THIS WEEK'S GAME

Saint Vincent's first road game of the 2023 season will be a tough test, as the Bearcats travel to Pittsburgh to face two-time defending Presidents' Athletic Conference champion Carnegie Mellon, ranked No. 17 in the most recent D3football.com national poll. The Bearcats look to bounce back from a 51-0 season-opening loss to Washington & Jefferson, a game in which the Presidents scored 41 second-half points and outgained the Bearcats 574-139 in total offense... Last week, Carnegie Mellon won its 17th consecutive regular season game with a 31-0 shutout at Geneva. Leading just 3-0 at halftime, the Tartans scored four second-half touchdowns and out-gained the Golden Tornadoes 202-78 over the final two quarters... The Tartans have won five straight over the Bearcats, with SVC's last win in the series coming in 2014. All-time, Saint Vincent is 5-11-1 against Carnegie Mellon.

BEARCAT BRIEFS

A BUSY GUY: In Saint Vincent's opener against Washington & Jefferson, sophomore safety Kyle Murray played a big role on both defense and special teams. Murray recorded a career-high nine tackles, including seven solo, while he also averaged 38.0 yards on seven punts, including a career-long 66-yard boot in the second quarter.

THE STREAK GOES ON: In last week's season-opener against Washington & Jefferson, senior Molayo Irefin, a 2022 D3Football.com All-America selection and 2023 D3Football.com Preseason All-American, hauled in three receptions for 33 yards. It marked the 12th straight game in which Irefin recorded at last three receptions, while he has done so in 21 of the past 22 games dating back to the 2021 season-opener. For his career, Irefin ranks second all-time in Saint Vincent program history with 144 receptions, while his 1,761 career receiving yards are third in the team's career record book.

JUMPING RIGHT IN: Saint Vincent saw a number of players make strong Bearcat debuts in week one against W&J. Offensively, freshman running back Ty Murray ran for a team-high 60 yards on just eight attempts. On defense, transfer linebacker Wiley Purry led the Bearcats with 11 tackles, including a tackle for loss, while fellow transfer Jake Beistel recorded four tackles and a team-high 1.5 TFL from the nose tackle position. On special teams, freshman Daishaun Alexander had a memorable first career punt, booming a 62-yarder midway through the fourth quarter, just the fourth Saint Vincent punt of 60 or more yards since the 2018 season.

WELCOME ABOARD: Five new faces will adorn the Saint Vincent sideline this season, with the additions of linebackers coach Terron Colson, running backs coach Chris Brown, offensive line assistant David Neil, special teams assistant Jason Ross and manager of operations Rob McElhaney. Additionally, John Bell enters his first season as defensive coordinator. Bell has been a member of the Bearcat football staff since the program's rebirth in 2007, previously holding the roles of defensive line coach and strength and conditioning coordinator.

CAPTAIN 'CATS: Per a vote of their teammates, the 2023 Saint Vincent College football team co-captains include senior defensive tackle Jake Beistel, senior receiver Molayo Irefin, senior quarterback Austin Slye, senior linebacker Nate Sullivan, senior receiver Kaelib McElroy, and junior linebacker Wiley Purry.

SEASONED VETS: The Bearcat welcome back a pair of fifth-year players in 2023 in graduate students Ahmad Shaw and Dwight Collins Jr. Shaw, a 2022 Second Team All-PAC selection, has been a full-time starter over the past two seasons, amassing seven interceptions in his past 20 games, including a team-high four picks last season. Collins has been a key contributor at the defensive tackle spot, amassing 49 tackles, 6.5 TFLs and 3.0 quarterback sacks over the past two seasons. Both students are enrolled in the Saint Vincent College Master of Science in Management: Operational Excellence graduate program. Shaw earned his bachelor's degree in management, while Collins holds a B.A. in communication.

