

## Eagles Take on Southern Utah Size in Cedar City

**With homestand on the horizon, Eastern nears end of the first half of the league season on the road against SUU's tall timber**

The Eastern Washington University men's basketball team has a sizeable challenge on its hand this week.

The Eagles take on the Big Sky Conference leader in rebounding and blocked shots when they travel to Cedar City, Utah, to face Southern Utah in the first-ever Big Sky Conference meeting between the two schools. Tipoff Saturday (Jan. 26) is 6:05 p.m. Pacific time at the Centrum.

Eastern will be trying to snap a three-game losing streak and record its first win since putting together an impressive performance on Jan. 10 in a 60-53 home win over Northern Arizona. The Eagles are 4-14 on the season and 2-6 in the league, and will return home after the SUU game for three-straight home games, starting on Monday, Jan. 28 versus Portland State. The game versus the Vikings will end the first half of the Big Sky season for the Eagles.

The radio broadcast of all Eastern games is on 700-AM ESPN, via the web at [www.700espn.com](http://www.700espn.com) and via iPhone application (search for "700 ESPN" and download the free app). The broadcast is also available via [www.tunein.com](http://www.tunein.com) and tunein's mobile phone app. Larry Weir returns for his 20th year as the play-by-play voice of the Eagles. Eastern's game against Portland State will also be televised live in the Eastern Washington region on SWX.

Although the Eagles are currently in last place in the league standings, they are just two games out of third. Southern Utah entered its game at Montana State on Monday (Jan. 21) with a four-game losing streak, a 3-4 league mark and a 5-11 record overall. The Eagle-Thunderbird matchup will be just the fourth meeting between the two schools, and first since Jan. 10, 1994.

With a starting lineup that goes 6-foot-2, 6-3, 6-4, 6-8 and 6-11, the Thunderbirds are perhaps the biggest team in the Big Sky. Southern Utah leads the league and ranks 20th in NCAA Division I in blocked shots (5.4 per game), and are first in the league in rebounds per game (38.0) and second in rebounding margin (+4.7). The team's biggest player is 6-foot-11, 250-pound Jason Cheesman, who averages 6.8 points, 5.9 rebounds and 2.31 blocked shots per game (second in the Big Sky and 37th nationally).

"They are really, really big," said Eastern head coach **Jim Hayford**. "But every game

in this league is a challenge and we need to hunt out wins, look to get better and play well for a whole 40 minutes. Those are the things we need to do."

Eastern's starting lineup, when it goes big, is 5-10, 5-11, 6-6, 6-7, 6-10, but includes two true freshmen and a sophomore. The Eagles rank 10th in the league in rebounding margin (-4.9), and are coming off a performance in which it allowed 18 offensive rebounds and 16 second-chance points in a 72-56 loss at Northern Colorado.

Eastern is fourth in the league in offensive rebounds (11.6), but SUU is one spot ahead of them in third (11.7). With 6-7 forward **Venky Jois** leading the way, the Eagles have averaged 5.3 blocked shots per game to rank 23rd nationally and second in the Big Sky right behind the Thunderbirds. Jois leads the league in both blocked shots (2.33, 35th nationally) and rebounding (9.4, 31st).

Jois has played superbly in league play thus far, making 53 percent of his shots and averaging 13.4 points, 9.3 rebounds, 3.6 blocked shots, 2.0 assists and 1.0 steals per game. Six-foot-10 **Martin Seiferth** has made 68 percent of his shots and has averaged 7.9 points, 4.1 rebounds and 1.0 blocked shots in eight league games thus far. Although there are some bumps in the road now, Hayford knows the sky is the limit for those two young players as they continued to develop in EWU's program.

"We are getting out-physicaled a little bit – there's no other way to say it," said Hayford. "We need to get bigger, stronger and tougher – we need to spend time in the weight room, keep growing and get used to college basketball."

The Eagles have enjoyed halftime leads in four of their last five games, and that has pleased Hayford.

"What encourages is me that we are coming out of the gate and playing with an identity," he said. "We just need to hold that identity through the whole 40 minutes."

The Eagles have enjoyed halftime leads in eight games this season, but have lost five of them. Hayford is hoping for more complete efforts like the one Eastern had versus NAU when the Eagles had a season-high 18-point lead at intermission, then led by as many as 25 in the second half. The 23-point winning margin was Eastern's best of the season after winning its other three games by a collective 12 points -- five, four and three points.

