Thunderbirds Travel To North Dakota

Quickly: Southern Utah University plays the first of two season-ending road games this weekend when the Thunderbirds travel to Grand Forks, N.D. to take on the University of North Dakota in a Big Sky Conference match-up.

Southern Utah (4-5/3-3 Big Sky) evened its Big Sky record last week with a 30-27 win over then-No. 1 Eastern Washington. It was SUU's first home win in Big Sky play and a good way to send the seniors out in the team's final home game of 2012. The Thunderbirds had suffered close losses at home to then-No. 2 Montana State (24-17), Sacramento State (27-22) and Weber State (24-22) in their previous three Big Sky home games. SUU has won both its BSC road contests, however, coming out on top at both Portland State (49-42) and Montana (30-20).

North Dakota (4-5/2-4 Big Sky) traveled to Montana State last weekend and came away with a 55-10 loss to the then-No. 4 Bobcats. UND had snapped a three-game conference losing streak the prior week with a 40-34 home win over Montana.

The Game: Southern Utah (4-5/3-3) at North Dakota (4-5, 2-4), Saturday at 1:05 p.m. (Central), Alerus Center (12,283/AstroTurf).

The Series: Saturday's game will be the sixth meeting between SUU and UND. The Thunderbirds hold a 3-2 edge in the series between the two first-year Big Sky rivals, but North Dakota won the last one, a 26-20 victory last year in Cedar City when the Thunderbirds were ranked 17th and UND was 24th. That win snapped a three-game SUU winning streak over North Dakota, which included a pair of wins in Grand Forks. SUU came out on top 15-14 in the first meeting at UND in 2008 and was a 31-21 winner in 2010 in the other meeting in Grand Forks. Both of UND's wins have come in Cedar City.

The Coaches

A 2010 Eddie Robinson Award nominee, SUU's **Ed Lamb** (BYU, 1996) has a record of 24-28 in his fifth season as the Thunderbird head coach and his fifth season as a head coach overall. Last year Lamb guided the Thunderbirds to their second straight winning season and their first win over an FBS-level opponent (UNLV) since 1997. He led the team to a Great West Conference championship in 2010 when the Thunderbirds went undefeated in GWC play and finished the season with a 6-5 overall mark. Prior to taking over at SUU, Lamb spent three seasons at the University of San Diego where he coordinated the special teams and recruiting and was the Toreros' defensive backs coach. Prior to his time at USD Lamb spent two seasons as defensive coordinator at Idaho. He also served a season at BYU as a linebackers coach and four seasons at the University of Redlands, three as defensive coordinator and one as defensive line coach. Coach Lamb is 3-1 vs. North Dakota.

Chris Mussman (Iowa, 1990), takes a record of 27-25 in four-plus seasons into the game. All five of his seasons as a head coach have been at UND. Coach

Coach Mussman is 1-3 against the Thunderbirds.

Affiliations: Southern Utah is beginning its first season in the Big Sky Conference following eight years as a member of the Great West Conference. North Dakota is also in its first season the Big Sky, following four years in the Great West.

Captains: This year's captains are seniors Brad Sorensen (QB) and Cody Larsen (DT).

Big Sky Players of the Week: Brad Sorensen and Colton Cook were named ROOT Sports' Big Sky Conference Players of the Week for their play last weekend.

Sorensen, a senior quarterback from Grand Terrace, Calif., completed 33-of-43 passes for 392 yards and a touchdown in the Thunderbirds' 30-27 upset of then-No. 1 Eastern Washington on Saturday. He was particularly effective in the second half when he completed 15-of-24 passes for 224. His 21-yard pass to Fatu Moala with 7:01 remaining tied the game at 27-27, then he engineered a 61-yard drive in the final three minutes to set up the game-winning field goal. Sorensen was Co-Offensive Player of the Week, along with Sacramento State QB Garrett Safron.

Cook, a junior kicker from Centerville, Utah, kicked that game-winning field goal, from 36 yards out with three seconds to play. After missing his first field goal attempt, a 42-yarder into a stiff crosswind, he nailed his next three, including 24- and 32-yarders. His two first half field goals allowed the Thunderbirds to be tied at halftime 13-13. He was also a perfect 3-for-3 on extra point attempts and four of his seven kickoffs went for touchbacks.

Brock Miller was named the ROOT Sports Big Sky Conference Special Teams Player of the Week following his performance at Montana. Miller punted seven times for 301 yards and pinned the Grizzlies inside their own 20 yard line four times. Montana didn't have much luck returning Miller's punts either, as the Grizzlies wound up with minus-two punt return yards. Miller's biggest contribution came when he didn't punt the ball, however, instead tucking it and running 22 yards on fourth and two to sustain an SUU drive that led to the field goal that gave the Thunderbirds the lead for good.

Josh Smith was named the ROOT Sports Big Sky Conference Special Teams Player of the Week following his performance at Portland State. The redshirt freshman from South Jordan, Utah (Bingham HS) returned six kickoffs a total of 173 yards, including a 95-yard return for a touchdown to open the second half. His total return yardage ranks fifth all-time on the SUU single-game kickoff return charts and his 95-yard return is tied for the sixth-longest return in SUU history. He is the first player in the Sky to return a kickoff for a touchdown this season.

College Football Performance Awards: Three Thunderbirds were honored by CFPA following the Eastern Washington game: Miles Killebrew, Colton Cook and Zak Browning.

Killebrew, a redshirt freshman safety from Henderson, Nev. (Foothill HS) was named National Punt Returner of the Week. He got the Thunderbirds on the scoreboard first Saturday when he blocked a Jake Miller punt, then scooped up the ball and returned it 41 yards for a touchdown in the first quarter. The touchdown was Killebrew's second of the season, along with a 49-yard fumble return he scored on against New Mexico Highlands University on Sept. 15.

Cook and Browning earned weekly honorable mention honors vs. EWU after Cook hit three field goals, including the 36-yard game-winner, and three PATs, while Browning led the team with 15 tackles, 14 solo, with a tackle-for loss and a fumble recovery.

Three Thunderbirds were honored by CFPA following the Weber State game as well: QB Brad Sorensen, Cook and P Brock Miller. Sorensen completed 33-of-47 passes for 320 yards and a touchdown while Cook converted 3-of-3 field goals and Miller averaged 51.6 yards per punt on five punts.

SUU had two players receive honors for their efforts at Montana, linebacker Zak Browning and Miller. Browning tallied a career- and team-high 18 tackles, including a team-best

seven solo stops and a tackle for loss. Miller's accomplishments are listed above.

