OPENING DRIVE

ORANGE SET FOR HOME OPENER

- · After opening the season on the road, Syracuse kicks off a three-game homestand, its longest of the year, when it takes on Rutgers.
- The Orange will play in front of their hometown fans for the first time since the 2019 season finale. In 2020 fans were not permitted to attend games due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The 'Cuse faithful will get their first look at the \$118 million in renovations to the stadium after a new roof and other amenities were installed in the building during the summer of 2020.
- The game will air on ACC Network, with Syracuse grad Mike Couzens '10 (PxP), Dustin Fox (analyst) and Dana Boyle (reporter) on the call.
- Saturday's game marks the first meeting between Syracuse and Rutgers since 2012 when both were members of The BIG EAST Conference.
- Syracuse has an all-time record of 148-93-2 all-time in the Carrier Dome. The Orange were a perfect 6-0 on its home field in 2018, a feat they have accomplished four times since the building opened in 1980.

ORANGE IN HOME OPENERS

- Syracuse is 92-33-4 in home openers a record that excludes the 1979 season when the Orange played all their games on the road due to the construction of the Dome – and the 1889 season when Syracuse did not play a home game.
- Since the Dome opened in 1980, Syracuse is 23-18 in home starters.
- Syracuse has won seven of its last-eight home openers, including a 4-1 mark under Dino Babers.
- Saturday's game marks the first time since 2018 that Syracuse faces a non-conference opponent in its home opener. The Orange hosted Clemson in the 2019 Dome opener and Georgia Tech last season.

TUCKER ENJOYS CAREER DAY

- Freshman RB Sean Tucker had his most productive day as a member of the Orange in Syracuse's
- He rushed for a career-high 181 yards on 25 attempts and a touchdown against the Bobcats.
- The 25 rushes are also a career-high as was his 7.2 yards per carry. Tucker's 47-yard gain in the first quarter is the longest run of his career.
- The 181 rushing yards is the most for a Syracuse player since Eric Dungey ran for 200 yards at Western Michigan in 2018. That total is the most for an Orange running back since Prince-Tyson Gulley ran for 213 yards against West Virginia in the Pinstripe Bowl in 2012.
- It marks the fourth time Tucker has recorded 100 yards rushing in 10 career games. He needs just four more 100-yard rushing performances to join Syracuse's all-time top 10 list.

NUMBERS TO KNOW

RB Sean Tucker ran for a careerhigh 181 yards against Ohio. His 25 carries are also a career-high.

> Career field goals for PK Andre Szmyt. His two FG at Ohio leaves him just one away from tying the Orange's all-time record, held by Cole Murphy.

With six catches against Ohio, WR Taj Harris moved into fourth place on Syracuse's career receptions list with 141.

The number of consecutive starts by OL Airon Servais. That number is tied for the most starts in over two decades..

GAME #2 MATCHUP: RUTGERS

SERIES HISTORY

- Syracuse and Rutgers will play for the 44th time when they take the field on Saturday. The Orange own a 30-12-1 advantage in the all-time series that dates back to 1914.
- Head coach Dino Babers will face Rutgers for the first time in his career.
- The Orange won 12-straight games against the Scarlet Knights from 1987-98. After Rutgers snapped the winning-streak with an overtime win in 1999, 'Cuse won the next three meetings.
- The squads met 22 times as members of The BIG EAST Conference. The Orange were 14-8 in those contests.
- The teams have split the last four meetings.
 Syracuse posted wins in 2009 and 2010, while
 Rutgers came out on top in 2011 and 2012.

LAST TIME VS. RUTGERS

- In their final meeting as members of The BIG EAST Conference, Rutgers defeated Syracuse, 23-15, in Piscataway, N.J. on Oct. 13, 2012.
- The Scarlet Knights scored first on a 1-yard touchdown run in the first quarter, but the Orange answered with 1:32 remaining in the half when Adonis Ameen-Moore found the end zone to cap an 80-yard scoring drive.
- Rutgers scored twice in the third quarter and took its largest lead of the day at 23-7 with a touchdown with 14:01 remaining.
- Ryan Nassib connected with Christopher Clark on a 3-yard touchdown pass and a successful two-point conversion brought the Orange within eight, but that was as close as they could get.
- The loss was one of only two for Syracuse in conference play as it won a share of the BIG EAST regular-season title.

