One of the brightest head coaches on the college circuit, Ian McIntyre has led Syracuse to unprecedented heights in his first four years at the helm of the program.

A 1996 Hartwick graduate, McIntyre owns a 136-99-40 (.567) record in 15 seasons as a college head coach. He's been honored with multiple coaching awards, including spearheading the BIG EAST Coaching Staff of the Year in 2012.

DONNING ORANGE

McIntyre became the 15th coach in Syracuse soccer history on Jan. 6, 2010. During his time in the Emerald City, McIntyre has gone about the task of building the Orange into a national contender. That effort began paying dividends in 2012 as Syracuse won 14 games, more than twice the number of victories in McIntyre's first two years with the Orange, and the most victories for the program since 1986.

Overall, Syracuse finished 14-6-1 in 2012 and was the most improved team in the nation, posting a win-loss improvement of +8.5. The Orange nearly doubled its number of goals (39) from the previous year and the defense posted 12 shutouts, tied for the third-most clean sheets in the country. As a result, Syracuse finished second in the BIG EAST Red Division and earned a berth in the 2012 NCAA Championship, just the second time in program history the Orange advanced to the national tournament.

Syracuse continued to perform upon reaching the national stage, knocking off Ivy League champion Cornell and Atlantic 10 foe VCU in the opening two rounds to notch the first NCAA Tournament victories in team history. In the third round (Sweet 16), the Orange took eventual national finalist Georgetown to the brink, tying the Hoyas 1-1 before being eliminated on penalty kicks.

McIntyre and his assistants were rewarded with 2012 BIG EAST Coaching Staff of the Year honors for authoring the breakout campaign.

In 2013, Syracuse's first year in the Atlantic Coast Conference, McIntyre led the Orange to a 10-7-1 record, marking the first time in more than a decade that the team posted double-digit wins in consecutive years. Along the way, the Orange went undefeated in non-conference play (7-0-0), beat two ranked teams (#12 Connecticut and #19 Clemson) and earned its first ACC win with a 2-1 victory at Duke.

Elite-level players have keyed the Orange's success as McIntyre's recruiting classes have consistently been ranked in the top 40 by *College Soccer News*.

REVIVING A SLEEPING GIANT

Prior to taking over the Orange, McIntyre spent seven seasons (2003-09) as the head coach at his alma mater, Hartwick College. He guided the Hawks to four 10-win seasons and a 2005 NCAA Championship appearance.

McIntyre succeeded the legendary Jim Lennox in 2003 and promptly led the Hawks to 15-2-1 overall record, the most wins for the program since 1993. The following year, McIntyre was named the regional coach of the year after presiding over a 13-3-3 campaign that featured a nine-game winning streak and an Atlantic Soccer Conference runner-up finish.

In 2005, McIntyre guided the team to another 13-win season and the Atlantic Soccer Conference regular-season and tournament titles. For his efforts, McIntyre was rewarded with 2005 Atlantic Soccer Conference Coach of the Year honors, and by virtue of its conference championship, Hartwick earned its first trip to the NCAA Tournament in a decade.

Two years later, McIntyre was the driving force behind Hartwick's successful move from the Atlantic Soccer Conference to the MAC, qualifying for the league's postseason tournament in all three seasons (2007-09) he was at the helm.

AN ALL-AMERICAN PLAYING CAREER

Before becoming Hartwick's sixth head coach, McIntyre was a standout player for the Hawks, earning NSCAA First Team All-America honors as a senior in 1995. He helped the program to two NCAA Tournament berths and a 52-20-7 record in his four seasons (1992-95).

McIntyre scored 18 goals and had 10 assists in his career and developed a reputation for clutch goal-scoring. He tallied game-winning goals in NCAA Tournament victories against Rutgers and Boston University in 1993, and the Hawks were 16-0-1 in his career when he scored a goal.

McIntyre was named the Hartwick Male Athlete of the Year in 1995-96 and earned the President's Scholar-Athlete Award. In addition, he was enshrined in the Hartwick College Athletic Hall of Fame in 2001, his first year on the ballot.

CLIMBING THE COACHING LADDER

After his college playing career, McIntyre served as an assistant coach at Fairfield from 1996-98 under former Hartwick assistant coach Carl Rees. McIntyre helped Rees lead the Stags to a pair of Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) championship game appearances.

