Big Sky Home-Opener, Homecoming 2012, Thunderbirds Host No. 2 Montana State

Quickly: Southern Utah University hosts Montana State Saturday in the Thunderbirds' Big Sky home-opener. The contest is also SUU's Homecoming game.

The game is being televised live in high definition by ROOT SPORTS.

Southern Utah (2-2/1-0 Big Sky), is coming off a 49-42 win at Portland State in the team's first-ever Big Sky game. SUU has won two straight after opening with back-to-back losses at NCAA FBS-level schools. The Thunderbirds fell behind 21-3 in the first quarter at PSU but came back to take their first lead at 49-42 with 1:35 to play, then pulled off a goal line stand in the final 18 seconds to seal the win.

Montana State (4-0/1-0 Big Sky) also got a win in its Big Sky opener last weekend as the Bobcats stopped Northern Colorado, 41-16, at home in Bozeman, Mont. The Bobcats opened with a home win against Division II Chadron State, 33-6, then traveled to Drake where they picked up a 34-24 victory before downing Stephen F. Austin at home on Sept. 15, 43-35.

At No. 2 Montana State is the highest-ranked team to ever play at SUU. The previous highest-ranked team to play in Cedar City was Northern Iowa, which was No. 4 when it played at SUU in the 1996 season-opener. More recently the Thunderbirds have hosted a trio of teams ranked No. 6 at the time of the game: North Dakota State in 2006 and both Southern Illinois and McNeese State in 2007. The highest-ranked teams SUU has ever faced were North Dakota State and Northern Iowa in 2007 when the Bison were No. 1 in the coaches poll and the Panthers were the top-ranked team in the *SportsNetwork* poll at the time of the meetings as well as at the end of the season. That 2007 squad faced a brutal schedule, with seven opponents ranked in the final polls and nine of 11 ranked at one time or another during the season.

The Game: Montana State (4-0/1-0) at Southern Utah (1-2/0-0), Saturday at 1:30 p.m. (MDT), Eccles Coliseum (8,500, Hellas MatrixTurf), Cedar City, Utah.

The Series: MSU holds a 2-0 lead in the series. Both previous meetings have been in Bozeman, Mont., where the Bobcats claimed a 32-31 win in 1993 and a 7-3 victory in 2007.

Next Up/Remaining Schedule:

Southern Utah remains at home next week for a game against Sacramento State, scheduled to kick off at 1:00 p.m.

Following a road trip to Montana on Oct. 13 the 'Birds return home for their final two home games of the season. SUU hosts Weber State on Oct. 20, then Eastern Washington visits Cedar City on Oct. 27.

The regular season wraps up with road games at North Dakota (Nov. 3) and Northern Arizona (Nov. 10). Should SUU qualify for the FCS playoffs, the Thunderbirds would have a bye week between the NAU game and the FCS first round.

The Coaches

A 2010 Eddie Robinson Award nominee, SUU's **Ed Lamb** (BYU, 1996) has a record of 23-25 in his fifth season as the Thunderbird head coach and his fifth season as a head coach overall. Last year Lamb guided the Thunderbirds to their second straight winning season and their first win over an FBS-level opponent (UNLV) since 1997. He led the team to a Great West Conference championship in 2010 when the Thunderbirds went undefeated in GWC play and finished the season with a 6-5 overall mark. Prior to taking over at SUU, Lamb spent three seasons at the University of San Diego where he coordinated the special teams and recruiting and was the Toreros' defensive backs coach. Prior to his time at USD Lamb spent two seasons as defensive coordinator at Idaho. He also served a season at BYU as a linebackers coach and four seasons at the University of Redlands, three as defensive coordinator and one as defensive line coach. Lamb is 0-0 vs. Montana State.

Montana State's **Rob Ash** (Cornell College, 1973), is 43-20 in his fourth season at MSU and is 219-119-5 in his 33rd season overall as a head coach. Prior to taking the reins at MSU Ash spent 18 seasons as the head coach at Drake and nine as head man at Juniata College. Coach Ash is 0-0 vs. SUU.

