Southern Utah's men's basketball team hosts a pair of Big Sky Conference games this week, welcoming Weber State – which currently shares first place in the conference with Montana – on Thursday night, and Idaho State – which is coached by former Thunderbird mentor Bill Evans – on Saturday.

SUU (5-8/3-1 Big Sky) is coming off its first conference road trip of the season. SUU split the two games, winning at Northern Arizona (90-77) before falling at Sacramento State (64-59). The 'Birds enjoyed their best shooting night of the season at NAU as the Thunderbirds hit 25-of-44 shots, including 7-of-13 3-pointers in the team's second-highest point output of the season. The team couldn't follow that effort with another hot-shooting night, however, as the percentage dipped to .322 at Sacramento State, its lowest percentage of the season.

Weber State (9-3/4-0 Big Sky) has won five straight games, including four conference games. Just one of the last five, a 73-69 victory in overtime at Portland State, was close. In the other four the Wildcats won at Eastern Washington 73-69, rolled past University of the Southwest 110-45, beat Northern Colorado 79-54, and in their last game they posted a 95-63 home win over North Dakota, last Saturday night. After starting the season 1-3 WSU has gone 8-1.

Idaho State (2-11/1-3 Big Sky) picked up its first Big Sky win last Saturday when the Bengals rolled past Northern Colorado, 86-63. That win snapped a

six-game winning streak and gave the Bengals their first win over a Division I team. The Bengals play just one game this week, at SUU.

The Games: Thursday – Weber State (9-3/4-0) at Southern Utah (5-8/2-1), 7:05 p.m. (MST) in the Centrum Arena (5,300). Saturday – Idaho State (2-11/1-3) at Southern Utah, 7:05 p.m. in the Centrum.

The Series: Weber State holds a 22-6 edge in the series with the Thunderbirds, including five straight victories and a 6-4 lead in games played in Cedar City. WSU claimed an 84-66 win in Ogden, Utah, last season and a 77-71 win in the Centrum during the 2010-11 season, the last time the teams met in Cedar City. Southern Utah's last win against the 'Cats was a 75-63 triumph in Cedar City during the 2006-07 season. SUU leads the series with Idaho State 12-6 but the two teams have not met since the 2004-05 season, when current Bengal Coach Bill Evans was at the helm of the SUU program. The two teams went to overtime in both meetings that year, with SUU taking a 71-70 win in the Centrum, then edging the Bengals in Pocatello, 82-79, a few weeks later. SUU is 6-1 vs. the Bengals in Cedar City, with the only loss coming during the 1993-94 season when ISU claimed a 71-69 win.

TV: There will be no live television for either game this week.

Radio: All of Southern Utah men's basketball games are broadcast live by KSUU (91.1 FM) as well as on the internet at www.power91radio.com. Art Challis is in his 40th season as the Thunderbirds' basketball play-by-play voice. Dr. Challis – who also serves as the chair of SUU's Department of Communication – is joined on home and selected road broadcasts by former SUU standout and current SUU VP for University Relations Dean O'Driscoll.

Next Up: Following this week's games the Thunderbirds will hit the road for their longest road trip – at least in terms of days away from campus – of the season. SUU will play at Montana on Jan. 17, then won't play again until Jan. 21 when the T-Birds visit Montana State. Montana will host Montana State on Saturday, Jan. 19.

Thunderbird Club Luncheons: The Thunderbird Club's weekly no-host luncheon is held Mondays at noon at the Cedar City Crystal Inn. The public is invited to attend the luncheons where Southern Utah's in-season coaches talk about their upcoming contests and review the past week's action.

Captains: This year's captains are seniors Jackson Stevenett and Tyson Koehler.