ON THE MAP: Nine different states are represented on the Bearcats' 2023 roster, with 59 players hailing from Pennsylvania, 16 from Florida, 14 from Maryland, six from Virginia, three from Ohio, two from South Carolina, and one apiece from California, New Jersey and New York.

UP NEXT: Saint Vincent will welcome Allegheny College to Latrobe for Homecoming at Chuck Noll Field next week, with kickoff slated for 1 p.m. It will mark just the third all-time meeting between the two schools on the gridiron, with the series tied at 1-1. The Bearcats earned a 52-35 road victory over the Gators last season.

SAINT VINCENT - LAST TIME OUT

Saint Vincent's 2023 season-opener was spoiled by Washington & Jefferson, which rolled up 574 yards of total offense and scored six second-half touchdowns to win a 51-0 decision at Chuck Noll Field.

The Saint Vincent managed just 139 yards of total offense and was hamstrung by four turnovers, while W&J held a 35-7 advantage in first downs.

The Presidents took the lead just over nine minutes into the first quarter, capping off a 10-play, 60-yard drive with a 9-yard touchdown pass from Jacob Pugh to John Peduzzi. After an SVC three-and-out, the Presidents came right back with another lengthy scoring drive, with a 15-yard touchdown run from Troy Volpatti closing out a 13-play, 75-yard drive and pushing the visitors in front 14-0.

The SVC defense forced a pair of W&J punts in the opening eight minutes of the second quarter, before the Bearcats forced a W&J turnover-on-downs inside the 10-yard line to keep it a two-score game with 2:33 left in the half.

On the ensuing drive, the visitors wasted little time adding onto the lead, marching 76 yards in nine plays

and just 94 seconds to take a 21-0 lead on a 14-yard hookup from Pugh to Peduzzi with eight seconds left in the quarter.

After the late second quarter score, W&J would use a stifling defense and balanced offense to pull away over the second half.

In his collegiate debut, rookie Ty Martin paced the Saint Vincent offense by gaining 60 yards on eight carries, while Molayo Irefin corralled three receptions for 33 yards. SVC quarterback Austin Slye went 9-for-17 for 63 yards.

Defensively, Wiley Purry made a team-high 11 tackles, including 1.0 tackle for loss, while Kyle Murray recorded nine tackles and Nathan Sullivan eight. Jake Beistel tallied four stops, including 1.5 TFLs.

Murray also led the SVC special teams efforts, averaging 38.0 yards on seven punts, including a career-high 66-yarder, while Daishaun Alexander booted a 62-yard punt on his first career attempt.

SAINT VINCENT VS. CMU - LAST MEETING

PITTSBURGH, Pa. (Oct. 29, 2022) - Host Carnegie Mellon jumped out to a 17-0 lead just 11 minutes into the first quarter and never looked back, showcasing a stifling defense to defeat Saint Vincent, 30-12.

The Tartans limited the Bearcats to just 174 yards of total offense, harrassed SVC signal-callers into six interceptions, and held the Bearcats to just a 1-for-10 mark on third down conversions.

After an SVC punt, interception, and turnover on downs led to 17 early CMU points, the Bearcats would finally get on the board midway through the second half, with Brady Walker completing a 6-yard touchdown pass to Ryan Whitman to trim the gap to 17-6. The Tartans would answer right back, however, turning another SVC interception into a field goal to extend the lead to 20-6 at the intermission.

The hosts would add a 28-yard field goal on their

opening trip of the third quarter, before adding on with a touchdown run early in the fourth.

Saint Vincent closed out the day's scoring with just under two minutes left in the fourth, when Max Pisula rumbled into the end zone from one yard out out of the Wildcat formation to account for the final score.

Austin Slye, who replaced an injured Walker in the second quarter, completed 11 of 21 passes for 88 yards under center for SVC. Kaelib McElroy made four catches for 44 yards and Molayo Irefin five grabs for 35 yards, while D.J. Gray Jr. ran 13 times for 37 yards. Defensively, Jaden Edmonds and Jaden Pratt shared the SVC team lead with eight tackles apiece.