Affiliations: Southern Utah is beginning its first season in the Big Sky Conference following eight years as a member of the Great West Conference. Montana State is also a member of the Big Sky.

Captains: This year's captains are seniors Brad Sorensen (QB) and Cody Larsen (DT).

Smith Is Big Sky Player of the Week: Southern Utah's Josh Smith was named the ROOT Sports Big Sky Conference Special Teams Player of the Week following his performance at Portland State. The redshirt freshman from South Jordan, Utah (Bingham HS) returned six kickoffs a total of 173 yards, including a 95-yard return for a touchdown to open the second half. His total return yardage ranks fifth all-time on the SUU single-game kickoff return charts and his 95-yard return is tied for the sixth-longest return in SUU history. He is the first player in the Sky to return a kickoff for a touchdown this season.

College Football Performance Awards: Smith was also named Kickoff Returner of the Week by the CFPA following his performance at Portland State.

Brad Sorensen and Mitch Jessop received honorable mention honors at quarterback and wide receiver, respectively, for their performances at PSU as well. Sorensen completed 27-of-36 passes for 311 yards and four touchdowns, while Jessop was on the receiving end of nine of those passes, for two touchdowns and 159 yards.

Cody Larsen was National Defensive Lineman of the Week by the CFPA following the New Mexico Highlands game. Larsen, a 6-4, 300-pound defensive tackle from Draper, Utah (Jordan HS) tallied six tackles, including four solo stops, in the Thunderbirds' 45-23 win over New Mexico Highlands. All four of his solo tackles occurred in the Cowboy backfield and he wound up with 4.5 tackles for loss, including 2.5 sacks. He also forced two fumbles, recovered another, and had a quarterback hurry in the game.

DE Austin Anderson earned honorable mention from the CFPA following the NM Highlands

game after tallying three tackles, two solo, with a half-sack, and recovering two fumbles, including one he returned for a touchdown.

Sorensen earned mention as one of the performers of the week at quarterback for his game at Cal after he completed 31-of-45 passes for 292 yards and four touchdowns against the Bears.

SUU defensive end Jeff Tukuafu and punter Brock Miller earned recognition as impact players from CFPA following the Utah State game. Tukuafu got in on three tackles for loss, including one sack, and finished the night with seven tackles, including two solos which both went for losses. Miller punted nine times for 411 yards and pinned the Aggies inside the 20 yard line four times, he also had a career-long 72-yard boot.

SUU In The FCS National Ranks:

SUU has 10 players ranked among the FCS top-50 in 14 statistical categories this week, while the team figures among the top-50 programs in eight major categories and among the top-30 in five.

Defense: Defensive tackle Cody Larsen ranks seventh in the FCS in sacks with 1.0 per game and eighth in tackles for loss with an average of 1.75 per game while DE James Cowser is 19th in TFLs with an average of 0.5 per game, while linebacker Zac Browning ranks 36th in total tackles with an average of 10.0 per game and safety Miles Killebrew is 43rd at 9.75.

Offense: Quarterback Brad Sorensen ranks among the top 50 in six categories: he is 12th in points responsible for with 17.5 ppg, 17th in total passing yards with 968, 20th in completions per game with 22.5, 23rd in passing yards per game at 242.0, 32nd in passing efficiency at 134.43 and 34th in total offense with 236.3 ypg. Wide receiver Fatu Moala ranks 26th in receptions per game with 6.25 and WR Mitch Jessop is just out of the top-50, in 51st, in receiving yards per game with an average of 70.33.

Special Teams: Brock Miller ranks 13th in punting with an average of 43.3 ypp while Colton Cook is tied for 22nd in field goals per game with 1.25 and Josh Smith is 39th in kickoff return average at 23.35 ypr.

Team: In the team categories, SUU is sixth in turnover mar-

gin at plus-1.75, 21st in net punting at 37.46 ypp, 22nd in sacks with 2.5 per game, 25th in tackles for loss at 7.0 per game and 28th in scoring with 32.0 ppg. SUU is also 31st in passing offense with 242 yards per game, 32nd in kickoff returns at 22.96 ypr and 35th in passing efficiency with a rating of 134.41.