In 1998, McIntyre's last year with the Stags, Fairfield went 15-4-1 and earned the program's first national ranking, checking in at No. 24 after a 10-0-1 start. In addition, McIntyre coached the Region I amateur team to the gold medal at the 1999 U.S. Soccer Festival in Portland, Ore.

Following his stint at Fairfield, McIntyre returned to Oneonta, N.Y. to assume the head coaching duties for the former Division I program at Oneonta State. McIntyre posted a 36-28-7 record for the Red Dragons from 1999-2002. He led them to three straight double-digit win seasons and was named Independent Coach of the Year in his debut campaign after leading Oneonta to a 10-6-1 record and an upset of Hartwick in the 1999 Mayor's Cup title game.

PERSONAL

A native of Basildon, England, McIntyre and his wife, Jenn, have a daughter, Lyla, and a dog, Elmore.

A veteran of the professional coaching and playing ranks, Jukka Masalin joined the Orange as an assistant coach in January 2010 and was promoted to associate head coach for the program in 2014. Masalin was Ian McIntyre's top aide for two seasons at Hartwick before teaming up with him again at Syracuse.

Masalin assists McIntyre in all facets of the program, including recruiting, player training and development, game preparation and opponent scouting.

Masalin's work was essential to the Orange's breakout 2012 campaign. Syracuse was the most improved team in the nation, posting a 14-6-1 record after going 3-12-1 in 2011. The team earned the program's second NCAA Tournament berth and advanced to the Sweet 16 (third round) before being eliminated on penalty kicks by eventual national finalist Georgetown. In addition, the Orange finished the year ranked 17th in the final NSCAA/Continental Tire Poll, the second time in school history Syracuse appeared in the organization's final rankings.

For their efforts, Masalin and rest of the Orange coaches were selected as the 2012 BIG EAST Coaching Staff of the Year. Masalin was also named one of the top 15 Division I assistants in the country for 2012 by *College Soccer News*.

Masalin played professionally in Germany, Sweden, Finland and the United States before making a successful transition to coaching. He served as the head assistant coach for the Atlanta Silverbacks in the United Soccer League's (USL) First Division from 2004-07. During his time with Atlanta, Masalin was also an assistant coach for the Reinhardt College men's soccer team. In addition, he served as the soccer director for the Decatur-DeKalb YMCA and was co-director of the Silverbacks' youth soccer program.

Following his stint in Atlanta, Masalin worked as the top assistant coach for the USL First Division's Rochester Rhinos. Masalin scouted, recruited, and negotiated with players from all over the world and built the professional youth academy infrastructure in Rochester.

In 2008, Masalin joined McIntyre's staff at Hartwick and helped lead the Hawks to a pair of MAC Tournament appearances and a 10-4-4 overall record in 2009. While at Hartwick, Masalin earned his first head coaching assignment. He served as the head coach of the Maine Sting in the National Premier Soccer League (NPSL) during the spring of 2009.

Prior to coming to the U.S. in 1995, Masalin was active in the Finnish soccer community. Between 1987 and 1993, he gained international experience as a goalkeeper for the U-16, U-18 and U-21 Finnish national teams. Once arriving stateside, Masalin embarked on a collegiate playing career at Lander University in Greenwood, S.C., where he was a two-time All-Peach Belt Conference honoree. With Masalin on the roster, the Bearcats recorded a 60-19-3 overall record and advanced to the NCAA Division II Championship in 1996.

Following his collegiate career, Masalin remained at Lander as an assistant coach for the men's and women's soccer programs and earned his bachelor's degree in exercise science from the school in 2002.

Masalin holds a pair of UEFA coaching licenses. He earned his UEFA 'B' license in 2005 and his 'A' license in 2007. Masalin also holds a UEFA Fitness Diploma from the German Football Federation.

As a professional player, Masalin made 23 European Cup (Champions League and UEFA Cup) appearances and played in more than 300 top-flight professional games in Germany, Sweden and Finland. During the last 10 years, he has been invited to observe some of the top European clubs train, including Liverpool FC (English Premier League), Bayer Leverkusen (German Bundesliga) and Paris Saint-Germain FC (Ligue 1).

2013 SEASON REVIEW

After authoring one of the most successful seasons in program history in its last year in the BIG EAST, the SU men's soccer team embarked on a new challenge in 2013 as a member of the Atlantic Coast Conference.