Heur Named BSC Player of the Week: SUU's Damon Heur was named Big Sky Co-Player of the Week, along with Weber State's Scott Bamforth, for his performance last week. Heur scored a Big Sky season-high 30 points to lead SUU to its first road win of the season, a 90-77 victory at Northern Arizona last Saturday afternoon. Heur started a 22-2 first-half run with a 3-pointer and he buried two more threes during the stretch that lifted SUU from a 9-7 deficit to a 29-11 lead. He went on to score 20 of his points in the second half, including a 3-pointer for the first basket of the period to lift SUU to a 45-30 lead and 5-of-6 free throws in the final 1:04 to keep the Lumberjacks at bay. He hit 6-of-11 shots, 4-of-6 3-pointers and 14-of-16 free throws in the game. The 14 made free throws are also the most in the Big Sky this season. In addition to his scoring, he pulled down four rebounds, dished out two assists, picked off two steals and blocked a shot.

The Coaches: Head Coach Nick Robinson (Stanford, 2005) is 5-8 in his first season at SUU and his first season as a head coach. Coach Robinson came to Southern Utah from LSU, where he spent three seasons on the staff. Prior to his time at LSU Robinson spent a season at William Jewell College and two seasons on the staff at his alma mater, Stanford. During his time as an assistant coach, Robinson helped guide his teams to a combined record of 87-47 and four post-season appearances, including two NCAA, one NIT and one NAIA Division I national tournaments. This is the first time Robinson has coached against either opponent.

Robinson is assisted by Jared Barrett (Eastern Oregon, 1996), Todd Okeson (Nevada, 2005) and Drew Allen (Southern Utah, 2010).

Weber State is coached by Randy Rahe (Buena Vista '82). Coach Rahe, who is in his seventh season at Weber State brings an overall and WSU record of 129-71 into the game. Coach Rahe is 5-1 vs. the Thunderbirds.

Idaho State is coached by Bill Evans (Southern Utah '72). Coach Evans spent 14 seasons as head coach at SUU, where he compiled a record of 209-224 and won more games than any other coach in Thunderbird history. He brings an overall mark of 211-235 into Saturday's game. This is the first time he has coached against SUU.

Affiliations: Southern Utah is in its first season as a member of the Big Sky Conference. All of SUU's sports except gymnastics and men's golf compete in the Big Sky. Gymnastics is an affiliate member of the WAC while men's golf competes in the American Sky Conference. Weber State and Idaho State are also members of the Big Sky Conference.

The Schedule: The Thunderbirds have played nine non-conference games, three at home, four true road contests, and two neutral court match-ups. They have played two conference games at home and two on the road. SUU opened at #21 Gonzaga, then played three games in three days at the World Vision Classic, meeting Green Bay, Cal State Fullerton and host Nevada before opening its home schedule against Carroll College. SUU also played non-conference games at TCU, at Denver, and at

home against San Diego Christian and San Diego. The T-Birds played Big Sky home games against North Dakota and Northern Colorado and last week faced Northern Arizona and Sacramento State on the road. SUU has just one non-conference game remaining, a BracketBuster match-up at home on Feb. 23.

Last Time Out: SUU fell behind 12-0 and although the Thunderbirds came back to tie the game 29-29 early in the second half they could never get over the hump and wound up falling out of the undefeated ranks in conference play with a 64-59 loss at Sacramento State. Jackson Stevenett score 24 points and pulled down 12 rebounds to notch his second double-double of the season, and Damon Heuir scored 14 points and dished out a team-high four assists. Jayson Cheesman blocked three shots, giving him 31 on the season, the 10th-highest single-season total in SUU history. On the downside, the team combined to hit just 19-of-59 shots, 32.2 percent, and was out-rebounded for the first time in nine games, 41-to-38. Sacramento State enjoyed a huge advantage at the free throw line, with 55 attempts, but the Hornets hit just 29, while SUU converted 15-of-21 free throw attempts.

T-Birds In The National Ranks: SUU had two players ranked among the NCAA's top-50 heading into the week, and the team ranked in the top-50 in two categories as well. Jackson Stevenett was 30th in free throw percentage at 87.8 while Jayson Cheesman was 33rd in blocks per game with an average of 2.33, prior to the Sac State game. As a team the Thunderbirds were 21st in the country with 5.4 blocks per game and 45th in

rebounding margin, at plus-6.0.