2012 Preseason Accolades: SUU had four players receive pre-season honors. Senior quarterback Brad Sorensen, senior offensive guard Zach Brackus and senior defensive tackle Cody Larsen all earned preseason all-Big Sky honors as well as being recognized on a handful of preseason all-America teams. Junior offensive guard Gavin Farr also earned several preseason all-America nods. In addition, Sorensen is on the Payton Award Watch List for the second straight season, is the only FCS-level player on the Unitas Award watch list and was named the pre-season offensive player of the year by the Big Sky Coaches.

Record Book Performances At PSU: Southern Utah had a handful of performances worthy of the SUU record books at Portland State. Josh Smith's 95-yard kickoff return for a touch-down is tied as the sixth-longest in the school's history, while his 173 KO return yards in the game rank fifth. Brad Sorensen's four-touchdown, 311-yard day also changed the books. Sorensen now has 7,062 passing yards to become just the second Thunderbird to pass for over 7,000 yards in a career (along with Rick Robins). Sorensen also moved into third place on the total plays list with 1,079 (passing Wes Marshall's 1,046 from 2003-07) and he tied the second-highest total for TD passes in a game with four.

Skid Stopped: SUU's win at Portland State was the Thunderbirds' first in six tries vs. the Vikings at JELD-WEN Field (formerly Civic Stadium).

Youth Steps Up: First-year players have done well for the Thunderbirds so far this season, particularly on the defensive side of the ball. They dominated Southern Utah's stat sheet on the defensive side of the ball at Utah State and at Portland State, and three of them found themselves at the top of the sheet following the Cal game as well. Six of the top-seven tacklers at USU were either starting or playing in their first games, and three of those six were 1-2-3 at Cal as well. Senior OLB Namari Flentroy (who is in his first season on the team) co-led the team at USU with 13 tackles and one fumble recovery, then was tied for second at Cal with eight tackles. True freshman Zak Browning followed up a 12-tackle effort at USU with eight tackles at Cal, including six solo stops and a half-TFL and he also forced a fumble, while Miles Killebrew led the team with 11 tackles, six solo, at Cal following a nine-tackle effort at USU. Senior OLB Rickey Clark,

who is in his first season as a starter, had 13 tackles at USU and was tied for fifth on the team at Cal with four stops, along with freshman DE James Cowser (who also had an interception, a sack and two TFLs), sophomore DE Austin Anderson, sophomore cornerback Gordon Garrett and veterans Cody Larsen, Randall Nygren and Brennan Fjord. Junior safety Tommy Collet, Jr., who was a part-time starter last year, was fourth on the list at USU with 10 stops but he sat out the Cal game. Junior cornerback Tyree Mills, who is also in his first year as a starter, had five tackles at Cal and eight at USU, where he also had the team's lone pass deflection. At Portland State the top six SUU tacklers were all first-year starters: Killebrew with a career-high 15, Clark with 12, Browning and Cowser with 10, Austin Anderson with six and J.T. Anderson and Sims, who were tied with Mills with four. Cowser recovered a fumble and threw in 1.5 TFLs with help from Killebrew on one, while Browning and J.T. Anderson each broke up two passes and Killebrew and Clark each broke up one.

Killebrew's 15 tackles at Portland State were the most by a Thunderbird since the 2009 season when Akeem Anifowoshe had 15 in the penultimate game of the season, against Eastern Washington.

The Vets Can Play Too: After watching the youth movement on defense in the first two games a handful of proven veterans were the stars of the win over New Mexico Highlands. Although Namari Flentroy is a first-season starter, he is a senior, and the linebacker led the team for the second time in three games with eight tackles, five solo, including a sack, two forced fumbles, a QBH and a pass break up. Junior MLB Chad Hansen, in his first start of the season, co-led the team (along with freshman James Cowser) with seven tackles, including a sack, two TFLs and a

Thunderbirds Host Montana State 6-6-6-6-6

PBU, while senior DT Cody Larsen dominated the line of scrimmage, getting into the backfield for 4.5 TFLs, including 2.5 sacks, while forcing two fumbles, recovering another and tallying a quarterback hurry. Although Cowser was the only underclassman among the team's top six tacklers, the younger T-Birds again had in impact vs. NMH, as redshirt freshman LeShaun Sims had four solo tackles and an interception, redshirt freshman safety Miles Killebrew had four tackles and a 49-yard fumble return for a touchdown (the sixth-longest in SUU history), while Austin Anderson got in on a sack and recovered two fumbles, one of which he returned nine yards for a touchdown.