Syracuse recorded a 10-7-1 overall record in its first year in the league, including a 3-7-1 ACC mark. The Orange remained in the hunt for a conference tournament berth until the final week of the regular season before being eliminated by Wake Forest. Despite missing the postseason, the 2013 Orange achieved several milestones and laid an important foundation upon which to build.

Among the year's highlights was defeating No. 19 Clemson at home to clinch its second straight double-digit win season, a first for the program since 1995 and 1996. In addition, Syracuse was a perfect 7-0-0 in non-conference play and outscored its non-league foes by a combined 18-2 margin.

The Orange freshman class was especially productive. Emil Ekblom led a corps of rookie scorers that accounted for 20 of the team's 30 goals. The Orange's three leading goal-scorers were first-year players as Ekblom (10), Alex Halis (6) and Chris Nanco (4) finished atop the season goals chart.

Ekblom and Halis received All-ACC honors, as did sophomore goalie Alex Bono who anchored the Orange defense. Ekblom made the All-ACC Second Team, while Bono was named to the All-ACC Third Team. Ekblom and Halis both earned spots on the All-ACC Freshman Team.

The Orange began its perfect non-conference slate by defeating Colgate on the road in its season opener. The SU freshman class adjusted quickly to the college game, combining for three goals in a 4-0 shutout of the Raiders on Aug. 30. Halis scored the game's first goal, while Ekblom scored the final two tallies.

Three days later, Syracuse handled Hartwick in its home opener to improve to 2-0. Grant Chong and Nick Perea provided the offense, scoring early in the second half. The Orange defense was stellar, holding the Hawks to just two shots.

Coach Ian McIntyre's club looked to carry the momentum into its first conference match Sept. 6 at Virginia Tech. The game represented the first ACC contest for the Orange in any sport. The visitors held a one-goal lead thanks to a Perea penalty kick in the first half, but the Hokies equalized match late and scored the golden goal in overtime to hand the Orange its first loss of 2013.

Syracuse returned to its winning ways in impressive fashion by beating Manhattan on Sept. 9, 4-1. Halis and Nanco combined for all four Orange goals against the Jaspers, registering two apiece. Halis also added an assist to finish with a career-high five points.

The men's soccer team recorded another first on Sept. 13 when it welcomed No. 4 Notre Dame to the SU Soccer Stadium for the first home ACC event in Orange history. However, the eventual national champions spoiled the occasion by beating SU, 3-0.

SU rebounded nicely from the loss to pick up one of the season's signature wins. The Orange topped former BIG EAST nemesis Connecticut to improve to 4-2-0. Halis scored the game's only goal and Bono recorded five saves against the 12th-ranked Huskies to end a six-game series losing streak.

A 2-1 come-from-behind triumph at Duke followed on Sept. 20. SU conceded a goal early in the second half, but came roaring back with goals from Ekblom and Nanco to secure the team's first ACC victory. Bono came up with several key saves down the stretch to stymie the Blue Devil attack and the nation took notice. Bono was named the NSCAA Division I Men's Player of the Week for his role in the victory along with his performance against UConn.

Syracuse extended its winning streak to three games with a dominating 3-0 win against Massachusetts on Sept. 25. Perea and Stefanos Stamoulacatos both tallied first half goals to power the Orange to the shutout victory.

In one of the year's most anticipated home matches, perennial national-title contender Virginia visited the SU Soccer Stadium on Sept. 28. A record crowd of 1,803 was on hand, but the home side couldn't generate much offense and the Cavaliers were victorious, 2-0.

The Orange brought a 6-3-0 record into its Oct. 1 match with Binghamton. SU dominated play, recording a 17-6 advantage in shots. Goals, however, were not easy to come by. Stamoulacatos scored in the first half, but the Bearcats came back to tie the match in the 79th minute to force overtime. In the second extra session, Halis broke through for the game-winner in the 105th minute to lift the Orange to a 2-1 triumph.

While cracking the Binghamton defense was difficult, Syracuse had no such issues the next time out. The Orange rolled to a 5-0 home win against NC State on Oct. 8. Ekblom turned in a magnificent performance. He factored in four of the Orange's five goals, setting an SU Soccer Stadium record with seven points. Ekblom scored three times to post the 25th hat trick in school history. He also assisted on a goal by Nanco.

Once again the college soccer world took notice of the Orange. Ekblom was named the national player of the week and the ECAC co-Offensive Player of the Week. He also earned spots on the *TopDrawerSoccer.com* and *College Soccer News* National Teams of the Week.