SYRACUSE-RUTGERS CONNECTIONS

- Head coach **Dino Babers** will face Rutgers for the first time in his career.
- Greg Schiano owns a 6-5 career record against the Orange as Rutgers' head coach.
- Syracuse has 10 players from the state of New Jersey, including QB Tommy DeVito (Cedar Grove), WR Taj Harris (Beverly), LB Leon Lowery (Elizabeth), DB Duce Chestnut (Camden), WR Trebor Pena (Ocean Township), DB John Sweetwood (Essex Fells), DB AJ Calabro (Farmingdale), DL Erik Slater (Old Tappan), OL Darius Tisdale (South Brunswick), DL Joe Rondi (Wayne),
- Rutgers has 15 players from the state of New York, including freshman DL Caleb Patterson, who attended nearby Jamesville-DeWitt.
- Orange junior QB Tommy DeVito attended
- Orange freshman DB Duce Chestnut attended Don Bosco Prep (N.J.) with Rutgers' sophomore WR Christian Dremel, sophomore PK Guy Fava, freshman TE Victor Konopka, freshman RB Kyle Monangai and freshman DL Cam'Ron Stewart.
- Orange assistant coach Nick Monroe and Rutgers assistant Bob Fraser were on the same staff at Colgate in 2004-05.

- After postponing its season opener because of flooding from the remnants of Hurricane Ida, Rutgers opened the season on Saturday, Sept. 4 with a 61-14 win against Temple.
- The Scarlet Knights never trailed in the contest, scoring on a safety at the 11:54 mark of the first quarter. Rutgers went on to build a 26-0 lead.
- Temple scored on its first possession of the second half to cut the deficit to 26-14, but that was as close as the Owls could get.
- Linebacker Olakunle Fatukasi led the Scarlet Knights' defensive efforts against Temple. The 2020 Butkus Award semifinalist recorded nine tackles, including four tackles for loss and three sacks. Fatukasi is on the Watch List for the this year's Bednarik, Butkus and Nagurski Awards.
- Head coach Greg Schiano is in his second season
 of his second stint at the helm of the Rutgers
 program. Schiano guided the Scarlet Knights
 from 2001-11 before jumping to the NFL as the
 Tampa Bay Buccaneers head coach in 2012-13.
 He returned to college fooball as associate head
 coach/defensive coordinator at Ohio State from
 2016-18.

GAME NOTES: TEAM

A WIN WOULD ...

- Improve **Dino Babers'** record to 26-36 as head coach of the Orange.
- Be Syracuse's eighth victory in its last-nine home openers.
- Mark the first 2-0 start for the Orange since 2019 when they posted a 10-3 record.
- Give Syracuse its 738th all-time victory (includes 11 wins from 2004-06 that were vacated by the NCAA). The Orange currently rank 22nd on the FBS ledger of winningest programs. Syracuse is one of 31 FBS schools to have accumulated 700+ wins.

DOME-INATION

- Under Dino Babers, Syracuse is 16-14 at home.
 Home field success has been a staple at all three of his coaching stops, with Babers' teams combining to go 34-19 when defending their home field.
- The Orange were undefeated in the Loud House in 2018, going 6-0 in the building. The 2018 campaign was SU's fourth perfect home season since 1980; the three previous unbeaten campaigns (all 6-0) were in 1987, 1988 and 2001.

BABERS RISING IN THE RANKS

- Head coach Dino Babers coached the 100th game of his career on Nov. 16. 2019 at Duke. In his eightplus seasons as a sideline leader at Eastern Illinois, Bowling Green and Syracuse, Babers has worked 114 games and holds an overall record of 62-52 (.544).
- Saturday's game will be Babers' 62nd at Syracuse, seventh most games coached at SU (behind Ben Schwartzwalder - 247, Paul Pasqualoni - 167, Dick MacPherson - 116, Frank Maloney - 78, Frank O'Neill - 77, Ossie Solem - 63).

WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE

- Syracuse did not commit a turnover in its win at Ohio. Last season, 'Cuse won the turnover battle in five games and were tied in two.
- The Orange recorded an interception in the fourth quarter to continue a trend from last season when they third nationally with 24 takeaways.