"We spend the days in preparation – we show them video and say we are going to do this and we are going to do that -- and we do pretty good," he said of his team's impressive starts. "We're executing, but when they make adjustments, that's when you have to adjust. We just need time with the players and repetitions to make sure that can be done."

## Quick Shots

- Eastern has held its last seven opponents to 44 percent or less shooting from the field -- a collective 38.4 percent. EWU is now 4-3 when it holds opponents to 43.5 percent or less and 0-11 when it doesn't. The Eagles made only 38.0 percent versus Idaho State on Dec. 22, but had a season-best defensive effort of 37.9 percent against the Bengals. Eastern bettered that two games later by holding Montana State to 34.5 percent, then held NAU to 34.9 percent in the next game. North Dakota won on Jan. 17, but managed only 36.7 percent shooting against the Eagles. Northern Colorado won by 16 on Jan. 19, but made only 38.3 percent from the field.

- Recently, true freshman **Venky Jois** was selected to the Collegehoopsdaily.com All-Big Sky Conference team from the first half of the season, and was also the school's Scholar-Athlete of the Month for December. The forward from Boronia, Australia, has had eight double-doubles this season to rank 16th in NCAA Division I (through games of Jan. 20). Against Northern Colorado on Jan. 19, Jois equaled the school record of seven blocked shots set earlier this season by teammate **Martin Seiferth**, as Jois finished with yet another monster game with 15 points, eight rebounds, four assists and the seven blocks. He had 12 points, 14 rebounds, two blocked shots and two steals in his most recent double-double versus North Dakota on Jan. 17. He had his best game as an Eagle with 22 points and 13 rebounds on 10-of-14 shooting against Cal State Fullerton in EWU's 79-75 win on Nov. 30 to earn Big Sky Conference Player of the Week honors. For the season Jois is averaging 34.2 minutes, 13.1 points, 9.4 rebounds, 2.3 blocked shots, 1.1 steals and 1.6 assists per game. He leads the league in rebounding and ranks 31th in NCAA Division I (through Jan. 20), and he is also first in the league and 35th nationally with an average of 2.33 blocked shots per game. Earlier in the season, he was selected to the All-Tournament Team for his performances in the 2012 College Basketball Experience (CBE) Hall of Fame Classic in Santa Clara, Calif. He had a pair of double-doubles with 19 points and 11 rebounds in EWU's 75-70 win over South Carolina Upstate and 16 points and 11 boards one game earlier in an 86-83 loss to Utah Valley. Jois came to Eastern after winning a pair of MVP awards in Australia. He was the Bob Staunton 2012 U-20 National Championship MVP, after leading the Victoria State Team to the championship and an unbeaten record. Saint Mary's College and NBA standout Patty Mills won the Bob Staunton MVP Award in 2006 and 2007. In addition, Jois was the South East Australian Basketball League (SEABL) Youth Player of the Year in 2011, an award given to the top under-23 player and previously won by college and NBA standouts Patty Mills and Andrew Bogut.

- Six-foot-10 sophomore **Martin Seiferth** is second in the Big Sky Conference in field goal percentage, making 63.6 percent of his shots from the field. Thus far, Seiferth is averaging 8.1 points, 5.2 rebounds and 1.7 blocked shots per game. He made 6-of-7 shots from the field and had 14 points, nine rebounds and three blocked shots in just 26 minutes of action at North Dakota on Jan. 17. Earlier this season he was the Big Sky Conference Player of the Week after finishing with 27 points, 17 rebounds and a school-record eight blocked shots in a 96-79 loss at Cal State Northridge. The transfer from Oregon had to sit out last season because of NCAA transfer rules.

- Eastern's game with Idaho on Dec. 6 was the 100th in the Eastern career of senior guard **Jeffrey Forbes**, and fellow senior **Kevin Winford** played in his 100th on Dec. 22 versus Idaho State. Forbes, who has now scored 954 points in his 109-game Eastern career, needs only 46 points to become the 16th player in school history to hit the 1,000-point

mark. Currently seventh in career games played, he could break Marc Axton's (2002-05) school record of 119 games played. Forbes has averaged 30.7 minutes per game in his Eastern career with 98 starts. He ranks eighth in school history with 113 career steals, and is also third in 3-pointers made (164) and fourth in attempts (434). Winford has started 39 of the 104 games he has played (13th-most games played in school history), averaging 18.6 minutes per game. He has made 126-of-373 3-pointers in his career to rank fifth in school history in both categories, with a total of 635 points scored.