Good Vibrations: SUU struggled to move the ball at Utah State, particularly on the ground, but senior tailback Brian Wilson has been effective in the last three games. At Cal he carried 17 times for 74 yards and scored a touchdown on a pass reception. Although he didn't get into the end zone vs. Highlands, he had his best overall day as an offensive player, logging 140 rushing yards on 19 carries, adding another 48 yards on four receptions, and finishing with 215 all-purpose yards after returning one kick-off 27 yards. It was the team's first 100-yard rushing performance since Austin Minefee ripped off 131 yards vs. UC Davis in the ninth game of the season last year and the highest total since Minefee also had 140, against Northern Arizona in the fifth game of the 2010 season. Wilson led the team with 64 yards on 19 carries at PSU and also caught three passes for 18 yards, including a 16 yard TD reception.

Benchmark Stat: SUU has won eight consecutive games in which it rushed for 100 yards.

Passing Game: After struggling to pass the ball at Utah State SUU has improved in that area in the last three games. The team finished with a season-high 311 yards through the air at Portland State, with four touchdown passes, but the turnaround began at Cal, particularly in the second half. Brad Sorensen completed 31-of-45 passes at Cal, tying the eighth-highest completion total in SUU history, for 292 yards and four touchdowns. The TD passes went to Fatu Moala – who had a career-high nine receptions for 85 yards – Henna Brown, Cameron Morgan and Wilson. Against New Mexico Highlands Sorensen was hot and cold in the first half, completing 17-of-27 passes for 163 yards and two touchdowns – both to Moala – but also throwing two interceptions – which were both returned for scores. The Thunderbirds opted to run the ball much of the second half, throwing just eight times with three completions for 49 yards, including one touchdown pass, again to Moala. Once again Moala led the team, with eight receptions for 74 yards and all three TDs. Mitch Jessop had three receptions for 50 yards against NMH. At PSU Sorensen completed 27-of-36 attempts at Portland State, with nine of them going to sophomore WR Mitch Jessop, who finished with two TDs (the first of his career) and a career-high 153 receiving yards. TD passes also went to Easton Pedersen and Wilson at PSU.

Pick Me Firsts: SUU has five interceptions so far this season and four of the five were the interceptor's first. Junior SS Tommy Collet, Jr. notched the first interception of his SUU career at Utah State, redshirt freshman DE James Cowser picked off the first pass of his career at Cal, redshirt freshman CB LeShaun Sims had his first against NM Highlands and junior linebacker Randall Nygren had his first at Portland State. Sims got the sec-

ond of his career at PSU as well.

Turnovers and Penalties: SUU has won the turnover and the penalty battle in each game. The Thunderbirds have turned the ball over six times so far (five interceptions, one fumble), while opponents have given it back 13 times, with SUU the beneficiary of eight fumbles and five interceptions. As far as penalties go, SUU has been whistled 26 times for 222 yards while opponents have drawn 47 flags for 416 yards.

Left-footed kickers: For the second year in a row, Southern Utah's kickers are both left-footed. Both specialists are off to good starts. At Utah State Brock Miller punted nine times for 411 yards – including a 72-yarder on his first boot of the game – and pinned the Aggies inside the 20-yard line four times, at Cal he booted six punts 250 yards, a 41.7 yard average, pinning the Bears inside the 20 twice. Cal did return one punt for a touchdown, but it was certainly no fault of Miller's, as the receiver – Cal all-American Keenan Allen – muffed the fair catch, then scooped it up and ran 69 yards around the right end for the score. Just one punt was returned more than 10 yards at USU and just two were returned at all. Highlands he had six punts for 266 yards, a 44.3 yard average with three inside the 20, one touchback and only one returned, for minus-8 yards. At PSU he averaged just 39.8 ypp but the three returned punts netted just eight yards and he pinned the Vikings inside the 20 once. Kicker Colton Cook went 1-for-1 on field goal attempts in the first three games and 2-for-2 at Portland State. He has averaged 62.5 yards on his kickoffs, including a 62.9 average at PSU, 65.0 at USU, 62.6 at home vs. NM Highlands and 60.4 at Cal.

