LAST TIME OUT

- Syracuse's attack scored six goals past visitors Loyola in a 6-1 victory.
- Nathan Opoku scored a brace, while Levonte Johnson, Curt Calov, Giona Leibold and Francesco Pagano also found the back of the net.
- The Orange did not allow a goal from open play, as the Greyhounds converted a penalty for their only goal.
- Syracuse outshot Loyola, 19-14.
- The Orange netted six goals for the first time since 2012.

SETTING THE SCENE

- Syracuse is 10-2-1 on the 2022 season. That matches the best start to a season since 2014.
- The Orange are top of the Atlantic Division table, two points clear of Louisville.
- Syracuse has a +21 goal differential, which is the best in the ACC.
- 'Cuse has registered 10 wins for the first time since 2016. The '16 squad went 12-4-4 on the season.

THE SERIES

- Friday's match represents the 19th meeting between Syracuse and Louisville.
- The Cardinals lead the series, 11-2-5. The last time Syracuse won a match in this series was in 2008.
- The last contest between the two sides was a high scoring, back-and-forth match. Louisville won, 5-4, in the second overtime. Deandre Kerr scored twice in the first half, while Chrisitan Curti scored in the 80th minute to send the match into overtime. Louisville's Josh Jones ended the match with a golden goal in the 103rd minute.

SCOUTING THE GREYHOUNDS

- Louisville is the No. 11 team in the nation with a 8-2-2 (3-1-1 ACC) record. They have a +11 goal-differential, which ranks fourth in the ACC.
- The Cardinals are 5-1-1 on their home turf, Dr. Mark & Cindy Lynn Stadium.
- In its last time out, Louisville beat Evansville 2-0 at home. After a scoreless first 45 minutes, junior forward Aboubacar Camara put the hosts in front in the 55th minute. A strike from substitute forward Brandon McManus secured the victory in the 77th.
- Konstantinos Georgallides leads the team in points with 10. The Famagusta, Cyprus native is tied for the squad lead in goals with Camara (4).

STRENGTH IN DEFENSE

- The Orange have only allowed six goals in 13 matches. That's the lowest total to start a season since 2014.
- They have allowed four goals from open play.
- 'Cuse have kept eight clean sheets, which is tied for the national lead with Western Michigan and Elon.
- Syracuse is tied fourth nationally in GAA (.462).

IMMEDIATE IMPACT

- New additions Levonte Johnson, Nathan Opoku, and Lorenzo Boselli have provided immediate results on the attacking end.
- Opoku leads the team in goals (7) and points (18), while Johnson leads the team in assists (5).
- Boselli scored his first career Syracuse goal against UConn and assisted the second goal against Colgate.

SHEALY'S HISTORY

- Redshirt-senior goalkeeper Russell Shealy is on pace for a historic season.
- The Cartersville, GA. native is second in the ACC in GAA (.500), second in save percentage (.870), and first in saves (40).
- He is on pace to break the program record in single season GAA set by Alex Bono in 2014 (0.55).

BIG TIME MOMENTS...

- Syracuse has a 4-1 record against Top-25 opponents in 2022.
- Last season, the Orange went 1-4 against ranked sides.
- The Orange have two major wins in 2022, one against No. 1 ranked Clemson and the other against No. 4 Wake Forest.
- Syracuse has defeated multiple Top-5 opponents in the regular season for the first time in school history.

IRON SHARPENS IRON

- The Orange play one of the toughest schedules in the nation.
- Syracuse has played five teams in the NCAA's RPI Top 25, going 2-2-1 against those sides.
- Syracuse is No. 3 in the RPI as of Oct. 9.
- 'Cuse's next foe, Louisville, ranks No. 8 in the RPI.

OUTSTANDING OPOKU

- Sophomore forward Nathan Opoku is an effective and exciting attacking prospect for the Orange.
- The Accra, Ghana native is first in the ACC in points (18) and is tied for the conference lead in goals (7).
- Opoku leads the Orange in goals and points as well.
- A transfer from Lindsey Wilson College, Opoku scored 19 goals in 19 matches during the 2021 campaign.

ROAD WARRIORS

- The Orange are 4-0-1 on the road in 2022. It is a huge improvement after going 2-10-3 away from the SU Soccer Stadium in 2021 and 2020 combined.
- Syracuse's away goal difference is +11 which is the best mark in the ACC.
- 'Cuse has never finished a season undefeated on the road under coach McIntyre.

ORANGE SELECT TEAM CAPTAINS

- Seniors Amferny Sinclair and Noah Singelmann and graduate student Julio Fulcar are the 2022 captains.
- Singelmann appeared in every match during the 2021 season. He also led the team in points for the 2020-21 season.
- Sinclair has 51 starts in 54 appearances during his Orange career.