HONORING FLOYD

- Syracuse will wear a special patch this season honoring the memory of Orange legend Floyd Little.
- The NFL and College Football Hall of Fame inductee passed away on Jan. 1, 2021.
- A three-time All-American for the Orange from 1964-66, Little rushed for 2,704 yards and scored 46 touchdowns. He was also a standout return man who led the nation in all-purpose yards (1,990) and punt return average (23.5) as a junior in 1965.
- In nine seasons (1967-75) with the Denver Broncos, he amassed more than 12,000 allpurpose yards and was a five-time Pro Bowl selection.

INTERNATIONAL FLAVOUR

- The Orange roster features eight players born outside the United States, including four from Canada.
- Temple (8) is tied with Syracuse for the secondmost foreign-born players on their FBS roster.
 UConn leads the way with 11.

A NEW STADIUM EXPERIENCE

- Next Saturday's game vs. Rutgers marks the
 first time fans have been back into the Dome
 for football since the University began work on
 creating a new stadium experience. It features a
 new fixed roof, a center-hung scoreboard, stateof-the-art sound and lighting systems, improved
 accessibility and added Wi-Fi capabilities are just a
 handful of features.
- The new crown truss atop the building consists of more than six million pounds of structural steel and the center-hung scoreboard is 7,022 square feet, making it the second-largest indoor centerhung system in the United States.

RECORD WATCH

- With six catches against Ohio in the season opener, junior Taj Harris climbed to fourth place on Syracuse's all-time receptions with 141 career catches.
- Ervin Phillips owns the Syracuse record for career catches with 223 from 2014-17. Steve Ishmael (2014-17) ranks second with 219, and Alec Lemon i(2009-12) is third with 201.

OFFENSIVE EFFICIENCY

- Syracuse scored on five of its seven possessions in the victory against Ohio, excluding the two possessions that concluded with the end of both halves.
- Syracuse was 8-for-12 on third-down conversions.
 The .667 success rate on third down is the highest conversion rate for the Orange in head coach Dino Babers era in a single game.
- 'Cuse punted just two times against the Bobcats.
 That mark equals the least punts for SU under the
 direction of Babers.
- The Orange averaged 6.2 yards per play, including a 6.4 average per rush.
- Syracuse had two six-minute or more scoring drives. The Orange used 6:46 on their first possession of the second quarter on a 61-yard drive that ended with a Andre Szymt field goal.

I AM IRON MAN

- Redshirt-senior offensive lineman Airon Servais made his 49th straight start in Syracuse's season opener at Ohio. That number is tied for the most starts in over two decades.
- Servais has the most consecutive starts for the Orange since 2000 and most offensive line starts in that span as well. He has now tied Orange QB Donovan McNabb for the most total starts of players who ended their careers this century, with 49.

PROTECTING THE POCKET

- Syracuse has seven players on its roster that started a game at offensive line at the FBS level.
 Airon Servais (49), Carlos Vettorello (24), Matthew Bergeron (17), Dakota Davis (15), Darius Tisdale (11), Chris Bleich (9) and FB Chris Elmore had started eight games at offensive guard last season.
- The 128 total offensive line starts coming into the 2021 season ranks just outside the top-10 in total returning starts at the FBS level. Only 10 schools have 130+ starts returning on their roster.
- Syracuse's seven returners with at least one start at the FBS level on the offensive line ranks 15th nationally.
- The group allowed just one sack in the season opener at Ohio. In addition, its run blocking paved the way for 283 yards on the ground.

TUCKER ACROSS THE CENTURY MARK

- RB Sean Tucker has four 100-yard games in his early Syracuse career. He recorded a career-high 181 yards in the Orange's season-opening win at Ohio.
- He is now tied for 22nd in program history with four 100+ yard games in his career in just 10 games.
- Last season, he rushed for 112 yards and two touchdowns vs. Georgia Tech, 111 yards against Liberty and 101 vs. Notre Dame.
- Tucker is the third player in Syracuse history to post multiple 100-yard games as a true freshman.
 He joined SU all-time leading rusher Joe Morris (who did so five times as a freshman and 22 times in total) and Dee Brown (twice) in that regard last year.
- The Georgia Tech game last year was just the 11th time in program history that a true freshman recorded more than 100 yards on the ground and the first since Jordan Fredericks did so in 2015 vs. Rhode Island.
- Tucker was the first to do so as a freshman vs. an FBS opponent since Antwon Bailey ran for 126 yards against Notre Dame in 2008.