Cook earned honorable mention honors for his efforts against Sacramento State. Cook connected on all three of his field goal attempts and an extra point. He hit field goals of 33, 18 and 43 yards in the game.

Josh Smith was also named Kickoff Returner of the Week following his performance at Portland State.

Sorensen and Mitch Jessop received honorable mention honors at quarterback and wide receiver, respectively, for their performances at PSU as well. Sorensen completed 27-of-36 passes for 311 yards and four touchdowns, while Jessop was on the receiving end of nine of those passes, for two touchdowns and 159 yards.

Cody Larsen was National Defensive Lineman of the Week following the New Mexico Highlands game. Larsen tallied six tackles, including four solo stops, in the Thunderbirds' 45-23 win over New Mexico Highlands. All four of his solo tackles occurred in the Cowboy backfield and he wound up with 4.5 tackles for loss, including 2.5 sacks. He also forced two fumbles, recovered another, and had a quarterback hurry in the game.

DE Austin Anderson earned honorable mention following the NM Highlands game after tallying three tackles, two solo, with a half-sack, and recovering two fumbles, including one he returned for a touchdown.

Sorensen earned mention as one of the performers of the week at quarterback for his game at Cal after he completed 31-of-45 passes for 292 yards and four touchdowns against the Bears. SUU defensive end Jeff Tukuafu and Miller earned recognition as impact players from CFPA following the Utah State game. Tukuafu got in on three tackles for loss, including one sack, and finished the night with seven tackles, including two solos which both went for losses. Miller punted nine times for 411 yards and pinned the Aggies inside the 20 yard line four times, he also had a career-long 72-yard boot.

Killebrew Named National Co-Freshman of the Week: SUU free safety Miles Killebrew was named national co-Freshman of the Week by The Sports Network for his performance in the Thunderbirds' 49-42 win at Portland State. Killebrew tallied 15 tackles in the game, including 11 solo stops. At the time it was the highest tackles total by an SUU freshman since the 2002

season when Steve Smith tallied 21 at Arkansas State and the most by any T-Bird since 2009. One of Killebrew's tackles went for a loss and he also broke up a pass against the Vikings.

SUU In The Big Sky and FCS National Ranks:

SUU has nine players ranked among the FCS top-50 in 15 statistical categories this week, while the team figures among the top-50 programs in eight major categories and among the top-30 in three.

Defense: Linebacker Zac Browning ranks third nationally and leads the Big Sky in total tackles with an average of 12.0 per game and he is second in fumbles forced with 0.5 per game, best in the BSC. Defensive tackle Cody Larsen and DE James Cowser co-lead the Big Sky and are tied for 21st nationally in tackles for loss with 1.33 per game while cornerback LeShaun Sims is 23rd in the FCS in interceptions with 0.43 per game, the fourth-best average in the BSC. Larsen and Cowser are tied for fifth in the BSC with 0.56 sacks per game, 63rd-best in the FCS. Larsen is also fourth-best in the BSC in fumbles forced with 0.33 fppg and ninth in fumbles recovered with 0.22 per game.

Offense: Quarterback Brad Sorensen ranks among the FCS top 50 in six categories: he is sixth in total passing yards with 2,551, 10th in completions per game with 25.7, 11th in passing yards per game with an average of 283.4 (2nd BSC), 24th in points responsible for with 13.8 ppg, 17th in total offense with 277.4 yards per game (3rd BSC) and 47th in passer efficiency at 132.79. Wide receiver Mitch Jessop ranks 45th in receiving yards per game, with 74.1 (7th BSC) and Fatu Moala is 28th in receptions per game with 6.1 (4th BSC).

Special Teams: Colton Cook leads the BSC and is second in the nation in field goals per game with 1.78 field goals per game and he is 30th in the country and third in the BSC in scoring at 8.1 ppg (first in the BSC among kickers). Punter Brock Miller is 17th in the FCS with a 42.9 yards per punt average, seventh in the BSC. Josh Smith is 62nd in the nation but second in the BSC in kickoff return average, at 21.8 ypr.

Team: In the team categories, SUU is first in the BSC and second in the nation in turnover margin at plus 1.56, 13th in the FCS and fifth in the BSC in net punting with an average

of 38.0 ypp and 4th/16th in passing offense with 283.4 yards per game. SUU is also 5th/33rd in sacks with 2.33 per game, 41st in the FCS in tackles for loss with 6.3, 8th/42nd in kickoff returns at 21.3 ypr and 8th/46th in punt returns at 8.7 ypr.

In a couple of more obscure categories the Thunderbirds are first nationally in both fumbles recovered with 15 and fewest fumbles lost, with two, second in turnovers gained with 25, third in red zone offense at 94 percent, and 21st in interceptions with 10.

Notes from the Eastern Washington Game: After going without an interception for the first time all season against Weber State the 'Birds got back on track when LeShaun Sims jumped in front of a Vernon Adams pass in the first quarter vs. EWU. It was Sims' team-leading third pick of the season. ... Colton Cook hit three field goals field goals, giving him three games this season with three field goals, the second-highest single-game total in SUU history; his third was not only the game-winner, but it was his 16th of the season, an SUU single-season record ... Brad Sorensen completed a season-high 33 passes against Weber State and against Eastern Washington; the 392 passing yards vs. EWU were a season-high. ... SUU broke up a season-high seven passes, led by Sims with two. ... after missing the Weber State game Brian Wilson returned and led the team with 93 rushing yards on 20 carries. ... Fatu Moala (112) and C.J. Morgan (100) each had 100 or more receiving yards, it was the first time since the 2010 season finale that two T-Birds had broken the 100-yard mark; the 2010 game was at Eastern Washington. ... SUU held EWU to 91 rushing yards, the second-lowest total by a Thunderbird opponent this season, behind New Mex-

ico Highlands' minus-20 yards on the ground.

Into the Record Books: Brad Sorensen moved atop the SUU career-passing list with his 327-yard game against Sacramento State. That game gave him 7,639 passing yards in his three seasons at SUU and moved him past Rick Robins, who threw for 7,441 yards from 1992-96. Sorensen became the first Thunderbird to pass for over 8,000 yards when he threw for 320 against Weber State, and his 392 yards vs. Eastern Washington give him a career total of 8,705. Sorensen also passed Robins to move into second place on the total yards list vs. CSUS. Sorensen now has 8,622 total yards while QB Matt Cannon, who ran for a good portion of his yards, is atop the list with 8,930, from 1997 to 2000. Earlier this season Sorensen set the record for career touchdown passes and completed passes. He currently has 57 TD tosses and has completed 735 passes, and he moved into first place on the pass attempts list vs. Weber State, and now has 1,102.

