Southern Utah's men's basketball team heads back out on the road for its longest road trip of the season, at least in terms of days away from home, this week as it travels to Montana for a Thursday game vs. the Big Sky-leading Grizzlies and a Monday match-up with Montana State. The two Montana schools will face each other in Missoula, Mont., on Saturday.

SUU (5-10/3-3 Big Sky) will be looking to snap a three-game skid after falling at home last week to Weber State (81-74) and Idaho State (54-53). Saturday's game against ISU was the Thunderbirds' fourth in eight days, as they traveled to Northern Arizona for a Jan. 5 game (a 90-77 win), then on to Sacramento State on Jan. 7 (a 64-59 loss), before returning home for the games against WSU on Thursday and ISU on Saturday.

Montana (10-4/6-0 Big Sky) – the defending Big Sky champions and pre-season pick to repeat – is riding a six-game winning streak after sweeping a road trip to North Dakota and Northern Colorado last week. The last time the Griz lost was on Dec. 15, when South Dakota State took a 68-67 double-overtime win in Missoula.

The Game: Southern Utah (5-10/3-3), at Montana (10-4/6-0), Thursday at 7:05 p.m. in Dahlberg Arena (7,321), Missoula, Mont.

The Series: The two teams have split their 10 previous meetings 5-5, but they

have not faced each other since the 2004-05 season, when the Grizzlies took a 69-57 home win. The Thunderbirds' last win in the series came during the 2000-01 season when they edged the Griz, 89-87, in Dahlberg Arena. SUU is 3-4 vs. Montana in Missoula.

Captains: This year's captains are seniors Jackson Stevenett and Tyson Koehler.

Heuir Named BSC Player of the Week: SUU's Damon Heuir was named Big Sky Co-Player of the Week, along with Weber State's Scott Bamforth, for his performance the week of Jan. 5. Heuir scored a Big Sky season-high 30 points to lead SUU to its first road win of the season, a 90-77 victory at Northern Arizona. Heuir started a 22-2 first-half run with a 3-pointer and he buried two more threes during the stretch that lifted SUU from a 9-7 deficit to a 29-11 lead. He went on to score 20 of his points in the second half, including a 3-pointer for the first basket of the period to lift SUU to a 45-30 lead and 5-of-6 free throws in the final 1:04 to keep the Lumberjacks at bay. He hit 6-of-11 shots, 4-of-6 3-pointers and 14-of-16 free throws in the game. The 14 made free throws are also the most in the Big Sky this season. In addition to his scoring, he pulled down four rebounds, dished out two assists, picked off two steals and blocked a shot.

The Coaches: Head Coach Nick Robinson (Stanford, 2005) is 5-10 in his first season at SUU and his first season as a head coach. Coach Robinson came to Southern Utah from LSU, where he spent three seasons on the staff. Prior to his time at LSU Robinson spent a season at William Jewell College and two seasons on the staff at his alma mater, Stanford. During his time as an assistant coach, Robinson helped guide his teams to a combined record of 87-47 and four post-season appearances, including two NCAA, one NIT and one NAIA Division I national tournaments. This is the first time Robinson has coached against Montana.

Robinson is assisted by Jared Barrett (Eastern Oregon, 1996), Todd Okeson (Nevada, 2005) and Drew Allen (Southern Utah, 2010).

Wayne Tinkle (Montana, 2005) is in his seventh season as a head coach, all at Montana. He will take a record of 126-75 into Thursday's game, including 72 Big Sky wins, the second-most conference wins by a Big Sky coach, one behind former Grizzly coach Mike Montgomery, who coached SUU's Nick Robinson at Stanford. This will be Coach Tinkle's first game as a head coach vs. SUU.

Affiliations: Southern Utah is in its first season as a member of the Big Sky Conference. All of SUU's sports except gymnastics and men's golf compete in the Big Sky. Gymnastics is an affiliate member of the WAC while men's golf competes in the American Sky Conference. Montana is a charter member of the Big Sky.