- Senior **Collin Chiverton** played versus Montana on Jan. 3 for his first appearance since Nov. 23. Last year's Big Sky Conference Newcomer of the Year, Chiverton missed six games from Nov. 30 to Dec. 22 following the death of a close friend in San Francisco. Previously, his mother passed away just as the season began. Chiverton scored just 15 points in EWU's first three outings, but has bumped his average to 10.3 for the season. He had a season-best 22 points against Northern Arizona on for the 13th 20-point performance of his career, and his best since a career-high 26 against Seattle on Jan. 16, 2012. Foul trouble hindered him early in the season, and he scored 19 points in just 18 minutes before fouling out with 6:20 to play against South Carolina Upstate in EWU's 75-70 win. One game later, he made 7-of-15 attempts from the field, including 4-of-12 3-point attempts, versus Santa Clara for his second-straight 19-point game. A year ago, he had 12 20-point performances, but was slowed late in the year with injuries.

- After leading NCAA Division I in 3-pointers made per game through games of Nov. 30, Eastern is now ninth through games of Jan. 20. The Eagles are averaging a league-leading 8.8 makes per game while attempting an average of 25.8. Last year, when EWU set school records with 283 makes and 793 attempts, Eastern averaged 8.8 made treys per game on an average of 24.8 attempts.

- Eastern is second in the Big Sky Conference in blocked shots with 96 already for an average of 5.3 per game to rank 23rd in NCAA Division I. Individual Eagles are ranked No. 1 and No. 4 in the league, with **Venky Jois** averaging 2.3 per game to rank 35th in NCAA Division I and **Martin Seiferth** averaging 1.7 to rank 93rd. The Eagles had a school-record 130 in the 2005-06 season (4.3 average per game).

- The Eagles are fourth in the Big Sky in offensive rebounds with an average of 11.6 per game (Sacramento State and Montana State are first at 11.9, with Southern Utah third at 11.7). **Martin Seiferth** has a 2.4 average and **Venky Jois** is averaging 2.3 to rank fourth and fifth, respectively, in the league. A year ago, Eastern averaged 12.0 offensive boards per game to lead the league.

- Three Eagles rank in the top nine in school history in career 3-pointers made. **Jeffrey Forbes** is third (164), **Kevin Winford** is fifth (126) and **Collin Chiverton** is eighth (113). In attempts, Forbes is fourth (434), Winford (373) is fifth and Chiverton is 10th (289), and Chiverton is also 10th in career 3-point field goal percentage (39.1).

- Eastern's game versus Montana on Saturday, Feb. 2 will be Alumni Appreciation Night, and includes free tickets for alumni if registered by Jan. 31. The event includes alumni basket drawings, a team tunnel spirit lineup at halftime for children ages 4-16, a family concession bundle (four hot dogs and four sodas for \$20) and a post-game poster-signing session with players. In addition, the EWU Student Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) will have a "Furry Friends Round-Up" that night to provide new or gently used stuffed animals to local children's organizations. The game begins at 6:05 p.m. Pacific time, and registration for the event is available at: <http://alumni.ewu.edu/events>.

- With the league expanded to 11 teams, the Big Sky Conference Tournament includes seven teams this year and will take place Dec. 14-16 at the site of the regular season champion. The host receives a first-round bye, with the other six teams playing for the other three berths in the semifinals. A year ago, Eastern beat Idaho State 81-75 in the first round before losing to eventual champion Montana 74-66 in the semifinals.

## More EWU Notes

- The Eagles played the game North Dakota game on Jan. 17 without a pair of senior starters who were injured the day before in Grand Forks in an accident involving one of EWU's team mini-vans. Senior starting point guard **Kevin Winford** (concussion) and senior shooting guard **Jeffrey Forbes** (knee) sat out, and Winford also sat out the Northern Colorado game two days later.

### Coaches Pick Eagles to Finish Third

The Eastern Washington University men's basketball team, under the direction of second-year head coach Jim Hayford, has been picked to finish as high as third in the 2012-13 Big Sky Conference preseason men's basketball polls released Oct. 18.

