WOODRUFF NAMED TO ALL-BIG EAST SECOND TEAM FOR THIRD TIME

Orange senior forward **Hansen Woodruff** was selected to the All-BIG EAST Second Team for the third straight season in 2009. Woodruff led the Orange in points (16), goals (6) and tied for the team lead with three assists. He recorded a pair of two-goal games during the year, scoring twice in the team's non-conference win against Cornell on Sept. 5 and in the Orange's 3-1 victory versus Cincinnati on Oct. 31. Woodruff is the sixth player in school history to earn all-conference recognition three times joining Jeff Knittel, Paul Young, Guido Cristofori, John McCallion and Chris Aloisi as players who have achieved that feat.

HILL AND PEREVEGYENCEV EARN ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT HONORS

Syracuse senior defender **Pete Hill** and senior forward **Tom Perevegyencev** were named to the ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District I Second Team on Oct. 30. It marked the second straight season the Orange had at least one representative earn academic all-district honors. Kyle Hall was picked to the District I first team last season. Hill is a finance major, while Perevegyencev will receive his undergraduate degree in economics. Hill has been named to the BIG EAST All-Academic Team in each of his first three seasons, and Perevegyencev has been selected to the team twice. Both players are five-time members of the SU Athletic Director's Honor Roll (min. 3.0 GPA).

ORANGE SETS SU SOCCER STADIUM AVERAGE ATTENDANCE RECORD

The Orange established a new SU Soccer Stadium home average attendance record in 2009. Syracuse averaged 908 fans per match for its nine home contests, eclipsing the record of 812 set last season. The Orange topped the 1,000 mark four times, including three of the top five crowds in the history of the facility (1,418 for Cornell on Sept. 5; 1,311 for Seton Hall on Sept. 18 and 1,128 for Georgetown on Sept. 20). Syracuse's average home attendance has increased every season dating back to 2004.

WOODRUFF CAPS STELLAR CAREER WITH TWO GOALS AGAINST CINCINNATI

Senior **Hansen Woodruff** will go down as one of the best offensive players in school history. The Stuart, Fla. native scored twice in SU's 3-1 win against Cincinnati. They were the 26th and 27th goals of his career and increased his career points total to 66. His 27 career goals ranks ninth on SU's all-time list, and his 66 points is tied with Ken Vieira for ninth on that respective career ledger. Woodruff paced the Orange with 15 points and six goals in 2009. He also tied for the squad lead with three assists.

PEREVEGYENCEV ONE OF SU'S MOST EFFICIENT GOAL SCORERS

Senior **Tom Perevegyencev** closed his Orange career ranked 10th on the school's career list for goals per game. Perevegyencev registered 15 goals in 52 career games, an average of .288 goals per contest. In 2009, he was second on the team with five goals and tied for the Orange team lead with three assists

BRODE SOLID IN ROOKIE SEASON

Freshman midfielder **Mark Brode** was one of two Orange players to start every game this season. Brode finished the year with six points (2g, 2a), which led all SU freshmen and ranked third on the team's scoring list. The only other SU player to start every match in 2009 was senior Kenny Caceros. Brode is the first SU freshman start every match of a season since Spencer Schomaker and Robert Cavicchia in 2005.

CACEROS EMERGES AS AN OFFENSIVE CATALYST

Senior midfielder **Kenny Caceros** registered two assists in 2009, a career-best total. Prior to his final year, the Nepean, Ontario native had one helper in 46 matches and hadn't found the scoring column since 2006 when he was at the University of Maine. Both of his assists came during the course of the Orange's last nine matches. He tallied his first in SU's win at Rutgers on Oct. 2 and his second on Perevegyencev's goal against Adelphi on Oct. 20.

HILL TIES FOR TEAM ASSISTS LEAD

Senior center back **Pete Hill** made the Orange a more dangerous team on set pieces in 2009. Hill had three assists on the year, two of which came on balls he served into the box on free kicks. Hill recorded his second helper of 2009 on **L.J. Papaleo's** goal against Hartwick. His first assist occurred on classmate **Hansen Woodruff's** first goal in SU's home opener against Cornell. Hill also was credited with a helper in the Orange's 3-1 triumph against Cincinnati. Hill started all 14 games he played in 2009. He had started 45 straight matches dating back to 2006. The streak was snapped on Sept. 18 when he missed the Seton Hall game due to injury.