The Schedule: The Thunderbirds have played nine non-conference games, three at home, four true road contests, and two neutral court match-ups. They have played four conference games at home and two on the road. SUU opened at #21 Gonzaga, then played three games in three days at the World Vision Classic, meeting Green Bay, Cal State Fullerton and host Nevada before opening its home schedule against Carroll College. SUU also played non-conference games at TCU, at Denver, and at home against San Diego Christian and San Diego. SUU has just one non-conference game remaining, a BracketBuster match-up at home on Feb. 23.

Last Time Out: Damon Heuir scored 17 points and Jackson Stevenett added 12 but Idaho State held Southern Utah scoreless in the final 2:25 to claim a 54-53 win. Southern Utah led 28-26 at halftime but former SUU Coach Bill Evans' Bengals held the Thunderbirds to .273 shooting in the second half (6-of-22), and the Thunderbirds chances went away when Heuir's 3-pointer from the corner bounced off the rim as time expired. The Thunderbirds finished the game with a 32.1 shooting percentage (18-of-56), their lowest of the season. Stevenett led the team in rebounds and blocks, pulling down eight boards and rejecting three shots, but he was just 4-of-12 from the floor while Heuir was just 4-of-18, 4-of-11 from 3-point range. Idaho State also enjoyed a 27-13 edge at the free throw line, but converted just 16 opportunities (.593) while SUU hit 10 of it's 13 (.769). SUU also out-rebounded the Bengals, 43-to-34, after losing the battle of the boards in their previous two games, and had the edge in

assists, 13-9 but turned it over 16 times.

T-Birds In The National Ranks: SUU has one player ranked among the NCAA's top-50 and one just outside that range this week, and the team ranks in the top-50 in one category and in the top-100 in two. Jayson Cheesman is 36th in blocks per game with an average of 2.33, while Jackson Stevenett is 51st in free throw percentage at .862. As a team the Thunderbirds are 22nd in the country with 5.4 blocks per game, 65th in rebounding margin (plus-4.9) and 78th in free throw percentage (.720).

T-Birds In The Big Sky: Cheesman leads the Big Sky in blocks per game with 2.3 and Stevenett is second in the league in scoring at 16.0 points per game while Damon Heuir is fourth in scoring at 14.5 ppg. Stevenett is also third in free throw percentage at .862 and is sixth in rebounding with 6.3 per game, while Cheesman ranks ninth in rebounding with 5.9 rpg. Wade Collie is fifth in 3-point percentage at .439 and Cal Hanks is ninth in blocks per game with 1.2. The team leads the conference in blocks with 5.4 per game, is second in the BSC in rebounding margin (+4.9), is second in defensive rebounds (26.4 drpg) and third in offensive rebounds (12.1 orgg).

When only conference games are considered Stevenett leads the Big Sky with 19.0 points per game and Heuir is seventh at 15.7. Heuir is third in 3-pointers per game (2.3) and sixth in free throw percentage (.867) while Stevenett and Cheesman are sixth and seventh in rebounding with 7.3 and 7.0 caroms per

game, respectively. Cheesman is third in blocks per game (2.0), Collie is sixth in 3-point percentage (.476) and Stevenett is 10th in free throw percentage (.824). The team leads the BSC in 3-point defense (.286) and offensive rebounds (13.7 per game), is second in field goal percentage defense (.372), blocked shots per game (6.0) and defensive rebounds (26.8) and third in rebounding margin (plus-3.2) and free throw percentage (.770).

Moving Up The Ranks:

Jackson Stevenett is currently 12th on SUU's career scoring list, with 965 points in his three-plus seasons at SUU. He needs 17 points to tie Fred House (1999-2001) in 11th place and 112 to tie Russell Otis (1984-86) in 10th. He also has 406 career rebounds, which ranks 19th all-time at SUU. He needs five boards to tie Dave Pinamonti (1967-69) in 18th place and needs 57 to move into the top-10, where Davor Marcelic is 10th with 463.

Cleaning The Glass:

- The Thunderbirds were out-rebounded in their first three games of the season then won the battle of the boards in nine straight contests before Sacramento State had a 41-38 edge on the boards and Weber State held a 46-41 advantage. SUU got back on the glass vs. Idaho State, however, out-rebounding the Bengals 43-34.
- SUU has reeled in 40 or more caroms eight times this season. Last year's team had a total of four 40-rebound games.