The media have picked the Eagles to finish third, and the coaches selected Eastern sixth. Defending Big Sky champion Montana has been selected first in both polls.

The 2013 Big Sky Championship will consist of the top seven teams from the regular-season standings. The championship will be played March 14-16 at the site of the regular-season champion. The No. 1 seed will receive a bye to the semifinals.

There will be three first-round games on Thursday, March 14.

Teams will play 20 conference games this season in a true double round-robin format.

The Grizzlies received eight first-place votes and 98 total points in the coaches' poll, and 24 first-place votes and 344 points in the media poll. Weber State, which lost to Montana in the Big Sky Championship game, was selected second in both polls. Randy Rahe's Wildcats earned three first-place votes from the coaches and 92 total points. Eight media members selected Weber State first, and the Wildcats earned 318 points from the media.

Northern Colorado was selected third by the coaches and fourth by the media. League newcomer North Dakota could make a splash -- the coaches selected UND fourth, while the media picked it sixth. North Dakota played in the Great West Conference last season and finished 17-15.

Portland State was picked to finish fifth in both polls, and Sacramento State was picked to finish seventh in the coaches' poll and eighth in the media poll. Montana State was picked seventh in the media poll and eighth in the coaches' poll. Rounding out both polls were Idaho State, Southern Utah and Northern Arizona. All three teams feature new coaches this season.

- Entering the Sac State game on Jan. 12, Eastern was coming off three of its five best shooting efforts of the season, including a season-best 50.0 percent in an 82-59 win over Northern Arizona two nights earlier. The Eagles looked like they would be well on their way toward another high percentage with a 52 percent first half, but made only 8-of-28 in the second half for 29 percent and finished at 40 percent for the game. Against North Dakota on Jan. 17, the Eagles made one of its first seven, 12 of its next 24 and then missed 21 of 28 shots in the second half to finish at 34 percent (second-worst of the season). In its most recent game, Eastern made 38 percent versus Northern Colorado.

- En route to a season-best 50.0 percent shooting night against Northern Arizona on Jan. 10 in an 82-59 win, Eastern had a season-high 44 points inside the paint and a season-high 20 second-chance points. The Eagles had 17 offensive boards and out-rebounded the Lumberjacks 49-37.

- Eastern's 40-22 lead at halftime against Northern Arizona on Jan. 10 was easily its biggest halftime advantage of the season, having owned an 11-point lead at intermission against Utah Valley in November. But the loss to Utah Valley – as well as losses to Idaho on Dec. 6, Montana State on Jan. 5 and Sacramento State on Jan. 12 – came after EWU held double-digit second-half advantages. Eastern is now 3-5 when trailing or tied at halftime, and 1-9 when it trails.

- As an illustration of their balance, the Eagles had six double figure scoring performances on the road at Montana and Montana State, but none were by the same player. Against the Grizzlies on Jan. 3, **Venky Jois** led the way with 16, with **Collin Chiverton** and **Thomas Reuter** coming off the bench to score 15 and 14, respectively. Two nights later at MSU, senior starters **Jeffrey Forbes** and **Kevin Winford** scored 18 and 13, respectively, and sophomore starter **Martin Seiferth** had 11.

- Since becoming eligible in mid-December, Australian point guard **Daniel Hill** has averaged 1.8 points, 1.7 assists and 1.6 rebounds per game in an average of 17.0 minutes per game (eight total games). He had three assists in EWU's 82-59 win over Northern Arizona on Jan. 10, and a season-high eight points in his third game as an Eagle in a 57-54 victory over Idaho State on Dec. 22. He made the first start of his career at point guard on Jan. 17 at North Dakota as an injury replacement for **Kevin Winford**, and he had a season-high five assists, four rebounds and a steal in 38 minutes. He also had five assists one game later versus Northern Colorado when he played 35 minutes in place of Winford for the second-straight game.

- Senior point guard **Kevin Winford** had his most productive outing in two years when he finished with 13 points (on 3-of-3 shooting from the 3-point stripe) and six assists in EWU's 70-68 overtime loss at Montana State on Jan. 5. Winford had his most points since scoring 15 versus Northern Colorado on Feb. 3, 2011. He also had his most assists since dishing out a career-high seven versus New Hope on Dec. 4, 2010 (he scored 39 points in that game with a school-record 10 3-pointers). Eastern played its second game with Winford in the lineup as starting point guard, with Justin Crossgile no longer on the team after starting the first 12 games.