Ekblom continued his scoring tear on the road at Boston College in SU's next match. He tallied two more goals, but the Bekkestua, Norway native's offensive heroics were not enough. The Eagles answered both Ekblom tallies and emerged with a 3-2 victory.

A 0-0 draw against Pitt on Oct. 12 and 1-0 loss at North Carolina on Oct. 18 followed before Syracuse got untracked with a 2-0 road win at Albany. The Albany victory capped an unbeaten (7-0-0) non-conference season for the Orange. Ekblom and Juuso Pasanen contributed goals, while Bono collected three saves for his seventh shutout of the year.

In its next match, the Orange went toe-to-toe with No. 12 Maryland at the SU Soccer Stadium on Oct. 26. Syracuse had one fewer shot than the Terrapins, but UMD tallied the match's only goal in the 56th minute to escape with the win. The Orange held Maryland's Patrick Mullins, the eventual Hermann Trophy winner as national player of the year, to one shot in the contest.

Despite the setback, Syracuse remained steadfast in its quest for an ACC Tournament berth. The Orange picked up another marquee win by toppling No. 19 Clemson, 1-0, on Nov. 1 in dramatic fashion. Halis scored in the 61st minute and the Orange defense was exceptional in limiting a flurry of late Tiger scoring opportunities. It was the team's 10th win of the season and represented SU's first win against a ranked conference foe since defeating No. 21 Louisville in 2008.

The Orange needed a win at No. 13 Wake Forest and some help from other conference contenders during the season's final weekend. Ekblom netted his team-leading 10th goal, but the Demon Deacons scored twice in each half to record a 4-1 victory and eliminate Syracuse from postseason contention.

Bono finished the year with a 10-7-1 record, including eight shutouts. He played every minute in goal for the Orange and raised his career total to 18 clean sheets, tied for the third-most in school history. He also moved into sixth all-time at SU with 23 career wins.

Ekblom, the first double-digit Orange goal-scorer since Hansen Woodruff in 2007, finished with 23 points on 10 goals and three assists. His 10 goals were the third-most scored by a freshman in program history, while his 23 points tied for fourth on the SU rookie scoring ledger.





CAPTAIN HISTORY

The wearing of the captain's armband dates back to Syracuse's first varsity season in 1920. Every player selected to serve as team captain shares the common bond of being one of a chosen few to represent the most ideal characteristics of a Syracuse University student-athlete. As an Orange captain, one must gain the confidence of his coaches and the respect of his teammates. As an extension of the coach, he must exhibit leadership, character, good judgement, and the ability to motivate others. Superior play, composure in critical situations, and the ability to communicate to both coaches and teammates are the trademarks of an effective captain. A leader both on and off the field, the captain must set the standard for excellence.

Among those who have worn the captain's armband are All-America selections John McEwan, Vincent Black and Paul Young. In addition, Steve Morris, SU's all-time points leader, also earned the honor. Chris Aloisi (2001-03) and John McCallion (1993-95) are the only players in Syracuse history to wear the armband for three seasons.

The Orange did not elect team captains in 2008. Former SU head coach Dean Foti, himself a two-time captain for the Orange, instituted a team leadership council that season. Council members rotated as captains on a game-by-game basis.

KENT SYVERUD
SYRACUSE UNIVERSITY
CHANCELLOR AND PRESIDENT


Kent D. Syverud is Chancellor and President of Syracuse University. Appointed by the University's Board of Trustees in September 2013, he assumed the leadership post in January 2014, becoming the 12th leader of the University since its founding in 1870.

Chancellor Syverud came to SU from Washington University in St. Louis, where he served as Dean and Ethan A.H. Shepley Distinguished University Professor since 2006. Prior to that, he served eight years as Dean at Vanderbilt Law School. During his tenure at Washington University, he led efforts to create university-wide programs in Washington, D.C., in partnership with the Brookings Institution, and in New York in partnership with the Olin School. He also advanced efforts to expand online education opportunities, including development of an innovative online master's degree program.

Chancellor Syverud has served since 2010 as one of two Independent Trustees of the Deepwater Horizon Oil Spill Trust, a \$20 billion fund created by BP in negotiation with the White House to pay claims arising from the BP oil spill in the Gulf of Mexico. A 1981 graduate of the University of Michigan Law School, he also was an expert witness for the University of Michigan in the landmark affirmative-action case *Gutter v. Bollinger*.