Young Defense:

First-year players have done well for the Thunderbirds all season, particularly on the defensive side of the ball. The young defenders have dominated the SUU stat sheet in four of the seven games and had significant impact on all six Big Sky contests so far.

A look at SUU's season statistics shows the top five tacklers are first-year starters, and four of those are freshmen, including linebacker Zak Browning, who leads the team with 96 tackles as a true freshman. Miles Killebrew, a redshirt freshman linebacker, is third with 53 tackles, while true

freshman LB Mike Needham is fourth with 52 stops. Red-shirt freshman defensive end James Cowser is fifth with 50 tackles and is the team's co-leader in sacks with 5.0 and tackles for loss with 12. Cornerback LeShaun Sims, another redshirt freshman, has missed two games but he leads the squad with three interceptions and is 10th on the team with 26 tackles.

The two first-year starters who aren't freshmen are senior linebacker Namari Flentroy and junior cornerback Tyree Mills, who are second and eighth on the team with 59 and 37 tackles, respectively.

Six of the top-seven tacklers at Utah State were either starting or playing in their first games, and three of those six were 1-2-3 at Cal as well. Flentroy co-led the team at USU with 13 tackles and one fumble recovery, then was tied for second at Cal with eight tackles. Browning followed up a 12-tackle effort at USU with eight tackles at Cal, including six solo stops and a half-TFL and he also forced a fumble, while Killebrew led the team with 11 tackles, six solo, at Cal following a nine-tackle effort at USU. Clark had 13 tackles at USU and was tied for fifth on the team at Cal with four stops, along with Cowser (who also had an interception, a sack and two TFLs). Junior safety Tommy Collet, Jr., who was a part-time starter last year, was fourth on the list at USU with 10 stops but he missed the next three games before returning against Montana State.

At Portland State the top six SUU tacklers were all first-year starters: Killebrew with a career-high 15, Clark with 12, Browning and Cowser with 10, sophomore DE Austin Anderson with six and J.T. Anderson and Sims, who were tied with Mills with four. Cowser recovered a fumble and threw in 1.5 TFLs with help from Killebrew on one, while Browning and J.T. Anderson each broke up two passes and Killebrew and Clark each broke up one.

Against Montana State it was basically the same cast of characters, as Browning led the way with 15 tackles, followed by Clark, Cowser and Flentroy with five and Killebrew and true freshman LB Mike Needham with four.

Killebrew's 15 tackles at Portland State and Browning's 15 vs. Montana State are the most by a Thunderbird since the 2009 season when Akeem Anifowoshe had 15 in the penultimate game of the season, against Eastern Washington. They are also the most by a true freshman at SUU since 2002 when Steve Smith had 22 at Arkansas State.

Four of the top six tacklers vs. Sac State were freshman, led by Needham's then-career-high 11 stops, including eight solo tackles, and he also broke up a pass. Browning finished with eight tackles and forced a fumble, while Cowser and J.T. Anderson each had four tackles. Anderson also picked off his first career pass vs. the Hornets.

At Montana Browning and Needham had 18 and 12 tackles, respectively, while senior Cody Larsen also had 12, including 1.5 TFLs. Cowser had nine tackles, including a sack, while Collet had seven and Sims had five after returning to the field subsequent to missing the previous two games.

Needham and Browning were again 1-2 on the Thunderbirds' tackles chart vs. Weber State, but in this one it was Needham at the top, with 13 tackles (including 10 solo stops), while Browning had 10. Killebrew was among four players with four tackles vs. the Wildcats, including Mills, Flentroy and junior DT Brad Meyer. Collet was third on the team with five tackles.

Browning had his second career 15-tackle game to lead the team against Eastern Washington, while Needham was second with nine stops and Sims and Collet each had eight. Browning and Needham each had a TFL against the Eagles, Browning recovered a fumble and Sims broke up two passes and intercepted a third.

The Vets Can Play Too: After watching the youth movement on defense in the first two games a handful of proven veterans were the stars of the win over New Mexico Highlands. Junior MLB Chad Hansen (an all-conference performer last year), in his first start of the season, was second on the team (along with Cowser) with seven tackles, including a sack, two TFLs and a PBU, while senior DT Cody Larsen dominated the line of scrimmage, getting into the backfield for 4.5 TFLs, including 2.5 sacks, while forcing two fumbles, recovering another and tallying a quarterback hurry. Although Cowser was the only underclassman among the team's top six tacklers, the younger T-Birds again had in impact vs. NMH, as Sims had four solo tackles and an interception, Killebrew had four tackles and a 49-yard fumble return for a touchdown (the sixth-longest in SUU history), and Austin Anderson got in on a sack and recovered two fumbles, one of which he returned nine yards for a touchdown.

Quiet Excellence: Senior defensive tackle Cody Larsen is quietly having a very strong year. The senior defensive tackle ranks among the nation's leaders in both sacks and tackles for loss despite playing in the middle of the line. He leads the team with five QB hurries and co-leads the team in tackles for loss with 12.0, and in sacks with 5.0. He has also forced three fumbles and recovered two more. During his career Larsen has notched 17 sacks, which ranks sixth all-time on the SUU list.

Good Vibrations: Senior tailback Brian Wilson didn't play against Weber State after suffering an injury at Montana. He got back into action against Eastern Washington, however, and although he didn't start he wound up leading the team on the ground with 93 yards on 20 carries. He has been the Thunderbirds' leading rusher all season but he didn't notch a rushing touchdown until he finally got into the end zone against Sacramento State. It was his fourth TD of the season but the others came on receptions. At Cal he carried 17 times for 74 yards and scored a touchdown on a pass reception. Although he didn't get into the end zone vs. Highlands, he had his best overall day as an offensive player, logging 140 rushing yards on 19 carries, adding another 48 yards on four receptions, and finishing with 215 all-purpose yards after returning one kickoff 27 yards. It was the team's first 100-yard rushing performance since Austin Minefee ripped off 131 yards vs. UC Davis in the ninth game of the season last year and the highest all-purpose total since Minefee also had 140, against Northern Arizona in the fifth game of the 2010 season. Wilson led the team with 64 yards on 19 carries at Portland State and also caught three passes for 18 yards, including a 16 yard TD reception. He was the rushing leader again

vs. Montana State, with 15 carries for 76 yards, and he caught three passes for 14 yards, including a six-yard touchdown catch. He saw his string of leading the team in every game come to an end at Montana, however, when he carried just seven times for 12 yards and Myles Crawford-Harris wound up with a career-high 64 yards on eight carries.