For Carnegie Mellon, quarterback Ben Mills completed 21 of 39 passes for 195 yards and two scores; running back Tre Vasiladis ran 20 times for 96 yards; and Kris Hughes caught nine passes for 65 yards and two touchdowns.

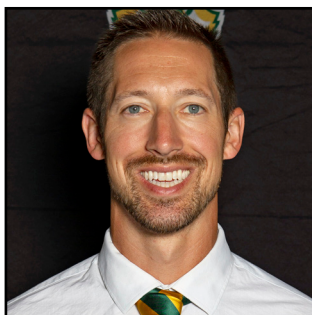

AARON SMETANKA HEAD COACH

Fifth Season
Saint Vincent, 2012

A standout quarterback for the Bearcats during his playing days, Aaron Smetanka was hired as the third head coach in the Saint Vincent College football team's modern era on Dec. 5, 2018. He completed his fourth season as head coach in 2022, and holds a 15-20 career record.

In 2022, the Bearcats finished 5-5 overall and 5-3 in the Presidents' Athletic Conference, with the five conference wins the team's most since 2011. The Bearcats scored 37 touchdowns and averaged 28.6 points per game, both third best in the PAC. Eight Saint Vincent players earned All-PAC accolades, highlighted by junior receiver/return specialist Molayo Irefin. Irefin, who led the PAC in kick return (27.2) and punt return (15.9) average, recorded the longest punt return in the team's modern era with an 85-yard touchdown in the season-opener against Stevenson, before posting a 100-yard kick return touchdown in a week nine victory over Waynesburg. Irefin also ranked second in the PAC in receptions (62) and touchdown receptions (8) and third in receiving yards (732). Along with his All-PAC honor, Irefin was also named First Team All-Region and Third Team All-America by D3football.com, becoming the first SVC football All-American since 1960. Quarterback Brady Walker led the PAC with 21 touchdown passes and 165 completions, while ranking third with 2,015 passing yards. Defensively, cornerback Ahmad Shaw was named Second Team All-PAC after picking off a team-high four interceptions.

In 2021, Smetanka led the Bearcats to just their second postseason appearance since the team's 2007 rebirth, as they took part in the ECAC James Lynah Bowl. The Bearcats closed the season with five wins, tied for the second most in the team's modern era. The Bearcat offense scored 30 or more points in five different games and averaged 361.3 yards per game to rank fourth in the Presidents' Athletic Conference. The Bearcat defense also ranked in the top five in the PAC in yards allowed, while their 18 interceptions ranked second in the conference and 16th in NCAA Division III.

Walker threw for 2,721 yards and 22 touchdowns in 2021, finishing his junior season as the team's all-time record holder in career touchdown passes (37) and passing yards (4,200). Irefin set a program record with 919 receiving yards and ranked second in the PAC in receptions (68), while he led the PAC in kick return average (23.5 yards) and all-purpose yards (174.90/gm), which ranked fifth nationally.

Defensively, graduate student Cam Norris recorded 7.0 quarterback sacks and 12.5 tackles for loss, while junior Ahmad Shaw and rookie Marvelle Cromerdie each intercepted three passes. Walker, Irefin and Norris were among a seven Bearcats who earned All-PAC honors, while safety Kyle Coombe, who recorded 51 tackles and three interceptions, was named First Team CoSIDA Academic All-District™.

In 2021, Smetanka guided the Bearcats to a 2-2 record during an abbreviated 2020-21 season that was played in the spring due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Over the four games, punctuated by a 35-6 victory over Bethany in week two and a 56-26 home win in the season finale against Waynesburg, the Bearcats ranked third in the Presidents' Athletic Conference in both scoring offense (29.8 points/gm) and total offense (382.5 yards/gm). Defensively, the Bearcats' allowed just a 44.4 percent conversion rate on third down, ranking second in the PAC, while they finished fourth in the league with six quarterback sacks.