T-Birds In The Big Sky: Cheesman leads the Big Sky in blocks per game with 2.4 and Stevenett is second in the league in scoring at 14.9 points per game and Damon Heuir is fifth in scoring at 14.4 ppg. Stevenett is also tied for fourth in free throw percentage at .857 and is seventh in rebounding with 6.3 per game, while Cheesman ranks ninth in rebounding with 5.89 rpg. Stevenett is also tied for seventh in defensive rebounds with 4.4 per game. Wade Collie is sixth in 3-point percentage at .432 and Cal Hanks is 10th in blocks per game with 1.2. The team leads the conference in blocks with 5.4 per game, is second in the BSC in rebounding margin (+5.3) and is second in defensive rebounds (26.1 drpg).

The Magic Number Is 58

Jackson Stevenett has scored 924 points in his three-plus seasons at SUU. He needs 58 more to tie Fred House (1999-2001) in 10th place on the school's career scoring list. He also has 394 career rebounds and needs 58 to tie Marc Wilson (1977-79) on the SUU career rebounding list.

Cleaning The Glass:

- The Thunderbirds were out-rebounded in their first three games of the season but have won the battle of the boards in all but one game since. Sacramento State had a 41-38 edge on the boards.

- SUU has reeled in 40 or more caroms six times this season, already two more than last year's total of four 40-rebound games.
- SUU pulled down a season-high 51 rebounds vs. San Diego Christian and followed that with a 43-board performance against San Diego, 42 against North Dakota and 45 vs. Northern Colorado.
- Although they out-rebounded Denver the Thunderbirds finished with just 31 caroms against the Pioneers, SUU's lowest total since a season-low 28-board effort against Cal State Fullerton in the third game of the campaign.

Block Party:

- SUU averages a Big Sky-leading 5.38 blocks per game. The Thunderbirds have rejected 70 shots this season, including 12 against North Dakota, SUU's highest total since the team combined for 13 rejections against Panhandle State on Dec. 14, 2010 and the highest total in the Big Sky so far this season. The Thunderbirds were in double-digits against vs. San Diego as well, when they blocked 10 shots.
- Jayson Cheesman didn't take much time to break into the SUU record books. In his first game as a Thunderbird the junior transfer from Salt Lake Community College blocked five shots, which tied the sixth-highest single-game blocks total in SUU history. With 31 total blocks this season Cheesman is in 10th place on the SUU single-season list. He needs two more to tie Donnie Jackson (2002-03) in ninth place and four to move past Kerry Sherwood (1991-92) and Bryan Olson (183-84) into seventh place.
- Cal Hanks tied Cheesman in sixth place on that single-game list when he came off the bench to block five shots against North Dakota. Hanks has 15 blocks on the season.
- SUU blocked five shots at Sacramento State, giving the team five or more blocks in a game eight times this season.

T-Bird Notes:

- The Thunderbirds had just four players foul out of the nine non-conference games (including two at TCU) but have had

- five disqualifications in the four Big Sky contests so far, including two at both Northern Arizona and Sac State.
- SUU was the first team to win its first three Big Sky Conference games in its first season of play since Boise State started out 4-0 back in 1970-71.
- Julian Scott, who hadn't played since suffering an injury against Carroll College back on Nov. 21, came off the bench to score 13 points and pull down four rebounds at NAU.
- SUU shot .568 from the floor and .538 from 3-point range at NAU – both season-high percentages – and knocked down 78.6 percent of its free throws, including 10-of-12 in the final 1:08 to clinch the win.
- The T-Birds attempted a season-high 42 free throws and hit a season-high 33 of them at NAU. En rout to his BSC-season-high 30 points Damon Heuir hit a team-high 4-of-6 3-pointers and 14-of-16 free throws. The 14 made free throws are also the most in a single game in the Big Sky this season.
- Stevenett's 29 points at Gonzaga was tied as the highest single-game point total in the Big Sky this season until Damon Heuir scored 30 at NAU. Stevenett's 11 field goals made against the Zags is the highest total in the conference so far this season, while his 11-of-15 shooting night (.733) ranks second-best in the Sky, behind Northern Colorado's Connor Osborne, who hit 8-of-9 shots against University of the Southwest.
- Heuir's 14 made free throws at NAU are the most in a game in the Big Sky this season while his 16 attempts are tied for the most.
- Jordan Johnson hit the first 3-pointer of the season and the second of his career at NAU.
- Northern Arizona hit just 3-of-17 3-pointers against the Thunderbirds, 17.6 percent. It was the lowest percentage and tied for the second-fewest long-range baskets by the Lumberjacks this season.
- SUU posted its first win of the season after trailing at the half, trailing in the last minute and when scoring fewer than 60 points when it came back for the 51-50 win over Northern Colorado. In that game the Thunderbirds also notched their first win when the opponent turned the ball over more