Play Of The Day: Cameron Morgan's 37-yard touchdown catch at the end of the first half at Cal was judged as the play of the day by *ESPN*. Morgan jumped high in the air to make a one-handed grab on a ball that had been tipped by a Cal defender, then pulled it in and got his feet in bounds before falling out of the back of the end zone. The circus catch came on an untimed down following a pass interference call with no time remaining in the second period.

Big Crowd: The paid attendance for SUU's game at Cal was 57,745, the largest crowd ever to watch a Thunderbird football game. It bettered the 42,137 that watched SUU play San Diego State in 2009.

Stopped: The Thunderbird defense rose to the occasion against New Mexico Highlands, limiting an offense which had been averaging 189 rushing and over 505 total yards per game to 346 yards, including minus-20 on the ground. The rushing total was the lowest by an SUU opponent since the 1999 season when the team limited Fort Lewis to minus-26 yards on the ground.

Thunderbird Quick Hits:

- SUU is in its 50th season as a four-year football-playing institution and its 27th as a member of the NCAA. The 2012 season also marks the Thunderbirds' 20th as a member of the NCAA's Football Championship Subdivision and is the school's first in the Big Sky Conference. SUU competed in the Great West Conference the past eight seasons.
- The opener at Utah State marked the eighth time in the

last 10 seasons the Thunderbirds have played their first game of the season on the road, including the last three in a row. Last year SUU opened at South Dakota State, in 2010 it opened at Wyoming. The other openers at the road during the past 10 years came at Air Force (2008), at Montana (2007), at Idaho State (2005), at Weber State (2004) and in 2003 the opener was at Nevada. The two openers at home were in 2009 against Dixie State and in 2006 when the 'Birds kicked off the season against Montana Tech at Eccles Coliseum.

- The Thunderbirds have five players returning who earned first-team all-Great West Conference honors last year, including the four preseason all-Americans and linebacker Chad Hansen.

- SUU has eight returning academic all-GWC honorees, including Larsen, senior offensive linemen Russell Petersen and Dylan Fox, junior defensive lineman Brad Meyer (who had the only 4.0 GPA among football players on the list), junior cornerback Tyree Mills, junior linebacker K.C. Rawlinson, sophomore defensive lineman Kouri Jones and sophomore receiver Easton Pedersen.

- SUU plays 10 of its 11 games against NCAA Division I opponents this year, with eight against teams from the championship subdivision and two from the bowl subdivision. Utah State and California are the two FBS opponents and SUU faces a Division II opponent for the first time in two seasons when it hosts New Mexico Highlands.

- About half of the players on the roster are Utah natives, with 45 hailing from the Beehive State. California is the next-most represented state, with 24, while nine call Nevada home. Four players come from Texas, with two from Florida, Idaho and Washington, and one each from Arizona, Colorado and Tonga.

Coaching Lineup: The SUU staff returns almost intact for 2012, with Head Coach Ed Lamb entering his fifth season on the SUU sidelines. The only change in the staff this year is former passing game coordinator Paul Peterson has moved on to take the offensive coordinator duties at Sacramento State. Justin Ena, an NFL veteran and former BYU standout, will continue as defensive coordinator and will work with linebackers. Former BYU and Utah assistant Steve Clark will again handle offensive coordinator duties. Ryan Hunt, a former all-conference performer at offensive tackle for SUU, returns as defensive line coach while Demario Warren, a former UC Davis running back, returns as secondary coach and has taken some of Peterson's recruiting duties. Teag Whiting, another NFL veteran and former BYU standout, is in his third season as offensive line coach after working as a graduate assistant in 2009. Ronnie Pentz is in his fourth season with the team, his second co-coordinating special teams and his second as tight ends coach after working with the linebackers his first two seasons. Aaron Fernandez, an all-GWC defensive tackle in 2008, is the co-linebackers coach and co-recruiting coordinator, while former Thunderbird standout WR/KR Justin Wattenscheid enters his third season with the team as co-special teams coordinator and running backs coach. Fesi Sitake, a former all-conference receiver for the Thunderbirds who worked as a student assistant last year, moves into a full-time

