 21 touchdown passes and 165 completions, while ranking third with 2,015 passing yards. Defensively, cornerback Ahmad Shaw was named Second Team All-PAC after picking off a team-high four interceptions.

In 2021, Smetanka led the Bearcats to just their second postseason appearance since the team's 2007 rebirth, as they took part in the ECAC James Lynah Bowl. The Bearcats closed the season with five wins, tied for the second most in the team's modern era. The Bearcat offense scored 30 or more points in five different games and averaged 361.3 yards per game to rank fourth in the Presidents' Athletic Conference. The Bearcat defense also ranked in the top five in the PAC in yards allowed, while their 18 interceptions ranked second in the conference and 16th in NCAA Division III.

Walker threw for 2,721 yards and 22 touchdowns in 2021, finishing his junior season as the team's all-time record holder in career touchdown passes (37) and passing yards (4,200). Irefin set a program record with 919 receiving yards and ranked second in the PAC in receptions (68), while he led the PAC in kick return average (23.5 yards) and all-purpose yards (174.90/gm), which ranked fifth nationally.

Defensively, graduate student Cam Norris recorded 7.0 quarterback sacks and 12.5 tackles for loss, while junior Ahmad Shaw and rookie Marvelle Cromerdie each intercepted three passes. Walker, Irefin and Norris were among a seven Bearcats who earned All-PAC honors, while safety Kyle Coombe, who recorded 51 tackles and three interceptions, was named First Team CoSIDA Academic All-DistrictTM.

In 2021, Smetanka guided the Bearcats to a 2-2 record during an abbreviated 2020-21 season that was played in the spring due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Over the four games, punctuated by a 35-6 victory over Bethany in week two and a 56-26 home win in the season finale against Waynesburg, the Bearcats ranked third in the Presidents' Athletic Conference in both scoring offense (29.8 points/gm) and total offense (382.5 yards/gm). Defensively, the Bearcats' allowed just a 44.4 percent conversion rate on third down, ranking second in the PAC, while they finished fourth in the league with six quarterback sacks.

Individually, 10 players earned All-PAC honors, highlighted by center Colton Belmont's First Team selection and Second Team picks Mike Stasko (RB), David Marshall (RB), Cam Norris (OLB) and Jared Gonzalez (P). Belmont was also recognized with All-Region honors by D3Football.com, while Stasko rolled up 370 rushing yards and four touchdowns to end his career as the Bearcats' modern era all-time leading rusher with 1,877 yards.

In 2019, Smetanka's first year at the helm, the Bearcats recovered from an 0-4 start to win three of their final six games. He recorded his first victory on Oct. 12 with a 41-18 decision at PAC rival Thiel, while the Bearcats ended the season on a high note with a 27-10 home win over Bethany College.

Seven SVC players were honored with All-PAC recognition following the conclusion of the 2019 team, including First Team selection Christian Witchey (punter) and Second-Teamers Belmont and Stasko. Stasko set new team records with 907 rushing yards and 10 touchdowns, while linebacker Izaak Gray recorded six guarterback sacks to graduate as the team's

all-time career leader with 16.5 QB takedowns.

Smetanka rewrote the record books during his career as the Bearcats' quarterback, before going on to play professionally for the Erie Explosion of the Continental Indoor Football League. Smetanka's coaching career began in 2012, and it includes a three-year stint as an assistant at Saint Vincent, while he served as head coach at Greensburg Central Catholic High School in 2017 and 2018.

A two-year starter under center for the Bearcats (2010-11), Smetanka ranks among the program's modernday career record-holders in passing yards (4,117), attempts (536), completions (331), and touchdown passes (31). Voted the team's offensive most valuable player in both 2010 and 2011, Smetanka was also a First Team All-Presidents' Athletic Conference selection in each season. As a senior and team co-captain in 2011, Smetanka led the Bearcats to their most successful season since the team's rebirth, as they went 6-4 in the regular season and qualified for the Eastern College Athletic Conference's Southwest Bowl. In 2014, Smetanka was named to the PAC's 60th Anniversary All-Time Team, which recognized the top football players in the conference's long history.


After graduating from SVC, Smetanka began his coaching career as the quarterback coach at Peters Township High School for the 2012 season. Following a one-year stint, he returned to his alma mater to join the Bearcat coaching staff as quarterback coach, a position he held for three seasons. Smetanka held a variety of responsibilities in this role, as in addition to coaching the team's quarterbacks, he was heavily involved in recruiting, scouting, and breakdown of game film, while also providing positive guidance and mentorship to the Bearcat players.

During his first stint on the Saint Vincent staff, Smetanka also starred under center for the Erie Explosion from 2013-14. As a rookie in 2013, he guided the team to a perfect 10-0 record and the CIFL title. A year later, Smetanka was named the Continental Indoor Football League's Offensive Player of the Year, leading the Explosion to a 9-2 record and their second consecutive league championship.

After spending the 2016 season on the staff at Chartiers Valley High School as passing game coordinator and quarterback coach, Smetanka was named the head coach of Greensburg Central Catholic in January 2017. He oversaw all aspects of the Centurion football program, as in addition to his head coaching role, he coordinated both the offense and special teams, while also serving as quarterback coach, strength and conditioning coach and equipment manager. During his time at GCC, a total of 21 Centurions were named all-conference.

In addition to his coaching experience, Smetanka has been a coach and speaker for the Coaching Boys into Men program for the past two years, an initiative aimed at promoting healthy relationships, building leadership skills and decreasing violence among high school boys. Smetanka was chosen as a featured speaker at the 2018 Coaching Boys into Men Summit, and was named the national MVP Coach of the Year, earning recognition from the United Way in its 2018 annual report.

A native of Allison Park, Pennsylvania, and graduate of North Catholic High School, Smetanka earned a bachelor's degree in business management from Saint Vincent's Alex G. McKenna School of Business, Economics and Government. He and wife Courtney are the proud parents of son Carter and daughter Kennedy.