Thunderbirds Host Wildcats, Bengals 6-6-6-6-6

(UNC had 18 turnovers to SUU's 14), when the opponent's bench outscored the 'Birds (14-8), in a game decided by seven or fewer points and when the opponent shot a better percentage from the floor (.380-to-.339).

- SUU had a season-high six players score in double figures against San Diego Christian. Stevenett led the way with 15, while Damon Heuir and Wade Collie each finished with 13. Jayson Cheesman finished with 12 points and both Jaren Jeffery and Jordan Johnson had 10. For Cheesman and Johnson the totals were career-highs while Collie's 13 were a season-high. Johnson was a perfect 5-for-5 from the floor while Collie was 5-of-6 and Hanks, who finished with a then-career-high seven points, was 3-for-3 from the field as SUU finished with a season-best 55.9 field goal percentage.

- Cheesman pulled down 13 rebounds at TCU, the third-highest total in the Big Sky this season.

- SUU combined for a season-high 18 assists vs. SDCC. Freshman A.J. Hess came off the bench to lead the squad with a career-high five dimes vs. the Hawks, while Collie had four and all but two Thunderbirds who saw action dished out at least one.

T-Bird Trivia:

- SUU has nine lettermen, one squad member and one red-shirt returning from last season's team that finished 8-10 (14-17 overall) and in sixth place in the Summit League.

- Five seniors, three juniors, three sophomores and four freshmen make up the 2012-13 Thunderbird squad.

- Jackson Stevenett was a second-team all-Summit League honoree and he also earned a spot on the five-player Summit League all-tournament team last season.

- SUU advanced to the Summit League tournament as the number six seed last year, then upset third-seeded Oakland (84-82) in the tournament's first round before falling to eventual tourney champion South Dakota State (63-47).

- Nick Robinson is the eighth head men's basketball coach in SUU's 50-year history as a four-year institution.

- Nevada's World Vision Classic was the fourth in-season tournament for the Thunderbirds in as many years. Last year SUU competed at San Diego State's Basketball Travelers Classic, in 2010 SUU traveled to the Great Alaska Shootout and in 2009 the team was in Hawai'i for the Rainbow Classic.

- Southern Utah plays 14 home games this season, including 10 Big Sky Conference contests and one in the Bracket-Busters tournament. The 10 conference match-ups are the most ever in a season for SUU, a far cry from the four the team had in 1993-94 and 1994-95 when it was a member of the five-team American West Conference and there were just four home conference dates. The last several years SUU has played nine Summit League games per season in the Centrum.

- SUU and the University of North Dakota are in their first seasons in the Big Sky, making it an 11-team conference. The Thunderbirds had been members of the Summit League (nee. Mid-Continent Conference) for the past 15 seasons before joining the BSC. As members of the 10-team Summit League the Thunderbird men's basketball team qualified for the conference's eight-team post-season tournament 14 of 15 seasons, missing only in 2009-10 when the T-Birds finished ninth.

- Seven teams qualify for the Big Sky tournament, which will be hosted by the regular-season champion, March 14-16.

- SUU is in its 50th season as a four-year institution, its 25th at the NCAA Division I level. Prior to joining the NCAA Division I ranks the University spent two seasons at the Division II level and 23 as a member of the NAIA.