- SUU pulled down a season-high 51 rebounds vs. San Diego Christian. The team's high mark vs. a Division I foe was 45, against Northern Colorado.

Block Party:

- SUU averages a Big Sky-leading 5.3 blocks per game. The Thunderbirds have rejected 81 shots this season, including 12 against North Dakota, SUU's highest total since the team combined for 13 rejections against Panhandle State on Dec. 14, 2010 and the highest total in the Big Sky so far this season. The Thunderbirds were in double-digits against San Diego as well, when they blocked 10 shots.
- Jayson Cheesman didn't take much time to break into the SUU record books. In his first game as a Thunderbird the junior transfer from Salt Lake Community College blocked five shots, which tied the sixth-highest single-game blocks total in SUU history. With 35 total blocks this season Cheesman is all alone in seventh place on the SUU single-season list. He had one block vs. Idaho State to move ahead of Kerry Sherwood (1991-92) and Bryan Olson (183-84). He is tied with Matt Hodgson (2010-11) in sixth place on the list and needs five to tie Kenyatta Clyde's 39 in 1997-98 for fifth place. Hodgson holds the school record with 64 blocks in 2009-10.
- Cal Hanks tied Cheesman in sixth place on that single-game list when he came off the bench to block five shots against North Dakota. Hanks had three last week to give him 18 blocks on the season.
- SUU blocked six shots vs. Weber State, giving the team five or more blocks in a game nine times this season.

T-Bird Notes:

- The Thunderbirds had just four players foul out of the nine non-conference games (including two at TCU) but have had nine disqualifications in the six Big Sky contests so far, including two at both Northern Arizona and Sac State and three against Weber State.
- SUU was the first team to win its first three Big Sky Con-

ference games in its first season of play since Boise State started out 4-0 back in 1970-71.

- Julian Scott, who hadn't played since suffering an injury against Carroll College back on Nov. 21, came off the bench to score 13 points and pull down four rebounds at NAU. Although he struggled at Sacramento State he scored eight points with five rebounds and a block vs. Weber State.
- SUU shot .568 from the floor and .538 from 3-point range at NAU – both season-high percentages – and knocked down 78.6 percent of its free throws, including 10-of-12 in the final 1:08 to clinch the win.
- The T-Birds attempted a season-high 42 free throws and hit a season-high 33 of them at NAU. En route to his BSC-season-high 30 points Damon Heuir hit a team-high 4-of-6 3-pointers and 14-of-16 free throws. The 14 made free throws are also the most in a single game in the Big Sky this season.
- Stevenett has scored a career-high 29 points twice this season, at Gonzaga and again vs. Weber State. Stevenett's 29 points at Gonzaga was tied as the highest single-game point total in the Big Sky this season until Damon Heuir scored 30 at NAU. Stevenett's 11 field goals made against the Zags is the highest total in the conference so far this season, while his 11-of-15 shooting night (.733) ranks second-best in the Sky, behind Northern Colorado's Connor Osborne, who hit 8-of-9 shots against University of the Southwest.
- Heuir's 14 made free throws at NAU are the most in a game in the Big Sky this season while his 16 attempts are tied for the most.
- Stevenett and Heuir are the only two players to lead the Thunderbirds in scoring this season. Stevenett has paced the team eight times while Heuir has been at the top of the scoring list in seven games.
- Jordan Johnson hit the first 3-pointer of the season and the second of his career at NAU. He buried another against Idaho State.
- Northern Arizona hit just 3-of-17 3-pointers against the Thunderbirds, 17.6 percent. It was the lowest percentage and tied for the second-fewest long-range baskets by the