- The 54 points the Eagles allowed in a three-point win over Idaho State on Dec. 22 were the fewest they surrendered by 16 – the previous best for the Eagles came in a 75-70 win over South Carolina-Upstate on Nov. 21. Eastern held the Bengals to 37.9 percent shooting from the field, which at the time was EWU's best defensive effort of the season.

- The Eagles had a season high 17 3-pointers made versus UC Davis on Dec. 17, and have attempted at least 39 3-point attempts on three occasions. Eastern had 41 versus UC Davis and a season-high 42 against Utah Valley on Nov. 20. Eastern's 17 3-pointers were one behind the school record of 18 set on Dec. 4, 2010, against New Hope. Eastern had a record 48 3-point attempts on Jan. 19, 1995, versus Sacramento State.

- Sophomore **Parker Kelly** out of Gonzaga Prep in Spokane equaled his career high with 17 points to pace the Eagles in their Dec. 17 loss at UC

Davis. He made 5-of-8 3-point shots against the Aggies, and is now averaging 9.2 points per game in his last 12 games after scoring just 10 in the first five games he played. For the season, he is now averaging 7.1 points and 1.0 assists per game, while making 25-of-69 3-point shots for 36.2 percent.

• The Montana loss on Jan. 3 was Eastern's first game without former starting point guard Justin Crosigile, who left the team for personal reasons to be closer to his family. Crosigile, who is from Patterson, N.J., and is a transfer from St. Joseph's (Pa.), started EWU's first 12 games and averaged 14.7 points, 5.5 assists, 5.9 rebounds and 1.7 steals per game.

### EWU vs. Southern Utah Series Notes

• This is the first Big Sky Conference meeting between the two schools, and first overall since Jan. 10, 1994. Eastern won that game at home, 69-65, but had lost the previous three meetings against the Thunderbirds. Eastern lost in Cedar City 87-67 on Feb. 17, 1993, 70-68 in Cheney on Dec. 21, 1993 and 71-50 in Cedar City on Dec. 28, 1993.

### EWU vs. Portland State Series Notes

• Since Eastern became a member of NCAA Division I in the 1983-84 season, the Eagles are now 17-17 versus the Vikings. All of the meetings have come since 1997 when PSU joined the Big Sky Conference, and Eastern is 11-6 in Cheney and 6-10 against PSU in Portland (0-1 on neutral courts) since then.

• The Vikings, who won 78-76 in overtime in the 2011-12 season in Cheney and 69-64 in Portland, has a 20-18 edge in the overall series. Eastern owns a 12-7 record in Cheney and 6-12 mark in Portland (0-1 on neutral courts) against the Vikings.

• Despite losing eight of the last nine meetings, the Eagles have still won 15 of the last 27 meetings. With a 65-61 home victory on Jan. 27, 2011, Eastern snapped a six-game losing streak to the Vikings. Before that, the last Eastern win in the series was a 58-57 home win over the Vikings on Dec. 22, 2007. Prior to that, Eastern had won five of the last six meetings.

### Records Watch

• Senior guard **Jeffrey Forbes** has played in 109 games to rank seventh in school history, and could break Marc Axton's (2002-05) school record of 119 games played. A 98-game starter, Forbes has averaged 30.7 minutes per game in his Eastern career. He ranks eighth in school history with 113 career steals, just four from reaching No. 6. He is also third in 3-pointers made (164) and fourth in attempts (434). He is 20 makes and 65 attempts away from school records. In his career at

the free throw line, Forbes has made what would be a school record at 87.9 percent (152-of-173), but he is 45 attempts shy to meet the minimum of two free throw attempts per game. Forbes set a single season school record for free throw percentage (.900, 54-of-60) as a sophomore. He also made 55 3-pointers in the 2010-11 season to rank as the 11th-most in Eastern history (now 13th entering the 2012-13 season).

• Senior guard **Kevin Winford** has played in 104 career games, and is just two from a spot on Eastern's top 10 all-time list. He ranks in the top 10 on several Eastern season and career lists for 3-point shooting. On career charts, his 126 makes and his 373 attempts both rank fifth. Winford made 66 3-pointers in the 2010-11 season to rank fifth (now sixth) in single season school history, and his 187 attempts were fourth (now fifth). He owns school records for single game 3-pointers made (10) and attempted (23) when he finished with 39 points – fifth-best in school history – in his sophomore season against New Hope (12/4/10).