Scouting Weber State: The Wildcats are adjusting very well to the loss of Damian Lillard in the first round of last year's NBA draft, thank you. Weber State lost two of its first three games, at San Jose State in overtime (68-67) and at Utah State (65-55) but has been on a roll ever since, winning eight of nine, with the only setback coming at home against BYU, 78-68. The 'Cats are 3-2 on the road, with wins at Dayton (62-61), Eastern Washington (74-53) and Portland State (73-69 in overtime) since the loss to USU. Three Wildcats carry double-figure scoring averages, led by wing Davion Berry's (6-4, 185, Jr) 13.1 ppg. Berry, who also paces the team in assists with 3.9 per game, is followed by Scott Bamforth (G, 6-2, 190, Sr) at 12.8 ppg and Kyle Tresnak (C, 6-10, 255, Jr) at 11.5. In all, seven players on the WSU roster average over 7.0 points per game. Tresnak is third on the team in rebounding with 5.3 per game, behind Joel Bolomboy (F, 6-9, 215, Fr), who has come off the bench in all 12 games to corral 8.4 caroms per game and block a team-high 19 shots, and Frank Otis (F, 6-6, 220, Sr), who averages 5.9 rpg. As a team the Wildcats have scored at a 78.9 points per game clip on 51.0 percent shooting, including a Big Sky-leading .426 from 3-point range. Bamforth is the biggest threat from downtown, having knocked down 29-of-65 threes (.446), while Jordan Richardson (G, 6-1, 185, Jr), who averages 9.0 ppg, has hit 22-of-41 from long-range (.537). Richardson is second in the conference in 3-point percentage while Bamforth is fifth. The Wildcats have been good on both ends of the floor, limiting opponents to 59.6 points per game on 37.7 percent shooting and just .256 from 3-point range. WSU has hit 66.7 percent of its free throws and out-rebounded opponents by an average of 37.7-to-31.3 caroms per game.

Scouting Idaho State: Like the Thunderbirds the Bengals have been learning a new system under a new coach – former SUU Coach Bill Evans – this year and although their record is 2-11 most of their losses have been very close contests. The Bengals have also been road warriors this season, with 10 of their 13 games to this point coming away from home. In true road games ISU is 0-8, and the Bengals are 0-2 on neutral courts with losses to Wright State and Central Michigan at Utah's Thanksgiving Tournament. Two Bengals, Melvin Morgan and Chris Hansen, carry double-figure scoring averages, with two more over 7.0 ppg. Morgan scores at a 12.7 ppg clip, while Hansen checks in at 10.0 ppg. Thomas Sanchez, who is the top assist man with 3.7 per game and co-leads the team in rebounding with 4.0 boards per game (along with Andre Hatchett and Neveij Walters), averages 9.2 points while scoring at a 9.2 ppg clip. Sherrod Baldwin averages 7.0 ppg after sitting out the first 10 games but appearing in the last three. As a team ISU averages 52.2 points per game on .392 shooting (.291 threes) while allowing opponents 62.0 pgon .440 shooting (.357 threes). The Bengals have converted 67.7 percent of their free throw opportunities and have been out-rebounded by an average of 35.2-to-27.0 boards per game.

Damian Lillard, the NCAA's leading scorer, scored 31 points to lead four Wildcats in double figures as Weber State held off Southern Utah, 84-66, Saturday night.

Ray Jones, Jr., scored 14 points while Jackson Stevenett added 12 points, five rebounds and five assists, and Damon Heuir came off the bench to chip in 11 points for the Thunderbirds.

Lillard hit a 3-pointer for the first points of the game and the Thunderbirds never led.

"Lillard hit that 3-pointer at the beginning of the game and set the tone for them," SUU Coach Roger Reid said. "He's a great player, a player who will be in the NBA some day, a player who would be in the NBA this year if he hadn't been injured last year."

Lillard hit 9-of-15 shots, including 5-of-8 from 3-point range, and also buried 8-of-9 free throws. For good measure, the junior guard also dished out a game-high nine assists for the Wildcats, who hit 30-of-53 shots (.566), including 13-of-21 (.619) in the second half.

Southern Utah wound up shooting 48.3 percent, hitting 28-of-58 shots, and won the rebounding battle 28-to-27 while turning the ball over just 12 times and dishing out 16 assists, but the Wildcats had just eight turnovers and finished with 20 assists.

After Lillard hit the three to open the game SUU played within three points for most of the first half, but the Wildcats went on a 12-4 run to close the period and take a 44-32 lead at the break after Byron Fulton hit a 3-pointer with five seconds to go.