TOWNSEND EXCELS IN STARTING ROLE

Senior **Elliott Townsend** started the Orange's final 10 matches in 2009 and scored the only two goals of his career during that time. He netted his first in the team's 3-0 win at Rutgers on Oct. 2. The following match against Villanova on Oct. 7, he closed the game's scoring with a tally in the 82nd minute. Townsend finished the season tied for fourth on the team with four points.

WOODRUFF NAMED TO BIG EAST HONOR ROLL TWICE IN 2009

Syracuse's **Hansen Woodruff** earned a pair of BIG EAST Honor Roll nods this season. He was selected to the first weekly honor roll on Sept. 7 and league's final one on Nov. 3. Woodruff was recognized for his performance in the team's first two games at Binghamton and versus Cornell. Woodruff tallied three of the Orange's four goals in the two contests. He tied his career high for points and goals, scoring both goals in the Orange's 2-1 win against Cornell in the team's home opener on Sept. 5. He also had a goal in the second of half of the campaign starter at Binghamton on Sept. 1. Woodruff was picked to last weekly honor roll after scoring twice in the team's 3-1 win against Cincinnati on Oct. 31. Overall, he was named to the BIG EAST Honor Roll five times in his college career.

JONES FOURTH IN THE LEAGUE IN SAVES

Redshirt freshman goalie **Ryan Jones** ranked fourth in the BIG EAST in saves in 2009. He fifth in the conference in saves per game. Jones registered 74 stops in 17 games, good for an average of 4.35 saves per contest. He stopped a season-best 12 shots in his first start at Colgate on Sept. 7.

JONES NAMED BIG EAST ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

Syracuse redshirt freshman goalie **Ryan Jones** earned BIG EAST Rookie of the Week honors on Oct. 5 for his performance in SU's 3-0 win at Rutgers on Oct. 2. Jones made five saves in the second half against the Scarlet Knights to record his first career shutout. He was the first SU player to be named the league's Rookie of the Week since current senior **Hansen Woodruff** earned the honor in 2006.

CACEROS AND JONES NAMED TO MAYOR'S CUP ALL-TOURNEY TEAM

Orange senior midfielder **Kenny Caceros** and redshirt freshman goalie **Ryan Jones** were each named to the Mayor's Cup All-Tournament Team on Sept. 13. Caceros had six shots in SU's two games at the tournament (vs. Loyola and Bucknell) and helped control play in the midfield. Jones made 10 saves in the two contests, including six against Bucknell on Sept. 13.

ORANGE WINS HOME OPENER FOR FIFTH STRAIGHT YEAR

Syracuse got its home schedule off to a good start on Sept. 5 with a 2-1 victory against Cornell at the SU Soccer Stadium. It marked the fifth consecutive season the Orange posted a win in its home opener. The Orange hasn't lost a home opener since 2004.

BIG CROWD ON HAND

A crowd of 1,418 witnessed Syracuse's 2-1 victory against Cornell on Sept. 5. It was the second-largest crowd in the history of the SU Soccer Stadium and biggest gathering since the Orange had 1,493 fans take in a home match against Notre Dame on Oct. 5, 1996.

JONES MAKES 12 SAVES IN FIRST START

Redshirt freshman goalie **Ryan Jones** made his second appearance and first career start on Sept. 7 at Colgate. The Clifton Park, N.Y. native stopped 12 shots in the match, including seven in the second half and overtime. His 12 saves were the most by an individual SU keeper since Oct. 14, 2003 when Alim Karim finished with 12 saves in a 1-1 draw versus Rutgers, and it was the highest save total by BIG EAST goalkeeper in 2009.

TOP ATTENDANCE TOTALS

Syracuse drew more than 1,000 fans four times in 2009 and had an average home attendance of 908. The Orange ranked in the top 40 nationally in average home attendance the last two seasons. In 2007, the Orange was 36th at 802 fans per game. Last year, Syracuse finished 40th out of 203 Division I men's soccer programs with an average of home attendance of 812.

ORANGE FIRST TEAM TO SCORE TWICE AT BEARCATS SPORTS COMPLEX

Syracuse notched a pair of goals in its season opener at Binghamton on Sept. 1 to become the first visiting men's team to score multiple goals at the Bearcats Sports Complex since it opened in 2007. The Orange's game against the Bearcats was the 16th men's match played at the facility. Senior **Tom Perevegyencev** opened the game's scoring in the 25th minute to give SU a 1-0 lead. Classmate **Hansen Woodruff** registered the Orange's second goal when he converted a breakaway chance in the 52nd minute to put SU in front again, 2-1.