Record Book Performances At PSU: Southern Utah had a handful of performances worthy of the SUU record books at Portland State. Josh Smith's 95-yard kickoff return for a touchdown is tied as the sixth-longest in the school's history, while his 173 KO return yards in the game rank fifth. Brad Sorensen's four-touchdown, 311-yard day also changed the books. Sorensen became just the second Thunderbird to pass for over 7,000 yards in a career (along with Rick Robins) against the Vikings and he tied the second-highest total for TD passes in a game with four, one shy of his own SUU record.

Benchmark Stat: SUU rushed for exactly 100 yards against Eastern Washington. The Thunderbirds have won now consecutive games in which they rushed for 100 yards or more.

Passing Game: After struggling to pass the ball at Utah State SUU has improved in that area in the subsequent games, including a season-high 392 yards through the air vs. Eastern Washington. Brad Sorensen completed 33 passes for the second straight game last week, including a TD pass to Fatu Moala, also for the second straight game. The team finished with a then-season-high 311 yards through the air at Portland State, with four touchdown passes, but the turnaround began at Cal, particularly in the second half. Senior QB Brad Sorensen completed 31-of-45 passes at Cal, tying the eighth-highest completion total in SUU history, for 292 yards and four touchdowns. The TD passes went to Fatu Moala – who had a career-high nine receptions for 85 yards – Henna Brown, Cameron Morgan and Wilson. Against New Mexico Highlands Sorensen was hot and cold in the first half, completing 17-of-27 passes for 163 yards and two touchdowns – both to Moala – but also throwing two interceptions – which were both returned for scores. The Thunderbirds opted to run the ball much of the second half, throwing just eight times with three completions for 49 yards, including one touchdown pass, again to Moala. Once again Moala led the team, with eight receptions for 74 yards and all three TDs. Mitch Jessop had three receptions for 50 yards against NMH. At PSU Sorensen completed 27-of-36 attempts at Portland State, with nine of them going to sophomore WR Mitch Jessop, who finished with two TDs (the first of his career) and a career-high 153 receiving yards. TD passes also went to Easton Pedersen and Wilson at PSU. Sorensen completed 25-of-47 passes for 250 yards and two touchdowns – to Wilson and Jessop – against Montana State, but he did throw two interceptions, including one on a Hail Mary to Jessop in the corner of the end zone as time expired in the game. SUU passed for a season-high 327 yards against Sacramento State, including the team's longest pass play of the season, an 82-yarder from Sorensen to Jessop. Griff McNabb had his first TD reception in the Sac State game as well. At Montana Sorensen took his lumps, with a career-high seven sacks, but he also completed 30 passes for 294 yards and a pair of touchdowns, to Fatu Moala and to Henna Brown, and he also notched his first rushing touchdown of the season. Sorensen threw for another 320 yards against Weber State, when he completed 33-of-47 attempts, including TD passes to Griff McNabb

(his second of the season) and Fatu Moala (his team-leading sixth).

Pick Me Firsts: SUU has 10 interceptions so far this season and seven of them were the interceptor's first career pick while the other three went to players who got their first earlier in the season. Junior SS Tommy Collet, Jr. notched the first interception of his SUU career at Utah State, redshirt freshman DE James Cowser picked off the first pass of his career at Cal, redshirt freshman CB LeShaun Sims had his first against NM Highlands, junior linebacker Randall Nygren had his first at Portland State, junior cornerback Tyree Mills notched his first vs. Montana State, freshman cornerback J.T. Anderson got his first against Sacramento State and freshman safety Michael Byrd got his first at Montana. The other three interceptions this season went to Sims, who got the second of his career at PSU and his third vs. Eastern Washington, while Collet got his second against Sacramento State.

If It's Close, It's A Score: Southern Utah has been very effective in the Red Zone this season, scoring 29 of the 31 times the team has advanced the ball to the opponent's 20 yard line, or 94 percent of the time. The Thunderbirds have scored 18 touchdowns once reaching the Red Zone and have converted 11 scores via field goal. The only blemishes in the Red Zone came in the season-opener at Utah State when the Thunderbirds drove to the Aggie nine yard line but threw an interception on the final play of the game, and against Eastern Washington when an interception spoiled a drive into the zone. SUU converted 28 consecutive drives into the Red Zone into points between the two miss-fires.

Turnovers and Penalties: SUU has won the turnover and the penalty battle in all but one game this season. The exception was at Montana, where the Grizzlies were flagged just four times for 48 yards while the Thunderbirds were penalized nine times. The Thunderbirds have turned the ball over 11 times so far (nine interceptions, two fumbles) this season, while opponents have given it back 25 times, with SUU the beneficiary of 15 fumbles and 10 interceptions. As far as penalties go, SUU has been whistled 56 times for 475 yards while opponents have drawn 83 flags for 728 yards.

Left-footed kickers: For the second year in a row, Southern Utah's kickers are both left-footed. Both specialists have been solid. Brock Miller got off to a good start, punting nine times for 411 yards at Utah State – including a career-long 72-yarder on his first boot of the game – and pinning the Aggies inside the 20-yard line four times, and he has been solid ever since, kicking 53 times for 2,272 yards to rank 17th in the country with his 42.9 yards per punt average. He has pinned the opponent inside the 20 yard line 21 times, with five touchbacks and 11 boots of 50 yards or more. His 51.6 yards per punt average against Weber State is the third-best single-game average in SUU history and his current 42.9 ypp average is the fourth-best.

Placekicker Colton Cook moved atop the SUU single-season field goals list against Eastern Washington when his three makes gave him 16 on the season, one more than Ryan Griffith hit in 2009. Cook hit a career-long 49 yard field goal against Montana State but missed two more long efforts, from 47 and yards, but he got back on track against Sacramento State when

he drilled all three of his field goal attempts and he was 1-for-1 at Montana and 3-for-3 again vs. Weber State. Although he missed his first FG attempt in a stiff wind vs. EWU, he is now 16-19 on field goals and 23-25 on extra points this season. Cook's 30 career field goals rank third on SUU's all-time list, while his 51 career PATs rank fifth.