Wade Collie tipped in a Ramell Taylor miss to open the second half, pulling the Thunderbirds within 44-34, but the Wildcats went on a 14-3 run, pushing the advantage to 58-37 on a Kyle Tresnak dunk with 14:47 to play.

SUU rallied back within 64-51 on a Taylor jumper at the 9:03 mark, but after a time out Weber State scored 12 straight, including 3-pointers by Lillard and Jordan Richardson, to give the Wildcats a 76-51 lead with 7:03 to play and SUU was never able to get closer than 18 the rest of the way.

Jackson Stevenett posted his second double-double of the season with 24 points and 12 rebounds but Southern Utah struggled on the offensive end at the beginning of the game, then after coming back struggled to score midway through the second half Monday night, enabling Sacramento State to end the Thunderbirds' three-game Big Sky winning streak with a 64-59 win. SUU dipped to 5-8 overall and 3-1 in Big Sky play while Sacramento State improved to 7-5 overall and 2-2 in conference play.

After shooting their best percentage of the season in a 90-77 win in the previous game at Northern Arizona (.568) the Thunderbirds dipped to 32.2 percent at Sacramento.

SUU was within one, at 41-40 after a Jayson Cheesman dunk with 9:32 to play, but turned the ball over three times and missed a shot on the next four possessions. Meanwhile Sacramento State scored on each possession to change the one-point edge into a 52-40 game with 5:20 to go.

The Thunderbirds battled back, pulling within five with 48 seconds to go but could get no closer than 63-59 with eight seconds to play.

SUU gave up two free points before the game started because of a technical foul for dunking in pre-game warmups, and then missed their first seven shots, to find itself down 12-0 before Jackson Stevenett finally got them on the board with a jumper at the 13:10 mark.

SUU fell behind by as many as 16, at 22-6, before finally making a run, pulling within 24-20 after a Stevenett tip-in at the 5:26 mark. Stevenett started the run with a layup, and after 3-pointers by Wade Collie and Damon Heuir, a Jayson Cheesman dunk, two Stevenett free throws and the tip in the Thunderbirds were back within four.

Sacramento State scored the next three points but the Thunderbirds got two free throws each from Heuir (after a technical foul on SAC's John Dickson) and Cheesman to pull within three, and after A.J. Hess grabbed a rebound on the defensive end Stevenett hit another jumper to pull the Thunderbirds within 27-26. Hess followed that basket with a steal and SUU had an opportunity to take the lead but Cheesman missed inside and Joe Eberhard got the rebound for Sacramento, was fouled, and hit two free throws to give the Hornets at 29-26 advantage at half-time.

Jackson Stevenett scored a career- and game-high 29 points and pulled down six rebounds to lead Southern Utah but the Thunderbirds were no match for No. 21 Gonzaga in the season-opener for both teams as the Bulldogs cruised in the second half to a 103-65 win at McCarthy Athletic Center on Friday night.

Down 44-27 at the half SUU was in striking distance but Gonzaga went on an 8-2 run to open the second period, then after a Stevenett layup, the Zags ran off another six straight to take a 62-31 lead with 15:19 to play.

After that point SUU made runs but couldn't ever get back within striking distance of the Bulldogs.

"I felt we had good execution at times in the game but Gonzaga did what they like to do. They're well coached, an established program," SUU first-year Head Coach Nick Robinson said. "We'll continue to work, continue to improve and we'll be a better team next game."

Stevenett hit 11-of-15 shots and teammate Julian Scott buried 4-of-5 en route to a nine points, also a career-high, while Wade Collie finished with 10 points. Scott, Jayson Cheesman, who was playing his first game as a Thunderbird, and Jaren Jeffery all pulled down five rebounds for SUU, who had 33 rebounds to Gonzaga's 36.

"Jackson has been here before, he was aggressive, looked for his shot and was effective," Robinson noted. "That's something we want all of our guys to do. He got some open looks and he was able to knock down some shots tonight."

SUU wound up hitting 27-of-55 shots, 49.1 percent, while Gonzaga hit 40-of-73, .548.