After earning a Juris Doctor and an M.A. in Economics, Chancellor Syverud went on to serve as a Law Clerk for Judge Louis Oberdorfer of the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia and for U.S. Supreme Court Justice Sandra Day O'Connor. He practiced law in the fields of litigation and insurance at Wilmer, Cutler & Pickering in Washington, D.C., from 1985 to 1987. From 1987 to 1997, he served on the faculty of the University of Michigan Law School, earning tenure in 1992 and advancing to Associate Dean for Academic Affairs in 1995. He has been a Visiting Professor at the Cornell Law School, the University of Pennsylvania Law School, and the University of Tokyo Faculty of Law and Politics.

A past Editor of the *Journal of Legal Education*, Chancellor Syverud also has served as President of the American Law Deans' Association, as Chair of the Board of the Law School Admission Council, and as President of the Southeastern Association of American Law Schools. He is a past Chair of the accrediting authority for law schools in the United States, the ABA Section on Legal Education and Admissions to the Bar; and a past Chair of the Board of Access Group, which is evolving into the largest funded nonprofit organization in the world benefitting legal education.



Chancellor Syverud has published numerous law review articles concerning civil litigation, insurance law, and negotiation as well as a monograph on the professional responsibilities of insurance defense lawyers. His more recent writings have concerned legal education and service as Dean, including the articles "Three Principles of Effective Deaning," "A Parable of Law School Leadership," and "How Deans (and Presidents) Should Quit." A frequent speaker at conferences in the United States and abroad, he has received outstanding teaching awards from students at both the University of Michigan and Vanderbilt University.

Chancellor Syverud and his wife, Dr. Ruth Chen, are the parents of three grown sons: Steven, Brian and David. Dr. Chen, an environmental toxicologist, holds a Professor of Practice appointment in the L.C. Smith College of Engineering and Computer Science at SU.



DR. DARYL GROSS

SYRACUSE UNIVERSITY
DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

Dr. Gross is in his ninth year leading the Athletics Department at Syracuse University.

During his tenure, Gross has advanced Syracuse's performance on the playing fields and courts, creating broad-based athletics success unseen in the history of the University. Under his leadership, Syracuse is consistently recognized as one of the great athletic institutions in the country, with the goal of producing the world's future leaders through championship-caliber sports experiences. In 2013, Syracuse was invited to join the Atlantic Coast Conference, a groundbreaking achievement that resulted in SU quadrupling its TV rights revenues. The first year in the ACC was marked by setting an on-campus college basketball attendance record of 35,466 for Syracuse's win over traditional ACC power Duke in the Carrier Dome. His mission is to compete and perform at the highest level in everything – in competition, in the classroom, and in the community – in an effort to graduate student-athletes who will make a positive impact on society. The principles in which he believes include winning championships, graduating the maximum number of the student-athletes, and maintaining compliance to all NCAA rules, while being fiscally sound and efficient.

A veteran administrator, Gross has led Syracuse Athletics to historic levels. Syracuse had its best finish in school history in the 2013 NACDA Learfield Directors' Cup. In fact, the across-the-board finishes in the last three years have been part of the top four performances in SU Athletics' history. In each of the past two seasons, a record 10 teams were represented in the NCAA postseason. In that span, Syracuse is one of just two schools nationally to place both men's and women's basketball teams in the NCAA Tournaments and win football bowl games in those same years (Louisville is the other). Gross centers his administration around his head coaches and his insistence and emphasis on having the best leadership in the world has produced arguably the greatest assembly of head coaches in the country, including Hall of Fame basketball coach Jim Boeheim, five-time men's lacrosse national champion John Desko, legendary lacrosse player Gary Gait as the women's lacrosse coach, perennial national championship contending Ange Bradley in field hockey, 2013 ACC Cross Country Coach of the Year Chris Fox, and many more.

Gross has increased revenues to record levels by increasing donor giving to its highest amount in history, significantly increasing corporate sponsorships and creating multiple new line item revenues. The department was the leading campus unit in the University's 'Campaign for Syracuse', a \$1 billion fundraising endeavor that was publicly launched in November 2007.

Gross has led a capital campaign, which has seen the construction of the Carmelo K. Anthony Basketball Center, the Manley Hall of Champions, the renovation of Manley Field House to an indoor practice facility, the re-surfacing of football practice fields, the naming of the Carrier Dome field as 'Ernie Davis Legends Field,' a weight room, a lacrosse practice field, a field hockey field, an ice hockey training facility and locker room complex, a new Dome field for football and lacrosse, a multi-media studio for Cuse TV, upgraded Dome amenities, new suites and floor seats, and improvements to many other facilities. The latest athletic facility is the new Indoor Practice Center, which will allow Orange football and other programs to train without interruption 365 days a year.