WOODRUFF EQUALS WINS

The Orange tended to come out on the winning end of games when senior **Hansen Woodruff** found the back of the net. During his four seasons, Woodruff scored in 24 matches and SU went 15-6-3 in those contests. He had at least one goal in all three of SU's victories in 2009 and the Orange was 3-1 overall this season when Woodruff had a goal.

SU INTERNATIONAL

Four different countries were represented on the Orange's 2009 roster. In addition to the United States, Syracuse boasted student-athletes from Canada, Russia and Puerto Rico, a self-governing commonwealth associated with the U.S. A total of eight international student-athletes were members of this year's team with the most hailing from Puerto Rico (4). As for the American-born players, 11 states are represented on this year's roster with student-athletes hailing from as far away as California (**Hunter Carlson**) and Washington (**Clayton Dubin**).

THREE IS THE MAGIC NUMBER

Syracuse scored three goals against Cincinnati on Oct. 31 to improve its all-time record when scoring three-or-more goals to 212-15-17. It includes 29 straight victories. The last time SU lost when registering at least three goals came on Oct. 18, 1998 when the Orange lost at #11 Georgetown, 5-4, in overtime.

ROWLEY SIGNED BY PHILADELPHIA KIXX

Former Orange men's soccer standout **Pete Rowley** joined the Philadelphia Kixx on Nov. 12. Rowley was one of four additions announced by the two-time Major Indoor Soccer League (MISL) champions. Rowley most recently competed for the FC Reading Revolution of the National Premier Soccer League and the Charleston Battery of USL-1.

"He has good size, strength and speed, and I feel he has the potential to be a good indoor player once he learns the game," player/coach Don D'Ambra said of Rowley.

Prior to joining the professional ranks, Rowley played for the Orange from 2004-08 and scored 27 points, including 11 goals. His most productive season was in 2005 when he led Syracuse with 13 points and six goals.

HILL AND WOODRUFF SERVED AS TEAM CAPTAINS

Seniors **Pete Hill** and **Hansen Woodruff** were named team captains in the preseason by Orange head coach **Dean Foti**, who himself was a two-time Orange captain. Hill and Woodruff were the first team captains since 2007 after Foti employed a "leadership council" during the 2008 season. SU's captain history dates back to the team's first varsity season in 1920 when Austin Derby wore the captain's armband.

A FAMILY AFFAIR

Two generations of Syracuse soccer united this season with the additions of sophomore forward **L.J. Papaleo** and freshman midfielder **Alessio Vitale** to the roster. L.J. is the son of former SU All-American goalie Joe Papaleo, and Alessio is the son of Marcello Vitale, the Orange's career goals leader. Both Joe and Marcello were college teammates of head coach **Dean Foti** from 1979-82 and helped SU win the inaugural BIG EAST Championship in 1982. L.J. and Alessio both played high school soccer in the Syracuse area. L.J. attended CBA before playing his freshman year at Albany in 2008. Alessio played scholastically at Liverpool High School.

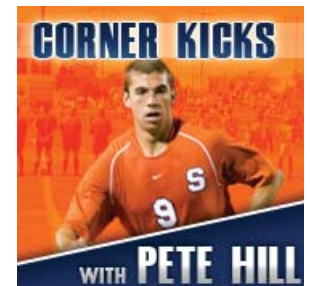

1999 NSCAA/adidas New York Region Coach of the Year

Syracuse head coach Dean Foti accumulated more wins than any other Orange soccer coach

in his 19 seasons on the sideline. Foti recorded a school-record 141 victories, including four seasons of at least 10 triumphs, and 14 wins versus ranked opponents since 1997.

Foti's 19 seasons mark the second-longest coaching tenure in the history of Orange soccer behind Arthur Horrocks' 22-year stint as the SU mentor.

Foti guided the Orange to a top-25 ranking in four of the last nine seasons and SU flirted with the national rankings in 2007 and 2008, receiving votes in the NSCAA/adidas, *SoccerTimes.com* and *College Soccer News* polls. The Orange posted at least one win versus a ranked team in nine of the last 12 campaigns.

SUCCESS AFTER SYRACUSE

Foti's student-athletes have found professional soccer success after Syracuse. Chris Aloisi, captain of the 2003 team, was drafted by the Los Angeles Galaxy of Major League Soccer and was a member of the Houston Dynamo during its run to the 2006 MLS title.