"For the first game out against a good team I thought our execution at times was good. Shooting 50 percent for the first game against a good defensive team was a good effort for us."

Six Gonzaga players finished in double figures, led by Przemek Karnowski's 22 points off the bench. Guy Landry Edi added 16, Sam Dower scored 15, David Stockton and Elias Harris had 12 and Kevin Pangos chipped in 10 points for the Zags.

Southern Utah gave one of its best efforts on the young season, giving Nevada all it wanted for 30 minutes Sunday afternoon, but the Wolf Pack warmed up down the stretch to overcome an eight-point second half deficit to upend the Thunderbirds 79-61.

After trailing 34-33 at halftime the Thunderbirds hit four of their first five shots in the second half to take a 43-37 lead on a pair of Jaysen Cheesman free throws with 16:22 to play. Nevada scored its next six points from the free throw line and took a 61-56 lead on a Story jump shot. After falling behind 8-4 in the first five minutes Thunderbirds rallied with a 22-7 run that put them up 26-15. Freshman guard A.J. Hess sparked the run with a pair of 3-pointers and Wade Collie took a steal coast-to-coast for a lay-up and a free throw to make the count 17-11.

After a Carroll basket, Chris Nsenki fed Julian Scott down low for a two-handed slam. The Thunderbirds then went on to cap the run with Heuir finding Jayson Cheesman in transition for a lay-in.

Heuir scored eight-consecutive points for SUU in the closing minutes of the half to lead all scorers at the break with 12 and help Southern Utah to a 39-25 half-time advantage.

The Thunderbirds hit 16-of-33 shots in the first period (.485) and out-rebounded the Saints 21-to-11. The Saints hung around by going 5-of-11 from the three-point line, including two from junior Nick Jones.

Southern Utah built the advantage in the second half, extending it to 58-37 with 9:57 left to play. From that point Robinson went heavily to his bench, getting everyone into the action with no player seeing more than Heuir's 25 minutes on the court.

SUU finished the game shooting 45.9 percent from the floor with 40 points scored in the paint. In addition to Heuir's 16, the Thunderbirds got 10 from Collie and another nine from Scott. They also held a 40-27 rebounding advantage, led by Jaren Jeffery's 11.

The Saints were 18-45 from the field in the game, with half of the baskets coming from 3-point range. Ben Cutler scored 18 to lead the visitors, who got another 11 from Jones and 10 from both Brett Ball and Chris McGrath.

Damon Heuir scored a season-high 25 points and Jayson Cheesman pulled down a career-high 13 rebounds and blocked three shots but TCU outscored Southern Utah 24-15 in the final 10 minutes to overcome a one-point deficit and hand the improving Thunderbirds a 61-52 loss Thursday night.

Heuir hit two free throws with 10:50 to play to give Southern Utah a 38-37 lead, but TCU took the lead back on a Devona Abron layup, then after the Thunderbirds had two chances at a basket on the other end extended the advantage to 41-38 on a pair of Abron free throws with 9:19 to play.

That series started what turned out to be an 8-0 Horned Frog run, and although SUU back within five several times, the last at 52-47 on a Cheesman tip in with 2:17 to play, the Thunderbirds weren't able to get back over the hump.

Damon Heuir scored 17 points and Jackson Stevenett added 13 but after falling behind early against San Diego the Thunderbirds could never climb out of the hole in suffering a 67-53 loss to the Toreros.

Jackson Stevenett turned in his first double-double of the season and led the Thunderbirds in scoring, rebounding, assists and steals as Southern Utah won its first-ever Big Sky Conference basketball game with a 79-67 triumph over North Dakota.

Stevenett scored 21 points, pulled down 10 rebounds, dished out five assists and had three steals to lead SUU. His rebounding and assists totals were both season-highs which tied his career-high totals, while his three steals tied the team's season high in 2012-13.

Wade Collie added a career-high 18 points coming off the bench for the first time this season and Cal Hanks blocked a career-best five shots as the team tallied a season-high 12 rejections. Jayson Cheesman had three blocks while Collie had two and Jaren Jeffery and A.J. Hess each rejected one attempt.