position this year, working with the team's receivers.

SUU's Eccles Coliseum is one of two football stadiums in the world sporting both the Olympic Rings and an Olympic Cauldron *inside* the stadium (The Los Angeles Coliseum is the other). Southern Utah's Olympic Cauldron, donated by DCI Incorporated of Utah, was lit by the Olympic Torch Feb. 5, 2002, during the Olympic Torch Relay.

Bobcat Notes:

Montana State will be playing its second road game of the season Saturday. The Bobcats played at Drake – where Coach Rob Ash spent 18 seasons as head coach – on Sept. 8, where they picked up a 34-24 win.

The Bobcats have been potent on the offensive side of the ball and stingy when they've played defense. Offensively MSU ranks 12th in the nation in scoring at 37.75 points per game and the Bobcats are 14th in total offense with 449.25 yards per game, 271 through the air and 178.25 on the ground. The MSU rushing defense is the fourth-ranked unit in the nation, allowing just 62.0 yards per game, and MSU has given up an average of 244.5 passing yards per game.

Quarterback DeNarius McGhee (6-0, 210, Jr) has passed for 261 yards and run for another 33.2 per game this season to rank 11th in the nation in total offense, at 294.25 yards per game. McGhee is the team's leading rusher, behind running back Cody Kirk (5-10, 208, Jr), who averages 82.0 yards per game and has six touchdowns.

McGhee has completed 107-of-157 passes for 1,044 yards and nine touchdowns with four interceptions. His favorite target has been Tanner Bleskin (6-3, 219, Jr), who has 32 receptions for 420 yards and two TDs. Bleskin ranks eighth in the nation in receptions per game and 12th in receiving yards. Jon Ellis (5-10, 180, Jr; 17 receptions, 175 yards) and Tray Robinson (6-1, 221, Jr; 15 receptions, 101 yards) both have three TD grabs and Everett Gilbert (5-9, 195, Jr) has the second-highest average per catch on the team with 13 receptions for 150 yards, 11.5 yards per catch.

Defensively, linebackers Jody Owens (6-1, 222, So) and Na'a Moealiola (5-11, 217, Jr) rank 1-2 on the team with 31 and 26 tackles, respectively. CB Deonte Flowers (5-11, 175, So) and safety Joel Fuller (6-0, 199, Sr) each have 18 tackles. DE Caleb Schreibeis (6-3, 253, Sr) leads the team in sacks (2.0) and tackles for loss (3.5) while a trio of Bobcats, FS Steven Bethley (5-11, 210, So), LB Aleksei Grosulak (5-10, 215, So) and LB Alex Singleton (6-2, 227, So), each have an interception.

Southern Utah and No. 13 Montana State battled for 60 minutes, and although the Thunderbirds out-gained the Bobcats by 100 yards, 317-to-217, MSU logged out a 7-3 win on a muddy, sloppy afternoon.

Overnight storms dropped several inches of snow on Martel Field, and although it was cleared before the game, the conditions were sloppy as wet snow continued to fall throughout the first half.

Southern Utah's defense allowed just one Bobcat drive all game, a 98-yarder in the first half, but that drive resulted in the game's only touchdown, which came on a 7-yard Aaron Mason run up the middle early in the second period.

SUU had chances to score in the first half but a short Steve Pulver field goal attempt was blocked and a holding call wiped out a 50-yard pass which would have given the Thunderbirds the ball at the one yard line in the final minute of the half.