BRANDING THE ORANGE

As the lone Power 5 conference school in the state of New York, Gross continues to brand Syracuse University as New York's College Team. This branding plan was a critical component of SU's invitation to join the ACC. SU Athletics continues to have events all over the Empire State and in the largest metropolitan area in the nation. In addition to basketball games at Madison Square Garden, football and lacrosse have played at MetLife Stadium, in what is believed to be the most lucrative contract ever for neutral-site games in college football. An Orange presence at the U.S. Open tennis tournament and "Orange is in The Apple" celebrations are regular events in the NYC area. The 2010 and 2012 football teams added to the prominence of the Orange in NYC by winning the New Era Pinstripe Bowl championship. Marketing initiatives include SU Athletics' taxi tops in Manhattan, as well as the NY logo on the back of the football helmets. The Athletics department launched a new website in 2014, Cuse.com, and is a leader nationally in design and multi-media content. Gross enhanced the 'Cuse Cares' Program for student-athletes to engage and make an impact on the community. Student-athletes won the Chancellor's Award for Community Service for the 14th consecutive year in 2011. Syracuse student-athletes continue to graduate at a high level and have received prestigious academic awards that include one Rhodes Scholar, 13 CoSIDA Academic All-Americans, and one finalist for NCAA Woman of the Year since 2005. In 2007, Gross initiated the 'Cuse Awards, a celebration of the accomplishments of all student-athletes, coaches, and administrators.

In 2005, Gross retired #44 in football, honoring the Syracuse greats who donned the number. The 'Legend of 44' includes 1961 Heisman Trophy winner Ernie Davis, who was the first African-American to win the award, as well as legends Jim Brown and Floyd Little. Gross also played a role in the production of the motion picture, "The Express," which tells the story of Davis, and worked to bring the September 2008 movie premiere to Central New York.

DEVELOPING THE PLAN TO LEAD

Prior to his appointment at Syracuse, Gross served as senior associate athletic director at the University of Southern California. During his 14 years in athletics administration at USC, the Trojans won 16 national and more than 30 Pac-10 championships, fielded 145 Olympians, played in nine bowl games, and finished in the top 10 of the Directors' Cup ranking almost every year. The University's signature program – football – dressed two Heisman Trophy winners and won two national championships.

At USC, he directed coaching searches and contract discussions, served as the department's spokesman, led marketing and corporate sponsorship efforts, negotiated television contracts, developed and contracted football and men's basketball schedules, directed student-athlete academic services, and directly supervised 10 of the University's 19 intercollegiate sports programs, among other responsibilities. In 2001, he led the effort to sign long-time NFL coach Pete Carroll. Gross' searches also produced women's volleyball coach Mick Haley, track & field coach Ron Allice, men's and women's water polo coach Jovan Vavic, and tennis coach Peter Smith, all of whom have won national championships and been named national coach of the year. Gross was named a senior associate athletics director in 2002. In that role, he led USC Athletics' corporate sponsorship program to record revenues and he headed the football marketing effort that broke USC attendance records. Gross also assisted in the biggest building program in the history of USC Athletics, including facilities for track & field, tennis, football, women's soccer, basketball, and volleyball.

Gross holds both a master's degree and Ph.D. in educational psychology from USC, as well as a bachelor's degree in psychology from the University of California at Davis, where he was a football wide receiver from 1979 to 1981, catching passes from future New York Jets quarterback Ken O'Brien. From 1982 to 1985, he was on the UC Davis football coaching staff; in 1985, the Aggies were the nation's No. 1 Division II team. He also was the assistant men's tennis coach. In 1986 (Citrus Bowl) and 1987 (Rose Bowl), Gross was a graduate assistant at USC, working with quarterbacks and wide receivers. From 1989 to 1991, he worked for the New York Jets as a personnel scout and in the front office. Gross joined the USC athletic administration as an assistant athletic director in 1991.

A native of Los Angeles, Gross and his wife, Lael, Syracuse's assistant athletics director for trademark licensing, reside in Fayetteville with their daughters, Jamie (SU Class of 2018), Jolie, Zoe, and Averie.