- SUU posted its first win of the season after trailing at the half, trailing in the last minute and when scoring fewer than 60 points when it came back for the 51-50 win over Northern Colorado. In that game the Thunderbirds also notched their first win when the opponent turned the ball over more (UNC had 18 turnovers to SUU's 14), when the opponent's bench outscored the 'Birds (14-8), in a game decided by seven or fewer points and when the opponent shot a better percentage from the floor (.380-to-.339).
- SUU had a season-high six players score in double figures against San Diego Christian. Stevenett led the way with 15, while Damon Heuir and Wade Collie each finished with 13. Jayson Cheesman finished with 12 points and both Jaren Jeffery and Jordan Johnson had 10. For Cheesman and Johnson the totals were career-highs while Collie's 13 were a season-high. Johnson was a perfect 5-for-5 from the floor while Collie was 5-of-6 and Hanks, who finished with a then-career-high seven points, was 3-for-3 from the field as SUU finished with a season-best 55.9 field goal percentage.
- Cheesman pulled down 13 rebounds at TCU, the third-highest total in the Big Sky this season.
- SUU combined for a season-high 18 assists vs. SDCC. Freshman A.J. Hess came off the bench to lead the squad with a career-high five dimes vs. the Hawks, while Collie had four and all but two Thunderbirds who saw action dished out at least one.

T-Bird Trivia:

- SUU has nine lettermen, one squad member and one red-shirt returning from last season's team that finished 8-10 (14-17 overall) and in sixth place in the Summit League.
- Five seniors, three juniors, three sophomores and four freshmen make up the 2012-13 Thunderbird squad.
- Jackson Stevenett was a second-team all-Summit League honoree and he also earned a spot on the five-player Summit League all-tournament team last season.
- SUU advanced to the Summit League tournament as the number six seed last year, then upset third-seeded Oakland (84-82) in the tournament's first round before falling to eventual tourney champion South Dakota State (63-47).
- Nick Robinson is the eighth head men's basketball coach in SUU's 50-year history as a four-year institution.
- Nevada's World Vision Classic was the fourth in-season tournament for the Thunderbirds in as many years. Last year SUU competed at San Diego State's Basketball Travelers Classic, in 2010 SUU traveled to the Great Alaska Shootout and in 2009 the team was in Hawai'i for the Rainbow Classic.
- Southern Utah plays 14 home games this season, including 10 Big Sky Conference contests and one in the Bracket-Busters tournament. The 10 conference match-ups are the most ever in a season for SUU, a far cry from the four the team had in 1993-94 and 1994-95 when it was a member of the five-team American West Conference and there were just four home conference dates. The last several years SUU has played nine Summit League games per season in the Centrum.
- SUU and the University of North Dakota are in their first seasons in the Big Sky, making it an 11-team conference. The Thunderbirds had been members of the Summit

League (nee. Mid-Continent Conference) for the past 15 seasons before joining the BSC. As members of the 10-team Summit League the Thunderbird men's basketball team qualified for the conference's eight-team post-season tournament 14 of 15 seasons, missing only in 2009-10 when the T-Birds finished ninth.

- Seven teams qualify for the Big Sky tournament, which will be hosted by the regular-season champion, March 14-16.
- SUU is in its 50th season as a four-year institution, its 25th at the NCAA Division I level. Prior to joining the NCAA Division I ranks the University spent two seasons at the Division II level and 23 as a member of the NAIA.

Scouting Montana: The Grizzlies are 5-1 at home this season, with the only setback coming at the hands of South Dakota State, in double-overtime. Montana is 2-0 at home in Big Sky games and has already picked up four conference road wins. The Griz beat Eastern Washington (81-66) and Portland state (62-55) at home and came out on top of road decisions at Northern Arizona (62-56), Sacramento State (61-60), North Dakota (77-62) and Northern Colorado (85-77). Montana averages 70.1 points per game on .463 shooting (.414 threes) while allowing opponents an average of 65.6 ppg on .418 shooting (.344 threes). The Griz have hit 77.5 percent of their free throws and have been out-rebounded by an average margin of 34.9-to-31.1 per game. Senior forward Mathias Ward (6-7, 228) leads the team with an average of 15.3 points per game while Kareem Jamar (G/F, 6-5, 210, Jr) averages 14.2 points and a team-high 6.0 rebounds per game. Two-time All-Big Sky guard Will Cherry, who missed the first seven games of the season after off-season foot surgery, averages 11.9 points and 5.3 assists per game, including a Big Sky-leading average of 6.2 per game in conference contests.