THREE QBS WITH FBS STARTS

- Syracuse has three quarterbacks on its roster that have made at least one start at the FBS level.
- QB Tommy DeVito has started 16 games for the Orange and Garrett Shrader started four games at Mississippi State in 2019.
- Freshman QB JaCobian Morgan made his first collegiate start vs. Boston College last season, making him the seventh true freshman to start a game at quarterback in Syracuse history. He also started vs. Louisville.
- Syracuse is one-of-15 FBS programs that has three or quarterbacks who have made at least one FBS start

TARGETING TAJ

- WR Taj Harris is the latest receiver to benefit from head coach Dino Babers' offense.
- Harris ranked fifth in the ACC with 5.8 catches per game last season. His 73.3 yards per game was seventh in the league.
- He was Syracuse's most frequent target in the season opener at Ohio. He finished with six catches for 29 yards.
- 2020 was the fifth-straight season that an Orange wideout has finished in the top-five of the ACC in receiving yards per game and top-six of the receptions per game categories in the league.

RUN SEAN, RUN

- RB Sean Tucker only played in nine of the Orange's 11 games last season, but he posted one of the top freshman campaigns for a running back in program history.
- He had 626 yards on the ground, third-most by a Syracuse freshman.
- All-time leading rusher and Syracuse great Joe
 Morris leads the category with the only 1,000-yard
 season by an SU freshman, and averaged 91 yards
 per game, but Tucker (69.6) has the next-highest
 yards per game average among the group.

ORANGE DIG THE LONG BALL

- A good portion of Syracuse's scoring since the start of 2019 has come by virtue of big plays in the passing game.
- In all, 38-percent (14-of-37) of Syracuse's passing touchdowns in the span were from 40+ yards out and nine covered more than 50 yards.
- Seven of the Orange's 15 touchdown passes last season have covered 40+ yards, including a long of 83-yards vs. Clemson.
- The average length of the Orange's receiving touchdowns since the start of 2019 is 35.7 yards.
- WR Taj Harris (94, 79, 69, 47, 46), TE Luke Benson (70, 53), WR Trishton Jackson (85, 59, 52, 46), and WR Nykeim Johnson (83, 60, 43) were the recipients of Syracuse's long-distance passing scores in the last-two seasons.
- Including rushing touchdowns, 27 of Syracuse's 66 (40.9 pct.) total offensive TDs since 2019 have been scored from outside the red zone.

ELMORE DOES IT ALL

- TE/FB/OL Chris Elmore, who has played in 48 games the past four-plus seasons on offense, and started on the offensive line in eight games last season, also played on defense in 2019, but returns to fullback for 2021.
- Elmore also saw field time as a reserve nose tackle in seven games in 2019. It wasn't a new position for Elmore, who set the Illinois state record with 44 career sacks as a standout defensive lineman at Chicago's Phillips Academy.
- In his Syracuse career, he's started at offensive line, played 76 defensive snaps and scored three rushing touchdowns as a fullback.

POINTS-A-PLENTY

 During the last three seasons, the Orange have seven 50+ points games, the fourth-most of any ACC team during that span.

BENSON FOR SIX

- When sophomore TE Luke Benson makes a catch, often times it goes for a touchdown.
- The second-year player has 14 catches in his collegiate career and five of those receptions have gone for a score. It's not like he's just a goal line target either. Benson averages 17.4 yards per catch thus far in his career. Last season he scored on a 53-yard touchdown catch vs. Duke and a 3-yard touchdown catch vs. Wake Forest.

QUEELEY COMING ON

- WR **Anthony Queeley** led the Orange in receptions in four of the last-seven games of 2020.
- He had a breakout day against Liberty, catching five passes for 77 yards and his first collegiate touchdown. His five catches and 77 yards were also career highs.
- He tied with teammates Courtney Jackson and Cooper Lutz against Wake Forest, with each hauling in four receptions.
- He was the only wideout with multiple receptions vs. Louisville and had a touchdown against Notre Dame.