Kick Start: Cook's three made field goals against Sacramento State and again vs. both Weber State and Eastern Washington tied the total for second-most field goals in a game at SUU. The record for field goals in a game at Southern Utah is five (by Ryan Griffith vs. Dixie State in 2009), but kickers have now booted three in a game seven times for the T-Birds.

Play Of The Day: Cameron Morgan's 37-yard touchdown catch at the end of the first half at Cal was judged as the play of the day by *ESPN*. Morgan jumped high in the air to make a one-handed grab on a ball that had been tipped by a Cal defender, then pulled it in and got his feet in bounds before falling out of the back of the end zone. The circus catch came on an untimed down following a pass interference call with no time remaining in the second period.

Big Crowd: The paid attendance for SUU's game at Cal was 57,745, the largest crowd ever to watch a Thunderbird football game. It bettered the 42,137 that watched SUU play San Diego State in 2009.

SUU's paid attendance vs. Montana State, 8,417, was the largest ever for a day game at Eccles Coliseum.

North Dakota Notes:

North Dakota has been up-and-down this season, winning big vs. South Dakota Mines (66-0) and at Sacramento State (35-13) and playing San Diego State to a 49-41 verdict, but also losing by large margins at Eastern Washington (55-17) and Montana State (55-10). UND is 3-2 at home this season, with wins over SD Mines, Portland State (45-37 in a non-conference game) and Montana (40-34). The home losses both came at the hands of ranked Big Sky opponents, a 35-17 setback against #16 Cal Poly and a 45-38 loss to #12 Northern Arizona.

The North Dakota offense is high-powered, averaging 440.3 yards per game, including 299 through the air and 141.3 on the ground, and 34.3 points per contest. UND's defense has given up an average of 479.9 yards and 35.9 points per game, with 244.4 of the opponents' yards coming on the ground and 235.4 through the air.

North Dakota has used two quarterbacks this season, Marcus Hendrickson (6-1, 197, Sr) and Braden Hanson (6-5, 212, Sr), with Hanson getting the start last week at Montana State. Hanson has completed 105-of-152 passes for 1,387 yards and 11 touchdowns with four interceptions, while Hendrickson is 89-159 for 1,304 yards and 15 scores with three picks.

Wide receiver Greg Hardin (5-11, 167, Jr) leads the team with 51 receptions for 988 yards and 13 touchdowns, while Jameer Jackson (6-3, 233, RFr) has caught 43 balls for 587

yards and six scores. Kenny Golladay (6-4, 185, Fr) and R.J. McGill (5-10, 170, Jr) have 24 and 22 receptions, respectively.

Jake Miller (5-11, 167, Jr) and Mitch Sutton (6-0, 220, Sr) have rushed for 436 and 402 yards, respectively, but Sutton has been the money back, getting into the end zone nine times to Miller's one. Hendrickson is also a threat with his feet when he's in the game, as he has rushed for 252 yards and another score for UND.

Defensively North Dakota has been led by linebackers Garrison Goodman (6-2, 213, Jr) and Ben Peters (6-2, 242, So) with 47 and 46 tackles, while SS Baylee Carr (5-9, 172, So) has 43 stops. End Jay Nelson (6-4, 245, Sr) co-leads the team in both tackles for loss (5.0) and sacks (3.5), while reserve free safety Will Lewis (5-10, 180, Jr) leads the team with two interceptions.

Thunderbird Quick Hits:

- SUU is in its 50th season as a four-year football-playing institution and its 27th as a member of the NCAA. The 2012 season also marks the Thunderbirds' 20th as a member of the NCAA's Football Championship Subdivision and is the school's first in the Big Sky Conference. SUU competed in the Great West Conference the past eight seasons.

- The opener at Utah State marked the eighth time in the last 10 seasons the Thunderbirds have played their first game of the season on the road, including the last three in a row. Last year SUU opened at South Dakota State, in 2010 it opened at Wyoming. The other openers at the road during the past 10 years came at Air Force (2008), at Montana (2007), at Idaho State (2005), at Weber State (2004) and in 2003 the opener was at Nevada. The two openers at home were in 2009 against Dixie State and in 2006 when the 'Birds kicked off the season against Montana Tech at Eccles Coliseum.

- The Thunderbirds have five players returning who earned first-team all-Great West Conference honors last year, including the four preseason all-Americans and linebacker Chad Hansen.

- SUU has eight returning academic all-GWC honorees, including Larsen, senior offensive linemen Russell Petersen and Dylan Fox, junior defensive lineman Brad Meyer (who had the only 4.0 GPA among football players on the list), junior cornerback Tyree Mills, junior linebacker K.C. Rawlinson, sophomore defensive lineman Kouri Jones and sophomore receiver Easton Pedersen.

- SUU plays 10 of its 11 games against NCAA Division I opponents this year, with eight against teams from the championship subdivision and two from the bowl subdivision. Utah State and California are the two FBS opponents and SUU faced a Division II opponent for the first time in two seasons when it hosted New Mexico Highlands.

- About half of the players on the roster are Utah natives, with 45 hailing from the Beehive State. California is the

next-most represented state, with 24, while nine call Nevada home. Four players come from Texas, with two from Florida, Idaho and Washington, and one each from Arizona, Colorado and Tonga.

2012 Preseason Accolades: SUU had four players receive pre-season honors. Senior quarterback Brad Sorensen, senior offensive guard Zach Brackus and senior defensive tackle Cody Larsen all earned preseason all-Big Sky honors as well as being recognized on a handful of preseason all-America teams. Junior offensive guard Gavin Farr also earned several preseason all-America nods. In addition, Sorensen is on the Payton Award Watch List for the second straight season, is the only FCS-level player on the Utitas Award watch list and was named the pre-season offensive player of the year by the Big Sky Coaches.

Big play was a 22-yard scramble on a fake punt that kept a drive alive and led to the field goal that gave SUU the lead for good. **Vs. Weber State:** Punted five times for 258 yards, a 51.6 yard per punt average which ranks as the third-best average in a game in SUU history. Pinned the Wildcats inside the 20 twice, one kick went for a touchback and the 'Cats didn't have any return yardage. **Vs. Eastern Washington:** Punted four times for 146 yards, with one inside the 20 and one touchback.

Brad Sorensen threw for a season-high 392 yards and Colton Cook hit a 36-yard game-winning field goal with three seconds to play as Southern Utah upset FCS No. 1 Eastern Washington, 30-27. Southern Utah overcame a 27-20 fourth quarter deficit with 10 points in the final 7:01 to claim the win.