Damon Huier scored 16 points while Jackson Stevenett added 12 and pulled down a game-high eight rebounds but Idaho State upset the Thunderbirds' in Bengal Coach Bill Evans' return to the Centrum. The Thunderbirds and Bengals went back-and-forth all game, but the visitors held on in the final seconds to escape with a 54-53 win.

ISU's Tomas Sanchez led all scorers with 12 points in the opening half, nine from beyond the 3-point line. Jayson Cheesman led Southern Utah with eight points on 4-of-8 shooting during the first 20 minutes. The Thunderbirds held a 24-17 rebounding advantage to start the game and outshot the Bengals 35.3 percent to 34.8 percent.

Idaho State opened the second half on a quick 11-2 run to take a 37-30 lead on a layup from Andre Hatchett. SUU battled back with a 12-2 rally that ended with Stevenett throwing down a two-handed slam to even the score and Heuir sinking a corner three to put the Thunderbirds back in front 42-39.

The two sides traded scores down the stretch until a Jordan Johnson layup brought the game back to a 49-49 stalemate with 4:29 left on the clock. The Bengals eventually went back up by one, but a deep three from Stevenett gave Southern Utah a 53-51 lead with just over two minutes to play.

ISU took possession of the ball with a 54-53 advantage and 43 seconds remaining. Melvin Morgan made a drive to the hoop as the clock wound down to 14 seconds, but Stevenett got up in the air to deflect the shot off a Bengal player to give the ball back to SUU.

Southern Utah's Wade Collie took the inbounds pass at the wing and dribbled inside the three-point line for an 18-foot jumper. The shot was off but the ball went out of bounds and back to the T-Birds with 3.5 seconds left. Collie received the ball again and quickly shot a pass to Heuir who fired a corner three that bounced off the back edge of the rim as the horn sounded, sealing the 54-53 win for the Bengals.

Sanchez finished with 18 to lead ISU, which got another 17 from sophomore guard Chris Hansen. The Thunderbirds got 17 from Heuir and another 12 from Stevenett, but the two combined to shoot only 8-30 from the field.

Southern Utah shot the ball 32.1 percent as a team, just behind the Bengals who recorded a mark of 34.0 percent. SUU outrebounded its opponent by a count of 43-34 but also sent the visitors to the foul line 27 times.

Jackson Stevenett scored a career- and game-high 29 points and pulled down six rebounds to lead Southern Utah but the Thunderbirds were no match for No. 21 Gonzaga in the season-opener for both teams as the Bulldogs cruised in the second half to a 103-65 win at McCarthy Athletic Center on Friday night.

Down 44-27 at the half SUU was in striking distance but Gonzaga went on an 8-2 run to open the second period, then after a Stevenett layup, the Zags ran off another six straight to take a 62-31 lead with 15:19 to play.

After that point SUU made runs but couldn't ever get back within striking distance of the Bulldogs.

"I felt we had good execution at times in the game but Gonzaga did what they like to do. They're well coached, an established program," SUU first-year Head Coach Nick Robinson said. "We'll continue to work, continue to improve and we'll be a better team next game."

Stevenett hit 11-of-15 shots and teammate Julian Scott buried 4-of-5 en route to a nine points, also a career-high, while Wade Collie finished with 10 points. Scott, Jayson Cheesman, who was playing his first game as a Thunderbird, and Jaren Jeffery all pulled down five rebounds for SUU, who had 33 rebounds to Gonzaga's 36.

"Jackson has been here before, he was aggressive, looked for his shot and was effective," Robinson noted. "That's something we want all of our guys to do. He got some open looks and he was able to knock down some shots tonight."

SUU wound up hitting 27-of-55 shots, 49.1 percent, while Gonzaga hit 40-of-73, .548.

"For the first game out against a good team I thought our execution at times was good. Shooting 50 percent for the first game against a good defensive team was a good effort for us."

Six Gonzaga players finished in double figures, led by Przemek Karnowski 's 22 points off the bench. Guy Landry Edi added 16, Sam Dower scored 15, David Stockton and Elias Harris had 12 and Kevin Pangos chipped in 10 points for the Zags.

Two Marqueeze Coleman free throws gave Nevada a 52-49 edge with 10:21 to play, and although Southern Utah pulled back to within one the Thunderbirds didn't ever lead again.