THE NEED FOR SPEED

- Since head coach Dino Babers arrived in 2016, Syracuse has run 4,685 plays in 61 games – an average of 76.8 plays per game.
- Being able to run tempo has traditionally helped the Orange. Syracuse ran 62 plays in 28:23 in its victory against Ohio. Last season, the Orange ran 65 plays in 25:52 of possession time in the team's win vs. Georgia Tech. 'Cuse also ran 70 plays against NC State, in what was their second-highest scoring output of the 2020 campaign.
- The Orange have ranked in the top five in the FBS in total plays in two of the past four seasons, including logging a school-record 1,063 plays in 2018
- In 2019, SU averaged 75.6 plays per contest and tied for 45th nationally with 909 plays. However, among teams that only played 12 games, the Orange tied Ball State for fourth. Tulsa (947), Texas Tech (935) and UCLA (916) were the only teams not to make the postseason that ran more plays than Syracuse.
- In 2020, Syracuse ranked 60th with 656 plays.

GAME NOTES: DEFENSE

CHESTNUT GETS THE CALL

- Freshman DB Duce Chestnut joined rare company in his collegiate debut at Ohio.
- Chestnut became the first true freshman defensive back to start a season opener since Andre Cisco in 2018. Prior to Cisco, the last defensive back to start the season opener as a true freshman was Markus Paul in 1985.
- Chestnut finished the day with eight tackles, including five solo, 0.5 tackle for loss and one interception, which he returned for 23 yards.
- Syracuse has started a true freshman in four of head coach Dino Babers' six seasons on defense in the season opener (Kendall Coleman, 2016, Andre Cisco 2018, Stefon Thompson 2020, Chestnut, 2021).

TAKEAWAY JONES

- LB Mikel Jones finished 2020 ranked in the top-12 nationally of all three takeaway statistics.
- He tied for eighth nationally with four interceptions, and was one-of-four linebackers nationally with four-or-more picks on the season. He also led the ACC in the category.
- Jones tied for the sixth in the FBS and second in the ACC with three forced fumbles.
- Jones also tied for 12th nationally in fumbles recovered (2), which was good for fourth in the ACC.
- He and Illinois linebacker Jake Hansen were the only two linebackers in the nation with multiple interceptions, forced fumbles, and fumble recoveries in 2020.

TAKETH AWAY

- Syracuse had the third-most takeaways in the FBS last season, with 24.
- 'Cuse finished in the top-12 nationally in the statistic for the third-straight season after ending up third in 2018 (31), 12th in 2019 (25) and third in 2020 (24).
- Since the 2017 season finale against Boston College, the Orange have registered at least one takeaway in 35 out of 38 games, including the season opener at Ohio.
- In all, Syracuse has gained 81 turnovers (36 fumble recoveries, 45 INTs) during that time, an average of 2.1 per contest.
- From Nov. 25, 2017 versus Boston College to Oct. 18, 2019 against Pittsburgh, Syracuse gained at least one turnover in 21 consecutive games. The streak was the longest in FBS football.
- Twenty different players had an interception during the streak.

TURNOVER TALE

- 'Cuse has won the takeaway battle in 24 of its last 38 games (six of the remaining 14 were even).
- Syracuse has ranked in the top-15 in turnover margin to conclude each of the last-three seasons, the only FBS program to do so.
- From 2018-20, Syracuse and Clemson are tied for the most takeaways with 81.

DEFENSE NOT BREAKING

- Syracuse kept Ohio out of the end zone in the season opener, marking the first time the Orange have not allowed a touchdown in a game since defeating Duke, 49-6, in 2019.
- The Bobcats had three opportunities in the red zone and were able to come away with just a field goal each time.
- Last season, when Syracuse allowed its opponent to reach the red zone the defense managed to minimize the damage.
- 'Cuse ranked fourth in the ACC, allowing points on just 80 percent (40-of-50) of their opponents' trips to the red zone. SU yielded just seven passing touchdowns in 2020.

YOUTH BECOMES EXPERIENCE

- Six Syracuse freshmen (four true, two redshirt) started in Syracuse's game vs. NC State last season, breaking the previous program record for most freshman to start on one side of the ball (5), which was set in the prior two games (vs. Boston College and at Louisville).
- In each of the last eight games of the year,
 Syracuse started four-or-more freshmen on defense. Prior to the 2020 season, four was the most freshmen starters on one side of the ball in program history.
- Against NC State LB Marlowe Wax made his first collegiate start alongside the group that had started the prior two games together (LB Stefon Thompson and DBs Garrett Williams, Aman Greenwood, Ja'Had Carter and Rob Hanna).
- Additionally, more than 71-percent of Syracuse's 2020 active roster was comprised of players in their first two years of eligibility, a mark that ranked fourth in the FBS. The 'active roster' was comprised of players who did not opt out. The list included injured players.