The Thunderbirds did get on the scoreboard in the third quarter when Pulver hit a 48-yard field goal with 11:39 to play in the period.

Southern Utah's defense shut MSU down in the second half, limiting the Bobcats to under 60 yards of offense, and although the Thunderbirds piled up over 200 yards after halftime, a pair of interceptions symied their efforts to score more than the field goal.

SUU gave itself a chance to win at the end, forcing a Bobcat punt with 2:12 to play, then driving from its own 13 to the Montana State 11-yard line with 53 seconds to play, but on second down from the 11 MSU's Kory Austin picked off a Wes Marshall pass in the end zone to seal the outcome.

Heading into Thursday night's game against Utah State, Southern Utah Coach Ed Lamb called the Aggies "the hottest team in the State." USU certainly lived up to that standard, rushing for 265 yards and throwing for 304 more in a 34-3 win over the Thunderbirds.

The Aggies scored the first three times they touched the ball, all in the first quarter, to run out to a 21-0 lead, and although Southern Utah came back to win the second quarter, 3-0, they weren't able to climb back out of the early hole.

USU, which had the sixth-best rushing attack in the NCAA Bowl Subdivision last year, hurt the Thunderbirds with the run but early on did the most damage through the air, taking a 14-0 lead on a pair of long passes.

Utah State put together an 11-play, 97-yard drive on its first possession, with quarterback Chuckie Keeton finding Chuck Jacobs on a 48-yard touchdown pass at the 8:51 mark, then less than three minutes later Keeton hit Matt Austin for a 35-yard touchdown.

A 27-yard Joe Hill run staked USU to a 21-0 lead as time expired in the first period.

The Thunderbirds didn't record a first down or complete a pass in the first period when they had just 19 yards of offense, all on the ground.

The first SUU first down came on a 10-yard Brad Sorensen run at the 14:52 mark of the second period and that play sparked the Thunderbirds, who went on to drive to the USU three yard line before the drive stalled and Southern Utah was forced to settle for a 22-yard Colton Cook field goal. The Thunderbirds' first completion of the game also came on the drive, an 18-yard completion from Sorensen to Griff McNabb.

Hill scored on a 19-yard run at the 11:53 mark of the third period to give the Aggies a 28-3 lead, then went 33 yards on the first play of the fourth period to make the Aggie advantage 34-3.

Sorensen struggled, particularly early on and finished with 153 yards on 12-of-33 passing with one interception, which came on the final play of the game on a ball that was tipped high in the air.

NOTES: Tommy Collet, Jr., intercepted a pass in the third period, his first career interception. Brock Miller had a good night punting the ball, with nine boots for 411 yards, a 45.7 yard-per-kick average. First-year starters Namari Fletroy, Rickey Clark and Zak Browning did well in their first games as starters. Fletroy and Clark co-led the team with 13 tackles each and Browning finished with 12 while Collet had a career-high 10.

Southern Utah played Cal close through the first three quarters Saturday, but the Bears took advantage of a pair of turnovers and a big punt return to score 30 fourth quarter points to pull away and hand the Thunderbirds their second loss in as many games against FBS-level schools this season, 50-31.

Southern Utah took a 3-0 on a 40-yard Colton Cook field goal late in the first period, then Cal tied the game on an 18-yard field goal early in the second period. The Bears then added rushing TDs by CJ Anderson and Isi Sofele and added a 27-yard Vincenzo D'Amato field goal with 25 seconds to play in the half for a 20-3 lead.

The Thunderbirds were able to grab some momentum at the end of the half, however, taking advantage of those final 25 seconds to score their first touchdown of the season. It came on a 37-yard pass from Brad Sorensen to Cameron Morgan, who tipped the ball in the air between three defenders, then brought it down with one hand before falling out of the back of the end zone. Cal challenged the call but it was upheld by video review.

SUU pulled within three points early in the third quarter after taking the opening kickoff of the half and putting together their first sustained drive of the game. A five-yard touchdown pass from Sorensen to Henna Brown capped the 12-play, 75-yard drive and brought SUU within 20-17.