Eastern Washington took a 27-20 lead in the third quarter on an 18-yard pass from Vernon Adams to Ashton Clark, then the teams exchanged turnovers on their ensuing possessions, with McKenzie Murphy picking off a Sorensen pass at the EWU three, then Zak Browning recovering a Bronson fumble at the SUU 12.

After Browning's recovery the Thunderbirds drove the length of the field to tie the game when Sorensen and Fatu Moala hooked up on a 21-yard pass with 7:01 to play, then after EWU's Jimmy Pavel missed a 37-yard field goal with 2:51 to go the Thunderbirds took over and put together the winning drive.

SUU ran the ball eight times and passed just once – a 15-yard Sorensen-to-C.J. Morgan completion on third-and-four – in driving from their own 20 to the Eagle 19-yard line, setting up Cook's game-winner.

That field goal wasn't the only big contribution from the Thunderbird special teams. The opening score came when redshirt freshman Miles Killebrew blocked a punt then returned it 41 yards for an SUU touchdown in the first quarter. Cook was three-for-four in field goals on the day, hitting three straight after misfiring from 42 yards out in the first period.

SUU rushed for exactly 100 yards, giving them nine straight victories when they rush for 100 or more yards. Brian Wilson led the way with 93 yards on 20 carries. Moala finished with 10 receptions for 112 yards and the touchdown as SUU finished with a season-high 492 yards of total offense. Browning led the team with 15 tackles while Jeff Tukuafu had a pair of sacks and Le-Shaun Sims had an interception for the Thunderbirds, his team-leading third of the season.

Despite outgaining North Dakota in total yards, 376-to-252, mistakes and missed opportunities cost Southern Utah Saturday, as the 17th-ranked Thunderbirds fell behind against No. 24 North Dakota, 16-0, then never climbed back out of the hole in a 26-20 defeat.

Down 26-13 SUU caught a huge break with 6:28 to go when Herman Sword forced a Jake Miller fumble at the UND 27 yard line. The Thunderbirds pulled within 26-20 when Brad Sorensen found Abbel Aiono in the back of the end zone to pull within 26-20.

The Thunderbirds had a chance to tie or win the game with a late drive, which moved to the North Dakota 22-yard line with 11 seconds to play, but Sorensen's pass for Jared Ursua was intercepted by UND's Daryl Brown in the end zone to seal the outcome.

Mistakes plagued the Thunderbirds early. After kicking off but forcing UND to punt on its first possession, things went badly for the Thunderbirds. The Thunderbirds started the ensuing drive from the 2-yard line, but the drive went nowhere and a fumbled snap on the punt rolled out of the end zone for a safety.

After the Fighting Sioux took a 9-0 edge on a 34-yard Jake Miller run SUU mounted a drive, but it stalled at the Fighting Sioux 11 yard line. A delay of game penalty pushed the T-Birds back to the 16, and on a field goal attempt a bad snap was picked up by placekicker Colton Cook, who was tackled at the SUU 49. UND was again able to capitalize, going up 16-0 on a 26-yard Joey Bradley-to-Greg Hardin pass.

Southern Utah finally got on the scoreboard midway through the second period on a 6-yard Sorensen-to-Decker Alexander pass. The T-Birds opted to cut the deficit in half with a 2-point conversion attempt, but Jared Ursua was unable to hang onto Sorensen's pass.

Late in the half the Thunderbirds again drove deep into UND territory, but failed on a fourth-and-one play at the 12 yard line and came away empty and go into the break down 16-6.

Southern Utah cut the UND lead to 16-13 with a 10-yard touchdown pass from Sorensen to Daryl Brown with 5:57 to go in the third quarter, but North Dakota answered with a 45-yard Zeb Miller field goal for a 19-13 advantage, then scored what were ultimately the winning points on a 3-yard Jake Miller run with 12:23 to play.

Heading into Thursday night's game against Utah State, Southern Utah Coach Ed Lamb called the Aggies "the hottest team in the State." USU certainly lived up to that standard, rushing for 265 yards and throwing for 304 more in a 34-3 win over the Thunderbirds.

The Aggies scored the first three times they touched the ball, all in the first quarter, to run out to a 21-0 lead, and although Southern Utah came back to win the second quarter, 3-0, they weren't able to climb back out of the early hole.

USU, which had the sixth-best rushing attack in the NCAA Bowl Subdivision last year, hurt the Thunderbirds with the run but early on did the most damage through the air, taking a 14-0 lead on a pair of long passes.

Utah State put together an 11-play, 97-yard drive on its first possession, with quarterback Chuckie Keeton finding Chuck Jacobs on a 48-yard touchdown pass at the 8:51 mark, then less than three minutes later Keeton hit Matt Austin for a 35-yard touchdown.

A 27-yard Joe Hill run staked USU to a 21-0 lead as time expired in the first period.

The Thunderbirds didn't record a first down or complete a pass in the first period when they had just 19 yards of offense, all on the ground.

The first SUU first down came on a 10-yard Brad Sorensen run at the 14:52 mark of the second period and that play sparked the Thunderbirds, who went on to drive to the USU three yard line before the drive stalled and Southern Utah was forced to settle for a 22-yard Colton Cook field goal. The Thunderbirds' first completion of the game also came on the drive, an 18-yard completion from Sorensen to Griff McNabb.

Hill scored on a 19-yard run at the 11:53 mark of the third period to give the Aggies a 28-3 lead, then went 33 yards on the first play of the fourth period to make the Aggie advantage 34-3.

Sorensen struggled, particularly early on and finished with 153 yards on 12-of-33 passing with one interception, which came on the final play of the game on a ball that was tipped high in the air.

NOTES: Tommy Collet, Jr., intercepted a pass in the third period, his first career interception. Brock Miller had a good night punting the ball, with nine boots for 411 yards, a 45.7 yard-per-kick average. First-year starters Namari Fletroy, Rickey Clark and Zak Browning did well in their first games as starters. Fletroy and Clark co-led the team with 13 tackles each and Browning finished with 12 while Collet had a career-high 10.

Southern Utah played Cal close through the first three quarters Saturday, but the Bears took advantage of a pair of turnovers and a big punt return to score 30 fourth quarter points to pull away and hand the Thunderbirds their second loss in as many games against FBS-level schools this season, 50-31.

Southern Utah took a 3-0 on a 40-yard Colton Cook field goal late in the first period, then Cal tied the game on an 18-yard field goal early in the second period. The Bears then added rushing TDs by CJ Anderson and Isi Sofele and added a 27-yard Vincenzo D'Amato field goal with 25 seconds to play in the half for a 20-3 lead.