GAME NOTES: SPECIAL TEAMS

POINT SZMYT

- PK Andre Szmyt recorded his 300th career kicking point in the victory at Ohio. He recorded nine points (2 FG, 3 PATs) against the Bobcats.
- With that performance he moved into second place in Syracuse's record book for kicking points.
 Nate Trout (1996-99) holds the record with 334.
- Szymt also moved into second place on the Orange's all-time field goals made list. He now has 58 career field goals, which is one shy of the school record of 49 held by Cole Murphy (2014-17).
- Szymt averaged 5.0 points per game last season.
 He ranked 29th nationally in field goal percentage (81.8).
- Szmyt has at least one made field goal in 30 out his 37 career games and has booted multiple field goals on 23 occasions.

NEXT IN LINE

- Freshman P James Williams made his debut in the season opener at Ohio. He punted twice and averaged 37.5 yards per punt. His first career punt was downed at the Ohio 4-yard line.
- Syracuse's last three starting punters have all gone on to NFL careers, and Syracuse will be seeking to add to that list with who is tabbed to handle punting duties in 2021.
- Nolan Cooney went on to sign a free agent deal with the New Orleans Saints this spring after his one season at the helm of the position.
- Sterling Hofrichter was the third Syracuse punter drafted (selected by the Atlanta Falcons in 2020) and second in the last-six years after current Giants' punter Riley Dixon was selected by the Broncos in the seventh round in 2016.
- Syracuse and Texas A&M are the only two schools to have multiple punters selected in the NFL Draft in the last 15 years.

SZMYT AMONG FG LEADERS

- Junior PK Andre Szmyt ranks second among active players and first in the ACC in career field goals made with 58.
- Michigan State's Matt Coghlin leads all active players with 67 made field goals.
- Szmyt is currently in sole possession of second place in Syracuse history with 58 made field goals. He passed John Biskup (1989-92) against Ohio. Cole Murphy (2014-17) leads all Syracuse players with 59 career made field goals. Dave Jacobs (53) is next for Szmyt to pass in third place.


- Two new position coaches made their Orange debut in the season opener at Ohio.

- Built between April 1979 and September 1980, the Dome was the fifth-largest stadium of its kind in the U.S. at the time and the first in the Northeast. The building covers 7.7 acres and has 527,320 square feet of floor space. It is 570 feet long and 497 feet wide, and the top of the Dome is 165 feet above the playing surface.
- In May 2018, the University Board of Trustees authorized a \$118 million investment for new stadium improvements. Renovations began in March of 2020 with the installation of a new fixed roof. Additional upgrades include a center-hung scoreboard, state-of-the-art sound and lighting systems, improved accessibility and added Wi-Fi capabilities. Air conditioning, new accessible restrooms and new concessions space are elements are improvements that were made for this fall.
- The new roof features over 3,000 tons of steel fixed to the structure and the center-hung scoreboard is the second-largest center-hung indoor system in the United States.



Athens, OH – Sean Tucker's career night pushed the Orange to a season opening road win. He rushed for a career-high 181 yards on 25 carries, including a six-yard touchdown run, guiding Syracuse to a 29-9 win over Ohio. The Orange rushed for 286 total yards, while holding Ohio to 129. Tommy DeVito rushed for a six yard touchdown on Syracuse's opening drive, giving the Orange a lead that it never conceded. DeVito completed 11-of-17 attempts for 90 yards in addition to the touchdown run. Ohio had the ball on their own one-yard line with 6:30 left in the first when Caleb Okechukwu's safety made it 9-0 Syracuse.

After Ohio scored two field goals in the second quarter to make it a one possession game going into the second half, the Orange defense held Ohio scoreless in the third. Andre Szmyt's 20-yard field goal gave 'Cuse a 15-6 advantage and Tucker's six-yard touchdown extended the lead to 22-6. A Cooper Lutz touchdown run would push that lead to 29-9. Darian Chestnut's late interpection closed out the program's 85th season-opening win.