• Senior forward **Collin Chiverton** and his 113 3-pointers rank eighth on EWU's top 10 career list, and his 289 attempts are 10th and his .391 percentage is currently 10th. In the five seasons he has played since his junior year in high school, teams that Chiverton has played on have won 133 of 181 games for a .735 winning percentage. His junior college and high school teams won 114 of 131 games (87 percent).

• Sophomore center **Martin Seiferth** broke a school record that stood for 25 years with seven blocked shots in a 96-79 loss to Cal State Northridge on Nov. 12. Seiferth, who also had 27 points and 17 rebounds in the game, broke the previous record of six set by Dexter Griffen versus Idaho State on Jan. 2, 1987. Seiferth's 17 rebounds are the sixth-best recorded performance all-time at Eastern. The sophomore from Berlin, Germany, just missed a spot on Eastern's all-time leading scorers list, with 30 points scored by 10 different players to rank 39th.

### Recent Game Summaries

• The Eagles had a record-tying performance by true freshman **Venky Jois** and another stingy effort on defense, but Northern Colorado was able to down the Eagles 72-56 Jan. 19 in Greeley, Colo. Jois equaled the school record of seven blocked shots set earlier this season by teammate **Martin Seiferth**, as Jois finished with yet another monster game with 15 points, eight rebounds, four assists and the seven blocks. The Eagles also held the Bears to 38 percent shooting – the seventh-straight game the Eagles have held their opponents to 44 percent shooting or less. After trailing by just three at halftime by a 33-30 score, the Eagles allowed UNC to go on a 13-3 run in the second half to open a double-digit lead it held much of the rest of the game. Senior **Collin Chiverton** added 13 points for the Eagles, and sophomore **Parker Kelly** chipped in 11. However, the 6-foot-10 Seiferth played just 14 minutes

because of early foul trouble and finished with only four points and three rebounds. Northern Colorado finished with a 47-29 rebounding advantage, with the 18-rebound margin the second-worst for the Eagles this season (21 versus Idaho). Already playing without starting senior point guard **Kevin Winford** (concussion), guard **Jeffrey Forbes** played only 20 minutes after suffering a finger injury in the second half that required stitches. "He had his pinky finger almost ripped off, so he wasn't able to play down the stretch," said Eastern head coach **Jim Hayford**. "We'll get it all figured out."

• North Dakota went on runs of 8-0 to start the game and 13-0 to begin the second half as the shorthanded Eagles lost 65-47 to UND in a the first-ever Big Sky Conference men's basketball game between the two schools on Jan. 17 in Grand Forks, N.D. In Eastern's first trip to Grand Forks since 1982, the Eagles had a season low point total as EWU made just 34 percent of its shots, including a season-worst 13 percent from the 3-point line (3-of-23). Eastern's 6-foot-10 center **Martin Seiferth** had 14 points, nine rebounds and three blocked shots in just 26 minutes to lead the Eagles, and **Venky Jois** added his eighth double-double of the season with 12 points and 14 rebounds. Seiferth made 6-of-7 shots from the field after entering the game leading the Big Sky in field goal shooting at 64.9 percent for the season. Jois also added a pair of blocks and two steals. Eastern held North Dakota to 36.7 percent shooting – the sixth-straight game EWU has held its opponent to 44 percent shooting or less. The Eagles were out-rebounded 44-38, and North Dakota forced 16 EWU turnovers leading to a 20-12 advantage in points off turnovers. Eagle true freshman **Daniel Hill** started at point guard in place of Winford and went scoreless, but he had a season-high five assists, four rebounds and a steal. Sophomore **Parker Kelly** came off the bench to add eight points and three rebounds.

### Quoting Coach Jim Hayford

**On North Dakota Loss, Including 38-18 Advantage by UND in Second Half:** "With the adversity we were going through, I thought our guys did really

well. We had control of the game in the first half and made it a game that was winnable. In the second half, North Dakota was fired up and we didn't match their intensity. When you take a couple of punches, you don't fold – that's when you get tougher. We have to get our players to a place with their confidence where they know if they work hard enough, good things will come. We did have some players who kept their heads up and kept fighting, and I have to recognize them for that effort."

