LAST TIME OUT

- Syracuse improved to 3-0 at home with a 1-0 victory over UAlbany on Monday.
- Senior Gabriel Mikina found the back of the net at the 50:57 mark, heading in a corner kick from senior Jeorgio Kocovski.
- The Orange outshot the Great Danes, 14-5, while holding the advantage in corner kicks, 7-2.
- Keeper Jahiem Wickham earned the clean sheet in his first collegiate start, turning aside a pair of shots. Wickham has posted a 0.82 GAA over 110:07 minutes of action over the previous two matches.

SETTING THE SCENE

- Syracuse improved to 3-0 at home on Monday after earning a 1-0 victory over UAlbany, extending its program-best unbeaten streak to 18 matches.
- Nearly striking in the 41st minute off a corner kick, the Orange capitalized on another set piece six minutes into the second half.
- Senior Gabriel Mikina lowered his body to head the ball into the bottom left corner following the corner sent in from fellow fourth year Jeorgio Kocovski.

THE SERIES

- Friday's match will be the 20th all-time meeting between the Orange and Cardinals. 'Cuse holds a 12-2-5 advantage in the series.
- Last season, No. 5 Syracuse defeated No. 11 Louisville, 2-1, with goals from Nathan Opoku and Levonte Johnson in the 18th and 29th minutes, respectively.
- The 8 p.m. start time will be the latest the Orange have begun a match since Aug. 26, 2021, versus Drexel (8 p.m.).

SCOUTING THE CARDINALS

- John Michael Hayden enters his fifth year as the head coach of the Louisville men's soccer program.
- The Cardinals are off to their best start in Hayden's tenure, opening the year with a 4-0 record and pair of top-20 wins.
- Louisville opened the season with a 1-0 win over No. 16 Tulsa before most recently earning a 4-2 win versus No. 19 Kentucky on Tuesday.
- Gage Guerra paces Louisville with four goals, while Alex Svetanoff has turned aside 14-of-16 shots and has earned three clean sheets through the first four matches.

OPENING ACC PLAY

- Friday will mark the third time Syracuse will open conference play against Louisville since joining the ACC in 2013, all played at the SU Soccer Stadium.
- The two teams first squared off to open league play on Sept. 11, 2015, when 'Cuse played to a 1-1 draw versus No. 23 Louisville. On Sept. 13, 2019, the Orange and No. 20 Cardinals battled to a nil-nil double overtime draw.
- Since joining the ACC, the Orange are 3-4-3 in league openers.
- Syracuse finished the 2022 season with a 5-1-2 conference record en route to earning the Atlantic Division regular season title. This is the best league record since 2014 (5-2-1).


TOP-10 MATCHUP

- On Aug. 24, then-No. 7 Stanford took down then-No. 8 Creighton, 3-1.





BOSELLI EARNS TEAM OF THE WEEK HONORS

- Lorenzo Boselli was named to the College Soccer News National Team of the Week on Tuesday, Aug. 29.
- Boselli recorded a multi-goal effort in the team's season opener versus Providence, finding the back of the net twice in the first 13 minutes of the match.

WELCOME TO 'CUSE

- Syracuse welcomes 15 new members to the program, including 14 transfers.
- Of the new transfers, five are playing in the fifth year of eligibility while four are seniors.
- The transfers bring a wealth of experience, combining for 561 collegiate games to pair with 90 goals and 75 assists.

STRENGTH IN DEFENSE

- The Orange allowed just two shots on target and five total shot attempts in the first two matches of the season.
- 'Cuse has allowed just three shot attempts in the first half of a contest this season, holding its first two opponents to without a shot attempt through the first 45 minutes.
- The one shot attempt allowed against Binghamton was the lowest total by an opponent since the Orange held Drexel without a shot attempt on Aug. 26, 2021.

FOUR-PEAT FOR LORENZO

- Senior Lorenzo Boselli became a four-time national champion when the team defeated Indiana.
- Boselli previously won three NJCAA national championships at Dallas College Richland.

ORANGE SELECT TEAM CAPTAINS

- Head coach Ian McIntyre announced that Lorenzo Boselli, Jeorgio Kocovski, Noah Singelmann and Buster Sjoberg have been named captains.
- Singelmann becomes a two-time captain after leading last year's squad with Julio Fulcar and Amferny Sinclair.

BIG TIME MOMENTS...

- Syracuse had a 7-1-1 record against Top-25 opponents in 2022.
- In 2021, the Orange went 1-4 against ranked sides.
- Syracuse defeated multiple Top-5 opponents in the 2022 regular season for the first time in school history after taking down No. 1 Clemson, 2-1, on Sept. 16 and No. 4 Wake Forest, 2-0, on Oct. 7.

WORLD CUP

- The Orange had a pair of former student-athletes representing Canada in the World Cup.
- The Canadian squad featured Tajon Buchanan and Kamal Miller.