Nevada scored its next six points from the free throw line and took a 61-56 lead on a Story jump shot. Three more Wolf Pack free throws made it a 63-56 game, then Story three straight 3-pointers to push the advantage to 75-58 with 2:29 to play as SUU got just a Julian Scott jumper during the stretch.

Damon Heuir hit 4-of-5 3-pointers in the first half and wound up with 14 points to lead the Thunderbirds, while Collie had 12 points and six rebounds. Jackson Stevenett finished with a team-high seven rebounds and two steals to go with eight points for SUU, which dipped to 0-4 on the season.

Damon Heuir scored 16 points to help lead Southern Utah to a 68-58 win over Carroll College in the Thunderbirds' home opener Wednesday night. The win was the first of the season for the Thunderbirds and marked head coach Nick Robinson's first career victory.

After falling behind 8-4 in the first five minutes Thunderbirds rallied with a 22-7 run that put them up 26-15. Freshman guard A.J. Hess sparked the run with a pair of 3-pointers and Wade Collie took a steal coast-to-coast for a lay-up and a free throw to make the count 17-11.

After a Carroll basket, Chris Nsenki fed Julian Scott down low for a two-handed slam. The Thunderbirds then went on to cap the run with Heuir finding Jayson Cheesman in transition for a lay-in.

Heuir scored eight-consecutive points for SUU in the closing minutes of the half to lead all scorers at the break with 12 and help Southern Utah to a 39-25 half-time advantage.

The Thunderbirds hit 16-of-33 shots in the first period (.485) and out-rebounded the Saints 21-to-11. The Saints hung around by going 5-of-11 from the three-point line, including two from junior Nick Jones.

Southern Utah built the advantage in the second half, extending it to 58-37 with 9:57 left to play. From that point Robinson went heavily to his bench, getting everyone into the action with no player seeing more than Heuir's 25 minutes on the court.

SUU finished the game shooting 45.9 percent from the floor with 40 points scored in the paint. In addition to Heuir's 16, the Thunderbirds got 10 from Collie and another nine from Scott. They also held a 40-27 rebounding advantage, led by Jaren Jeffery's 11.

The Saints were 18-45 from the field in the game, with half of the baskets coming from 3-point range. Ben Cutler scored 18 to lead the visitors, who got another 11 from Jones and 10 from both Brett Ball and Chris McGrath.

Damon Heuir scored a season-high 25 points and Jayson Cheesman pulled down a career-high 13 rebounds and blocked three shots but TCU outscored Southern Utah 24-15 in the final 10 minutes to overcome a one-point deficit and hand the improving Thunderbirds a 61-52 loss Thursday night.

Heuir hit two free throws with 10:50 to play to give Southern Utah a 38-37 lead, but TCU took the lead back on a Devona Abron layup, then after the Thunderbirds had two chances at a basket on the other end extended the advantage to 41-38 on a pair of Abron free throws with 9:19 to play.

That series started what turned out to be an 8-0 Horned Frog run, and although SUU back within five several times, the last at 52-47 on a Cheesman tip in with 2:17 to play, the Thunderbirds weren't able to get back over the hump.

Damon Heuir scored 17 points and Jackson Stevenett added 13 but after falling behind early against San Diego the Thunderbirds could never climb out of the hole in suffering a 67-53 loss to the Toreros.

The Toreros jumped out to a 14-4 lead and trailed 14-7 after Cal Hanks scored three points for Southern Utah, but Ken Rancifer sparked a 7-0 USD run with a 3-pointer for a 22-7 advantage with nine minutes remaining in the first half.

The Thunderbirds chipped away at the lead, pulling within 24-17 after a Stevenett 3-pointer but San Diego was able to stretch its lead again in the final minutes of the half, taking a 36-22 score into the locker room after Johnny Dee beat the buzzer with his third three of the of the game.

Southern Utah started the second half on a 17-3 run to bring the game back within three. That is as close as the Thunderbirds would get however as the visiting Toreros held on to win by a final score of 67-53.

Heuir started the second half by scoring on back-to-back drives to the basket and A.J. Hess added a lay-up to pull SUU back within ten with the score at 39-29. A corner three for Heuir and a transition bucket from Stevenett then helped pull SUU within 39-36.