The Thunderbirds were able to grab some momentum at the end of the half, however, taking advantage of those final 25 seconds to score their first touchdown of the season. It came on a 37-yard pass from Brad Sorensen to Cameron Morgan, who tipped the ball in the air between three defenders, then brought it down with one hand before falling out of the back of the end zone. Cal challenged the call but it was upheld by video review.

SUU pulled within three points early in the third quarter after taking the opening kickoff of the half and putting together their first sustained drive of the game. A five-yard touchdown pass from Sorensen to Henna Brown capped the 12-play, 75-yard drive and brought SUU within 20-17.

SUU held Cal scoreless in the third period but the Bears scored on the first play of the fourth quarter, then on SUU's subsequent possession Marc Anthony intercepted Sorensen at the Cal 39-yard line and took it back all the way for a touchdown and a 27-17 advantage. The Bears added a 47-yard field goal after Malik Brown lost a fumble at the SUU 36-yard line, then went up 44-17 after Allen muffed a punt but scooped it up and ran around the left side of SUU's coverage 69 yards for another score.

Southern Utah scored on an eight-yard pass from Sorensen to Brian Wilson with 4:48 to go in the game to pull within 44-24 and the teams exchanged late scores, on a 77-yard Daniel Lasco run for Cal and a 7-yard TD pass from Sorensen to Moala.

Fatu Moala caught eight passes for 74 yards and three touchdowns and Brian Wilson rushed for a career-high 140 yards as Southern Utah overcame a sloppy first half to handle Division II New Mexico Highlands Saturday night, 45-23.

The teams combined for seven turnovers, with SUU throwing two interceptions and NMHU throwing one and losing four fumbles. SUU didn't turn the ball over in the second half, however, and three of the four Cowboy fumbles came after halftime.

The Thunderbird defense came up big, forcing the turnovers - Namari Flentroy forced both fumbles that led to touchdowns - holding the Cowboys to minus-20 rushing yards and getting scores from end Austin Anderson and free safety Myles Killebrew. Anderson returned a fumble nine yards for a touchdown late in the second quarter to stake the Thunderbirds to a 21-6 lead, while Killebrew's 49-yard return with 6:27 to go gave SUU the 45-23 lead.

Flentroy finished with eight tackles to lead or co-lead the team for the second time in three games, while Chad Hansen and James Cowser each had seven stops. Cody Larsen was in on six tackles and all but one of them went for losses as he finished with 4.5 tackles for loss and 2.5 sacks for the Thunderbirds. Larsen also forced two fumbles, while Flentroy, Hansen and Cowser each had a sack as well.

New Mexico Highlands got the first and last scores of the first half on interception returns by Abdul Kanneh, who stepped in front of a Brad Sorensen screen pass with 10:00 to play in the second quarter and took it 31 yards for a score. Then, with 40 seconds to go Sorensen scrambled out of trouble at the 46-yard line and heaved a long pass downfield but Kanneh grabbed the ball in front of Moala at the 10 and returned it all the way to bring Highlands to within 21-20 at halftime.

Southern Utah started slowly but finished strong and the result was a 49-42 win at Portland State in the Thunderbirds' Big Sky Conference opener. With the win, SUU's first at Portland State as well as its first in the Big Sky, the Thunderbirds improved to 2-2 overall while PSU dipped to 1-3, 0-1 in conference play.

The Thunderbirds fell behind by 18-points in the first-quarter, but rallied to pull within eight at halftime, then outscored the Vikings 29-14 in the second half when sophomore wide receiver Mitch Jessop caught six passes for 110 yards and his first two college touchdowns.

SUU tied the game with Jessop's second touchdown, then took its first lead, 49-42, on a one-yard Lavel Ika run with 1:35 to play. The T-Birds had to hold on, however, as PSU drove to the SUU two-yard line, where the Vikings had first and goal with 18 seconds to play. SUU's defense held, however, allowing DJ Adams to get to the one on first down, but then knocking down two passes before stuffing Viking quarterback Kieran McDonagh on fourth down as time expired.

The Vikings dominated the first quarter, scoring touchdowns on all three of their drives to take a SUU 21-3 lead into the second period. But from then on SUU asserted itself, winning the second quarter 17-7, the third 15-14 and the fourth 14-0.

Colton Cook hit the first of two field goals in the second period, then Brad Sorensen hit Easton Pedersen for an 18-yard TD, the first of Pedersen's career, and Brian Wilson scored on a reception as well to pull the Thunderbirds within 28-20 at halftime.

Josh Smith returned the opening kickoff of the second half 95 yards to tie the game at 28-28, and the Thunderbirds also scored on a pair of Sorensen-to-Mitch Jessop passes, the first of his career, in the second half.

It was the first win by the Thunderbirds in seven tries at JELD-WEN Stadium.

Brian Flotkoetter caught a three-yard touchdown pass from DeNarius McGhee with 2:59 to play to give No. 2 Montana State a 24-17 lead over Southern Utah, then Steven Bethley intercepted a pass in the end zone as time expired to thwart SUU's last-gasp effort, giving the Bobcats the win and spoiling the Thunderbirds' homecoming game Saturday afternoon.

After falling behind 17-7 in the third quarter the Thunderbirds battled back to tie the game at 17-17 on a career-long 49-yard field goal by Colton Cook with 8:29 to play. SUU then missed a golden opportunity to take the lead when J.T. Anderson forced and recovered a fumble at the MSU 32 on the Bobcats' ensuing possession.

The Montana State defense stymied the Thunderbirds after the fumble, however, holding them to no yards and forcing another 49-yard Cook field goal attempt. This time the kick sailed wide right, leaving the game tied. It was one of three Bobcat turnovers the Thunderbirds weren't able to capitalize on and Thunderbird Coach Ed Lamb pointed to that as a key to the game.

That inability was "the difference in the game," Lamb noted. "We didn't take advantage of good field position and should have gotten field goals at least out of those [turnovers], it was a major problem."

In addition to the turnover on Anderson's fumble recovery, SUU got the ball at the SUU 44 yard line in the first quarter but was forced to punt and got the ball at the MSU 32 on a Tyree Mills interception late in the second period and missed a 47 yard field goal. The only turnover the team capitalized on was a fumble recovery by Shad Ennis after Kouri Jones sacked McGhee late in the third period that led to an 8-yard Sorensen-to-Jessop TD pass early in the fourth.