PRESEASON ACCOLADES

- Senior midfielder Amferny Sinclair was named to the 2022 Atlantic Coast Conference Preseason Watchlist.
- Senior forward Levonte Johnson was named to the Hermann Trophy Watch List. The transfer from Seattle U scored nine goals and tallied eight assists in 2021.

CANADIAN TIES

- Canada is a pipeline for talent for coach McIntyre and his staff.
- There are six student-athletes on the roster from Canada
- Three Orange come from Brampton, a city in Ontario (Johnson, Oyegunle, Wickham)

ORANGE EARN ACADEMIC HONORS

- The Orange were recognized as a 2021-22 College Team Academic winner by the United Soccer Coaches. The squad earned the honor after maintaining a GPA above a 3.0 for the 2021 season.
- Noah Singelmann and Buster Sjoberg were named to the All-ACC Academic Men's Soccer team in January.

500 AND COUNTING

- The Orange's 1-0 victory at Colgate on Sept. 24, 2019 was the 500th win in program history.
- Syracuse has an all-time record of 525-538-130
- The first Syracuse team took to the pitch in 1920. No games were played in 1922, 1943-45 and 1951. The program was briefly discontinued between 1961-1970 before being reinstated in 1970.

ORANGE IN THE PROS

- Last season's leading goal scorer DeAndre Kerr joined the long list of Syracuse alumni in the pros.
- In January, Kerr signed with Toronto FC. He's played 25 MLS matches with 10 starts so far in his MLS career.
- 'Cuse alum Tajon Buchanan and Miles Robinson were also named to the 2021 MLS Best XI in December 2021. Syracuse is the only ACC squad with representatives in the 2021 MLS Best XI.
- Kamal Miller played and started in the 2022 MLS All-Star Game. Syracuse is the only ACC school to have a former student-athlete in the 2022 MLS All-Star game.
- In August 2021, Tajon Buchanan signed a three-year deal with 2021 Belgian First Division A champions Club Brugge.
- Ryan Raposo won 2022 Best Young Canadian Player honors at the Canadian Championship as he led the Vancouver Whitecaps to a Canadian Championship.
- In a seven-year span, Syracuse has had 12 former student-athletes taken in the first two rounds of the MLS Draft.

In his 13 years at Syracuse, head coach Ian McIntyre re-established the Orange as a national contender year-in-year-out in a highly competitive Atlantic Coast Conference. McIntyre has guided student-athletes in Upstate New York to both on field and off the field success.

McIntyre has a record of 218-149-69 in his 24 years of coaching experience, and a 111-86-37 tally during his time in the Salt City. He's led his teams to ACC Tournament Championships, NCAA Tournament triumphs, and a trip to the College Cup in 2015.

DONNING ORANGE

McIntyre became the 15th coach in Syracuse soccer history on Jan. 6, 2010. During his time in Syracuse, McIntyre has gone about the task of building the Orange into a national contender. That effort began paying dividends in 2012 as Syracuse won 14 games, executing the biggest single season turnaround in school history.

Overall, Syracuse finished 14-6-1 in 2012 and was the most improved team in the nation, posting a win-loss improvement of +8.5. The Orange nearly doubled its number of goals (39) from the previous year and the defense posted 12 shutouts, tied for the third-most in the country. As a result, Syracuse finished second in the BIG EAST Red Division and earned a berth in the 2012 NCAA Championship, just the second time in program history the Orange advanced to the national tournament.

Syracuse continued to perform upon reaching the national stage, knocking off Ivy League champion Cornell and VCU in the opening two rounds to notch the first NCAA Tournament victories in team history. In the third round (Sweet 16), the Orange tied eventual national finalist Georgetown, 1-1, before being eliminated on penalty kicks. McIntyre and his assistants were rewarded with 2012 BIG EAST Coaching Staff of the Year honors for authoring the breakout campaign.

In 2013, Syracuse's first year in the Atlantic Coast Conference, McIntyre led the Orange to a 10-7-1 record, marking the first time in more than a decade that the team posted double-digit wins in consecutive years. Along the way, the Orange went undefeated in non-conference play (7-0-0), beat two ranked teams (#12 Connecticut and #19 Clemson) and earned its first ACC win, a 2-1 victory at Duke.

The Orange reached unprecedented heights in 2014 when it climbed to No. 1 in the national rankings for the first time in school history. Syracuse won a share of the ACC Atlantic Division and earned a program-best No. 9 seed in the NCAA Tournament. The Orange defeated Penn State on its home field before its season came to an end in the Sweet 16 in a 2-1 overtime loss to Georgetown. Syracuse posted a 16-4-1 record, finishing just one win shy of the single-season school record for victories.