After a basket and a pair of free throws pushed the San Diego lead back up to seven, Jayson Cheesman block led to a fast break lay-up for Heuir that made the score 45-40 with nine minutes to play.

The Toreros worked their lead back into the double figures but the T-Birds came back again after Heuir hit another three to make the count 58-49 with three minutes left on the clock. San Diego was able to hold on in final moments however, eventually coming away with the 67-53 win.

Heuir and Stevenett co-lead SUU with eight rebounds each as the Thunderbirds won the battle of the boards, 43-31. San Diego got 17 from Dee and another 13 from Chris Anderson.

Jackson Stevenett turned in his first double-double of the season and led the Thunderbirds in scoring, rebounding, assists and steals as Southern Utah won its first-ever Big Sky Conference basketball game with a 79-67 triumph over North Dakota.

Stevenett scored 21 points, pulled down 10 rebounds, dished out five assists and had three steals to lead SUU. His rebounding and assists totals were both season-highs which tied his career-high totals, while his three steals tied the team's season high in 2012-13.

Wade Collie added a career-high 18 points coming off the bench for the first time this season and Cal Hanks blocked a career-best five shots as the team tallied a season-high 12 rejections. Jayson Cheesman had three blocks while Collie had two and Jaren Jeffery and A.J. Hess each rejected one attempt.

Southern Utah led throughout most of the game but had just a 62-59 advantage after Alonzo Traylor hit a jumper with 3:56 to play. UND had an opportunity to cut further into the lead but Traylor missed a free throw and a chance to convert a 3-point play, then after SUU was unable to score on the other end Traylor grabbed a rebound but Aaron Anderson's shot on the other end was blocked out of bounds by Cheesman. Anderson then drove to the basket but Stevenett corralled the rebound and Hess buried a 3-pointer to push the T-Bird lead to 65-59 with 2:49 to play.

Mitch Wilmer converted just one of two free throws the next time UND went down the floor and Stevenett grabbed the rebound on the miss, then scored on the other end to stake SUU to a 67-60 lead and UND would get no closer than six the rest of the way as the Thunderbirds converted 9-of-10 free throws down the stretch to seal the win.

SUU held UND to 30 percent shooting, the lowest percentage by an opponent this season, and hit 17-of-20 free throws for a season-high 85 percent success rate. UND scored 28 of its points from the free throw line, where it held a 35-20 advantage.

SUU also finished with 15 assists, its second-highest total of the season.

Damon Heuir scored a season-high 30 points, including 13-of-14 free throws in the second half, to lead Southern Utah to a 90-77 win over Northern Arizona Saturday afternoon. With the win the Thunderbirds remained undefeated in the Big Sky Conference at 3-0 and improved to 5-7 overall. Northern Arizona saw its BSC record dip to 2-2, 5-9 overall.

Heuir hit 6-of-11 shots, including 4-of-6 3-point attempts, and buried 14-of-16 free throws overall to lead all scorers. Jackson Stevenett added 14 for SUU before fouling out and Wade Collie scored 10. Julian Scott, who had missed the previous seven games with an injury, gave the Thunderbirds a lift with 13 points in 24 minutes off the bench.

SUU finished the game shooting 56.8 percent (25-of-44), its highest percentage of the season, and .538 from 3-point range (7-13), also its best of the season.

Southern Utah built leads as high as 18 points in the first half, going up 29-11 on Wade Collie's second straight 3-pointer with 10:50 to play, but the Max Jacobson scored nine straight NAU points to spark a Lumberjack comeback. NAU went on a 13-1 run to get back within 30-24 when DeWayne Russell hit two free throws with 5:53 to play but the Thunderbirds answered with a 10-6 run and took a 42-30 lead at the break.

Southern Utah hit 6-of-10 3-pointers in the half, three by Heuir to get the T-Birds started, and two by Collie, and knocked down 15-of-24 shots overall, 62.5 percent.

Heuir opened the second half with the team's final 3-pointer of the afternoon, to lift the team to a 45-30 lead, and SUU pushed the advantage to 49-33 on a Stevenett layup but NAU scored the next nine points to pull within 49-42 and got as close as 51-45 on a pair of Gabe Rogers free throws with 12:33 to play.