Montana State was able to capitalize on the momentum shift after the Thunderbirds failed to capitalize on Anderson's play, driving 67 yards in 12 plays and taking the lead on Flotkoetter's TD catch.

Southern Utah executed the two-minute offense on its final possession, however, using 14 plays and driving to the MSU 27 before Sorensen's pass for Mitch Jessop was tipped high in the air in the end zone and Bethley came down with it to preserve the win.

Southern Utah threw for a season-high 327 yards and had 388 yards of total offense, its second-highest total of the season, but Sacramento State outgained SUU 244-127 in the second half to come back from a 16-7 halftime deficit and hand the Thunderbirds their second straight loss, 27-22.

Sacramento State improved to 4-2 overall and 2-1 in Big Sky Conference play while the Thunderbirds dipped to 2-4 and 1-2 in conference games.

The Thunderbirds seemed to take control of the game in the second quarter when they got two Colton Cook field goals and a 28-yard touchdown pass from Brad Sorensen to Griff McNabb to take a 16-7 lead into the break.

The advantage could have been bigger, as the Thunderbirds missed a golden opportunity to put a touchdown on the board rather than a field goal when Sorensen hooked up with Mitch Jessop on the team's longest play of the year, an 82-yard pass play that put the ball on the Hornet one-yard line.

Sac State cornerback Osagie Odiase made a touchdown-saving tackle as Jessop dove for the end zone, and it proved to be a huge tackle. On first down Sorensen bobbled the snap and the Thunderbirds wound up taking a 5-yard loss, then on second and third downs Brian Wilson then ran three and one yards and the Thunderbirds wound up setting for the field goal to pull within 7-6.

SUU took the lead on the McNabb touchdown, his first as a Thunderbird, then tackled on a 43-yard Cook field goal as time expired in the half to take all the momentum into the break.

Hornet quarterback Garrett Safron got the momentum back for the Hornets on the first drive of the second half, however, as on first-and-10 from his own 37 yard line he took a quarterback draw up the middle, then outran the defense to pull the Hornets within 16-14.

Southern Utah extended the lead to 22-14 on a one-yard Brian Wilson run midway through the third, but missed the extra point, Cook's first missed PAT of the season, after a false start backed the T-Birds up five yards.

Safron scored again on an eight-yard run late in the third to pull the Hornets within 22-20 after their two-point conversion failed, and AJ Ellis gave the Hornets the lead for good on a two-yard run with 9:18 to play.

SUU outscored Montana 17-3 in the second half to overcome a 17-13 halftime deficit and upset the Grizzlies 30-20 Saturday afternoon. With the win the Thunderbirds improved to 3-4 overall and 2-2 in Big Sky play while Montana dipped to 3-4 and 1-3 in conference games.

The Thunderbirds got great play from the defense, solid play from the offense and big plays from special teams, blocking a pair of field goals and successfully running a fake punt in the fourth quarter to sustain a drive.

"I thought the difference was on defense. SUU Coach Ed Lamb said, 'I thought we moved the ball pretty well in both halves. ... Montana happened to have some better field position in the first half, by my recollection, and they happened to have some bigger plays and some broken tackles in the first half, it just didn't happen again in the second half and I thought that was the difference in the game'."

Brad Sorensen completed 30 of 53 passes for 294 yards and two touchdowns but it was his two-yard designed quarterback draw in the third period that lifted the Thunderbirds to a 20-17 lead, and although Montana came back to tie the game on a 42-yard Chris Linder field goal in the fourth period, the Grizzlies never led again.

SUU dodged a huge bullet later in the fourth period when Brian Wilson fumbled – his first of the season and just the second the Thunderbirds have lost all year – and Montana recovered on the SUU 38 yard line, but the Thunderbird defense rose to the occasion, holding the Grizzlies to just a field goal.

Southern Utah then put together a 13-play, 64-yard drive that led to a 38-yard Colton Cook field goal that staked them to a 23-20 lead. Punter Brock Miller had a huge play midway through the drive, taking a fake punt 22 yards on fourth and two around the left end to sustain the momentum.

SUU held the Grizzlies on fourth and four, taking the ball on downs with 1:14 to play, then put the game away when Miles Crawford-Harris took a Sorensen handoff 34 yards around the right end, breaking one tackle then running untouched into the end zone for his first rushing TD and a 30-20 lead.

Weber State rolled up a 14-3 halftime advantage, then held off Southern Utah down the stretch to pick up their first win of the season and keep the Thunderbirds winless at home in Big Sky Conference games with a 24-22 victory.

The Wildcats improved to 1-4 in the conference and 1-7 overall while the T-Birds dipped to 3-5 and 2-3 in the conference. SUU is 2-0 on the road in Big Sky play but all three losses have come at Eccles Coliseum.

SUU scored first, taking a 3-0 lead on a 46-yard Colton Cook field goal in the first quarter, but Weber State put up a pair of touchdowns in the second quarter to take a 14-0 lead into halftime. C.J. Tuckett ran three yards for the first Wildcat score and quarterback Mike Hoke ran three for the second.

Southern Utah got the ball to begin the second half and drove to the WSU 11 yard line but the drive stalled after an illegal shift penalty and the Thunderbirds were forced to settle for another field goal.

On Weber State's ensuing possession Hoke and Xavian Johnson hooked up on what was perhaps the biggest play of the game. On the Wildcats' first play from scrimmage Hoke hit Johnson on a screen pass and Johnson did the rest, going 75 yards for a touchdown and a 21-6 WSU advantage.

Southern Utah missed another opportunity on its next possession, as the Thunderbirds again drove into the red zone only to have a penalty kill the drive. This time it was a personal foul that wiped out a six-yard Myles Crawford-Harris touchdown run and forced another Cook field goal.

The Thunderbirds were able to cut the deficit to 21-16 when Moala dove the final three yards into the end zone on a 34-yard hookup with Sorensen with 8:11 to play in the game.

On its ensuing possession WSU got good field position, at the SUU 39-yard line after another SUU penalty, then ran the clock down to 3:43 in eight plays before taking a 24-16 advantage on a 46-yard Shaun McClain field goal.

The Thunderbirds responded, however, driving down and pulling within two when Sorensen found Griff McNabb in the corner of the end zone with 54 seconds to play.

SUU's two-point conversion failed, however, when Trevor Pletcher sacked Sorensen as he scrambled to find a receiver, and the win was clinched when David James corralled the Thunderbirds' on-side kick.