Individually, 10 players earned All-PAC honors, highlighted by center Colton Belmont's First Team selection and Second Team picks Mike Stasko (RB), David Marshall (RB), Cam Norris (OLB) and Jared Gonzalez (P). Belmont was also recognized with All-Region honors by D3Football.com, while Stasko rolled up 370 rushing yards and four touchdowns to end his career as the Bearcats' modern era all-time leading rusher with 1,877 yards.

In 2019, Smetanka's first year at the helm, the Bearcats recovered from an 0-4 start to win three of their final six games. He recorded his first victory on Oct. 12 with a 41-18 decision at PAC rival Thiel, while the Bearcats ended the season on a high note with a 27-10 home win over Bethany College.

Seven SVC players were honored with All-PAC recognition following the conclusion of the 2019 team, including First Team selection Christian Witche (punter) and Second-Teamers Belmont and Stasko. Stasko set new team records with 907 rushing yards and 10 touchdowns, while linebacker Izaak Gray recorded six quarterback sacks to graduate as the team's

all-time career leader with 16.5 QB takedowns.

Smetanka rewrote the record books during his career as the Bearcats' quarterback, before going on to play professionally for the Erie Explosion of the Continental Indoor Football League. Smetanka's coaching career began in 2012, and it includes a three-year stint as an assistant at Saint Vincent, while he served as head coach at Greensburg Central Catholic High School in 2017 and 2018.

A two-year starter under center for the Bearcats (2010-11), Smetanka ranks among the program's modern-day career record-holders in passing yards (4,117), attempts (536), completions (331), and touchdown passes (31). Voted the team's offensive most valuable player in both 2010 and 2011, Smetanka was also a First Team All-Presidents' Athletic Conference selection in each season. As a senior and team co-captain in 2011, Smetanka led the Bearcats to their most successful season since the team's rebirth, as they went 6-4 in the regular season and qualified for the Eastern College Athletic Conference's Southwest Bowl. In 2014, Smetanka was named to the PAC's 60th Anniversary All-Time Team, which recognized the top football players in the conference's long history.

After graduating from SVC, Smetanka began his coaching career as the quarterback coach at Peters Township High School for the 2012 season. Following a one-year stint, he returned to his alma mater to join the Bearcat coaching staff as quarterback coach, a position he held for three seasons. Smetanka held a variety of responsibilities in this role, as in addition to coaching the team's quarterbacks, he was heavily involved in recruiting, scouting, and breakdown of game film, while also providing positive guidance and mentorship to the Bearcat players.

During his first stint on the Saint Vincent staff, Smetanka also starred under center for the Erie Explosion from 2013-14. As a rookie in 2013, he guided the team to a perfect 10-0 record and the CIFL title. A year later, Smetanka was named the Continental Indoor Football League's Offensive Player of the Year, leading the Explosion to a 9-2 record and their second consecutive league championship.

After spending the 2016 season on the staff at Chartiers Valley High School as passing game coordinator and quarterback coach, Smetanka was named the head coach of Greensburg Central Catholic in January 2017. He oversaw all aspects of the Centurion football program, as in addition to his head coaching role, he coordinated both the offense and special teams, while also serving as quarterback coach, strength and conditioning coach and equipment manager. During his time at GCC, a total of 21 Centurions were named all-conference.

In addition to his coaching experience, Smetanka has been a coach and speaker for the Coaching Boys into Men program for the past two years, an initiative aimed at promoting healthy relationships, building leadership skills and decreasing violence among high school boys. Smetanka was chosen as a featured speaker at the 2018 Coaching Boys into Men Summit, and was named the national MVP Coach of the Year, earning recognition from the United Way in its 2018 annual report.

A native of Allison Park, Pennsylvania, and graduate of North Catholic High School, Smetanka earned a bachelor's degree in business management from Saint Vincent's Alex G. McKenna School of Business, Economics and Government. He and wife Courtney are the proud parents of son Carter and daughter Kennedy.