Southern Utah led through most of the game but had just a 62-59 advantage after Alonzo Traylor hit a jumper with 3:56 to play. UND had an opportunity to cut further into the lead but Traylor missed a free throw and a chance to convert a 3-point play, then after SUU was unable to score on the other end Traylor grabbed a rebound but Aaron Anderson's shot on the other end was blocked out of bounds by Cheesman. Anderson then drove to the basket but Stevenett corralled the rebound and Hess buried a 3-pointer to push the T-Bird lead to 65-59 with 2:49 to play.

Mitch Wilmer converted just one of two free throws the next time UND went down the floor and Stevenett grabbed the rebound on the miss, then scored on the other end to stake SUU to a 67-60 lead and UND would get no closer than six the rest of the way as the Thunderbirds converted 9-of-10 free throws down the stretch to seal the win.

SUU held UND to 30 percent shooting, the lowest percentage by an opponent this season, and hit 17-of-20 free throws for a season-high 85 percent success rate. UND scored 28 of its points from the free throw line, where it held a 35-20 advantage.

SUU also finished with 15 assists, its second-highest total of the season.

Svihovec had one last chance to tie the game, but his driving layup with under 10 seconds to go rimmed out and Johnson grabbed the rebound and dribbled up court to run out the clock and seal the win.

Stevenett wound up with a game-high 14 points and four assists to lead SUU, while Collie added 13 points and six rebounds. Jayson Cheesman had eight rebounds to go along with eight points and two blocks, while Johnson finished with four points, two blocks, two steals, an assist and six rebounds.

Derrick Barden led Northern Colorado with 12 points and a game-high nine rebounds, hwhile Addo came off the bench to score 10 points for the Bears. Svihovec finished with six points, five rebounds and five assists but also turned the ball over seven times.

SUU out-rebounded UNC 45-32 to give the team eight consecutive games out-rebounding the opposition. The Thunderbirds also had 14 turnovers, but just four in the second half, and finished with 15 assists, as every player but Collie and Chris Nsenki had at least one dime.

Damon Heuir scored a season-high 30 points, including 13-of-14 free throws in the second half, to lead Southern Utah to a 90-77 win over Northern Arizona Saturday afternoon. With the win the Thunderbirds remained undefeated in the Big Sky Conference at 3-0 and improved to 5-7 overall. Northern Arizona saw its BSC record dip to 2-2, 5-9 overall.

Heuir hit 6-of-11 shots, including 4-of-6 3-point attempts, and buried 14-of-16 free throws overall to lead all scorers. Jackson Stevenett added 14 for SUU before fouling out and Wade Collie scored 10. Julian Scott, who had missed the previous seven games with an injury, gave the Thunderbirds a lift with 13 points in 24 minutes off the bench.

SUU finished the game shooting 56.8 percent (25-of-44), its highest percentage of the season, and .538 from 3-point range (7-13), also its best of the season.

Southern Utah built leads as high as 18 points in the first half, going up 29-11 on Wade Collie's second straight 3-pointer with 10:50 to play, but the Max Jacobsen scored nine straight NAU points to spark a Lumberjack comeback. NAU went on a 13-1 run to get back within 30-24 when DeWayne Russell hit two free throws with 5:53 to play but the Thunderbirds answered with a 10-6 run and took a 42-30 lead at the break.

Southern Utah hit 6-of-10 3-pointers in the half, three by Heuir to get the T-Birds started, and two by Collie, and knocked down 15-of-24 shots overall, 62.5 percent.

Heuir opened the second half with the team's final 3-pointer of the afternoon, to lift the team to a 45-30 lead, and SUU pushed the advantage to 49-33 on a Stevenett layup but NAU scored the next nine points to pull within 49-42 and got as close as 51-45 on a pair of Gabe Rogers free throws with 12:33 to play.

Southern Utah kept the Lumberjacks at bay, however, going up 58-58 on a Collie free throw with 9:55 to play and answering every NAU run thereafter.

Heuir, A.J. Hess and Collie combined to hit 10-of-12 free throws in the final minute to clinch the win.

The win gave SUU back-to-back wins as well as a road victory for the first time this season.