**On Victory Over NAU & Having Collin Chiverton Back:** "I do think we are coming together. Not having Collin for that whole month slowed our development, but he's back, and he is going to have a good finish to his senior year. (Against Northern Arizona) Collin looked like he did last year when he was at his best. What I like the most is seeing him play with a smile on his face and enjoying basketball."

**On Defense Versus NAU:** "Our senior guards did a really good job in the backcourt on (Gabe) Rogers and (DeWayne) Russell, so give Forbes and Winford credit. All summer Collin told us he could be a lock-down defender, so give him credit. He did a really good job. I thought Collin's size really bothered Russell."

**On Kevin Winford & Jeffrey Forbes Versus MSU:** "Kevin and Jeff gave great senior performances to lead and show our team how you play on the road. I just want to give those two young men a lot of credit. They both have amazing personal character, are great guys and they really did lead by example."

**On Toughness After ISU Win & WSU Loss:** "We need to keep building toughness. The way you get toughness is you face adversity, and you find success against it. When you face adversity -- and fail against it -- you go up the next time and you look for success. That's what we are committed to do as a coaching staff."

**On Aggressive Play:** "I'm scrappy so I'm going to try to make them scrappy every day. That's the only way I know how to play basketball. It's just a truth. The team that plays harder wins. That's the great equalizer -- there's talent and whatever, but I hope we just get scrappier."

## Second Season Azusa Pacific '90



Leading the school to its most successful season in six years, Jim Hayford concluded

his first season as head coach of the Eastern Washington University men's basketball team with a 15-17 record overall and 8-8 record in the Big Sky Conference to place fourth.

His team improved by five victories from the year before, as the Eagles equaled their most wins since Eastern made its first-ever NCAA Tournament appearance in 2004. The Eagles won their first postseason game since 2006, beating Idaho State in the quarterfinals (81-75) before falling to eventual champion Montana (74-66) in the semifinals.

In addition, Eastern won six road games – its most since EWU won seven in the 2002-03 season and six the year after. And Eastern's average attendance of 2,286 was double the 1,101 average of the 2010-11 season when EWU finished 10-20 overall and 7-9 in the league. Eastern's crowds of 3,617 versus Montana State on Jan. 28 and 3,512 against Montana on Jan. 26 rank ninth and 10th, respectively, on EWU's all-time list of single game recorded attendance.

And for the first time since 2006, the Eagles also had their first non-losing conference season, hosted and won their first game in the Big Sky Conference Championship and had their first player honored on the All-Big Sky Conference first team (Cliff Colimon) and BSC All-Tournament squad (Colimon). In addition, Eastern also was home of the Big Sky Newcomer of the Year (Collin Chiverton) – only the third such honor for an Eagle and the first since 2002.

"I'm really, really proud of our players, and proud of the season we had," said Hayford, who has also had tremendous fund-raising success through his Sixth-Man Club. "We advanced Eastern Basketball further than it had in a long time, and that's what I want our players to hang their hat on."

After spending 10 seasons building nearby Whitworth University into a NCAA Division III powerhouse, Hayford was announced as Eastern's new head men's basketball coach on March 29, 2011. He is Eastern's 17th head coach in history and ninth at the NCAA Division I level (since 1983-84).

In his tenure at the helm of the Pirates, Hayford had a record of 217-57 and a winning percentage of .792. He coached the Pirates to eight 20-win seasons, six appearances in the NCAA Division III Tournament (including the last five seasons in a row), five Northwest Conference titles, three NCAA DIII Sweet 16 appearances (2008, 2010, 2011) and one Elite Eight appearance (2011).

Hayford, 44, earned five NWC Coach of the Year awards and was honored by the National Association of Basketball Coaches as the West Region Coach of the Year in both the 2009-10 and 2010-11 seasons. In Hayford's final two years at Whitworth, the Pirates were 54-5

overall and 31-1 in league play. Whitworth was ranked 21-consecutive times in the D3hoops.com NCAA Division III rankings over Hayford's final three seasons at Whitworth.

Including his two seasons at Sioux Falls (1999-2001), Hayford's win-loss record is 269-102 (.727) in 13 seasons as a head coach. At the time he left Whitworth, his career winning percentage ranked among the top 10 among all active NCAA Division III coaches.