Southern Utah kept the Lumberjacks at bay, however, going up 58-58 on a Collie free throw with 9:55 to play and answering every NAU run thereafter.

Heuir, A.J. Hess and Collie combined to hit 10-of-12 free throws in the final minute to clinch the win.

The win gave SUU back-to-back wins as well as a road victory for the first time this season.

Jackson Stevenett posted his second double-double of the season with 24 points and 12 rebounds but Southern Utah struggled on the offensive end at the beginning of the game, then after coming back struggled to score midway through the second half Monday night, enabling Sacramento State to end the Thunderbirds' three-game Big Sky winning streak with a 64-59 win. SUU dipped to 5-8 overall and 3-1 in Big Sky play while Sacramento State improved to 7-5 overall and 2-2 in conference play.

After shooting their best percentage of the season in a 90-77 win in the previous game at Northern Arizona (.568) the Thunderbirds dipped to 32.2 percent at Sacramento.

SUU was within one, at 41-40 after a Jayson Cheesman dunk with 9:32 to play, but turned the ball over three times and missed a shot on the next four possessions. Meanwhile Sacramento State scored on each possession to change the one-point edge into a 52-40 game with 5:20 to go.

The Thunderbirds battled back, pulling within five with 48 seconds to go but could get no closer than 63-59 with eight seconds to play.

SUU gave up two free points before the game started because of a technical foul for dunking in pre-game warmups, and then missed their first seven shots, to find itself down 12-0 before Jackson Stevenett finally got them on the board with a jumper at the 13:10 mark.

SUU fell behind by as many as 16, at 22-6, before finally making a run, pulling within 24-20 after a Stevenett tip-in at the 5:26 mark. Stevenett started the run with a layup, and after 3-pointers by Wade Collie and Damon Heuir, a Jayson Cheesman dunk, two Stevenett free throws and the tip in the Thunderbirds were back within four.

Sacramento State scored the next three points but the Thunderbirds got two free throws each from Heuir (after a technical foul on SAC's John Dickson) and Cheesman to pull within three, and after A.J. Hess grabbed a rebound on the defensive end Stevenett hit another jumper to pull the Thunderbirds within 27-26. Hess followed that basket with a steal and SUU had an opportunity to take the lead but Cheesman missed inside and Joe Eberhard got the rebound for Sacramento, was fouled, and hit two free throws to give the Hornets at 29-26 advantage at half-time.

Jackson Stevenett tied his career- and season-highs with 29 points and Damon Heuir added 16 but Weber State got balanced scoring, enjoyed a 49-27 edge in free throw opportunities and out-rebounded SUU 46-41 to remain undefeated and atop the Big Sky standings with an 81-74 win.

SUU dipped to 3-2 in conference play and 5-9 overall while WSU improved to 5-0, 10-3 overall.

Both teams got off to slow starts and for the second straight game the Thunderbirds went without a basket until Stevenett scored on a layup with 15:03 to play in the first half, making it a 4-3 game. Neither team led by more than six points in a back-and-forth first half that ended with the Wildcats leading 30-29.

SUU scored the first basket of the second half to take a one-point advantage, and although the lead went back and forth several times the Thunderbirds were never able to go ahead by more than a point.

Weber State went on an 11-2 run midway through the second period to extend a 42-40 lead to a 53-42 advantage with 9:14 to play, then slowly extended the advantage to 68-53 with 2:20 remaining before the Thunderbirds rallied to pull back within the final margin.

Heuir scored 10 of his points in the final 2:20, including a pair of 3-pointers.

SUU finished with 11 turnovers, its lowest total of the season, and although the Thunderbirds were out-rebounded for the second straight game it was just the second time in the last 11 games they had come up on the short end of the battle of the boards. WSU came into the game as the conference's top rebounding team, just ahead of the Thunderbirds.

Jayson Cheesman blocked three shots, giving him 34 on the season to tie hime with Kerry Sherwood (1991-92) and Bryan Olsen (1983-84) for seventh place on SUU's single-season blocks list.