SUU held Cal scoreless in the third period but the Bears scored on the first play of the fourth quarter, then on SUU's subsequent possession Marc Anthony intercepted Sorensen at the Cal 39-yard line and took it back all the way for a touchdown and a 27-17 advantage. The Bears added a 47-yard field goal after Malik Brown lost a fumble at the SUU 36-yard line, then went up 44-17 after Allen muffed a punt but scooped it up and ran around the left side of SUU's coverage 69 yards for another score.

Southern Utah scored on an eight-yard pass from Sorensen to Brian Wilson with 4:48 to go in the game to pull within 44-24 and the teams exchanged late scores, on a 77-yard Daniel Lasco run for Cal and a 7-yard TD pass from Sorensen to Moala.

Fatu Moala caught eight passes for 74 yards and three touchdowns and Brian Wilson rushed for a career-high 140 yards as Southern Utah overcame a sloppy first half to handle Division II New Mexico Highlands Saturday night, 45-23.

The teams combined for seven turnovers, with SUU throwing two interceptions and NMHU throwing one and losing four fumbles. SUU didn't turn the ball over in the second half, however, and three of the four Cowboy fumbles came after halftime.

The Thunderbird defense came up big, forcing the turnovers - Namari Flentroy forced both fumbles that led to touchdowns - holding the Cowboys to minus-20 rushing yards and getting scores from end Austin Anderson and free safety Myles Killebrew. Anderson returned a fumble nine yards for a touchdown late in the second quarter to stake the Thunderbirds to a 21-6 lead, while Killebrew's 49-yard return with 6:27 to go gave SUU the 45-23 lead.

Flentroy finished with eight tackles to lead or co-lead the team for the second time in three games, while Chad Hansen and James Cowser each had seven stops. Cody Larsen was in on six tackles and all but one of them went for losses as he finished with 4.5 tackles for loss and 2.5 sacks for the Thunderbirds. Larsen also forced two fumbles, while Flentroy, Hansen and Cowser each had a sack as well.

New Mexico Highlands got the first and last scores of the first half on interception returns by Abdul Kanneh, who stepped in front of a Brad Sorensen screen pass with 10:00 to play in the second quarter and took it 31 yards for a score. Then, with 40 seconds to go Sorensen scrambled out of trouble at the 46-yard line and heaved a long pass downfield but Kanneh grabbed the ball in front of Moala at the 10 and returned it all the way to bring Highlands to within 21-20 at halftime.

Southern Utah started slowly but finished strong and the result was a 49-42 win at Portland State in the Thunderbirds' Big Sky Conference opener. With the win, SUU's first at Portland State as well as its first in the Big Sky, the Thunderbirds improved to 2-2 overall while PSU dipped to 1-3, 0-1 in conference play.

The Thunderbirds fell behind by 18-points in the first-quarter, but rallied to pull within eight at halftime, then outscored the Vikings 29-14 in the second half when sophomore wide receiver Mitch Jessop caught six passes for 110 yards and his first two college touchdowns.

SUU tied the game with Jessop's second touchdown, then took its first lead, 49-42, on a one-yard Lavell Ika run with 1:35 to play. The T-Birds had to hold on, however, as PSU drove to the SUU two-yard line, where the Vikings had first and goal with 18 seconds to play. SUU's defense held, however, allowing DJ Adams to get to the one on first down, but then knocking down two passes before stuffing Viking quarterback Kieran McDonagh on fourth down as time expired.

The Vikings dominated the first quarter, scoring touchdowns on all three of their drives to take a SUU 21-3 lead into the second period. But from then on SUU asserted itself, winning the second quarter 17-7, the third 15-14 and the fourth 14-0.

Colton Cook hit the first of two field goals in the second period, then Brad Sorensen hit Easton Pedersen for an 18-yard TD, the first of Pedersen's career, and Brian Wilson scored on a reception as well to pull the Thunderbirds within 28-20 at halftime.

Josh Smith returned the opening kickoff of the second half 95 yards to tie the game at 28-28, and the Thunderbirds also scored on a pair of Sorensen-to-Mitch Jessop passes, the first of his career, in the second half.