The 2015 squad produced the most successful season in school history. Syracuse, which had to replace seven starters, became the first No. 10 seed to win the ACC Tournament, the first in school history. The Orange earned a program-best sixth seed in the NCAA Tournament. After a first-round bye, they defeated Dartmouth, Seattle and Boston College to advance to the College Cup for the first time in school history. The Orange faced No. 3 Clemson for the third time that season and were tied with the Tigers, 0-0, after 110 minutes of play. Clemson won the penalty kick shootout to advance to the national final. Syracuse ended the season with a 16-5-4 record and was No. 4 in the final NSCAA poll, its highest final ranking in school history.

Syracuse continued its success in 2016, earning the No. 8 seed in the NCAA Tournament. The Orange started the season 8-0-0 and reach the No. 2 position in the polls. The Orange finished with a 12-4-4 record and made their third-straight appearance in the NCAA Tournament and earned a eight seed. 'Cuse dominated in a 3-0 win in the second round, and lost a close match to North Carolina in the third round.

In 2017, the Orange finished with a losing record and missed out on the national tournament for the first time since 2013. But the following season in 2018, the Orange returned to the NCAA Tournament.

'Cuse returned to their winning ways in 2019, as they finished with a 8-7-5 record and a spot in the NCAA Tournament for the second consecutive year. The Orange knocked off Rhode Island in the first round before falling to St. John's in the second round.

After losing a talented and veteran group, the 2020 and 2021 seasons were shortened years for the program. The 2020 season was shortened and played in both the fall and spring due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Orange finished with a 2-7-4 record.

'Cuse bounced back in 2021, finishing with an 8-8-2 record and narrowly missing out on a berth to the NCAA Tournament. The marquee moment of the season was a 2-0 win over eventual national champion Clemson on Senior Night.

Heading into the 2022 season, the Orange have nine starters returning, and a plethora of talent coming into the program through the transfer portal. 2021 vice captains Noah Singelmann and Amferny Sinclair return, and the Orange add exciting attacking options in Levonte Johnson and Nathan Opoku.

McIntyre has led the Orange to six NCAA Tournament appearances. In those six trips, 'Cuse has a record of 8-4-2.

DEVELOPING THE ORANGE

A staple of McIntyre's legacy as Orange head coach is preparing student-athlete for the next level. In the past seven years, 12 former Orange were taken in the first two rounds of the MLS SuperDraft. Once at the professional ranks, Syracuse alumni have thrived, some playing for both club and country.

Former 'Cuse center back Miles Robinson was taken with the second overall pick in the 2017 MLS SuperDraft by Atlanta United. After a couple of loan spells, The Arlington, Massachusetts native cemented his place in the Atlanta United squad in 2019. Along with starring for his club, Robinson has also been a staple in the United States men's national team since his senior debut in 2019. He played every minute of the 2021 Gold Cup, and scored the title winning goal in extra time against Mexico. Robinson was also a key figure in the United State's qualification for the 2022 World Cup in Qatar. While at Syracuse, Robinson won the 2016 ACC Defender of the Year, and led the Orange to the 2015 NCAA College Cup.

Tajon Buchanan and Kamal Miller are both slated to play a major role in Canada's first World Cup appearance since 1986. Kamal Miller is a defensive anchor for his club CF Montreal and CMNT, while Tajon Buchanan is an electrifying attacking prospect. Buchanan recently moved to Belgian side Club Brugge. Miller, a two-time captain while at Syracuse, was initially drafted by Orlando City SC in the 2019 MLS SuperDraft. Buchanan brokeout in the 2018 season, scoring eight goals on his way to a First Team All-ACC honor. Buchanan was drafted by the New England Revolution with the ninth pick in the 2019 MLS SuperDraft.

REVIVING HIS ALMA MATER

Prior to taking over the Orange, McIntyre spent seven seasons (2003-09) as the head coach at his alma mater, Hartwick College. He guided the Hawks to four 10-win seasons and a 2005 NCAA Championship appearance.

McIntyre succeeded the legendary Jim Lennox in 2003 and promptly led the Hawks to 15-2-1 overall record, the most wins for the program since 1993. The next season, McIntyre was named the regional coach of the year after presiding over a 13-3-3 campaign that featured a nine-game winning streak and an Atlantic Soccer Conference runner-up finish.

A native of Basildon, England, McIntyre and his wife, Jenn, have a daughter, Lyla, and a dog, Elmore.