LEAGUES CUP CHAMPION

- Kamal Miller and his Inter Miami CF squad lifted the 2023 Leagues Cup trophy on Aug. 19.
- Inter Miami defeated Nashville SC, 10-9, in PKs after a 1-1 draw.
- Miller scored on his penalty kick attempt in the fourth round.
- Miller started in all seven Leagues Cup matches, playing the full time in all but one contest.

MLS DRAFT

- The Orange saw a program-best five players drafted in the 2023 MLS SuperDraft.
- Abdi Salim was taken 17th overall by Orlando City SC, while Levonte Johnson was taken with the

29th selection in the first round by the Vancouver Whitecaps.

- Championship heroes Amferny Sinclair and Russell Sheary were both taken in the second round by Real Salt Lake and the LA Galaxy, respectively.
- Buster Sjoberg rounded out the 'Cuse-heavy draft, being taken in the third round by the Vancouver Whitecaps.

USL LEAGUE 2 TEAM OF THE YEAR

- Syracuse had a pair of players named to the 2023 USL League Two Team of the Year.
- Incoming goalkeeper Jason Smith earned the honor for his time with the Park City Red Wolves. He was also the only goalkeeper to be selected as a Divisional Player of the Year.
- Liverpool, N.Y., native Jeorgio Kocovski was also named to the team after spending the summer with the Long Island Rough Riders.
- Kocovski netted four goals in 12 matches for Long Island.

PRESEASON ACCOLADES

- Junior midfielder Giona Leibold was named to the 2023 Atlantic Coast Conference Preseason Watchlist.
- Leibold started in all 22 of his appearances last season, scoring five goals and adding a pair of assists, including the decisive goal in the 83rd minute against Cornell on Nov. 27 to send Syracuse to the Elite 8.

CANADIAN TIES

- Canada is a pipeline for talent for Coach McIntyre and his staff.
- There are six student-athletes on the roster from Canada
- Three Orange come from Brampton, Ontario (Nate Edwards, Olu Oyegunle and Jahiem Wickham).

ORANGE EARN ACADEMIC HONORS

- The Orange were recognized as a 2022-23 College Team Academic winner by the United Soccer Coaches. The squad earned the honor after maintaining a GPA above a 3.0 for the 2022 season.
- Syracuse had 11 members named to the All-ACC Academic Men's Soccer Team in January, including returners Jackson Glenn, Giona Leibold, Julius Rauch, Noah Singelmann and Buster Sjoberg.

CELEBRATING THE CHAMPIONSHIP

- The Orange experienced many different events following its championship.
- The team had a proclamation at City Hall in Syracuse and was recognized at the Senate and Assembly Chambers at the New York State Capitol in Albany.
- In May, 'Cuse traveled across the pond to England where the team visited parts of the country and played in matches against U21 teams.
- The team also visited the White House as part of the College Athlete Day Celebration in June.

In his 14 years at Syracuse, head coach Ian McIntyre re-established the Orange as a national contender year-in-year-out in a highly competitive Atlantic Coast Conference. McIntyre has guided student-athletes in Upstate New York to both on field and off the field success and most recently earned the distinction of becoming a national champion during the 2022 season.

McIntyre has a record of 230-150-72 in his 25 years of coaching experience, and a 123-87-40 tally during his time in the Salt City. He's led his teams to ACC Tournament Championships, NCAA Tournament triumphs and a trip to the College Cup in 2015.

DONNING ORANGE

McIntyre became the 15th coach in Syracuse soccer history on Jan. 6, 2010. During his time in Syracuse, McIntyre has gone about the task of building the Orange into a national contender. That effort began paying dividends in 2012 as Syracuse won 14 games, executing the biggest single season turnaround in school history.

Overall, Syracuse finished 14-6-1 in 2012 and was the most improved team in the nation, posting a win-loss improvement of +8.5. The Orange nearly doubled its number of goals (39) from the previous year and the defense posted 12 shutouts, tied for the third-most in the country. As a result, Syracuse finished second in the BIG EAST Red Division and earned a berth in the 2012 NCAA Championship, just the second time in program history the Orange advanced to the national tournament.

Syracuse continued to perform upon reaching the national stage, knocking off Ivy League champion Cornell and VCU in the opening two rounds to notch the first NCAA Tournament victories in team history. In the third round (Sweet 16), the Orange tied eventual national finalist Georgetown, 1-1, before being eliminated on penalty kicks.

McIntyre and his assistants were rewarded with 2012 BIG EAST Coaching Staff of the Year honors for authoring the breakout campaign.

In 2013, Syracuse's first year in the Atlantic Coast Conference, McIntyre led the Orange to a 10-7-1 record, marking the first time in more than a decade that the team posted double-digit wins in consecutive years. Along the way, the Orange went undefeated in non-conference play (7-0-0), beat two ranked teams (#12 Connecticut and #19 Clemson) and earned its first ACC win, a 2-1 victory at Duke.