Richard Asante, an All-BIG EAST and All-Northeast Region selection in 2006, became the highest Orange product selected in the MLS SuperDraft. He was taken with the first pick in the third round (27th overall) by Toronto FC in 2007, and Kyle Hall became the latest of Foti's charges to be drafted when he was taken by Toronto with the 39th overall pick in 2009.

In addition, the Orange has had several players selected in the USL First Division College Draft, including following the 2006 season when Ezra Prendergast was chosen by the Rochester Raging Rhinos. Prendergast was also picked in the MLS Supplemental Draft by the Chicago Fire. Syracuse has also had players compete in the NPSL, WISL and USISL.

NATIONAL RECOGNITION

Foti coached 26 student-athletes to a total of 45 All-BIG EAST honors in his 19 seasons, including eight first-team selections. Two players were named the league's Rookie of the Year during his tenure, including 2001 winner Jarrett Park who led the nation in assists and was named national Freshman of the Year by *Soccer America*. Foti's players were also recognized as some of the best in the region. Twenty-seven of his charges received All-New York or All-Northeast Region honors, including 17 first-teamers.

Foti coached the 2000 Orange to its first top-25 ranking since 1997 after Syracuse upset top-ranked, and eventual national champion, Connecticut on the road. Foti and

the Orange made its second consecutive BIG EAST Tournament appearance that season, a first for the program since 1995 and 1996. In 2005, he guided SU to the conference tournament for the fifth time. On its way, the Orange knocked off a pair of ranked league opponents in USF and Cincinnati.

The 1999 NSCAA/adidas New York Region Coach of the Year, Foti led SU to 11 wins that season, the highest single-season total in his tenure. The squad finished the year ranked second in the region, boasting wins versus a pair of top 25 teams.

FOTI IS SYRACUSE SOCCER

Even before his tenure on the sidelines began, Foti was part of Syracuse soccer history. A four-year starter from 1979-82, Foti captained the squad during his junior and senior seasons and was named to the conference's first all-tournament team after leading the Orange to the inaugural BIG EAST Tournament title and a school-record 17 wins in 1982. He is one of just 18 SU players to wear the captain's armband for more than one season.

Prior to returning to Syracuse, Foti spent six years as an assistant coach at the University of Maryland. He was an integral part of the staff that led the Terrapins from a dormant ACC program to an NCAA Tournament team in 1986. Foti also was a graduate assistant at Syracuse in 1984 and an assistant at Fayetteville-Manlius High School (N.Y.) in 1983 before joining the Maryland staff.

GROWING THE GAME

In addition to his duties with the Orange, Foti is an experienced clinician. He served on the Olympic Development Program (ODP) Region I staff and has served on the USSF National Coaching School's staff. He also worked on the ODP staffs of both New York West and Maryland. Foti spent 12 years as an assistant coach for the U-17 Region I Olympic Development Team. His squads traveled the globe, playing in tournaments in France (1996-97, 2004, 2006), Brazil (1998, 2003), Switzerland (1999), Morocco (2000), Spain (2002), and England (2004).

In 2008, Foti joined U.S. Soccer's national network of coaches chosen to evaluate players participating in the U.S. Soccer Development Academy. The group is responsible for identifying and tracking the nation's top youth players.

Foti is also involved in youth soccer, having directed summer camps for more than 20 years. After co-directing the 1985 Syracuse Soccer Camp, he successfully started and directed the University of Maryland camp from 1986-90. At Syracuse, he ran the popular Dean Foti Boys Soccer Camp and, in 2007, directed a six-week spring training camp.

He was the president of the BIG EAST Conference Men's Soccer Coaches Association from 1996-98 and served as the group's vice president in 2006-07. He was also a member of the NSCAA Regional Ratings Committee (N.Y.) from 1993-98, working as chairman in 1994 and 1995. Foti currently serves on the NSCAA Northeast Regional Ratings Committee, a position he has held since 2006. In addition, he served three separate terms on the NCAA Regional Advisory Committee for the Division I Men's Soccer Championship (1992-94, 1998-2000, and 2004-05).

PERSONAL

Foti graduated from Syracuse in 1983 and received his master's degree in physical education from SU in 1985. He holds both a USSF "A" license and a NSCAA Advanced National Diploma.

Foti, a native of Oneonta, N.Y., and his wife, Holly, have three daughters -- Riley, and twins, Sophia and Lainey. The Fotis reside in Syracuse.