Prior to coming to Whitworth, Hayford was head coach at the University of Sioux Falls (S.D.), where he compiled a 37-27 record in two seasons. During his inaugural season (1999-2000), he led the Cougars to their first conference playoff appearance in five years. The team finished 15-15 after losing in the South Dakota Intercollegiate Conference (SDIC) championship game. Hayford's Cougars finished the 2000-01 season at 22-12 and lost to the eventual NAIA Division II champions (Northwestern College of Iowa) in double overtime in the Great Plains Athletic Conference championship game. His team set a school record for wins in a season. Prior to Hayford's arrival, USF was 9-17 in 1998-99.

Hayford served as the top assistant coach at Azusa Pacific University (Calif.) from 1990-99, including eight seasons under Bill Odell. APU won seven consecutive Golden State Athletic Conference titles during that time and advanced to the NAIA Division I Final Four in each of his final two seasons there.

Hayford also coached at the high school level, leading Contra Costa Christian High School in 1987 and Berean Christian High School from 1988-1990.

Hayford earned his master's degree in education from Claremont Graduate School in 1991. He earned his bachelor's degree in social science from Azusa Pacific in 1989. He is a 1985 graduate of Berean Christian, which is located in Walnut Creek, Calif.

Hayford and his wife, Robin, have a daughter, Jayme (17), and son, Joseph (14).

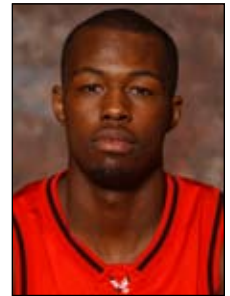

## Rodney Stuckey's Eagle Basketball & NBA Highlights



- Former Eastern Washington University men's basketball All-American and current Detroit Piston Rodney Stuckey had his EWU jersey retired in ceremonies that took place on Sunday, Jan. 11, 2008, at Reese Court in Cheney, Wash. The 2008-09 season would have been Stuckey's senior season at EWU had he played all four seasons.
- EWU's highest draft pick ever and the second-highest in the history of the Big Sky Conference.
- All-American at Eastern – both athletically and academically – after averaging 24 points per game in his career. He helped EWU win 30 games.
- As a sophomore, he ranked seventh in NCAA Division I in scoring with an average of 24.6 points per game. He was eighth as a freshman with a 24.2 average.
- As both a freshman and sophomore, he was given honorable mention All-America honors by the Associated Press.
- With a 3.34 cumulative grade point average, he was a third team selection on the 2007 ESPN The Magazine Academic All-America team and twice received All-District VIII honors.
- In just two seasons, he broke 10 school records and scored a total of 1,438 points. He had nine games with at least 30 points (out of 59 career games).

- He was a preseason candidate for the John R. Wooden Award in the 2006-07 season.
- In his freshman season, Collegeinsider.com voted Stuckey its National Freshman of the Year. He was also the Big Sky Conference MVP and Freshman of the Year in 2005-06.
- He made his NBA debut in the 2007 Summer League in Las Vegas, Nev., helping the Pistons to a 4-1 record with averages of 30.6 minutes, 19.0 points, 4.0 rebounds, 2.6 assists and 1.2 steals per game. But he injured his hand during the preseason and missed the first 25 games of the regular season. He finally made his NBA debut on Dec. 21, 2007, and his first start in the NBA was on March 1, 2008, in a 103-73 victory over the Los Angeles Clippers.
- He was impressive as a rookie for Detroit, earning second team NBA All-Rookie Team honors as selected by the league's head coaches. He finished his first season with averages of 19.8 minutes, 7.8 points and 2.9 assists per game as the Pistons advanced to the Eastern Conference Finals where it lost to eventual NBA champion Boston. His minutes increased in the playoffs as he averaged 8.2 points and 3.4 assists, while making 87.9 percent of his free throws, in 17 playoff games.
- In his second season in 2008-09, Stuckey started 65 of 79 games, averaging 31.9 minutes, 13.4 points, 4.9 assists, 1.0 steals and 3.5 rebounds. In his third season, he was a starter in all but six of the 73 games he played and averaged 34.2 minutes, 16.6 points, 4.8 assists, 1.4 steals and 3.8 rebounds. In the 2010-11 season, he started 54 of 70 games and averaged 15.5 points, 3.1 rebounds, 1.1 steals and a career-high 5.2 assists. In 2011-12 – his fifth season as a pro – Stuckey started 48 of 55 games and averaged 14.8 points, 2.6 rebounds, 0.8 steals and a 3.8 assists.