The Orange reached unprecedented heights in 2014 when it climbed to No. 1 in the national rankings for the first time in school history. Syracuse won a share of the ACC Atlantic Division and earned a program-best No. 9 seed in the NCAA Tournament. The Orange defeated Penn State on its home field before its season came to an end in the Sweet 16 in a 2-1 overtime loss to Georgetown. Syracuse posted a 16-4-1 record, finishing just one win shy of the single-season school record for victories.

The 2015 squad produced the most successful season in school history. Syracuse, which had to replace seven starters, became the first No. 10 seed to win the ACC Tournament, the first in school history. The Orange earned a program-best sixth seed in the NCAA Tournament. After a first-round bye, they defeated Dartmouth, Seattle and Boston College to advance to the College Cup for the first time in school history. The Orange faced No. 3 Clemson for the third time that season and were tied with the Tigers, 0-0, after 110 minutes of play. Clemson won the penalty kick shootout to advance to the national final. Syracuse ended the season with a 16-5-4 record and was No. 4 in the final NSCAA poll, its highest final ranking in school history.

Syracuse continued its success in 2016, earning the No. 8 seed in the NCAA Tournament. The Orange started the season 8-0-0 and reached the No. 2 position in the polls. The Orange finished with a 12-4-4 record and made their third-straight appearance in the NCAA Tournament. 'Cuse dominated in a 3-0 win in the second round, and lost a close match to North Carolina in the third round.

In 2017, the Orange finished with a losing record and missed out on the national tournament for the first time since 2013. But the following season in 2018, the Orange returned to the NCAA Tournament.

'Cuse returned to their winning ways in 2019, as they finished with a 8-7-5 record and a spot in the NCAA Tournament for the second consecutive year. The Orange knocked off Rhode Island in the first round before falling to St. John's in the second round.

After losing a talented and veteran group, the 2020 and 2021 seasons were transition years for the program. The 2020 season was shortened and played in both the fall and spring due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Orange finished with a 2-7-4 record.

'Cuse bounced back in 2021, finishing with an 8-8-2 record and narrowly missing out on a berth to the NCAA Tournament. The marquee moment of the season was a 2-0 win over eventual national champion Clemson on Senior Night.

Syracuse had a historic 2022 campaign, finishing with a program-best 19-2-4 record. The Orange earned the ACC Regular Season Title, won the ACC Championship and the program's first NCAA Championship after defeating Indiana, 7-6, in PKs.

McIntyre has led the Orange to seven NCAA Tournament appearances. In those seven trips, 'Cuse has a record of 13-4-2.

DEVELOPING THE ORANGE

A staple of McIntyre's legacy as Orange head coach is preparing student-athlete for the next level. In the past seven years, 12 former Orange were taken in the first two rounds of the MLS SuperDraft. Once at the professional ranks, Syracuse alumni have thrived, some playing for both club and country.

Former 'Cuse center back Miles Robinson was taken with the second overall pick in the 2017 MLS SuperDraft by Atlanta United. After a couple of loan spells, The Arlington, Massachusetts native cemented his place in the Atlanta United squad in 2019. Along with starring for his club, Robinson has also been a staple in the United States men's national team since his senior debut in 2019. He played every minute of the 2021 Gold Cup, and scored the title winning goal in extra time against Mexico. Robinson was also a key figure in the United State's qualification for the 2022 World Cup in Qatar. While at Syracuse, Robinson won the 2016 ACC Defender of the Year, and led the Orange to the 2015 NCAA College Cup.

Tajon Buchanan and Kamal Miller are both slated to play a major role in Canada's first World Cup appearance since 1986. Kamal Miller is a defensive anchor for his club Inter Miami CF, while Tajon Buchanan is an electrifying attacking prospect. Buchanan recently moved to Belgian side Club Brugge. Miller, a two-time captain while at Syracuse, was initially drafted by Orlando City SC in the 2019 MLS SuperDraft. Buchanan broke out in the 2018 season, scoring eight goals on his way to a First Team All-ACC honor. Buchanan was drafted by the New England Revolution with the ninth pick in the 2019 MLS SuperDraft.

REVIVING HIS ALMA MATER

Prior to taking over the Orange, McIntyre spent seven seasons (2003-09) as the head coach at his alma mater, Hartwick College. He guided the Hawks to four 10-win seasons and a 2005 NCAA Championship appearance.

McIntyre succeeded the legendary Jim Lennox in 2003 and promptly led the Hawks to 15-2-1 overall record, the most wins for the program since 1993. The next season, McIntyre was named the regional coach of the year after presiding over a 13-3-3 campaign that featured a nine-game winning streak and an Atlantic Soccer Conference runner-up finish.

A native of Basildon, England, McIntyre and his wife, Jenn, have a daughter, Lyla, and a dog, Elmore.
